#### ADVENT CALENDAR SALE TO AID IN ESTABLISHING EPILEPSY CONTROL CENTER

Freedom has been one of America's greatest heritages. and vet many of our fellowmen remain bound by a stigma derived from ignorance and fear. Shackled by prejudices and the lack of funds, the epileptics of our country must sit and wait for the time when they too will be freed from their bonds and allowed to lead lives comparable to those of their neighbors.

Neurology is the field of medicine with the knowledge and men capable of treating epilepsy, but doctors are few and the facilities expensive. At the present time there are the means for treating only one out of five of the 1,500,000 men, women, and children afflicted with this disorder. Attempting to remedy this situation is the National Epilepsy League and various local groups. Through the sale of the "Little Christmas Town" calendars the organization hopes to obtain funds for the construction and operation of "seizure control centers," one of which will be located in Albany as soon as funds are available.

### JUNIOR HIGH PARENTS CALL SPECIAL MEETING TO ASK "WHERE WILL OUR CHILDREN GO TO COLLEGE?" other 195,000 college eligibles?

The urgent problem of "Where and how will our children go to college?" will be probed at 8 P.M., Thursday, Nov. 17 at the Junior High School.

Alarmed by skyrocketing tuition rates and the increasing inability of New York State students to gain admission to out-of-state colleges (because we have limited facilities for "exchange" students) the Bethlehem Central Junior High Parents' Steering Committee has called a meeting, to which all interested persons in the community are invited.

College enrollment in New York State is expected to soar from today's 200,000 to 400.-000 by 1970. New York State 4-year college facilities now building will accommodate only 5,000. What will happen to the
