Arrangements are under the direction of the Service and Hospitality committee, Mrs. Isaac Udell, chairman.

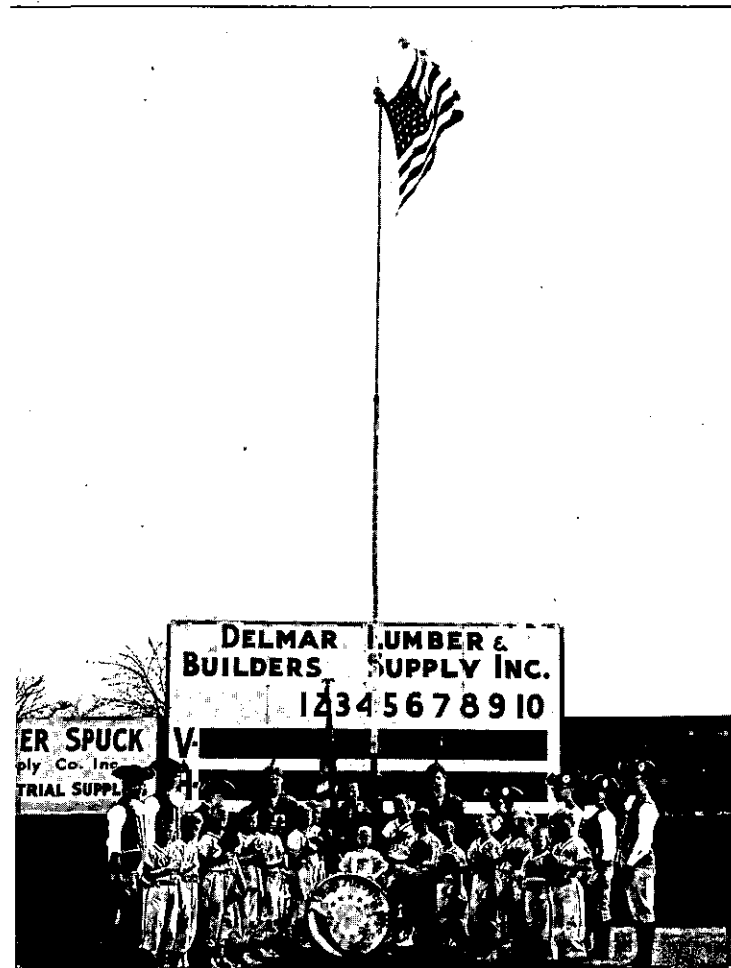

GRIPING ABOUT SOMETHING***

1. All of a sudden, we've started to receive publicity and news stories **TYPED COMPLETELY IN CAPITAL LETTERS** SO THAT IT'S AWFULLY HARD FOR US TO DISTINGUISH WHAT **MUST** BE IN CAPS and what needn't be.
