

A sewer thing in Slingerlands

A hardy group of Slingerlands citizens is keeping that community's new sewer system in the headlines. First it was the impact of the system on zoning, legal specifications for properties and housing construction versus pre-sewer real estate values, and the major controversy over the sprawling Lyndhurst development. Then there was the digging, the displacement of lawns, street pavements, trees and shrubs. Now it's sewer taxes.

As the first 168 households prepare to hook into the system, a contingent of residents led by Mrs. Sandra Peterson Hardt complained to the town board that they felt it was unfair to be charged with the sewer tax before the service was available. It appears now that some sections of the Slingerlands system will not be ready

for residential hookups until after Jan. 1, when the 1976 tax levies become effective.

The dissidents suggested that the town pro-rate or rebate taxes to compensate for the time lost in bringing the system fully on-line. At last weeks' board meeting, Supervisor Harry H. Sheaffer explained that the municipal law "is quite specific" on this point: that people who stand to benefit from a service are liable for the tax when the debt service is due. The town must begin making payments on the sewer debt in January.

Mrs. Hardt said she would continue her battle to gain what she called "equitable taxation" for Slingerlands residents. Sheaffer, her favorite target since the Lyndhurst turmoil, said it was "quite possible by the first of the year that other sections will be able to hook into the system" before the tax period starts Jan. 1.

Two days later the town sent out notices to 168 of the approximately 500 addresses on the sewer system advising them they could tie into the subterranean network whenever they can get their individual contractors to do the work.

Blackout on police hassle

More than four months of haggling between the Bethlehem Police Benevolent Association and the town board could be resolved next month, but there's no indication it will be.

The long stalemate is currently in the fact-finding stage

and both sides are committed to a no-comment news blackout until at least Dec. 3. That's the date of the final hearing to be conducted by Peter Prosper, a Union College professor serving as the appointed Public Employee Relations Board (PERB) arbiter in the controversy.

Prosper met with representatives of the town and PBA on Nov. 10 to determine work rules, define the issues and set a Dec. I deadline for receiving written arguments. Prosper will hear further presentations and cross-examinations at the Dec. 3 session. He declined to estimate how long it will take him to prepare his fact-finders' report.

Teachers chafe at stalemate

Bethlehem Central Teachers Asociation, back on a work-torule formula as a protest against the long delay in contract negotiations with the district school board, are hoping for a break in the impasse this week.

Signs that the BCTA's patience is wearing thin came last week when members called off their earlier moratorium and resumed work-to-rule. That means performing no extra duties not specified in the contract, including after-school meetings, outside-classroom school or community activities and an embargo on taking work home.

In addition, BCTA negotiator Gordon Molyneux asked the Public Employee Relations Board (PERB) to set up a hearing this week on the impasse.

Teachers and the administration have been at odds in November 20, 1975 – PAGE 7 contact talks since last spring. A report by a PERB-appointed mediator, Rev. David C. Randles, was accepted by the BCTA but turned down by the school board, which sent the negotiations into another round of searching for compromises.

Meanwhile, to dramatize the stalled talks, Bethlehem teachers scheduled a mass picketing ploy at the district offices Wednesday of this week as the board of education assembles for its regular meeting.

Tri-village has its best seller

An unseasonably warm sun was pouring through the windows of the Delmar Methodist Church library last week when Irma Crounse and Barbara Stokoe sat down to put in more volunteer hours checking names in the Tri-Village Directory.

They've been doing this a lot lately as the press deadline for Bethlehem's perennial bestseller gets closer.

To thousands of people in Delmar, Elsmere and Slingerlands, the Tri-Village directory is a household bible in its own right.

"Everyone seems to want this book," says Mrs. Helen Schiller, a volunteer section leader for more than 30 years. "That's why I stay with it."

And Mrs. Elmer Reynolds, now 80, is still making calls in

the annual canvass. "I guess I've done just about everything from checking lists, making calls and sending out bills," she said. "I've worked on it every year since I came to live here 37 years ago."

Then there's Mrs. Carroll (Myrtle) Green, 8 Ridge Rd., Elsmere, who covered Ridge Rd., a' short street between Kenwood Ave. and Poplar Dr., for 40 years until she sold her house earlier this year. And Mrs. Winnie Long in Heldervale took care of her section of Slingerlands for 30 years.

Mrs. Long's retirement almost caused the directory publishers to abandon a sizeable section of Slingerlands from Carstead Dr. and Fisher Blvd. along New Scotland to Mason Rd. and Upper Font Grove.

about it, and she and a new group of volunteers rallied to the rescue.

Donations needed

The directory is one of the staunchest of community institutions, and has been since the first edition appeared 45 years ago. The originators began the first canvass in 1930, and got the first books out in 1931. They announced an intention of publishing a directory every year, but added a qualifier: "... if the first issue is successful financially."

For decades the book was distributed free, supported by modest advertising and \$1 donations from householders. Today the donations have to average \$3.

The Topsy principle

As a section leader Mrs. Schiller had 40 women on the canvass from Delaware Ave. to Feura Bush Rd. and east from Elsmere Ave., "but it was too much." Now she's down to 22.

She has watched new residential areas blossom, new streets like Dumbarton and the Kenholm area, now well established neighborhoods. Only once could she recall an unapproving reception.

'A man told me he had come out to Elsmere from Albany to remain anonymous," she said. "That was quite a few years ago, when Greenleaf Dr. was a new street."

Now Dumbarton, Greenleaf and scores of other streets are familiar addresses in the Tri-Village directory, this year planning a press run of 5,800. Arthur Jomes is the new business manager, succeeding Audrey Madison, and George Chesbro is chairman of the directory association.

Meanwhile in contributed office space at the Methodist Church the long job of checking lists is nearly over for Barbara Stokoe, secretary, and Irma Crounse, coordinator. And when the books are distributed sometime next year, that little pocket of Slingerlands, which nearly didn't make it because there was no one to cover the routes, is safely in the Tri-Village Area Directory, 1976 edition, where it belongs.

"It was a tough loss. We deserved to win," commented Ritchko. With eight minutes left, the Eagles started a drive. With less than two minutes to go, quarterback Randy Grenier fumbled on the Shaker 5. Then the Bison, with the aid of questionable officiating, got the winning score. "I'm not complaining," said Ritchko, "but there were some very quick whistles, some questionable out-of-bounds calls and a crucial pass interference penalty that kept the Shaker drive alive. That penalty just killed us. From where I was standing, I didn't see any interference."

Season disappointing

Reflecting upon the season, Ritchko said, "We started out well, but injuries played a vital role in the season." 
