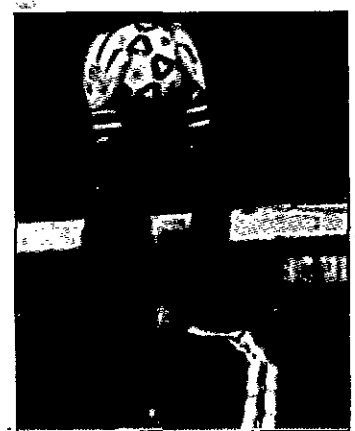

• Organizational changes highlight the January meeting of the Bethlehem Town Board. Christine Motta is appointed to a full term on the town planning board and Parker Mathusa remains chairman of the board. Anthony Umina is named to the zoning board of appeals and Town Court attorneys are Andrew Kirby and Thomas Newman.

February

• Trouble for the former superintendent of schools in the Voorheesville School District. State Comptroller Alan Hevesi

and staff auditors found that Alan McCartney and former business superintendent Anthony Marturano paid themselves more than \$216,000 in leave and other benefits without knowledge and approval of the board of education. The findings were uncovered in a routine audit by the state. District officials filed a lawsuit to recover the missing money.

• Bethlehem begins preparations for a major quadricentennial celebration in 2009 with the formation of a committee to plan events with the state to mark explorer Henry Hudson's discovery of the Hudson River. The committee will ask residents to come up with activities at Henry Hudson Park. The activities will coincide with

• A Voorheesville teacher's assistant is arrested for rape. John T. Krajewski, 25, is charged with second-degree rape, criminal sexual act, sex abuse and endangering the welfare of a child. Krajewski was accused of having a relationship with a 14-year-old girl. He had been employed with the Voorheesville School District since 2004 and coached boys' basketball at the high school. District officials terminated his employment based on improper work credentials.

Peace group's cookbook offers food for thought

In January 2007, the Bethlehem Neighbors for Peace, a group formed to protest the war in Iraq, will celebrate its fourth anniversary. In an effort to keep alive interest and to promote a continued healthy lifestyle, the group has recently published a cookbook called *Recipes for Peace*.

If the success of the initial printing of the book is any indication, a second recipe book will likely follow.

"We printed 250 books, and

we are all out of them," said Leslie Hudson, a member of Bethlehem Neighbors for

Peace, who worked with several other locals to make the cookbook a reality. The group has since printed more copies of the cookbook, which costs \$14.

"This idea was formed last year at a general meeting when the group talked about the poverty level in the U.S. and the diminished funds for food pantries because

Rail worker struck and killed by train in Selkirk

The Bethlehem Police Department is investigating a fatal accident involving the driver of an all-terrain vehicle and a train that occurred at the CSX Rail Yard in Selkirk just before midnight Monday,

Dec.18.

Police responded to the scene after receiving a call that a person had been struck by a train. The operator of the ATV, John A. Williams, 53, of Albany, was a CSX employee. Williams

was driving the CSX-owned ATV on an access road, where he was struck by a train while crossing the tracks.

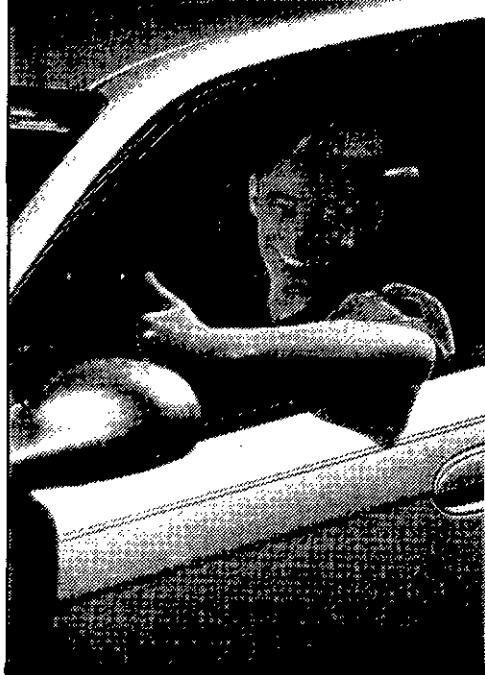
Williams was pronounced dead at the scene. His body was found under the engine of an

eastbound freight train headed for New Jersey.

Williams worked as a mechanic for the railroad for several years. CSX officials stated the area where he was struck by the train is clearly

marked with stop signs.

The Bethlehem Police Department continues to work with CSX police and safety personnel to determine the cause of the accident. No charges have been filed.

Grand jury adds charge for driver who struck cyclist

Darlene Kawczak, 51, of Feura Bush is being charged with manslaughter-second degree in the death of 49-year old Joel Melnikoff of Slingerlands. The indictment by an Albany County grand jury, which convened in October, includes previous charges of vehicular manslaughter, criminally negligent homicide and operating a motor vehicle while ability impaired.

Kawczak was driving on

Route 32-Feura Bush Road on the morning of July 3 when she struck Melnikoff with her vehicle as he was cycling along the side of the road.

Kawczak was processed by Bethlehem police, arraigned, and released under the supervision of probation, and previous bail set in Town Court at \$15,000 was continued.

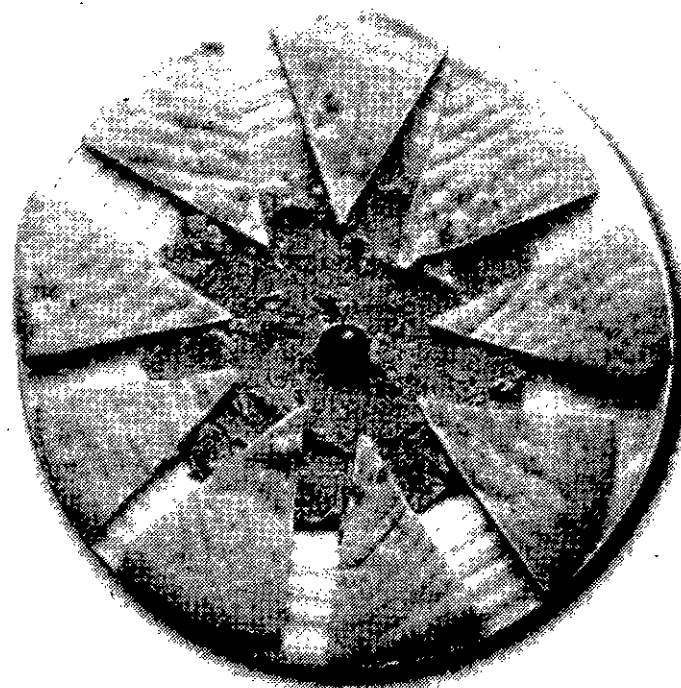

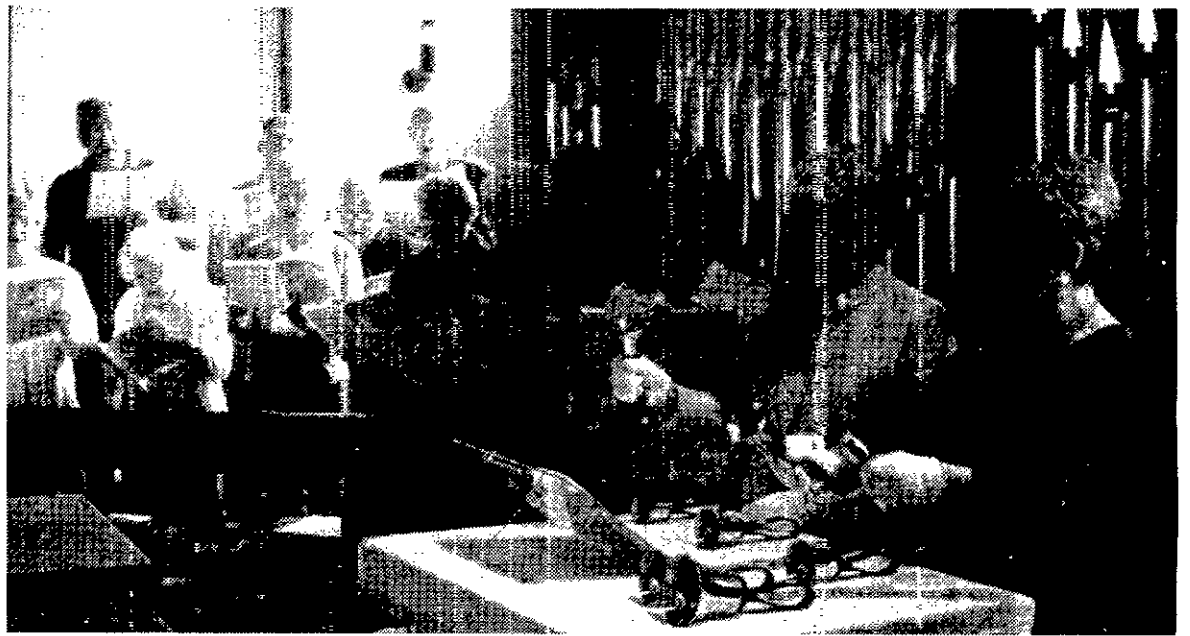

Fun ways to ensure many happy returns

The store clerk was wearing a nametag that said "Having fun since 2006."

"You don't look like you are having fun," I told her as she rang up my purchase. "Maybe you have fun some place else, outside of work?"

"Would you like your receipt in the bag?" she droned.

I was tempted to wander around the store looking for employees that had been having fun longer. The clerk that helped me just started having fun this year. What about clerks that have been having fun since the late 1900s? Were any of these people still working here? What would they look like?

Why does this store want me to know about employees that have been with the company less than one year? Is the store telling shoppers to avoid high expectations? Is it a clever way of saying "store clerk in training"?

There are probably a lot of seasonal employees with limited experience working in retail during the holiday shopping season. The lines at the registers don't go down once all the presents are unwrapped. People head back to the stores to make returns and exchanges and to look for post-holiday bargains.

When, oh, when will it be safe for me to go back to the mall?

It's never truly healthy for me to go to the mall. It's moderately OK when I'm going to purchase a standard item for someone else. For example,

popular music CDs, winter hats, sheets, beach towels or gift certificates.

However, if I'm shopping for myself, especially for clothing, it's generally a disaster. I just can't ever find the desired item in the right size. Or if it's the right size, it's the wrong color. And when it is the right size and the right color, it's at the wrong price.

Due to my mall phobia I'm rarely there when the stock is plentiful and everything is on sale. Or I'm there, but shopping for other people.

My husband and I went shopping for Hanukkah presents in early December. The amount of merchandise in the stores completely overwhelmed me. There would never be enough time to look through all the choices and make selections if I were shopping for myself.

"Look at all this stuff!" I exclaimed as we browsed through a sporting-goods store. There was barely room to walk. I usually shop in late January when the racks are thin and picked over.

Still, even when inventory is high, I manage to come up empty-handed. In a clothing store we searched for T-shirts.

There were countless piles in a wide array of colors. I saw purple, blue, magenta, black, red and pink, among others. But I did not see green. Green was the color I wanted. My husband found a green shirt, but alas, it had long sleeves and I was looking for short sleeves.

OK, I'll get a black T-shirt, I decided, size medium. That should be easy enough. Wrong! There were two piles of black T-shirts, stacked high. There were smalls, larges and extra larges, but no mediums.

"It's a conspiracy," I shouted to my husband. "I tell you if I was looking for a small or a large there'd be none of those. There'd be only mediums."

"Let's go get lunch," he replied.

But first I settled on the size large black T-shirt and we stood in line. There weren't many people in line, but the waiting time was long because the first person in each line was opening a store credit card. Plus all the store employees were "having fun," and that can't be rushed.

During the period of holiday returns and exchanges, store employees should switch to tags that say, "Dealing with impatient customers since 2004."

As exasperating as it feels to be a customer waiting in line to make a return, it must be doubly so for the staff who work in the stores. Retail is a demanding line of work.

Instead of adding to the angst, try to keep yourself

occupied. Here are some suggestions for passing the time in line.

Dance. I'm not talking the tango or break-dancing. You don't even have to move your feet if the space is severely limited. You can just get your upper-body going, maybe a little twist action, or at the very least you can bob your head around. There's almost always music playing, but you can dance to your own beat if necessary. It's good exercise.

Perform a puppet show for the other people in line. You'll need to bring a puppet with you. If you are not prepared, you may have to take off your own shoe and use the sock you are wearing. Depending on how long you've been walking the mall, this may not be a smart move.

Sing. Just in quiet tones, mind you, for there's no need to put on a concert unless you happen to be very talented. You can sing along with the in-store music or you can choose a favorite tune.

Try to name all the cast members in The Wizard of Oz or some other movie with a lot of characters.

List every variety of dog and cat that you can think of. For extra challenge, do it in alphabetical order.

Strike up friendly conversations with the people in line with you. Don't complain about the long lines. Everyone is already doing that. Don't get on your cell phone, because you may miss your turn at the register.

Be grateful about where you are. Say to yourself, "I am grateful to be on this side of the line." The store clerk

needs to stand there for hours. You only feel like you've been standing there for hours. You can leave the store right away if you want. The store clerk has to finish her shift. She's tired too, and it's not her fault that you need to return a gift.

Think up nicknames for everyone in your family. Keep them constructive. For extra challenge, try to make the nickname rhyme with the actual name.

Hyperventilate. Just kidding, I mean take deep breaths. If you hyperventilate you will lose your place, in line. On the other hand, if you partially hyperventilate, someone may give you a small paper bag to blow into and then you could use that bag to make a puppet (in case you don't want to use your own sock) for the puppet show.

Chances are no one will have a small paper bag. Everyone will just have large shopping bags and that won't help you. You'll just be hyperventilating under a large bag and then other people in line won't want to have a friendly conversation with you. Although, you might feel less self-conscious about dancing if you have a shopping bag over your head.

Whatever you do in line, just be pleasant. That way, when you get to the register, you and the store clerk can both say you've been "having fun" during your time together.

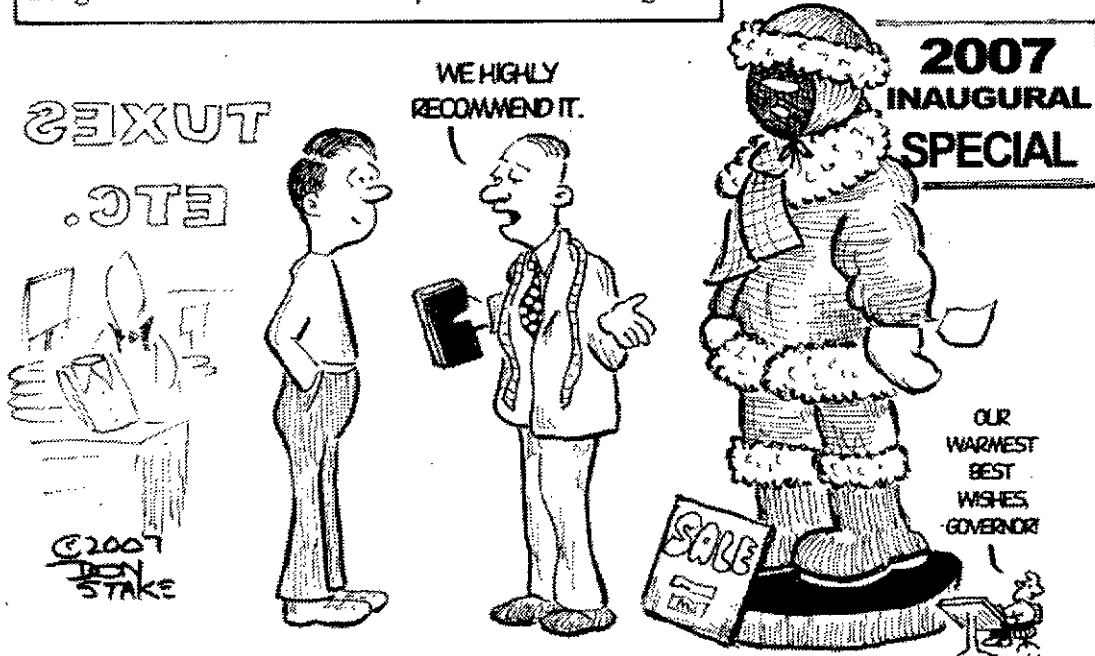

See the butterfly, not the cocoon

It's been said the only way to keep New Year's resolutions is to not make them at all. Most of us have used this catchy comeback to skirt the issue entirely — "My New Year's resolution is not to make resolutions" — thereby effectively eliminating any conversation about how we're going to tidy up our lives in the next 12 months.

The intrinsic dilemma in resolutions, the reasons we wrestle with our consciences and wring our hands come Jan. 2, is that the pledge to be better focuses on our self-perceived flaws. 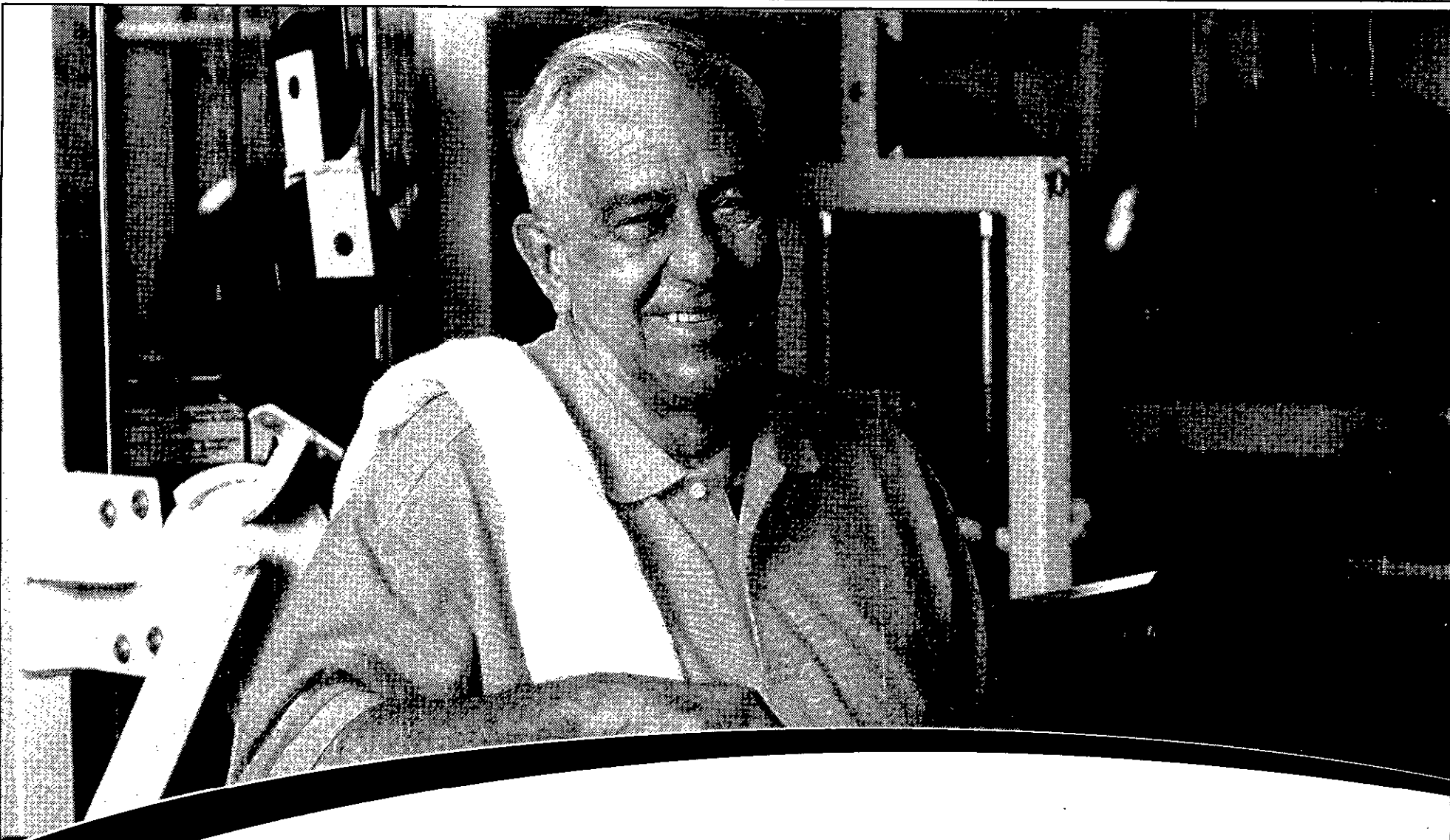

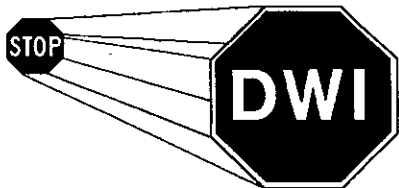

Bethlehem town seal is a good reflection of history just the way it is

Editor, The Spotlight:

The Dec. 20 *Spotlight* article on the town's seal repeats a glaring error that appeared in *Bethlehem Revisited, A Bicentennial Story 1793-1993*. The Half Moon anchored north of what is now the city of Hudson, not Albany.

Let's look at the true history behind the relationship between Henry Hudson and native Americans.

Logbooks and journals by Henry Hudson clearly show that he considered most native Americans to be "treacherous savages." Two examples are: after anchoring the Half Moon off the coast of Canada, Henry Hudson sent a boat, loaded with 12 men and muskets, "drew the savages from their homes and robbed them."

Henry Hudson's crew killed more than eight Indians on the Half Moon's return trip down the Hudson River.

The native American tribes along the Atlantic coast were constantly fighting with each other and forming alliances for self-protection. All coastal tribes disliked explorers because the explorers had a habit of kidnapping Indians and putting them on display in Europe. In

some cases, Indians were made slaves. Most Indians sent to Europe quickly died from diseases they had no natural immunity against.

Henry Hudson noted that the native Americans became less warlike and friendlier as he traveled north up the Hudson River. Henry Hudson described one tribe near what is now Catskill as being a "very loving people." When the Half Moon reached Hudson, the frequency of becoming stuck on mud and sand shoals increased.

The Half Moon had to stop and anchor. Captains of sloops and steamboats later called the islands and shoals in the river above the city of Hudson the middle grounds. Fortunately for Hudson's crew, the local Indians were very friendly.

On Sept. 21, 1609, Henry Hudson staged a party and introduced several Indians to alcohol to find if their true intentions were peaceful. One elder Indian got so drunk he slept overnight on the ship. Hudson made sure that he elder Indians was well taken care of. The next day, when Indians returned and found their elder was in good shape, the Indians put on a feast

for Hudson.

On the morning of Sept. 22, 1609, "our master's mate and four others of the ship's company took our boat (a dinghy) to sound the river higher up."

The five-man crew traveled 24 to 27 miles north and returned late at night, reporting that it would be impossible for the Half Moon to travel any further upriver.

Historians are still debating if the five-man crew reached Albany or perhaps Troy-Green Island, because it is not clear as

to how far north from the city of Hudson, the Half Moon was anchored. However it is very clear that the boat crew did pass through what later became known as the settlement of Bethlehem. On Sept. 23, 1609, the Half Moon started its journey to return to Europe.

The town's seal depicts the Half Moon on a river, a brown or gray silt shoreline typical of a tidal shore, with lush green vegetation above high tide. It shows and labels Henry Hudson. The seal also shows a native American without a name because Henry

Hudson did not remain long enough to identify a chief. Actually the seal is in honor of all of the friendly Indians who lived 20 miles south of what is now the town of Bethlehem. It would be an insult to native Americans to put on the seal "Henry Hudson and friend," because most native Americans would not consider Henry Hudson a friend.

The town of Bethlehem's seal should be left as it is because it is a true depiction of the history of the town

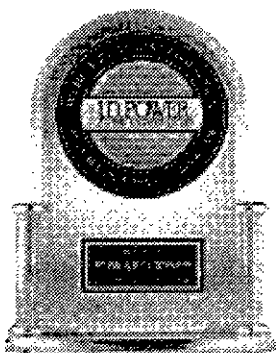

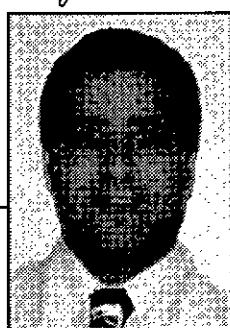

Tune in to, create your community with TV-18 at Bethlehem library

Did you know that TV-18, Bethlehem's public access television station, maintains its studio in the library building?

This valuable community resource is a ready forum for public affairs and poetry, religion and relationships, music and medicine, education and environment. It's yours to use, and it's free.

Funds for the station's equipment and maintenance come from Time Warner Cable, which distributes the money via its franchise agreement with the town. Updated equipment acquired in the past year has enabled longer cablecast hours and a more professional quality.

The year's primary update was automated cablecasting. This technology has allowed the station to expand its offerings into the evenings and weekends.

Station manager Janice Irwin researched, assembled and implemented the system, and is delighted with the results.

"Automated cablecasting provides seamless onscreen transitions, which makes for a more professional presentation. The whole process has become more efficient and more effective."

This year the station was also able to buy a mini digital video camera and lightweight tripods, which greatly aid portability to off-site locations by TV-18 staff and Bethlehem residents wishing to borrow equipment.

Two new DVD players join the VHS equipment on the studio's rack of ten decks. This means that the station can now accept home-authored DVDs for cablecast as an alternative to tape.

"The DVD technology has already been well utilized," Irwin said.

The studio's somewhat tight quarters have been alleviated by the purchase of flat-screen monitors and low-profile modular editing consoles. A hand truck was purchased to carry recording equipment across the street for Town Board meetings, which are recorded twice monthly and cablecast four times a week.

Shows cablecast on TV-18 have ranged from 30-second public service announcements to long-running series such as Jewish View and Write Stuff.

To produce a show for TV-18, all you need is an idea. Irwin is ready to help experienced producers and neophytes alike.

TV-18 and the library do not endorse any views expressed in TV-18 productions. But the beauty of public access television is its availability to anyone.

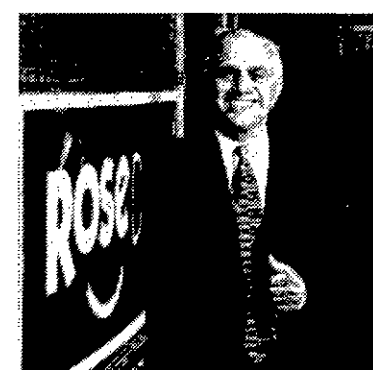

10 and 12 cookbooks at a clip and sending them to friends and neighbors as holiday gifts.

"We were able to pre-sell enough cookbooks to pay for a first printing," Hudson said.

Partial proceeds from the sale of the *Recipes for Peace* cookbook will go to the Capital District Food Pantries.

"Anything anybody can do is a good thing," said Lynda Schuyler, executive director of the Capital District Food Pantries serving 43 different food pantries in Albany and Rensselaer counties.

Schuyler said the food pantry is serving more people but not more meals, and people going to food pantries are getting less.

"Food pantries are anything but bottomless pits of funding," Schuyler added.

Bethlehem Neighbors for Peace members continue to come out every Monday evening at the Delmar Four Corners to voice their opposition to the war in Iraq, holding signs and peacefully protesting.

Hudson said she believes the group is making an impact.

"When we first started standing at the corner four years ago many people were not friendly, and there were negative gestures," said Hudson. "Now we're down to two vehicles that give us a gesture and holler, but most honk horns and give us the peace sign."

A weekly e-mail newsletter is printed by members updating the community about the group's events. Monthly meetings or gatherings are held at the Bethlehem Public Library and at Perfect Blend Coffee House. 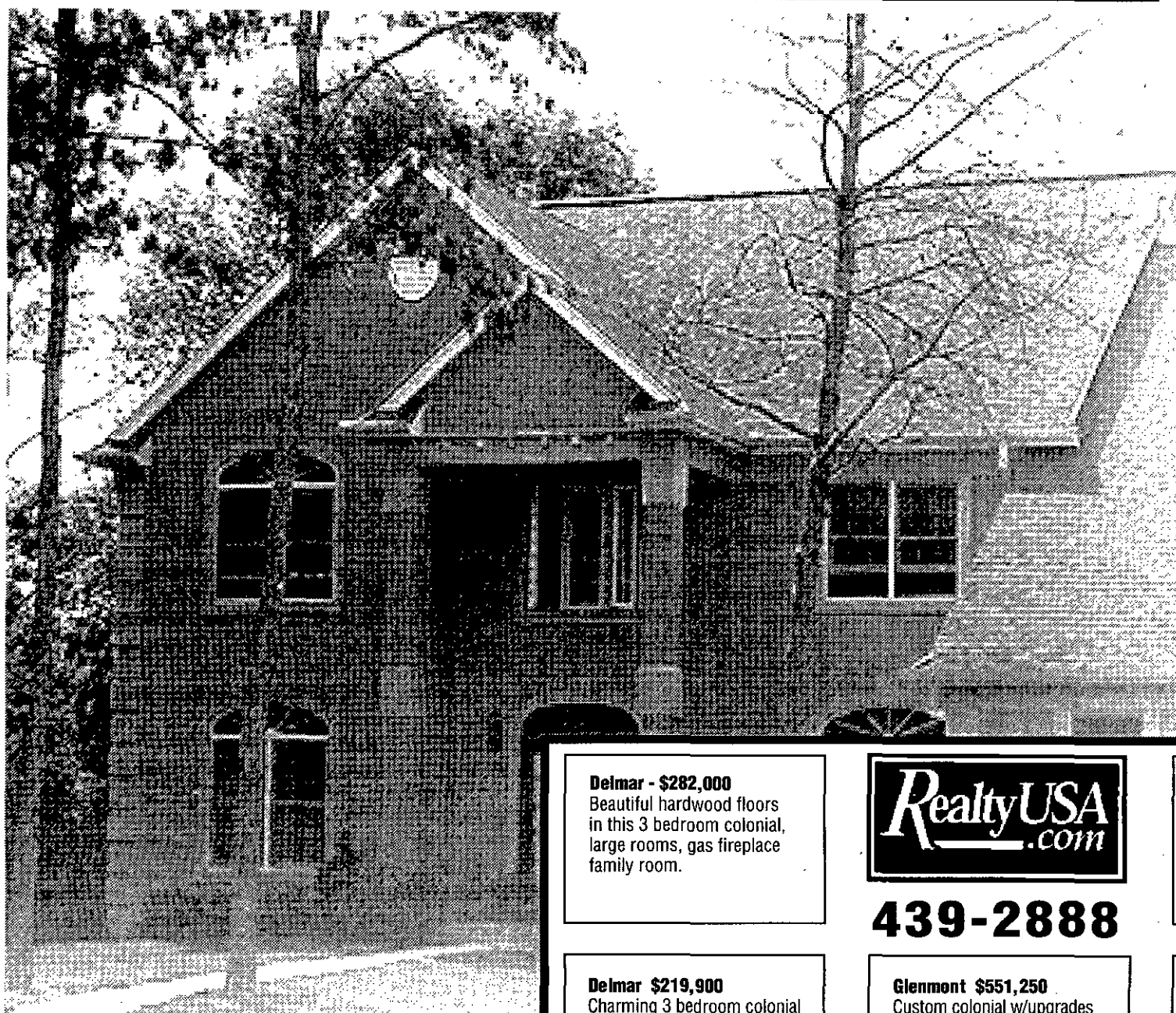

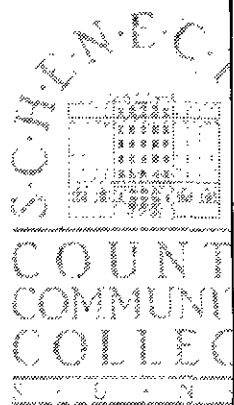

Saratoga First (and only) Night

If you want a bigger New Year's celebration, go hang out with Dick Clark.

In the past 11 years, First Night Saratoga has gone from being the largest citywide winter festival in Saratoga Springs and Saratoga County to being the largest New Year's celebration outside of Times Square.

Things will kick off a little differently this year, said event coordinator Maureen Duda. Children's activities and performers—like the Zucchini Brothers, Radio Disney and the ever-popular reptile exhibit—will begin at 4 p.m.

"Because it's on a Sunday, and most people won't be working, we did start the kids festivities a little early," Duda said, noting the earlier attractions may help parents get the little tykes to bed a little earlier. "The kids can catch

the opening fireworks at 6 p.m. and our older revelers can watch the larger fireworks display at midnight," she said.

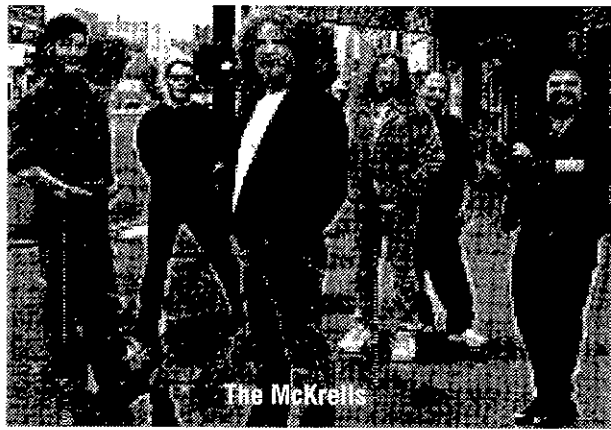
At 5:30 p.m., the starting pistol goes off on the five kilometer run through the Skidmore college campus. Even in a season characterized by excess and winter sloth, the YMCA had no trouble finding participants for the ninth annual trot. Limited to 1,000 runners, the event was booked a full three weeks before its run.

Throughout the evening, over 40 downtown Saratoga Springs buildings, churches, and storefronts become stages for musicians, actors, dancers, and artists. This year, attractions include performances by bluegrass and folk artists the

McKrells, improvisational group the Mop & Bucket Co. and Kate Taylor, sister of singer/songwriter James Taylor.

If you don't feel like stopping in at any one particular venue, take a stroll up and down Broadway and enjoy performers such as Alana Sangiocomo, Andrew & Bob, Brandon Compilango, Jeff Brisbin, Joe G., Katie Buchner, Kimberly Moore, Meredith Bull, Mike Campese, and Nick Colluccio as they turn Saratoga Springs' storefronts into soundstages.

"It's going to be a great event," said Saratoga Springs Mayor Valerie Keehn. "I've been la-

menting the lack of snow, but the warmer weather is a little welcome this year." It's trade-off, said Keehn—she said she'd like to see a white First Night, but knows the moderate temperatures will bring more people to the event. "I've been to

First Nights where the weather has just been bone-chilling, so it'll be nice for people to be able to stay out longer and enjoy the festivities."

This year, the event has the distinction of being the sole First Night in the Capital District. The city of Albany is hosting a family friendly event on Saturday, Dec. 30.

"We're getting into party mode here," Duda said a week before the celebration. Duda said the YMCA of Saratoga sold 10,500 admission buttons last year, but ordered 14,000 this year to compensate for former Albany-bound First-Night-ers.

"We're getting ready for our friends from parts south, migrating up the Northway," Duda said. "And we hope the decent weather sticks around for them."

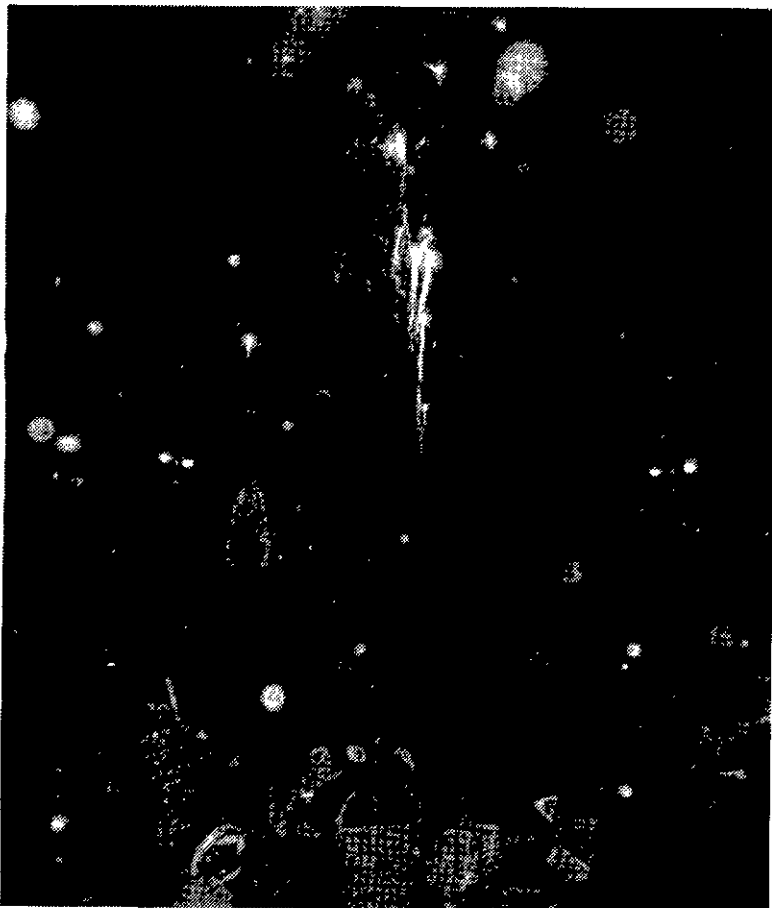
Duda said she'd like to thank General Electric, the signature sponsor of the event. "With their help, we've been able to produce a top-notch event, with spectacular performers," said Duda.

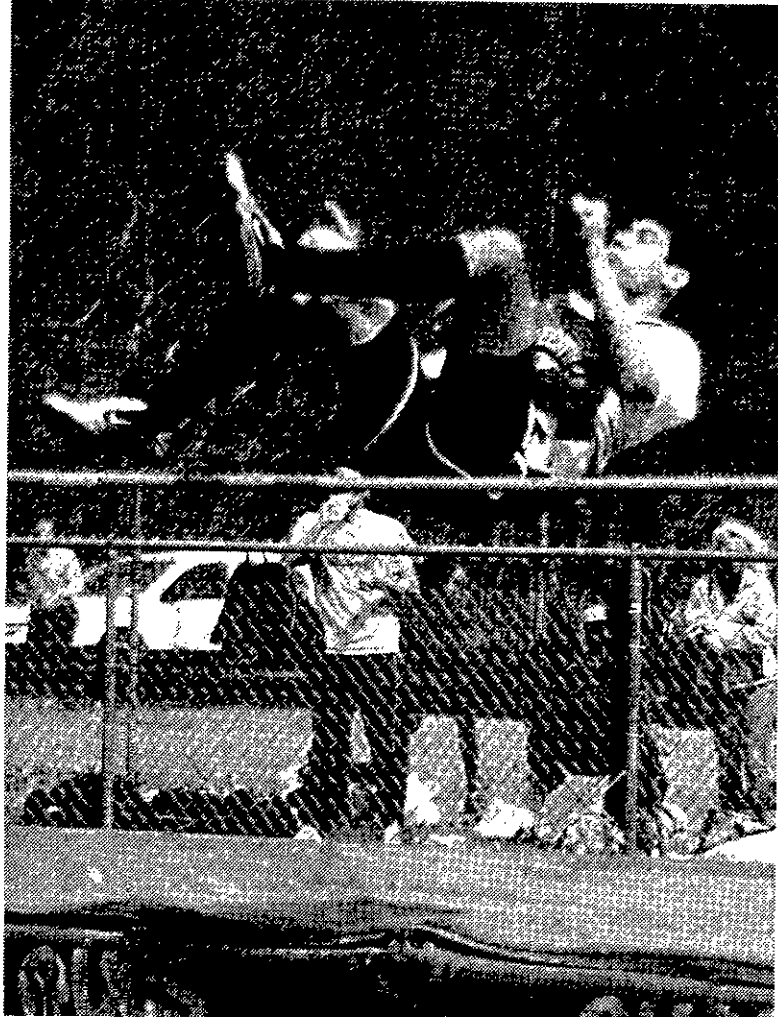

Camoin Associates estimates the proposed Vista Technology Park in Bethlehem will generate \$3.7 billion in new earnings over a 20-year period. The project is expected to create 5,000 new jobs and \$185 million in new salaries along with half a billion dollars in new revenue to Albany County. The new technology park is slated for Slingerlands.

March

• The town's new revaluation has residents concerned. Assessor David Leafer told residents during a public information meeting on reassessments that the process does not necessarily mean residents will see a major property tax hike. "We don't know yet what they will be," said Leafer. A formal grievance process for residents to dispute the new assessments will take place in the spring. There hadn't been a revaluation in the town of Bethlehem for eight years.

• Police Detective John Cox, a 34-year veteran of the Bethlehem Police Department, died after a two-year battle with leukemia. Cox was a patrolman who rose to the rank of sergeant and then became detective.

"He was the foundation on which the Bethlehem police department was built," said Supervisor Theresa Egan.

Police Chief Lou Corsi said Cox was dedicated to the town of Bethlehem and his family.

April

• Bethlehem residents learned on April 1 that 25-year-old Timothy Moshier was killed in Iraq when the Apache helicopter he was piloting crashed outside of Baghdad.

Moshier and his wife, Katie, were both graduates of Bethlehem High School. Timothy Moshier is also survived by his daughter, 10-month-old Natalie Moshier. More than 800 people turned out for services to honor Moshier and his family at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Delmar. Jay Gallagher, a friend of Timothy's and the family, called the tribute "moving and emotional."

• The board of education approves a \$73 million dollar budget. The budget would increase spending by \$7.9 million and taxes by close to 6 percent. Board members and Superintendent Les Loomis express concern over how the public will vote on the new proposed budget because of the town's recent reassessments. A vote is to be held in May.

• Three people will run for two open seats on the Bethlehem school board. Incumbents James Lytle and Lynne Lenhardt will be challenged by newcomer Paulette Morgan.

• Four teenagers, all from the Virgin Island and all living at the Glenmont Job Corps, are charged with gang assault in Glenmont, April 18. Carlos Figueroa, Dennier Thomas, Joel Marchene and Jaleem Charles were arraigned and taken to Albany County jail. "These four students obviously have problems, and when we have

problems we call the police," said Job Corps Director Rose Walker Cook.

• *Spotlight* staffers Brady Chapman and Rob Jonas take home awards for graphic illustration and best sports/outdoor column, respectively, at the New York Press Association's Better Newspaper Contest in Saratoga Springs.

May

• Bethlehem voters for the first time in more than 20 years defeat the proposed \$73 million dollar Bethlehem school district budget. The defeat is blamed on the town's recent reassessments. "I believe that was the last straw for people who are concerned about their finances," said Superintendent Les Loomis. The school board will hold several meetings over the next several weeks to make changes before a new budget is put forth to the voters. The vote was 2,876-to-2,280. "It was a significant defeat," said board president Richard Svenson.

• Pre-trial hearings in the heavily publicized murder trial of Bethlehem native Christopher Porco begin. Porco is accused of murdering his father, Peter Porco, and attempting to murder his mother, Joan Porco, with an ax inside their 36 Brockley Drive home during the overnight hours of Nov. 14 and Nov. 15, 2004. Testimony from both the defense and prosecution lasted four days and included statements from many friends and family members. On the last day of pre-trial hearings, Joan Porco has to leave the courtroom as lurid details of the attack are presented by the prosecution.

• Residents of Voorheesville's school district approve a \$20.1 million dollar budget, which raises taxes by 3.3 percent. "We are pleased with this budget and the fact it supports all of the district programs," said Superintendent Linda Langevin.

• Delmar resident and manager of the College of Saint Rose baseball team Robert Bellizzi died after a 10-year battle with

leukemia. Bellizzi worked with baseball Little Leagues, Babe Ruth leagues and high school players in the area for several years. He was 57 years old.

"When we think about role models for young people today, there is no one that comes more to mind than Bob Bellizzi," said St. Rose President R. Mark Sullivan. Bellizzi left behind a wife and five children.

• Hundreds of residents come out on Memorial Day in Bethlehem to watch the

Bethlehem Memorial Day Parade. The parade kicked off at Nathaniel Adams Blanchard American Legion Post and continued through town with a concluding ceremony at Veterans Memorial Park on Delaware Avenue. Also in May, Lt. Col. Scott Benza of the 355th Contracting Squadron is named the Air Force Outstanding Field Grade Contracting Officer of the Year. Benza is the son of Delmar residents Donald and Margiana Benza.

June

• A group called "Bethlehem Families March for the School

Budget" holds a rally and march June 15 from the middle school to the Four Corners in Delmar to support the revised school district budget scheduled for a vote June 20. Members of the Bethlehem school PTAs, along with hundreds of other community school supporters, show up for the rally.

• The Bethlehem school board makes more than \$800,000 in cuts to the revised budget including a proposal to self-fund certain sports including varsity hockey, gymnastics and cheerleading.

"I have severe reservations about self-funding sports," said board member James Lytle.

• Selkirk resident Brendan Mooney urges the community to protest the town's new assessments by holding a Bethlehem Tea Party modeled after the Boston Tea Party at the June 14 town board meeting.

"Bring your tea bags and your opinions and speak loudly and clearly on how the new tax (reassessment) affects you," Mooney said.

More than 700 residents filed formal grievances challenging their new assessments with the assessor's office.

• Jury selection begins in the murder trial of Christopher Porco. The trial is moved to Orange County Supreme Court in Goshen because of intense media coverage in the Capital District surrounding the trial.

"It's been an inconvenience," said Assistant District Attorney Michael McDermott.

Both the defense and the prosecution will have to set up shop in Goshen and stay in hotels and find office space for the duration of the trial. The cost to Albany County is expected to exceed \$100,000. The trial began June 28 with explosive opening arguments by both the prosecution and the defense.

• It took an additional 34 days, but the second school district budget is overwhelmingly approved by voters by more than 1,000 votes in a record turnout.

"I'm thrilled it passed, and we don't have to go to contingency," said board member Robin Storey. Outgoing board president Richard Svenson thanked the community for "supporting the children and the future of this district."
