**Audit uncovers misuse of funds**

**Comptroller's report says McCartney used district funds at strip club**

An audit released by the state Comptroller's office says that former Voorheesville super-

intendent Alan McCartney had charged at least \$11,500 to the district for everything from expensive dinners to an evening at an Albany-area strip club.

The audit also found that a school official currently working in the district possibly violated leave time regulations and another may have accepted an inappropriate gift from a bus

manufacturer.

The findings came after the office of the state comptroller decided to expand the audit, originally released in January, that found that McCartney and former assistant superintendent Anthony Marturano improperly paid themselves \$216,000 for leave and other employment benefits.

According to the audit, of the \$11,500 charged to or reimbursed from the district for various personal expenses, only \$611 of those charges was paid back by McCartney. The audit stated money paid back by McCartney included the \$357 he charged at a strip club on Dec. 17, 2004. The same night, McCartney used the district credit card for an

**the politics of losing**

In elections, it's not only whether you win or lose, but *how* you win or lose

Steve Pesta can sell you a sixth-place trophy right off the shelf at Awards by Walsh's in Cohoes, and he can order you lower places if you need them.

"Tenth place. Fifteenth. If you want to honor everyone, you can just get participation awards," the 41-year-old owner of the awards and screen-printing store said. He said in recent years there has been a move away from celebrating only those who come in first, second or third in a contest, and toward recognizing everyone's participation and effort in an event.

"And I'd say that's a good thing," he said from behind the counter, "if you own an awards store."

Kidding aside, Pesta said he embraces the trend of awarding all competitors regardless of how they place, especially children.

"For a lot of kids, mom and dad are going to buy them things," he said. "But when they get an award, maybe just for finishing an event, that's something they've earned."

This argument works in spelling bees and science fairs, but in politics, there are no awards for gradual accomplishment, and this can lead to sore losers, say some local professors.

"In politics, that's it — you win or you lose," said University at Albany's William Husson, a member of the university's communications department and co-author of 10 research texts on media and politics.

"Those kinds of grades of recognition are beneficial in an

**Fumes force school's closure**

**RCS High School classes cancelled due to nauseating odor**

On Tuesday, Ravena-Coymans-Selkirk High School was closed for a fourth consecutive school day because of an odor that has caused some faculty and students to go home sick. High school students were asked to report to the middle school Tuesday for classes, while middle school students were given the day off. All after-school and evening activities, including adult education activities, at the high school were cancelled for a portion of Thursday, Nov. 16, Friday, Nov. 17, and Monday, Nov. 20.

On Thursday, Nov. 16, seven faculty members and four students complained of nausea and related symptoms due to an odor emanating from portions of the building. Two students went home with parents and two others were taken by Ravena Rescue Squad to an area hospital for evaluation. All students were dismissed from the middle and high schools at 12:45 p.m. Thursday. District officials and Superintendent Vicki Wright made the decision to cancel classes Friday and Monday.

Officials have contracted with C.T. Male & Associates to work to remove the source of the odor, a slurrylike sediment that is sitting on top of the soil beneath the high school. Experts have determined that the odor is the result of a yeast fermentation

## Bomb threat forces school to lock up

On Monday, Nov. 13, at 9:45 a.m., a bomb threat forced Bethlehem Central High School into lockdown mode for about an hour. The incident is still being investigated, and no arrests have been made.

"The normal procedure is a sweep of the school and moving students to safe areas," said Superintendent Les Loomis.

High School principal Chuck Abba sent a letter to parents explaining that the lockdown was prompted by a written threat in one of the school's student bathrooms.

"No bombs or explosive materials were found on the premises," said Abba.

"In consultation with the

police, the administrative staff determined that the building was clear for resuming classes," Abba wrote.

The district follows a state-approved process every time a threat occurs.

"It's much safer than moving all students outdoors like we do in a fire drill," said Loomis.

School officials are working with the Bethlehem police to find the source of the threat. Students and parents who may have information regarding the threat are urged to contact the district.

"The safety of our students is one of our primary concerns, and all threats, no matter how vague, will be investigated," Abba wrote to parents.

Bethlehem police would not provide any details other than to say the investigation continues.

Police said Paige was stopped just east of Kenwood Avenue.





# Eagle lands a spot as new school name

**Younger students swing the vote**

Eagle, a name identified with school spirit and pride in the Bethlehem Central School District, is the name picked by a vote of the student population for the soon-to-be-constructed elementary school.

Out of 4,585 student votes, Eagle Elementary School was the choice of 1,677 students. Delmar Elementary finished second with 1,383 votes, followed by Adamsville Elementary School with 1,222 votes. The name Henry Hudson School received only 303 votes.

Ironically, it wasn't the high school students, whose mascot is an eagle, who chose Eagle Elementary. It was the younger Bethlehem students who caused the vote to swing in the name's favor. Delmar Elementary received more

votes from high school students, and Adamsville Elementary received more votes from the middle school. More than 1,000 elementary students made up the 1,677 votes for Eagle Elementary School.

"The elementary school students put it over the top," said board member James Lytle.

A large round of applause was heard at the school board meeting Wednesday, Nov. 15, when the public watched Lytle unveil a drawing of the new school design with the name Eagle Elementary at the top of the building.

"That's what you guys

decided, and it's wonderful," said school board president Stuart Lyman.

"Congratulations!"

Eagle Elementary was one of more than 75 different names nominated by the community. Names submitted were narrowed down to four by the school board before the student vote was held Nov. 3.

"During the course of the day, we received an update on the vote, like getting an exit poll," said Lytle. "And very much like exit polls, the update was not the final result."

"Are we going to send eaglets there?" asked board member Warren Stoker.

More than 140 people submitted entries for the new school name in September. Students in kindergarten through grade 12 districtwide voted on the finalists.

"It's exciting for kids to be able to have a chance to vote on something," said Mary Baker, co-president of the Bethlehem

Central Community Organization.

Slingerlands PTA co-president Margaret Taranto said both her children voted for the name Eagle Elementary.

"I think the children enjoyed having a voice in it," said Taranto. "It's consistent with the district mascot."

Angie Randles, Slingerlands PTA co-president brought her two children to the school board meeting for the unveiling of the new school name.

"It really speaks to the kids who named the school," Randles said. "Every kid at the elementary schools wanted Eagle Elementary."

Construction on the new elementary school to be located on Van Dyke Road across from the high school will start in the spring. The tentative school opening date is September 2008. Anticipated construction costs for Eagle Elementary are around \$8 million.

# Group to examine waterfront's future

Bethlehem is home to several miles of one of the richest natural resources in Albany County — its local waterfront.

"A lot of people say they didn't know we have any waterfront," said Supervisor Theresa Egan of the seven to 10-mile stretch that extends from the heavy industrial Albany city line all the way to the south towns with their majestic homes overlooking the Hudson River.

The northern section includes a boat-building company and an old storage facility near the Port of Albany. As you proceed south, the waterfront changes to residential and then again to light industrial and a mix of economic development from the west side of Route 144 to the rural east side.

"We have a very diverse waterfront, but we have no plans," said Egan.

That is precisely why the town established a nine-member Waterfront Advisory Committee as part of a recommendation of the 2005 Comprehensive Plan.

A grant of \$40,000 will be used along with a local match of \$40,000 to assist in drafting a local waterfront revitalization plan. At the Wednesday, Nov. 8, the town board agreed to pay Saratoga Associates \$78,000 to work with the economic development and planning department and the local waterfront board to put forth a vision to bring new energy and life to the area.

"This is really the last remaining growth corridor of any magnitude," said economic development director George Leveille.

The committee consists of residents and representatives of state and local government agencies with jurisdiction in the river corridor. The members are Charlotte Buchanan, Ken Daves, David DeCancio, Tom Donovan, Lisa Evans, Ted Jennings, Paul Murray, Theresa Pillittere and Howie Vagele.

They will be charged with offering ideas and solutions that will enable the town to formulate, plan and finance waterfront development. The waterfront planning process is expected to take about a year to complete.

The committee will then send their recommendations to the town board for approval, then on to the state. Once approved, the regulations will give the town the ability to regulate future waterfront growth.

"It's a very specific process governed by the State Coastal Resources program," Leveille said.

Members of the waterfront committee said they are ready to share their ideas and vision for development of the riverfront. Aspects of the initiative include identifying waterfront development and use, historic resources along the water, and scenic resources and wildlife habitats.

"Some people would love to see more access, and others would like to see more waterfront dining or a historical component," Egan said.

"They all have a stake in the process," Leveille said. "There seems to be a lot of enthusiasm among the members."

# Ruff transforms Four Corners sandwich shop

**CynderElla's home-cooked fare replaces Mr. Subb**

You can't get a mini-Vinny breakfast sandwich or a Bob's Big Bologna at Mr. Subb ... but you can at CynderElla's of Delmar, formerly Mr. Subb and under the same ownership of Ella Ruff.

Ruff owned Mr. Subb at the Delmar Four Corners for 10 years, until the weekend of Nov. 11-12, when she closed the doors for two days, painted the inside, added a fireplace and transformed the restaurant to CynderElla, where an offering of home-cooked food will be available.

"We have already started to implement the new menu," said Ruff.

One of the new sandwiches, called The Gobbler, has turkey, stuffing and cranberry sauce. There are also chicken teriyaki and Philly steak sandwiches, along with a selection of hot and cold sandwiches named after customers, such as the Little Joe and Danny Boy.

"The names were the customers' choices," said Ruff. "The majority rules."

Ruff said she decided to make the transition from Mr. Subb to CynderElla because customers

were saying they had tried everything on the old menu.

"Now we are making egg salad and German potato salad," said Ruff.

Daily specials will be added, along with hot chili and pasta fagiolo soup. Breakfasts at CynderElla will include a double meat with egg and cheese or a western omelet wrap. Fresh-baked goods like hot muffins and buns will also be available.

"I have a local woman, Mary Cox, who operates a company called Sugar Bakers," said Ruff. "There will be fresh-baked cinnamon rolls and homemade dinner rolls we will serve with soup."

Even the coffee has been switched — from Green Mountain to New England coffee, another customer choice.

She said her customers have been very loyal and welcome the change.

"Ella is a nice, outgoing person who goes out of her way for you," said longtime customer Valerie Hanifan, whose said her favorite sandwich is the roast beef wrap on wheat.

"It looks nice here," said Hanifan. "It's not just like another franchise."

Ruff was recognized in 2005 as the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce Businessperson of the Year, and was presented proclamations from both Albany County and the New York State Senate. Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, another longtime customer, sponsored the bill.

"I have met so many people and so many friends through here," said Ruff. "When we have get-togethers at my house, a lot of customers come — just like a family."

When Ruff was a growing up, her parents owned Hills Superette Grocery and Deli in

Albany.

"I grew up in a grocery store," said Ruff.

Just before her 40th birthday, she made a decision to operate a Mr. Subb franchise — a move she said transformed her life.

"I had a partner at the time, Cyndi, who is now a physician's assistant in Arizona," Ruff said, referring to how she came up with the name CynderElla.

CynderElla will feature a wall dedicated to hometown heroes and another wall dedicated to the local fire department.

Ruff has been very active in many civic functions, including raising money for people who need bone marrow transplants and volunteering for the Red

Cross, a decision she made after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks on the World Trade Center and Pentagon.

"I used to go every Saturday to the WTC and bring 300 subs and sandwiches down," said Ruff. "That's how I ended up being a volunteer for the Red Cross."

CynderElla's staff includes two of Ruff's four children and many Delmar residents.

"I still have former employees who say, 'I really miss working for you,'" said Ruff.

Ruff also owned a Mr. Subb in Glenmont, which she sold last year.

Meanwhile there will be no downtime and no vacations for Ruff, who begins her new venture without the Mr. Subb name.

"No vacation," said Ruff. "That's all right, I don't need one right now."

# Only turkeys fret over big holiday dinners

Unless you are a turkey, there's no need to fret over Thanksgiving. If you already fretted this year, then decide today that next Thanksgiving will be fret-free. Or better yet, resolve to have a reduced-fret December holiday season.

Start by developing a plan for the mashed potatoes. Mashed potatoes are a common side dish at holiday dinners. To avoid potato-stress, understand that not all families prepare foods in the same way.

For example, my husband's family adds milk, uses electric beaters and sometimes whips the potatoes into the consistency of a milkshake. In my family, we just add margarine and mash by hand, creating a thick mixture, heavy with potato flavor.

Just because you don't prefer the food prepared a certain way, doesn't mean you can't enjoy eating it.

Often, when my sister-in-law drains the potatoes and asks for help, my husband steps in to prevent total annihilation of the spuds. He is my potato savior, but I am such a mashed potato fan that I will eat them regardless of the consistency.

Jeff's family realized this early on and would set the serving bowl in front of my place setting. And when it was time to transfer the leftovers

into a storage container, they'd ask if I wanted to lick the bowl. I could not ask for nicer siblings-in-law.

I have a friend whose in-laws did not even serve mashed potatoes. She has been hosting the holiday ever since.

If you are hosting, then simplify the process by limiting the number of dishes served.

One item you can drop from your holiday menu is the tossed salad. No one wants to fill up on salad when the following carb-lover's dream awaits: mashed white potatoes, sweet potatoes, bread stuffing, rolls, and corn. "Thankscarbing" should be the official name for the holiday. I'm feeling bloated just thinking about it, and I haven't even mentioned pie yet.

Disclaimer: Omitting the tossed salad is not a healthy alternative. If you want to simplify and be healthy, then keep the greens and drop one of the starchy dishes.

Another reason to limit the number of warm side dishes is because the turkey is an oven hog. A common holiday

challenge involves coordinating the roasting of the turkey with the heating of casserole dishes.

Luckily, a turkey needs a good 20 minutes out of the oven before it can be carved. Once the turkey vacates the oven, the other dishes can move in.

Don't micromanage your turkey. The turkey is quite satisfied to relax and roast without frequent visits from the cook. I know this because one person told me she sometimes just puts the bird in the oven loosely covered with foil, sets a timer, and opens the oven door only twice: once to remove the foil and a second time to remove the bird. She doesn't even baste.

I think most people baste the turkey out of habit. If your mother bastes the turkey, chances are you will to.

I'm pretty sure that basting is the reason it takes so long to cook a turkey. Heat escapes every time you open the oven door to pour pan drippings over the turkey.

I baste my turkey about every 30 minutes. I do this because using the baster tool is fun. First you get to watch the drippings defy gravity and fill up the baster. Then you get to squeeze the bulb and release the juice over the turkey.

Another way to add some

fun is to pretend you are a gourmet chef. I do this by covering my turkey with cheesecloth that has been soaked in vegetable oil. I've been doing this for years. The cheesecloth is supposed to prevent the turkey juice from escaping.

I got the idea for the use of cheesecloth from a magazine article years ago. Mostly I was curious about cheesecloth itself. I had no clue what it was, although I'd occasionally seen it mentioned in a recipe direction, such as "put the potatoes through a ricer or use cheesecloth to strain."

In case you are wondering, cheesecloth is not made of cheese. It's actually cotton gauze. I still don't know what a ricer is.

However, my turkeys usually come out tasty, so I always cover them with the cheesecloth. I've never tried it without the cheesecloth, so I can't tell whether cheesecloth is the secret to a juicy turkey or just my good-luck charm.

Nobody needs to fret if the turkey is on the dry side or if the mashed potatoes are cold. Many, many turkeys are overcooked and even more side dishes lose their heat by the time guests are helping themselves to dinner. This is why hot gravy is served. Just make sure you remember the

gravy! I use a combination of sticky notes and small pieces of paper as holiday meal reminders. I write down the name of each dish or food item that needs to come to the table. I use a separate note sheet for each item. As each item is brought to the table, the note sheet gets moved to the "served pile." The set of notes works better than a list because each item stands alone and you don't need a pencil to make check marks.

I started doing this after history showed that certain items were often forgotten (such as the cranberry sauce) or others were late (gravy for the turkey and whipped cream for the pies).

Cranberry sauce is easy to serve last minute: open the can, squeeze out the blob and slice it along the indentations made by the can.

My gravy is as easy as the cranberry sauce: pop open the jar, pour contents into gravy boat, microwave for three minutes. People who make gravy from the pan drippings are likely rolling their eyes at my jar gravy. Yet I have to believe that the pilgrims would have been receptive to timesavers. Plus, I buy the fat-free variety.

I also put the sticky notes on the empty pots on the stovetop to indicate where the green beans will be steamed or where the potatoes will be boiled. This helps me remember to prepare the food, avoid last-minute searches for cookware, and provide guidance to those who ask, "What do you need help with?"

Don't be a holiday martyr. Accept help when it's offered. Request help if nobody volunteers.

A low-fret holiday is technically possible. Just remember to be flexible with the mashed potatoes, give the turkey autonomy, curb the quantity of side dishes, wear a chef's hat but serve store-bought items, write reminder notes, and ask for help.

# They're in the rink, back from the brink

## Boosters keep hockey team afloat

Bethlehem Varsity Hockey is back on track and ready for another season thanks to the dedicated volunteer members of the Bethlehem Boosters.

The boosters received some tough news, or in hockey terminology a bit of "interference," in the spring when they found out that funding for varsity hockey, along with gymnastics and cheerleading, was excluded from a revised Bethlehem School District budget for 2007. The reason for the change was due to the first school budget in more than 20 years going down to defeat. It meant the school boosters would have to raise a total of \$40,000 to ensure skates would be laced up for the new hockey season.

"We are halfway there," said Maggie Royle, president of the hockey boosters. "We believe we'll be able to raise the rest."

Bethlehem's school board allowed the boosters to self-fund the sports program, and so far the task has been a major success.

"Once we got approval to go to self-funding, we knew we could do it," Royle said.

Two car washes, a golf tournament and a direct mailing to the local hockey community has all been a part of the fundraising efforts. Other surprise donations include the high school student senate donating money to the boosters, along with a \$2,500 donation from CSX Rail of Selkirk. Beff's Restaurant has also been a major supporter.

"We also have a lot of activities planned to raise more money at the games," Royle said.

Players, parents and fans of Bethlehem varsity hockey are ready to let the games begin.

"Without the boosters, we may not have made it on the ice," said new Bethlehem Varsity Hockey Coach Richard Hughes.

Hughes has been coaching hockey for several years and was the assistant coach for the varsity team last year.

"It was great," Hughes said. "I love working with the kids."

Tryouts began about two weeks ago, and 33 boys tried out for the team.

"We have a good group of kids here," said Hughes who said the varsity hockey record for Bethlehem last year was 6-14-2.

The Capital District Hockey League, according to Hughes, is very competitive, and players practice five days a week for more than an hour each day.

Many teams in the league are from the Suburban Council.

"We're focusing on teamwork," said Hughes. "We're going to work hard."

Hughes said the community has been outstanding in their support, and they should be ready for some good hockey this winter.

"I really believe there is going to be total excitement within this building," said Hughes, referring to the Bethlehem YMCA hockey rink where Bethlehem Varsity

Hockey games are played.

"The kids have a great work ethic, and it's going to be an exciting year for BC hockey," said Hughes.

That's exactly what Royle and the boosters want to hear.

"It's going to be a great year," said Royle, whose son, Dan, played for the team last season. "Hopefully, he'll make it this year."

The season runs from November through March, with the first game against Mohonasen on Nov. 29.





An elderly couple from the south end of Albany comes to the sit-down dinner at First Presbyterian church dressed every year as Mr. and Mrs.

Many people call us to find out what we need - especially within the last few weeks prior to Thanksgiving. Some of the donations that we receive are truly heartwarming.

There is a senior citizen on a very limited income who sends two \$1 bills as her annual contribution.

There is the family that collects money from their neighbors; calls us to see what we need, and offers to shop for the turkeys, hams or produce and deliver it to us.

Twenty-three local schools collect canned green beans, cranberry sauce, fruit cups, applesauce and yams.

There's a businessman who solicits \$500 from clients and customers, adds \$200-\$300 of his own money and shops for turkeys, hams and vegetables.

This year, the Carrot Barn in Schoharie County had a poor carrot crop, so couldn't donate carrots as they usually had, but donated 500 pounds of potatoes instead.

Some elderly people have donated small quantities of food every year, and some families have kept up the family tradition in their memory when they have passed away.

We receive major donations from Hannaford, Price Chopper and Grandma's Pies.

We are thankful to the small-community businesses and individuals, which provide a large portion of the donated items.

Thanksgiving Day is a miracle itself for everyone involved in the Thanksgiving dinner. There's a man who

Claus to have dinner with their family and pass out candy to the children.

And if you've ever stood in the line on the concourse at the Empire State Plaza on Thanksgiving morning, you can't help but be awed at the generosity of our community. Starting in the early morning hours, families, church groups, and volunteers arrive with wagons, shopping carts, strong arms and willing hearts to pick up the meals that will be delivered sometimes as far away as 50 miles. Children run and color at tables set up to provide them with a distraction; strangers chat; and politicians walk the snaking line, thanking their constituents for showing up.

Volunteers pick up the cards that tell them where they'll deliver their meals; UPS volunteers print out maps to help people find their way.

In small groups, drivers enter the kitchen, where workers are packaging the food that will become somebody's Thanksgiving dinner.

"How many?" volunteers in plastic hats call to groups. "Don't forget the gravy!"

And periodically, a rousing cheer from the kitchen workers: "Let's hear it for the drivers!"

Here's a cheer to all the Capital District residents who travel over the Hudson River and through whatever woods they pass, to make sure some neighbor somewhere has a slice of pumpkin pie on Thanksgiving Day.



# Holiday appeal to assist Bethlehem residents

The Bethlehem Festival Fund's 2006 holiday appeal has begun with a goal of \$30,000 this season in response to rising need in the community. Fund trustees expect to provide a record number of 120 families with food baskets for the holidays.

Slingerlands School nurse and fund trustee Joann Menrath explained that although the town of Bethlehem is considered an affluent community, that is not the case for many local individuals and families. "Over the past few years, we have clearly seen more need in our student population. We want to do what we can to support these families, especially during the holiday season," she said.

The Festival Fund, an all-volunteer nonprofit organization, has served Bethlehem residents since 1942 when it was known as the "White Christmas Festival." All of the monies donated to the Festival Fund are used to help individuals and families with needs that are not met by traditional assistance programs.

"Most of the people whom we help are students, seniors, people with health concerns and economic difficulties attributable to job loss, divorce or illness," added treasurer Paul Gutman.

The Festival Fund collaborates with school personnel and the Bethlehem Senior Services Department who make the majority of referrals for assistance. Requests are handled confidentially and are considered on a case-by-case basis. The fund covers items such as eyeglasses and hearing aids, medications, clothing, utility bills and tutoring services for children. Last June the Festival Fund also funded \$1,500 college scholarships to three Bethlehem High School graduates who exemplified a commitment to community service.



# Town still has an eye on skate park

Work to bring a skateboard park to Bethlehem continues.

Administrator of Parks and Recreation Nan Lanahan said discussion continues between the town and the Bethlehem School District to see if a skateboard park from Croton-on-the-Hudson can be moved to the middle school.

"We are definitely committed to trying to find a solution," said Lanahan. "We just don't know what that solution is."

A group of local teen skateboard enthusiasts and their parents are urging the town to take advantage of a skateboard park that Croton-on-the-Hudson is trying to give away for free.

One thing holding up the process is that someone has to drive two hours away and look at the park first, then speak to the manufacturer before disassembling it and bringing it back for reassembly at its designated site.

"We are just not ready to go get the equipment," Lanahan said.

The main reason is because

a specific site has yet to be secured. Up for discussion as a possible location is Bethlehem Middle School, and school attorneys and town attorneys, along with Supervisor Theresa Egan and Superintendent Les Loomis, are reviewing the legalities and liability issues.

"It's a good central location to where the kids are," Lanahan said.

Scott Johnson of The Shelter indoor skateboard park in Albany has expressed an interest in operating the proposed park as a third party on the middle school site, but legal questions linger.

"Would the town be responsible for running it or leasing it to a third party who would be on school property," questioned Lanahan.

The lengthy decision process has skateboarders in Bethlehem wondering if they will lose the opportunity to obtain the free equipment to the village of Voorheesville, which has also expressed an interest in obtaining it.

"We really need to act if we are going to acquire it," said one skateboarder at the Wednesday, Nov. 8, meeting of the town board.

"We're working on it," Egan replied.

Will Smith, director of public works for the village of Voorheesville said there is no commitment by the village to take the skateboard park from Croton-on-the-Hudson at this time.

"The equipment is still up for grabs," said Smith. "It's first-come, first-served."

Smith said the village is currently in the middle of fall leaf pickup and making the two-hour trip to Croton-on-the-Hudson would be

very difficult.

"It is next to impossible to get down there and take that trip," said Smith.

If Voorheesville were to acquire the skateboard park, plans are it would not be supervised.

Bethlehem's skateboard park would be supervised and would have to sustain enough revenue to offset any extra costs.

Smith said he tried to solicit information from skateboarders in Voorheesville about whether they would use a skateboard park, but he is not getting many suggestions.

"I think they'd rather skate on the streets," said Smith.

# School board upholds decision to ban hats

After two months of negotiations between high school officials and a committee of seven students, Bethlehem Central High School is upholding the decision to ban hats and caps during school hours.

When making the announcement at the Wednesday, Nov. 15, school board meeting, officials said they would revisit the issue at future meetings of the district's code of conduct committee.

"The overwhelming feeling was shock when we heard the decision," said school student senate representative Ryan Rockmore, speaking on behalf of the high school population protesting the hat ban.

"I feel we provided many good arguments in favor, but we were not heard on this issue," Rockmore added.

"This is not a democracy," said school board president

Stuart Lyman, in response to Rockmore's statement. "We are functioning as a school district directed by the board for the community."

"It really bothers me you feel your input wasn't heard," said Lynne Lenhardt, a member of the school board. "I propose we look at all the information at our next policy meeting and decide at this point."

During the negotiations, Rockmore said the students presented high school principal Chuck Abba with a variety of alternative options for wearing hats inside the school, including wearing hats only in the cafeteria or between classes.

The conclusion, according to Abba, is that parents and faculty who responded are in favor of the policy, and students are overwhelmingly

against it.

"Students lobbied very skillfully and professionally," said Abba.

One of the students' main arguments is they don't believe wearing a hat or cap disrupts the learning environment.

In the end, however, Abba and Superintendent Les Loomis said they felt the district's code of

conduct committee made the right decision not allowing students to wear hats at the high school between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 2:07 p.m.

"At 2:07 p.m., anybody can put a hat on at Bethlehem Central High School," said Abba. "At 2:07 p.m., we're not fighting that fight anymore."

Students were reminded again that reviewing a code of conduct decision can be a lengthy process and decisions are not made lightly.

"This was not a very light issue," said assistant superintendent Michael Tebbano, who assisted the code of conduct committee in the policy revisions made this year.

"We wanted to create a code of conduct policy that reflects the quality of education in K-12 in a safe and successful environment," Tebbano said.

As for not being heard on the issue, board member James Lytle said he understands how the students feel, but he does not agree.

"You have been heard, but you haven't been successful so far," Lytle said.

"Don't get so discouraged," said board member Richard Svenson. "There will probably be other issues."



## STOP-DWI program celebrates 25 years

On the night of Monday, Nov. 13, county, state and federal transportation and law enforcement officials gathered at the Crowne Plaza hotel in downtown Albany to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the state's STOP-DWI program.

Joined with STOP-DWI coordinators from counties across the state, officials praised the program, formed by state legislation in 1981, for establishing itself as a national leader in the prevention of drunk driving. The program, funded entirely by the fines paid by people convicted of DWI and DWI-related offenses, enables each county to set its own priorities in the effort to combat

drunken driving.

During the 1980s, an average of 801 people were killed and more than 16,000 were injured each year due to drunk driving in New York. In the 1990s these totals were reduced to an average of 458 people killed and fewer than 12,000 people injured. As recently as 2005, 382 people were killed and fewer than 8,000 people injured in alcohol-related crashes.

"Thousands of lives have been saved and hundreds of thousands of injuries have been prevented," said Ken Carpenter, executive director of the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee.

Carpenter cited STOP-DWI's success in instituting new programs and initiatives to combat DWI along with other successes, such as doubling arrest rates across the state, as

the program's major contributions. Even without those contributions Carpenter acknowledged the program is still a success.

"Every injury and death we've prevented is a success in and of itself," he said.

In Albany County, STOP-DWI has had a significant impact over the previous 25 years, according to the program's deputy coordinator Lenny Crouch, a first sergeant in the Albany County Sheriff's Department.

Crouch said that since STOP-DWI was initiated in Albany County, approximately 15 deaths were attributed to alcohol-related accidents in the city alone, a number that has dropped significantly.

"Countywide, we're down to two or three a year," said Crouch.

Besides limiting fatalities and accident related injuries, Albany County STOP-DWI has taken a proactive role in public education of DWI.

"The public perception of DWI as a crime has changed," said Crouch, "from putting the guy in the back of a car and giving him a ride home to strict enforcement."

Still, said Crouch, there are too many DWI arrests during regularly-scheduled DWI dragnets in the county throughout the year. Crouch said overnight DWI patrols net roughly 20 people, while weekend patrols typically result in 35 to 40 arrests.

"It just shows that people aren't getting the message," said Crouch. "We need to step up awareness and education."

According to Crouch, one of the performance goals for STOP-DWI in Albany County was to increase its public education methods by 20 percent. Currently, said Crouch, through increased public events held at town parks, Crossgates Mall, schools and other safety events that public education has increased 24 percent.

There is always room for improvement, he said.

"There's not a school in the county that can't say they don't have a problem with underage drinking," said Crouch, who

added that a number of school districts do not make schools available to STOP-DWI programs.

Crouch said it is important to reinforce the message at an early age.

"It would behoove us to keep banging on the door," said Crouch.

In addition to education and enforcement, STOP-DWI has recently worked with the city of Albany, DeCrescente Distribution Co., and Albany Yellow Cab to offer VPASS (Valet Parking and Shuttle Service). VPASS would include an overnight valet parking service on Lark Street for \$7 and a shuttle service, costing \$2, that will run continuously and make stops on Lark Street, Madison Avenue and New Scotland Avenue.

If the pilot run of VPASS is successful, Crouch said it would be expanded to other areas of the city of Albany, and eventually throughout the county. Crouch said he hoped the pilot run would begin in time for the Thanksgiving holiday weekend.

Crouch said Albany County STOP-DWI would continue working with law enforcement, offering public education and alternative initiatives to reduce drunken driving in the county.

"There's a lot of stuff to do," he said. "I need more time in the day."

**If You Are the Heir of Someone Who Received Both Medicare and NY Medicaid and Resided in a Nursing Home in 1989**

**A Proposed Class Action Settlement May Affect Your Rights**

There is a Proposed Settlement with the New York State Department of Health, in a class action lawsuit pending in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of New York. The name of the lawsuit is *Conrad v. Perales*, Docket No. 91-CV-846C. The settlement affects a "Class" or group of people that may include you. This Notice is just a summary. For more complete information, you should read the full Notice. You can get a copy of the full Notice by calling the number or visiting the Web site listed below.

**What Is the Class Action Lawsuit About?**

The lawsuit claims individuals who received services in a nursing home in 1989 may have been overcharged. Plaintiffs allege that the New York Medicaid program allowed nursing homes to bill both Medicare and Medicaid for the same services. This policy allowed nursing homes to collect the individual's Medicaid "co-payment" for services that were covered by Medicare.

**Who Is Involved?**

The class includes individuals for whom payments toward their care were made from both Medicare and New York's Medicaid program to a skilled nursing facility during 1989.

**What Are the Terms of the Settlement?**

The Defendants have agreed to create an \$11 million Settlement Fund to reimburse individuals who were overcharged for Nursing Home Services in 1989, or their

heirs if the Class Members are deceased.

**Who Represents Me?**

The Court has appointed attorneys to represent the Class at no cost to you. Class Counsel will request that the Court award attorneys' fees, plus reimbursement of expenses, together with other fees and costs to be paid in part from the Settlement Fund. Further fees and costs may be incurred during the Settlement Administration Period. You may hire your own attorney, if you wish. However, you will be responsible for your attorney's fees and expenses.

**What Are My Legal Rights?**

- You can file a claim, if the Proposed Settlement is approved. Claim Forms will be available on the Settlement Web site, or by calling the toll-free number.
- You can tell the Court if you do not like the Proposed Settlement. To object or comment, you must send a letter that is filed no later than December 22, 2006, as outlined in the *Notice of Proposed Class Action Settlement*.

**Will the Court Approve the Proposed Settlement?**


The Court will hold a Final Approval Hearing on December 28, 2006 at 10:15 a.m. in Part I of the Federal Court in Buffalo, NY to consider whether the Proposed Settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate and the motion for attorneys' fees and expenses. overnight stay at a hotel located approximately 12 miles from his home. The claim for the stay indicated its purpose was for a meeting, although the claim did not include a copy of the hotel receipt or why it was necessary to spend the night.

McCartney declined to comment on the audit's findings. His lawyer, Stephen Coffey, could not be reached for comment.

The audit also found the former superintendent submitted reimbursement claims totaling nearly \$4,600 for more than 120 day and overnight trips. Those claims, state the audit, did not include all travel destinations or departure and arrival times, making the grounds for mileage reimbursement indeterminable.

For example, the audit showed an instance in which McCartney was reimbursed by the district for 625-mile trip to attend a basketball game involving a school team. The auditors used an Internet mapping Web site to determine the trip from the superintendent's home to the game site was only 440 miles, leaving it unclear why the district paid McCartney for the additional 185 miles.

According to the audit, McCartney also was reimbursed for 46 meals, totaling over \$4,200, each lacking the documentation about who attended and why the meal was necessary.

While attending a conference in Rochester with three board members, it was discovered McCartney charged \$770 for meals on one day. The federal reimbursement rate for meals in Rochester is \$47 per person per day or \$188 for the four officials.

Additionally, McCartney documented that three of his seven trips to Syracuse were necessary because of meetings held in the city. The associations

that purportedly held the meetings told auditors that no records of these meetings existed. The district was charged \$1,100 for mileage reimbursement and meals for those trips.

The audit found that district credit card and reimbursement claims that were submitted by McCartney for 10 overnight stays on seven separate occasions at Turning Stone Casino in Oneida County cost the district nearly \$1,300. On at least one night, it was in the district's best interest

for McCartney to stay closer to the event he was attending in Potsdam instead of driving the 166 miles back to the casino hotel. In this instance, the audit found that McCartney billed the district for the additional mileage. The cost of two nights at the casino exceeded the federal reimbursement rate by \$224.

"The Board of Education had a long-term and trusting relationship with former superintendent of schools Alan M. McCartney that now appears to have been violated," said Superintendent Linda Langevin in a statement. "The district is seeking full restitution from Dr. McCartney for contract violations and unauthorized expenditures."

In light of the new findings, criminal charges against McCartney from the Albany County District Attorney's office are under review, said spokeswoman Rachel McEneny.

The district attorney decided to not pursue criminal charges following a review of the January audit.

The audit of Marturano's expense claims disclosed no significant findings.

According to the audit, the district may have also inappropriately paid current assistant superintendent and former treasurer, Sarita Winchell, \$8,425 for unused leave and \$5,575 for tuition reimbursement over a three-year period ending in 2002.

According to the board of education's response to the audit, it was determined through discussions with prior board members and the public, as well as through memos and letters to the board that it was the board's intention to allow Winchell, at the time the treasurer, to obtain the necessary graduate level courses to become a school business official and to pay for those courses.

According to the response, the board did not properly document these intentions through resolutions, but it was determined to take the course of action, therefore Winchell will not be required to reimburse the district.

The board will also not seek reimbursement for the unused vacation leave time, except in the instance in which a new employment agreement changed the amount of days that administrators were able to accumulate in a given year.

In that year, Winchell cashed out 10 vacation days. When the board retroactively agreed to an employment agreement, only a five-day cash out was allowed for that year. According to Langevin, Winchell voluntarily gave the district back the current value of five vacation days.

"The board of education and I have full confidence in the integrity and abilities of the current assistant superintendent for business," said Langevin. "She has consistently performed her duties in an exemplary fashion and is a valuable member of the Voorheesville School District central office team."

Additionally, The audit found an instance in which the trans-

portation supervisor Michael Goyer may have accepted an improper gift when he took an all-expense paid trip to Tulsa as a guest of a school bus vendor. The audit stated that the trip cost more than \$75, making it improper under municipal law that prohibits district officials from accepting gifts of \$75 or more.

In November 2003, the district purchased three buses costing more than \$200,000 from the same bus manufacturer that paid for Goyer's trip.

"The subsequent purchase of buses from the manufacturer after the acceptance of the expense-paid trip raises a question of impropriety," stated the audit.

The audit recommended that the district should have paid for the trip to avoid any conflict of

interest. According to Langevin, the district always purchases the same bus model because of compatible parts and that the trip wouldn't have influenced that decision. Additionally, she said, Goyer was one of 12 district transportation supervisors who attended the trip.

"He didn't go for a good time," said Langevin. "If it had been Hawaii, I would have questioned it."

In the past year, the Voorheesville School District has taken steps to strengthen the district's internal controls. The district added an internal and claims auditor, hired a consultant to review internal controls changes, provided board training and appointed a board audit committee.

process, and, although it is pungent, it does not pose a risk to students and faculty.

The sediment was created by a build-up of standing water in the crawl space beneath the school. The pumps that typically remove the water failed, according to school facilities director Roy Deyo.

The pump failure, combined with warm weather conditions on the ground and strong winds with cold air aloft, created fumes that would typically vent outside the crawl space and away from the school. The fumes were blown back into the building through air intakes.

A final report from C.T. Male & Associates regarding the problem will be released in the

next two weeks. An expert with the firm said that slurry removal while classes are not in session will not pose any problems or risks to those who use the facility.

Classes in the middle and elementary schools will continue as scheduled. All after-school and evening activities at the middle and high schools were also cancelled for Nov. 17. They were cancelled on Saturday, Nov. 18, as well. Parents are encouraged to check the district Web site at [www.rcscsd.org](http://www.rcscsd.org) for an update on when classes will resume.

Wright praised the diligent work of the firefighters and emergency medical personnel who responded to the scene, as well as the school's administration, faculty and staff who conducted an orderly evacuation.

# AAA expects robust Thanksgiving weekend

Higher prices for hotel rooms, rental cars and airfares will not keep families home this Thanksgiving, according to AAA Hudson Valley. AAA estimates that 38.3 million Americans will travel 50 miles or more from home this holiday, a 2.7 percent increase from last year's 37.3 million travelers.

"Airports and highways will be busier than ever," said Tammy Melo, public relations manager for AAA Hudson Valley. "Higher prices for hotel rooms, rental cars and airfare have increased, but that will not keep people from traveling."

Approximately 31.7 million travelers (82.8 percent of all holiday travelers) expect to go by motor vehicle, a 2.6 percent increase from the 30.8 million who drove a year ago. This holiday's most popular out-of-state travel destinations (via automobile) for AAA Hudson Valley members — based on Trip Tik routing requests — include Orlando, Myrtle Beach and Sarasota, Fla.

Holiday auto travelers will find gas prices in the Capital District currently averaging \$2.35 for a gallon of self-serve regular gasoline — about six cents lower than this time last year, and 15 cents lower than a

month ago.

"Americans will take advantage of the fact that gas prices have been falling for the past several months," said Melo. "They might have foregone the summer family vacations because of high gas prices, but extended family get-togethers and lower gas prices will encourage Americans to get back on the road this holiday."

AAA expects 4.8 million (12.5 percent of holiday travelers) Americans to travel by airplane, up 3.2 percent from the 4.6 million that flew last Thanksgiving holiday. A projected 1.9 million travelers (5 percent) will go by train, bus, or other mode of transportation, up slightly from 1.8 million a year ago.

"With new security measures and crowded airports, travelers should leave extra time for check-in and security," said Melo. "Travelers should educate themselves on new security restrictions before leaving home in order to avoid throwing away expensive liquid products and other restricted items."

Despite paying less at the pump, travelers will face much higher prices for hotels, airfares and car

rentals, according to AAA's Leisure Travel Index. Holiday hotel rates are up 16 percent for AAA-rated three diamond hotels, as strong demand allows hoteliers to increase rates that they raised last Thanksgiving, too. Expect higher rates for rental cars as well, with an average increase of 21 percent. With an average 4 percent increase from last year, air fares will be more costly, but travelers won't see the extreme price hikes they will experience with hotel and car rental rates.

The greatest number of Thanksgiving auto travelers will originate in the Southeast with 9.1 million, followed by the West, 7.2 million; Midwest, 6.7 million; the Great Lakes, 6.2 million; and the Northeast, 2.4 million.

The Southeast and the West are expected to produce the largest number of air travelers with 1.3 million each, followed by the Midwest with 789,000; the Northeast with 772,000; and the Great Lakes with 643,000.

Hot water heaters will be working

overtime, as 69.5 percent of Thanksgiving travelers expect to stay at a friend or relative's home. Hotels and motels are a distant second at 16 percent, followed by cabin/condo, 4.5 percent; camper/trailer/RV/tent, 2.4 percent; other, 3.6 percent; no overnight stay, 2.6 percent; and didn't know, 1.4 percent. Small towns and rural areas are the expected destination for 45.3 percent of Thanksgiving travelers, followed by cities, 35 percent.

Mountain areas should see 8.3 percent of travelers, followed by oceans and beaches with 5.2 percent of travelers; 2.3 percent for lake areas, 0.6 percent for state/national parks and 0.3 percent for theme/

amusement parks. Another 2 percent responded with "other." Several AAA online offerings can help travelers with their holiday journeys.



## Flu shot clinic tests county's readiness

In an effort to test emergency

preparedness, the Albany County Department of Health offered free flu vaccinations at the Pepsi Arena Tuesday, Nov. 14.

The health department re-

ceived 1,000 influenza vaccinations from the state's Department of Health for the purpose of preventing the flu while testing the county's capability for emergency response.

The free flu vaccine was made available to people who live or work in the Capital District and was available to adults and children over the age of 9. Advanced registration was required, and Albany County spokeswoman Kerri Battle said all 1,000 pre-registration spots were filled.

"It was very streamlined, people came in, and there was very little wait time," said Battle, who observed the vaccination clinic.

"Preliminary estimates indicate it took about eight to 12 minutes on average for an individual to make it through the clinic," said James Crucetti, Albany County's commissioner of health. "We're pleased with that efficiency."

According to Battle, the mass vaccination was in accordance with federal guidelines and funding received from the Department of Homeland Security.

"The county is responsible to hold a series of activities to test emergency preparedness," said Battle.

The county also conducts various other scenarios with law enforcement agencies and the department of health, including role-playing and smaller-scale vaccinations to test its response times.

"One of the reasons for doing this exercise was to determine just how well we could handle a large number of patients at a clinic like this," said Crucetti. "The goal is to develop plans to provide preventative medications to all residents in our county in a rapid manner."

Crucetti said the program was in line with "point of dispensing" plans developed during the national smallpox program a few years ago.

Crucetti said drills like this allow the county to also test its ability to deliver antibiotics and antiviral medication depending upon the disease that requires a response.

"I'm so pleased with the results of our clinic. Just the experience itself has helped to strengthen our planning," said Crucetti.

Once the results are fully reviewed Crucetti said the department of health would have a better idea of what can be improved upon in the future.

From observing last Tuesday's drill, Crucetti said he noticed at least one thing that could be improved.

"We noted that it would be helpful for us to set up a second area to deal with individuals who have special needs," he said. "We want to make sure all residents have access to our clinical service."





bite," said Bob Freeman, director of the Albany-based Committee on Open Government. "They remember the extremes, the smears. They may not even be aware of where candidates stand on important issues."

One very accessible vehicle in negative campaigning is the op-ed pages in newspapers. Once considered a place to write a knowledgeable letter for fair debate, the venue has opened up for free-rein attacks on people, not issues.

"I don't read letters to the editor anymore," said Freeman. "They involve personal attack and emotion. Thoughtful comments just don't happen, and people love gossip. They suck it up."

Mudslinging isn't limited to the editorial pages. The campaign for U.S. Congress between Republican incumbent John Sweeney of Clifton Park and Democrat Kirsten Gillibrand got nasty when reports of Sweeney's alleged domestic abuse were splashed across the headlines just days before the election. Gillibrand was the victor on Election Day.

Some contend the public trashing is all part of running for public office.

"If you can't stand the heat, get out of the kitchen," said Ann Crowell, Saratoga County Republican Campaign chairwoman. "That's why so many people don't run for office."

Crowell spoke to a Fair Campaign Practices (FCP) panel two weeks ago, representing Ballston Town Council contender Mary Beth Hynes. Her Democratic opponent for the council seat, Patti South-

worth, lodged two complaints, one of them a two-page, 11-point document, against incumbent Republican Hynes.

FCP was formed in 1999 to promote honest, issue-oriented campaigns. The group said it encourages candidates to conduct campaigns openly and fairly, to discuss issues, to refrain from defamatory or misleading attacks on the character of their opponents, and to never use campaign materials that distort the facts.

"We formed this group to have an impact on current practices to make them focus more on issues and actual policy, and on the different stances of candidates," said Barbara Thomas, member of the local League of Women Voters and president of FCP.

"These issues are important for campaigning, and the recent occurrence of so many emotional appeals really do skew the issues."

Thomas said a record number of complaints were received this year.

In October, two local candidates for the state Assembly filed simultaneous complaints against their opponents with the FCP. The complaints were by Independence member Tim Gordon of Bethlehem, running in the 108th Assembly District, against his opponent, Republican Martin Reid. Gordon contested mailings that questioned his stance on environmental issues. Democrat Bob Reilly, running in the 109th Assembly District, filed a complaint against Republican opponent Paulette Barlette for printed allegations that Reilly did little to thwart violence in an Albany pub he once owned. Both complaints were upheld by the FCP.

"These were really, really down and dirty," said Thomas.

In the Saratoga County race for treasurer, Republican County Treasurer Samuel Pitcherelle filed a complaint with the FCP against his Democratic opponent, Preston Jenkins Jr., regarding printed campaign materials released just days before Election Day. At issue was the use of Jenkins' name printed above the words "County Treasurer," a move the FCP ruled was misleading to voters because it implied Jenkins was the incumbent in the office. Pitcherelle received the majority of votes on Election Day to remain in office.

In the case of Southworth's complaints, the committee ruled that, in two cases, materials sent by the Hynes campaign days before the election breached fair practice standards. The panel, however, conceded that some of the strong comparative language was acceptable given the parameters of heavy-handed campaigning.

"Had Ms. Hynes' flier merely purported to compare the records of the two candidates, FCP would agree that it fell within the realm of rough and tumble political debate without crossing the line into unfair campaign practice," said the statement released by FCP.

Is it a coincidence that many of the local unfair campaign practice complaints are filed within a few weeks—or days of elections? Thomas says it is not.

"We don't get complaints in early October," she said. "It could be due to the fact that really bad literature sometimes comes at the end of a race, or candidates get really fed up and won't tolerate personal attacks anymore."

The FCP findings do not come with any legal ramifications, nor are they intended to sway the decisions of voters.

"The final outcome is in the hands of the voters," said Thomas.

The race between Southworth and Hynes on Election Day turned out to be a dead heat. Votes were impounded, and 147 absentee votes were counted one week after Election Day. Hynes nosed out Southworth by six votes.

Freeman said that in order to get away from negative campaigning, this muddled practice needs to be stymied at the highest levels of government.

"We need better role models nationwide," said Freeman. "There's a true absence of civility here, and candidates need to engage in meaningful dialogue. My hope is that it will filter down to state and local government. It can't keep following this same dangerous course, that's for certain."

educational arena, or in any arena that does not have a definite winner and loser," said Husson. "In politics, there is only a first place."

Vying for the only successful position in an election can breed animosity, said Husson, which manifests itself in vitriolic campaigning and ungracious losers.

"Whether you're the winner of an election or the loser of an election, the moment in which you either concede defeat or embrace victory, that's the moment that is going to register with voters. It's going to be on the news, in the newspapers, and it's a moment that a lot of people are going to be paying attention to," said Husson. "If it's done graciously, it can only benefit you in the public eye. If it's done bitterly, or with any kind of acrimony, it's going to register with people."

The professor, who lives in the 20th Congressional District, used U.S. Rep. John Sweeney's recent concession speech as an example of a poor way to lose. During the speech, Sweeney, who had come under fire days before the election for an alleged December 2005 domestic dispute incident, said that it was now his opponent Kirsten Gillibrand's time to "live in the glass house for a while."

Husson likened it to then-gubernatorial candidate Richard M. Nixon's famous 1962 statement made upon losing the California race: "You won't have Nixon to kick around anymore."

"For many people, (Nixon's) comment identified him as a person who was filled with bitterness and a certain amount of self-pity. People will

not only remember that he lost, but how he lost," said Husson.

David J. Hennessy is chairman of the business and law department at Schenectady County Community College and teaches several courses in American politics.

According to Hennessy, all the pre-election posturing and post-election grumbling boils down to one thing: "It's a set-up for the next election," he said. "The winner of this election cycle was declared Nov. 7. The next campaign started Nov. 8. It's all about tactics, and it starts the next day."

Hennessy acknowledged that it's not all electioneering, but said there are mechanisms in place to address serious ethical breeches.

"There are some real shenanigans that go on out there," he said, "and if that happens, people can face criminal charges or other penalties."

Hennessy said there have been candidates who have enjoyed campaigning, like former New York Gov. Alfred E. Smith, whom Hennessy said former New York governor and President Franklin Delano Roosevelt referred to as "the happy warrior of the political battlefield."

Husson said he sees the more venomous campaigns as just a sign of the times.

"I think that the increasing tendency of reaching out to the courts has to do with the increasing polarization of our politics over the last several years. On both sides of the political aisle, if you just think in terms of Democrats and Republicans, there has been a kind of building animosity on both sides. I think it was jeweled significantly by the outcome of the 2000 presidential election, but it was going on before then," said Husson.

People running for smaller offices

look to what then-presidential nominees George W. Bush and Al Gore did in 2000, Husson said, and feel it is acceptable for them to contest election results. Husson also said he believes there is more likely to be an atmosphere of animosity in more closely contested races than in ones in which there is an unquestionable winner.

"Politics has become rougher. The political ads and political communication, including what you hear in speeches, has become a lot nastier. I think the kinds of political attacks that both sides have launched have become increasingly personal over the years, and I think that creates a climate in which it becomes increasingly difficult and much less likely to be gracious to your opponent, even in defeat."

But what to do about it?

Hennessy said that the public is approaching the issue the wrong way when it demands fairness in politics. "I think that we're asking the wrong questions when we ask that politicians play fair. The public shouldn't demand they get fair politicians, the public should demand that they get substantive answers to their questions. Don't just be persuaded by a 30-second ad."

Hennessy encourages his students to get involved and seek those answers actively.

"Most people, when addressing the 18- to 24-year-old crowd, the people who usually don't turn out and vote, will say that they should go out and be heard, make a difference. I use a little bit of reverse psychology on my students," said Hennessy. "I say 'Don't go out and vote, because it gives my vote more power.' Most of my students will vote just to cancel out my vote."



## Tuition options to be the focus of private school fair

The future enrollment of Capital District private schools rests, in part, on the outcome of an upcoming fair planned to reach out to area parents to let them know what the schools offer and what kind of financial assistance might be available for tuition.

Despite steady enrollment numbers at area independent

schools, the Capital Region Independent Schools Association will begin a new focus on public outreach, which has been somewhat dormant since a decade ago, when the group discontinued informational mailings.

On Wednesday, Dec. 6, CRISA is inviting the public to attend an informational reception at St. Gregory's School for Boys in

Loudonville.

The reception will feature the association's member schools, and organizers hope to dispel misconceptions about the costs of the schools and to inform parents of their options.

"This is a good time to remind people in the Capital District that you have an alternative to public schools," said Margaret Roach co-chair of CRISA and senior

associate in charge of day students at Emma Willard School in Troy.

Over the years, the association has met quarterly to discuss strategic planning and how area independent schools can market themselves. The recent move to host the reception hasn't been driven by a need to fill school slots, Roach said, but it doesn't hurt to get the word out now and then and refocus the mission.

The biggest issue for many parents when it comes to independent schools of all grades, secular or not, is cost. They aren't cheap.

Emma Willard, both a boarding and day school, charges \$34,800 a year for its boarded students, \$22,000 for day students. Day students typically live at home and commute to school. People hear those tuition numbers and immediately strike independent schools from the list, Roach said.

However, many parents don't know that Emma Willard will make available \$22 million this year and next year in financial aid to students.

Emma Willard helps almost 50 percent of its students with school aid, said Roach. This year alone, 41 percent of the students have received financial aid, the average award ringing in at about half a year's tuition, she said.

"We are willing to work with families depending on their financial needs," said Francis Foley, headmaster of St. Gregory's School for Boys. "There is a benefit to at least looking at it (these schools).

That's one of the missions that we need to attack."

For two years, St. Gregory's has held a steady enrollment of 170 students. The school offers classes from nursery school through eighth grade. All grades are eligible for financial aid, Foley said.

From nursery to fourth grade, St. Gregory's costs \$4,400 a year per student. The rate increases to \$10,900 up to the eighth and final grade at the school. Like Emma Willard, the school reserves a portion of its budget for financial aid. This year, the school has set aside \$150,000 for financial aid. Foley wouldn't say how many families use the aid but only that "people do utilize the assistance."

That assistance ranges from 20 percent to close to 80 percent of the tuition, depending on a family's needs, he said.

Private school officials hope to get that across at the upcoming reception.

The reception will be held on St. Gregory's campus at 121 Old Niskayuna Road in Loudonville. Representatives from CRISA member schools will be on hand to speak with parents from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Participating schools include Albany Academy, Albany Academy for Girls, Bethlehem Children's School, Brown School, Christian Brothers Academy, Emma Willard School, Robert C. Parker School, St. Gregory's School for Boys, Saratoga Independent School, Susan Odell Taylor School, Waldorf School of Saratoga and Woodland Hill Montessori School.





cringe at the thought of what will be said next.


On a related topic, I'm thankful that O.J. Simpson's TV special has been cancelled. I really don't want to know how he hypothetically would have killed his ex-wife.

## Eagles lose to Arlington in last minute

Try as they might, the Bethlehem Eagles couldn't keep Arlington off the scoreboard forever.

Matt Turcio scored with 17 seconds left to give Arlington (Section I) a 1-0 victory over Bethlehem in Saturday's class AA state semifinal at the National Soccer Hall of Fame Soccer Complex in Oneonta.

"They had a cross in the final 30 seconds, and they headed it over Jason Daniels' head. It happens in soccer," said Bethlehem head coach Phil Ridgway.

The Eagles (16-5-3) stayed with Arlington through the first half, but they couldn't maintain the pace. By the middle of the second half, Arlington was controlling the ball and applying pressure on Bethlehem's defense.

"The defense played fantastic," said Ridgway. "Nate (House), Tanner (Crosier), Rob Wexler and Pat Champion played extremely well. They really held their own."

Daniels made several saves to keep Arlington off the scoreboard, but there was nothing he could do to stop Turcio's shot from finding the back of the goal.

It was the first state semifinal appearance for Bethlehem. The Eagles won Section II titles in 2000 and 2002, but were eliminated in the regional round each time.

"I told the guys right after the game they had nothing to be ashamed of," said Ridgway. "We won the Section II title, we won the regional title and we made it to the state semifinals. That seemed to perk them right up because they were really down after the game."

Bethlehem graduates its entire starting lineup including its defense, its goaltender and its most dangerous offensive players — Darko Knezevic, Bryan White, Bill Barrowman and Patrick Meany.

"The last two years, we've had a huge senior class," said Ridgway. "Next season, we'll only have six seniors, which is unusual for us. So, we'll have a young team."

Still, the 16 seniors that are leaving the Eagles' nest can say that they made school history and pushed Arlington — which went on to win the state title — to the brink.

"We made it to the semifinals of the state tournament. That's quite an accomplishment," said Ridgway.

## Cutting it close

### Relay team misses Section II record by .56 seconds

Four members of the Bethlehem girls swim team made a big splash at last weekend's state championships in Buffalo.

The 200-yard medley relay team of Becca Stern, Elise Walsh, Molly Howland and Katie O'Donnell placed third with a time of 1:50.70, less than one second off the Section II record time of 1:50.14 set by Glens Falls in 1982.

"We missed it by a few tenths of a second, but we still finished third, and we were the first team from the Section to finish," said Bethlehem coach Doug Gross.

Stern was one of Section II's leading swimmers at the state meet. The senior made the finals in both of her individual events, placing fifth in the 100-yard freestyle with a time of 53.03 seconds and finishing eighth in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of 24.49 seconds.

"She wasn't entirely happy with her times, but I talked to all the girls beforehand about doing their best," said Gross.

Stern also anchored Bethlehem's 400-yard freestyle relay team, which placed seventh in the finals. The team of Stern, Howland, O'Donnell and Emma Walsh finished with a time of 3:40.05, more than one second faster than its preliminary time.

Howland turned in two strong individual performances at states. The sophomore reached the finals of the 200-yard freestyle with a preliminary time of 1:55.09 and finished eighth in the event with a time of 1:59.59, and she placed 12<sup>th</sup> in the 500-yard freestyle with a time of 5:10.48.

Bethlehem's efforts helped Section II finish third in the team standings with 276 points. Section V — the state's traditional swimming powerhouse — took the title with 459 points, followed by Section IV in second place.

"The funny thing about states is it's so individual," said Gross. "When you're at Sectionals, you

have about 20 girls pulling for the same thing. At states, there's maybe five girls there pulling for you."

Bethlehem's focus now shifts toward defending its first Sectional title in nearly 20 years next season. The Lady Eagles won't have Stern or the Walsh twins, Elise and Emma, who will be

graduating, but Gross said younger swimmers such as O'Donnell and Howland should help Bethlehem remain among the region's top teams.


"It's been a four-year climb to get to this point, and as I told the girls, I have no desire to go back to the way things were," said Gross.
