
"COMPULSION" NOW ON SHELLEY STAGE

The eighth and final play of the 1960 Shelley season will be Compulsion, Meyer Levin's powerful dramatization of his novel based on the Leopold-Loeb murder case of the 'twenties.

Judd Steiner and Artie Straus are two brilliant young intellectuals, graduates of the University of Chicago at 17 and 18, respectively. They've committed a murder, and confessed to it-

without too much prodding by the police. It is a crime that the police and the press call senseless, brutal, and perverted. Judd and Artie claim that it was an experiment, a test - they were trying to commit the "perfect murder" in order to prove a rather confused concept of their own; in order to prove that they were "Supermen," and therefore beyond the reaches of the law. as ordinary men know it. They claim to have chosen their victim, a young boy they knew, the age of Artie's brother, by chance.

The question throughout the play is "why?" The facts of the case are all known at the outset, and it soon becomes a matter of interpretation, the prosecution calling it a "thrill murder," and basing a lot of its case on the fact that the boys were sons of millionaires. The defense




