



It is Sock and Saffron Dramatic Society's presentation of Inherit the Wind, a recent Broadway hit based on the Scopes "Monkey Trials" of the early 20's and the epic struggle between Clarence Darrow and William Jennings Bryan over the right of a young Tennessee teacher to reveal Darwin's theory of evolution to his students.

The play is entirely studentproduced, cast and directed. The new drama group says membership "affords opportunity for experience in all phases of amateur theatre to the aspiring thespian." Mrs. Helen Adler is faculty advisor.

Commander Alvin W. Greenwood conducted two meetings, recently, at Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post #1040, American Legion, Delmar, concerning the Delmar By-Pass Project. About 30 representatives of civic, fraternal, and veterans' organizations in the Town of Bethlehem were present. The meetings stemmed from the fear that the By-Pass Project of the New York State Department of Public Works had been shelved. and were intended to urge the DPW to act on construction of the proposed road this year.

The By-Pass would extend from a point on Route 9-W near Corning Hill in the Town of Bethlehem to a point at or near the intersection of Routes 85 and 85A in the Town of New Scotland.

The Blanchard Post submitted a broad resolution to the Department of Public Works in 1957 with various steps recommended to solve the traffic problem in this fast-growing area. Since then, the road has been widened to three lanes at Elsmere and Delaware Aves., and now Delaware Ave. will be widened from the Normanskill Bridge to Elsmere Avenue or beyond. Both of these improvements were recommended by the Blanchard Post, along with construction of the By-Pass.

The desperate need for a more modern route to our 91thurbs was quite evident recently when a large fire occurred on Delaware Ave. near the Plaza Shopping Center on a Sunday. Traffic was halted for two hours. If this had occurred during a peak traffic period, the traffic jam would be the worst in the history of this area, simply because there is only one direct route in this direction [to Del-
