A clock is more than just a timepiece to Frank Peckham of Douglas Road, Delmar.

The ticking of the many clocks in the Peckham household gives evidence of an interest which includes collecting, reassembling, repairing and digging into the historical lore of watches and their makers.

A good many years ago, during a long convalescence Frank discovered the insides of his first clock. Since then he has been trading, buying and discovering clocks and watches, taking them apart and putting them together, and developing a library of watch and clock history.

Probably his oldest clock is one he found in a Canadian shop and for which he swapped a repeater watch. It is a table clock, made near the end of the 1500's.

It still keeps good time and one cannot help but be impressed by the delicate, detailed decoration which has gone into its works. Another of particular interest is a ship's chronometer (of the 1790-1800 period) which was sent to Frank in pieces, from England. Now it is in perfect running order with its case intact and on the case is "No. 72." No. 202 of the same make and style is in the British Museum.

Frank Peckham has two work areas in his home, one for watches and one for clocks. In the watch area one can find leaf watches, repeaters (that strike the hours and half hours), pendulum watches, calendar watches, a railroad watch that runs for 60 hours, and watches of innumerable well-known makes and many that are not so well known. And in clocks throughout the house there are steeple clocks; an experimental clock (in which a maker tried out a new idea and if it was not practical made no more), a ship's clock that strikes the ship's bells, grandfather clocks, banjo clocks, and many others with wooden works, with brass works, with pendulums and without.
