





KIDNEY TRANSPLANTATION A POSSIBLE ANSWER TO AN . AGE-OLD PROBLEM

Mention end stage kidney disease and most often people will tell you: "Yes, I've heard of someone who died from it" or "Wasn't that what actress Carole Lombard died of?" In few cases is the true extent of the problem understood or appreciated. The fact is, that in the area of killer diseases only circulatory problems and cancer kill more Americans than kidnev disorders. Kidnev disease ranks as the fourth most prevalent killer sharing the ominous spot next to auto mishaps. Why then isn't the problem drawing more attention or more being done?

Partially, the answer lies with the disease itself, which for many years defied recognition. All too often, even in comparatively modern times, definite diagnosis was not made until a patient's kidneys had been largely destroyed. The warning signs of kidney disease often are not recognized and sometimes ignored altogether. They are usually not violent symptoms; but consist of the following:

 Burning or difficulty during urination — often excused as a natural consequence of age or a slight cold.

2. More frequent urination, particularly at night.

3. Passage of brown or bloody appearing urine; often shrugged off as the result of drinking too much coffee.

4. Puffiness around the eyes and swelling of the hands and feet. Sometimes thought of as a touch of hay fever or an aller-

5. Pain in the small of the back, just below the ribs, not aggrevated by movement and not often severe enough to create alarm.

If the public could be educated to watch out for kidney disease, many lives might be Modern drug therapy can work wonders in clearing up the deep seated infections which destroy the kidneys. In past years, when it was determined a patient's kidneys were failing, little could be done. Without the kidneys which serve as the body's miracle filter in removing impurities from the blood stream, uric acid and poisons would soon reach a fatal level.

During the last decade, work to develop and improve upon an artificial kidney machine led to the Hemodialysis unit as we know it today. Essentially a filter and washing machine for the blood, the unit appears not unlike the familiar appliance, except that a patient's blood is taken to the machine via a shunt in the arm and routed back to the patient's blood stream after treatment. In the late 1960's, the scarcity of these expensive machines often forced decisions to be made as to who would live and who would die a sad state for the most affluent nation on earth.

Today, dialysis has become a somewhat standardized procedure for the nation's kidney patients and includes a trip to a hospital's dialysis unit or their own home unit a few times a week, for several hours. Even if the procedure were successful, it would still represent an unwelcome imposition on a patient's life style. Dialysis seems to have other drawbacks however. The "machine" is not the sophisticated organ that the kidney is and tends to remove valuable substances from the blood as well as the poisons. While there seems to be considerably variations in an individual patient's tolerance of dialysis; statistically dialysis patients have markedly higher mortality rate than the rest of the population and most often do not experience what might be determined the glow of good health

The alternative to dialysis maintenance is a transplant; a subject usually misunderstood and not fully appreciated by the general public. In spite of the greatly publicized and generally unsuccessful attempts in the area of heart transplantation: the fact is that kidney transplantations (those lasting a minimum of two years or more) are highly successful. Some recent studies indicate that under optimum conditions upwards of two-thirds of attempted kidney transplants could be successful. While science does not provide all the answers in determining the chances for a successful transplant, enough is known about body chemistry and tissue typing to insure at least a fair chance of success. Generally after the transplant a patient experiences a "rebirth;" a sort

of vitality that had been missing while on dialysis. While there is still some debate as to whether improved dialysis or better transplantation will be the final answer to the kidney problem, the question is, unfortunately, academic in many cases. Cadaver kidneys which could be available in sufficient numbers from an enlightened public are scarce and hundreds of patients who doctors feel would benefit from a transplant are unable to avail themselves of one.

The Kidney Foundation, through its organ donor program, provides both information and answers to questions regarding transplantations. In many ways, the concept of organ transplantation is in a position comparable to that of blood transfusions fifty years ago. There remains much ignorance and even superstition concerning the subject. Willing the kidneys after death is not a complicated procedure and involves merely the carrying of a small wallet card. The overall goal for the 1975 campaign is \$2,517,787. This money is to support the vital work of the 32 voluntary United Way agencies.
