





Best Makeup Base: Clean, Conditioned Skin

The best foundation for any cosmetic is skin that is really clean and in good condition. Thorough removal of cosmetics, atmospheric dirt, and perspiration—even when you feel so tired you think you can just about make it to bed—is the way to help keep skin clear, soft, and ready for any makeup.

A dermatologist, writing for a medical journal, suggests that adolescents wash their faces three to four times a day to remove sebum. However, the mature adult usually does not need to wash his face more than once or twice a day.






