
Library Notes

Identification Flashcards will be issued to residents Senior Citizens in the Town of Bethlehem at the Justice Building, 118 Adams St., Delmar, N.Y. on Monday, September 30, 1974. The hours are 9:30 A.M. to 12 Noon and 12:30 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. This Flashcard Plan will replace the Senior Citizen Bus Token presently in use and will allow Senior Citizens to ride C.D.T.A. buses for halffare

The Program is being offered on a trial basis from October 1, 1974 through March 31, 1975, and is being funded jointly by the County and the Capital District Transportation Authority.

Albany County Department of Social Services will issue the Flashcards during the month of September at sixteen (16) locations throughout the County. Senior Citizens who are sixtyfive (65) years of age or older who wish to participate in this program can do so by applying at any one of the various centers






