Two toll operators identify Jeep

Two tollbooth collectors who work 230 miles apart, in Rochester and Albany, told jurors in the murder trial of Christopher Porco that they recall seeing a yellow Jeep Wrangler with a young white male driving the night Peter and Joan Porco were attacked.

John Fallon worked as a toll collector at Exit 46 in Henrietta on Nov. 14, 2004, covering the 3 to 11 p.m. shift. Fallon saw over 3,000 vehicles pass through his toll that day, but there was something about a yellow Jeep that registered in his memory.

"I remember a yellow Jeep that came through at 10:45 p.m. right before quitting time," said Fallon on Monday, July 10. Fallon testified that his son and wife both own Jeeps and Jeeps are vehicles he pays close attention to.

"As the vehicle got closer, I

Weapon described in detail

Investigators from the Albany County district attorney's office wheeled a heavy sack filled with evidence into the Orange County Courthouse on Thursday, July 6, where the murder trial of Christopher Porco is being held. Part of the evidence was an ax used to kill Peter Porco and injure his wife, Joan.

Investigator Drew McDonald of State Police Troop G in Loudonville continued a second day of testimony on evidence gathered at 36 Brockley Drive in Delmar Nov. 15, 2004, including the murder weapon, People's Exhibit 274, a 3-foot ax.

"Yes, this is the ax depicted in this photograph which was located in the master bedroom," McDonald said to Assistant District Attorney and Chief

Doctor: Victim may have memory lapses

The neurosurgeon who operated on Joan Porco's skull fractures after the ax attack inside the Porco family's Brockley Drive home in November 2004 said her severe injuries could cause memory lapses following recovery.

Dr. Paul Spurgas, associate professor of neurosurgery at Albany Medical Center, spent six hours removing and repairing damaged bone from the center of Porco's scalp down the right forehead and right eye during a 12-hour overall operation to save her life. Joan Porco survived the attacks that murdered her husband, Peter, and for which her son, Christopher, 22, is now on trial.

"The injuries were extensive, involving multiple skull fractures," said Spurgas during testimony on Thursday, July 6. "I repaired the brain the best I could."

Porco's injuries, which prosecutors believe were inflicted by her son Christopher Porco, were so severe that 4 to 5 inches

of bone had to be replaced.

"She would have died if injuries were left untreated," said Spurgas under questioning by Albany County Assistant District Attorney and Chief Prosecutor Michael McDermott.

Spurgas is considered an expert witness for the prosecution because of the 7,000 surgeries he performed throughout his career, hundreds of them involving brain and spinal cord injuries.

Defense Attorney Laurie

Shanks was quick to point out that Spurgas is a neurosurgeon and not a neurologist, and cannot testify as an expert witness with respect to cognitive functions.

"It is not uncommon for patients after neurosurgery to have changes or lapses in their memory," Spurgas testified.


"You couldn't tell if she (Mrs. Porco) was asleep when injuries to her eye and skull took place, is that correct?" Shanks asked.

"Correct," said the doctor. "You certainly didn't ask Mrs. Porco any questions," continued Shanks.

"She was under anesthesia when I saw her," said Spurgas.

Joan Porco could not communicate for a period of time after surgery because her jaw was wired shut and she was fed through a feeding tube.

"Did she communicate with

Feura Bush woman charged in fatal vehicle/bike accident

A 49-year-old Slingerlands man was killed while riding his bike on Route 32 on Monday, July 3, and the driver has been charged with DWI.

Bethlehem Police report that 49-year-old Joel Melnikoff, was

riding down the shoulder of the road on his bike along State Route 32 when a 1995 Ford Explorer driven by 51-year-old Darlene G. Kawczak of Feura Bush traveling north struck the cyclist.

Police report Melnikoff was found pinned underneath the vehicle when they arrived. Melnikoff was extricated from underneath the vehicle by members of the Slingerlands Fire Department and

pronounced dead at the scene. The road was closed for several hours in both directions between Creble Road and Feura Bush Road following the accident.

Kawczak failed field sobriety tests and has been charged with

DWI and was arraigned in Town Court to reappear Aug. 1. The accident remains under investigation, and additional charges are pending.

Traffic stop leads to arrest

Richard Oldham, 35, of 11 Gardner Terrace, Delmar was charged by Bethlehem Police with DWI and felony aggravated unlicensed operation. Bethlehem police report that Oldham was traveling west on Route 85 with no rear plate when a police officer began to follow the vehicle to the intersection of 85 and New

Scotland Road. Oldham according to police, then drove across the solid double yellow center line. Police state he failed a field sobriety test and was subsequently charged with DWI. Oldham will appear in Town Court July 18.



Bloody socks and a \$100 check

Porco doesn't look at graphic photos

Close to 200 crime scene photos of the inside of 36 Brockley Drive were detailed during testimony at the murder trial of Christopher Porco from the man who took them, New York State Police Troop G Investigator Drew McDonald.

Porco, 22, is on trial for the murder of his father and the attempted murder of his mother.

A 20-year veteran who has worked on over 100 homicides, McDonald on Wednesday, July 5, described in room-by-room and sometime object-by-object detail the collection of evidence gathered inside the Porco family home over several days beginning Nov. 15, 2004, the day Peter Porco was found dead and his wife Joan Porco severely injured in their home.

"We were at the residence a total of six days," said McDonald, who photographed every room in the house explaining the minute differences between blood splatter, transfer of blood and the many passive bloodstains of Peter Porco found inside the home.

What becomes clear in photo after photo is that Peter Porco was up and wandering from the master bedroom to the master bath to the downstairs kitchen and family room, leaving a trail of blood following his footsteps. The greatest amount of blood is found in the master bedroom where the attacks on Joan and Peter Porco occurred. However, the kitchen floor, stove and countertop have bloodstains, as do the bathroom and kitchen light fixtures. Tissues and paper towels with Peter Porco's blood are on the bathroom and kitchen floor. The most difficult photo for the jury and family members to see was the body of Peter Porco lying on his side, head pushed up toward the wall of the foyer by the stairs, shirt pulled halfway up, one hand over his side and white athletic socks he is wearing soaked in blood.

"What it indicated to me is that he stepped in several areas of blood drops," said McDonald.

Defense attorney Terence Kindlon said there is never going to be anything about a crime scene less than horrific. Christopher Porco did not look at the photos of his father when they were shown in the courtroom.

"I couldn't look at the pictures

if it was my father," Kindlon said.

Although the testimony shows a brutal crime scene, Kindlon said it does not link Christopher to the attacks at all.

"The testimony shows Peter Porco was brutally murdered, but it doesn't have anything to do with Christopher," Kindlon said.

A check for \$100 signed by Peter Porco dated Nov. 13, and made out to Saratoga Springs City Court was found stuck to the inside front of the dishwasher. The check was to pay for a traffic violation Christopher Porco received.

"Christopher was being taken care of by his father, and his last act was to pay a \$100 traffic fine," Kindlon said.

Many of the 200 photos also show many rooms left untouched by the perpetrator of the crime, including both the bedrooms of Johnathan and Christopher Porco, the upstairs bathroom, the living room and the dining room. The master bedroom and master bath where the crime scene occurred have the most visible signs of an attack. Evidence collected at the scene show that most, if not all, of the blood found in the rooms outside the master bedroom is the blood of Peter Porco.

Kurt Meyer, a Time Warner Security employee, explained the intricacies of the home security alarm Peter and Joan Porco installed in the home prior to the attacks. The 128 entries in the security system from Oct. 31 through Nov. 15, 2004 were entered as evidence for the prosecution.

Although the Porcos improperly programmed the daylight savings time in October 2004, Meyer was able to show when the home alarm was activated the night prior to the attacks, and when it may have been disarmed.

"At 2:14 a.m., Nov. 15, 2004 the security system was disarmed or turned off by using the master code," Meyer said. "One way to do that is at the keypad in the kitchen."

At 5 a.m. a phone line was cut.

"The actual time the line was cut was around 4:54 a.m.," said Meyers. Defense Attorney Laurie Shanks noted the Porcos paid for a motion sensor with the home security system but could not use it because the family dog Barrister could set it off.

Shanks also noted one of the 128 entries in the security alarm shows the time and date of Dec. 30, 1899, indicated the system is not foolproof. She added there is no way to know if the security alarm was disarmed by someone inside or outside the house. Only four people had the master code to the security alarm system at 36 Brockley Drive prior to Nov. 15.

In earlier testimony, Navy Lt. Steven Carter testified that Johnathan Porco was accounted for at a class inside the Nuclear Power Training Command in Charleston, S.C. on Nov. 15, 2004.

"He sat directly behind me in class and was there at 6:45 a.m.," Stevens said.

IM: 'My parents are dead'

Then-girlfriend testifies about correspondence with Porco around the time of his father's death

The girlfriend of Christopher Porco during November 2004 told jurors in his murder trial that Porco "wasn't feeling well" just hours before he learned his parents had been attacked in their Brockley Drive Home. Porco, 22, is on trial for murdering his father and attempting to murder his mother.

Sarah Fischer of Slingerlands met Porco through a mutual acquaintance in the summer of 2004.

"We played tennis and would go to the movies," Fischer testified on Wednesday, July 5. "We saw each other often in the evenings about five nights a week," the Fairfield University senior told the jury. Fischer often went to 36 Brockley Drive in Porco's yellow Jeep Wrangler.

"Did you ever go to the house at night when his parents were asleep, and how did you enter?" asked assistant district attorney for Albany County, David Rossi.

"Yes, either through the garage door or the front door," answered Fischer, who said a spare key was usually hidden in the flowerpot outside the front door. "Sometimes, I would wait at the front door until the alarm was disarmed."

Barrister, the Porco family's Labrador retriever, often greeted the two when they entered.

"He would hang out with us," said Fischer. "He would never bark, he was always pleasant."

The two continued to date through the fall of 2004 and continued to see each other when Porco went back to the University of Rochester and Fischer attended Fairfield. Porco visited Fischer in October at Fairfield and the two corresponded by instant



messaging on each of their computers right up until the morning of the crime on Nov. 15. Porco also stayed over at Fischer's home in Slingerlands that Friday and Saturday Nov. 12 and 13.

"When did he leave?" asked Rossi.

"That Saturday afternoon at 3 p.m.," Fischer said.

"Do you know where he went when he left?" Rossi asked.

"Back to the University of Rochester," said Fischer.

Fischer told Rossi that Porco initially told her he did not see his parents that weekend.

"He said he felt bad about that," she said. When the couple spoke again online through instant messaging Sunday afternoon Nov. 14, Porco told her he did see his father Peter that weekend, but that his mother Joan wasn't home. They again spoke online Sunday night just before 10 p.m., about four to six hours prior to when police believe Peter Porco was murdered and his wife Joan was savagely attacked with an ax in the master bedroom of their Brockley Drive home.

"He signed off at 10 p.m., and said he had to pick up an economics book," said Fischer.

The next time Fischer spoke with Porco online was Monday afternoon Nov. 15, around 2 p.m., about three and a half hours after police found the body of Peter Porco lying dead at the base of the stairs inside his home.

"We were talking, and he said he wasn't feeling well," said Fischer. While the two were corresponding, Fischer's sister Kate sent Sarah a message online, telling her older sister something had happened at 36 Brockley Drive. Sarah Fischer then rapidly sent the same message to Chris-

topher Porco.

"What was his response to that?" Rossi asked.

"He said he had not been able to contact his parents all morning and that he was nervous," said Fischer. Porco then asked Sarah Fischer if he could send an instant message to her sister Kate to find out more information. The two briefly stopped communicating for about 45 minutes, and again went back online between 2:45 and 3 p.m. It was one of the last messages that day from Christopher to his girlfriend, and it said "my parents are dead."

Defense Attorney Laurie Shanks asked Fischer if she noticed anything different about Porco's demeanor when he stayed over at her family's home on Nov. 12.

"In fact, he made breakfast for you that morning," said Shanks.

"Yes," said Fischer.

"Did he tell you that night about any arguments with his parents?" asked Shanks.

"No," answered Fischer.

Shanks also made it clear that instant messages on a computer does not give a location for the people communicating.

Fischer told Shanks she has only contacted Porco a couple of times since Nov. 15, 2004.

After testimony for the day ended, Defense Attorney Terence Kindlon said Judge Jeffrey Berry ruled out the videotaped interrogation of Porco by the Bethlehem police department.

"The judge said they (the Bethlehem police department) denied him his Fifth Amendment rights," Kindlon said.

Berry did keep the Thruway toll ticket allegedly used by Christopher Porco the night prosecutors and police believe he drove from Rochester to Albany, and back to Rochester the night of Nov. 14, and the morning of Nov. 15, following the attacks on his mother and father.

"You'll find the DNA in that ticket could have come from 60 percent of the population," Kindlon said.

entertainment, it was performed by me. Usually the other parents found me more amusing than did their children, but I was able to hold everyone's attention, at least in the early years.

When Rachel was very young, I didn't put much emphasis on having a designated theme. The theme of "it's your birthday" seemed sufficient and it was easy to find lots of plates and napkins printed with the words "Happy Birthday." Also, instead of a bunch of identical Mylar balloons with a theme decoration, I would get a variety based on Rachel's favorite characters and interests. And every year I always get one balloon personalized with her name in shiny, colorful letters.

We eased into themes when Rachel turned 3. We not only had Smiley Face plates, but I also decorated the homemade chocolate-frosted cake with a big Smiley Face, squeezed out from a tube of yellow icing. By luck, I happened across a Smiley Face necklace and bracelet and she wore those at the party.

Parents who want to remain sane will go to a party store and choose from one of the gazillions of existing themes. If your theme involves princesses or mermaids or any currently popular kids TV show, then you will not have a problem finding supplies.

This rarely applied to us. For the most part, our themes have been non-traditional. Over the years Rachel and I would pick a theme and then I'd go in search of paper goods and decorations. For example, one year our theme originated from a book called Big Max. Big Max is a detective who goes in search of a missing elephant. During the story it's revealed that birthdays are very important to elephants.

Well, in 2003 the only elephant accessory I could find was a giant helium balloon. I wasn't expecting to find anything related to the specific characters in Big Max, but even Disney's Dumbo paraphernalia wasn't available to serve as a substitute.

Parents work hard to make their children feel special on their birthday.

For nine years, I created Rachel's invitations on the computer and I wrote them in rhyming verse: "If you like fun, we'll have a bunch; come for cake and games and lunch." I inserted clip art, including balloons and something else related to the party's theme: a dog, an owl (for the Harry Potter theme), an elephant, a mouse, etc.

This year, we went to the bowling alley and picked up

shiny postcard invitations. Rachel filled in the relevant details, including the time of the party and the RSVP deadline. Although the information was handwritten, it took less time to prepare the invites than it used to take me to write the poem, pick the graphics, and arrange the layout.

Filling out the cards gave my daughter a greater sense of involvement in the party planning. Although I understood this, part of me still lamented over my reduced role and her lack of interest in a poem.

Ah well, it wouldn't have been appropriate to print "Let's meditate and practice Zen; my little girl is turning ten" or "My girl is sweet and rarely fidgets; She is turning double digits."

Double digits! Yikes, she's almost a teenager.

It's an adventure to watch our child grow. In many ways she's the same person we've always known, only taller and with a slightly later bedtime. She loves reading, boogie boarding at the ocean, playing softball and soccer, going to camp and having sleepovers. As has been the case for many years, her favorite foods are pasta, pasta, pasta, rice and ice cream.

Rachel's first birthday was by far the largest gathering, with over 30 people crammed into our condo on a blazing hot and humid Sunday. Rachel's main present for her first birthday was a wooden rocking horse her daddy made. We had to help her get on and only her tiny toes could reach the footrests. She got a few good years out of that horse.

This year, Rachel prepared a list of desired birthday presents, with asterisks marking the most important items. All but one item on the list was asterisked!

In the not-too-distant future I bet her "birthday party" won't involve computer-generated or handwritten invites. It will be just telephone calls out to friends. They'll hang out in the basement and eat pizza and then walk over to the Perfect Blend Café for smoothies. Her dad and I will be relegated to the family-only birthday celebration.

But I don't need to rush things along. This week, Rachel turns 10, and we'll be a part of the festivities at Del Lanes along with a group of our daughter's friends.

I see now that it's easier to host a party outside one's home. All I'm responsible for is bringing a cake and writing a check.

So, what's so hard about being replaced by a bowling establishment? Not much. But watching my little girl "being replaced" by a young lady, now that's a whole other story.

"It's finally here, 10 is your age. And you've been loved at every stage."



Commercial lights save money

took notice of it because I thought it would be a good vehicle for my son," said Fallon.

"Did you see who was driving that vehicle?" asked Assistant District Attorney for Albany County and Chief Prosecutor Michael McDermott.

"It was a white male in his early- to mid-20s with a baseball cap on," said Fallon.

Authorities believe Peter and Joan Porco were attacked inside their Brockley Drive home in the early morning hours of Nov. 15, 2004 by their son Christopher Porco with an ax. Christopher Porco is on trial for the murder of his father and attempted murder of his mother.

A police officer from Bethlehem's police department met with Fallon later that month to ask if he remembered the yellow Jeep.

"Did anybody show you a photo of a human being to look at?" asked Defense Attorney Terence Kindlon.

"No sir," answered Fallon.

"Nobody showed you a picture of a young white man in his early 20s?" Kindlon asked again.

"That's correct," Fallon said.

"When the Bethlehem police officer asked me to identify a vehicle that day, I laughed at him," said Fallon, believing he could never remember one vehicle in 3,000 that pass through his toll booth on a given day. "When he showed me a picture of a yellow Jeep Wrangler, I said I recognize that."

Kindlon asked Fallon if he remembered other Jeeps that passed through his tollbooth on Nov. 12 or Nov. 14, and Fallon did

not.

"All I remember about the Jeep (on Nov. 14, 2004) is that it was a yellow Jeep Wrangler with big tires on it," said Fallon.

Karen Russell, a 25-year veteran toll collector working the 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. shift at Exit 24 in Albany remembers not only the yellow Jeep but something else about the driver.

"I remember a yellow Jeep that came barreling down my lane with a young man driving with brown hair," said Russell. "The

speed he was coming into my lane was excessive." Russell pinpointed the time to be right before her 2 a.m. break that morning on Nov. 15.

Kindlon said Russell told police the yellow Jeep was the last vehicle she saw before her 2 a.m. break; however, a check of all toll tickets collected that night indicate Russell handed out 24 other toll tickets before her break.

"You can confirm it is just not true that a yellow Jeep Wrangler was the last vehicle before your break," Kindlon said.

"I remember seeing a yellow Jeep because of the speed it entered, but I am inaccurate in saying it was my last vehicle like I told Det. (Anthony) Arduini," Russell stated. Arduini was a Bethlehem police officer who recently died.

Earlier in the day, Thruway Authority Toll Supervisor James

Buono and Thruway Authority Senior Accountant Craig W. Slezak were asked about the process of handling and separating the specific number of toll tickets that match the time frame of Nov. 14 and Nov. 15, 2004 when all vehicles on the Thruway that night left Rochester to go to Albany and back. Both men said they were in the same room together wearing latex gloves when they sifted through the hundreds of tickets to find a total of 12 tickets that traveled from Exit 46 to Exit 24 and back between midnight and 3 a.m. and between 5 and 10 a.m.

"Once we found the tickets that met the criteria of the subpoena, we put those tickets in individual white envelopes and called someone in our legal department to give them to," said Buono.

Slezak also told the jury that only E-Z Pass toll lanes have cameras, and the only time the camera takes a photo is when a vehicle goes through an E-Z Pass lane that does not register.

Assistant District Attorney David Rossi said the toll ticket they believe Christopher Porco used to drive his yellow Jeep Wrangler from his University of Rochester dorm early Monday morning Nov. 15, 2004, registered in toll collector Karen Russell's Thruway toll lane at 1:51 a.m. at Exit 24 in Albany. They believe Porco arrived back in Rochester at 8:18 a.m. that same morning, about four to six hours after

authorities believe the crimes occurred.

Peter Porco was found dead at the bottom of the inside stairs of his Brockley Drive home around 11:30 that morning by Third Appellate Division Court Officer Michael Hart. His wife, Joan Porco, was in the upstairs

master bedroom with critical injuries to her skull and face from the ax attack.

The murder trial of Christopher Porco has been adjourned until Monday, July 17, due to the death of Laurie Shanks' mother on July 10, while Shanks was in court.

you in any way?" asked Shanks.

"I asked her if she had memories, but never specifically of the attack," said Spurgas.

"There is no notation that ever indicated Joan Porco was given a mental status exam when she came to the emergency room,"

"The injuries were extensive, involving multiple skull fractures. I repaired the brain the best I could."

Shanks said.

"She was sedated before coming to the emergency room, and could not respond with a tube in her throat," said Spurgas.

A key piece of evidence in the prosecution's case against Christopher Porco is that police and paramedics at the scene of the crime on Nov. 15, 2004, testified later that Joan Porco nodded "yes" when asked

whether her son Christopher had attacked her. Defense Attorneys Shanks and Terence Kindlon are trying to poke holes in that theory. It is their belief it was too dark to see the assailant in the middle of the night, and both Joan and Peter Porco could have been asleep before the attack occurred. The defense believes that, combined with Joan Porco's mental state immediately after the injuries when paramedics began treatment, make it impossible for her to know who committed the crime.

Peter Porco was found dead at the base of the stairs in his

home after the attacks by Third Appellate Division Court Officer Michael Hart, who arrived first on the scene on Monday, Nov. 15, when Peter Porco didn't report to work. Christopher Porco is charged with murder and attempted murder and is free on bail.

He is currently living at the home of Elaine LaForté and her family in Glenmont.

Prosecutor Michael McDermott.

"There are heavy bloodstains on the head of the ax, but not on the bottom of the ax," McDonald said. The murder weapon was dusted for fingerprints with blood swabs taken to a state police lab for testing.

"Are you familiar, investigator, with a fireman's ax, and how does it differ?" asked McDermott.

"A fireman's ax is generally bigger," McDonald said, "and used for cutting buildings, not trimming tree branches."

McDonald told jurors the crime occurred inside the master bedroom on Joan Porco's side of the bed, where the perpetrator swung a 3-foot ax anywhere from 10 to 30 times before dropping it on the bed and fleeing.

"I believe the attack happened while the two people were in their bed, and they spent some time lying there with their injuries in their bed," he said.

"Did you try to find if the perpetrator in this crime was cut or bleeding?" asked McDermott. McDonald said no blood from any other source was found.

Under cross examination from Defense Attorney Terence Kindlon, McDonald was asked who took the lead in the crime scene investigation, state police or the Bethlehem police department.

"The Bethlehem police department was lead agency at the crime scene, and they call the shots as to how this investigation proceeds," said McDonald.

McDonald told Kindlon and the jury that both state police and Bethlehem police were gathering evidence at the scene at different times in the days following the

crime. Kindlon told the jury several people, including EMS personnel, police and others all walked in and around the crime scene before evidence was gathered. The defense believes Bethlehem police have very little experience in handling homicide cases since very few homicides ever occur in the town.

"Who was in charge of the investigation?" asked Kindlon.

"The detective I dealt with was Christopher Bowdish," McDonald said. "He is the person most extensively trained in the police department."

McDermott asked in redirect whether Bowdish has forensic investigative similar to McDonald's extensive police experience.

"We are both members of the Capital District Forensic Officers Group, and he is the vice president," said McDonald of Bowdish.

Kindlon asked how many homicides Bowdish had investigated for the Bethlehem police department.

"I don't know," McDonald said.

Later in the day, Officer Michael Cotsworth of the city of Rochester police department testified that he found the yellow Jeep Wrangler that Christopher Porco drove on a street outside the dormitories at the University of Rochester on Nov. 15, 2004, after the crimes on Brockley Drive in Delmar occurred.

"I located the vehicle on Genesee Street," said Cotsworth, who then immediately dispatched word that the vehicle was found.

"I blocked the street off and put crime scene tape around the vehicle," he said.

Cotsworth said the Jeep was never moved or touched in his presence.

Kindlon attempted to get information to the jury that

Cotsworth asked neighbors if they had seen Porco's Jeep Wrangler that weekend. Celestina Brown, who lives in the neighborhood, told the officer that the Jeep in question had been parked in front of her house for a couple of days. Judge Jeffrey Berry, who is presiding over the trial, would not allow the officer to answer questions regarding his sweep of the neighborhood calling it "classic hearsay."

"This is not coming in by the manner you want it to come in," said Berry while the jury was taken out of the courtroom.

"You're couching it in terms of the People haven't done their job. You can subpoena the witness," said Berry, referring to the neighbor.

Chad Rice, a Bethlehem police officer, was ordered to drive to Rochester with a local towing company to remove the Jeep Wrangler from the Rochester city street.


"I was advised and told not to touch the Jeep, to just pick it up and bring it to the State Police lab (in Loudonville) for testing," Rice said.

Kindlon asked Rice if the E-Z-Pass inside the Jeep Wrangler went off when the tow truck carrying Porco's vehicle went through the tollbooths.

"I don't recall," said Rice.

Peter Porco's name is listed as the owner of the Jeep Wrangler. Prosecutors believe Christopher Porco allegedly drove from the University of Rochester to Delmar late Sunday evening, and attacked his parents in their home before driving back to Rochester early Monday morning, Nov. 15. Porco is charged with murder and attempted murder. The trial recessed at the end of the day Thursday.

Advisory committee members dream of happy trails

With talk of oil addiction on many people's minds, members of one town committee floated the dream of a trail-linking four green corners of Bethlehem.

The Citizens Advisory Committee on Conservation met Monday, July 10, and discussed linking Five Rivers, Elm Avenue Park, the Norman-side Golf Course and the land behind Price Chopper, where the Vista

Technology Park is slated to be built.

Down the center of that loop and connected to it would run the Albany County Rail Trail. Several committee members wanted to focus only on the area around the Vista property, but others favored the larger scope.

"You have to know essentially where the trail is going," committee member Jeff Freedman said.

The committee's report on a trail system will likely be given to the town board in September or October, committee chair John Smolinsky said. It is only a starting point for the board.

Still even if the town board takes up the committee's ideas, before anyone can easily walk, rollerblade or bike about town, a lot of other players will have to be on board.

Albany County for one.

Despite rumors to the contrary, Smolinsky said, the county has not yet purchased the spine of the project — the rail/trail land — from Canadian Pacific Railroad.

The rail trail would also take Bethlehem residents into Albany where they could connect with the Mohawk Hudson Bike Trail.

"All the parties are still on track to make (the land purchase) happen. They expect it would be another six months to a year before they will finalize the deal," Smolinsky said.

Also several years off is the Vista project, which is still in its infancy.

Add to the mix a consultant the town is in the process of hiring. That may make the committee more of an advisory body for the trail system rather than the actual

planner. The consultant's role should be clear by the committee's August meeting.

In another year or two a study on the watershed located 1 kilometer from the Normanskill now under way may also impact the long-term plans for the trails. The Hudson River Estuary program, a state program, is funding the study and the New York chapter of the Audubon Society will do the work.

"These are long-term visions and long-term changes in the area that are going to take time," Smolinsky said.

Cool ideas for saving energy this summer



Electricity demand in New York State continues to grow. Once again this summer, when hot weather places even greater demand on New York's electric grid, supplies may be tight, especially in New York City and Long Island. Statewide, the New York Independent System Operator (ISO) forecasts that we should have enough electricity to meet demand. It projects that New York's 2006 peak demand will be 33,295 megawatts (MW), 1,220 MW higher than last summer. Add another 5,993 MW for the required cushion, and the total need for 2006 is 39,288 MW.

In the past few years, new generating plants have come on line, improvements to older plants have been made, and demand reduction programs have been implemented that are helping meet the need. But if we have a prolonged heat wave, the margin between peak demand and available supply could be tight.


What to expect

This summer, you may be asked to help ensure system reliability and the availability of electricity by conserving energy. Your efforts can make a big contribution to the plans of utilities, large-use customers and New York State that go into effect during a heat wave. If everyone reduces the amount of electricity they use just a little, it can make a big difference.

Adequate supply and reliability

On an extremely hot day, New York's electric utilities may take steps to maintain system reliability. Utilities may:


- Issue public appeals to residential customers on the radio and TV.
- Ask large customers to reduce their consumption.
- Ask customers to voluntarily reduce consumption.



What you should do


Using less electricity or shifting usage to off-peak hours will help ensure that there will be an adequate supply for everyone and can help lower your bills.

- Use major appliances early or late in the day.
- Turn off your air conditioner when you leave home or set the thermostat at 78 degrees or higher.



- Use an electric fan to bring in cool air from outside during morning or evening.

- Close curtains or blinds during the day to block out heat from the sunlight.



- Shop for the ENERGY STAR® symbol for energy efficiency when you're in the market for a new air conditioner or major appliances.

Protect your appliances

Using dedicated surge protectors can help protect your appliances from power surges. In the event of a power outage or voltage reduction:

- Disconnect your personal computer, VCR, DVD, TV, microwave and stereo.
- Turn off other appliances that were on to prevent blowing fuses or tripping circuit breakers when power is restored.

Protect yourself

To protect your health and safety if your electricity goes out:

- Check to see if your neighbors have power.
- Notify your utility of the outage.
- Keep a battery-powered radio, flashlight and batteries on hand.
- Have at least one phone in your house that does not require household electricity.
- Have a list of emergency numbers available.
- Keep refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible.


- Register special needs customers (blind, elderly, disabled) with their utility so they receive priority attention.
- Follow all safety precautions for operating portable generators.

During an energy alert, your actions can help maintain the system. If an energy alert is announced, make every effort to reduce your electricity use. Turn off




all non-essential electrical devices, lights and appliances.

Classic musicals liven up two local summer stages


The hills to the east are teeming with a summer onslaught of theatrical venues. Whether it's Tanglewood and the Boston Symphony Orchestra, The Berkshire Theater Festival, Jacob's Pillow, Shakespeare and Company, Williamstown Theatre Festival, all in the Berkshires, or Mac-Haydn Theatre in Chatham, Columbia County, there is something to entertain everyone.

Williamstown Theatre Festival


A bad night at Williamstown is still a good night of theater. That holds true for the current production of Cole Porter's "Anything Goes." The season opener, directed by the festival's Artistic Director, Roger Rees is quite entertaining on some levels. It's a delightful summer evening filled with camp, mugging actors, great costumes and lovely voices.

The problem with this production falls with the lead, Sharon Lawrence. Lawrence, best known to television audiences for her role in the series "NYPD Blue," acts well, is a joy to look at and has a pretty voice. Unfortunately, she is painfully miscast in the role of the gutsy Reno Sweeney.

Many actors' careers are defined by the roles they have played; occasionally, a role is defined by the performer who brought it to life. This is the case with the character of Reno, the gutsy

gal with a heart of gold originally created on Broadway by the late Ethel Merman and later in the New York Lincoln Center revival by Patti LuPone. Both of these

women brought loud, bombastic singing voices that made such songs as "Blow, Gabriel Blow," "Anything Goes," "You're the Top," and "Friendship" become Cole Porter standards for singers of the "belting" variety. Lawrence just doesn't have the power and gusto to get it out there. One feels as if the music has been "dumbed down" in order to

accommodate her soft melodic approach. It just doesn't work.

The rest of the cast is outstanding. Malcolm Gets of the 1990s television series "Caroline in the City" is perfect, albeit a tad young for the role of Sir Evelyn Oakleigh. Remy Auberjonois, Matt Cavanaugh, Catherine Brunell, and Nikki Renée Daniels all have strong singing voices, and are perfect in their roles. Kaye Voice's costumes hone in on the feeling of the 1930's on board ship perfectly. Particularly well played out are her black, white and gray opening scene costumes on the New York docks as everyone is boarding the ship, creating the appearance of black-and-white newsreel footage. While Lawrence is an unfortunate choice, the rest of the cast more than makes up for the evening and the Theatre Festival still offers an enjoyable evening in the mountains.

Mac-Haydn

In Columbia County's Chatham, Mac-Haydn Theater has brought Fanny Brice back to life in the stage production of "Funny Girl." This production is strong, well-packaged and a joy to watch, all two hours and 45 minutes of it. The "Funny Girl" role is another that's an icon — both Fanny herself and the depiction of her that projected Barbra Streisand to superstardom. They leave very large shoes to fill. Melissa Giattino is not Streisand, though here, her rendition of Brice works well. Her interpretation hampers neither the show nor the character, though she lacks the ability to get into some of Brice's schtick with any sense of believability. Her voice is strong in a pretty way,

and her dancing is superb.

A strong supporting cast — Richard Weidlich as Nicky Arnstein, Elizabeth Dowling as Fanny's mother and area favorite Brandon Davis as Flo Ziegfeld — all captivate the audience with their strong voices and acting acumen.


This show's standout is Richard Schwarz, in the role of Brice's confidante, Eddie Ryan. Schwarz steals the stage every time his feet start to move... his tap dancing is flawless, his voice strong and he alone is worth the trip to Chatham. Jimm Halliday's costume designs have pushed this theater to a new level.

The show is unique in that it isn't a typical musical comedy, leaving you laughing after the big splashy grand finale. Rather, the very quiet, down ending leaves you pensive and thinking well after the house lights have come up. Great costumes, Julie Styne's wonderful score and Melissa Giattino, Richard Schwarz and a stage filled with

great voices make this one show not to be missed this summer.







Fortunately for Monthie, there were two factors that helped him and his coaching staff get some of the top college talent from such premier baseball programs as UCLA, California State-Fullerton, South Carolina, Georgia, Miami and Pepperdine. One factor was a new home field in Brewster—a first for an 18-year-old franchise that had played all of its previous home games in neighboring Harwich.

The other factor was that the Whitecaps play in the Cape Cod League, which has produced hundreds of Major League Baseball players. Brewster alone has 15 active players in the majors including Pittsburgh pitcher Kip Wells, Philadelphia second baseman Chase Utley and New York Mets reliever Billy Wagner.

"The list is, in many cases, a Who's Who of baseball," said Monthie. "(Nomar) Garciaparra, Aaron Rowand, (and) Frank Thomas all played in this league."

Monthie's work doesn't end with building the Whitecaps' roster. He fields questions from his players, his volunteers and fans from the time the ballpark opens until everything is put away for the evening. In one five-minute stretch before Saturday's game started, a player asked him about getting a new bat after breaking his, a woman asked to borrow a pen and an on-field volunteer asked where the pine tar was.

Monthie wasn't bothered by any of those requests, though. He was at a ballfield on the Cape on a near-perfect late afternoon.

"I'd say it's a fun job," he told me. "It's fun to be around kids, and it's fun to be around baseball because I love the sport."

organization — much like he did during his days as a catcher and utility infielder. But he also knows a winning record doesn't always ensure a promotion.

"You can't really predict that sort of thing. You have to be in the right place at the right time, and you have to have the right people see you," he said. "There are a lot of successful coaches who have stayed at the minor league level."

Quatraro does have time on his side. At age 32, he is getting an early start in his managerial ca-

reer. Still, he's not willing to look too far ahead — not after seeing his playing career cut short.

"I love what I'm doing, but there's very little job security in baseball," he said. "You can't predict what's going to happen next year, let alone 10 or 15 years down the road."

At least, Matt Quatraro is on the path to a major league career. Just not the career he thought he was going to have.

"I thought I was going to play in the major leagues for 10 or 15 years when I was drafted," he said.





Monthie gets a dream job on Cape Cod

I never know where I'll run into some of the people I cover on a regular basis.

I've met up with coaches at the supermarket, former high school athletes at area bars, and one high school athletic director in the parking lot of Giants Stadium tailgating before a Giants-Bills game.

As we were walking toward the field, I heard someone shout, "I thought we banned people from Latham from this park."

When I turned, I saw long-time Shaker boys varsity swim coach Ned Monthie standing near the backstop wearing a Brewster baseball cap and golf shirt.

At first, I figured Monthie was there to watch the game. As I soon found out, he was there because he had a personal stake in the Whitecaps as the team's general manager.

That's right. Monthie has been given every baseball junkie's dream job. And it wasn't out of the blue, either.

"I've been with the club for three years," said Monthie, who is spending his 36th summer on the Cape. "I'd been a game day volunteer and youth clinic coordinator the last two years, and when the general manager left for a job in Chicago, the team president called me and asked if I wanted to be the general manager."

With that call, Monthie went from helping with behind-the-scenes game-day operations to building the actual on-field product with head coach Bob Macaluso and his coaching staff.

"The biggest challenge of putting any team together is getting the best players and getting them to come here," said Monthie.

Quatraro embarks on managerial career

Matt Quatraro didn't get the chance to play Major League Baseball. But with some success and a little luck, he might get the chance to coach in the big leagues.

The 1992 Bethlehem Central High School graduate is in his first season managing the Hudson Valley Renegades, a Class A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays in the New York-Penn League.

"I didn't even expect to be coaching two years ago," said Quatraro, who is called "Q" by his

players. "It just kind of happened, but I'm happy to be doing what I'm doing."

Quatraro was originally on the road to the majors as a player. He was drafted out of Old Dominion University by the Devil Rays in 1996 and spent the next six years working his way up to the AAA-level Durham Bulls — one step below the major leagues. But he never got the call to Tampa Bay and was released following the 2002 season.

Quatraro gave it one more shot when he signed a deal with the New York Yankees in 2003, but he was released in spring training — ending his playing days at the age of 29. Still, he had no regrets.

"It was great. I was getting paid to do what I love," said Quatraro. "Minor league ball is a grind. There's long trips on the bus (be-

tween cities), and all the traveling can wear on you. But it's a great experience."

Quatraro's coaching career began the following year when Tampa Bay hired him to be the Renegades' hitting coach. Having settled down in Albany, Quatraro decided to commute between the Capital District and the Renegades' home in Beacon (outside Newburgh) — something he still does today.

"I come home as much as I can," he said. "I come home two or three nights a week, depending on the schedule."

Quatraro assisted manager Dave Howard for the 2004 and 2005 seasons before Howard left. Tampa Bay then offered the Hudson Valley managerial position to Quatraro, which he gladly accepted.

Quatraro said the transition from hitting coach to manager has gone well.

"I think being here for a couple of years was helpful to me," he said. "There are some different things I have to do day to day, but I've gotten used to it."

Quatraro's players responded well to the new manager out of the gate, as the Renegades won eight of their first 13 games. A recent seven-game losing streak has taken some of the steam out of Hudson Valley's sails, but they were only 6.5 games behind first-place Aberdeen in the McManara Division as of Monday with nearly two months still to go.

Quatraro is hoping a good showing this season will help him advance within the Tampa Bay
