





Slain trooper had local roots

Delmar church holds funeral for officer killed in firefight

Several thousand mourners, including a large contingent of New York State Troopers, were expected to be in Bethlehem at 11 a.m. Wednesday, May 2, for the funeral of fallen trooper David C. Brinkerhoff at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

Brinkerhoff was killed Wednesday, April 25, outside a farmhouse in Margaretville, Delaware County, while searching

for 23-yearold shooting suspect Travis D. Trim. Trim was hiding out in the secluded property after shooting another state trooper, Matthew Gombosi, the day before.

Brinkerhoff, an eight-and-a-half-year veteran of the state police, and member of the unit's elite Mobile Response Team, was shot once in the chest by Trim and once in the back of the head by a bullet believed to come from a member of the team that sur-





town boards tried to form a comprehensive plan, but it did not receive approval until former Supervisor Theresa Egan took over.

"It was clear the community was screaming for this when Terri became supervisor," Plummer said.

Leveille wrote that the new committee would create what he called a "blueprint for action." One of those actions could possibly include a partnership with the Albany County Land Conservancy to initiate development of a greenway recreational trail network.

Meetings of the newly formed oversight committee will take place from May through July and draft recommendations for consideration by the board will be held in July. A final report is expected to be prepared and published by late August or early September.

New phone features produce frazzled feeling

Last year a salesman rang my front door bell. He wanted to talk to me about getting a new phone service. I didn't really know or care much about what he was talking about. I was on my way out. I told the man I was not interested.

Then the man named one of my neighbors and told me they already had the service. He must have thought this revelation was going to incite in me some sort of "keeping up with the Joneses" (not the neighbor's real name) desire to install it. It didn't.

"I'm happy with my phone service as is," I told the man, knowing vaguely that whatever he was selling had something to do with the phones.

Many months later, my husband and I realized we were paying a ridiculous sum for long-distance service we rarely used because we used our cell phone. This led my husband to research telephone service options, which led him to the service we'd been offered.

I remember the day the new service was installed. The phone rang during our frantic morning routine. Who could be calling while we were trying to get off to work?

"It's the phone company," said my daughter, handing the cordless phone into the bathroom.

"We're on our way to install the (phone service)," said the man from the phone company.

"You're on your way?" I asked, wishing my daughter had passed the cordless phone into the upstairs bathroom where her dad was shaving. I had an idea that he was behind this installation. I wondered if it would prevent people from calling while I was in the bathroom.

I found my way upstairs where we had our first new phone service skirmish.

"The phone company is coming in 15 minutes," I reported curtly to my husband.

"They told me they'd be



coming after 9," he said.

I explained that they must have changed their minds. I clearly heard, "15 minutes" even over our old line.

It was school break week and Jeff was supposed to be dropping off our daughter at a program downtown. I was supposed to be getting to work on time. But now he had to be home for the phone company. I was going to have to take care of the drop-off.

Our second phone service skirmish was about "call waiting," a bonus feature that came "free" with the new service.

I don't care for call waiting. First off, the name is misleading. It should be referred to as "call interruption."

With call waiting, you can toggle back and forth between two calls. It works as follows: While you are on the first call a second call comes in. You hear a beep or a click and you can switch over to the second call and say, "Hi. I'm on another call," and then switch back to the first

The original way to tell people you were already on the phone was via an automated feature called the busy signal.

I understand the value of call waiting, but as an adult I just want to be able to finish a conversation uninterrupted. I only want to talk to one person at a time. I don't want to toggle back and forth between two calls.

My parents got call waiting when I was a teenager because I was always talking on the phone. The few people who might have tried to call my paren—ts, such as my older siblings or other relatives, would only get busy signals. Mom and Dad thought call waiting would fix this problem.

However, teenagers don't want to interrupt their conversations to answer calls When we paid by the minute we were more efficient about our calls. We didn't waste time on the phone. We had to choose our words carefully. We had to break off and say goodbye for things like food and sleep.

from people other than their friends. When I was a teenager I would often forget to tell my parents that someone "beeped in." Worse yet, sometimes I would switch over to the new call and tell the person to hold on. Then I'd switch back intending to say goodbye to my friend, but then my friend would say she had "one more thing to tell me." I'd completely forget about the other person.

If I was on the phone with my sister, she would refuse to be put on hold if a second call came in. She'd say, "No, I'm not hanging on, I'm hanging up if you're switching to the other call." As a teenager it was difficult to ignore the incoming call and face the possibility of missing news from a friend

Of course, that was before caller ID. Now you know who is calling before you even answer the phone. Now you can decide who is worthy of interrupting your dinner or making you late when you are on the way out the door.

Some phones not only display a caller's name and telephone number, but also have computerized voices that will say the name. It's like having an automated servant announce who is calling.

I wonder if there's a way to shout back at the phone "We're eating dinner now, please call again later" and have the automated voice relay the message to the caller.

In our house the automated servant is called an answering machine. Amazingly this machine allows you to hear the caller's voice

We only use the machine to screen out telemarketers (who usually just hang up on the machine) or to record calls while we are eating dinner.

Sometimes my parents will leave a message that begins with "If you're there, pick up the phone." Well, obviously we can't pick up the phone if we're NOT there. I feel bad that my parents think I would screen out their calls. I would feel much too guilty to screen out my parents.

When I was younger, I tied up their phone line, neglected to give them their messages, and ran up their bills by calling out-of-town friends. And I don't remember feeling terribly guilty about that.

I do remember trying to make the long distance calls when the rates went down. In those days we paid by the minute. I'd call the operator and ask for the rates to the area code I was calling. The operator would give the information, such as "26 cents for the first minute and 14 cents for each additional minute."

When we paid by the minute

we were more efficient about our calls. We didn't waste time on the phone. We had to choose our words carefully. We had to break off and say goodbye for things like food and sleep.

My new plan includes unlimited long distance. You pay a bunch of money up front instead of getting billed later by the minute. Somehow this worked out to be less expensive than the plan where I paid by the minute even though I didn't use any minutes.

Unfortunately this "savings" was offset by the fact that the Internet connection over the fiber line initially failed a lot. This led to our third phone service skirmish.

"We should've found out if the Joneses were satisfied with their FiOS connections," I told my husband.

Again the phone rang early one weekday morning. This time I knew it was the phone company. They came over and fixed the Internet connection issue. We all breathed a sigh of relief.

On the other hand, maybe having less access to e-mail was a blessing in disguise. After all, without the Internet access we would have had the time to make all those unlimited long-distance calls.



Cultures don't have to clash

The writer is a transplant from London, England, via a short spell in Florida. She lives in Guilderland with her family and is currently on a career break to raise two young children.

Look around your neighborhood and I bet you will have seen some new faces and heard different, non-American accents over the past few years. The population of the Capital District is slowly becoming more diverse and multicultural.

I live in Guilderland, and I have neighbors from India, China and Cyprus. According to the Census 2000 demographic profile of my ZIP code, 12 percent of the people surveyed are foreign born and 15.5 percent speak a language other than English at home. My friends in the Capital District include people from Sri Lanka, St. Kitts, England and South Korea. I say hooray for this influx! Why? Because, I am one of the foreigners.

I have often wondered how the people I have met from all corners of the world ended up here in the Capital District. I guess my own odyssey serves as an example. I immigrated to the United States for love because my husband (a fellow British Chinese person) was offered a job in Albany after his postdoctoral stint in Florida. I responded by saying: "Where the heck is Albany?" immediately followed by some frantic Googling. (Forgive me, but my knowledge of U.S. geography at this point was limited, and I was hesitant about moving to a smaller place, coming from the metropolis of London, England.)

Up to that moment, I had a stereotypical image of America gleaned from television and movies. I remember sitting in the food court at a mall in Florida staring at my large plate

of food and feeling very American.

My education into all things American began in earnest when we came to Albany. When you settle in another country, it is as if you are a child again, learning and stumbling through your dayto-day existence.

Consider all the layers of daily life - from writing a check to mailing a letter – things that are second nature to you but, now, presented as something alien. Imagine what it would be like if you had to relearn everything. From doing battle with your health insurance company, when you are used to a universal health-care system, to learning about the education systemwhen you grew up in a school system where sixth grade is called the first year of secondary school.

All the while, you have to remember to slow down your speech when making inquiries, knowing that you will have to repeat yourself, and anticipating the look of surprise as people hear the British accent come out of your mouth.

Many moments are etched in my memory as I recall the initial shock of adjusting to life here in the United States.

Grocery shopping was certainly an adventure for me. Everything seemed bigger over here, and there were more choices - I remember being overwhelmed by the sheer amount and endless variety of cereal on offer. I would hang around the customer service desk seeking a translation for the produce I needed. We may as well be speaking another language when I have to substitute zucchini for courgetté, eggplant for auberginé and heavy cream for double cream.

Although we are supposed to share a common language, The Queen's English and American English have many differences, which can lead to misunderstandings.

The line: "You like tomato and I like tomahto" from the Cole Porter song "Let's Call the Whole Thing Off" sums it up for me. I am reminded of a meeting at work where it was agreed to table a proposal. I was confused when we came to the end of the meeting and the proposal had not been raised. You see, in the United Kingdom, "to table something" means that you are putting forward an item for discussion.

As if it wasn't daunting enough for me to acclimate to a different work culture, getting to my new workplace in Troy was an even more daunting prospect. Until I came to America, it was normal for me to use public transportation, having lived in a city all my (called the tube) into work. I common.

presumed I would be able to use the bus system here. However, I became frustrated with the inaccessibility of bus routes, which required three changes of buses for me to get to work. People were surprised that I didn't drive, and I felt like a second-class citizen. Finally, after I plucked up the courage to drive on what was for me the wrong side of the road, I took all the routes that did not require left turns, unless there were traffic lights!

Undoubtedly, the hardest thing for me about moving to another country was the separation from family and friends. Right from the start, it became important for me to create a network of friends and contacts. However, meeting new friends was a hit-and-miss process. I would sit in Starbucks and smile at people in the hopes that they would talk to me. Slowly, I connected with people and made plans to socialize with

As in many cultures, going out to eat is a customary way to socialize. Yet, I found this to be intimidating. The first time I went to a diner I thought my head would explode, as my server spoke too fast and presented me with too many choices: How would I like my eggs? Scrambled, sunny-side up, over easy. ... What sort of bread would I like? White, wheat, rye. ...

There is one thing about eating out in America that irritates me and that is being given the check before I have finished my meal. In Europe, it is extremely rude for a waiter to place the check in front of you unless you asked for it first.

Now, I have a wonderful group of friends and, in the interest of cultivating cultural awareness, I have confounded them with conversions of American measures to the metric system. They have experienced an English tea party and eaten homemade, traditional Chinese food at a Chinese New Year party.

All new immigrants experience degrees of homesickness. You miss your family and friends, and reminisce about familiar things - for me, it is the British sense of humor, the media and chocolate. Adjusting to life in a new country requires moving beyond the homesickness toward acceptance of your new situation. You rise to each challenge and look for the opportunities.

Perhaps I am no different than earlier immigrants who came to this country looking for their American dream. I am creating a path for my children, who are American citizens. Despite the present geopolitical conflicts, I believe the world is getting smaller, and we can learn from one another's diversity. Please do me a favor, the next time you see your new neighbor, stop and say hello. Start a conversation, and you life. For most of my working might be pleasantly surprised life I had ridden a subway train with how much you have in

would say that the board was not properly concerned with the burdens of the taxpayers, I would respond by saying that when he/she was looking at the board he/she was looking at seven taxpayers, that any tax increase would affect board members like all other taxpayers.

Mr. Livreri mentions tax abatements, granted to some businesses. The school board has no involvement in or control over these abatements, which do NOT apply to school taxes. Similarly, the board has no control over pension costs. Every

year the state tells the district what it has to pay for pensions in the ensuing school year. And, unlike private businesses that can decide whether to absorb or pass on increases in health insurance costs, public agencies do not have this option. They have to pass these costs on to taxpayers.

Our responsibility as residents and taxpayers is to provide our children with a good education, whether our own children are in the schools or not (as ours s have not been for almost 30 years). And a good school system, making ours a desirable community, maintains the value of our homes.

Therefore, I strongly urge our

school budget on May 15.



Jones said that having had two children go through the district and one in the schools would make him a valued member of the board. He also feels the historical perspective that comes with that and having been a member of the community for nearly 20 years would be of assistance to the board.

Timothy Blow

Timothy Blow, a resident of the district since 1990, said he would like to add school board member to his service to the district.

"I think the school board is a natural progression," said Blow.

When he is not working at his job as executive vice president and chief financial officer of Ballston Spa National Bank, Blow said he volunteers as treasurer for the New Salem Fire Department, basketball coach and treasurer for St. Matthews CYO, and also has been involved with Kiwanis Little League and Guilderland Babe Ruth.

Along with his passion for helping kids, Blow said he brings to the board experience and knowledge of finance and budgeting, auditing, internal controls and more. Blow said he could use that knowledge well to serve the board.

"I'm all for improving and keeping the high-quality education Voorheesville provides," said Blow, who has one child in each of the district's three schools.

Blow said in recent years he thinks the focus of the board has been shifted and needs to move back to what's most important in the district.

"I think it's important to keep the focus back on the education of the kids," said Blow.

Blow said that, if elected, he would serve the district as best as he could with the time allotted. "I think it's something that's important to my kids as well as to the entire community," said Blow.

Sean Signer

A Voorheesville school district resident for 17 years, Sean Signer would like to use his background in technology to serve the district.

A network engineer for five years at the state health department's Women, Infants and Children Program, Signer has been a state civil servant for 31 years.

"I believe I can make a difference," said Signer, who said one of his goals is to keep Voorheesville students competitive in a global economy that increasingly leans on technology.


"It can't just be math, science and English. My priority is to make sure (children) are getting the best education possible," said Signer. It is his hope, he said, to ensure that Voorheesville children can continue their quality education after high school and move into successful careers. It is the responsibility of the school district, he said, "to make sure (children) have the right tools to do that."

Signer, a father of three, has a fifth-grade son in the district.

Signer said he believes that strong, responsible fiscal management is needed to maintain and increase the quality of education and educational programs in the district. 



County moves ahead with plans for jail annex

Facility would provide better care to inmates with mental health issues

Initial steps have been taken to begin work on a \$13.5 million annex at the Albany County

Correctional Facility.

Albany County Sheriff James Campbell, superintendent of the correctional facility Thomas Wigger and county officials met last week to plan the construction of an estimated 80-bed annex to house mental health inmates and replace four aging trailers. A plan for the annex will be sent out to area contractors May 21.

"Before the four suicides, the plan was on the drawing board. But the number of mental health inmates is on the rise. The suicides may have sped up the process a little bit."

Money for the annex has been a part of the county's capital project budget since 2005. The county had asked to put the annex on hold because of financial issues. But four suicides at the jail in the past two years and a growing population of inmates who need mental health care spurred the county into action.

"It's the right thing to do," said Campbell. "I'm looking for construction this year. The thing being held over my head is the four trailers. I've got to get them (the inmates) out of there."

.Those four trailers were installed in 1989 and were intended to last five to six years. Campbell said the trailers are falling apart and riddled with electric and plumbing problems. The 72-bed trailer annex houses inmates who are allowed to work in and outside of the jail, under supervision.

The new annex will free up space in the jail's general population, allowing those inmates

to live in better conditions. It will also move inmates under watch for mental conditions into a stateof-the-art facility that will allow staff to better watch and care for them.

Currently, the mental health wing is a 50-single-cell unit with another constant observation area elsewhere in the jail, said Wigger. Staff of the mental health wing are also located elsewhere in the jail and make routine checks on inmates many times throughout the day.

Inmates in the constant observation section of the jail are routinely exposed to general population inmates and can be subjected to taunting and ridicule, Campbell said.

They are separated in a bank of 25 cells and are under watch with one correctional officer for every four inmates. Depending on the day, the bank of cells can see two to 20 inmates under watch, said Wigger.

Wigger said jail officials would like to see an annex solely serving the mental health inmates. The annex would also be able to keep medical staff readily available and inmates in plain view.

Talks about the annex's design include a facility that provides a 360-degree view of inmates from centrally located correctional staff. That way, inmates will no longer be able to take advantage of the few minutes after officers pass their cells to attempt, and sometimes succeed, in suicide.

"Before the four suicides, the plan was on the drawing board. But, the number of mental health inmates is on the rise," said Wigger. "The suicides may have sped up the process a little bit."

What exists at the jail now is not a cohesive mental health program, he said.

rounded the house where Trim was inside.

Preston Felton, acting superintendent of the state police, said, "The medical examination on our deceased trooper, David Brinkerhoff, has revealed two things. First, that he was shot in the chest by a high-caliber round we believe was used by the assailant. This round was stopped by the trooper's protective gear. Second, that the fatal wound to the trooper was made by a .223 tactical round. This round is believed to have been fired by an MRT team member. Sadly Trooper Brinkerhoff appears to have been killed during an extremely intense firefight that occurred inside the Margaretville home."

Bethlehem was chosen as the location for services because Brinkerhoff and his wife lived in Delmar for more than three years and have been members of the local Lutheran Church since 2002. "He lived on Kenwood Avenue and was married in Bethlehem,' said town Supervisor Jack Cunningham, who was alerted late Thursday, April 26, that Brinkerhoff's funeral would be in Bethlehem.

"It's been sobering; I can't believe it," Cunningham said of the tragedythatleftBrinkerhoffdead. About 8,000 people were expected to attend the funeral, including Gov. Eliot Spitzer, who said there will be a thorough investigation with full disclosure of all facts surrounding Brinkerhoff's

ing the exact circumstances of Trooper Brinkerhoff's death," said Spitzer in a prepared state-

Brinkerhoff is survived by his wife, Barbara, and his 7month-old daughter. He and his family had attended services at Bethlehem Lutheran Church the Sunday before his death.

"My wife said that she will never forget him looking at his daughter in church and just beaming," said the Rev. Mark Mueller, pastor of Bethlehem Lutheran, who also baptized Brinkerhoff's daughter.

"He wanted to be connected to a church, and they were here quite regularly," said Mueller.

Brinkerhoff's connection to the Lutheran church began in his childhood in western New York.

"His faith was very important to him," said Mueller.

"He loved to worship here and loved the people here." Members of the Bethlehem Police Department knew Brinkerhoff well. Some even attended his wedding at Bethlehem Lutheran.

Mueller said Brinkerhoff's wife is doing her best to cope with the tragedy. 'She is strong, she has wonderful family and is doing as well as can be expected," he said.

Burial for Brinkerhoff was scheduled to be held immediately following the funeral in the village of Coxsackie at St. Mary's Cemetery.





Area potters fire up visitors in Albany County

Festival features a series of demos, displays and sales

From functional to artistic, dozens of works forged by area potters will be displayed throughout the Capital District this weekend and through

At the Shaker Heritage site in Colonie, 35 regional potters will novices a hands-on opportunity to create their own masterpieces at Pottery Fest 2007.

As one of the oldest forms of art and design, pottery is making a comeback, said Troy potter Barbara Reeley, and the Albany area has rich history in pottery and ceramics.

"There is a resurgence of people who want to get their hands in clay," said Reeley. "Most everyone has touched clay in


show off their wares and give their lifetime and want to do it again."

> On Saturday and Sunday, May 5 and 6, Reeley will showcase Raku kiln-firing, a Japanese technique that uses fire and smoke to accentuate patterns in pot glazes.

Reeley and members of the Collar City Clay Guild, an organization of Upstate sculptors and potters hosting this year's Pottery Fest, will be demonstrating the many techniques they use in their

Festivalgoers will have the opportunity to experience throwing clay on a potters wheel, sculpting and demonstrations.

If, after all the exposure, they have caught the clay-bug, then they can always catch "Earth and Fire: A Celebration of Clay and Ceramics" at the Albany Institute of Art and History in downtown Albany, which willrun until May 27. The three-part exhibit features the works of eight area potters whose forms range from functional and classic to contemporary.

The Albany Institute exhibit will feature the works of Colonie native Michael McCarthy, who for the past six years has been creating pottery pieces

out of his studio in Goshen, Mass. McCarthy's display is the culmination of 10 years of work at the wheel and kiln. His said his works are functional. The shapes are symmetrical, and each pot is made with ergonomics in mind. The handles are placed perfectly and the spouts pour flawlessly.

"I make functional work. Nobody needs what I make. You can buy it somewhere else for a lot cheaper," said McCarthy.

However, unlike assembly line pottery, his work is not cast in molds. Each work is one of a kind and displays the characteristics of a hand-thrown, wood-fired pot, he said. Even though they may just be teapots or butter trays, they are throwbacks to early designs and techniques in pottery that have been brought into the contemporary realm.

McCarthy fires an average of 1,000 pots in a year. He uses a traditional, wood-fired kiln that creates natural-looking glazes and effects, he said.

Firing takes a full day in the large kiln.

Other works, featured at both the Pottery Fest and the Albany gallery, will feature the famous Albany slip glaze. Slip is a liquid form of clay that can be used in plaster molds or as a glaze. Made of talc, ball clay and feldspar, the ingredients are taken from quarries, one of which existed in the Albany area for centuries. The Albany concourse now rests over it.

Like the resurgence in pottery Albany slip, or slip made to mimic it, is appearing on many area pieces. The signature earth tones and rich glaze it produces after firing are sought after traits in pots, both McCarthy and Reeley said.

Worldwide, Albany is known for its slip.

This year's Pottery Fest will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, May 5 and 6. Admission is \$4, with free admission for children younger than 12. The festival will be held at the Shaker Barn and Shaker Meeting House on the grounds of the Ann Lee Home on Washington Avenue in Albany.

McCarthy's works will be on display at the Albany Institute of Art and History until Sunday, May 27.



Harlem Renaissance is the focus of The Big Read

F. Scott Fitzgerald coined the term "Jazz Age" to reflect an era of ragtime, jazz, stylish automobiles and uninhibited young women with bobbed hair. This same era – the 1920s – also marked the Harlem Renaissance, the artistic, political and cultural birth of a new black voice in literature and art.

Similar renewals were happening in Chicago, Philadelphia, and Washington, D.C., especially through the influence of Louis Armstrong's and Duke Ellington's jazz.

Most of the literary Harlemites were not from New York, nor did they depict Harlem life in their writing. The decade was a creative outpouring of how black artists chose to convey their African and American heritage. Their stance was no longer one of apology or defeat, but rather of assertion and pride.

Despite still-flourishing Jim Crow laws, many white New York writers, publishers and patrons rallied behind black writers and intellectuals, who in turn vociferously protested



injustice and racism. You can read about this fascinating historical era in the novel "Their Eyes Were Watching God" by Zora Neale Hurston, which will be the topic of the adult book discussion at 7 p.m. Wednesday, May 16. Hurston's book was chosen as the hallmark of the national reading initiative called The Big Read, which is being celebrated during the month of May.

district policies for food allergies has just been returned to the floor for consideration. The bill is sponsored by Jose Rivera, D-Bronx, chairman of the Task Force on Food, Farm and Nutrition Policy.

Robert Stern, the task force's program manager, said the bill was introduced because Rivera wanted to see a plan in place to ensure that all school districts can respond adequately to problems raised by students with food allergies. The bill would direct the state health commis-

sioner to develop guidelines for

districts to use to draft policy, which would then have to be enacted in 2009.

According to FAAN, food alergic reactions result in more than 30,000 emergency room visits each year, and it is estinated that 150 to 200 people die annually from serious reactions. Twelve million Americans have ood allergies, including approxinately 2.2 million children.

In Saratoga Springs schools, parents of children who have ood allergies inform school nurses, who then tell the disrict's food service directors. Other local districts have similar plans in place.

Margaret Lamb, the school unch director in Saratoga Springs, said once she is made aware of a student with food allergies, parents are sent the menu or the month and can select alergen-free choices for their chil-Iren. When the district receives iood shipments, the food labels are scanned for required warnngs alerting service personnel to potential allergens. The most common offenders are peanuts, ree nuts (walnuts, almonds and nazelnuts), wheat, milk, eggs and soy.

If a meal includes any of these, parents are notified before selecting their meal choices. Even if foods are produced on the same manufacturing line as a potential allergen, like peanuts, the meal would be scrapped from the child's choices. If no adequate choice is available. Lamb said, a special meal could be prepared.

The Saratoga district uses other precautions, including preventing cross-contamination in the cafeteria that could occur, for instance, with serving utensils.

"We're trying to avoid someone using a scoop for peanut butter and then using it for chicken salad," said Lamb.

Similar precautions are in place in the Guilderland school

Food service Director Linda Mossop said that in addition to checking labels and choosing meals, the district offers "peanut-free classrooms." The nutfree rooms are generally those that are shared between all students, for example music and art classrooms.

Both Mossop and Lamb said

that the precautions have been successful in combating problems associated with food aller-

Kathy Oliver, head school nurse in Guilderland, said that the nursing staff is constantly discussing their approaches to the problem.

Each year there seem to be more and more students with this," said Oliver. "We try as best we can to make it a safe environment for the child."

While school districts try to ensure a healthy environment for their children, doctors and scientists are researching the causes and possible cures for the afflicted.

"At this point, scientists don't know why the immune

system decides that one harmless food is harmful and attacks it," said Anne Munoz-Furlong, founder and chief executive officer of the Food Allergy and Anaphylaxis Network. "It appears that anyone with a history of allergy to anything - dogs, pollen, inhalants - is at increased risk for de-

veloping a food allergy because their body is already 'trained' to create allergy.'

Food allergies are caused when the immune system determines proteins found in specific foods are recognized as foreign and then produces antibodies to combat the "invader." As the body fights the foreign object, symptoms such as swelling lips, stomach cramps, vomiting, rashes and breathing problems can develop.

Despite some tests that can be conducted to determine whether food allergies are present, the most reliable way, and the most common, is by noticing a reaction to a food that has already been eaten.

The key for individuals is to report any symptoms, such as lip-swelling or mouth-tingling, that are caused by a food to their physician — even if the symptoms go away on their own," said Munoz-Furlong. "These may be the early warning signs of the development of the allergy.'

Once an allergy is diagnosed, the only way for an individual to avoid a dangerous situation is to eliminate that food from his or her diet. If the food is eaten, and an anaphylactic reaction occurs. people commonly use an injection of epinephrine, an adrenaline, which is carried with them to treat severe reactions.

Experts recommend that food allergy sufferers carry an EpiPen or other treatments with them at all times. Studies have shown that children often will not carry an epinephrine injection with them, for fear of being embarrassed in front of their peers — a dangerous choice that can have serious consequences.

Despite the rise in the number of those affected by food allergies, Munoz-Furlong is optimistic about the future.

"There is lots of research going on in the U.S. and around the world. Scientists are trying to determine how to predict who will develop an allergy, how to prevent it from developing and how to shut down the allergy once it develops," said Munoz-Furlong. "In the next 10 years or so, the landscape for food allergy diagnosis and treatment should be much better than it is today. The future looks promising."

Daily dilemma

Two parents cope with children's allergies

Some parents have witnessed their children with rapid pulse, nausea, dizziness, blue lips, and loss of consciousness, and might think the child is choking or having a heart attack. To their surprise, they learn these are the warning signs and symptoms from someone with a deadly allergic reaction to certain foods.

When her daughter was 15 months old, Mary Ann Pastrana found out she was allergic to peanuts.

"I was having a piece of toast with peanut butter and I gave her a little piece in her high chair and she had a reaction," Pastrana said. "Her face became red, she began to sneeze and cough.'

The attack alerted Pastrana that her daughter might be one of the many million in the United States affected with anaphylaxis.

"I was scared, but she was able to breathe," said Pastrana.

Peanut allergies are triggered when the immune system reacts to proteins found in peanuts. People who have family members with food allergies are most at risk. Pastrana knew food allergies existed on her husband's side of the family. A trip to the pediatrician

for a blood test was in order after her daughter's first allergy attack to determine if Pastrana's little girl was allergic to peanuts.

The doctor said the first reaction can be mild, but the next reaction can also be more severe," Pastrana said.

Pastrana's daughter is eight vears old now and she has learned that balancing a child's food intake without peanuts in the daily diet can be a difficult task.

"When she goes to birthday parties, sometimes she can't always have the cake," said Pastrana.

Many types of chocolate and candy are excluded for people with peanut allergies because the candy can be processed at a food plant where peanuts are also processed.

'If she sees something she has never eaten before she will check with me," Pastrana said.

Aidan was diagnosed with a peanut allergy after a blood test when he was 3. Reading food labels and always being aware of her son's food intake are now common reminders for Ryan that life is not the same for Aid-

Schools that the children are enrolled in need to be contacted along with the school nurse to ensure a plentiful supply of the drug epinephrine exists. An

emergency injection of adrenalin or epinephrine will ease the allergic attack, but the only sure cure to make it go away is to avoid peanuts entirely.

There is a routine we go through anytime we are out," said Ryan. "We always have to ask and see what kind of answer we get."

Ryan recalls a trip to New Jersey when she stopped along the turnpike at a fast food restaurant to order French fries for Aidan. Then the question came. Do the French fries in any way contain peanuts or traces peanuts?

"The restaurant told me they cook their French fries in peanut oil," Ryan said.

Both Ryan and Pastrana, who live in Bethlehem, know several families in the area with a son or daughter who has a food al-

"I am finding this is more common," said Pastrana. "I don't even remember hearing this as a child."

Pastrana can relate to the close call Ryan had with the French fries in peanut oil and will not allow her daughter to eat any Asian food because a lot of Chinese food is cooked in pea-

"No Oriental foods if you have a peanut allergy," said Pastrana, who also packs safe snacks for her daughter wherever she goes.

"If she sees something she has never eaten before, she'll check with me," Pastrana

The Center for Disease Control believes prevention is the best way to avoid a potentially fatal allergic reaction. Know what you are eating and drinking. Read food labels carefully and wear a medical alert bracelet.

Also write an action plan to describe how to care for your child when he or she has an allergic reaction to peanuts and provide a copy of this plan to the school.







he Schenectady

Dolly" for the conclusion of its 80th season.

Director Suzanne Rayome, a Scotia resident, said the audience should expect to see a very bright and colorful show, with lots of dancing, elaborate sets and costumes and a talented cast.

"From the start, we had a great turnout for auditions, which is an indication that we really have incredible talent in the Capital Region," Rayome said.

Because "Hello Dolly" is intended for a large stage and SLOC's stage is relatively small, the entire theater is used to create more space.

"We've got people coming from everywhere," Rayome said. "You have people sweating right next to you, which is an interesting experience."

The 1890s setting requires elaborate costumes with incredible details, which the company's costume designer, Connie Rauhauser, made by hand.

The set design is also quite detailed. Set designers Peter and Madeline Codella created a front extension to the stage with stairs to the floor, which gives the actors more room.

and organization is what attracted Rayome to its stage.

Rayome has been involved with community theater for 35 years, but this is her first SLOC production. Rayome and her husband have done a lot of work with the Glove Theater in Gloversville.

"We are really tickled to be here, so close to home," she said.

Jean Foster, who plays Dolly, returned to SLOC after nearly 20 years away from the stage because of Rayome.

"This is what we really enjoy doing, but the biggest draw for me was the director," Foster said.

Foster, from Burnt Hills, said her biggest challenge in playing Dolly is that the character is larger than life.

"Sometimes it's hard to play that role. I'm still working to do that. I am still cautious, and Dolly isn't," Foster said.

The vocal range is also different. Foster is used to singing soprano and Dolly has a deep alto voice.

Ken Zarnoch from Scotia plays the male lead, Horace Vandegelder. Zarnoch has been with the theater company for 20 years. In that time he has worn many hats, including acting, doing technical work and set design and being on the board of directors.

He said he likes playing Vandegelder because he is a crusty, grumpy, hard as nails, half-a-millionaire snob.

"It's fun to play a role like that," he said.

"You do so well with it," Rayome joked.

Nearly everyone involved in the production is a

volunteer. Foster said it is nice to come to rehearsals from her full-time job, and have everything organized and ready to go.

Cast members have been rehearsing about 12 hours a week since February, but Rayome has been planning for this production for a year.

"Everyone here does this for fun. It is their hobby and you want that experience to be rewarding" Rayome said.

For Foster, her experience has been a positive one, which includes her husband and her 12-year-old son Colin, who's in the ensemble.

Colin Foster said it's great to be performing with his family for this show.

"It's in my blood," he said.

All ages are welcome to perform with SLOC, including young children and 70-year-old grandparents. Often families perform together, and many people have met their significant others while performing with the company.

"That's what's so amazing about community theater,"
Jean Foster said, "People can come in for the first time, and it's so much fun to watch them go through the process from the beginning."





There are plenty of people like Montana who suffer from high blood pressure — an estimated 72 million in the United States alone. And though Rippe said family history is relevant, it is not the only factor.

"We know that there is a not a determining factor," said Boomhower also struck out Rippe. "We don't know why some eight batters and got some help families have more high blood

pressure than others, but the sad truth is that in over 90 percent of people who have high blood pressure, we don't know why they have it."

Montana's case was particularly unique. Even though there was a family history of high blood pressure, he lived a highly active lifestyle during his pro football

But there were some factors that elevated Montana's risk for high blood pressure including his diet.

"It was typically American the food was good, and it was even better if it was more," said Montana. "I ate everything and anything, and salted everything before I ate it."

The main thing is Joe is very typical of what exactly we're trying to say," said Rippe. "He has made some lifestyle changes, but Joe was never significantly overweight. He was always in quite good shape - in the top 1 percent. He never smoked cigarettes, and he's made some slight modifications. But the reality is Joe is on two medicines to lower his blood pressure, plus he's made some lifestyle changes, and that's exactly what we're recommending in the 'BP Success Zone."

High blood pressure is a reality many more Americans will likely face — whether or not they are athletes.

"I think we all need to be aware of it," said Montana. "Athletes probably worry less about their health on the whole because they always feel like they are working out or doing something."

make mistakes, you go, 'Oh God, I know exactly how that feels. You hate that feeling, and you wish that never had to happen because having experienced it so many times myself, it's not fun. But it's fun (watching them). I really enjoy going, and they are enjoying it."


Seeing the sports world from a new perspective
