A firm stand against the pending Bond Issue is taken by John Clyne, member of the B.C. Board of Education, in his following letter:

Dear Joni:

With unemployment at the highest rate in over 28 years, and with all taxes going up, the Board of Education of the Bethlehem School District continues its reputation as the "Big Spenders" by proposing an unnecessary Bond Issue of \$1,336,000, plus an interest cost of \$513,760, for a total of \$1,851,760.

Currently the Bethlehem Central School District has the highest cost per-pupil in the entire area. With an annual decreasing number of pupils, the current Shool District budget is \$9,900,000, the highest in history. The proposal is to spend \$1,851,760 more.

The rationale for the Bond Issue is the fact that there are some roofs to be repaired, and possibly a new boiler in one of the schools. The listed cost of these repairs in the proposed Bond Issue is \$426.023 (and that is admittedly padded by 18-1/2%) so the real cost of the proposed needed items is \$361,010. The balance of the items in the Bond Issue are "add-ons;" nice to have if you can get them.

Not mentioned in the Bond proposal (but added on the tax-payer) is \$149,000 for architects charges, and \$513,760 for interest, a total of \$662,760



Property Tax Deadline


Bethlehem property owners are reminded that Tuesday, February 18 is the final day for payment of the 1975 property tax bills without incurring a late payment charge — this year's special extension expires and the 1% collection fee commences on Wednesday, February 19. However, all mail received on the morning of February 19 will be honored without the fee.

Owners wishing to defer payment until February 28 may do so, but will be assessed a 1% late payment charge. Payments made during March incur a 1-1/2% additional penalty. Kenneth P. Hahn, Receiver of Taxes & Assessments, advises that taxes unpaid as of April 1st will be transferred to the Albany County Treasurer for late collection.


Judo Course


