Reval doesn't mean higher taxes

New Scotland assessor updates residents on process

Around 70 residents of the town of New Scotland gathered at the town hall last Wednesday to attend an informational session that town Assessor Julie Nooney hosted to bring residents up to speed on the revaluation of properties currently under way in the town. Nooney said the purpose of her presentation was to educate residents on all the stages of the revaluation process.

By definition, a revaluation is "the reassessment of all properties in a municipality using a mass appraisal technique to determine the fair market value

of those properties." The last town-wide reassessment took place in 1997.

Nooney explained that the current revaluation is necessary to preserve equity in homeowners' assessments and taxes. Pointing out that she is also a town resident and homeowner, Nooney said, "I put in many extra hours here in town hall to make a conscientious effort to be as fair as possible."

Nooney also said that the belief that a revaluation will automatically increase a resident's taxes is a common misconception.

Board changes curriculum

A wellness program, a literacy study skill program and accelerated studio art for eighth grade students are three of the new curriculum choices that will be available to middle school students in the 2006-07 school year. The board of education approved all three at Wednesday's meeting.

"We met with the students extensively to get their thoughts and ideas about the classes," said Jody Monroe, principal at the middle school. "We've also had a lot of parent and teacher input."

By next year, all schools in the state will be required to have a wellness program, said Michael Tebbano, assistant superintendent for instruction.

The program will be a three-year integrated process that combines physical education, health classes and family and consumer sciences.

"Instead of a separate class in sixth grade, it will be incorporated over the three years of middle school," said Monroe of family and consumer sciences, better known as FCS, a modernized version of home economics.

"The intent is to give students tools and tips on how to think and learn best."

FCS will remain a separate course at the seventh grade level.

The more focused literacy study skills program is being offered to sixth-grade students.

car went off the road because his tires are bald and he skidded off into the woods.





School books needed for hurricane relief

Clarksville Elementary sends relief to hurricane-ravaged school

Cleaning up after last fall's book fair at Clarksville Elementary School, co-chair Abby Mouzakes had an idea — why not send some of the leftover books to victims of Hurricane Katrina?

Deborah Zimmerman, Mouzakes' co-chair, was one step ahead of Mouzakes. She had already looked online and found a school in Mississippi that was hit hard by tornadoes and high winds from the hurricane.

The result of their efforts are the 1,800 books that Clarksville students collected over the last four months, which have been steadily shipped to Sharon Elementary School in Laurel, Miss.

"Almost all the students have been involved in this project in some way," said Mouzakes. "Everyone is really enthusiastic about it."

Mouzakes and Zimmerman wanted to help Sharon Elementary rebuild its library.

Aside from significant damage to the building infrastructure, eight classrooms, the entire computer lab and the gym were totally destroyed. Mouzakes and Zimmerman wanted to give kids at Clarksville a real sense of giving that doesn't come from writing a check.

Children and parents scoured their bookshelves looking for books they didn't want anymore. Each class also decorated a backpack to give to the students of Sharon with decorations the kids thought they would enjoy.


"We've got the whole gamut of books, and we had to use discretion in

the selection that we sent," said Mouzakes. "We don't want to send all Sponge Bob or Batman."

Sharon Elementary School is similar in size to Clarksville, which was part of the goal. Finding a school comparable in size and student population would help the kids relate, Mouzakes said.

"This gives the kids the idea that they have really done something, and it's fun for them," she said.

Kelsey Bohl, a fifth grade student at Clarksville, said she felt really bad when she heard about the disaster.

"I wanted to do something about it, and I was really happy that the school donated all those books," she said.

Bohl donated about 15 of her old picture books. Alexis Mouzakes, Abby's daughter, donated about the same number.

A second grader, Alexis said

she donated about 20 books that she didn't like anymore.

"I feel good," she said.

Kelsey said after the backpacks are sent, she is hoping to keep in touch with some of the students at Sharon.

Donations have been dwindling, however, and the drive is still short

of its goal of collecting 2,500 books. The final shipment is scheduled to be delivered Jan. 31.

However, school officials at Sharon Elementary are pleased. They registered the school on FEMA for Kids, a Web site which helps children understand natural disasters, and received a huge influx of calls from schools wanting to help.

"Most of the schools that have helped us have had penny drives and book drives, and just this week we've been able to let kids come back to the library," said Lisa Ishee, educational specialist at Sharon Elementary School. "The kids have been begging for books, they are so excited to see books again. Clarksville school has been great."

Sharon Elementary School is 125 years old and located in Jones County, about 100 miles north of the Gulf Coast. Jones County was the hardest hit intercoastal county, with 115 tornadoes reported and lots of destruction, Ishee said.

"We came back to the school to check the damage, and we would just think 'how in the world will we ever rebuild this?' But it's getting better," said Ishee.

Some teachers had things in their classroom that were there for 20 years, Ishee said, which made the destruction that much more difficult to handle.

"We just wanted to die when we saw the classrooms," she said. "Even though it's gotten better, it will still take two or three years for things to be back to normal."


Drainage slows Kenwood traffic

Warm weather and rain has taken the Capital District by surprise, and unfortunately for commuters and residents along Kenwood Avenue, it's also taken their cars for a swim.

"We know there is a drainage problem in that area, but right now we just don't have the means to address it," said Dave Vardigan, assistant resident engineer at the Albany County Department of Transportation.

Most of the staff is on winter and snow duty, he said, meaning less manpower and

equipment to mitigate flooding in the area.

"We know we have a problem, but right now, all of our resources are limited," he said. "The weather has caused a real problem. The rain really threw us. If it was snow, we would have been able to handle it much better," he said.

Vardigan expects the DOT to address the problem in the spring.

In another drainage matter, work crews responded to a call from Cookies By Design at the Four Corners Saturday afternoon after the owners discovered a flooded basement.

"We sent our crew out

there, cleaned it up and then checked the street line," said Oliver Holmes, commissioner of public works in Bethlehem.

The flooding occurred about 1:30 Saturday afternoon. Work crews were able to pump out the basement with no additional problems.

Amy Pearlson, owner of Cookies By Design, said the flooding was no big deal. Packing materials and non-food items stored in the basement were thrown away, and the basement was professionally cleaned and disinfected.

"Nothing happened upstairs, and nothing touched the food," said Pearson.

'Village scheme' OK'd for new CVS store

It won't look like the average CVS.

The CVS that is proposed for Delaware Avenue across from its current location will have weathered wood signs and possibly more decorative molding, giving the building a "Cape-Cod-ish" feeling, according to planners.

Tuesday's planning board meeting approved signage for the project, although the actual project was approved last June. Karl Myers, a representative of CVS, said she and the town planners worked over the last few months to develop the project so it would serve the needs of both CVS and the town of Bethlehem.

"We worked very hard to fit this in the entire village scheme," said Myers.

Signs on the actual building will be internally lighted. The signs by the road will be 10 feet high and lit by three decorative lights on each side. The sign will be made of a material that looks like wood, but weathers better so it will last longer and look good, Myers said.

For months, the project was in "no man's land" according to town planner Jeff Lipnicky, because of the adoption process of the zoning

code. Because it received a negative declaration on the SEQR review, the project is exempt from the new zoning code that was adopted shortly after the comprehensive plan.

Town supervisor Theresa Egan said the new design will likely be a great addition to that corner.

"The planning board did a really good job, because the project was being reviewed during the comprehensive plan process, and they did a good job trying to guess what the new requirements would be," said Egan.

It's the town's responsibility to demand high quality, she said, but she admitted it was difficult due to negative impacts some design changes may have on project cost.

"The design will be a bit different, with windows, shingled roofing, and a nice entrance," she said. "The planning board was trying to alleviate the feeling that of too much parking lot. The planning board tried to get them to concentrate on that."

Luke J. Mullen of Elsmere, owner of the current CVS, said he does not yet know what he plans to do with the site once the new CVS is built.

"I really have no idea right now," he said. "The new CVS won't be up for quite awhile."

Anniversary stirs thoughts of alternative energies

Last week's news that it has been 25 years since the Iran hostages were released woke me up and carried me back instantly. I was 21 again, a senior in college, standing in my friend Marcy's dorm room, unable to breathe as I watched hostages deplane and embrace the families running toward them. Her little television's biggest workout usually came on Sunday nights, when we put popcorn in the industrial-sized silver bowl I'd "borrowed" from my work-study job in the dining hall, and a bunch of us gathered to watch Sunday night episodes of "Star Trek." Our hall mate John liked to call just after we all returned from the library and make reservations.

"One for popcorn and Star Trek," he'd say, and we'd all laugh like we were doing something worthy of Monty Python or Firesign Theater.

While we loved Star Trek, we avoided the evening news with the count of days that our fellow countrymen were being held hostage. I'd lived a semester in Germany, where many of us Americans had had Iranian roommates and come home believing that, really, we could all just get along.

It was John who wandered into Marcy's room while I stood there

in tears when the news clips showed the hostages returning to their families. He just started talking, and I held up my hand.

"Oh, you haven't seen this yet," he said. "Sorry. I bawled like a baby when I saw it this afternoon."

While the clutch at my heart remains today when I think of those moments — or see any family that's endured hardship reunited — we flip, protected college students were soon were back to joking. Marcy's Winnie-the-Pooh sat on her windowsill, and one evening, her window shade came down to his nose. John observed that he looked like he was a hostage; and how would he feel if he'd just been released? "I want a steak and a current newspaper," somebody piped up, and it was a phrase we repeated way too often for the rest of the year.

I like to think we've outgrown that sort of flippancy that comes from taking the tiny steps from the protection of our parents' homes to the protection of the Ivory Tower.

Being reminded last week that

the release took place just shortly after Ronald Reagan was sworn in also reminded me of the joke I heard the most in January 1981: "What's flat and glows in the dark?" "Iran after Reagan is inaugurated."

Twenty-five years ago, it might have been nervous laughter as we told the flat-and-glows-in-the-dark joke, but there was still a sense of confidence that nothing bad could happen to us. As Iran re-activates its nuclear policy, I feel nervous all over again.

Sept. 11 showed that something really bad can happen to us, and the anniversary of the hostage release made me wonder again if we shouldn't keep water in the basement (bottled, not the kind the rains brought last week); a full tank of gas in the car; and a few cans of Dinty Moore beef stew around. I wondered if the one friend we have who still lives in Manhattan with her family continues to keep a "go bag" packed and ready for her family.

We're not the planning kind, though — our Christmas tree just came down this past weekend. That's partly by design and partly because we put off big chores that involve getting out boxes, sorting and putting things away, and cleaning shelves now dusty after five weeks of Christmas knick-knacks filling space differently than the pictures we usually have displayed. Before Y2K, Chris stockpiled water and canned food; the boys held on to their Halloween candy should a worst-case scenario take place.

Hunting for extension cords in December, I found a few bottles of water from that non-emergency: were they still good to drink, or were they full of parasites? I watered the plants with that water, and while it didn't kill them, I didn't feed it to my family, either.

Events in the news make me hold my family tighter, which I think has as much to do with the fact that at 15 and 13, my children have become less mine and more their own individuals. As we discussed Christopher's midterm exam schedule and his study

strategy — a discussion that a few years ago I despaired we might ever have — he actually inquired what I had planned for the coming week. As much as I miss the little children my sons were, exchanges like that are a nice benefit to the fact that they are growing up. We are lucky that, for the most part, our children like us; and we are blessed that they are interesting people.

We talk a lot in our family about world events, mostly because the Internet has been the greatest thing for my husband, who can

Willie Winkie, sleeping with a nightcap on my head. We love our programmable thermostat, and I'm coveting a hybrid car.

"Wrong strategy, Mom," Christopher — who wears short-sleeved Hawaiian shirts all winter — told me. "We need to use up the fuel supply before people will really come up with alternatives." His current favorite riff is George Carlin's, pointing out how long our planet has been here, and that it's darn likely to survive anything we can do to it.

But the ecology was the hot topic in my teen years, and I feel compelled to do my bit to save the earth. Two summers ago, that involved the purchase of an electric lawn

now follow international events with ease.

"The Middle East has always been a problem, hasn't it?" Cormac observed post-9/11, making the observation that is the starting point for future generations of historians and political scientists.

Our boys love the flat-and-glows-in-the-dark joke. Cormac especially is an advocate of get-them-before-they-get-you, and getting rid of threats suits him better than staying up nights worrying about the source of the next blow. He frets about Osama bin Laden's whereabouts the way I used to worry about nuclear annihilation when I was a little girl in the Cold War era.

I kind of keep newspapers away from him, and am glad that our evening schedule doesn't include the nightly news. He knows a lot already, but I let him filter it through more liberal friends and his father's excellent information and interpretation.

We, like many Northeast families this winter, are also looking at world events through the lens of our heating bills, and the cost of filling up our automobiles. Our house is already cold enough that my 89-year-old grandmother wears long johns when she visits us between October and May; I look like Wee

mower, which is awkward to use, and had me believing for the first time that the oil companies really do control the world. It should be easier to get and run appliances and devices that use renewable energy.

We are lucky in our state to have some green energy policies in place; those wind farms might not be so beautiful on the landscape, but if they can reduce our dependence on depleting the earth's resources, they might be the way to go. And Christopher is partly right: there won't be alternative fuel sources till the public demands them, and we won't really demand them as long as the alternatives remain pricey.

So this winter, I'm keeping the non-liquid kind of nightcap handy so I can sleep warm in my chilly house; and I'm dropping my elected officials a line, requesting strengthened development of alternative fuel sources.

I'm not the only person advocating less dependence on foreign oil, nor the one who sees breaking that dependence as a way of fighting terrorism. In 25 years, I hope to be chatting with my grandchildren — in the warmth of my solar-heated or wind-powered home.



New Scotland water system needs upgrades

Bethlehem maintains it; seeks money to fix it

The town of Bethlehem applied for a grant to help provide funds for a study of the water system in New Salem. The money would fund upgrades to the system, which has been serving a small number of residents of New Scotland for more than a century.

"This is actually in the town of New Scotland, but the town of Bethlehem maintains it. It needs upgrades," said Supervisor Theresa Egan. "We're trying to find money to do this study, and then have the town of New Scotland take over."

The grant is new this year, said Oliver Holmes, commissioner of the Bethlehem public works department. A total of \$200,000 could be granted to both municipalities, with a match of \$10,000 from each community.

"We want to take a comprehensive look at the system, do some survey work on the water lines and do a lot of legal research on some of the old agreements," said Holmes. "This grant allows municipalities the money for a joint venture. In this case we would be looking at the areas in New Scotland that Bethlehem provides water to.

It's an old agreement."

Finding a better way to provide service to the approximately 300 customers will require survey work on water lines, and legal research to see who really owns the system.

"There are efficiencies to be gained by this study," he said.

The shared grant is in line with the town's overall goal of working closely with other municipalities.

"I think this is a great chance to use a regional approach," he said.

If the grant is awarded, it will likely be in last spring, Holmes said.


The town also approved the addition of an intern to assist the interdepartmental management advisory committee, which was formed last year to review town departments and make necessary changes to improve efficiency.

The committee, which includes Egan, board member

Sam Messina, Director of Economic Planning and Development George Leveille, Comptroller Judy Kehoe, and Jeff Danmeyer. MIS director, took on intern Dan French, who will spend 20 to 30 hours a week working with the committee, Egan said.

Although the review will be an ongoing process, initial recommendations should be completed in a year, Egan said.

"This committee provides us with benchmarking information, and we're looking at other ways to gain efficiencies in the town," she said.

Cellist brings Albany alive

Yo-Yo Ma just part of downtown excitement

When it comes to being a music critic, I may not know much about the technical aspects of the art of classical music, but I do know what I like. And, I do know good theater.

This past Friday evening, the world of classical music was presented with an exciting evening of theater.

For starters, Albany and environs were treated to one of the highlights of the arts calendar's year. Yo-Yo Ma performed with the Albany Symphony Orchestra.

The excitement in downtown Albany on Friday was electric. The streets were literally packed with folks going to the Palace Theatre, Capital Rep, coming and going from the various dining and drinking establishments in the area. Friday night in Albany was reminiscent of a "big" city or the Albany that those of us who grew up in this area have heard stories of from grandparents and parents of how everyone used to be downtown on a weekend evening as all things social emanated from there. It was great fun to be a part of the excitement, greeting friends and acquaintances, getting caught up in the entire festive nature of the goings-on. The mighty Palace Theater too was breathing with new life. The well-publicized renovation work long since completed, the Palace seemed to come alive all over again for the evening ahead. The theater was packed. From the orchestra to the back rows of the balcony, there was not a seat to be had. Truly, the only thing missing was the formal dress attire that, 40 or 50 years ago, would have been the standard for such an event.

The orchestra members made their way to the stage and began that wonderful pre-performance

performance of tuning up. The ASO's Maestro David Alan Miller entered stage right and greeted the audience's warm applause. He began the evening, as he does most, by welcoming and offering a bit of explanation of the evening ahead. As if everyone were not already keyed up, Miller upped the ante by saying how excited he was to have "the greatest figure in the entire classical music world" performing.

Cynicism being my middle name, I began to think back on some past visits with ASO, albeit, I am loathe to admit, many years ago, and began to ponder whether or not our hometown group would be able to measure up to such standards. Mr. Miller departed from the stage briefly for the orchestra to begin its formal final tuning. The first violinist stands and every member tunes his or her instruments to hers... we are all in sync, let the music play on!

The first piece was a short world premiere performance entitled "Poestenkill Pastoral" composed by Chinese native Bun Ching Lam as a tribute to her adopted homeland. The piece was intriguing, pleasant, as it took the audience through the change of seasons in the Hudson Valley, beginning with a thunderstorm and moving through the fall, then cold frozen winter and culminating with the light budding of the maple leaves as the harbinger of spring. Lam's piece was a pleasant prelude to the repast that followed.

Yo-Yo Ma made his entrance along with violinist Colin Jacobsen. Jacobsen is one of Ma's group of protégés that tour with him in a group known as Silk Road Project.

The first piece was Brahms' "Double Concerto in A Minor, Opus 102." Now, this is the part that I must confess you lose me technically. I don't know a concerto performed in A Minor from one performed in A Major. I wouldn't know Brahms' Opus 102 from 103, but again — and I feel certain that lack of knowledge or expertise extended to the better part of the audience that evening — I do know what moves me.

Ma's emotional involvement is as exciting to watch, as his music is to hear. His fingering on the cello, the unmitigated joy that this man so obviously gets every time he plays, is exhilarating. Mr. Jacobsen and Mr. Miller, too, obviously enjoy their work. The sideways glances of Miller to Ma; the smiles passed between them; and Miller to the orchestra; makes you realize that you are watching art being made, not just

listening to music.

The piece is a wonderful conversation of violin talking to cello, the sparring back and forth and the occasional injection of the orchestra, first as responder, then more obviously becoming a greater force in the conversation, beginning to form its own voice, is great fun to observe. Throwing a devil-may-care attitude, the gypsy music takes over the end of the piece and you can almost see everyone dancing in the streets. Thank goodness it was time for intermission.

The second act was Beethoven's "Triple Concerto in

C Major, Opus 56," triple concerto being for piano, violin and cello. Aside from Ma, the second act soloists were Joel Fan, pianist, and Jonathan Gandelsman, violinist, also of the aforementioned Silk Road Ensemble. All three young men certainly are able to hold their own on the stage with Ma. Experience and time will certainly help to polish their talents but they, in particular Joel Fan, are inordinately talented performers. Beethoven's piece toyed with the audience, as the musicians sparred back and forth, tossed the musical lead from one to the other and then to the orchestra itself. The second movement of the piece was more reflective, thoughtful and calmer. The final movement brought us back full circle to where we began, after allowing each of the soloists to shine again.

For an encore, the audience was treated to the quartet performing a wonderful and lengthy Brahms piano quartet. Again, it was as much fun watching Ma and observing Miller standing at that point at the side of the stage, as it was listening to the music.

Leaving the theater, one could not help but be impressed not only by the size of the crowd but the diversity of ages in the group. And like leaving a rock concert, everyone was exhilarated, electrified and wowed by what they had just participated in.

Oh, and how did the ASO hold up? Were my fears of local small town embarrassment against the Maestro warranted? No. Not in any way. I was pleased and proud to see how far the orchestra has come along. David Alan Miller has molded the musicians and helped them grow to a point that they not only hold their own with world class talent, they too were a joy to listen to, and I look forward to my next visit...which won't be as long again as the past one!





Mark Twain's classic tale comes to BCMS stage

America's favorite fictional rascal at BCMS

Lots of dancing and singing marks the upcoming middle school production of "Tom Sawyer," as well as a hands-on learning experience for all middle school students interested in theater. Of the 85 students involved in the production, only half are part of the cast.

"There are a lot of kids who audition, and many of them would rather work as part of the crew," said Mary Katherine Daly, musical director and general music teacher, who is new to the district. "The great part about this show is that it's not just about the people on the stage. There are students who are sewing costumes and learning the technical parts of putting on a show. It's really hands-on."

Workshops to train the cast members in music and dance took place in mid-October, and rehearsals started in November.

The musical version of the Mark Twain novel is set in 1840 in St. Petersburg, Mo. In the course of the story, Tom Sawyer, played by Christopher Barron, matches wits with his stern Aunt Polly, falls in love with feisty Becky Thatcher, played by Adi White, and goes on the adventure of his life with Huckleberry Finn. Along the way, the audience meets the terrifying villain Injun Joe, Tom's bratty half-brother Sid, and all the other boys and girls in the village.

Frank Leavitt, director and producer, has an easier job this year with the addition of Daly and choreographer Ailisa Fardella, a graduate of Manhattanville College and an intern at

the school. As educational outreach coordinator for Capital Repertory Theater in Albany, Leavitt also worked as the musical director in addition to his directing and producing duties. The additional help this year leaves him time to really concentrate on character development.

Education is first and foremost in Leavitt's mind, which means, ironically, that the focus is not on putting on a good show. Having a good time and educating the students about theater production is the main focus. The rationale is if the students learn to develop their skills and enjoy doing it, they will walk away with knowledge of how a theatrical production works.

"Otherwise, there would be a lot of yelling, and that's not going to teach them anything," Leavitt said.

Much of the music in the show is three- and four-part harmony, said Daly.

"What's nice about the middle school is the range of voices," she said. "It fits them vocally very well."

Performances will be at the middle school at 7 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 2; Friday, Feb. 3; and Saturday, Feb. 4. A snow date is scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 5 at 3 p.m. Tickets are \$5 and may

"You don't necessarily see the intricacies involved, but there is a right way to do things and a wrong way," he said. "This is the right way."

Tom Sawyer is a good production because many of the characters in the play are the same age as the students, Leavitt said. The educational value is just as important as the entertainment value, he said. Also, the vocal demands are not too much for middle school voices.

"When you choose for middle school students, you have to find material that is not too challenging as far as the acting, and vocally not too demanding," said Leavitt. "We look for pieces that have breadth to them, and we try to find shows that can highlight the skills of the kids. Tom Sawyer is a very long, good story, and the way the play was written was great. It's theatrical as well as being a great story."

Service group seeks worthwhile community projects

The Delmar Rotary just can't find enough to do.

There are about 20 members of the Delmar Rotary, and they are currently looking for some hands-on projects to do around the area.

"Things like fixing shelves, or other kinds of things that would

take about a day or two and would require about eight to 10 people," said Tom Burdick, president-elect, of the projects the Rotary's seeking.

In the next two months, the Rotary is hoping that people in the community will help them with some ideas of what can be done to improve the town, said Rotarian Vicki Plotsky.

Part of Rotary's commitment is to do four kinds of service: international, local, vocational and community, or hands-on. Although the Rotary holds annual fund-raisers to benefit local organizations, Plotsky said a series of hands-on projects would help build a stronger sense of community.

"We haven't been able to swing the hands-on projects in previous years," said Plotsky.

The Rotary hosted a breakfast last Wednesday and invited town Supervisor Theresa Egan to speak and offer suggestions of work that could be useful to the town.

"There are certainly things that will be coming up in the future that we will need some help with," said Egan.

Currently, Egan is circulating the Rotary's petition to the town's department heads.

One of Egan's ideas is to coordinate all the service clubs in town. Creating a council that would periodically meet to discuss projects to work on is something she will encourage, and pooling resources for grand-scale projects is a possibility.

"We have the Rotary, the Kiwanis, the Lions, and so many more," she said. "There are a huge number of volunteers, but we don't have great organization among them. They do great individual projects, but it would be great to something in a grand way."

Many beautification projects could receive the Rotary's help, including landscaping near the traffic rotaries being built for the planned Slingerlands Bypass on Route 85.

Project proposals should include a one-page description of the project, and other details like cost and special skills required, and the expected improvements.

The Delmar Rotary host two major fund-raisers each year. Now through February the Rotary sells oranges and grapefruits, and in June, it holds a Teeing for Charity fund-raiser at the Normanside Country Club.





increases in all segments of local government, such as school, county, town, fire and ambulance.

One important source of information that the town uses to verify the accuracy of the data being used to value property is on the data mailers sent to all town residents almost one year ago. Residents were asked to either confirm that the information about their property was correct, or update the data to reflect any changes or improvements, and then mail them back to the town.

Concerns came up during the meeting about responses that might be less than truthful. "There isn't much we can do about that," Nooney said. "It's basically assessment fraud." Nooney then reassured community members that the assessor's office does everything possible to make sure they are using accurate data.

Town resident Marlene

Buzzard asked if assessors had gone inside any homes during the current reassessment. Nooney said there simply is not enough staff to make that feasible.

As part of the final phase of this process, all property owners can expect to receive an assessment disclosure notice from the town on or around Feb. 9. This is the first notification of new assessments.

Project Monitor Bob Kitchen spoke about the taxes shown on the disclosure notice.

"It shows about 95 percent of your total tax bill, the three main parts," he said. Those three parts are county taxes, town taxes (general fund and highway), and school taxes.

"If your assessment changes by 65 percent (from last year) your taxes will be about the same," Kitchen estimated.

The notice will contain information about informal meetings the town will hold in February and March. These hearings will be scheduled by appointment for

residents who have any questions or wish to review their preliminary assessment. Residents can sign up for 15-minute blocks of time.

Nooney said that anyone who believes there is an error in their assessment, must bring in any supporting documents they have to support a request for an adjustment.

Nooney said the step after that would be that "property owners will be notified by mail of the determination of the assessor's review from support supplied at

the informal meetings."

What happens if a resident does not agree with the assessor's determination? Nooney said that at this point a grievance application must be filed with the assessor's office and an appointment scheduled for the grievance to be heard before the board of assessment review. She stressed that all applications must be submitted no later than the fourth Tuesday in May.

Regarding the availability of information on this entire process, Nooney emphasized,

"There is tons of information. I'm always available in my office if anyone has any questions."

Superintendent Les Loomis.

Some of the classes, such as social studies and science, can go "a mile wide and an inch deep" said Loomis.

"That is not our goal, and students don't really use study skills for those classes," he said.

The study skills program will be fairly generic, Loomis said, so that what students learn there can be applied to all their classes.

Additional computer applications as well as keyboarding will be offered as part of the program.

The studio art program will enable eighth grade students to get a jump-start on art courses. Unlike the other curriculum changes, studio art

will be offered after school due to packed schedules at the middle school. However, the decision to include studio art as a middle-school curriculum choice was not as easy as the other offerings.

"I feel that this is a form of high school staffing, and that is inappropriate at the middle school level," said Stuart Lyman, vice president of the school board.

He is concerned that the middle school class would be competition with the high school classes, meaning that allocating staff to the middle school might cut out a high school class. He's also concerned that students might be disappointed if the class doesn't take place.

The board is currently in the process of looking at curriculum and staff changes as it prepares the budget for the

2006-07 school year.

"To approve this now, it may be misleading because the class may not be funded if it is in a competition situation with other high school classes," said board president Richard Svenson.

Studio art is being offered for those students who are very serious about art, and who want to have opportunity to explore as many art classes as possible during their tenure at the school.

"We view this as an enhancement of the art program, not just to satisfy the state acceleration mandate," said Loomis.

Easy so far? Then try this one:

- Coochi, coochi, ya ya _____

If you got them all right, you'll want to not just run, but hustle, to Albany's Capital Repertory Theater to catch "8-Track: The Sounds of the 70's," running now through Feb. 12. (Get it? Hustle, as in "do the...")

The four-person cast is energetic and upbeat enough that everybody will have a good time, but on opening night, it was clear that those enjoying the show the most had lived the polyester, palazzo-panted decade. Each song was greeted with laughter that ranged from ripples to guffaws, and when baritone Nik Rocklin took the stage in low-slung, frayed bell-bottom jeans, boots that you'd hope were manufactured by Frye, a polyester shirt that shouldn't be allowed too close to an open flame, and hair parted in the middle and hanging past his shoulders, most of the women in the audience surely agreed with what Cap Rep's Artistic Director Maggie Mancinelli-Cahill said at the reception following the opening night show.

"When Nik comes on stage in that first act," she said, "he looks like all the boyfriends I've ever had."

Rocklin's swagger is dead-on. All of the costumes help move the show through the era that saw the end to Vietnam, Nixon's presidency, the coming and going of disco, and ushered in the preppy era. No wonder a lot of the clothes and music are something that make us grin ruefully when we see them again.

And yet... "8-Track" is a good night out. Rick Seeber, a Cold Spring, Putnam County, native and now a Denver resident, conceived and wrote the show five years ago, with three out of four of the current cast members in mind. The evening's songs are grouped around eight "tracks," which include "Not sold in stores" (remember K-Tel television promotions?), "War and Peace," "Road Trip," and of course no homage to the '70s is complete without a tribute to disco.

"I'm a musical director in recovery," Seeber said on opening night. "I thought this show up in 1990, and a theater I worked with in Milwaukee trusted me, and took a chance. I had dialogue at first, but I hated that. I also hate the word 'revue.' I had a list of titles for the show, and settled on '8-Track.' Then I came up with different scenes. Every song is there for a reason; there's a connection between them."

The cast does a good job enhancing the songs with great dancing, excellent

facial expressions, and enough acting to put the lyrics in context.

"We had to make sure everyone understood the words," 32-year-old Rocklin said. The cast listened to

Tonya Phillips, the show's soprano, picked up the task of choreographer for the Cap Rep production.

"I choreographed it as a singer, thinking about how I would dance if I were singing," Phillips said. "I watched a lot of Earth, Wind and Fire."


Phillips, 33, also drew on her own childhood.

"I was a pre-teen in the 1970s," the Orlando, Fla., native said. "My whole family was into music. The older kids in our neighborhood would take the younger kids to the gym, play music, and teach us these songs and how to dance to them. I also love to watch 'Good Times' and 'What's Happening.'"

Phillips' favorite songs in the show are "Takin' it to the streets" and "Until you come back to me."

Teddey Brown added soul to the show, with an Afro that looked like it needed scaffolding and striped denim bell bottoms in the early part of the show; wide-wale corduroys and a shirt with horizontal stripes later in the show. His winsome facial expressions drew the audience in completely, and let us laugh at ourselves as much as the numbers he sang well.

Liana Young brought a charming twang to a lot of her songs, and her costumes reminded us that yes, too many patterns can be a bad thing. Her mini-skirt in the first act was a reminder

original recordings of the songs and went to the Internet to figure out what exactly they should be singing.

They also did a little research about the era.

to every 1970s-era Catholic school girl about why uniform skirts had to be long enough to touch the floor when you knelt.

"The show takes people away," she said. "It lets them reminisce."

That's exactly what audience members Danielle Boudreau, 43, and Edie Guilbault, 42, found.

"I knew every word to every song," Boudreau said. "It was a carefree and easy time, and now we're remembering it."

"There were some classics in there," Guilbault said.

You can check out the classics on Cap Rep's stage, and as the theater always does, it's offering events around the show. This Saturday, Jan. 28, and next Saturday, Feb. 4, after the 4 p.m. show and before the 8:30 p.m. show, Jennifer Girard of the Arthur Murray Latham Studio, will offer mini-dance lessons upstairs at the Victory Café. Cost is \$5 per person.

Discussion nights with Mancinelli-Cahill are scheduled for Jan. 25, Feb. 1 and Feb. 8, after the show; and on Sunday, Feb. 5 at 1:30 p.m. with a complimentary continental breakfast.

Regular performances are at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday; 8 p.m. Fridays; 4 and 8:30 p.m. on Saturdays; and 2:30 p.m. Sunday. Tickets range in price from \$34 to \$42, and discounts are available for teachers, those under 30, over 65, and for groups of 10 or more.





The Bethlehem girls basketball team has made some significant strides this year, but what the Lady Eagles accomplished last Friday was a giant leap.

"The last couple of seconds seemed to take forever," Nealon said.

Meg Olsen led a balanced Bethlehem attack with 13 points. Alex McCullough contributed 10 points, while Gillham added nine points.

"Leah's been consistent all year long," Nealon said. "Once in a while, someone else contributed double digits (in scoring), but then everyone has been contributing rebounds and steals."

The victory over Colonie gives Bethlehem consecutive league victories, as well as a big confidence boost heading into Friday's cross-divisional game at Shaker.

"We have three games left in league play (before the Suburban Council Tournament)," Nealon said. "What we've got to do is concentrate on these next three games, but especially the Shaker game since it's the next one on the schedule."

lost to the Raptors (Toronto had a double-digit halftime lead). Seriously, someone in the Lakers' front office might want to consider giving Bryant a better supporting cast than Lamar Odom and a bunch of role players. Bryant isn't going to deliver an NBA championship on his own.

By the way, I just looked at the Eastern Conference standings for the first time since ... well, since

the NBA season started. There are only six teams in a 15-team conference that are above .500, and four of them are in the Central Division (Detroit, Cleveland, Indiana and Milwaukee). Meanwhile, the Western Conference has eight teams above the .500 mark as of Monday. I'm not saying the Eastern Conference is weak — not when Detroit owns a 32-5 record. I am saying that there may be a bit of a competitive imbalance, though.

I do have a baseball rant I need to get off my chest. Has Omar Minaya gone insane? How many relief pitchers do the New York Mets need? After Saturday's trade that sent Kris Benson to Baltimore for Jorge Julio and John Maine, the Mets officially have four starting pitchers and (this is just an estimate) 12 relievers.

I know the bullpen was a weakness last year, but overloading on relievers — mostly middling relievers, at that — isn't going to

make the Mets any better. Plus, Minaya traded away two starters (Benson and Jae Seo) who combined for 24 victories last year to get four of his new relievers. And to think this is the same general manager who was lauded for signing Carlos Beltran last year.

Danielle was fully aware that Fran had left Reigning Cats and Dogs that afternoon. She was also well aware of her responsibility in monitoring the dogs that were drying in the downstairs grooming area. Danielle and Fran returned to the grooming area in preparing for Fran to leave. At that time, Ollie and Junior had been drying for 35 minutes with a dryer set on a 3 heat, given a 1-9 range. A dryer was removed from their drying cage. Two small fans and two standing fans were rearranged on all of the drying dogs. One dryer remained on a German Shepherd situated below Ollie and Junior. Ollie and Junior were fine at this inspection and in their bath. One hour later, Danielle, our kennel manager, found Ollie and Junior in distress. Emergency procedures were followed by taking the two dogs to their vet, and subsequently to the emergency clinic, since the Delmar Animal Hospital was not open for business that day.

We are deeply saddened by this unfortunate set of circumstances. However, on that day, Reigning Cats and Dogs followed the exact procedures that are in place 365 days a year to safeguard each animal in its care. Ollie and Junior showed no obvious signs of being in distress when they were first checked by Danielle. Ollie and Junior were not purposely left in dryers to overheat in an attended, unsupervised situation.

As the owners of Reigning Cats and Dogs, we can only relate to you the incident as it occurred. We have nothing to hide as evidenced by our immediate cooperation in the Bethlehem police investigation. We assure you that a consistent level of care and attention is given to each of the animals cared for at our facility for grooming or boarding. Our dedication to the animal community as well as to the individual care of animals has never wavered in our sixteen years of business.

Sixteen years of caring for our customers and their best friends has been a job which we have taken very seriously and with great responsibility. Our safety record verifies our commitment to our customers and their pets. We have had only one insurance claim filed by us during those years. This was for an injury to a pet's leg when he jumped from the grooming table. These sixteen years of service translates into approximately 116,800 boardings and 48,000 grooms for our trusting customers. Our facility is also one in which any dissatisfaction or problems are often settled through discussion and negotiation. In the case of the Luries, such discussion was abbreviated with the threat of a lawsuit, and monetary claims by the Lurie's lawyer, Mr. Wander, on December 27. Even after the threatened lawsuit, we asked for the autopsy report emergency records so we could understand the details of the tragedy and then respond to the Lurie's questions. We have never received the reports. The day after the incident, December 27, Richard Pulice spoke to the lawyer and Michael Lurie. He clearly expressed his sorrow as well as his interest in finding out what had happened to Michael Lurie. Mr. Lurie stated that we would get through this.

Our facility has been one of the only USDA certified kennels in the area since 1995. This certification holds Reigning Cats and Dogs to a higher standard than most other boarding facilities since we are subject to random USDA inspection visits. These standards include the quality care of animals in every respect. Our family and staff are proud of that certification and we have promised ourselves and our customers to live up to it every day. Man's best friend deserves that consideration in the kindest care that Reigning Cats and Dogs will continue to offer. In this way, we fulfill the goals that got us into this business sixteen years ago.

They took Denver's raucous crowd out of the game, just like they did in Indianapolis, by completely shutting down the Broncos' offense and taking advantage of a pair of Denver turnovers. By the time the Broncos got going, it was too late. No one is going to come back from a three-touchdown deficit against a Bill Cowher-coached Pittsburgh team.

I do have one piece of sober-

ing news for Steeler fans, though (and believe me, I am smiling as a type this): the last time a team won three consecutive road games to get to the Super Bowl was the 1985 New England Patriots. And as any Patriot or Chicago Bear's fan will tell you, that Super Bowl was not pretty. Just the fact that William "the Refrigerator" Perry scored a touchdown for Chicago as part of the 46-10 blow-out makes it ugly (and by the way, this is the 20th anniversary of that game).

Meanwhile, I don't mind saying that I'm happy to see Seattle finally reach a Super Bowl. However, it just reinforces the fact that Cleveland hasn't been to one since the game began in 1967. And at their current rate, it's more

likely that we'll see a Super Bowl between Arizona and Houston before we see the Browns get there. Between the fact that Cleveland plays in a tough division (Pittsburgh, Cincinnati and Baltimore — oh crud!) and how much roster cleanup is left to do before the Browns can actually contend again, I don't see a lot of hope for my Browns. At least, not before the 2010 season.

Now, back to Kobe Bryant. The fact that he scored 81 points in a game on 28-of-46 shooting from the field is very impressive but it also reinforces the fact that Bryant is the only good player the Los Angeles Lakers have. I mean, Bryant hadn't scored 55 second-half points, the Lakers might have

Ballston Spa), the Eagles were the first team I knew that beat the Cowboys on a regular basis. So, they kind of stuck with me."

"The New York area teams are the ones who I usually go for, but I follow the Giants the most," said Guilderland girls soccer and Nordic ski team coach Barb Newton. "They were always on at home, so I just grew up a Giants fan. I even named my first dog Tucker after (former Giant) Tucker Frederickson."

Shaker football coach Dennis Bender chose the Giants to be contrary to the kids he grew up with. The only difference was Bender grew up in Pennsylvania, where rooting for anyone other than the Eagles or the Steelers

was considered unusual.

"It was kind of like I was a (New York) Mets fan, and everyone down there was either a (Philadelphia) Phillies or (Pittsburgh) Pirates fan," Bender said. "I just said no way (to rooting for a Pennsylvania team)."

Bender wasn't the only member of his family to go against the grain. His sister became a Washington Redskins fan.

"I don't know how that happened," Bender said. "Maybe it's because she saw how big of a Giants fan I am, and she saw the Redskins beat the Giants on a regular basis. So, she decided to root for the Redskins."

Family ties also determine football allegiances, such as Scotia-Glenville wrestling coach Ron Ashcraft's love for the Cowboys.

"I've been a Cowboys fan with my dad and my uncle since I was a kid," Ashcraft said. "My whole family are Cowboys fans."

On occasion, allegiances are determined by who a coach knows on a team. Two area high school football coaches, Niskayuna's John Furey and Saratoga's Blase Iuliano, have former players on NFL rosters — Niskayuna graduate André Davis just completed a season with the defending Super Bowl champion Patriots, while Saratoga's Anthony Weaver ended his fourth season with the Baltimore Ravens.

A Giants fan by nature, Furey said he would have jumped ship for the Patriots if the two teams had met in this year's Super Bowl (both teams qualified for the playoffs, but got knocked out).

"There's nothing more that I would love to see than someone I know winning the Super Bowl," Furey said.

Though Weaver and the Ravens didn't qualify for the playoffs, Iuliano could still see a friend of his earn a Super Bowl ring this season.

"I've got a friend coaching in Carolina, Mike Maser. So, I'd like to see the Ravens in there, but right now I'm pulling for the Panthers," Iuliano said.

Other coaches chose their allegiances based on pro players or coaches they admire.

Shenendehowa's Brent Steuerwald said he eschews rooting for a single team in favor of cheering for coaches who deal with the pressures of the NFL well, such as Seattle's Mike Holmgren and Indianapolis' Tony Dungy.

"But when the Eagles lost, I really wanted to watch the playoffs because it's so wide open this year."

"Of the four teams that are still in it (as of last weekend), I'd like to see the Steelers win it," said

Saratoga High School athletic director Bob Stuhlmaker, who is a Chicago Bears fan.

"They play the type of football I like — hard-nosed, smash-mouth football."

Bethlehem girls lacrosse coach Dawn Austin, a die-hard Eagles fan, said that last year, she had been worried that she'd miss the Super Bowl between Philadelphia and New England because she was due to give birth to her first child. As fate would have it, she gave birth one week before the game was played.

Now that her team isn't involved in the playoffs, Austin said she'll still watch the Super Bowl. "Football is football. I'm definitely going to watch, no matter who is in it," she said.

And that will likely be the story in every community across the United States. As much as baseball would like to claim it's the national pastime, there aren't World Series parties held in sports bars and private homes across the United States. But when it comes to the NFL and the Super Bowl, nearly everyone is drawn into the drama.

"I enjoy watching it, no matter who's playing," said Sausville.

Super what?

For diehard sports aficionados, Feb. 5 is Super Bowl Sunday, a holy day of obligation to pay homage to the football gods, a time for beer and wings, machismo companionship and testosterone-induced mayhem. For others, it's simply Sunday, Feb. 5.

For those who don't find particular enjoyment in the gladiatorial combat that is "the Big Game," there are a number of events in the area that can satisfy the tastes of those willing to step out of the mainstream and not devote the whole day to the pre-game shows that start before noon, or the game itself around 6 p.m.

People not likely to watch the Super Bowl probably won't be interested in "Miracles: New York's Greatest Sports Moments," but that is just one of three special exhibits at the State Museum in downtown Albany.

There is also an exhibit by photographer Anne Zane Shanks, featuring 75 prints of her work. Shanks' photos, which cover America in the 1950s through the 1970s, cover such topics as travel, celebrity portraits, and changing times in America.

The museum also has an exhibit titled, "The World in Brooklyn: Selections from the Brooklyn Museum." The exhibit features artwork from across the world collected through the 10 cultural departments of the museum, and demonstrates how the values of a culture can be shared through art.

The State Museum, located at the Empire State Plaza in Albany, is open seven days a week, 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The Albany Institute of History & Art opened an exhibit this weekend titled "Excavating Egypt," which chronicles the finds of archeologist William Petrie, said to be the father of Egyptian archeology. The exhibit features 221 of his finds, many never before seen by the

public.

Another exhibit ongoing at the museum features the works of Alice Morgan Wright, an Albany native thought to be one of the first sculptors to experiment with cubism and futurism. The Institute, located at 125 Washington Ave., Albany, is open from noon to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

Another form of art always available is film, though the first few weeks of the year are a notoriously slow time in terms of cinema, and 2006 is no different. That means moviegoers will have to choose between a pair of sequels, "Underworld: Evolution" and "Big Momma's House 2," or a remake, "When a Stranger Calls," based on the 1979 horror classic.

Similarly, the rental world is just as sparse. The unrated version of the John Carpenter cult classic "The Fog" came out this week, and other than that, next week's choices are a toss-up between "Corpse Bride" or "The Legend of Zorro." That leaves few alternatives to football, unless of course you've been waiting for the third season of "The A-Team" or "Knight Rider," in which case you'll have plenty of rental choices to keep you busy though the game.

As a last resort, there are scant alternatives on television, including the usual eight hours of "Law and Order: Criminal Intent" on Bravo, preceded by a four-hour mini-marathon of "Queer Eye for the Straight Guy," aptly named the "Fabulous Bowl II." The Sci-Fi Channel will also keep with its usual Sunday helping of movies, choosing "Species" and "Star Trek: First Contact" to combat the game.

The History Channel will chronicle one of America's other greatest pastimes, eating, with four hours of its series "American Eats."

If all else fails, there is the recently released Stephen King novel "Cell," said to be his goriest and most horrific novel in years.

Hmmm — that's almost as horrific as a Sunday without football.

Mention names like Terry Bradshaw, Joe Montana or John Elway... (and) you'll soon have a conversation going with a total stranger who remembers what each of them did in the Super Bowl.

"The deeper I got into football, the more I got into the coaching styles," he said.

Weather doesn't keep students, skiers away

Winter enthusiasts travel to Maple Ski Ridge

A mid-January late afternoon sun beamed over the hills of Maple Ski Ridge on Mariaville Road in Schenectady just one day after heavy rains had doused the Capital District. But those rains didn't stop 130 students of the Schalmont School District who come out four times a year to learn to ski at Maple Ski Ridge. These students and plenty more children and adults lined up in mid-40 degree weather to snowboard and ski at the oldest family-run ski facility in the Mohawk Valley area.

The story of Maple Ski Ridge is a simple one. In 1960, George and William Mulyca enjoyed skiing at Scotch Valley.

"My dad and his father felt they could make a ski area in their backyard and they bought a tractor and built a rope tow," said Carolyn Lattart, George Mulyca's daughter. "From 1962 to 1964, the skiing was only for private use, then all their friends and family wanted to ski there and Maple Ski Ridge became open to the public in 1964," Lattart said.

The first price of admission was only \$3 for a full day of skiing and the first concession stand offered hot chocolate, coffee and hot dogs. In 1970, snowmaking operations were installed and the first chair lift arrived in 1972. The triple chair lift was added in 1990. Maple Ski Ridge now has an expanded lodge with fireplace and an array of items to eat and drink in the restaurant.

Owned and operated for three generations by the Mulyca family, Maple Ski Ridge is the only ski area less than 30 minutes from most Capital District residents.

"This is a real gem," said Lattart, who also works in the

kitchen, handles catering and even works with the four-member crew that makes snow daily.

"It takes 14-hour shifts to make snow," Lattart said. "It all depends on the weather."

Ninety hours of work to make snow over the past several days went awry when heavy rains rolled down the hill, melting the freshly made snow.

"As a person who makes snow it is sad and upsetting," Lattart said of the precipitation. "Last year we fought the cold and this year we're fighting the rain. It's like farming in reverse — we want cold and dry and the farmers want it warm and wet."

Snowboarding now equals the popularity of skiing at Maple Ski Ridge.

"I believe it's half and half, with 50 percent of our customers skiing and the other 50 percent snowboarding," Lattart said.

More children are learning to ski because of the improved conditions and safer equipment throughout the industry said Lattart.

"Skiing is safer now than it was 10 years ago and much safer than it was 20 years ago, plus our trails are groomed daily and conditions are usually good," Lattart said.

Maple Ski Ridge is busy now through the end of March, according to Lorraine Moyer, who handles group sales and special events. A 24-hour ski-athon to benefit the American Heart Association will be held Friday and Saturday, Feb. 3 and 4.

"Last year we raised \$3500 and we hope to double it this year," she said. The Snapple Snow Box derby is Feb. 11 and March brings a Beach Party with pond skimming and a barbecue. 

Bethlehem Chamber: A glimpse into our past . . .

Back in the late 1950s, there was much debate within the "Delmar Business Association" about what direction to take. For as long as anyone could remember the business district in the town started and ended around Delaware Ave. Now businesses were starting to crop up in other areas of Bethlehem. By late 1957, the association re-formed as the

Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce. Nearly 50 years later, although the Chamber is a much larger organization, its mission remains the same: to promote good business practices, a favorable business environment, community prosperity and good government relations while working to make Bethlehem and the surrounding area a better place to live.

Most of the original Chamber members represented businesses located around what was then known as the heart of the Tri-Village area. The main focus in those days was beautification, park benches, flowers, festivals and sidewalk sales, and encouraging businesses to locate here. There was a tree planting committee – which was always active and continues to this day.

If Bethlehem back in the '50s sounds a little like Norman Rockwell's small-town America, that's pretty close to the mark. Everything you needed was here. Pharmacies, a five and ten cent store, movie theater, butcher, bakery, Annie's Hatbox, the Delmar Department Store, Delmar


Bootery, a barber shop, two bowling alleys and a roller skating rink; and the list goes on.

There was an A&P, the Empire Market, a Gulf station, Libby's restaurant (where Sweets & Treats is now), and the corner store where you could buy beer, cigarettes and penny candy for the kids. Tony and Grace Little operated the store for many years, before Nelson Isdell took it over. They had a little lunch counter in the back. Libby's was a famous hangout for high school students.

Of course, with Bethlehem still very much an agricultural community, there was Schnurr and Woods Feed and Seed, with a mill in the back, somewhat like what Agway is today. You could buy 150-pound bags of feed. It was a mix between a hardware store and a country store, a fascinating place.

And lest one forget, there was the Three Elms, which according to some old timers didn't have a very good reputation. You wouldn't stay in business very long if you were caught in that place. It eventually burned down.

There was really no need or desire to trek into Albany for the basics, according to Bob Jackson,



From 1957 until the mid-1980s, the Bethlehem Chamber was a largely volunteer organization. "It really didn't become a professional organization until we hired a CEO," said Robert Verstandig of Verstandigs Florist and former member of the Chamber Board. All that changed in 1985, when the chamber had 175 members and the Board of Directors decided to hire Marty DeLaney as its president.

Today, the Chamber has over 650 members, primarily from the immediate Bethlehem Area, and from the entire Capital Region. A full-time team of employees manage an office in Main Square on Delaware Avenue.

Ranked 9th of the 25 largest area Chambers of Commerce (Capital District Business Review 2005), the Chamber has an annual operating budget of over \$200,000 and administers a nearly \$2 million health and dental insurance program.

former owner of Delmar Lumber (now Curtis Lumber). "We were a little bit isolated. It seemed like quite a distance into Albany at that time." Where the State Dep't of Health is now was open land. That's where they put the Circus when it came to town," Jackson remembered.

The Chamber actively participates in the Tech Valley Chamber Coalition, as well as the New York State Alliance of Chambers. An 18 member Board of Directors, representing all facets of the membership, provides expert oversight of the Chamber's goals and programs.
