GOAT BREEDERS HOLD SHOW

GOATS HAVE BEEN IN THE NEWS LATELY, making the front page of the Wall Street Journal and starring in the Six O'Clock News on local WRGB-TV. Why? Because in these economyminded days more and more people are finding that instead of running up the dairy bill at the market, it pays to keep a friendly dairy goat.

These dairy animals require less space, are easier to handle and more economical to maintain than a large size cow. People who couldn't keep a cow can often find room for a couple of goats in an empty car stall in the garage, with part of the backyard fenced for an exercise pen. A quality dairy goat will give three to six quarts of milk daily, and cost less than a dollar a day. Two dairy goats can provide a family of four with ample milk for drinking and cooking year round.

If this sounds like the type of recession-fighter you'd like to have on your side, come to the 9th Annual Buck and Kid Show, at the Altamont Fairgrounds, on Saturday, May 17th. The show, sponsored by the New York State Dairy Goat Breeders Association, is open to the public — free admission, free parking. Judgng will begin at 9 A.M., and continue all day. 


