available. They emphasize that the length of mortgage should be governed by a man's earning power over a 30-year period and his ultimate potential. They are skeptical of the real-estate trend toward "trading-in" old homes on the purchase of a new one, but are interested in more information about this practice.

When they buy their "ideal home," it could cost \$5,000 to \$15,000 more than their present home. If they could remodel their present home as they would like to have it, they might spend from \$3,000 to \$15,000. Most women would spare no expense in remodeling their kitchens, agreeing to pay up to \$5,000 exclusive of constructural alterations to get it "perfect."

Though they don't regard their homes as an investment


per se, all feel that their present homes have increased in value due to improved localities, increased land values and the addition of rooms or modernization of kitchens.

> BEG FOR HIGH QUALITY IN HOME EQUIPMENT
