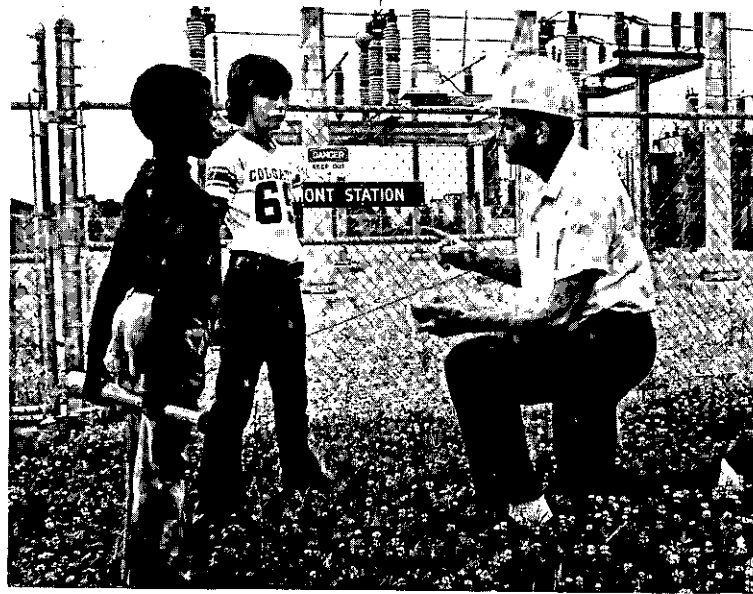
Plans have also been completed for the story hours for the preschoolers. There will be two on Wednesday mornings at 10 a.m.

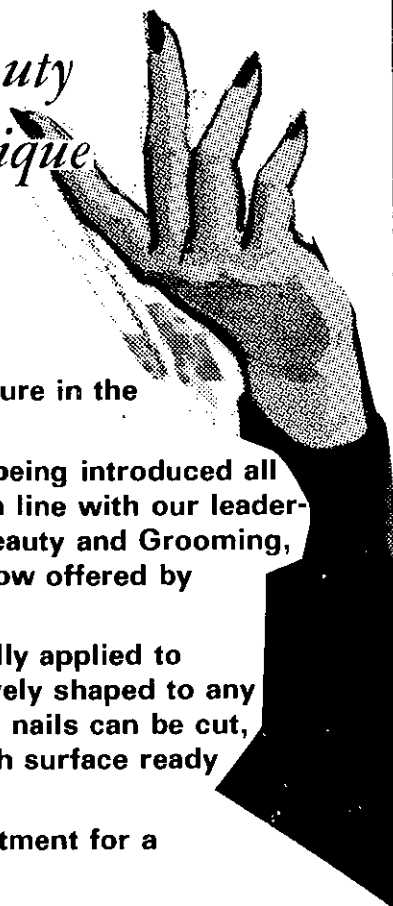
