

Porco jury: four questions

Judge expects trial to begin this week

Jury selection began Monday in the Christopher Porco murder trial in Orange County Supreme Court in Goshen. Porco is accused of killing his father and severely wounding his mother with an ax inside their Brockley Drive home in Delmar in 2004.

The trial was moved from Albany to Orange County last week by a state Appellate Court in Brooklyn because of the intense media surrounding the case, and the problems it could pose in picking a jury in Albany

"It has been an inconvenience," said Michael McDermott,



assistant Albany County district attorney and chief prosecutor in the case. "Everybody working on the trial has been in Goshen since last Wednesday.'

Judge Jeffrey Berry scheduled three different rounds of jury prescreening over a two-day period. The first 80 prospective jurists walked into the courtroom around 10:45 a.m. only to be followed minutes later with close to half the 80-member jury pool

The Empire State could become a leader in wind power

Second time a charm

Record turn yields school budget OK

By JIM CUOZZO

It took an additional 34 days, \$802,000 in cuts, and one 'no' vote, but the Bethlehem Central school district budget was approved the second time around in a record turnout of over 5,800 voters.

"It's good, good," said Richard Svenson, school board president, of the June 20 re-vote. "The voters have spoken, what a turnout."

The margin of victory was more than 1,000 votes, with 3,473 ves votes and 2,415 no votes.

Overall that's a 1,700 vote swing from when the budget was first defeated on May 16 by more than 600 votes. May's budget defeat was the first school budget to go down in over 20 years.

"I'm thrilled it passed and we don't have to go to contingency," said board member Robin Storey.

Voters streamed to the polls all day long, with 40 people waiting outside the Bethlehem Middle School before the polls opened at 7 a.m. At 9 p.m., when the polls closed, people were still running to the election machines in the middle school gym to make sure

ind-generated electricity is pollution free, wind is plentiful in the right spots, and since it is produced locally, wind is not subject to world events that lead to spikes in prices like a barrel of crude oil shipped in from the

Middle East. Recent technological advances, like better equipment to find sites with enough wind for wind farms to be efficient and enhancements to the wind turbines themselves, have made wind the fastest growing

New York is home to the largest wind farm east of the Mississippi River. The Maple Ridge Wind Farm on the Tug Hill Plateau in Lowville, about 30 miles north of Rome, will eventually have 186 wind turbines that will produce enough juice to provide electricity to more than 60,000 homes a year.

But, New York lags behind states like Texas and California, which produce the most megawatts of electricity from wind turbines in the county, said Chris Mason, an education director for the Northeast

Sustainable Energy Association, based Greenfield, Mass.

While finding a spot where wind blows at the necessary near constant 7-12 mph is easy, often times selling a wind farm

to prospective neighbors is not. Many think dozens of wind turbines, which can stand 320 feet tall, are ugly, dangerous and will decrease their property values.

For example, while most environmentalists, public officials and health advocates favor-a proposal to build a 10-turbine wind farm near Gore Mountain in the Adirondack Mountains, there is opposition from some, like the Adirondack Council, that fear it will open the door to more wind

"A lot of people underestimate the value of the benefits," said Marion Trieste, a consultant for the Alliance for Clean Energy New York, a nonprofit consortium of environmentalists, private business and public health advocates that promotes alternative sources of energy. "It is an energy resource produced in New York state and something that will be a substantially useful part of the (energy) mix."

Lambert cleared of rape

An Albany County jury decided that 18-year-old German Lambert Jr. was not guilty of raping a Bethlehem Central High School student at her family's Glenmont home last fall.

A two-day trial preceded a twohour deliberation by the jury on Friday, June 23.

Lambert was accused by Bethlehem Police and the Albany County District Attorney's office of two separate acts of sexual misconduct on Bethlehem High School property along with an additional charge of raping a 16year-old girl at her family's home on Oct. 13, 2005.



Board considers skate park

Two residents have found used equipment from Westchester town

Two town of Bethlehem residents presented a petition to the town board signed by over 300 people requesting a skateboard park for kids.

Robert Salamone, a physical education teacher at the middle school, and Donna Berger believe they can acquire the necessary funds to purchase a disassembled skateboard park currently up for sale in Croton-on-Hudson in Westchester County.

The parts, according to Salamone, are worth much more than the asking price.

"They spent \$60,000 on their park, but they want to get rid of it, and they listed it at \$7,000," Salamone said.

Salamone and Berger would like to see the Bethlehem chamber of commerce, several church groups, parents and other community leaders to get together to purchase the park and build it. It would then be up to the town to maintain the skateboard park and staff it.

Graduation rate is 92 percent

Testing scores in English, math and science at Bethlehem Central School District continue to exceed state and federal standards.

A district report card issued by the State Education Department shows that Bethlehem has made adequate yearly progress on all Egan said another concern is exams and among all subgroups, whether or not the kids will show and is designated a District in diplomas. Scores in English, Good Standing.

"The Board of Regents are considering new reforms to improve high school graduation rates," said Richard Mills, commissioner of the state Department of Education.

Ninety-four percent of the graduating students Bethlehem received Regents diplomas, with 61 percent, receiving advanced Regents math and science were also high, with 95 percent of all graduating students passing English Regents and 93 percent passing high school math. Within that score, 55 percent of high school math students received scores between 85 and 100.

"This is a very strong score," Tebbano said. "We tied for first in the Suburban Council with these scores. Bethlehem's School District is considered one of the top academic schools in the Capital District, but actual rankings are not a high priority.

"The state Education Department doesn't want to view it that way," said Tebbano, "and we don't look to rank one better

statewide rate of 64 percent. In or another. We do have a very strong educational program."

> The only testing scores that consistently level off in the district tend to be around the time students enter eighth grade.

> "Middle school tends to be a problem in different levels in different areas of the state,' Tebbano said.

> School attendance will be a fourth indicator on future scoring standards set by the government, and poor attendance in many school districts is now being directly linked to poor graduation rates in several school districts.

> "As attendance falls below 92 percent, graduation rates decline significantly," said Mills.

"When attendance reaches 88 percent, graduation rates plummet," Mills wrote in a released statement on state report card scores.

In Bethlehem, both attendance and scoring is strong and Tebbano credits the combination of an outstanding faculty and parents who strive for a quality education as key factors.

"This report demonstrates our commitment to educational programs being strong in this district," Tebbano

'You know that happy feeling you get when you walk through Home Depot?" I asked my husband. "All the tools, lumber, parts, and endless possibilities? Well, that's the way I feel when I'm in the library.

I love the library. Sometimes I feel like I missed my calling. When I was applying to college I didn't even realize there was a major called library sciences. I guess I never considered the takes is a love of books to become a librarian!

A career that involves spending every day in the library sounds mighty enticing. conspiracy to keep my family subsided and I took a turn. I parmesan, made a tossed salad and garlic bread, and cooked a pot of pasta. Dessert was storebought cookies. The plates were disposable.

Some folks think book Rachel became interested clubs are too much work, that they take the pleasure out of reading. I suppose this could happen if you don't enjoy any of the books or the company. Some people also don't like the pressure of having to read a book within a prescribed time frame. For them it's like going back to school. > Everyone is encouraged to bring suggestions for what the group should read. I solicit ideas from friends who are in other book clubs. Others check out The New York Times' best seller list. After four or five selections are presented to the group, the voting begins.

Voting works like this: The

first time around you can vote for as many choices as you want. Eventually the choices are narrowed down and you must cast a vote for a single-book.

Quarterly, the group reads nonfiction books and classicnovels. All four selections are made in November. This gives members extra time to obtain and read the books, which tend to be longer and sometimes more difficult reads.

know it sounds complicated, but really it's not. The group is fairly informal; members are welcome to attend even if they haven't finished (or even opened) the book. Often, discussion about the book while concludes we're consuming hors d'oeuvres. That leaves dinner and dessert time to catch up on each other's lives and also to pick the book selection for the following month.

Through my book club, I have read and enjoyed books that likely wouldn't have otherwise come to my attention or that I would have ignored based on an aversion to the topic or writing style. Among my favorites are The Red Tent by Anita Diamant and Wicked by Gregory Maguire. I have read not only the group's official selections, but also many of the runner-up books.

I generally vote for books that are available at the library. I love books, but I'm not one for re-reading them. With my house bursting with clutter, I don't want discarded books gathering dust. And quite frankly, I don't want to buy a book if I don't like it.

This leads me back to my favorite place: the library. For when I go to pick up my book club selection, I can also browse through the DVDs for a familynight movie, or research the parent-teacher shelves for parenting tips, or even just plop down in the periodicals section and flip through a magazine. Or I can open my spiral-bound notebook and plant the seeds for my own story. Ah, the endless possibilities.

We wonder whether the mayor and board members will be at the park to oversee the killing set sometime in the next week or two.

We think the mayor and the board tried to assuage the anger of some who object to the goose gassing by saying the breast meat of the animals will be donated to local food pantries and shelters. The fact that Canadian geese are so prolific indicates that their meat is not in any great demand. Perhaps the livers from the gassed geese could be marketed to the more financially secure folk in the form of foie gras.

Donating the meat to anyone, however, isn't the issue.

No one is sure that killing the geese will serve any purpose. Some "experts" claim that the goose population at Collins Park will not change as more geese will come to the lake when the others are long gone and digested by the unsuspecting homeless people or the foie gras types.

Essentially, killing these geese without knowing whether or not they are a real health hazard and whether the outcome will make any significant changes in the park does not make sense.

We believe the mayor and the board should really listen and be big enough to admit that they could be wrong in pursuing this course of action.

We hope that reason prevails in this situation that has somehow grown way out of proportion. We think elected officials should be more flexible than they have been. Compromise is sometimes necessary especially in political matters.

Given the brouhaha that has erupted after the decision to kill the geese was announced and the uncertainty of the outcome of destroying 200 or so of the animals, why not do what is reasonable and find another "solution?

Q: Is there really anything to be concerned about using e-mail and the Internet?

A: A computer infected with a fessional. virus can have disastrous results, ranging from sending out messages to stealing information. Email or your computer can come to a grinding halt. Busi-nesses or ISP's scanning for viruses may reject your e-mail if your computer is infected. The virus could be used to attack other computers or Web sites, putting the blame on you. Viruses can delete or make data on your computer unreadable. A virus could also send out an embarrassing e-mail in your name to everyone in your e-mail list.

Q: What is a Trojan horse?

A: Trojan horses typically contain software with the ability to allow a hacker or criminal to you type in an address.

take control of your computer. Trojans can record keystrokes. You could be accessing your bank account or pay online service and your user name and password could capture everything you type, then send it to a third party. If you have an Internet camera attached to your computer, someone could turn the camera on when you least expect it, save the images, and send them to someone, or turn your system into a streaming Web site. Viruses can contain Trojans and Trojans can contain viruses.

Q: What is a worm?

A: A worm works like a virus, but does not need another program to run as it has the ability to recreate or clone itself.

Q: What can be done to protect against viruses?

A: Install a high quality antivirus program and keep it up to date. Many of the programs today do this for you automatically if you have a broadband connection. Be careful about reading e-mails. Don't open any attachment unless ing inside is a virus. Other times you are absolutely sure it is safe. or you are willing to gamble your

Q: What if I get a virus?

A: Unplug your computer from the Internet, then call a pro-

Q: What makes my computer slow down?

A: The most likely suspect is spyware, software which allows companies to collect information about your browsing habits. That software on your computer puts a burden on the processor and memory of a computer, and slows it down. Spyware does not have the ability to spread to other computers, but it can create a major headache for computer users. Some symptoms of spyware are pop-up windows appearing, new browser windows opening on their own, your home page changing, and being redirected to a different site when

Q: How can I protect my-

A: Don't go to pornography or gambling Web sites as they are typically very bad for spyware. Don't download anything. Check out programs designed to protect you against Spyware, and high security settings for your com-

Q: What are cookies?

A: A cookie is a small piece of data stored on your computer, which allows others to get some information about you, but are not a threat to the information on your computer. You can turn cookies off, but they also have a beneficial value as they allow Web sites to keep your preferences available to vou.

Q: Are dial-up users safe from spyware?

A: No. In fact dial-up users as susceptible to having their computers dial pay-for-services.

Q: How do I protect children from predators on the Internet?

A: The No. 1 proactive measure is to have the computer in a central area of your home, like the kitchen or family room. While it is very possible for a child to view inappropriate material on TV, the program cannot reach out and do harm to your child. People on the Internet can and do. Your children may push back, but this is one of the safest methods to help protect them.

Q: What is spam? How do I deal with it?

A: Free limited time offer, Fw: FYI, Look rich, Re Account #2344234, Your loan has been approved, are just some of the spam recently seen. It's been estimated that half of all e-mail is spam. spam does not have the ability to destroy data, but many spammers use the computers taken over by viruses or Trojans to send spam, bringing the computer down to a crawl. Just like too many cars on the highway at the same time, too much spam takes up bandwidth. To avoid spam, you can set junk and/or adult filters in your e-mail software. You can also create rules, which delete or re-route Spam to your deleted items folder based on certain words in the spam. Additional software is also available to help alleviate spam. Never reply to Spam, click unsubscribe, or click any link in spam. Turn off the preview pane in your e-mail program. If it's Re: and you didn't send it, it's spam. Use common sense. If it looks like spam and smells like spam, it's spam.

Q: What is a hoax?

A: Subject: Notice from National Internet Security Defense Department. We have detected a virus on your computer and below provide you with the necessary steps to remove it. Please follow these directions at once as the virus will destroy data 23 hours after the computer has been infected. Search your computer for the following file and once found, permanently delete it. If someone had taken the above steps, they would have deleted a file which was necessary for their computer to run, rendering their computer dead in the water.

Q: What are some other types of hoaxes?

A: You receive a message. from Citibank indicating there has been a lot of activity on your account and you need to verify certain information. Another hoax was an e-mail being distributed stating Microsoft was conducting a test and if you sent the e-mail to a certain number of people, Microsoft would send you a check. They were supposedly doing this to help them with marketing something Microsoft hardly needs anyone to assist with marketing. Use common sense -to detect a hoax. If someone called you on the phone and said check your car for wires coming from the engine, which could cause fires and you should cut them. Would you?

Use common sense and keep yourself safe online.

their vote counted. There were parents with their children in baseball uniforms, others on bikes, and some people even brought their dogs with them right into the election booth. Hundreds of people came in to vote in the last hour.

"A great big thanks goes out for supporting children and the future of the district," Svenson said. "This will give the board confidence in our future decision making.

The record turnout combined with difficult cuts the board made after the initial budget defeat were keys to the approval the second time around, according to Superintendent Les Loomis.

"This community really stepped up for its children," said Loomis.

Another key factor of the overwhelming majority of yes votes was the Parent-Teacher Associations that stepped up to support the district by calling neighbors, circulating fliers and holding a public march and rally prior to the vote to support the school budget.

The new and approved spending plan totals \$72.5 million, down from \$73.3 million and holds a 3.75 percent tax increase, down from the original 5.25 percent increase.

"It's a total turnaround," said board member Stuart Lyman. "Now the focus is back to board of education point of view," Lyman said.

Several hardships will need to be endured for at least a year with the new school budget. Funds for varsity hockey, gymnastics and cheerleading were taken out of the new budget and will be selffunded by sports booster clubs in the new school year

They sing and they see the world doing it

Local residents are membersof Harvard's singing group

Evan Siegel, a Bethlehem native and senior at Harvard University, is off to see the world. The 21-year-old member of the Harvard a cappella group The Din and Tonics will be traveling literally around the world this summer singing with the group.

Members of The Din and Tonics don't pay for anything while touring. They use the Harvard network to find places to stay, and Siegel said usually hotels put them up and pay for their meals.

The Harvard alumni network is amazing and far-reaching," Siegel said.

This is Siegel's second year with The Din and Tonics. He said the audition process is pretty rigorous. Potential Dins try out for about a week, performing songs and surviving cuts. Siegel said the number of people auditioning varies anywhere from 20-60 people, from which the group usually takes about four.

Siegel said hardly anyone performs with The Din and Tonics for their entire Harvard career because the schedule is performs about 150 concerts a year, and travels a lot.

Every winter the group spends its break in Vail, Colo., singing and skiing. Spring break is spent in Bermuda at the Fairmont Southampton Hotel. Siegel said the hotel gives members of the group rooms and provides their meals in exchange for performances.

In addition, The Din and Tonics perform at private parties and functions. Siegel said the price tag is pretty high to book a concert with the group.

The Din and Tonics were in the movie "Mona Lisa Smile" and performed at the premiere of the film. Siegel said the group has performed for Sharon Stone, Bill

Music has always been an important part of Siegel's life. He has been playing the piano since kindergarten and was a serious classical saxophonist. Siegel said it was when he was in the studio performing the saxophone that another musician convinced him to join the singing group "Bass on Up" at Bethlehem Central High School. He performed with the group through high school.

Siegel also participated in choir at Bethlehem High School and performed in the musical productions.

Siegel's major at Harvard is

too demanding. The group Clinton, Jessica Lange and many linguistics with a related field in theater. He spends most of his free time performing in drama and musicals. He has spent the past three summers with professional theater companies and plans to move to New York to become an actor when he graduates.

"This is the only job I know," said Sherri. "It's a great place to work while raising your family."



Library exhibit displays the world of children's play

A portion of "Small Traditions: the folklore of children," on loan from the Arts Center of the Capital Region, will be exhibited at the library in July and August.

"Small Traditions" was on view at the center from December 2005 to March 2006, curated by Mary Zwolinski, head of ACCR's Folk Arts Program. The exhibit focused on the world of children's play — a world apart from the play adults organize for them, with its own rules and raw materials.

The following is excerpted from the curator's notes: "The

[world] made and directed by children themselves ... can include secret hiding places, vernacular architecture, toys and playthings constructed out of recycled debris or other items, impromptu games, riddles and made-up stories.

A child's world is different ... from the world adults create ... in that no actual money exchanges hands (pretend

money is acceptable), no adults create and oversee the rules of the games (although children themselves may do this) and there is no formal guidebook ... other than the verbal rules and guidelines they create by and for themselves.

The play is spontaneous, yet may continue and expand over days, weeks and even years, mysteriously handed down from child to child, generation to generation. In this particular place, the child is the absolute ruler of the world."

The "Small Traditions" exhibit will be directly opposite the interior doors of the library. In addition, the lobby display case will hold items reflecting Bethlehem residents' childhood memories. Come and see. You will remember the places and play of your childhood, and your children will recognize a world not so different from their own.

The original exhibit was funded by the Folk Arts Program of the New York Council on the Arts, a state agency, and The Arts Center of the Capital Region. 



n 1928, Mabel Choate, doyenne of the Berkshire landscape, decided that the casino designed by famous architect Stanford White, located in the heart of Stockbridge, was an eyesore. since it had fallen into neglect and abandonment. A team of horses was hired to move the building to its current location on Main Street, and the home of the Berkshire Theatre Festival was born. Situated on 5 acres, the property now houses the theatre festival, and its onsite barn, the Unicorn Theatre, is celebrating 10 years of emerging and alternative theater.

Occasionally, though, athletes get it right. For instance, Bernie Williams didn't swing for the fences with his first album. He simply played his electric guitar and surrounded himself with some capable musicians for a jazz album. Nothing spectacular. Nothing poppy enough to be played on commercial radio. Then, there's Doug Flutie. He and his brother Darren were in Albany last Thursday with their rock band, the Flutie Brothers. None of which was planned, by the way.





Old power, new revenue

profitable for private **business**

With the memory of record high prices at the gas pump still fresh in the minds of Capital District drivers and the prospect of steep air conditioning bills facing consumers this summer, some are looking to an old energy source as a way of saving consumers a bundle. The result may mean that less than

two years from now, the electricity used in your home comes from something as basic as a gust of wind.

Wind power has had its champions for years among environmental advocates viewing it as a simple way to harness an abundant natural resource. Pointing to the windmills erected by the Dutch centuries ago, attorney Ken Bond noted the historical connection between the state and that part of the world during a recent daylong wind power conference in Albany.

"The Dutch actually founded New York and perfected the windmill," he said. "Now we're coming back to that same technology.

show at least 784 major wind turbines being built in the next year and a half, some of which could stand over 400 feet tall.

Since late 2004, a round of state initiatives tailored to electricity by wind-driven turbines have kicked into high

prices for fossil fuels like oil and natural gas, state policies have become the catalyst for major new economic development taking place in New York in the next decade, according to John Sainteross, a senior project manager with New York State Energy and Research Development Authority. By 2013, the state expects more than \$1 billion in new economic development as a result of wind power.



State tax dollars are already being used to provide a major subsidy to wind power in Lewis County, a small rural community in western New York. There a company known as Flat Rock Windpower LLC is looking to operate a series of 186 stateof-the-art wind turbines on the Tug Hill Plateau.

In a unique move, the sites for those turbines are included in an area the state has designated as an Empowerment Zone and much of the \$8 million local government will receive from Flat Rock will be reimbursed by the state. "We wouldn't have even considered approving the turbines if it hadn't been for the substantial payments we are receiving," said Lewis County Attorney Richard Graham.

farms and ruin the "forever wild" flavor the park is famous for.

It is an old battle. On the one hand, the 6-million-acre Adirondack Park is the only place in the country outside of Alaska that includes 9,000 square miles of protected natural forest landscape. On the other hand, utilizing wind energy reduces the nation's reliance on Midwestern coal-fired power plants that spew toxins into the atmosphere causing acid rain that kills off lakes, trees and other foliage within that same 9,000 square miles.

"These things have to be weighed in context," said ACENY Executive Director Carol Murphy, adding the site is a former mining operation and is one of the few spots in the park already zoned for industrial use. "We need additional electricity so what are our options? Burn more fossil fuels? Build a new nuclear plant? We need to move forward with renewable energy."

She said New York has the potential to become one of the "windiest" spots in the nation. "We have no problem finding the spots. The problem is getting public acceptance of building them at those spots," she said.

In addition to the obvious value of chipping away at the costs of using crude oil and other fossil fuels — symbolized by the ever present threat of a gallon of gas crossing the \$3 threshold and ongoing global warming proponents say wind farms are an economic boost to the area.

As Adirondack Wind Partners work its project through the permitting process, one selling point it is using is the need to hire, 75 construction workers to build the farm and up to three full-time employees once it is up and

Noble Environmental Power. which has three large wind farm projects pending approval in the northern part of the state, says it will create 725 jobs in the towns of Altona, Clinton and Ellenburg and pay \$1.7 million a year in

Wind parks provide tremendous benefits to both the environment and the economy." said Noble Environmental Power CEO Charles Hinkley in a statement. "Our wind parks will provide a huge boost to the local economy and, by making tax payments to local schools, help reduce pressure on local school property taxes."

As wind becomes more prevalent in New York, a phenomenon taking place in the western part of the state benefits the longstruggling family farmer. Generally, wind farmers pay traditional farmers \$5,000 per mega-watt of electricity produced per year from turbines built on their land. A standard turbine needs less than an acre of land and produces 1.5 megawatts or more a year.

"It will help keep the farm from being sold into subdivisions and keep the land in the family," Murphy said. "New York has the reputation of being progressive on environmental and energy issues and we have been leaders in a lot of ways, and we should continue that tradition with wind."
