Cunningham is new town boss

Board is unanimous in selecting county legislator as new supervisor

At a special meeting on Thursday, April 12, the Bethlehem Town Board voted unanimously to appoint Albany County Legislator Jack Cunningham to its interim supervisor post.

Cunningham, a Democrat, will fill the seat left vacant by former Supervisor Theresa Egan, who left to serve as deputy commissioner for the state Department of Motor Vehicles beginning next month. (See story - Egan bids goodbye, page 16)

Egan, the town's first Democratic supervisor in 150 years, served as supervisor for the past three and a half years, and Cunningham will serve what remains of her term. He has said he plans on running for a full term in November.

Cunningham, a Delmar resi-

dent, has been a county legislator in the 34th District since 2004. He will resign from his part-time county legislative seat and his full-time employment at Key Bank, where he serves as a technology project manager.

The town supervisor position pays \$99,000 annually. The board, three Democrats and one Independent, voted 4-to-0 in favor of appointing Cunningham.

Before the resolution was passed to appoint Cunningham, the public and the board were given an opportunity to comment on the action.

Albany County legislator Herb Reilly, a Democrat and former supervisor of the town of New Scotland, expressed his support of Cunningham.

"I think it's a great shame we're going to lose him in the Legislature," said Reilly, but added, "If you want to get the job done, put Jack in there."

Jared King asked that the board explore alternative options before appointing Cunningham, including not appointing anyone and having a four-member board

V'ville settles with former superintendent

McCartney ordered to pay back \$40,000

The Voorheesville Central School District recently finalized a settlement in its civil suit against former Superintendent Alan McCartney, in the amount of \$40,000.

An initial audit by the office of the state comptroller in 2005 revealed that McCartney, while employed as superintendent, and former Assistant Superintendent for Business Anthony Marturano, received questionable payments totaling \$216,000.

The audit revealed that McCartney had received \$127,338 from August 1989 to July

2005. According to the audit, the two officials authorized virtually all of the payments to themselves without the knowledge or approval of the board of education.

Superintendent Linda Langevin said the \$40,000 figure was settled upon after careful analysis by the school district's internal auditors and attorney, with consideration of the findings of the state comptroller's office.

Langevin called the analysis "very complicated," but said its findings differed from those of the comptroller. Of the more than \$127,000 that the state office reported McCartney was responsible for, only \$40,000 was ultimately credited to McCartney by the

district. The rest of the money

Town board, planning board and zoning board meetings are a regular part of Bethlehem resident Bob Jasinski's monthly schedule. While many residents are not even aware of when and where these local government meetings are, Jasinski makes it a point to attend and take part. When his schedule has a conflict, he looks to his daughter to "cover" for him. A dedicated community member, Jasinski said he feels being a "regular" at these meetings is simply part of his civic duty.

"I feel it is so important to take part in local government. It is our only chance to have a voice, to be heard," said Jasinski.

Jasinski, who has run for town supervisor several times, said he worries that people today are too busy with work, school and families to slow down and make time to care about local politics. He said he is disappointed that more people do not find the time, although he conceded that the times of town meetings are not always suitable for "working people."

"In my town, meetings are sometimes held at 5:30, which doesn't work for a lot of people with full time jobs and kids to care for," said Jasinski.

He the town recently held a riverfront meeting that he had to miss because of its timing.

"One of my biggest concerns is making sure our town holds these meetings at the time that works for the majority of people. We need to get people out and

involved, and we need to make sure it all works with today's busy world," said Jasinski.

From Bethlehem to Clifton Park, those community members who are familiar faces at local meetings said they are grateful for their chances to speak up to those who make the decisions that affect things such as taxes and land development.

Norm Goldman of Clifton Park said he has been attending town board meetings since the 1980s. He said he has regularly voiced his concerns, and feels he has made a difference.

"Years ago, there were issues over the development of Route 146. That is when I started attending. After that, I continued

to stay on top of local government, and I am often given a lot of positive feedback," said Goldman.

Goldman said residents and taxpayers need to realize when they get involved they truly can have an impact on local government.

Like Jasinski, Goldman said he worries about the lack of attendance, especially among the younger generation.

"I hear young people say they do not have the time to attend meetings, and that is when I remind them they can always take advantage of local television sta-




Men reject deal on negligent homicide charges

Parents of Jonathan Carey say they are 'disappointed' by the news

The two men charged in the death of 13-year-old autistic boy Jonathan Carey turned down a plea agreement Wednesday, April 11.

Michael and Lisa Carey said they were let down by the rejection of the plea agreement.

"Lisa and I are disappointed about their decision. We feel they need to do the right thing," said Michael Carey. "Putting us through a trial ... we just feel it would be hard on the entire family."

Spokeswoman for the

district attorney's office Heather Orth said she could not comment on the specifics

of the agreement that Edwin Tirado Jr. and Nadeem Mall rejected.

Tirado and Mall are charged with manslaughter in the second degree and criminally negligent homicide. If convicted on all counts, the defendants each face a maximum term in state prison of 15 years.

The two employees of O.D. Heck Developmental Center in Niskayuna were arrested after police said they belatedly reported a medical emergency after Carey had allegedly suffocated while being restrained. At the time of the Feb. 15 incident, Carey was riding in the back seat of the van traveling on Central Avenue in Colonie on Thursday.

The two men had taken Jonathan and another 14-year-old resident to Crossgates Mall, said police.

According to the charges,

Tirado allegedly struggled with Jonathan after he began acting up, suffocating the boy and eventually causing his death. According to police, Mall was driving the vehicle at the time of the boy's death.

Attorney for Tirado, Brian Donohue, said he could not comment on the proposed plea agreement.

"The DA's office has preferred not to make this public, and we are respecting their wishes," said Donohue.

Donohue said the deal was rejected because, "Mr. Tirado is innocent, in a nutshell."

Because of this, Donohue speculated that the case would most likely proceed to trial.

Mall's attorney, Stephen Coffey, could not be reached for comment.

Bethlehem police charge Selkirk woman with drunken driving

Bethlehem police arrested one woman for driving while intoxicated (DWI) last week after she was found sleeping in her vehicle.

Rozila Jakhra, 34, of 8 Dorchester Ave., Selkirk, was arrested and charged with DWI on Monday, April 9.

Police said they witnessed Jakhra make a right hand turn into Elm Avenue Park without signaling. She then entered the park through the front tennis court parking lot before turning off the paved area onto a grass berm, coming to a stop, according to police.

Upon investigating, police said Jakhra was asleep in the vehicle.

Police said that after waking her, she could not explain what she was doing in the park or how she had got there. She allegedly admitted to consuming two drinks at a downtown Albany bar.


She was advised that the park was closed.

She was arrested after failing field sobriety tests.

She was charged with DWI and refusing to submit to a blood alcohol test at the police station. According to police, she failed to blow hard enough

into the apparatus during three admissions of the test. Under state law, failing to provide an adequate sample after three times is a refusal to take the test.

She is scheduled to appear in Town Court on Tuesday, May 1.

Mapping a future for Five Rivers

DEC holds hearings to discuss plans for nature center

In order to more effectively manage the Five Rivers Environmental Education Center in the town of New Scotland, the state Department of Environmental Conservation has been holding public hearings over the past few weeks to discuss the future of the center.

Development goals for the center include a new visitor facility and picnic shelter; improved parking and trail access; new maintenance and operations facilities; and the removal of some existing structures. The new management plan being developed would also hope to improve wildlife management at the center, educational programs and land use.

"The main goal is to establish a vision for the management of the center, and for that we're getting input and advice," said Craig Thompson, the center's director.

The main issue at the public meetings has centered on the addition of a new 8,000-square-foot facility, the development of which is in the preliminary stages. Thompson said the new facility would increase administrative effectiveness and efficiency by placing all of the center's offices in one building. Thompson said he estimates the capital project would cost around \$4 million.

Currently, the 446-acre Five Rivers area includes 12 miles of trails and interior roads, 16 ponds and wetlands, and expanses of forest, field and brush land habitats, according to the DEC.

Thompson said the development of this management plan was ordered by the previous director of the DEC, and is the first guide for the development of the center since a master plan was drawn up in 1985. Thompson described the 1985 master plan as not fully sanctioned.

"We never had public hearings on it," said Thompson. "For the first time, we're publicly vetting our management regime."

The Friends of Five Rivers, an affiliated nonprofit citizens group, welcomes DEC's plan

and the new center; however, RoseAnne Fogarty, president of the group, said she feels that "the design for the proposed building and its surrounding area must be revised to better fit Five Rivers' philosophy and programs."

The Friends of Five Rivers would like to see adequate workspace for volunteer instructors; a layout that supports teaching that moves from indoors to outdoors; and appropriate space for program-related items. The group would also like to see attention to acquiring additional green space, providing adequate staffing and acknowledging the area's historic heritage.

One of the provisions of the proposed management plan would be to develop a committee to address wildlife management issues — including the consideration of adding hunting, fishing or trapping for species control or for public use.

This committee would make its recommendations over the next few years, and Thompson said the possibility of adding these activities to the park's usage is not imminent. Any changes would require extensive public and administrative reviews.

Regardless, frequent user of the Five Rivers Center, Ron Berger, said he thinks allowing hunting would be a mistake, calling the practice irresponsible.

"I think it would be terrible to do that," said Berger, who has attended the recent public hearings. "There was no public interest in having hunting and trapping at Five Rivers."

Currently, the park offers guided catch and release fishing programs and hunting and trapping education and certification courses. Those courses are educational and do not include any actual hunting or trapping practices.

Other than that provision, Berger praised the DEC for its work on the management plan.


"I think the DEC is doing a really responsible, thoughtful review of the place," said Berger, adding, "My interest is keeping the area as pristine as possible."

Thompson said that once the management plan is adopted, it would come up for review and amendment every five years.

The management plan is available for review at Five Rivers, DEC Region Four Headquarters, Bethlehem Public Library and Town Hall, and the New Scotland Town Hall. It can also be found on the DEC's Web site at www.dec.state.ny.us.

Dems pick Dorsey for 36th

Pat Dorsey of Selkirk is the choice of the Bethlehem Democratic Committee to replace Howard Shafer as Albany County legislator in the 36th District.

The town party chose to nominate Dorsey over Shafer, who is currently finishing his first full term as county legislator, at its Tuesday, April 3, meeting.

"Dorsey received a majority of the weighted votes in the caucus amongst committee members," said town Democratic chairman Matt Clyne.

Clyne, who was recently selected as county Democratic election commissioner, said Shafer did not support the county committee group last fall when Dave Bosworth of Gunderland and Jack Cunningham of Delmar ran for chairman and vice chairman of the county party.

"There was no excuse for that, and that bothered me," said Clyne.

The county vote for Democratic chairman ended in a legal dispute, resulting in two co-chairs, Frank Comisso and David Bosworth, being named.

Shafer also voted against Clyne for election commissioner. He said at the time he had made a prior commitment to Karen Shea, the county deputy elections commissioner, before he knew Clyne was going to run.

Clyne, however, said Shafer told him the night before the vote that he would support him.

Shafer said he is questioning the town Democratic district caucus vote that supported Dorsey for the county legislative seat.

"I have asked the chairman for a copy of the proxy votes, and he has refused to give them to me," said Shafer.

Clyne said Shafer knows how the caucus vote went for his district seat, and the majority did not support him.

"He was shown the proxies that night, he knows how the vote went, and there is no dispute on the weighted vote," Clyne said.

Shafer represents parts of Coeymans and Bethlehem in the county Legislature and said he was planning on running for re-election this November until the caucus vote.

"If I didn't get the nomination, I will have to make a decision about running," Shafer said.

He said his county track record as legislator is a good one, and he should have received the party nod.

"I was recently re-elected as district leader, and I have perfect attendance at county functions," Shafer said.

Clyne said he believes Shafer does not understand that the county suburbs are trying to show their strength and every Democratic town vote is needed to further that cause.

"When push comes to shove, you have to stick together," said Clyne, who has been a committee member for 34 years and has watched the Albany County suburbs gain in political strength over the years.

"We are trying to advance our own cause," Clyne said.

Having a preteen daughter is just fine

It's not easy living with a preteen daughter.

There's a lot of stomping up the stairs and door slamming. There's frequent lamenting that "nobody understands me" and "nobody listens to anything I have to say."

My husband says I have to stop behaving this way. I know he's right, but I can't help it. At the rate I'm regressing, I will become a teenager at the same time as my daughter. I'm already way ahead of her in terms of acne and moodiness.

If he's smart, Jeff will start building himself a bunker in the basement. I have a feeling it's going to get ugly.

I try to remember that I'm the grown-up. I more than try to remember. I know that I'm the grown-up. I just don't always feel like acting like one.

It's just not fair!

Sorry, there I go again with those emotions. Not just any emotions, but the negative ones: frustration, exasperation and indignation.

"You have to remember to enjoy your child," a co-worker told me last year. She said that the key to avoiding feeling aggravated was to focus on enjoying the child.

I shared this bit of wisdom with my husband. We take turns reminding each other.

"Did you enjoy that?" I'll ask sweetly of my husband after he has just completed one of those "I've asked you 10 times to brush your teeth" discussions with our daughter.

"Had enough enjoyment?" he'll smile and ask me as I stand in the middle of her bedroom ranting, "You call this a picked up room?"

For her part in the process, it seems that my daughter is genuinely befuddled. She

comes out looking like an innocent bystander. It's not her fault that she has to live with hypersensitive parents.

My daughter, like my husband, is more mature than me. Those two have long fuses and tend to keep quiet when angry. When I start to rant and rave, they literally close their mouths so as to avoid adding flames to the fire. They feel that anything they say can and will be used against them.

Sometimes this backfires on my daughter.

"I asked you a question," I snarl during a pause in my ranting, "Why aren't you answering me?"

"It's rude to interrupt someone when they are talking," my daughter will say. And she is being sincere.

I also know from experience that she sometimes doesn't know what to say. She's wondering: What answer will appease the crazed mother? What does Mom want from me?

At the same time I'm thinking to myself, "And this too shall pass."

Why am I arguing with her? Can I just stay calm? Can I try to see things from her point of view?

In a blink of an eye she'll be in college, and I'll miss having to say, "Go brush your teeth."

What's most unsettling for me is that this mother-daughter battling dynamic seems unavoidable. It can extend to fathers, too.

"A lot of times Daddy doesn't understand me," my daughter once said. I told her, "Yeah, Daddy doesn't understand me either, but he

loves both of us very much." Think of how frustrating it must be for him, I told her, to live with two mysterious girls.

I don't always understand her either, but I try to.

I try to imagine what she feels like. I walk in her shoes. And I mean I literally put on her shoes. I can do that because her foot is now bigger than mine. But I can't say I've walked a mile in her shoes, because that wouldn't be safe. I have, however, worn her shoes on a quick trip out to my car in the garage.

So, I don't fully understand her. She doesn't fully understand me. We don't fully understand ourselves.

"I don't want to have another eight years of this," I told her recently after we'd argued. Of course, eight was an arbitrary number. Why did I say eight? She'll only be 18 then. That's still a teenager. We'll be deciding on a college then. That won't be easy.

To maintain a good relationship I work hard to keep the lines of communication open. No, she does not have a cell phone.

"Let's not put up a wall between us," I tell her, referring to a description in a book we read together.

If I feel we're not communicating well then I'll wave my hand vertically between us, miming the search for a barrier. I'll say, "There's no wall going up here, is there? Even if we get angry at one another, we need to talk it out, because we are a family, and I love you."

Sometimes both parties

need to cool down before talking.

"Do not engage," a fellow mom advised me recently. She was referring to a way to avoid battling with one's daughter.

I need a loudspeaker warning system triggered by my emotions. The system would sense my growing agitation. A siren would sound, followed by a stern, but kind voice stating, "Do not engage the child in a conversation. Step away from your daughter."

to remind our children to do homework. Your teacher is behind all this nagging."

She's no longer listening phase: "You think we enjoy nagging you? We just want you to do well so that you can get into college and have a good life."

Sarcastic remark phase (only thought, not spoken out loud): "It's your life. What do I care if you don't do your work, can't get into college and don't get a job? Nothing would please me more than to be doing your laundry and supporting you when you are 40."

All that because she said, "fine" in a huffy voice when I asked her to do some homework.

The correct response to her huffy "fine" should have been my

neutral "thank you."

Recently Rachel and I had a pleasant outing together. After she went to bed I related a fear to my husband. I told him that I expected that the next day our daughter would set me off and I would start yelling, "I took you to the mall and we went to the movies and I bought you new sneakers and new pants and this is the thanks I get?"

"So don't do that," said rational Jeff.

"Easy for you to say," I snapped, rolling my eyes at him.

"You had fun together today. Just concentrate on that," he said.

"You just don't understand," I pouted.

"Finish your milk and go to bed," he said kindly.

I've got to give him a lot of credit. It's not easy living with the mother of a preteen daughter.



Greenway grant to bolster bridge

Project will create a pedestrian link between town and city's trail systems

A Hudson Valley Greenway grant will help pay for improvements to the Normansville Bridge to link nature trails on the Bethlehem and Albany sides of the span.

The Greenway is awarding \$10,000 to the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy for the Normansville Bridge Improvement Project. The old Normansville Bridge is considered a critical connection between the city of Albany's trail system on the historic Stevens Farm and the Conservancy's Normans Kill Preserve.

The grant will allow needed improvements to ensure the bridge's safety for pedestrian access.

"The town of Bethlehem has done a fair amount of work on the Bethlehem side, and we would like to continue that work across the bridge on the Albany side," said Jill Knapp, executive director of the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy.

Kevin J. Plunkett, chairman of the Hudson River Valley Greenway Conservancy, said the project provides enhanced opportunities for recreation and tourism in the Hudson River

Valley by implementing Greenway Trail programs.

"The 2006 Greenway Small Grant program recipients are undertaking important trail initiatives in their communities," said Plunkett.

The Greenway awarded \$75,000 to 13 projects from Saratoga County to Manhattan. There are currently 266 eligible communities in the Greenway.

The Normansville Bridge was built in 1916 and once was a link across the Normans Kill.

"The Stevens Farm has miles of trails leading to the Albany Golf Course," said Knapp. "In Bethlehem there is an interesting trail system throughout the community, and this could be a potential link into these trails."

George Leveille, town economic development director, has been assisting the town and community groups trying to integrate the Bethlehem pedestrian trails.

"This is another amenity that will connect our open space and assets on either side of the bridge," said Leveille.

Mary Mangione, executive director of the Hudson River Valley Greenway, said trails are an ever-important recreational resource for communities in the Hudson Valley.

"We are proud that we can contribute to the efforts of municipalities and nonprofits as they work to improve connections between communities along the Hudson," Mangione said.

Voorheesville justice steps down

After 14 years, Dolin says he's ready to explore his options

Effective Monday, April 16, Voorheesville Town Justice Thomas Dolin stepped down from his position to explore other employment possibilities, including a run for other elected offices.

Dolin, a Democrat, has been town justice for 14 years, since he was appointed to fill an open position. He has since been elected to the post four times. The 68-year-old Dolin, formerly an attorney in a private practice, has been retired for two years.

Being a justice, he said, was the realization of a goal he had had since he was a student at Albany Law School.

"I think most young lawyers aspire someday to try their hand at being a judge," said Dolin.

Dolin said his choice to become a justice was the continuation of his involvement in local government, including stints as a planning board member in Voor-

heesville and a town attorney.

"It was an opportunity to serve the community at a local level, and you always hope that you're doing a good job," he said of his time as town justice.

He said the small claims court was one of the more difficult aspects of serving as town justice.

"The small claims facet of the position proved to be quite challenging and educational," said Dolin. In small claims, Dolin said, the cases mainly required him to settle contractual issues and tested his objectivity and fairness.

"When you don't have a jury trial, you're acting as judge and jury," said Dolin.

Despite the challenges, Dolin said, he thought he served the town well.

"I think I was impartial. I listened; I tried to be

compassionate where I could be," said Dolin.

Supervisor Ed Clark said, "I think he did a very good job. He was diligent and reliable in his scheduling and execution of his responsibilities."

Dolin has lived in Voorheesville for more than 40 years with his wife, Nancy. He has three grown children and four grandchildren.


The open position will be filled by a vote of the town board, said Clark.

Kenneth Connolly, a Republican, has expressed interest in the interim position. Clark said that Connolly, a town justice in New Scotland for 20 years and the current Voorheesville village justice, could fill the position until fall elections. According to Clark, Connolly has indicated he would not run for the position at that time.

"I think it would be beneficial for the town," said Clark, of the Connolly appointment. "Ken is a very experienced judge and could certainly step into the job very easily and competently."





There have been yelps of joy, cries of disappointment and a final round of anxiety as the nation's high school seniors received word in the past couple of weeks of college acceptances and rejections.

The statistics look grim to students just beginning the college search, with some of the top schools in the country accepting fewer than 10 percent of their applicants.

There's a wake-up call in this, and it's to not stop trying to get into the top colleges.

Life is about trying, getting results and whether we like the way things turned out or not, moving on. Without a doubt, though, "the old college try" needs to be exerted on a lot of levels.

Our schools need to work to make sure that our students can be competitive, not just in the college market, but in an increasingly global market.

Parents, too, must teach their children appropriate lessons. By May 1, the college class of 2011 will have made its decision, and we can all take heart from the fact that most colleges accept the bulk of their applicants.

Students, now it's up to you. The future is yours ... remember that as you shape your lives, you are also shaping the future of our republic.

Get your yard ready to grow

The odd snow pile may still linger in the Capital District, but spring has finally sprung. Now is the time to take steps to ensure a great lawn and yard throughout the year.

With this year's late onset of snow, and lagging cold, winterlike conditions, the window for cleanup is especially short. Mid-March is generally a good time to start cleaning, we had more than a foot of snow at that time. Ideally, you want to have your cleanup completed by mid to late April to take full advantage of the rain and early growing season.

By doing a spring cleanup, you prepare your lawn, trees and shrubs for optimal growth and lay the foundation for the appearance and upkeep of your property for the year.

It's not just aesthetics; a well-groomed and landscaped property can increase the value of your home by 15 percent. You do the math on that.

Some people have a landscaping firm come in to do their cleanup for them, while others prefer to do it themselves, with a little help from the kids. If you're looking to hire a lawn or landscaping firm talk to your neighbors and friends for a referral.

Why you should do spring cleaning

When we last worked on our property it was late in the fall. We spent many hours removing the leaves and dragging them to the road for removal by the town.

Over the winter, branches fell, those leaves that hung on too long for us to wait any

longer came down, and leaves blew into our bushes from who knows where. The snow and ice we so enjoyed has squashed our once-vibrant lawns into flat sickly looking fields of blah. All of this will be set right with a spring cleanup.

Spring cleanup tips

The object of a spring cleanup is to remove winter's debris from our property. This requires a good deal of raking and, of course, hauling. To do a top-notch job you may want to run a dethatcher over your lawn. This will lift the debris that regular raking leaves behind.

In addition, dethatching will loosen the top bit of soil, which is great if you plan to seed your lawn after your cleanup. Another huge help is a good push blower; they really cut down on the time and effort. A backpack blower is great for those delicate or hard-to-reach areas that a push blower can't touch.

Put your debris on a tarp and drag it to the street, much easier than a can or bag. Start at the foundation or a corner of the property and work toward the street. Of course the biggest help will come from many hands.

Before you spend a day or two doing your cleanup, why not call one of the local landscaping or lawn care companies for an estimate. The time you save may be better spent on another less labor-intensive project.

Now what?

Now is a great time to seed and feed your lawn. If your

lawn is thin, overseeding is the way to go. At the very least, spot seeding should be done now. Use a good starter fertilizer and help Mother Nature keep your seed wet until established. Don't mow until your new grass is 4 inches long.

Some of us should instead put down a fertilizer and weed control. Remember, you can't seed and weed at the same time. Read the bag of any product you apply. If your lawn is very sunny, crabgrass is a likely issue, start the battle now, and stick with it. What about grubs? Those who have had grubs can attest to the damage and would advise you take steps to avoid them.

There are a great number of issues to be dealt with, my best advice is to choose a battle or two and stick with it. Do some research at the local garden shop or online.

Next on your list should be dressing up those beds. Weed, edge and mulch before they're overrun with weeds. Pruning and shearing are done at different times based on the type of plant, but there is no wrong time to remove damaged or crossed branches.

Pruning your trees allows you to control the growth, shade and privacy afforded your property. It can also have a big impact on curb appeal. Don't be shy about cutting back branches that are too close to the house, block doors, windows or simply are too big.

For many, spring couldn't come soon enough this year, and a great way to enjoy the weather by getting out and doing garden projects. Your spring cleanup is the best way to ensure a great-looking yard throughout the spring and summer.



The big picture in the back lot

Edwood FilmFest invites local would-be filmmakers and actors to strut their stuff

Writers, actors, production staff and would-be directors will convene behind the Spectrum 8 Theatre Friday, June 29, for a weekend of back-lot filming as part of the Edwood FilmFest.

More than 40 scripts have come in, and 100 actors have

answered the organizers' call for local talent to try their hand at the big screen. On Friday, April 20, event organizers will announce the winning scripts that will be made into 16 short films.

From then on, it will be a mad dash to land actors for the right roles, work out the details and begin filming. The final products will be edited in Hollywood studios and sent back to Albany

for a to-be-announced summer screening.

"It will be fun to see what Hollywood does with these things. This is a great primer for some and a great proving ground for others," said Peter Barnett, one of the festival's organizers.

Edwood is the only festival of its kind in the area. That was the intent.

Most other festivals are just screenings of no-name, avant-garde films of the independent subculture, said Barnett.

Barnett and others decided in 2000, after a series of amateur film showings in downtown Albany, that they would make a "People's Film Festival."

Now, every summer, and sometimes twice a year, the festival casts the Capital District for its series of "microisodes."

More and more people are jumping at the opportunity to get their work on screen, said Barnett.

"The sheer number of people that have signed up has far exceeded anything we even wildly hoped for," said Edwood FilmFest casting agent Judy Tower in a written statement.

Both Tower and Barnett joked about the number of people who attend the festival and how they do not need to superimpose large crowds through computer-generated imaging. They have the people for realistic battle scenes or a biblical epic ... assuming a screenwriter scripted it that way.

In late June, the Spectrum's overflow parking lot will be transformed into a series of soundstages for the shooting of the selected episodes.

The Hollywood professionals who will do the editing have worked on movies such as "The Polar Express," "Analyze This" and "Cast Away."

Outside the Hollywood editing, the final product of the 16 short films will include work done entirely by a staff of area amateurs who have worked set design, costumes, music scores, writing and acting.

There's a change in the air

V'ville's new policy on smoking signals a shift toward cessation

Opinions are mixed on how to enforce Voorheesville Central School District's proposed tobacco policy.

A discussion of the five-page draft of the policy at the school board's April meeting led to questions about the discipline procedures currently in effect for students caught violating the policy. First-time offenders currently face a one-day, out-of-school suspension.

Board member Page Pierce said she believes many seniors are in danger of not graduating this spring, and a contributing factor could be the suspension policy for students caught smoking.

"I know students who are addicted to cigarettes who get caught and booted from school and are now at risk of not graduating," said Pierce, questioning why no treatment program is made available.

The new tobacco policy spells out the specific prohibition of smoking by any student or employee on all school property. Students are encouraged to inform district personnel if they see anyone smoking on school grounds. The policy also states how a student can receive intervention including cessation counseling and educating parents by providing them with intervention service options for students who smoke.

Superintendent Linda Langevin said the new tobacco policy will be adopted before the next school year, and first offenders will no longer receive an out-of-school suspension.

"The new policy allows first-time offenders to be put into a smoking cessation program," Langevin said.

Most school officials agreed that is the proper first disciplinary step for student smoking offenders.

"Kids and seniors need to be in school and not suspended," said high school Principal Mark Diefendorf. "We now have three or four staff members trained in cessation counseling."

Diefendorf added that he believes student smoking is not the reason why so many seniors are in danger of not graduating this year.

"I don't know of any student in my 20 years that has had their graduation jeopardized for smoking," Diefendorf said.

Currently, 21 seniors in Voorheesville may not graduate, and that number is about 15 to 20 percent of the overall graduating class. Diefendorf said only one or two of those students have ever been suspended for smoking

on school property.

Pierce said she believes the number of students who have faced suspension for smoking and are in danger of not graduating is more like five. She also said she believes the district should work in formulating more in-school suspensions for students who break rules by skipping class or

disciplining to the discretion of staff.

"If you don't spell it out, I see the same problems as the school dress code," said Brackett.

Other board members, including school board president David Gibson, disagreed.

"If we don't trust our administration to be reasonable and fair, then we should get rid of our administration and get others," said Gibson.

The draft tobacco policy indicates that discipline measures for students caught smoking on school grounds will be defined by the school's current code of conduct. The code of conduct discipline can include everything from an initial verbal warning to suspension.

"Administration should have the discretion of disciplining students who violate the smoking policy," said Diefendorf.



Bethlehem to run Colonial Acres Golf Course

Deal preserves the future of birdies at historic course

The town of Bethlehem will become the new operator of the 43-year-old Colonial Acres Golf Course.

A deal is being finalized allowing a not-for-profit group called the Open Space Initiative to purchase the 35-acre, nine-hole, semi-private course in Glenmont from a consortium of about 17 shareholders.

"This will preserve a beautiful area that is nationally Audubon certified and will keep the area forever green without development," said Theresa Egan, town supervisor as the deal was being made.

Last year, more than 700 residents signed a petition urging the town board to take over operation of the golf course for fear the current owners would sell the land to private developers

interested in a new housing development in that neighborhood off Feura Bush Road.

"Once OSI purchases the property, the town will enter into an operational agreement," Egan said.

The golf season for Colonial Acres has officially begun, and the current owners are accepting memberships. Town officials said they expect a transition to take place during late spring or early summer, when the town becomes the official operator of the course.

"We are trying to anticipate when that might happen," said parks and recreation Director Nan Lanahan.

Lanahan said the current Colonial Acres staff would become town staff, including full-time groundskeeper Pat Bloom and other seasonal help.

"There will be no radical changes in the first year," said Lanahan.

Future improvements to the property once the town takes over could include extensions of water and sewer lines. The golf course currently has its own irrigation system, which includes a holding pond.

"We need to make those amenities to increase usage," Egan said.

Expanding the current pro shop is another idea being considered.

"Right now the pro shop only sells bottled water and candy bars, and it could definitely be expanded," said Lanahan, who said she is excited the town will be able to offer a golf course to residents.

"It's going to be a great opportunity to increase play there and expose Colonial Acres to more people," said Lanahan, who is also a golfer.

The 2006 cost for a season membership at Colonial Acres for

a single adult was \$400. Currently, the course sells an average 100 season memberships. Lanahan said she believes the town will be able to increase both daily and seasonal attendance once they take over.

"We will have to work on forecasting and projections, but we hope to increase the amount of play there," Lanahan said.

The town will also honor current season pass holders to the golf course.



Establishing a strong credit history is the key to borrowing

For some first-time borrowers, there is a common misperception that not carrying debt equates to a strong credit score. This is not true. A strong credit rating is determined by an individual's ability to repay a loan based upon their prior financial history. Also, the credit bureau must send that explanation to anyone who requested your credit report within the past six months (if the request was for credit purposes) and within the past two years (if the request was for employment purposes). flexibility, and the details can and often do vary greatly from product to product and lender to lender. Therefore, to shop wisely, it helps to understand a few common terms.

- **Interest:** The amount of money the lender charges you for borrowing money. Interest rates can be either variable or fixed.
- **Variable Interest Rate:** The rate may change during any period of the loan term, as defined by the loan agreement.
- **Fixed-Interest Rate:** The rate means remains the same throughout the term of the loan.
- **Length of Loan:** The period of time in which a loan must be repaid, usually in months.

Auditor pleads guilty to fleecing \$1.2M

Former OMH employee must pay back amount taken from state

A Slingerlands resident pleaded guilty Tuesday, April 10, to fleecing the state of \$1.2 million dollars through his position as senior auditor for the state Office of Mental Health.

James L. Leggiero, 50, a 27-year state employee, submitted and approved at least 80 fraudulent vouchers over a nine-year period charging the office for work that was not performed. He now faces up to 10 years in prison on one count of first-degree grand larceny. Leggiero must also pay full restitution for the money he stole from the state.

The guilty plea was entered before Albany County Court Judge Thomas A. Breslin. Leggiero already lost his \$79,000-a-year position with OMH. His wife, also an OMH employee who was not accused of any wrongdoing, will keep her position with the state, according to Leggiero's lawyer Steven Coffey.

Leggiero admitted to establishing a bogus company called VIP, short for Very Important Property, and submitting vouchers ranging from several hundred dollars to more than \$99,000. VIP was supposed to perform site work

on potential properties the office of OMH would purchase for residential treatment facilities.

To conceal his crimes, Leggiero opened up a checking account in the name of VIP, and then used the funds in the account for his personal expenses. Leggiero's lavish lifestyle included owning several automobiles, including a 1958 vintage Corvette.

As part of the plea condition, Leggiero is unable to seek any future public employment.

"This case involves not just the theft of \$1 million, it involves a breach of public trust," said state Attorney General Andrew Cuomo.

The Leggiero case is the first major case to be handled by the new attorney general's office.

"My office is working diligently to ensure taxpayer money is being spent in a lawful manner," said Cuomo.

The state comptroller's office was also a part of the initial investigation. Audits of vouchers Leggiero approved in his position with OMH were performed by the comptroller's office in early February indicating no actual site for the fictitious VIP company Leggiero had created.

"This plea sends a message to any other state worker who might think about doing something similar," said state Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli.

Sentencing for Leggiero is scheduled for July 2.





Egan bids goodbye to town job

Bethlehem officials shower departing supervisor with praise at farewell gathering

Theresa Egan's last day as Bethlehem supervisor on Wednesday, April 11, began with a morning farewell inside town hall. The room where Egan conducted her town meetings had been turned into a makeshift banquet hall with employees and department heads saying their goodbyes to the popular town leader, showering her with gifts and tables full of home-

made breads, cakes and other pastries.

"It has not been an easy week and a half," said Egan trying to hold back tears during an emotional farewell speech.

"Thank you very much for what you have done these past three and a half years," Egan told employees. "I leave full of pride in accomplishing a great deal, and without you we couldn't have done it."

Egan reminded her staff she is not leaving the area, just driving down the road to work in a new job.

"I am not moving to San Di-

ego, I am just changing jobs, and I'll still be around," Egan said.

Egan's new job will be in the city of Albany, working in the state Department of Motor Vehicles as deputy commissioner.

Sam Messina, town board member, said Egan has been his friend for 25 years, adding that it was her influence that led Messina to run for public office.

"Her enthusiasm, her leadership, her integrity, I have always valued," said Messina.

"I hope she stays connected with the town and community in many ways. I will miss her a lot."

Those heartfelt sentiments were echoed time and again by several town employees who stopped by with flowers, handshakes and hugs for the departing supervisor.

"She has set the bar high for public service," said town controller Judy Kehoe. "She has led by example with hard work, intelligence, integrity and compassion."

Kehoe said no matter how busy Egan was on any given day, she would always take the time to ask, "How are you?"

"She cares," Kehoe said.

Mike Morelli, assistant economic developer, agreed with Kehoe that Egan led by example.

"She is a tremendous, supportive leader," said Morelli. "She has put together a dedicated team that has advanced a lot

of good initiatives for the town."

Kyle Kotary, another member of the town board, said Egan made town government in Bethlehem more open than ever before, and she will be missed.

"She will be remembered as a very effective leader who not only moved through several projects in a short period of time but also changed the way town government conducts its business," said Kotary.

Kim Ryan, Egan's assistant, said she will miss her boss.

"It's going to be tough," said Ryan.

Jack Cunningham, Democratic county legislator, replaces Egan as the interim supervisor and will serve in that capacity through the remainder of 2007.

The position of supervisor will be up for election in November.

in question was found to be the result of discrepancies in district policy at the time as well as what was determined to be inaccuracies in the findings of the controller's office.

The \$40,000 received from McCartney will be used to lower the tax levy in the 2007-2008 budget.

The settlement with McCartney was made in December but was not finalized until March 22. Officials could not comment on the outcome until it was final.

"I think it was a fair settlement," said Langevin.

McCartney's attorney, Stephen Coffey, declined to comment.

"It is what it is, and by the agreement we had, we're not commenting on the case," said Coffey.

Coffey said, despite some media reports, no countersuit had been filed against the school district by his client.

Based on a provision in the set-

tlement limiting discussion on its details, board members couldn't comment on the settlement's specifics but expressed relief to be able to put the situation behind them.

"It's the belief of the board that it was in the best interest of the district to accept this," said school board president David Gibson. Gibson said the school board's responsibility to the students has remained the focus throughout

this process, but admitted that the lawsuit, at the management level, was a "big distraction."

"I'm personally glad to see that it's over. It caused a lot of distractions and now it's behind us and so we can focus on what we should be focusing on — educating children," said C. James Coffin, board vice president.

Coffin said he was satisfied with the terms of the settlement.

"Quite frankly, I think the

settlement is a good one," said Coffin. "It took a lot of hard work, and it wasn't the easiest thing to deal with."

"I'm glad that it's resolved," said board member Thomas McKenna.

Gibson said the administration, business office and the school board expended a huge amount of effort over the past 18 months strengthening internal controls to make sure that situations like the one with McCartney and Marturano don't happen again.

"The lion's share" of work has been done, said Gibson, and now it needs to be continually monitored to ensure its success.

No settlement has been reached with Marturano, though Gibson said the board is open to hearing a fair settlement offer.

Other than the civil suit, the Albany County District Attorney's office looked into whether or not criminal charges were applicable in the case. The office declared in late June 2006 that it would not pursue charges against the two administrators because neither man's actions were considered criminal.

place Deputy Supervisor Dan Plummer as interim supervisor or promote a qualified town official to the position.

Plummer said he was not in the position to assume the full-time responsibility that the duties of supervisor require and that it was in the best interest of the town to make the appointment of a qualified official immediately.

In his comments before moving to adopt the resolution to appoint Cunningham, Plummer said that he thought Cunningham would make an excellent town supervisor, citing his roots in the community, his judgment and work ethic.

Board member Kyle Kotary, a Democrat, echoed Plummer's sentiments, calling Cunningham an "active community leader" who possesses exceptional experience and leadership abilities.

"I think we had a great leader over the last couple of years, and I think we'll have a great leader over the next couple of years," said Kotary.

Sam Messina, an Independent, said when he was deciding to accept a role as a town board member, a friend offered this piece of advice: "If you want

to be on the board, do it only if you're interested in service."

Messina said that friend was Jack Cunningham.

Messina said he reviewed Cunningham's resume in preparation for the April 12 appointment, and what struck him about Cunningham was his schooling, "top-notch experience" and his continued professional and personal growth.

Board member JoAnn Dawson, an Independent, kept her comments brief, but said she was confident Cunningham had the capacity and experience to serve as supervisor.

In accepting his new position, Cunningham said he is committed to ensuring Egan's goals of protecting the quality of life in the town and ensuring smart growth. Cunningham said one of his primary goals would be to use his experience as an IT professional to streamline technology in government offices to reduce costs and increase efficiency. Another one of Cunningham's stated goals, he said, is to see the proposed Vista Technology Park in Slingerlands through to its conclusion.

"I think everyone here agrees that Terri sets a very high standard and is a tough act to follow," said Cunningham. "I hope that I meet all your expectations in my role as town supervisor."

Skiing is believing for disabled vets

Man joins fellow veterans on the slopes

Andrew Treventi, 49, of Loudonville has been confined to a wheelchair for 10 years.

He has been skiing for the past five.

Every year Treventi joins hundreds of veterans from throughout the country to meet at Snowmass Village, Colo., for the National Disabled Veterans Winter Sports Clinic.

It's a program co-sponsored by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and Disabled American Veterans.

In its 21st year, the clinic brings disabled veterans from World War II through each American conflict till the present day. Some veterans at this year's event have yet to be discharged from military service in Afghanistan and Iraq.

"The real nice thing about it is that you see people there every

year and meet people all the time," said Treventi. "It's real big. It's something to look forward to all the time, and it helps in rehabilitation."

Treventi is a Navy veteran, having served from 1975 to 1979 as an aviation hydraulic mechanic. Somewhere and sometime during his service, he may have been exposed to something that triggered multiple sclerosis, Treventi said.

Treventi was discharged from the Navy and worked at the Watervliet Arsenal as a mechanic for a number of years, until his condition worsened.

His condition is considered service-related because he was stricken with the disorder within seven years of exiting the Navy. He was classified as disabled.

Since becoming confined to a wheelchair 10 years ago, Treventi has become active in a number of sports. As a member of Team Albany Adaptive Sports, an organization mostly made up of disabled vets, he bowled, lifted weights, did scuba diving and

eventually took up skiing at area resorts.

He uses a special sled that rides on a single or double ski. He uses outriggers to steer and stabilize himself. He mostly keeps to trails within his skill level, he said.

This year, 370 disabled veterans of World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf and nearly 100 vets of the ongoing Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts took to the slopes in Colorado. Their conditions range from amputations to diseases linked to their wartime service.

"For us, it continues the Veteran Affairs' mission of rehabilitation and self development post injury or illness. It's for disabled vets who used to enjoy winter sports who haven't since becoming disabled," said Jenny Tankersley Ballou, spokeswoman for the event.

The event, which takes place the first week of April every year, is key to the rehabilitation of disabled veterans, she said. Many

are able to sit down and share their stories of wars past and how they have come to live with their injuries.

It's an opportunity to get out of their respective towns and hospitals from around the country and open some doors, said Tankersley Ballou. It shows them they can still enjoy their lives and ski, she said.

"There are ways to do just about anything you want to," Treventi said. "If you put your mind to it, there isn't a whole lot you can't do, no matter how bad you think you are."







Public hears Route 7 bridge update plans

Engineers propose lighted, multi-lane intersection at Exit 6 in Latham

Residents, landowners and business owners who live and work along Troy Schenectady Road took advantage of a two-hour open house Tuesday, April 10, to review the state's proposal to raze the Interstate 87 Exit 6 bridge and replace it by 2010.

The work, slated to begin spring 2008, will involve the regrading of Route 7 west of the bridge to match the new

structure that will be roughly 4 feet higher than the existing structure.

Over the course of the bridge's 48 years in use, several trucks have struck the underside of it when traveling on I-87.

The state Department of Transportation fielded public comments last week on the proposal, which will affect a stretch of the thoroughfare extending from the entrance to Latham Farms Shopping Center to west of the bridge ending at Wade Road.

In all, the work will encompass a half-mile corridor.

Work will include new sidewalks and medians. Due to the size and scope of the work, the project is calling for a number of permanent and temporary easements of properties along the corridor. The state is currently in negotiations with owners of the Subway Shop at 679 Troy Schenectady Road and Medicine, a doctor's office east of the bridge at the entrance to Latham Farms. Both properties are being eyed for demolition.

The new bridge and update of the corridor has long been needed, said some at the meeting.

"It's something that needed to be done a long time ago," said Charles Guptill, 66, owner of Guptill's Arena on Route 9.

Guptill came to the meeting at the town's Public Operations Building with a bird's-eye view photo of the area taken on March 21, 1954. Guptill once owned more than 70 acres in the area, which he sold most of in 1960. He still

owns a small portion off of Route 7.

"This is going to eliminate some of the traffic. It's quite a task to do because there is no good time to do it. But if they can build the tunnels in Boston, they can build this," Guptill said.

This being the Single Point Urban Exchange, or SPUI.

The SPUI will be a first for engineers C l o u g h Harbour & Associates and a first for the DOT. Similar designs have been built outside Phoenix, Ariz., and the Mall of America in Minneapolis, Minn., but an elevated SPUI would be the first of its kind in the United States.

The proposed SPUI design for Exit 6 would include be a nine-lane interchange controlled by two rows of traffic lights on the same rotation.

Unlike the current expanded diamond design of the existing bridge, the SPUI will incorporate multiple turn lanes to access I-87 simultaneously. Its major difference: All ramps converge and diverge at the single intersection. By using one traffic rotation and the turning lanes, the congestion between Wade Road and the bridge, and subsequent back-ups east of the bridge, will be eliminated.

Eastbound traffic accessing I-87 south will have three turning lanes, while westbound accessing I-87 north will have two turning

lanes. The initial design also calls for two through traffic lanes, west and eastbound.

Work will also include landscape enhancements and a proposed raised median

between Wade Road and Forts Ferry Road. Auxiliary lanes on I-87 will also be built for both north and southbound traffic traveling between exits 5 and 6.

The open house

meeting was done in conjunction with a formal public hearing in regard to the properties that would need to be taken through eminent domain if the proposal goes through as is, said Dan Moore project manager for the DOT.

The SPUI design was selected in part for its ability to safely and effectively move large volumes of traffic, he said. However, it was also selected because the limited impact it would have on surrounding property owners. Other proposals would need to take much more property, including homes, to be built.

"We wanted to make it as easy as possible for everyone to get the most information out of the meeting," said Moore.

After taking last week's public comments at the meeting, the comment period will remain open until Friday, April 20.

The project carries a price tag of \$28 million. Of that, the state will pay \$6 million of in bonds, and federal money will cover the rest, said Moore.



Water, water everywhere

A classic nor'easter hit the Capital District over the weekend, but with above-freezing temperatures, the storm triggered rising waters rather than growing snow banks. With 1.65 inches of precipitation on Sunday and rain still falling on Monday, streams swelled, pipes burst, lawns harbored puddles the size of ponds, and storm water spilled across roads and into basements around Bethlehem. Flood warnings remained in effect on Monday for Albany County.

Crews from the town's Department of Public Works began their workweek managing two sewer main breaks.

"We've installed bypass pumps around the broken portions," said Public Works Commissioner Oliver Holmes. "We'll repair them in a couple of days, after the rain has stopped."

It's not the worst storm the town has had, but with snowmelt over the last couple of weeks, the ground is fairly

saturated. As a result, the storm drainage system experienced significant loading, said Holmes.

Storm sewers were "pretty well filled up," Holmes said. Sewage pipes also were taking on a lot of water, in part from residents' sump pumps collectively filling the system.

"One house had a hole in the foundation and water was just pouring through it. ... It's rare that we get this much rain."

Town crews spent the day traveling around town and monitoring the situation, said Holmes. At the top of the list were the 39 sewer pump

stations, where checks ensure there's no overflow or power loss.

As of Monday afternoon, despite localized flooding, the system held steady, helped in part by a break in the rain earlier that morning.

"It's pretty well under control," said Holmes. "Although it's a little chaotic."

Plumbers experienced a different deluge, in the form of calls from area homeowners.

"It started around 7 or 8 last night [Sunday], and just continued through the night," said Randy Rowe of Farrell



Brothers.

Either sump pumps had failed or drains were plugged. Rowe said they've helped people who've never had water in the basement before, and those whose sump pumps were working, but couldn't keep up with the volume of water.

"One house had a hole in the foundation and water was just pouring through it," he said.

It's not unusual to tackle flooding problems in the spring, but it is unusual how it happened this week. "Usually it's two factors like an inch of rain and a foot of snow on the ground," that team up to cause problems, said Rowe. "It's rare that we get this much rain."

Plumbers were busy

installing new sump pumps and snaking drainage pipes. For systems that were working but overwhelmed, Rowe prescribed temporary fixes to drain more volume with additional hoses.

"We do whatever needs to be done to keep the basement from flooding," he said.

With so many finished basements, homeowners have more to protect from water damage. Rowe recommends that homeowners check their pumps when flood warnings prevail.

"Pour a bucket of water in and see if it's working," he said. Or call your plumber to check it out.





Summer camps let athletes try out different sports

Despite the fact that winter extended well into spring this year, summer is fast approaching, and with it the time-honored tradition of summer camps. The Capital District has a wide variety of summer camp offerings that are as general or specific as camps and their parents want to get. Many opt for a wide variety of options and activities throughout the day; others seek a more narrow focus.

Young athletes who are looking to improve upon their existing athletic abilities often want to hone skills that are sport-specific. While those camps have valuable attributes, several area camps devoted to specific areas offer up an opportunity to take those same athletes out of their comfort zone to try some new component of the sport or immerse themselves more deeply in areas of the sport they typically would not have access to during traditional practices or lessons.

"We try and bring new things to them that we don't normally do during the year," said Danielle Cuzdey, owner and co-director of

The World of Dance in Colonie. During the summer, The World of Dance offers camps that allow the students to try out and experience dance.

The camps are open to both experienced and non-experienced dancers. Children, ages 4 to 12 who have limited dance experience, can explore many different forms of dance, from hip hop to ballet, including tap and jazz. Throughout the week, the campers will learn new skills and dance routines. On Friday, parents and relatives are invited to a show put on by the students to show off what they have learned.

In addition to dancing, the campers will also play games, create fun crafts and see dance movies.

A second camp is a dance-intensive workshop designed for intermediate to advanced dancers age 9 and up who have a minimum

of four years dance experience. This camp offers these experienced dancers a chance to hone their skills, providing technique classes in leaps, turns and combinations in an atmosphere Cuzdey said is without pressure.

Cuzdey, along with her co-director Barb Pregont, who also happens to be her mother, has been teaching dance for the past 17 years. Her mother has been training dancers for more than 35 years. Between the two of them they have taught students who have gone on to win World Tap Dancing titles and numerous regional and national titles.

One student is currently touring in "Hair Spray" and another child is now in London, getting ready to debut in the musical "Billy Elliot," written by Elton John.

The students who come to the mother and daughter team can expect to learn new moves and perfect the skills they already have.

"There are new steps and new ideas that they can take away from the camp," she said.

Cuzdey added that the camps reinforce valuable skills outside of dancing, including "learning

structure, respect, and responsibility."

Master instructor Robert Rice of Guilderland Martial Arts agrees that sports offer an opportunity to educate children on a multitude of levels, beyond the obvious sports related skills.

"Martial arts enriches their character while helping them improve physical attributes," said Rice. He said students learn to be leaders, explore team dynamics, and improve their social skills by participating in martial arts.

Rice offers themed camps throughout the summer, and creates a curriculum around the topic. One possible theme for this summer is movie stunt fighting. The camp provides training time, but also includes outside recreation, field trips, arts and crafts, as well as a lot of games. The program is very interactive, he said with a student instructor ratio of 15-to-1.

"This is a way to try martial arts in a fun way," said Rice. "It is not as intimidating."

Rice said that camps are an easy and non-threatening way for children who think they have an interest in Tae Kwon Do to test the waters. For current students who regularly practice the sport, camps provide a means to increase practice time and hone their skills.

"Regular students who come to camp usually make extra progress, allowing them to test for

the next level sooner or do a better job when they do test," said Rice. Practicing of basic skills allows them to focus on details.

At Peaceful Acres Horse Farm, riding skills are taught but take a back seat to the other things that owner, Nanci Beyrl, believes are important for children to learn. Beyrl wants the campers to leave feeling empowered, confident in their decision-making ability and with improved self-esteem.

"Riding is almost secondary," she said. "We want them to have fun." Beyrl is certified in equine assisted psychotherapy. This is a method encouraged by the Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association (EGLA) that uses horses as tools for emotional growth and learning.

"Kids get a lot of individual attention," said Beyrl of Peaceful Acres.

With only eight students each week the campers are divided into groups based on riding ability. Campers range in age from 8 to 16 years old. Beyrl said that older students often serve as mentors and team building comes naturally as camp progresses.

Camp is an all-day event each week, and campers are able to attend for consecutive weeks. Beyrl said that in addition to being able to ride a horse, the students also learn valuable lessons about taking care of the animals.

"They know horse ownership isn't showing up to a saddled horse and riding for an hour," said Beyrl. "It's about responsibility and caring for something you love. It is a long day. The kids are exhausted when they are done."

The senior staff at Peaceful Acres is EGLA trained. In addition to offering traditional camp to individual children Beyrl has also partnered with a variety of youth organizations, most who deal with "at-risk" populations, to provide several camp sessions each summer designed specifically for them.

"Every kid needs to be empowered. We need to build resilience in kids," she said. "By building resilience we're lessening their risk factors."





Scott O'Donnell goofs off at work.

O'Donnell, the boss clown for Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus, calls his job "the best in the world," and said it's what he was born to do. "As a kid, I just always appreciated comedy," O'Donnell said, citing some of his influences as Red Skelton and Jerry Lewis.

"I didn't come from an affluent family by any means," said the Barrie, Ontario, native. "The idea that the circus traveled all over and came into a town for a day or two and made people happy was very exciting to me. That they disappeared in the middle of the night — that was also very romantic, I thought."

Now marking the 18th year in his clown career, O'Donnell has worked for nearly every major circus in North America, not only as a clown, but also as a ringmaster, dog trainer and even an owner of Vidbel's Old Tyme Circus in Windham.

In his role as boss clown, O'Donnell serves as "doyenne, mentor and guidance counselor," admitting that his approach - that all minds together are better than one - sometimes needs to be balanced with the fact that "when you put a lot of clowns together in a room, you don't always get much accomplished."

What Ringling Bros. has accomplished, though, is presenting what they call "the circus for the iPod generation." They've done away with the traditional three-ring circus, instead using one massive ring to showcase the circus' talent. The new show also includes a 24-foot-in-diameter LED video screen, which allows audiences to get closer to the action, transforms the arena atmosphere, and gives everyone a chance to be part of the show.

"By moving beyond the three-ring format, Ringling Bros. is giving its human and animal performers a circus-sized playground in which to entertain families," said

Despite the light-hearted nature of his work, O'Donnell said there is a risky aspect to the job.

"If we're doing our job right, you haven't seen the little slips — the circus behind the circus is what I call it. If we've done our job well, people will look at us and say, 'What

you do is the easiest thing in the circus,'" said O'Donnell. "But I call us the real daredevils of the circus. With the animal acts, there is that 'cutesy' factor built in; with the daredevil acts, there is that 'wow' factor involved.

But with us, you're either going to get a laugh or you're not. When you do, you couldn't feel better. When you don't, you couldn't feel more lonely."

In a travelling city — complete with a school, daycare, and two nuns for spiritual guidance — loneliness isn't a big concern for O'Donnell.


"It's the great honor of being in the circus family. I mean, we're 300-plus strong now, and it's pretty cool to have 80 brothers and sisters from China," said O'Donnell. "I mean, who gets that opportunity?"



a member of the CBA elite, it was a more natural choice than the ABA (which, coincidentally, has franchises in places like Buffalo, Cape Cod, Brooklyn, Montreal and Vermont).

The second misstep — though no one knew it at the time — was hiring Richardson. Though Richardson did a good job coaching the team this season, his success may have fueled his ego. During the second half of the season, Richardson butted heads with Coyne several times over decisions both personal (going to the NBA All-Star Game) and personnel, and then he made some racist comments during the CBA finals that earned him a league suspension and cost him his job. Perhaps Richardson should have remembered that his role as head coach is to go along with upper management's wishes and just talk about the game.

The third misstep was making the Pats a two-league team. By joining the USBL — another far-flung, eight-team league — Coyne and Fernandez were probably

hoping to make a few extra dollars in revenue and keep the Armory hopping through June. But spring is hardly the season people want to go inside to watch basketball (of course, if it keeps raining ...), especially if it's not at the same level as the CBA. Maybe people will warm up to the USBL Pats, but it's a long shot at best.

With all that has happened in the two years since the team was resurrected, it's only logical to question how long the Pats can survive in Albany. After all, the CBA hasn't shown any signs of being a stable league. It had one team, Utah, suspend operations after 16 games and cut its playoff format because of a lack of available arena space two weeks before the end of the season.

The competition for Albany sports fans' dollars is also much higher than it was back in the Patroons' heydays. College basketball has gained a large following with the success of Siena and the University at Albany. Section II basketball's profile has risen to the point where an average of 5,000 people show up for the boys class AA championship game. And let's not forget the Albany River Rats, who averaged more than 4,000 per home game.

But if the CBA survives for another season and the Patroons remain at or near the top of the standings, there is a chance to make the franchise as lucrative as the days when people jammed the Armory 23 years ago to watch Jackson's crew win the title.

Sadly, it may take Jackson's return to do it, and I seriously doubt he's going to leave Los Angeles to coach in Albany.

Eagles ride roller coaster

The Bethlehem boys lacrosse team has the offense to compete with any Section II team.

The defense is another story.

The Eagles (4-3) got on a good run last week with victories over Shenendehowa, Colonie and Schenectady, but their defense couldn't hold up in a 16-15 non-

league loss to Queensbury Saturday.

"When the Schenectady game was rescheduled to Friday night, I knew that would be a problem for us because 10 hours was not going to be enough rest to face a team like Queensbury," said Bethlehem coach Dave Rounds. "But we still battled them all the way."

The Eagles have one of the best offenses in the section this year. They are averaging nearly 13 goals per game, including a 14.5 goals per game average in their last four games.

Defense has been the area where Bethlehem has struggled. Opponents are averaging 10 goals per game against the Eagles.

"Coming into the season, we knew defense was going to be a concern for us because we weren't returning a lot of players," said Rounds. "We're scoring goals, but we're also giving up a lot of goals."

Bethlehem's best defensive effort came last Monday in a 15-6 Suburban Council victory over Shen. The Eagles limited the Plainsmen to one goal in each of the first three quarters as they

built a 13-3 lead.

But Bethlehem's schizophrenic nature showed up in last Wednesday's 12-13 victory over Colonie. The Eagles jumped out to a 5-0 first quarter lead, but Colonie bounced back with six consecutive goals to push in front. The lead went back and forth before Bethlehem regained command in the fourth quarter.


"What hurt us (against Colonie) was their first goal was created by a mental mistake on our part. They stole a clearing attempt and scored," said Rounds.

Patroons adrift in area sports scene

Twenty-three years ago, an up-and-coming coach by the name of Phil Jackson took the Albany Patroons to the Continental Basketball Association championship.

Today, Jackson is a hall of fame coach in Los Angeles. The Patroons — on the other hand — are anything but a hall of fame franchise.



As Vince Lombardi once asked, "What the hell is going on here?"

What happened is the reincarnation of the Patroons as both a CBA and a United States Basketball League (USBL) franchise has been a flop — lost in a sea of high-grade high school and college basketball programs, a minor league hockey team and a college mer's lacrosse team that may have a shot at a national title.

Sure, Jim Coyne and Ben Fernandez have done their best to make the Patroons as successful as they were back in the 1980s. They bought and refurbished the Washington Avenue Armory to make it look much nicer than it was when the Pats first played there in 1982. They stocked the roster with such players as Jamarion Moon, Felipe Lopez, Kwan Johnson and Kareem Reid. They hired Micheal Ray Richardson and former Patroon Derrick Rowland to coach the team.

But Coyne and Fernandez made some missteps along the way.

The first was when they put the Patroons back in the CBA, which

at the time was a shell of the league the Pats left in the mid-1990s. Not only was the CBA still stinging from its plunge into bankruptcy after Isaiah Thomas' reign as league commissioner (side note: why does everything that Thomas touches turn bad), but it was also in direct competition with two other minor leagues — the American Basketball Association and the NEA's Developmental League.

Given the far-flung nature of the eight-team CEA (Yakama and Minot aren't anywhere near Albany, let alone each other), it was hardly an ideal league to join from a geographical standpoint. But given Albany's traditional role as

Local government offers citizens a chance for involvement

As more candidates step into the ring for a presidential election that is more than a year away, political promises and positions are rampant. But all the focus on the national political arena can take the spotlight off the people who make decisions every day that have a direct effect on people's lives — local elected leaders.

Often, local politicians are more accessible than national ones, but many citizens don't take advantage of that direct line to the political process.

Some simply don't know where to start.

"I think people should try to educate themselves about what the issues are; what kind of government we have," said Valerie Keehn, mayor of Saratoga Springs.

The City of Saratoga Springs functions under a commission-style form of government, while many other municipalities in the region have a town board, which includes a supervisor.

Regardless of their form of government — based on a commission like Saratoga Springs, or featuring a town board and supervisor — each municipality has regularly scheduled meetings that are open to the public. Most meetings offer people a chance to share their opinions and ask questions.

Municipalities differ in how they take public comments so it pays to know the procedure. Some offer a comment period at the beginning and end of each meeting, while others offer it only once. Some place no limitation on the public comment session, while others limit the number of minutes each person can speak.

"I think one of the fairly easy things to do is to come to a city council meeting," said Keehn. "The agenda is usually online."

Our town online

Like Saratoga Springs, many municipalities have their own Web sites. Even the barest Web sites provide the names of the town's elected officials and appointed department heads, and some sites include a means to contact them. There are also listings for government offices in the front of local telephone books.

Many towns, including Clifton Park, offer detailed Web sites that allow residents to view meeting agendas and minutes of past meetings.

In Clifton Park, the minutes are usually available about two weeks after the meeting.

"The minutes will not be on the Web site until they are approved by the town board," said Patricia O'Donnell, clerk for Clifton Park, explaining the lag time.

O'Donnell said that resolutions passed by the town board may be picked up any time in the town clerk's office. The resolutions passed by the board provide information on the action taken, but meeting minutes reflect the discussion of board members, town staff, and the public that took place before the resolution was passed.

In many cases, that background information may be as important as the resolution.

Beyond the board

In addition to the town board, there are a host of other boards and committees, such as planning and zoning board of appeals, that assist in shaping the laws and developments within a town.

In most municipalities these boards are staffed by citizens who spend a significant amount of time preparing for these meetings. Eligibility to serve on the boards typically

only requires residency in the municipality; however some boards ask applicants to have relevant professional history and may mandate some form of training.

The planning boards review projects coming into the town's building and planning departments and make sure that the proposals meet town code. All planning board meetings are open to the public.

Public participation in the process varies by town, but those towns that pride

in small print.

Keehn said residents should not rely on the legal notices or the newspaper headlines to formulate their opinions.

"They (reporters) try to hit the highlights, but so much is lost in interpretation," said Keehn.

She said she encourages residents to use newspaper articles as one source of information, but suggests they go beyond the story and seek out the document or information they are looking for and ask an expert on the subject if they can.

"Don't rely on someone else to tell you what to think," said Keehn. "Getting

involved is really, really important."

Heather Mallozzi, director of building and planning for the town of Malta, said the town keeps its Web site updated and sends out regular newsletters, but residents also need to educate themselves about the town's business.

"It is really important for residents to keep up to date on town happenings," Mallozzi said. "People should be aware of the town's comprehensive plan so that people know what the vision is for the entire town."

Typically, comprehensive plans are developed over a period of time under the direction of a volunteer committee, a professional engineering firm and public input.

"Specifically, people should be aware of their neighborhood as identified in the comprehensive plan. Residents should also be aware of the overlay districts and what standards are in place, as well as

themselves on "open government" often allow residents to comment or ask questions throughout the process rather than just at designated public hearings.

There are requirements that dictate how public notification of projects must be made, and in most municipalities this simply requires a legal notice to be put into the official newspaper.

Typically, each January the municipalities have organizational meetings at which time they announce what committees the town has, who will serve on them, where the town will do its banking, and other seemingly minute details of town business. At that time, the town will also designate one or two area papers as the "official" newspaper. Any legal notices or announcements will be sent to these newspapers for publication. Legal notices tend to be placed in the classifieds section of the paper and

any linkage studies that show trail and roadway connections," said Mallozzi. "Open space and recreation plans are also very important for people to be aware of."

These plans are typically approved by the town board and are available for review in the planner's office and town clerk's office, with the associated maps.

Residents who look at their town's list of committees may be surprised at what they find. Many towns have committees related to veterans, trails, people with disabilities, historical preservation, seniors and young people. Most were formed as a result of citizens identifying the need for such a group to exist. These committees offer recommendations to the town board.

Where to start

For general town questions, the town clerk's office is a likely source of information.

O'Donnell said all town clerks perform the same basic job, although some also serve as tax collector.

The clerk's office is responsible for "tons of research" and a variety of licenses she said.

One of the many licenses they hand out is for peddlers. O'Donnell said anyone coming to a person's door selling something should be able to produce a town license signed by the clerk.

Additionally, she said, new residents typically interact with the clerk's office as their first association with the town. The town clerk is able to provide information about dog licensing, notary services and the schedule of town meetings and public hearings.

"That's what we're here for," O'Donnell said. "To answer questions and help in any way we can."

tions that broadcast meetings," said Goldman.

It is not uncommon for "regulars" at town meetings to run for office.

In Scotia, Jerry Moore has been attending board of education meetings since 1999. He has run for the board in previous years, including just last year. He often takes the floor during the meetings to voice his opinions regarding the Scotia-Glenville Central School District.

"I began attending school board meetings because system and staff concerns almost always trumped the concerns of parents and the community. That has changed throughout the entire organization, and board members are now far more willing not just to consider, but also to use the concerns of others in making their decisions," said Moore.

Moore said he feels residents are missing their ability to make positive change. He feels the dynamics with local government

have changed for the better and is now more about open communication.

"It takes more time and effort (to attend), but it generates the kind of good will that saves time and avoids conflict in the future. There is more of a can-do attitude. 'Customer satisfaction' has greater weight today," said Moore.

Community members who take part in local government seem to have one thing in common: a love for their hometowns. Even when they feel their local officials are making the choices they may or may not agree with, they seem to have a great sense of civilian responsibility.

"Sometimes I am much more active than others, depending on the cause and the fluidity of the administration. You always know when there is a hot topic because the room is filled with new faces who otherwise never attend the meetings. What people need to know is that it's those other meetings that lead up to the big decision makers that everyone comes out for. No matter what, I am thankful for the opportunity to be able to have my voice heard," said Goldman.
