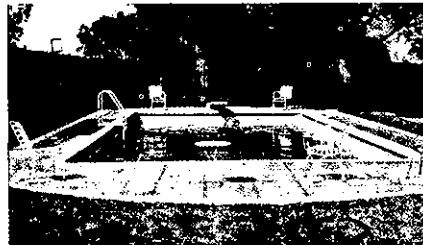

RPI HAMS TO RELAY MESSAGES ANYWHERE IN NORTH AMERICA

Free radiogram, anyone?

Student operators of W2SZ on the campus of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute are now prepared to send 25-word messages to anyone in the United States, Canada or Mexico, except to people living within 75 miles of Troy. It is done, of course, through the network of amateur (ham) radio clubs and stations which get in touch

with each other through call letters. A message received by a station is telephoned to the addressee, or mailed if he has no telephone. At least a day should be allowed for delivery of a message to any person in the United States. Since there is no charge for the service, delivery of message is not guaranteed, but they do get through.

Here's how it is done, according to William E. Price of the RPI News Bureau: Messages, not over 25 words long, (continued on next page)

think first of Alice Johnson as a portrait painter, however she says: "Portraits are actually not my major interest but apparently I have more ability in this field." And indeed her portraits have an exceedingly "living" look.

"I am a realist, but I am constantly endeavoring to develop better design and freedom of expression," she commented when asked in which of the numerous categories she might be placed. As an example of this constant endeavor she is at present studying sculpture at the Utica School of Fine Arts. "I feel that working in an entirely different branch of the arts and a different medium will benefit my painting and give a

new approach and viewpoint.

She doubts that her style has changed a great deal over the years she has painted, except in the improvement and change that comes in "the struggle to find a better way to express what I see and feel — a more artistic and exciting way."

Mrs. Johnson graduated from Syracuse College of Fine Arts and later studied with Carl Faille, Betty Lancaster and Rudy Helmo. She worked in commercial advertising for a few years and then settled down to becoming a housewife and painter. She paints in a small room which she laughingly calls her studio, but, more often, follows the light and paints in whatever room is best for the picture. "I grab whatever time there is available apart from household care. One can't wait for inspiration. Inspiration, as far as I am concerned, comes only with hard work."

Alice Johnson's exhibit will be in the Library through the first week in May.

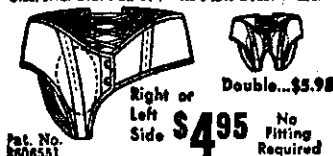
