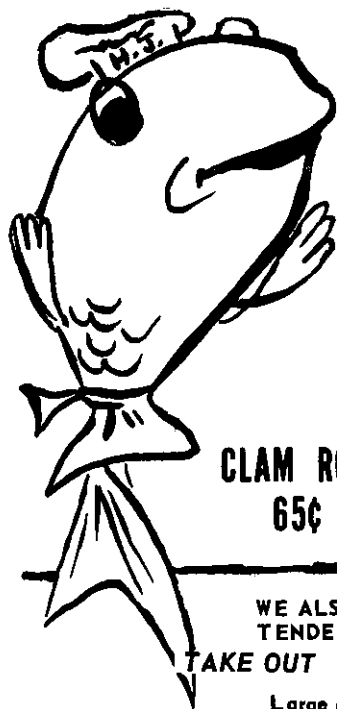
If past performances are any criterion, this will be a most enjoyable occasion. The quality of the music is extremely high and audiences are increasingly appreciative.

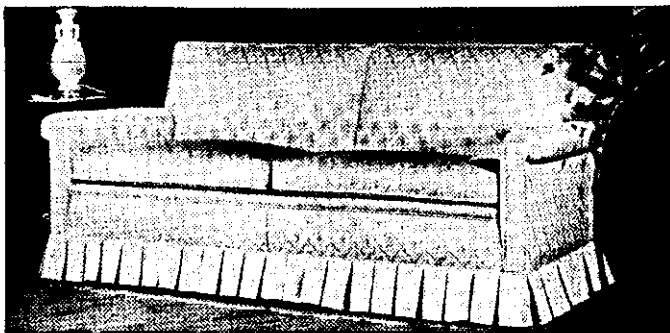

### To The Spotlight:

The Board of Education has turned down a request for increases in teachers' salaries in the Town of Bethlehem. This appears to be an unfortunate

decision which may be a false economy.

The high quality of education offered in the Bethlehem schools should be a source of great pride to us all. But this should not make us smug.

The Board of Education argues that Bethlehem teachers' salaries "are comparable to those paid in like districts." We should aim higher than being a "like" district. In fact, if we were a "like" district, the number of scholarships won by Bethlehem students would have been many fewer than they were in recent competition.

As taxpayers we are concerned with the most effective use of tax dollars. Every time a teacher leaves for a more lucrative position in another district, we incur considerable expense in recruiting and training a new

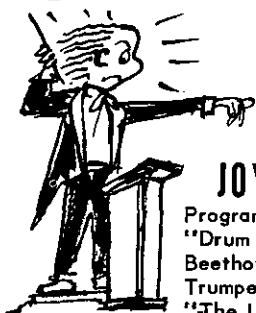

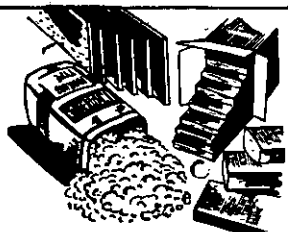

teacher. In addition, the morale and enthusiasm of teachers is probably the most important single factor in high quality education. A high level of compensation is, of course, only one element in motivating teachers, but we can achieve a tremendous advantage by keeping teachers' salaries higher than those in "like" districts.

Industrial wages and governmental salaries have been moving upward with the higher cost of living. It is important that teachers' salaries should not lag behind. With greater demands for better education in a rapid-

ly changing, scientific era, teachers' salaries should rise even faster than living costs.

The decision of the Board of Education should be reconsidered — perhaps with more community discussion. It is a matter of serious concern. State aid for education is being increased substantially this year. Let's use it for raising teachers' salaries.

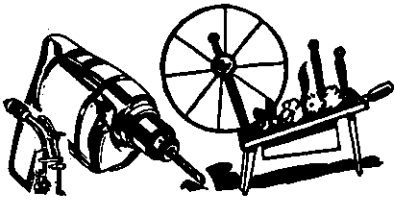

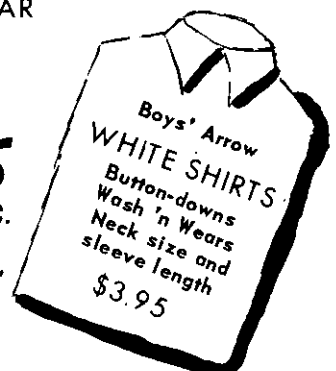

**200 TRI-VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS TO AID  
CANCER SOCIETY'S "LIGHTS ON" CAMPAIGN**

April will be National Cancer Month, it was announced by Millerd G. Larkin of the Albany County Unit of the American Cancer Society, chairman of the Tri-Village Area annual cancer crusade. Tuesday, April 5, has been designated for the "Lights On" campaign when 200 volunteers in the Tri-Village Area will solicit donations to the work of the American Cancer Society.

### A LITTLE OVER A WEEK LEFT TO GET THOSE NICE GIRL SCOUT COOKIES

Uniformed Brownie, Intermediate and Senior Scouts will be approaching their neighborhood friends, until April 2, in order to sell Girl Scout Cookies, proceeds from which will support the Camping Program of the Hudson Valley Girl Scout Council. Six Day Camps, one Troop Camp and one Resident Camp, which are operated by the Hudson Valley Council, are not supported by the Community Chest, and since camping fees do not cover the cost of maintenance or camp capital improvements, the sale of Girl Scout Cookies meets this expense. This year there will be major improvements at Camp Little Notch at Fort Ann; Camp IS-SHO-DA at East Greenbush; and further developments of the Council's six Day Camps located throughout Albany, Rensselaer, Greene and Columbia counties.

In addition to the Camp Development Program, the Girl Scout Cookie Sale benefits the troops directly by giving the girls an approved way of raising money for their troop treasuries. The troop will sell the cookies for forty cents a box and will

receive a five cent profit for each box sold. Mr. Joseph Einhorn, chairman of the 1960 Cookie Sale, has announced the goal is 190,000 boxes. This year, for the first time, four varieties of cookies are being sold: vanilla, assorted sandwich, double fudge-filled, and cooky-mints.
