Two Fascinating Displays

The month of July brings two fascinating displays to the Bethlehem Public Library.

The entrance corridors are hung with brightly colored examples of the art of Swedish Rya. The Rya was done by Jo Bourque and students from the Bethlehem Adult Education Program, the Voorheesville Adult Education Program, the Guild-erland Adult Education Program, and the Tri-Village Welcome Wagon Rya Group. Included in the exhibit are wall hangings, purses, pillows, and even a beautiful white sheep.

The glass display cabinet in the Library near the Circulation Desk holds a part of an interesting collection of post marks owned by Louis Picarazzi, the Post Master of Selkirk. Since the U.S. Postal Service came into being, postmarks which identify their origin are being faded out. Mr. Picarazzi has collected thousands of postmarks and hopes someday to have one from every post office. The marks on display are just a small fraction of his collection, but are from all over the United States. Mr. Picarazzi's hobby is an unusual one, but fascinating.

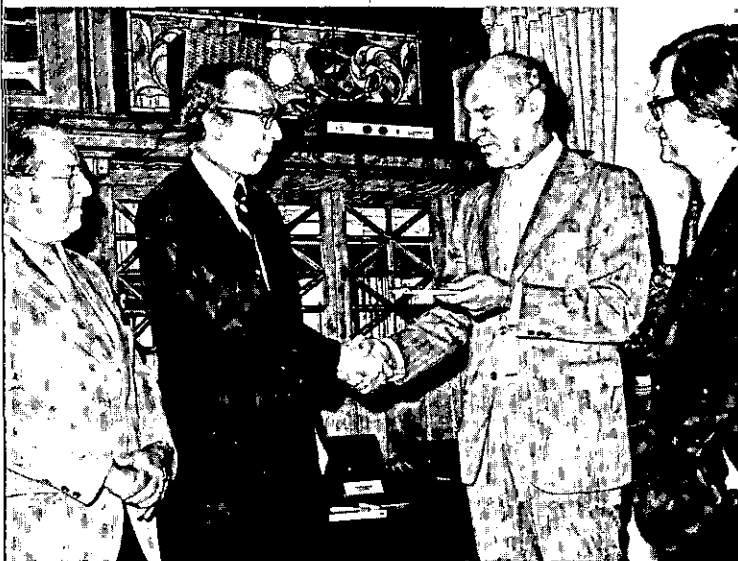
Other leaders, besides Sharon, will include Nancy Smith, Royce VanEver, Ellen Carnahan, and Peter McGinty.
