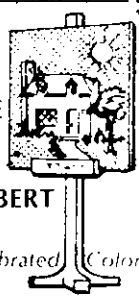

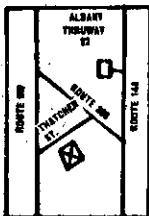

The Spotlight Goes to School

Report Released

Last Monday, June 16th, the Public Employment Relations Board's (PERB) assigned factfinder's report, regarding the Bethlehem Central Board of Education and the Bethlehem Central Teachers' Association negotiations impasse, was released to the media. Factfinder Rev. David Randles has recommended that the Board grant the Bethlehem teachers a 9.4% salary increase but no increase in benefits. The recommended package would cost the school district \$403,000 plus \$157,700 of built-in fringe benefit costs. This would translate to a total salary and benefit increase of \$2,007 per teacher.

The Bethlehem School Board has budgeted for salary and fringe benefit improvements a total of \$260,700, which amounts to \$941 per teacher, and they believe this is an equitable offer in view of: the state of the economy, the fact that there were no layoffs, and the fact that Bethlehem teachers are already receiving the highest public school teacher salaries in the Capital area — the average teacher salary is now \$15,300, and fringe benefits cost 25% more.

On the half day planning for elementary teachers, Randles recommended that in "any week when there are already two days lost because of vacation, there will be no half-day planning time for teachers." He further recommended that "there shall be no more than thirty-five (35) ... planning days for elementary teachers in the school year 1975-76." The Board finds this recommendation unacceptable and considers the resolution of this problem of very high priority.

Since the School Board considers all aspects of negotiations to be a "package," they have not accepted the factfinder's report. However, the Board has announced that their negotiator is available to continue work for a new contract as soon as the Association is ready.

A Big Change

Renovation of Siena College's Gibbons Hall into a Campus Center is underway, reports Donald W. Kiszka, Vice President for Business Affairs.

Changes in Gibbons Hall will result in fuller utilization of the existing space with considerable economy, Kiszka added.
