Something different has appeared this year in the wake of the fragrant apple and pear blossoms at Will-Roy Orchards. Blended among the fruit trees and the stately oaks are the new buildings of Tall Timber Day Camp, ready for boys and girls four to 14 years old.

Director Kenneth George says that the new camp will emphasize values most closely akin to true camping; an appreciation of our natural resources and an ability to enjoy and use them. To this end, the camp's 25 acres of pleasant woodland will be used for the teaching of fascinating wood lore and nature activities under the direction of Robert Andrews who has had years of experience in scouting and camp activities.

A major effort will be made in the swimming instruction area, supervised by Clarence Lephart, BCHS swimming coach and former assistant director of the Albany County Red Cross Summer "Learn to Swim" program. The camp's aim is to teach thoroughly and to improve all swimming skills. The 500-ft. waterfront contains two instruction cribs surrounded by a dock for supervision and safety, 200 feet of sand beach and 300 feet of sun deck.

Nestled in the woods is a large recreation hall containing an indoor stage, and nearby, buildings housing dressing rooms and modern lavatory and shower facilities. To the left of the assembly green are four acres of play field; baseball and softball diamonds bordered by tempting apple trees. To the right is the gaily-colored camp office; a building which also houses the infirmary and three arts and crafts rooms. Hidden from view are trails and campsites where campers will pitch their pup tents, cook out and camp overnight once in every camping period, if they wish.

Perhaps as a naturalized citizen I am a little more conscious of this act, but several people I spoke with felt the same indignation at the lack of respect.


