Home and community gardeners harvest more than a crop

It may not be a wheatfield waving, but all across the Capital District, people are dreaming of late summer bounty as they put their own personal crops into their backyard, a community garden or a big pot on the deck.



Across the nation, gardeners spent \$1.154 billion in 2005 on vegetable gardening, according to a 2006 national gardening survey conducted by the National Gardening Association in Burlington, Vt.

What's the appeal? "It's rewarding, don't you think?" said Dean Plummer of Delmar's nursery and gardening supply shop Price-Greenleaf. "Also, the taste and the freshness."

As if to pay testament to Plummer's words, Eunice and Josh Peacetree paced up and down by the table of young vegetable plants, not unlike kids in a candy store.

Town historian dies

Raymond C. Houghton, Jr., remembered for his knowledge and giving spirit

His career ranged from computer programming to authoring several Revolutionary War travel books. Now, at age 60, Bethlehem Historian, Dr. Raymond C. Houghton Jr., of Delmar has died after being ill for several

months. Houghton served as town historian since 2005 and was admired by his colleagues for contributing his vast knowledge and resources that assisted in promoting Bethlehem's rich cultural history.

"He was an absolute treasure to the town of Bethlehem," said Parker Mathusa, chairman of the town planning board. Mathusa worked with Houghton on the town's quadricentennial cel-

bration along with hosting historical trolley tours around Bethlehem.

"He was very knowledgeable and essentially a man for all seasons in terms of contributions to both young and old," Mathusa added. "The town lost a very special person."

Houghton was born in Greenfield, Mass., and

Board eyes full-day K

\$3.6 million is the starting figure

Bethlehem school district residents may go to the polls a second time in 2007 to vote on a \$3.6 million capital construction project to fund a full-day kindergarten program.

The potential fall referendum is needed to capture EXCEL funding available to pay for the cost of six to eight classrooms needed at Eagle Elementary school, being built on Van Dyke Road, across the street from the high school. EXCEL stands for Expanding Our Children's Education and Learning, and funds for the program are included in the state budget.

Why full-day kindergarten is considered beneficial and how to fund the move from half-day to full-day classes were the main topics discussed at the Wednesday, May 30, meeting of the school board.

"Research indicated that full-day kindergarten programs are more advantageous than half-day kindergarten, and there is money to make it happen," said Assistant Superintendent Michael Tebbano.

A study presented by district officials to the school board indicates it would cost \$852,000 to staff a full-day kindergarten program in Bethlehem. That figure includes 13 new teachers, five aides and a school nurse. The full report is posted on the district Web site at bcsd.k12.ny.us.

Administrators said school enrollment is expected to increase with a full-day kindergarten program, and state aid would fund the entire amount for the 2008-2009 school year. The expected enrollment boost would come from students currently enrolled in private schools, which traditionally have offered full-day kin-

Albany County cracks down on parking rule scofflaws

Project aims to keep handicapped spaces open for those who need them

Albany County authorities have netted 27 summonses as part of a two-day screen aimed at stopping drivers who illegally park in handicap parking spots.

For the most part, the infractions go unchecked, admit authorities. Most summonses come by way of police cruisers reporting to other calls who come across drivers who ignore the signs.

Project Access, which the two-day screen is called, is launched four times a year and in most cases lands more tickets than local and county police agencies would like.

The screen was conducted on Wednesday, May 23, and Thursday, May 24.

"Of the 27 summonses, we've written a lot more. We are pleased. Twenty-seven is still a number we would like to get lower, but hopefully education and enforcement will have an impact," said Albany County Sheriff James Campbell.

The last Project Access in December resulted in at least three times the number of summonses, he said. City of Albany police, who issued seven summonses over the course of the most recent screen, issued 60 in December. Typically, the results of the screen always see more infractions in Colonie, Bethlehem and among private security agencies

patrolling mall parking lots, he said. To keep an eye on the more than 80 square miles of the town, officers typically avoid the parking lots unless they are called to them. Calls for cars illegally parked in handicap spots are few and far between, he said.

"The main thing is the volume of calls they response to. It cuts down on any proactive work they can do," said Pero.

Most of the time his officers stumble across the violators.

May's screen netted \$3,840 in fines to be paid out to the city of Albany, Bethlehem, Colonie and Menands police and one

for a ticket issued at Crossgates Mall. Since the program went into effect in 1994, more than 33 screens have been conducted resulting in 1,490 summonses and more than \$138,830 in fines.

of local malls.

Colonie and Bethlehem police issued eight summonses, accounting for more than half of the tickets issued in the May sting.

Campbell attributes the tickets to the municipalities' size and the number of malls and strip malls in the two towns, where most infractions take place.

"There were two guys out there for four hours driving through strip malls and malls," said Colonie Police Traffic Safety Division Commander, Lt. Ken Pero.

Delmar resident charged with drug possession

A 21-year-old Delmar man was charged with possession of drugs after police responded to a 9-1-1 call.

Bethlehem police report Christopher J. Stipe, of 10 Lincoln Drive, was arrested for criminal possession of a controlled substance fifth degree, a felony, and possession of marijuana.

Police initially responded to a 9-1-1 report of an individual having a seizure near Elsmere Avenue on Tuesday, May 23.

When officers arrived they found a person in need of medical attention and called EMS. The person then allegedly became uncooperative, refusing medical attention:

According to police, after

several minutes of questioning passengers and the driver at the scene of the 9-1-1 call, officers went to 10 Lincoln Drive, where they found Stipe exiting his car in the driveway and running inside the house.

Officers detected a strong odor of marijuana inside the vehicle and a white substance in they believed to be cocaine in a baggie.

Stipe was placed into custody and police confirmed there was 1.51 grams of cocaine inside the car that was seized along with an ashtray with marijuana ashes.

Stipe was sent to Albany County jail on \$2,500 cash bail and will appear in Town Court on June 19 to respond to the charge.

Slingerlands resident charged with DWI

A 23-year-old Slingerlands man is being charged with DWI after being stopped along Route 9W on Friday, May 25.


According to reports, patrols from the Bethlehem police department were attempting to stop traffic due to a property damage accident where a car struck a telephone pole.

Charles Simpson told police while he was stopped in traffic that he needed to get by. He then attempted to continue north on


Route 9W when one of the officers called out for Simpson to stop.

Vista Park moves forward; town seeks another roundabout

The Bethlehem Town Board held a special meeting on Tuesday, May 29, to approve the finding statement for the proposed 450-acre Vista Technology Park.

The approval is a requirement of the state Environmental Quality Review and is a necessary step before a public hearing on the Vista Park Master Plan can take place. That public hearing is set for Friday, June 15.

Supervisor Jack Cunningham said one of the reasons for the May 29 meeting was because of a need for a roundabout to be constructed at the entrance to the

proposed site.

"The NYSDOT (New York State Department of Transportation) does not have a planned roundabout in that intersection," said Cunningham.

Three roundabouts are slated to be built as part of DOT's Route 85 Slingerlands Bypass project; however, a fourth roundabout at the entrance of Vista Park will be built by the developers. The town needs approval from DOT before that fourth roundabout can be built. Pete Van Keuren, DOT region information officer, said excavation work on the new alignment and widening abutments along the

Normanskill Bridge is taking place.

"Construction is moving along faster than we anticipated," Cunningham said.

Including a new roundabout at the entrance of the Vista Park is something town officials would like to see take place while the Slingerlands Bypass project is underway.

"We hope it can be integrated into the larger job without affecting the timeline on the larger job," Van Keuren said.

Cunningham said project developers BBL Construction are not saying who could be the first tenant at the new tech park, but he said the interest is out there.

"My understanding is that when the road is complete, we will have commercial and retail tenants lined up to go there," Cunningham said.

The first tenants for Vista Park are expected to be announced once the entrance road and bypass construction is complete at the end of 2008.

Vista Park is expected to create thousands of new jobs, with a high percentage of the companies moving in to be technology driven, similar to the proposed Sematech and Advanced Micro Devices projects in other areas of the Capital District.

"The developer of this project has determined that 80 percent


of new business will be high tech and office space, and 20 percent only retail," said Kyle Kotary, town board member.

Kotary said the project timeline fits with when technology-based companies will be ready to locate in the area in 2009 and 2010.

"This project will be a success no matter of Sematech and AMD," Kotary said.

Vista Park will be Bethlehem's first mixed economic development district, or MEDD, meaning the development will include residential neighborhoods along with retail and office development.

"This gives us our first test of our MEDD district," Kotary said.

A growing tradition

Garden tour, plant sale raise money for green projects

Like watching a baseball game, barbecuing or swimming in the pool, the Bethlehem Garden Tour and Plant Sale is a summer tradition.

Five private homes and two public gardens are included on this year's tour, which will be held from 4 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, June 13, at locations throughout town.

Tickets for the garden tour are sold the day of the event at 4 p.m. in the parking lots of the Slingerlands Price Chopper, 1355 New Scotland Road, Slingerlands, and the Glenmont Price Chopper, Town Squire Plaza, Glenmont. The fee is \$12 per person.

Anywhere from 250 to 350 people attend the annual event, depending on the weather.

"We have never had to cancel, but weather does have an impact," said Marcy Corneil, garden tour chairwoman.

A plant sale will be held the same day of the tour, also from 4 to 8 p.m., across the street from the Bethlehem Public Library. There is no fee to attend the plant sale.

"Over 300 perennials and pots will be on sale," said Corneil.

The Bethlehem Garden Tour is now in its 11th year, and proceeds are used to create and improve public gardens throughout the town, including at the intersection of Cherry and Kenwood avenues, outside town hall, along Delaware Avenue and in Selkirk.

"This year's public gardens on

tour include one in front of town hall designed by the garden club and another in front of the library done by the Delmar Progress Club," Corneil said.

Last year's tour raised more than \$2,500. Proceeds from the plant sale fund an annual elementary environmental science grant given to a local school. A \$1,000 award was given this year to Clarksville Elementary School.

"It means so much for the students to have a hands-on experience," said Clarksville teacher Barbara Riegel, who applied for the grant with teacher Heather Bush. "You want to let the kids know this is their world and they need to take care of it."

A butterfly habitat will be created at Clarksville with money from the garden club award. A quiet place for students to observe nature in a close-up setting will also be constructed with the funds.

There are currently between 60 to 80 members of the Bethlehem Garden Club who meet monthly between September to May.

Van fleet keeps seniors on a roll

But group needs money to replace two aging vehicles

The Bethlehem Senior Transportation Service fleet is looking to add two new vehicles to transport the elderly passengers who use the service to their regular doctor visits.

Bethlehem Senior Projects, Inc., the non-profit right arm of the town senior services department, is in the process of raising \$50,000 to purchase a new wheelchair-lift-equipped vehicle for adult daycare transportation. A non-specialty vehicle is also needed. Once purchased, they will replace two older vehicles in the eight-vehicle fleet that are showing signs of wear and tear.

"We are looking at significant money that we have to raise," said attorney Todd Tobin, president of Bethlehem Senior Projects.

The organization has been working with the town senior services department since 1988, providing many programs for the elderly in the community.

"The ability to have this partnership allows the town to provide more service for less cost to the taxpayer," said Karen Pelletier, town senior services director for Bethlehem.

Health-care screenings and speaker forums are a few of the services provided by Bethlehem Senior Projects, along with funding the town senior transportation fleet.

"These vehicles are used to transport passengers to doctor visits, chemotherapy, dialysis, outpatient surgery and other medical reasons," Pelletier said.

The Bethlehem senior services department and Bethlehem Senior Projects share in the purchase of

vehicles that provide transportation for independently living adults, ages 60 and older. Half of the vehicle fleet is owned by the town and the other half is owned by Senior Projects.

Pelletier said finding new sources of revenue for the fleet is getting harder for the organization to come by.

"The community can help by sending a contribution, or if they are aware of avenues of funding for senior transportation vehicles," said Pelletier.

Tobin said although he will reach out to his colleagues in the legal community to try to assist in fundraising efforts, the community can also get involved.

"Bethlehem and Delmar are unique, and I am continuously impressed by the willingness of people to help others," Tobin said.

Several thousands of hours of community service are provided to seniors annually by more than 260 volunteers. That equals about 25 volunteers a day working for Bethlehem seniors in a variety of ways.

"We are very fortunate; we have a great community," said Tobin.


The Bethlehem religious community will hold a special service on July 15 on the lawn outside Delmar Reformed Church to raise money for the senior transportation fleet. Proceeds from that days service involving four churches including Delmar Reformed, Bethlehem Community Church, Delmar Full Gospel, and St. Stephen's Church will go toward the new vehicles.




One of the vehicles in the The Bethlehem Senior Transportation Service fleet.



County comptroller says fuel mix is 'gold'

Mechanics warn that older cars shouldn't run on ethanol

For more than a year, Albany County Comptroller Mike Conners has endlessly pitched ideas to consumers and legislators on tackling increasing gas prices.

Conner's attempts to hold the oil industry accountable for its pricing practices have had a marginal impact at best. Now, instead of focusing on the supply end of the gas price equation, he is turning his attention to the demand.

It is a shift from defense to offense, he said. His game plan is ethanol.

"The way I look at it, I am replacing 300 gallons I'm buying from a country that wishes this country harm," said Conners, of the rocky relationship between Middle East suppliers and Western consumers.

Last week, Conners concocted his own mix of a lesser-grade ethanol by mixing E85 Ethanol with regular gasoline. Many car manufacturers, like General Motors, have been equipping their vehicles to run on E85 ethanol

since 2002, said Conners.

The so-called "flexible fuel vehicles" can burn both conventional and biomass fuels like ethanol. But older vehicles can't run on the ethanol rich E85, which is a mix of 15 percent petroleum and 85 percent ethanol. Instead, older models and their drivers who wish to use the cleaner-burning fuel have to rely on E10. However, it is not offered in the state.

Conners is now on his third tank of E20, which he calls "Albany County Gold," a mix of three to four gallons of E85 topped off with regular gasoline.

On Thursday, May 31, Conners was about to burn through his third tank of the concoction. His 2000 Chevrolet Suburban was running great, he said. By his estimates, he will save himself \$900 in fuel this year and realize a 4.2 percent increase in fuel mileage. He plans on posting the E20 formula on the County's Web site soon, accompanied with performance records of his test vehicle.

He recommends people speak with a mechanic or auto dealer before using the mixed fuel.

Although it sounds good, some auto mechanics are warning against Conner's "Albany County Gold." It could become potentially

troublesome for some older model vehicles.

"On a vehicle equipped to run on E85, that is not a problem, to mix gas with ethanol," said Mike Cressey, service advisor for DePaula Chevrolet in Albany. "GM states clearly that if the vehicle is not equipped to run E85, don't use it, no matter how small the quantity."

Cressey has relayed the message to the scores of GM owners who began calling in last week after Conner's announcement, he said. He tells them all the same thing. Don't use it unless the car was designed to use it and says so.

However, according to the Energy Future Coalition, low-level ethanol blends of 10 percent or less are approved for use in any automobile in the U.S. The only downside is a decrease in fuel economy because ethanol has lower energy content than gasoline, according to the coalition's Web site. The site goes on to say that higher-level

ethanol blends can corrode some engine parts, but older engines can be modified to run on E85.

Cressey had no information from GM regarding at-the-pump formulas for mixing your own low-level ethanol blend.

There is one problem with Conners latest proposal to reduce dependence on oil; currently

Albany County has only one pump distributing E85 ethanol - Campus Mobil on Washington Avenue outside the University at Albany entrance.

Conners said he will be looking to expand the county's ethanol market by getting more ethanol and his low-level "Albany County Gold" into area gas stations.

Use caution with chemicals

In the towns that Spotlight Newspapers covers, local leaders take the responsibility for their citizens' safety very seriously. They work hard to provide excellent police departments, road crews and support staff.

We were surprised to see the town of Bethlehem rescind its ban on pesticide use on town property recently. Concern from parents of children playing on fields with large holes and divots caused by grubs chewing up the ground led to the town board re-examining that ban. In a short time period, the board reinstated the use of pesticides — albeit at a very low level and only in the most needed circumstances. The board gave itself the option of reducing the risk of sprains and breaks in children by allowing the use of pesticide to kill the grubs.

The board should have spent more time investigating alternatives to pesticides before signing off on their use. Rescinding the ban happened much faster than the enactment of the ban itself, and more time for public input and an in-depth study of the risks and alternatives was warranted.

Bethlehem's not alone in its use of pesticides, and certainly didn't break any laws by deciding to allow their use again.

Still, we encourage all towns to stay within levels of use deemed safe, and when possible, to avoid pesticides at all.

Under state law, private homeowners are required to notify their neighbors when they apply pesticides to their lawns. We hope that municipalities will also be that courteous to their residents when they must apply pesticides.

We also encourage private homeowners to weigh the beauty of their lawns against health hazards. In addition to the lawns and fields where pesticides are applied, where do they end up? In the water? In the soil used to grow food?

Our page 1 stories this week focus on vegetable gardening, and repeatedly, the benefits of produce grown organically are touted. It may seem a great distance between the soccer field and the backyard garden, but we should strive for consistency in how we treat our environment.

Poor's nutritional needs not being met

Hunger. Food insecurity. These are abstract terms for most of us. But some of our neighbors pledged this month to opt for a taste of what it's like to have too little food in the cupboard to make it through the week. Religious leaders, advocates and public officials promised that, for at least one day this month, they would limit their daily food spending to \$3.50, the value of food stamp benefits now offered to low-income New Yorkers.


Bishop Howard J. Hubbard of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany took part. He described his commitment in moral and religious terms: "On behalf of those who must face this dilemma on a daily basis, I accept the challenge to live on \$1.16 per meal today in solidarity with their plight and in prayerful hope that together we can bring sufficient resources to those struggling to feed their families in this, the greatest nation in the world."

In terms of politics, Congress will soon decide the fate of the food stamp program when it turns to debating the Farm Bill later this month.

We need them to know that almost 1.8 million New Yorkers — 26 million Americans overall — rely on food stamps to help them purchase a nutritionally adequate diet. In Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties alone, more than 40,000 people relied on food stamps each month in 2006.

The food stamp program is the nation's largest and most comprehensive nutrition program, and it's the single most important factor in this country's significant progress against hunger and malnutrition in recent decades. In the late 1960s, medical research exposed the fact that American children were suffering and dying from malnutrition-related diseases that usually occur only in

Third World countries. By 1979, after the food stamp program became available nationwide, physicians found that severe malnutrition had become rare. They attributed this dramatic improvement to food stamps.

Food stamps generally go to households that include children, elderly people, or people with disabilities. But many food stamp recipients are from working families. In fact, in Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties, food stamp recipients from working families outnumber food stamp recipient from families on temporary assistance by 2-to-1: 28,530 in working poor families compared to 12,856 in cash assistance families. And the number is growing. During the most recent economic expansion, the number of households in Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties receiving food stamps has grown by more than 33 percent, from 15,768 in 2002 to 20,956 in 2006. Fully 71 percent of the new households were working poor families.

Unfortunately, food stamps are worth only about \$1.16 per person per meal for the average New Yorker. And because they don't keep up with the cost of living, the amount of food they can purchase is steadily declining. So households are increasingly likely to run out of food before the end of the month, affecting everything from their health to their ability to succeed at work and in school. Local food pantries try to make up the difference but find it hard to meet the needs.

Food stamp rules allow applicants to subtract a "standard deduction" from their income to reflect the cost of non-food necessities such as housing, clothes, transportation and school supplies. The standard deduction represents the portion of household income that is not available to purchase food because it must be used for other basic expenses. Food stamp benefit levels are based on a household's income minus the standard deduction and other deductions; households with lower incomes after deduction receive larger food stamp benefits because they have less money available to purchase food.

Until 1996, the standard deduction went up each year to

account for the fact that basic living expenses go up due to inflation. In 1996, however, Congress froze the standard deduction, a freeze that remains in effect today. It's time to fix this 11-year-old problem.

Our representatives in Congress need to realize that next year, food stamp benefits for a typical working parent with two children in New York will be about \$24 a month lower than they would have been without the freeze. That \$24 could have gone for vegetables and fruit sorely lacking from low-income diets. In all, New York residents will lose \$115 million in food stamp benefits in 2008 due to the freeze in the standard deduction. And if the rules are not changed, the cut will continue to grow, by the end of 10 more years, to a total of \$1.55 billion.

Strengthening the food stamp program isn't just the right thing to do. It would also provide a significant boost to the state's economy by increasing overall food purchases. Despite the fact that food stamp benefits are low for each recipient, the program overall brings \$2.3 billion in federal dollars into New York. Last year, residents of Albany, Saratoga and Schenectady counties had \$45 million more to spend on food thanks to the food stamp program. These funds don't just put food on the table. They also provide vital support for food distributors — including local grocery stores — and for food producers. Food stamp dollars translate into jobs; according to the USDA, every \$5 in food stamp benefits generates \$9.20 in local economic activity.

So when it renews the food stamp program in the Farm Bill this summer, Congress should improve food stamp benefits with a goal of ensuring families get adequate help. And this means help with healthier foods, which tend to be more expensive. At the very least, Congress must stop the erosion in the value of food stamp benefits. Left unchecked, this erosion makes it harder every year to put food on the table. Stopping the erosion in benefits would help low-income New Yorkers and the entire New York economy.

Adams). While there were many great points raised, I would like to point out an omission. Another excellent vehicle for high school AND college students looking for "real-life" experience can be found at The New York State Theatre Institute.

NYSTI is a truly unique

organization in the Capital District. While many patrons of the arts and local high schools are aware of its existence, I have found that a far smaller number are aware of the internship program. As a professional company with a focus on family-friendly productions, NYSTI offers interns the chance to work hand-in-hand with Actor's Equity performers and union technicians. It gives students a real, no-frills view of the business of show business. While many people can dream about working as an actor or a stagehand, moving

the dream in to reality can be a lot to handle. It requires 100 percent commitment and a thick skin that will help you handle rejection. Interning while you are still in school is the safest way I know of to test the waters.

I have been a student at Russell Sage College in Troy since the fall of 2003 and have found my time spent at NYSTI very rewarding. The musical theater program at Sage works in direct conjunction with NYSTI and the culmination of our studies is a 15-credit, one-semester internship. Having NYSTI in residence was the main reason I chose RSC for my undergraduate studies in the first place and I have not been disappointed with my choice.

There are two types of internships at NYSTI: high school level and college level. While my experience has been the latter, I have also known

many high school interns over the past four years. Seniors in high school can elect to come to NYSTI for either half the year or the entire year. While they have additional classes to meet requirements such as government and economics, we ALL participate in theater-specific classes such as stage combat with company fight coordinator David Bunce and circus skills classes with resident teacher artist John McGuire. Similarly, whether you are a college or high school intern, you are assigned to a company member who serves as your mentor. Though I have yet to actually lay solder to metal, my internship over this past academic year has found me working in NYSTI's costume shop, scenery shop, public relations department and even in the capacity of assistant stage manager for the March production of "American Soup" that went on tour to Queens. This was all in addition to performing in four mainstage productions. Yes, I have been running around like crazy! It has been an intensive year, but the experience I have gained is absolutely priceless. First responders get on the same frequency

Grant enables emergency groups to stay in the loop

Soon Albany County first responders will be on the same frequency.

More often than police, firefighters and paramedics would like to see, the scene of an accident, fire or crime is often clouded with the chatter of dozens of radios tuned into

different channels.

In the wake of the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security has been doling out money to help emergency services across the country be able to communicate on the same frequency.

Albany County's solution is the Emergency Service Interoperability Radio System (ESIRS). Through a \$1.7 million grant, the county has been reworking communication systems among all local and

state agencies within the county. New radios and equipment have been made available to agencies so that a single "command and control frequency" can be used among all emergency responders in the county, said Albany County Sheriff James Campbell.

The sheriff's department has been working through a consultant to get the system online.

"Let's say you're at a multi agency response. Instead of a radio on every car, there will be one frequency. It will certainly

improve emergency response and improve communication among first responders," said Campbell.

The new system is similar to its predecessor the Capital District Emergency Radio Network. That network had a shared frequency for the command posts and communications officers of the state and local agencies linked to the system. Some agencies, like Colonie police, will keep that structure in place, while others will have car-to-car communications available.

The sheer size of Colonie's police, fire and paramedic fleets, in addition to the number of radios that would need to be equipped, made using the old command structure under the new system the ideal choice, said Police Chief Steven Heider.

"We want to make sure that our communications people are involved. They are at the center of everything. They can look at a map and see where each of our cars are," said Heider.

If a multi-agency emergency

happens in Colonie, all police, fire and paramedic personnel will be tuned into the ESIRS frequency and linked directly to Colonie's command center, he said. Vice versa, if Colonie police were serving in neighboring municipalities, their command would coordinate with outside agencies and direct Colonie first responders accordingly.

Several weeks ago, the system was put to the test in Watervliet when an auto accident caused a power outage in the city. Watervliet authorities were able to coordinate police, paramedic and fire services directly with neighboring Green Island agencies, said Campbell.

"All of this stuff is in the vein of 9-1-1 and in the vein of all law enforcement cooperating with each other," said Heider. "It's another step to keep people in the loop."

Campbell couldn't exactly when ESIRS would go online. He could only say that it has been in the works for years and will soon be online.

A Latham insurance firm has handed over the first in a series of donations from a \$150,000 pool of money slated for charitable organizations in Albany, Warren and Broome counties this year.

The center's executive director, Alex Hallenstein, joined Kahn at the check presentation. Annually, the center operates on a \$3 million budget, said Hallenstein. The \$10,000 donation will go directly to the center's operating budget that helps fund the many programs in the community that an average of 1,000 families take part in, he said.

The center is preparing a 2007 capital campaign to raise money for needed improvements, said Hallenstein.

The center needs to improve existing infrastructure and build new, he said. It also needs to grow a meager reserve.

The last campaign was held 10 years ago and generated \$3.8 million, he said. For this campaign, the center is aiming for less than half of that - \$1.5 million. The campaign will kick off some time between now and the end of the year, said Hallenstein last week.

The Schenectady JCC offers fitness and aquatics centers, after school and nursery school programs, and a variety of other activities ranging from Jewish cultural events to the arts to sports.




The grade school kids rocked out to a four-minute clip that Ridgway had put together of the soccer team's finest moments. The theme from "Rocky" set them clapping and swaying.





Kids run for fun in Freihofer's

Race for youth has been around for 20 years

At the Freihofer's Kids' Run, toddlers toddle next to their parents and grade schoolers scamper one of four distances up to 1 mile. After crossing the very same finish line that elite women runners crossed a few hours earlier, each participant got coupons for free T-shirts and boxes of Freihofer's cookies.

Sandy Morley has been a part of the Kids' Run across its 20-year existence. "George Regan (director of the Run for Women) originally pulled in educators," said Morley, who is assistant principal at Bethlehem Central

Middle School. The first committees worked to put together training packets for schools, which contained exercises and advice. "It gives teachers an opportunity to put a training program together," for schoolchildren who might want to race.

Morley said the Kids' Run committee is full of teachers and that the event is very education-based. Another educational component is the school visitation program, which started in the 1990s with Lynn Jennings, a repeat winner in the Freihofer's Run for Women. "The day before the event, she'd come in person to give a motivational speech and sign autographs," said Morley.

Since then, the school visits have been expanded to include more runners and more schools. This year 10 elite athletes made 15 presentations to area schools last week, including Joan Benoit Samuelson, who dominated women's marathons more than two decades ago, and who will be competing as a master (40 and over age group) in the Run for Women.

Samuelson arrived at Bethlehem's middle school library last Friday after going for a run through the streets of Delmar. When she was not much older than the students around her, she said, her goal was to run in the Olympics and to break the 2-hour-20-minute barrier. She accomplished the first in high style, winning the gold medal, but she never did achieve the second, she said. Now, at age 50, her goals are to run in the Olympic trials and to run a 2:50 marathon.

The athletes are great role models of achievement for kids, said Morley, but they also present what it is to have a career as an athlete.

"The kids make that 'aha' connection that this is a real job," she said. The runners make clear they go out day in and day out, when they have to, not just when they want to or when the weather is nice.

Several runners in the women's race are "graduates" of the Kids' Run.

At age 12, Emma Bowitch is still young enough to compete in the Kids Run, but this year she competed in the Run for Women as she has for the previous three years.

Running is fun, she said.

"For running, I don't get nervous," said Bowitch.

Bowitch works out twice a

"I was so nervous. Then the gun went off, and I just started running. I remember coming down the hill on Madison and just being so excited."

ergarten programs.

"Obviously, there are additional expenditures, but on the other hand, there are some savings in program services," said Superintendent Les Loomis, who said the district would realize \$226,000 in cost savings in transportation and special education costs.

The school board will be taking up the full-day kindergarten topic at the next two meetings on Wednesday, June 6 and Wednesday, June 20, and is expected to arrive at a decision at the end of June before two new school board candidates, Lisa Allendorph and Diane Giaccone Stever, assume their seats on the board.

District officials and PTA leaders said they are already receiving e-mails from parents who are both for and against the move from half-day to full-day kindergarten.

"I am not in support of this for all my children," said mother of four Jennifer Burns. "I am hearing so much about money, money, money. I want to hear what's good for the kids."

Helen Salamone, director of Bethlehem's Early Learning Center who is retiring this year, said teachers would have more time with their students in a full-day kindergarten setting.

"We don't have time to do math every day, we don't have

time to do science every day," said Salamone. "This would allow the time for all these subject matters."

The current half-day kindergarten structure in the district is a two-and-a-half-hour day. The full-day proposal increases the kindergarten day to six hours and 10 minutes a day, which was another concern for several parents at the meeting.



"Six hours and 10 minutes plus a bus ride is a long day," said Angie Randles, Slingerlands PTA co-president.

Randles said parents are divided on the issue.

"I always say do what's best for the majority, but I am not sure we have a majority here," she said.

School board president Stuart Lyman said it is not cost but what is good for the children that will be the deciding factor in his vote.

"What is it that will make this program successful? To me, it is the program that makes this decision before I ask the taxpayer to pay for it or not," Lyman said.

District officials pointed to more instructional time, more

time to explore topics in depth, and greater focus on a child's behavioral development as some of the reasons to move to a full-day kindergarten.

"I am a supporter of full-day kindergarten, and I applaud you for your effort to plan for it instead of reacting to it," said parent Carol Brousseau.

District officials also said they believe the state will soon mandate full-day kindergarten, and funds to pay for it will not be available at another time.

Parent Rebecca Lane said a state mandate for full-day kindergarten is hardly a done deal.

"Is there a bill in the Legislature now?" asked Lane. "It is my understanding the Board of Regents bill died in committee."

Although the state Board of Regents is calling for a full-day kindergarten program, there is no bill in the state Legislature. Gov. Eliot Spitzer has spoken in favor of the proposal, though.

Board member Lynne Lenhardt requested the district provide the board with information at the next meeting showing the pros and cons of half-day kindergarten.

The next meeting of the Bethlehem school board is scheduled for Wednesday, June 6, at 7 p.m. at the district office on Adams Place. The district is inviting the public to attend if they have questions or concerns regarding the proposal.

Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham said Houghton will be very much missed.


"It's a loss for the town," Cunningham said.

Sharing in a farm's bounty

Agricultural concept connects consumers with food's origins

German-raised farmer Trauger Groh founded the Temple-Wilton Community Farm in New Hampshire in 1985 and is now recognized as the pioneer of community supported agricultural, or CSA, farms in the United States. Temple-Wilton still exists and continues to grow organic products financially supported by the individuals who sustain the operation. They share in both the risks and profits.

With CSAs, members or "shareholders" of the farm pledge a fee in advance to cover the anticipated costs of the farm operation and farmer's salary. With that fee comes the bounty

of the harvest.

"The CSA concept represents a completely different relationship between farmers and eaters," said Steve Gillman of Stillwater, who for many years owned a CSA farm in Quaker Springs, between Stillwater and Schuylerville. Gillman's farm was once supported by more than 100 people and several restaurants in the Capital District.

"The history of CSA's began in Europe and Japan, and Groh is credited with starting the first CSA in this country," Gillman said.

In 2004, more than 1,700 CSA farms were registered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and the list continues to grow with more than 40 in New York.

"CSA is a real response to industrialization and is local agriculture, or food with a face," said Gillman.

The reason for a CSA is so a farmer can grow his crops early without having to worry about

startup costs from a bank.

"Farmers would go over their farm budget and members would pledge to offset certain expenses to receive what is produced," said Gillman. "They are getting money upfront at the beginning of the season, and in return CSA shareholders are getting food at a wholesale price." In the Capital District, Chris von Bulow is the site coordinator for Roxbury Farms, a large, 225-acre CSA in Kinderhook in Columbia County. As site coordinator, von Bulow finds locations throughout the area, including Delmar, where workers drop the food off weekly to the farm's 800 members.

"The Delmar region has 55 members that pick up their produce beginning in June every Tuesday," von Bulow said.

Salad greens, spinach, sugar snap peas, and turnips are some of the early summer crops. As the harvest continues into late summer and fall, the variety be-

comes more plentiful.

"Tomatoes of every size, from heritage to Juliette tomatoes, oriental eggplant, fava beans, kale and bok choy," said von Bulow of the produce harvested.

Members of Roxbury Farms can also participate in farm events held annually, including strawberry picking, garlic planting and sweet potato picking.

"Every age group comes to the farm," said von Bulow.

Gilman said the connection between member and farmer and farm in a CSA is very real and more direct. When the weather is good, everyone reaps the benefits of the harvest, and when the weather takes a turn for the worse, members are affected as well.

"Shareholders learned after one hail storm that my lettuce crop was ruined for a month," said Gilman, who said members have a vested interest in the farm and farming.

"When frost occurred I would get calls from members asking how my tomatoes were doing," Gilman added.

Roxbury Farms is one of the largest CSAs in the country. It was formed in 1990 as a partnership between Jonathan Hilton and Jean-Paul Courtens. Courtens operates the farm with Jody Bolluyt and a crew of 10. The Roxbury Farm membership that began in New York City branched out to the Capital District in 1991 and continues to grow. Food grown at the farm is organic and biodynamic, meaning no pesticides are used and genetic manipulation does not occur.

"Instead of meat-centered

meals, my meals are now centered around the vegetables," said von Bulow.

Membership at Roxbury Farms is at its peak, and most of the customers hear about the farm from word of mouth.

"I was a member in Albany many years ago when Roxbury first started," said Delmar resident Deborah Reichler, who rejoined the CSA when a local pickup site was formed.

"The fruits and vegetables are incredibly fresh and much better than anything you find in a store," Reichler said.

A full membership can cost \$455 for a season, and for those participating in the fruit bounty, there is an extra charge.

"My favorite items are the fresh tomato and basil," said Reichler. "We eat tomato, basil and pasta all summer long."

Gilman said the CSA phenomena is not a fad and what was once a concept strictly found in rural communities and small towns has branched out to different cities across the country.

"CSAs really raised awareness about where our food is coming from," Gilman said.

Roxbury Farms CSA supplies food to the Upper West Side of Manhattan and to community kitchens in the Big Apple. Roxbury Farms also has local CSA pickup sites in the city of Albany and Glenville in Schenectady County.

"You really need to learn how to eat seasonally," said von Bulow.

"Tomatoes, eggplants, cukes, peppers," Josh Peacetree, groundskeeper at Siena College, said as he walked.

"We're getting some 4x4 railroad ties and making raised beds," Eunice Peacetree said. "It's our second year in the house, so it's our second garden."

Why do they do it? "It's better than buying produce," Josh Peacetree said. "You feel more connected to the earth and it's more environmentally friendly."

"People have a desire to know what they're eating," said Bill Giniiecki of The Country Garden on Consaul Road in Niskayuna. "Especially vegetables that come from overseas, could have pesticides that we don't use any more in this country."

Like the Peacetrees, Giniiecki rattles off the names of vegetables - most of them started from seed in his hoop house. The favorites? Tomatoes, cukes, summer squash and peppers.


"Vegetables are a big product this time of year," Giniiecki said as a quick summer storm started hitting his plants. "Years ago, families living in two-family houses in Schenectady would turn their whole, small yard into a vegetable garden. It was amazing what they could grow. A lot of young people are trying vegetables again."

For people without a yard - or who want a large, sun-drenched piece of land with good organic soil - community gardens are the way to go.

Capital District Community Gardens has 45 locations and a total of 3,000 gardeners. "We're mostly serving folks in the inner city, who have no backyard," said Amy Klein, executive director of CDCG. There are some plots in some suburban towns, and some are on the edges of towns and draw suburban gardeners. "The community gardens are different things for different people," Klein said. "Some sustain families - we estimate that most of our gardeners grow \$1,000 worth of produce in their plots." Klein echoed Giniiecki's senti-

ments.

"People are interested in growing their own food," she said. "There's a health issue with produce grown close together, with chemicals and pesticides applied. Community gardens are organic, so you're not creating toxic waste. Also, produce itself is healthy and people are concerned with eating healthy food. You can deal with the scares associated with produce that comes from other countries



by growing your own."

In Guilderland, the community gardens located at Tawasentha Park provide more than food.

"People keep their plots from year to year," said Guilderland's Parks and Recreation Director Dennis Moore, who started the community garden about 10 years ago.

"A lot of Guilderland residents don't own their own homes and this lets them garden. We have about 50 gardeners, and it's as much a social thing as gardening."

In the Guilderland gardens, transplanting, protecting and planting anew was the order of the day during the Memorial Day weekend.

"I like being outside with nature," said Eve Gannon as she pointed out her asparagus plants and talked about the tomatoes, the cukes and the squash she'd grow that summer in her Tawasentha plot.

Margaret and Albert Rusch tucked landscape fabric around their plants. "Corn is probably my favorite," Margaret Rusch said. "I also like being outside, working in the sun."

"It's so beautiful here," said

Fan Chen. "When the sun goes down behind those trees in the evening, it's such a beautiful place."

Chen has already harvested some Chinese greens that don't mind the frost. "These last few days," she said, "I'm here almost daily. After the garden gets established, it's just watering and weeding."

Getting it established can be tricky. The most important things to do?

"You need good sun; fertilize; keep the weeds out; at first, water a lot," said Plummer. "Once the garden takes hold, you're OK."

"Keep the ground fluffed up," Giniiecki said. "Weed. When you see farm fields, you don't see weeds. A lot of people throw their plants in the ground and walk away. If you don't weed, you're wasting your money. You have to have a love for it."

"Disease-resistant plants and a healthy garden soil," said Larry Sombke, who has the Web site [beautifulgardens.com](http://www.beautifulgardens.com) and is WAMC's natural gardener.

"A lot of compost is the No. 1 solution," said Sombke, who goes weekly with his wife, two blue barrels and their little dog to collect compost from his town's transfer station.

"Compost is free in a lot of towns," he said. "It's worth a phone call. Most soils need decomposed plant material. Adding organic matter aerates the soil, retains moisture and encourages deep root growth."

The benefits to gardening? "It's good exercise," Sombke said. "It gets you out, and it gets you thinking about the environment."

Oh, yeah, after all that work, there's the fresh produce.

"Tremendous, superior flavor," Sombke said of homegrown produce.

"Nothing's as good as a freshly picked tomato," Plummer said.

"You can taste the difference in the tomatoes and the greens. It may be psychological," Chen said.

"Homegrown tastes better," said Giniiecki. "Taste is the primary product. You can't beat going to the garden and picking a fresh tomato."

Take care of your feet this summer

High-heeled sandals may look great in the summertime, but they offer minimal arch support to your aching feet.

Take proper care this summer and avoid developing painful foot problems – including a common ailment called plantar fasciitis (fash-ee-EYE-tis). Plantar fasciitis

is an inflammation of the ligament that runs from the toes to the heel on the bottom of the foot. Those most at risk are people with flat feet or high arches; people who stand or walk for long periods of time, particularly on hard surfaces; runners (due to the repetitive trauma that creates micro-tears in the ligament); and athletes who make fast starts and stops, like baseball and basketball players.

The onset is usually gradual. The pain is nearly always worse with the first step in the morning, or upon standing after a long period of sitting. This is because fibers in the foot have contracted during inactivity. They are painful when suddenly stretched. Pain usually subsides with activity, and then returns later.

Ice and anti-inflammatory medications can help ease pain. It is best to rest the foot so that the ligament tears can heal. Stretching and strengthening routines are recommended to help correct tightness in the calf and Achilles tendon, and weakness of the foot muscles.

Rolling the foot over a 15-ounce can or a tennis ball can also help.

Shoe inserts have become a mainstay of treatment. Some patients wear splints to bed at night to keep the foot at a 90-degree angle to the ankle. If all else fails, corticosteroid injections can bring relief.

Wearing worn-out shoes can make problems worse, as can heels for women. Comfortable, good-quality sneakers are the best option. Replace them every three to six months depending on wear and tear.

With no change in routine, the healing process will stop and start over and over again. Eventually, calcium deposits or bone spurs can develop, along with other body mechanic issues. With proper treatment, the problem usually resolves itself within several months to a year.



Proper posture can relieve pain

Most people have been told at one time in their life to, "Stand up straight." Or perhaps they have thought their posture is not so good, and they intended to correct it, yet didn't quite follow through.

Back, neck, feet, knee and hip pain, as well as rotator cuff injuries, tendonitis and many other musculo-skeletal problems have their origin - and their remedy - in alignment and posture.

Think of posture this way: If a tire axle is off, after a while, everything in the system is worn


down prematurely. The bearings, the ball joints, the tire tread is all in tension, worn down and worn out. It is no longer a smooth ride.

This is exactly the same scenario with a body. The spine (the core) is like the axle for the whole system. For the body to move easily and smoothly, the axle or spine/pelvis must be in proper alignment. However, if there is muscle tightness or weakness anywhere in the body, then this will ultimately change the position of the spine; and then the whole body works under tension to compensate. At first, it may seem like no big deal. But with time, the damage adds up. If there is weakness on the front part of the joint compared to the back side, causing the forces of motion on the "ball joints" to be off, then the wear and tear occurs. This could be cartilage wear and tear, disc deterioration, joint capsule injury-inflammation, osteo-arthritis formation (bone spurs, also known as degeneration) or ligament/tendon inflammation (sprains or tendonitis).

Studies indicate more than 70 percent of adults suffer back pain at some time in their lives. One report stated eight out of every 10 people has some form of back pain. A 2004 Duke medical study showed that back pain patients consume more than \$90 billion annually in health-care expenses, with approximately \$26 billion of that amount directly attributable to treating the back pain.

With such a high number of cases of debilitating back pain and so much money going out, it is important that people are taught proper management of their bodies to avoid such pain.

The good news is we can prevent and heal these injuries and disease breakdown with understanding and some attention. The healthy, long-



lasting vitality of our tissues and bones depends upon the structure's proper alignment (bio-mechanical integrity). Integrative Physical Therapy, or IPT, is dedicated to educating, assessing and offering the crucial postural therapy needed to get and stay pain free.

Bike to better health this summer

Bike riding is a favorite summer activity for young and old. From a quick trip down the block to a family outing at the park, a ride on a bike burns calories, helps heart health and, most importantly, is tons of fun.

According to bicyclinginfo.org, research shows the health

says Dr. Laura Laskonis, a pediatrician affiliated with Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago. "Bike riding, which burns 300 to 400 calories per hour, is an excellent way to have fun and be active outdoors in the summer."

While a family bike outing is a great way to get active and have fun, it's important not to forget safety. In fact, according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, kids ages 5 to 14 get hurt more often than bicyclists of any other age. All riders, even moms and dads, should wear properly fitting helmets that sit evenly between their ears and low on their forehead, and bike riders should dress in reflective, brightly colored clothing so drivers can easily spot them.

It's important to eat a balanced meal prior to exercising to keep energy up throughout the ride. Take along a protein-filled picnic, like a turkey wrap made with fresh veggies, to fuel your ride home. Remember biking is exercise so drink plenty of water before, during and after your ride. Try freezing a water bottle the night before so it will stay cool during a hot day.

As they say, practice does make perfect. Attempt these fun tricks as an exercise before an outing:

- Set a course: To help riders master turning and breaking, arrange an obstacle course in your driveway with obstructions like cones or boxes.

- Bike with balance: Start new



riders off on a bike with training wheels to help them get a handle on balancing and pedaling.


"Ranger Rick" is often used by teachers to stimulate interest in wildlife and wild places. In 2006, the magazine received the Teachers' Choice Award for the "Family by Learning" magazine (leading magazine for elementary school teachers).

Expanding on what "Ranger Rick" has been encouraging for 40 years; the National Wildlife Federation is launching a new program as an antidote for kids with "nature deficit disorder." The Green Hour is designed to get kids away from their electronic

screens and go outside every day to connect with nature.

These outdoor adventures can promote creativity, lower stress levels, build fitter, leaner bodies, inspire a sense of wonder, and instill caring and responsibility for all things wild. Are your kids healthy and active or do they fit into the growing number of youngsters who are overweight? According to the federal government, obesity among American children is a major health concern.


Today, almost 9 million children ages 6 to 10 are considered overweight – three times the proportion just 25 years ago. And overweight children tend to grow into overweight adults with a host of medical problems, including Type II Diabetes, heart disease, osteoporosis, bowel cancer, high blood pressure and more.

Realizing the existence of a unique opportunity to influence change, four years ago the Professional Baseball Athletic Trainers Society (PBATS) teamed up with the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons (AAOS) and the American Diabetes Association (ADA) to launch a nationwide effort to teach kids the benefits of a healthy diet and regular exercise. The program's main message: "Get out and play. It's fun."

"We are an organization founded to educate athletic trainers but have evolved to expand our mission into the communities. It's a great awareness program; one we're excited to partner with for years to come," says Jamie Reed, PBATS president and the man credited with coming up with the idea for the campaign.

The program he helped develop, called PLAY, which stands for Promoting a Lifetime of Activity for Youth, has evolved into a multimillion-dollar campaign aimed directly at the youth of America. It includes a series of radio and television public service announcements featuring Major League Baseball players who urge kids to stay active and eat right.

"Play a sport! Dance, swim, walk with a friend. Have some fun... go out and play -- it's



healthy," says Jim Thome in one of the ads that has aired in television markets across the country.

In addition to the PSAs, PLAY also involves clinics held at professional ballparks in which a group of boys and girls are invited to come down to the field for the thrill of their lives. They learn about living a healthy lifestyle from Major League ball players and their medical teams – people they idolize. The invited kids are all ones who have raised money and awareness in their communities about childhood obesity and diabetes.

Among the players scheduled to participate in this year's planned events, World Series MVP David Eckstein, NL Batting Champ Freddy Sanchez, All-Star Jim Thome, Curtis Granderson, Brandon Inge, Tony Clark, Ian Kinsler, Ryan Zimmerman and many more.

"At our clinics, the kids learn about good sportsmanship, how to avoid sports injuries, how to stretch, how to build strong bones and how to eat healthy while at the same time getting the once-in-a-lifetime chance to

interact with some of the biggest names in baseball and the trainers who have helped make them so successful. You can't beat that," says Reed, who credits a great deal of the program's success to the support offered by its partners.

At each PLAY event, the AAOS provides an orthopedic surgeon who talks to the kids about bone and muscle health, the importance of getting enough calcium and how to prevent

sports injuries.

"We feel it's critical for kids to not only learn how to hit and pitch, but what they should do to avoid injuries and build strong bones. At each event, we focus on the importance of warming up before each practice or game, and show the kids what kinds of exercise and stretches they should do. We also answer questions they have, like how many pitches they can safely throw in a single game," says Dr. Frank Kelly of Macon, Ga., a spokesperson for the AAOS.

The American Diabetes Association, meantime, supplies the expertise to help kids make good food choices. "We send nutritionists to each event to talk to the kids about healthy eating and to answer any questions they may have," says Michael Curren, field vice president for the Northern division of the ADA. "Childhood obesity and diabetes in young people are major concerns of ours. This event is the perfect opportunity to raise awareness."

"I think PLAY is a great program. I think it's a great message, and the message is saying not only to be active, but also to eat right. It's just good for just general health," says Los Angeles Dodgers first

baseman Nomar Garciaparra who participated in last year's clinic at Dodger Stadium.

Their first year out, only three Major League Baseball teams participated in the event. This year, thanks to support from the League, there are already 14 confirmed and more are expected to join in before the end of the season.

- Pack extra water supplies. Include water shoes that make it easier to navigate the pool decks and swimsuit cover-ups to keep your family cozy on the way to and from the waterpark.

- Don't forget about the adults. Parents can have fun too by seeking out resorts that feature amenities adults can enjoy such as on-site spas and golf packages.




Show us what needs to be done and we'll do it

A new survey shows that while a majority of American adults volunteer, a significant number of others are willing to serve - but don't. Nearly two in three Americans (64 percent) said they had completed some form of volunteer work in 2006, but nearly nine in 10 (86 percent) said they were willing to volunteer - a gap of 22 percent.

The December 2006 survey by Thrivent Financial for Lutherans suggests that many would-be volunteers could use a helping hand to step from "willing" to "serving."

"Americans genuinely want to help others, but sometimes our actions don't follow our intentions," says Brad Hewitt, senior vice president for Thrivent Financial, and the person who oversees volunteer programs for the organization's nearly 3



million members. "If we're going to move potential volunteers from 'want to' to 'got to,' then the volunteer community needs to create opportunities that are flexible and easy to access."

Despite respondents' nearly universal willingness to volunteer, the Thrivent Financial survey revealed that most Americans find it easier to give money to support a charitable cause than to give their time. Fifty-three percent of respondents said money was easier to give, 30 percent said time was easier to give, and 14 percent said both were equally easy to give.

That's one reason Thrivent Financial offers options to help people support causes they care about. The organization's programs are locally driven and designed to make volunteering flexible.

"People are more likely to volunteer when they can do something they really care about," Hewitt notes. "Everybody wins when volunteers can roll up their sleeves, so to speak, and see tangible results right away."

Hewitt offers these tips for those willing to volunteer:

- Find your passion. Identify those needs or issues that touch your heart, emotions and will. Focus your volunteer service around these concerns, even though you get asked to help in many other areas.

- Identify what you need. Pinpoint what you hope to get out of your volunteer service (for example, new experiences, skill development, camaraderie, networking opportunities, sense of accomplishment). If you've done 10 fundraising walks already, you may want to try something else.

- See what's out there. Find out if an organization already exists that addresses your passion and needs. If not, you may have discovered a new opportunity.

- Assess your skills. Understand the skills you bring to an organization. Let your volunteer organization know about your strengths.



Safe grilling tips for summer fun

With the outdoor barbecue season coming into full swing, the New York Propane Gas Association is reminding people that grilling safety should always be on the outdoor cooking menu.

Propane is the most common fuel used for outdoor grills, so as the warm weather arrives we always like to remind barbecue enthusiasts about the importance of gas grill safety," said Barbara Roach, executive director of the New York Propane Gas Association. "By following some basic safety tips, grill owners can ensure that each cookout is safe and enjoyable."


The New York Propane Gas Association recommends the following tips for the safe operation and maintenance of a gas grill:

- Always follow grill manufacturer's instructions and keep written materials accessible.
- Always keep the lid open when lighting your grill.
- Always keep the grill in a well-ventilated area at least 10 feet away from the house. Never use a grill indoors.
- Before connecting the cylinder to a grill for the first time, use a leak detection solution (a 50/50 mixture of water and liquid soap) to check connections for leaks. Never use matches or lighters to check for leaks.
- Keep all flammable materials away from the grill.
- If the grill doesn't ignite within 10 seconds, turn off the gas, keep the lid open and wait five minutes before trying again.
- Trim excess fats from meats; replace greasy

lava rock or ceramic briquettes, and keep the grill clean to reduce the potential for flare-ups.


- Never leave a hot grill unattended.
- Always use or store propane cylinders outdoors in an upright position.
- Do not allow children to tamper with the grill or propane cylinder.
- When refilling the cylinder, always have the supplier check for dents, damage, rust or leaks.
- After filling or exchanging a cylinder, take it home immediately. While transporting a cylinder, keep the vehicle ventilated and the valve closed or capped. Never transport a propane cylinder in the trunk.
- Do not smoke when handling a propane cylinder.
- Regularly check the tubes that lead into the burner for blockage from insects or food grease.
- Use a pipe cleaner or wire to clear blockage, pushing it through to the main part of the burner.
- When the grill is not in use, cover the disconnected hose end fittings with plastic bags or protective caps to keep them clean.

Propane is a safe, clean, versatile and highly efficient fuel that can be used for other outdoor products to help extend the summer season. In recent years, propane has become an increasingly attractive energy source for such consumer-friendly outdoor products as pool and patio heaters and mosquito magnets. Personal fitness for busy boomers

Skipping meals or eating too little throughout the day activates the body's starvation response

and actually slows the metabolic rate.

Multi-tasking fitness

With work hours getting longer, many Americans can find it hard to fit fitness in their schedules. But there are simple exercises people can do in their everyday lives that won't take up as much time.

For example, while talking on the phone to a friend after a day at work, instead of sitting on the couch, try "pretend sitting." Simply find a wall and lower your back against the wall until you are in a sitting position. Hold it for as long as you can, or for up to 60 seconds and you will firm your thigh muscles, all while catching up with your friend.

Elevators are a great invention, but they don't help burn calories. Whenever possible, take the stairs instead of the elevator. At work, instead of sending an e-mail across the office, take a break and walk over to update your co-worker. Choosing to walk instead of taking the easy way out will help boost your physical and mental health.



SPAC unveils amphitheater renovations

New seats are among upgrades at facility

The Saratoga Performing Arts Center on Saturday, May 26, unveiled the first major renovations to the amphitheater in its 40-plus-year history.

The renovation work includes upgrades to infrastructure and the grounds, amphitheater improvements and new seats, dressing and rehearsal rooms, rain screens, acoustic panels, paint and lighting.

After \$2 million was spent prior to last season on upgrades to infrastructure

and the grounds, another \$2.1 million in state money went into the amphitheater over the past nine months for new seats, dressing and rehearsal rooms, rain screens, acoustic panels, paint and lighting. Some of original light fixtures, mounted to the soaring ceiling, hadn't worked in 15 years, since a search-and-rescue team clambered out on the steel trusses with replacement bulbs in hand.

The SPAC amphitheater features 5,248 new seats, about 150 more than in the previous configuration. Beverages will be allowed in the amphitheater for the first time, "to enhance the SPAC experience," said Marcia J. White, president and executive director of SPAC.

The new seats have cupholders, aisle lights at the end of every other row, and cushions. The decorative wall at the front of the stage, called the Galaxy Curtain, was commissioned by SPAC in 1981 from artist Yasuhide Kobashi. The \$81,000 artwork consists of a steel frame, wood panels and 3-inch-diameter acrylic holes to admit light.

Evoking the spirits of '60s — when New York City Ballet Orchestra Conductor Robert Irving raised his baton to open the first concert held at SPAC — Scooby Doo, the Batmobile and a Pontiac GTO were on hand for the day's events.

Saratoga Springs native Sarah Pedinotti gave a free performance during the reopening, as did opera singer Heidi Skok of the Lake George Opera and Time for Three, an acoustic-folk-jam band.

White said the revitalized performance space is an essential asset to the community because it provides cultural opportunities that appeal to a diverse audience. "A setting like this is too perfect

not to share with audiences of all ages," she said.

Clowns, ponies and face painters were on hand for the kids, and concession prices that were scaled back to 1966 pricing were appreciated by their parents. SPAC's big theme this summer is family-friendliness. The center will give free lawn admission for children 12 and younger all summer at every classical and jazz event during its 42nd season.

John Colucci was in Saratoga for a family member's wedding, but took time away to go to the reopening. He now lives in Redondo Beach, Calif., but said SPAC was big part of his and his friends' childhoods when they were growing up in Troy.

"We would come up here every summer for at least one show," he said. "If we couldn't get to someone we really wanted to see, like Rush or REM, we'd come up for any concert we could get to. It's nice to see that they've done some renovations."



Raymond Houghton

Dr. Raymond Carl Houghton Jr., 60, of Delmar, died Wednesday, May 30, at St. Peter's Hospice Inn.

Born in Greenfield, Mass., he lived throughout New England in his early years; he graduated from Pittsfield High School in 1965 and Norwich University in 1969 with a bachelor's degree in mathematics.

He began his career as a programmer for GE in Pittsfield, Mass., and Burlington, Vt. He served his country as a second lieutenant (101st Airborne) field artillery officer in the Vietnam War from 1971 and 1972.

His pursuits in academia became full time as he split work on completing his doctorate in computer science at Duke University in Durham, N.C., and as an associate professor at Augusta State University in Augusta, Ga., in the mid-'80s to early '90s. In 1991 he received his doctorate from Duke. He served as an adjunct lecturer at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs.

In 1995, he opened Cyberhaus, a computer cyberhaus, a computer center in Delmar. During this time he began to pursue his interest in history, specifically the Revolutionary War. He wrote several award-winning Revolutionary War travel books and hosted tours and talks on the subject. In 2005, he became town historian for Bethlehem and worked as a columnist for "Our Towne".

He had honors from the Department of Commerce; was consistently listed in Who's Who in America; was a Bethlehem Middle School mentor; he built and maintained several community Web sites including Feestelijik Bethlehem; sat on a committee that brought about the Bethlehem Veterans Memorial; and was a People to People Ambassador to China, Vietnam and Cambodia.

Survivors include his wife, Dr. Jan Laws Houghton of Delmar; a son, Raymond James Houghton of Philadelphia, Pa.; two daughters, Dr. April Houghton Blakeslee of Pittsfield, N.H.; and Amy Houghton of Kalamazoo, Mich.; two brothers, Jerry Houghton of Billerica, Mass.

and Scott Houghton of Simsbury, Conn.; a sister, Theresa Houghton of Las Vegas; and one grandson.



"basically acting exercises, adapted and put together as a stage show."

Yeara uses the very same games with the high school actors he works with in his day job at Bethlehem Central High School, where he teaches English and drama, and directs Theatre Without a Net's annual Shakespeare play.

Actors need to use all their senses while performing and not operate by rote, he said. The exercises, often used as a warm-up, are a way to stay focused on what's going on in the moment and to pay attention to the other actors on the stage.

"It's like scales to a musician or push-ups to an athlete," Yeara said.

Womachka has performed with Wit & Will for six of the group's almost 10 years. Currently at seven players, the acting troupe works as a collective, without a hierarchy of any kind.

"The troupe is stronger than it's been in a long time," she said.

Audiences are solid as well, often filling Zuzu's for the comedy shows.

"It's really been growing and surprising us," said Womachka. "It's exciting. We create every thing out of nothing," said Womachka. "We just use our imagination and the imagination of the audience. We believe our audience is smart."

Acting games for fun and fathers

Comedy troupe performs in Albany

Ever wondered if your life has the makings of a musical? If you're game, Wit & Will's comedy troupe will give it a try.

"Your Life, The Musical" is one of many games that the troupe performs at its monthly improvisation shows, said actor Janet Womachka. "We pick an audience member and ask them 10 questions."


The questions are about significant others, hobbies, and embarrassing moments, she said.

"We create a musical about their life on the spot," Womachka said.

This weekend's show will be at Zuzu's Wonderful Life, a café and performance space that spans two row houses, giving it an address of 299-301 Hamilton Street

(between Swan and Dove) in Albany. You can enjoy coffee, tea, and dessert during the show.

First, the players explain a little about what they're doing and then the games begin. The troupe tries to involve the audience as much as possible, taking suggestions for characters or scenarios and sometimes inviting them onto the stage. What results are skits, anywhere from three to 30 minutes long, that may include song and dance in addition to dialogue and pratfalls.



"The shows are funny," said player Jim Yeara, who is a founder of the troupe.

He likens the show to television's "Whose Line is it Anyway?"

"What you're seeing is a different kind of acting," Yeara said. "It's not scripted."

Another game the troupe plays is called Blind Freeze. Audience members call out physical positions for two players, who then have to create a scene that justifies those positions.

"Then, someone yells 'freeze,'" said Yeara, and a third actor replaces one of the two on stage - taking their frozen position - and the action continues.

In addition to comedy, Wit & Will Theatre performs Shakespeare in the summers as well as straight plays and original works.

Womachka wrote and produced a short play last year entitled, "Left

Behind." The serious work is on the fringy side, said Womachka, which she sees as a good thing.

"It lets people have a voice," she said.





Barna drove in Troy's two runs with a first inning double and a third inning single — two of only five hits Polsinelli allowed.

The Dutchmen advanced to Tuesday's regional game against Section III champion Utica-Proctor in Rome with the hopes of adding another title to the banner. C.J. Sohl was the scheduled starter.

"I think if we play our game, we should be able to win," said LaValley.

Lady Dutch take title

After ending Bethlehem's eight-year reign as Section II girls lacrosse champions in the class A semifinals, the Guilderland Lady Dutch became the third team in area history to win the title with last Thursday's 9-7 victory over Shaker at the University at Albany.

Shaker built a 2-0 lead before Guilderland took over with six consecutive goals in the first half. Chelsey Newman started the run with the first of her two goals, and Jen Madsen tied the game with less than 12 minutes left. Danielle Petreault then tallied three of the Lady Dutch's final four goals of the half to put her team ahead 6-2.

Petreault scored her fourth goal early in the second half to put Guilderland ahead by five goals. Shaker rattled off a 5-2 run to make the game close, but Jen Kaye made a couple of key saves in the final three minutes to seal the Lady Dutch's win.



Johnson repeats as champ

Wegman leads local contingent at Run for Women

Benita Johnson waited until the right moment to make her move, and it paid off.

"My race strategy was to run with the pack and make my move toward the end," said Johnson.

That move came as Johnson and Leghzaoui neared the edge of Washington Park. Johnson surged ahead by a step. Leghzaoui, the 2005 champion, tried to regain the lead, but Johnson began pulling away as they headed down Madison Avenue toward the finish line at the Empire State Plaza.

"I think we were both really, really tired at that point," said Johnson, who finished with a winning time of 15:22. "Once I sensed I had a few meters on her, I just pushed harder."

Johnson said winning the race a second time meant more than

her inaugural win last year.

"It means a great deal because once you win the race and become the defending champion, you feel pressure to do it again," she said.

Former Queensbury resident Emily McCabe was the top American finisher with a ninth-place performance in a time of 16:11.1. Delmar's Roxanne Wegman was the top local finisher with a 51st-place performance in a time of 19:31.
