

bicentennial bulletin

(editor's note: this is a new column developed for any organization with news of Bicentennial Events.)

The Bethlehem Central School District is taking the lead in initial planning for a Bicentennial Pageant to be produced in April, 1976.

As envisioned now by school officials, the school district will cooperate with the Town of Bethlehem Bicentennial Committee in the sponsoring of a musical and dramatic production in which school children and adult residents of the community will participate.

It will incorporate musical selections, both choral and instrumental, with dramatic scenes and readings, and use of many special effects.

Because this is viewed as a very ambitious undertaking, the school district plans immediate appointment of a staff member to serve as director, so he can begin script preparation and rehearsal scheduling. It is expected that Richard Feldman, a High School English teacher whose expertise as a choreographer and musical director is well-known, will get the assignment.

An initial meeting to begin plans for the pageant was held on Feb. 25, and it was agreed that all segments of the community should be represented

on a planning committee. Anyone who would like to become involved in the pageant may contact Dr. Zinn.

I received a letter this week from Wheeler Smith, manager of Handy Dandy Cleaners, presenting his explanation of what happened concerning the two women's coats which they claimed had been cleaned by him - one ruined and one lost.

Dear Joni,

As the manager of the Handy Dandy Cleaners at 240 Delaware Avenue, I would like to present to the residents of Bethlehem my side of the story. I would like it known that since June 10, 1974, when I took over management, all dry cleaning has been done right here at Handy Dandy. In addition, since June of 1974, I have not had to settle any sort of claim resulting from dry cleaning done here in Delmar. In fact business has picked up considerably to what it was prior to my taking over Handy Dandy 'Cleaners. Same day service, the lowest professional dry cleaning prices in the Tri-Village area, and prompt rectifying of any complaints have helped toward this end.

In reference to the letter published by Mrs. Jean Smith in the February 27th issue, let me state that I have never heard of this case since I have been in business in Delmar. Mrs. Smith apparently believes I am the same manager she had trouble contacting three years ago. Here six days a week, I am available to receive compliments, inquirys, complaints about my dry cleaning business. The raincoat to which Mrs. Smith refers was cleaned by the Commodore Cleaners of Troy, owners of Handy Dandy Cleaners, and not done here.

As to the letter published in the Spotlight on February 6 by Mrs. Carlton Engelhardt, the same explaination holds true. The coat was sent out to the Commodore Cleaners. The white vinyl coat was taken to Flah's, where Mrs. Engelhardt

purchased it, and the people there said the coat looked fine. I will not "admit that the coat is beyond looking fit to wear" because that would not be true. Mrs. Engelhardt also attributed to me the quotation "just give me one more chance and I'll kill it, or cure it." At no time did I say this to her.

In conclusion let me restate what I have noted here: first, all dry cleaning, both bulk and professional has been done at Handy Dandy Cleaners for the past nine months. Secondly, the claim of Mrs. Smith as well as that of Mrs. Engelhardt were not a result of "incompetent business practices" of Handy Dandy Cleaners, rather of the Commodore Cleaners of Troy. I trust the residents of Bethlehem will realize that my business is suffering through these problems which occured before I took over the business. Thank you for hearing my side of the story.

Thank you for writing. I sincerely hope everything is worked out to satisfy everyone involved. I am also very sorry if the printing of these two letters has affected your business intake, but I felt as an editor, I must be ready to publish anyone's oppinions, because I believe everyone has a right to be heard.




