## Turn Meat Loaf Into a Double Delight



Twin meat loaves are a double delight. Cap one with hot mushroom sauce; serve up its twin with a cold olive topping.

NEW YORK (ED) — Meat loaf is one of those old family standbys that appears in every good cook's collection of favorite recipes. But (admit it) meat loaf *does* get boring. There's a sameness to it — and a pervasive aura of budget-consciousness — that just doesn't do justice to its potential for savory goodness.

One way to make meat loaf more than "just meat loaf" is to make more than one. Meat loaf twins offer a choice of sauces that change everyday flavor into something special. As a matter of fact, meat loaf twins would be ideal fare for a buffet party. Cook it now and serve it later — to the accompaniment of assorted antipasto, made up of Italian specialties like artichoke hearts, mushroom salad, olives, roasted peppers and eggplant caponata. All are available (no preparation needed) in the ethnic section of the supermarket.

### MEAT LOAF OREGANO

2½ lbs. ground beef, veal and pork  
2 eggs  
2 Tbsps. chopped parsley  
1 Tbsp. olive oil  
½ cup Italian flavored bread crumbs  
2 tsps. lemon juice  
salt and pepper  
1 tsp. oregano  
1 clove garlic, minced

1 jar (16 oz.) Progresso Spaghetti Sauce with Mushrooms

Pre-heat oven to 350°. Combine all ingredients except spaghetti sauce, working them together with your hands. Shape into two oval loaves. Place in lightly greased shallow pan. Pour half of spaghetti sauce over loaves. Bake 1 hour, basting at intervals with remainder of sauce. Serve one loaf with hot mushroom sauce and the other with cold olive topping. Each loaf serves 4.

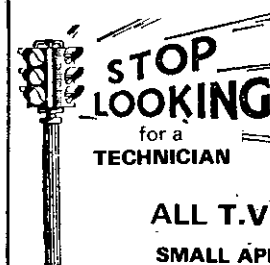

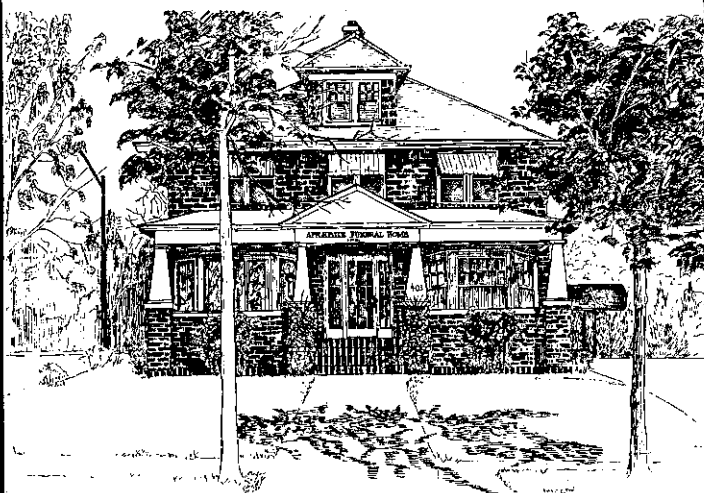
