

Kiwanis Club to serve fall pancake breakfast

The Kiwanis Club of Delmar will hold its annual fall pancake breakfast on Saturday, Oct. 13, from 8 a.m. to noon at the Delmar Presbyterian Church, 585 Delaware Ave., Delmar.

It is an all-you-can-eat breakfast featuring orange juice, pancakes, sausage, coffee, tea or milk.

The cost is \$5 for adults, \$4 for seniors and children younger than 12 are \$3.50. Pre-school children are free.

All proceeds go to fund Kiwanis Projects for Youth, including projects for K-Kids, Builder's Club at the middle school, Key Club at the high school and Circle K at the University of Albany.

In addition, money raised through fundraisers benefits community groups such as Little League and Babe Ruth.

Each year, Kiwanis sends at least one child with disabilities to Kamp Kiwanis for a week.

The motto of Kiwanis is "Serving Children of the World," and this goal is met by supporting projects to reduce Iodine Deficiency Syndrome.

Kiwanis, along with UNICEF, has almost eradicated the disease, which causes mental retardation in children.

The major local project is support for the Pediatric Trauma Unit at the Children's Hospital at Albany Medical Center.

To date, almost \$400,000 has been collected for this project.

The Delmar club alone gives almost \$10,000 each year for pediatric trauma.



ELECTION '07: Town of Bethlehem Justice

Judge job 'rewarding,' incumbent says Challenger says he'll offer up new ideas

Paul Dwyer says busy town court needs someone decisive and fair

Democrat/Independence incumbent Paul Dwyer is running for re-election as one of two part-time judges serving the town of Bethlehem.

Dwyer has served in the position since 2003 when Theresa Egan resigned as town justice to run for supervisor.

"I was appointed by the town board in the spring of 2003 and then ran that same year and won," said Dwyer.

Along with his four years as Bethlehem justice, Dwyer served as a substitute trial judge in Albany City Court for four years, and has been a practicing attorney for more than 30 years. He has spent 17 years as a prosecutor and 10 years as defense attorney. His educational background includes a law degree from the New England School of Law. He has been in private practice in this area since 1980 with several years of service in the Albany County district attorney's office under former District Attorney Sol Greenberg. Dwyer said he is running for reelection because he enjoys the time he serves as justice in Bethlehem town court.

"It's a great job," said Dwyer. "It's very rewarding."

Dwyer and his opponent Daniel Persing agree that Bethlehem Town Court is busy, and on some nights people are lined up in the hallway waiting for their turn.

"There are eight court sessions each month, four for each judge," Dwyer said. One night is for trials, another for arraignments, and one for small claims cases.

"You have to be able to do the right thing and do it quickly, and that takes a lot of years of experience," said Dwyer.

He credits his many years as a prosecutor handling felonies in area courts and as a member of the district attorney's office as an important reason to keep him in the justice seat.

"The real background you bring to the job is all those decades in town court," Dwyer said.

Door-to-door campaigning is not as familiar to a judge as it is for candidates who typically run for other offices, but Dwyer said he has been making the rounds and enjoying the experience.

"There are so many registered voters, you can't hit them all," Dwyer said.

Dwyer also teaches law at Siena College and is an instructor for the state Office of Court Administration. He said the people who work in town court, along with the local police department, are strong town assets.

"I love this job, and I think I do a really good job," Dwyer said. "The court is run very well and the feedback I get is positive."

Daniel Persing says he would address long court waits and repeat offenders

Daniel J. Persing believes a "fresh outlook" is needed in the Bethlehem Town Court system, and that is one of the reasons he decided to run for town justice.

Persing, who lives in Delmar, is an Albany attorney working in general law with a concentration in litigation. A graduate of Albany Law School of Union University and a practicing attorney in the area for more than 20 years, Persing is the Republican/Conservative candidate for the justice seat. He said he sees many repeat offenders go through the town court system, and it's time to turn that cycle around.

"We have got to find other alternative programs," said Persing, who said he feels current treatment programs for offenders are not working.

"I know there are programs out there to examine the roots of the problem," he said.

He pointed to counseling and anger management programs as possible alternatives for domestic dispute offenders.

Persing, who decided to run for the office in

May, pointed to youthful offenders as another area of need he would address if elected.

"I am very youth-oriented, and I am concerned with how our youth are going through the court system," Persing said.

Persing said he believes he could bring about some changes to alleviate the delays that plague Bethlehem courts.

"It is not uncommon to sit for an hour and wait," said Persing. "I would be willing to change the time of court or to add a morning court session if elected."

In other towns, such as Colonie, the facility holds two courts. Persing said Bethlehem's Town Court might have outgrown the current space it occupies inside Town Hall on Delaware Avenue.

"The facilities may be in need of an upgrade with the number of people we have going through the courts," Persing said.

Like all candidates running for office, Persing is making the door-to-door rounds, greeting residents who are listening to what he has to say.

"It's a large town with a lot of great people who are truly interested in how this town is being governed," said Persing.

Persing is a member of the Trial Lawyers of America, the state Bar Association and the state Trial Lawyers Association. He also teaches law as an adjunct professor of trial practice at Albany Law School of Union University.

"I know I am capable of doing this job, and I can bring solid management skills to the position of justice in town court," said Persing.

The town justice position in Bethlehem is part time, with an annual salary of \$43,085.

ELECTION '07: Town of Bethlehem Receiver of Taxes

Incumbent touts experience Newcomer eyes role

The office of Receiver of Taxes may not be a high-profile one, but in Bethlehem more than \$86 million in total town taxes was collected in 2006 alone.

Incumbent Republican/Conservative candidate Nancy Mendick said for that reason alone, consistency is key when voting for someone to serve in the four-year elected position.

"I have worked in that office for 20 years, and most people say why fix something that isn't broken," said

Mendick has been the Bethlehem receiver of taxes for 12 years and is running for a fourth term on Nov. 6. She is a leader of the Empire State Receivers and Collectors Association and a member of the state Receiver and Collectors Association.

Mendick said she believes it is her duty to provide the highest level of service at the least possible cost to the taxpayer.

"I have a terrific staff, and they are dedicated," said Mendick, who currently has two full-time and two part-time employees working under her direction. In addition to collecting school and town taxes, the office issues many building, sewer, tap and meter permits and works with more than 30 banks to keep track of escrow accounts for homeowners. September, when school tax collection begins, is the busiest and most stressful month, according to Mendick.

"It's busy," said Mendick. "We collect for three different school districts, and sometimes we work nine-hour days to get it done."

There have been many changes in the collection of taxes and other duties of the office since Mendick took over for Ken Hahn 12 years ago, including the computerization of tax bill collection.

"He brought me in as clerk, and he taught me everything,"

said Mendick, who ran for the position and won following Hahn's retirement after 33 years.

Holding office hours on Saturday before tax deadlines, and allowing for auto-pay payments for tax and water bills are a few of the improvements in the office since Mendick took over.

"We also have a convenient drop box outside the building so residents can make payments on their way to work," Mendick said.

Mendick said part-time wages in her office have decreased 13 percent over a 10-year period and controllable expenses like office and furniture supplies is also down since she took over.

Her civic involvements include presiding over the Bethlehem Business Woman's Club the past two years as well as being a member of the town historical association, the Friends of the Library, and the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce. Mendick is a lifelong resident of the town. She lives in Selkirk with her husband, Richard, who is running for Albany County legislator in the 36th District, and has three married children and three grandchildren.

Mendick said she can't lower a person's taxes but she can make taxpaying easier.

"Customer service is what our office is all about," said Mendick.

Democrat Patricia Parsons is challenging Mendick for the receiver of taxes position.

Democrat and Independence Party candidate Patricia Parsons will try to unseat Republican/Conservative incumbent Nancy Mendick in the race for receiver of taxes in the town of Bethlehem.

Parsons is currently the administrative assistant to the Albany County department of general services commissioner and has worked in Albany County for 30 years. Prior to her current position, she was the administrative assistant to the commissioner in the Department of Social Services in Albany County.

"I love the county, and I like to meet and work with people," said Parsons, who said she can bring innovation and efficiency to the receiver of taxes position.

"A fresh pair of eyes can sometimes look at the office and do things more efficiently and cost effectively," said Parsons.

This is Parsons' second attempt at capturing an elected office in Bethlehem. In 2001 she ran against Kathy Newkirk for town clerk and was defeated.

"I lost, but I enjoyed the experience," said Parsons who believes this time around will be different.

"I am going door to door, and the people are great," Parsons said.

Parsons is also campaigning with current town supervisor Jack Cunningham on some of her door-to-door stops.

"Jack is a good supervisor who is continuing the work Terri Egan and the town board have begun," said Parsons.

She said she believes residents are pleased with the current direction the town is heading in.

"It's a united team," said Parsons.

As for the office of receiver of taxes, Parsons said she would improve customer service by creating more flexible hours and expanding payment options.

"I would like to look at the possibility of paying taxes through credit cards," said Parsons.

Her opponent, Nancy Mendick has also said credit card payment for taxes is an option to pursue.

Parsons said there are busy months in the tax office, but once taxes are received staff could be assisting the town in other areas.

"I'm sure there are times we could lend a hand to other offices in town," said Parsons.

Parsons' community affiliations include chairing the Albany County Department of Social Services AIDS Task Force and being a member of the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post American Legion.

"I look forward to serving people in the town," said Parsons.

The receiver of taxes position pays \$59,743 annually.

I grew up afraid of dogs, or at the very least, indifferent to them.

My father's animal phobia peppered our childhood with irrational fears that seeped into the corners of our minds.

"A dog will attack you if it gets a chance," he instructed my sisters and me, not even blinking as he said this.

Fast forward a couple decades when, newly married, my husband and I dabbled in pet ownership. We had a tiny lemon yellow canary whose warbling songs nearly broke our hearts. When he died, we buried him in a handmade box covered with a potpourri heart from our wedding. We had a 50-gallon fish tank that entertained our then-baby daughter, Sasha, better than television. As two sons joined our family, the menagerie expanded to include Sally the bunny, Sophie the guinea pig, Poppy the hamster, and a couple of mice whose names and presence in my house I managed to completely ignore.

Plagued with allergies, middle son Ryan and I endured allergy shots for four years, eventually being declared "clear."

And so we arrived at last spring, and the notion of owning a puppy kept cropping up in my mind much like a bad case of baby lust.

I floated the idea past my family. My sons, who had always planned to fill their own future homes with furry friends, were stunned.

In our classic form of putting the cart before the horse, we discussed names, whittling the list down to favorites Dakota and Milo, or Miloh for a girl.

"I can't imagine our house with a dog," said Sasha.

Neither could I. Maybe that challenge was what brought on action.

a few weeks," said my husband, who is, appropriately, a certified financial planner and the official yin to my yang.

Two days later, discarding my husband's advice entirely, Ryan and I drove to a private pet store in Glens Falls. We had in mind a small, possibly hairless dog that wouldn't make us sneeze.

And then we saw her.

In a large sawdust lined pen, with an orange Playskool slide in the middle, two yappy gray poodles were using a small brown ball of fluff as a stepladder. The poodles yelped to be picked up, while beneath them, the fur ball waited patiently.

I had never held a dog in my life. The four-pound female Chihuahua-Yorkie mix ("Chorkie") wiggled, licked, and swung her paws in what we now call her "swimming" motion. I knew instantly she was Miloh, and that she was meant to be ours.

Miloh is lounging on a fuzzy yellow pillow on the windowsill as I write this. Six months old now, she is the most incredible creature since my own children. She was blessedly house-trained in under a month. We listen for the jingling of her tags as she chases us around the house. She does a Bambi-prancing in tall grass across the road. She rolls on her back to show us her skinny tummy and fragile rib bones. She smells like damp grass and sunshine. After I carry her around, she smells like my shampoo.

When she outgrew her rainbow striped puppy collar, I wore it as a bracelet. She lost a baby tooth smaller than the white end of candy corn. When she sneaks downstairs at night to snooze on the couch, I follow her and scoop her back up to our bed. She sleeps in a perfect circle.

We've broken all the rules we set when Miloh came home.

She's abandoned her crate as a quiet spot, the gates blocking off the carpeted rooms of our house are gone, she's learned to hop up and down the stairs, she lies around wherever she likes. We're trying to keep her on puppy chow, which is hard when everyone sneaks her deli turkey.

One of the most remarkable things about Miloh and my family is listening to them all, including my business-mannered husband, baby talk to her. She has many nicknames, none of them explainable, Miloh Gusta, Gusta, Booster, Baby Doll, and Fat Dog, the biggest misnomer of them all.

Miloh was chugging down the stairs the other day with a chopstick in her mouth.

"Don't run with that stick," I called to her, like a mother warning her kids not to run with scissors.

With the onset of school, Miloh mopes around the house now devoid of the loud voices of my children. She barks only at her own shadow in a darkened

window. Her belly rumbles as she growls. She loves people and other dogs, her two-inch tail like a metronome as she runs to everyone she meets. Miloh. She's like a Christmas gift every day.

A dog will attack you if it gets

a chance. I know this now to be untrue. Here are the truths I do know: a dog will bring you to your knees, literally and figuratively. A dog makes a house a home. A dog will burrow its wet nose and grass-stained paws into your heart, and stay there forever.



Grants to bring upgrades to Bethlehem airport

Assemblyman Tim Gordon (I-Bethlehem) recently announced two grants totaling nearly a half million dollars for local projects at Bethlehem's South Albany Airport. The funds are part of the \$43 million sanctioned for transportation infrastructure improvements in aviation, rail and port capital projects across the state.

The grants - from the voter-approved \$2.9 billion Renew and Rebuild New York Transportation Act - include \$270,000 for a 10-bay hangar and \$150,000 for security fencing at South Albany Airport.

"As an auxiliary emergency landing site, the improvements at South Albany contribute to the state's goal of modernizing and maintaining secure, reliable travel," Gordon said. "Earlier this year, I met with Wayne Wegman and Sean Bray from the New York Aviation Management Association to discuss their plans for improvements at the airport and potential funding options. Today I'm pleased to announce that South Albany Airport is getting much

needed funding."

South Albany's \$270,000 grant will help the privately owned airfield build a third hangar to house several planes now parked on the grass. The 10-bay hangar and associated taxi lanes will increase safety and revenue for the airfield.

The airport will use its \$150,000 grant to fund the second phase of the airport's security fencing project, which began last year. The money will be used to build access control gates and complete installation of the security fence on the airport's perimeter, reducing trespassing and wildlife entry.



Keep public debate civil

In one of the bigger instances of dereliction of duty we've seen in a while, Saratoga Springs' Commissioner of Public Safety Ron Kim walked out of a City Council meeting on Oct. 2 when a vote didn't go the way he wanted.

Where does a public servant get off wasting not just time, but taxpayer money?

Political squabbling in Saratoga Springs — like many towns — has become an all-too-frequent occurrence. The Oct. 2 vote led to the 3-to-2 defeat of a proposal to build a public safety facility on a city-owned lot on Woodlawn Avenue, something that's been a controversial issue among council members for a while. When a democratic vote reached its conclusion, it was incumbent upon everyone to accept it. If leaders have so little regard for the democratic process, what lesson does that teach the rest of the citizenry? We have been alarmed at the lack of civility in public discourse. Many town meetings in the areas we cover regularly are rife with shouted exchanges and insults.

We're better than this, people. Disagreement is to be expected, especially when issues hit close to the heart, the home or the wallet. It's critical that we have open and honest debate, and that we keep it respectful. The person you insult at today's meeting could be the person you stand behind at the supermarket tomorrow. Most of us want a better lifestyle for ourselves, our children and our communities. When we disagree about how to arrive at that better point, it's important to remember that we all walk the same streets every day.

We praise the towns that welcome the community as they shape public policy and approach issues that affect everyone. When Bethlehem created its master plan, regular meetings drew hundreds of attendees. When Luther Forest first hit the radar screen, there were plenty of public meetings to attend. Most of the discussions on these vital issues were civil, and led the way to improved plans for the future.

We encourage open government process, whether it has to do with water plans or development plans. This is, after all, a democracy and it is up to all of us to take that seriously.

Especially our leaders.

Help for those affected by suicide



It is a reality that some people at some point in their lives may feel they are in so much pain that the only way to make the pain stop is to die. People who have come close to killing themselves or had thoughts of it, have often said that there was just too much pain. The pain of living was worse than the uncertainty of death.

What do we know about suicide? What we know is that 90 percent of people who die by suicide are also suffering from one or more psychiatric disorders. Depression. Anxiety. Bipolar disorder. Addictions. Schizophrenia. Personality disorders. All have been implicated in suicides. And all, unfortunately, are more common than we think.

We also know that suicide occurs not just because of a mental illness, but is really a "perfect storm" of many factors, including genetic factors, biologic factors, personality, past experiences, life stressors, interpersonal connectedness, social issues and access to a means for suicide.

So what is being done on a local level to help those who may be suffering from a life crisis, a mental illness or thoughts of suicide? There are many organizations throughout our community that help those in emotional distress. Here at the Samaritans, we are busy every day building our program and our capacity to serve our community. A typical day for me involves speaking to a community group about volunteer opportunities, responding to a particularly

desperate e-mail from someone thinking about ending his or her life, organizing the details of our annual Hope Vigil event and preparing curriculum for upcoming volunteer trainings. It is a busy and important job, and I am committed to making the Samaritans a program that truly reaches the people who most need it: those in crisis who are finding life to be a difficult road.

Our primary service is our Crisis Helpline 689-4673 (HOPE), which is staffed by caring and compassionate volunteers from our community. Anyone within our community who is in crisis may call our line and receive an anonymous, confidential, compassionate listening service. Often, in fact, the service we provide on the crisis helpline serves to prevent an escalation of a crisis, a crisis that might have resulted in violence towards oneself or to others.

Our current hours of operation are limited, with growth in hours of coverage planned over the next six months. We are open 6 to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday, with other varied weekend and nighttime hours as well.

Our volunteers come from all walks of life and go through a rigorous and professional training program that prepares them for work on the Helpline. Our volunteers gain valuable life experience and skills as they practice precise communication tools and models in our training program, that will help them work with depressed, lonely and sometimes suicidal people on our phone lines. Samaritans' volunteers gain skills and experience they can't find anywhere else.

Our annual Hope Vigil is an opportunity for those who have lost a loved one or a friend to suicide. It is a place to come together to honor and remember the person they have lost. Our 2007 Hope Vigil will be held Sunday, Oct. 14, from 2 to 5 p.m. at the Desmond Hotel and Conference Center in Albany.

Family members, loved ones and friends of those who have died of suicide

are invited to partake in a beautifully orchestrated program including music, an audio-visual presentation, words from a spiritual leader, an address by a bereaved parent, a gift of remembrance ceremony and a presentation of names.

Registration for the event is encouraged. Participants who are registered will be able to submit a photo and written piece (200 words or less) about a loved one or a friend for inclusion in a remembrance book and an audio-visual presentation.

On average, six people are intimately affected by the death of each person by suicide. That means that in the Capital District, where one to two suicides occur per week (DOH 2000-2003), anywhere from six to 16 people become survivors every week. In a given year, there may be close to 550 new survivors of suicide in the Capital District.

How do we support our survivors? What can we do for them? The obvious need for a supportive network of services for those left behind is great, as survivors themselves are at a greater risk for suicide and also are dealing with a complex range of questions and emotions.

Natural support networks such as families, friends, workplaces, schools and neighborhoods are always the first and the last ones to step up and support those in need. Many survivors may also avail themselves of a counselor, a social worker or a psychologist who is able to allow them to express their painful feelings in the context of a warm, safe and professional environment.

Survivors can also call the Crisis Helpline at 689-4673 (HOPE). Community support groups for survivors of suicide also are extremely helpful, as survivors report they gain the greatest support from others who have experienced a similar loss. All services can be accessed through calling our Crisis Helpline during evenings, or the office at 462-6531, ext. 126, during business hours.



On the front page of the fall Bethlehem Report, the new supervisor's picture appeared in all three of the pictures and in 13 of the 14 pictures of the 12 age mailing. Should his Republican rival in the November election, be due "equal time?" Also, a Democratic member of the Albany County Legislature attempted, but failed, to have his primary opponent removed from the November ballot.

It seems that whether in Washington, D.C., or Bethlehem,

politicians do not want to give up the power of their political office.

Has the time come for the people to demand that control of

government be returned to them and that perhaps term limits be a beginning to that process?





Waterfront plan readies for review

Panel's study tackles inventory, policy-making for town's riverfront areas

After months of review and revisions, the Bethlehem Town Board will get a look at the town's local waterfront revitalization plan later this month.

A presentation is scheduled for Wednesday, Oct. 24, in advance of finalizing the waterfront study, which will occur in 2008.

"We are at a point where we feel the town board should be brought in on what we've done," said Rob Holzman, representing Saratoga Associates, the consultants hired to work with the waterfront committee on the project.

The nine-member committee has been meeting since November 2006. Its formation was based on a recommendation by the town's updated comprehensive plan, approved in 2005. The panel is tasked with conducting an inventory of waterfront

resources, formulating a master plan for the Henry Hudson Park, identifying significant waterfront issues and developing policy.

The committee's Tuesday, Oct. 2, meeting included policy review based on a set of standards from the state Department of State, the agency in charge of inland waterfront development. The presentation to the town

board will include a 15-minute summary of work the committee has completed.

A Nov. 7 public meeting in town hall will allow the community to comment on the waterfront plan, which is available for review. The plan will then be sent to the state for final revision.

"We are really looking at mid-winter for adoption of the (plan)," said George Leveille, town economic development director.

Areas reviewed in the yearlong study include the

potential of directly connecting Route 9W to the waterfront, redeveloping the Job Corps site and providing visitors with a pedestrian network system connecting natural areas with historic resources. Once the waterfront study is complete, Bethlehem will join other Capital District communities that also have a local waterfront revitalization plan along the Hudson River.

"Albany, East Greenbush and Troy all have LWRP's (local waterfront revitalization plans)," said Jamie Reppert, coastal resource specialist with the Department of State.

Reppert, who is providing the town with assistance during the planning process, said there are several reasons why Bethlehem should have a waterfront plan.

"There is policy advantages and funding advantages," said Reppert.

Once Bethlehem's LWRP is complete and approved by the town board, specific areas will be identified for potential state or federal funding through grant opportunities.

Circulation staff keeps library running smoothly

This is the first of two columns about the people who work in our Circulation/Technical Services Department – the library's nuts-and-bolts operation.

A patron's library experience often begins and ends with the person at the checkout desk. Our intrepid circulation team cheerfully handled well over a million check-ins and check-outs last year, an all-time high.

Patrons generally stock up on books and videos before a holiday, which means that business is especially brisk afterward. On the day after Memorial Day, for instance, our staff took care of 7,091 transactions across the desk, almost double the usual number.

The circulation staff also manages all the items on the "hold" shelves. These are the

books, audiobooks, CDs and DVDs you put on reserve. In addition to the shelves you see behind the checkout desk, there are banks of them on the other side of the wall. Circulation supervisor Betty Albright reports an average of 800 to 900 items on the hold shelves at any one time, 150 to 250 of which are processed on any one day.

Library without walls

As members of the Upper Hudson Library System, we engage in daily exchanges of patron-requested materials among the 29 libraries in Albany and Rensselaer counties.

"Our patrons can request items in person, by phone or online from any library in the system and pick up their requests right here,"



Albright said. "Our computer records show that patrons are making online requests and renewals 24 hours a day."

These system loans travel via courier and are managed by circulation staff. Our staff handles about 15 large bins of materials per day arriving from other UHLS libraries. Because we are one of the largest libraries in the system, we send out almost as much as we take in from all the other libraries combined. This free exchange greatly increases the borrowing pool for our

patrons, and the speed at which our circulation team processes these materials shortens the wait for requested items to a few days in most cases.

All in a day's work

If all this weren't enough, circulation personnel troubleshoot problems, maintain the community bulletin board and "Happenings" table in the lobby, handle overdues and renewals and issue new library cards to patrons of all ages. On occasion they are part of a library outreach team, visiting schools and other community agencies, issuing library cards and serving as library ambassadors. What's more, they handle all this with equanimity and grace. Our many hats are off to them.

Apples are the archetypal American fruit symbolizing agriculture and good health. It is interesting that in the Hudson Valley the fruit shares the season with a tradition that is decidedly not a health food—the beloved cider doughnut. Cider doughnuts are fried cakes flavored with apple cider and spiced with a dusting of cinnamon sugar, especially delicious when served piping hot. At Indian Ladder Farms we turn out thousands and thousands of these doughnuts to feed hungry apple pickers and it is no small task. On weekends our doughnut makers come to work in the dark and go home in the dark. We have been known to make well over 10,000 doughnuts in a day and could sell much more if we had equipment capable of higher volume.

Currently, like most doughnuts, our cider doughnuts are fried in an all-purpose vegetable shortening. It is made with partially hydrogenated soybean and cottonseed oil. It is essentially the same product as Crisco except it comes in a 50 pound block instead of a 16 ounce can. And yes, because it is partially hydrogenated, it contains trans fats which, unlike

apples, have been proven to be very bad for your health.

On May 14, 2007 the Albany County legislature voted unanimously to phase out the use of artificial trans fat in fried, baked and spreadable foods. Albany County followed in the steps of New York City which is phasing in a ban on trans fats that will be fully implemented as of July 2008.

Our goal is switch to a zero trans fat vegetable oil by or before 2008.

It turns out making doughnuts with a zero trans fat oil is not as simple a matter as substituting one oil for another. In fact Dunkin' Donuts has tried over 20 different types of oil in their effort to make the switch. The first ZTF oil we tested left a greasy coating on the outside of the doughnuts after they cooled. Worse yet, a bite of the doughnut itself turned into a gummy ball in our mouths. The second oil we tried made the doughnuts taste like they were cooked in the fake butter they use on movie popcorn and that was really repulsive. The third experiment gave us doughnuts that were a little tough on the outside but not too bad overall. The search continues but we'll get there.

Vegetable oil is hydrogenated by being put under pressure with hydrogen gas at a temperature between 250 to 400 degrees Fahrenheit for several hours in

the presence of a catalyst such as nickel or platinum. Why would anyone do such a thing to vegetable oil? You may ask and it is a good question. The answer is because it gives the vegetable oil a solid form, a longer shelf life, and increases the length of time it can be held at high heat before breaking down. The down side is that the hydrogenation process also causes hydrogen atoms to be randomly added to polyunsaturated fats changing natural oils into compounds called trans fatty acids. Consumption of these trans fatty acids have been proven to raise people's levels of bad cholesterol and we all know what that means.

So while we crank out traditional cider doughnuts we experiment with cooking our doughnuts in zero trans fat oils. Zero trans fat oils are generally made from canola oil, sunflower oil, palm oil, oleic oil, soybean oil or combinations of thereof. They are more expensive and they don't keep as long. The majority of our customers are not as concerned about trans fats in cider doughnuts as they might be in other foods because they don't generally eat them in quantity all year round. However we want to offer a healthy product (keeping in mind health is a relative term where doughnuts are concerned) and be in compliance with the county legislation once it is in effect. Wish us luck!

Phase two will take between six and eight months in order to allow the Department of Motor Vehicles to make necessary infrastructure changes.

The state Association of County Clerks estimates the new rules could result in 200,000 to 500,000 new licenses.

Saratoga County Clerk Kathleen Marchione, president of the New York State Association of County Clerks, proposed a resolution at a recent association meeting to urge the governor to withdraw his policy. Of the state's 62 county clerks, 29 voted in favor

of the resolution, four opposed, and three abstained. Twenty-six clerks did not participate in the meeting.

Marchione also said the policy will waste county and state resources. She said that if an illegal immigrant presents a document to the county clerk's office that is in a foreign language, that document must be scanned, then sent to and reviewed by a state agency to determine its validity. If the document turns out to be fake, the state has spent time and money without collecting a dime, she said.

"There has to be a way to recoup that money," she said. Marchione suggests a nonrefundable deposit, collected before paperwork begins.

She and about a dozen other

Republican clerks said they would not enforce Spitzer's policy, even though they would be in violation of the law and susceptible to lawsuits by whomever they denied a license.

John J. Woodward, the clerk of Schenectady County and a Democrat, said he will enforce the governor's policy and that partisan politics is the real issue in this debate.

As a New Yorker, Woodward said there are things about the policy he likes and things he dislikes. But as a county clerk, his position is much clearer:

"The bottom line is I have no choice when it comes to this policy. I would be violating my oath of office if I didn't uphold the law," he said. "I'm sure some of my constituents may not be happy about that, but I've got to choose what's legal over politics."

The Republican legislators in Schenectady County disagree with their clerk.

"As Republicans, we take the safety of the people of our community and state very seriously", Schenectady County Legislator James Buhrmaster stated. "Our county, state and nation have spent billions to improve the security of all Americans and to identify those who might wish to harm us. We publicly ask the governor to reconsider this unlawful and ill-conceived action. He should know we will not stand idly by as he tries to do by decree, what the law does not permit."

Spitzer says the policy will create safer streets, lower insurance rates and make the country safer.

"This policy change helps bolster homeland security by bringing more individuals into the system and, when necessary, assisting law enforcement efforts to locate those who present a real security threat," he said in a Sept. 21 written statement.

Law enforcement officials are hesitant to make an official statement on the policy itself, but some have chimed in with how it would affect their operations.


"We have strong feelings against any proposal that will provide illegal immigrants with enticements to enter a state and hide in plain sight," said T.J. Bonner, president of the National Border Patrol Council, in a written statement. The NBPC is the union that represents about 10,000 Border Patrol agents. "There's no doubt this would hamper homeland security."

Locally, one police department said it wasn't concerned with the new regulation affecting its work.

"The only thing we would be concerned with is whether or not a person has a valid New York state driver's license," said Lt. Greg Veitch, director of communications for the Saratoga Springs Police Department. "Who can apply, or how someone can apply does not affect us. If it's a valid New York document, it wouldn't affect our procedures at all."

age when horsepower had a different meaning.

Shedding our modern cares, a look around the grounds allows us to connect with key figures in history and prominent local personalities with stories to tell about their well-lived lives. Among those resting here is a well-spoken man with strong connections to the Capital District who became the leader of our nation after a popular president was shot while catching a train in Washington, D.C.

Yet, while our region is his final resting place, few know that former president Chester Alan Arthur is even here. Despite the small markers that show the route to his grave, it rarely draws a crowd.

"Usually we have school groups who come in every year on Oct. 5 because that is his birthday, and we also have a group of veterans that gathers on Memorial Day because he was a Civil War veteran, but other than that, there really isn't any organized activity for him," John Buszta, the registrar at the cemetery, said on a recent fall day.

That isn't how Arthur was received during his years at Union College in Schenectady. An articulate young man who traveled from Vermont to go to school there, the future president led one of the campus debating societies and joined Phi Beta Kappa, a premier academic honor society that had about one-third of his classmates as members. During his time at Union, Arthur left few lasting marks on the campus but he may have fostered a connection with fellow student William Seward who gained national prominence as a United States senator from New York and eventually as Secretary of State under Abraham Lincoln. Along with fighting slavery, one of Seward's lasting accomplishments was securing the purchase of Alaska from Russia, an acquisition that quickly became known as "Seward's Icebox" or, more commonly, "Seward's Folly."

A retired local scholar who spent four decades as a professor at Union has pointed to the ties between the two schoolmates

as an indication of how strong Arthur's anti-slavery views were. It also demonstrates the key role the college played as a breeding ground for influential political leaders in the pre-Civil war era.

"There's some real evidence that they were in correspondence with each other during the difficult days of the Civil War," James Underwood explained. "In 1862, the north was facing a major shortage of soldiers, but Lincoln didn't want to ask for them because it could have been seen as a sign that the war was not going well. So Seward sought to create a situation in which states would offer additional troops to the federal government and Arthur was part of that."

"Arthur was the adjutant general of the New York National Guard at the time and he was assigned the responsibility for raising an additional 120,000 troops from the state. But he did more than that, he raised close to 220,000 troops," said Underwood. "It was quite an astounding feat when you consider that there were anti-war riots going on in the streets of New York City at the time. It may have been one of his biggest accomplishments going into the presidency."

Recruiting the foot soldiers to fight and win the nation's bloodiest war wasn't Arthur's only accomplishment before taking on the country's highest office. He also gained a name throughout the state when he successfully championed a lawsuit ending the New York City transit system's policy of racial segregation.

"This was major victory and he won the case years before the Civil War even started," Underwood said.

"Arthur continued that same approach to racial justice when he was president and, in his own way, he was a civil rights leader before there even were 'civil rights' as we know them. For example, he had a black choir stay at the White House," said Underwood. "Now remember, this is in the 1880s when something like that had never been done before

"He was very strong when it came to enforcing the Pendleton Act, which was a reform that started implementing the civil service system in the federal government and cut down on the use of political influence to control those jobs," he said. "It was a major step forward in curbing abuse and made him very unpopular with the political bosses in New York State like Roscoe Conkling."

"Overall, I would say he was a very good president who was on the right side of all the major issues of his day, but it was a time when presidents were relatively weak and the federal government was going through an era of Congressional dominance," said Underwood. "If you look at the rankings that are published, and different publications do one about every year, you will see that he is down toward the bottom of those who are ranked in the middle, but I think that is mostly because presidents in the era from Lincoln to Theodore Roosevelt had such a weak role."

"He had a scandal-free administration and he really does deserve credit for having taken many important steps forward for the country," he said.

Those interested in stepping back into history can see Chester Alan Arthur's gravesite by visiting the Albany Rural Cemetery in the Village of Menands.





lines due out in November.

VersaTrans was hired by the town to draw the new school boundaries, which officials hope will provide more balance across the six schools.

Eagle Elementary, which is set to open in September of 2008, is expected to be the district's largest elementary school with 24 classrooms and a student population of 378. The next largest school will be Hamagrael at 342, a decrease of 155 students from the current enrollment of 497. Glenmont School will hold 298 students, down from 409. Elsmere will see a decrease of 44 students with their enrollment in 2008 set at 268. Clarksville, the district's smallest school with 271 students, will decrease to 205 students next year.

Loomis said enrollment calculations for Slingerlands in 2008 could not be determined because, unlike the other elementary schools, which will gain kindergartners from their own "home" areas, there will be no change in Slingerlands' current classroom size. However, changes in where those students are coming from are expected.

"You might have some Sling-

erlands students go to another school district and gain some students from elsewhere," said Loomis.

Many Slingerlands parents at the meeting appeared uncomfortable with that answer.

Board president James Lytle told the 60 parents in attendance to look at the enrollment estimates as just numbers at this time.

"It is important to view that number other than putting children's faces on it and adding them up," said Lytle. "That number should be dealt with a little less intensity."

The 24-member redistricting committee has finished their preliminary work drawing neighborhood boundary lines. Those lines will now be reviewed by VersaTrans staff with a deadline of Nov. 6, when possible boundary scenarios will be released. Establishing the final formal criteria for the process went through another round of debate between the committee and the public.

Of the criteria, which included achieving more rational boundaries, balancing school enrollment and addressing transportation efficiencies are criteria options, proximity to neighborhood schools was a main concern of several parents.

"It has to be considered," said parent Kim Wise. "You're

trying to develop a feeling of community."

Regina Frederick, an Orchard Street resident, said she is concerned the new proposed boundaries cut right through her existing neighborhood.

"Please do not put anybody on a bus and take them away from a local school where they can walk," said Frederick.

Doug Hamlin, president of VersaTrans said the criteria needs to be set so work can continue in the "proper fashion."

"I wish I could tell you tonight how this will all come to look, but that is the work we have to do," Hamlin said.

Proposed changes to neighborhood boundary lines are on display at each redistricting meeting. Parents in attendance said they would like to see each proposed map on the district's Web site for review.

"If we just start throwing maps online, it will create more confusion and more difficulty than it helps someone," said Loomis.

Updates on the redistricting process can be reviewed at bcsd.k12.ny.us.

"We are trying to be as open as you can and still make it work," said Loomis.

The next meeting of the redistricting committee is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 16.

Project vote key to full-day K

Approval will allow schools to use state funding to add classrooms

Full-day kindergarten in the Bethlehem Central School District may hinge on the outcome of a \$4.9 million capital project referendum vote on Oct. 30.

Although the school board has already decided to go with the full-day program, board president James Lytle said the additional state funding made available upon approval of the referendum is necessary.

"This project makes our full-day kindergarten initiative possible," Lytle said.

The Oct. 30 district vote will decide the fate of EXCEL (Expanding our Children's Education and Learning) funding that will cover 97 percent of the proposed construction costs, much of which is planned to accommodate the switch to full-day kindergarten. The capital project up for vote is above the \$93 million bond referendum approved by voters in 2003 for upgrades at all Bethlehem schools.

Superintendent Les Loomis said if the EXCEL funding referendum is defeated, it would have an effect on the implementation of full day kindergarten in the district.

"Then what is going to happen is we have to rethink full-day kindergarten," said Loomis.

The most crucial aspect of the EXCEL funding for Bethlehem is the addition of eight classrooms at Eagle Elementary School. The classrooms are necessary for a full-

day kindergarten program, which is scheduled to begin in 2009. Other projects with EXCEL funding include installing security cameras at the high school, replacing terrazzo stair treads at the high school, new windows at Hudson House in the middle school, new bleachers in gym B at the high school, pool and restroom upgrades at the middle school and replacing the roof at Clarksville.

Richard Peckham, of Colons/Scoville architects outlined the scope of EXCEL work at the Wednesday, Oct. 3, meeting of the school board by stating the impact to taxpayers is minimal.

"It's an opportunity the district has to complete this work, and it needs to be taken advantage of," said Peckham.

According to district officials, the estimated cost to the district, if the \$4.9 million is approved, would be about \$4,750 a year for 20 years or a total of \$95,000.

Many of the funding initiatives are designed to enhance health and safety measures at all schools. Other anticipated work with EXCEL money includes replacing asbestos tile flooring districtwide.

Much of the current \$93 million district bond work is complete, with the exception of work at Slingerlands and Elsmere. The parking lots at both schools will be refurbished along with upgrades to the heating and electrical systems. Elevators at both schools will be installed to make them more handicap accessible. The nurse's office at Slingerlands will also be enlarged and relocated.

"The target is to have all work completed for the 2008-2009 school year," Peckham said.

land and New Scotland and iron markers on the graves of local Revolutionary War Veterans, they have preserved a part of American history," said Supervisor Jack Cunningham reading from the proclamation.

The chapter name comes from the Normanskill Creek and is memorialized in the famous Longfellow poem "The Song of Hiawatha."

Chapter highlights include a ceremony in 1915 when the Liberty Bell passed through Slingerlands on the old Delaware and Hudson rail line. The year 1925 marked the beginning of the chapter's historical markings beginning with the unveiling of a granite boulder in New Scotland cemetery in memory of the Revolution War soldiers who are buried at that site.

"Allison Bennett has helped get state markers placed throughout Bethlehem honoring Revolutionary War soldiers," said Tawasentha Chapter regent Christine Torey.

Bennett said the Tawasentha Chapter has placed markers in Thacher Park to mark where the Tory's kept munitions with the Indians during the Revolutionary War. A plaque rests inside a platform at Indian Ladder Farms that leads to a walking trail to recall a time in the 1800s when geologists studied the rock formations of the Heldebergs just past the farm.

Through the years, the historical contributions of the Tawasentha Chapter have been significant.

A booklet in 1940 reveals the location of graves where 126 Revolutionary War soldiers from Bethlehem, Guilderland and New Scotland are buried. During the World War II years, the chapter made donations to soldiers of hand-knit sweaters, mittens and socks. Today the Tawasentha group offers an annual scholarship to a Bethlehem High School student in honor of Lt. Henry Clyne, one of the first area soldiers killed in the Korean War. Annual gatherings are held in Washington, D.C., at the national DAR site at 1776 D St.

The National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution was founded in October of 1890 when a group of women in the nation's capital formed their own organization. Torey said the only prerequisite for any woman who would like to be a member of the DAR.

"The biggest requirement is that you have to be a descendent of a patriot who fought in the Revolutionary War," Torey said.

That, however, sounds like a tall genealogical task to muster.

"A lot of people will find they have an ancestor from the war they never realized," said Torey.


The next time you stop by town hall, look at the back wall of the main meeting room and you'll see a large American Flag encased in a frame that a local Tawasentha Chapter member made several years ago.

"The donation of the 1861 U.S. Civil War flag on display at Town Hall and other displays around town promote patriotism to young and old alike," said Cunningham.





Perfect Poison

NYSTI brings back 'Arsenic and Old Lace' more than a decade after its last run

"Arsenic and Old Lace" runs at NYSTI from Saturday, Oct. 13, through Wednesday, Oct. 24.

The New York State Theater Institute is once again producing the classic comedy "Arsenic and Old Lace."

The production was met with critical acclaim during its run in both New York City and London during the thick of World War II.

Written by Joseph Kesselring, who died 1967 in Kingston, the play provided thousands of audiences with much-needed comic relief through America's entering into the war, and England's turmoil in the face of German bombings.

After more than a decade and scores of requests for the company to bring the production back, Director Ed Lange consented. By his logic, a great play can't go wrong.

NYSTI has produced the play twice before, once in 1989 and again in 1996. On Saturday, Oct.

13, through Wednesday, Oct. 24, the company is bringing the hit comedy back at the Schacht Fine Arts Center at Russell Sage in Troy.

"After 11 years, all of the students who had seen it in the past have graduated and gone on. It's time for a new class to see the play," said Lange of Delmar. "It's an American classic comedy."

The story revolves around

theater-hating drama critic Mortimer Brewster, played by Jason Marr, who stumbles upon his aunts' "charitable" work of poisoning Brooklyn's lonely elderly gentlemen. Mortimer's life spins out of control as he attempts to keep the lid on his aunts' actions, all the while preserving the family name and keeping them out of jail.

As with most comedies, the plot is thickened by an eccentric brother who does his part by burying the deceased, who he believes are yellow fever victims, in the basement, which he considers the Panama Canal;

all the while masquerading as Theodore Roosevelt.

NYSTI has pulled together a star cast for the production, many of whom are rooted in theater classics, including roles in past productions of "Arsenic and Old Lace."

The requests this year to bring the play back were too many to ignore, said Marr.

"This is a part I really wanted to do. It's sort of a dream part for an actor," said Marr.

Marr, of Queens, has appeared in several off-Broadway productions, including dozens of appearances in Virginia, Florida

and Ohio theaters. He makes his first appearance with NYSTI on Saturday.

Eileen Schuyler, who is playing Abby Brewster, is reprising her role in the NYSTI 1996 production of the play. Schuyler is a founding member of NYSTI and has appeared in dozens of the company's productions. NYSTI regular, Carole Edie Smith will also be reprising her role as Martha Brewster, in which she appeared in the 1996 production.

Other NYSTI members, Joel Aroeste, John Romeo, David Bunce and Mary Jane Hansen, also star.

On Saturday, Oct. 21, NYSTI will host a mask contest for attendants of "Arsenic and Old Lace" during intermission. Masks will be judged on originality. Winners will be announced and prizes awarded at the end of the show.

The production will run: Saturday, Oct. 13, 8 p.m.; Sunday, Oct. 14, 8 p.m.; Friday, Oct. 19, 8 p.m.; Saturday, Oct. 20, 8 p.m.; Sunday, Oct. 21, 8 p.m. On weekdays the production will run at 10 a.m. Oct. 12, 17, 18, 19, 23 and 24. On Tuesday, Oct. 16 Arsenic and Old Lace will begin at 10:30 a.m.

Adult tickets are \$20, \$16 for senior citizen and students and children up to 12 years old will cost \$10.





Reaching new heights

Five adventurers from Albany County climb Kilimanjaro

Five Albany County men saw the most dramatic sunrise of their lives recently.

That's because they were standing near the top of Mount Kilimanjaro at the time.

"To me, the best way to describe it is how you'd draw a picture of heaven," said Voorheesville resident Tom Markert. "It was astonishing."

"It was just unbelievable," added Delmar's Mark Bryant. "You felt like you were seeing the sun rise over Africa."

Forty-five minutes later, they

and the rest of their 11-man climbing party were standing at the top of Africa. Some were overjoyed to reach the summit, while others were dazed by the climb.

"I'd like to tell you that I was overcome by emotion, but I was more overcome by the altitude," said Markert. "I was actually stumbling."

The trip was partially a family affair. Markert was joined by his brother Paul and his cousin Jim, while Bryant had his brother Jeff along for the climb. Another portion of the climbing party was made up of two mutual friends of both families - Tom Fashouer of Guilderland and Mike Brennan of Voorheesville.

"The 11 guys all got along very well," said Bryant. "It was amazing

that people from different places (across the United States) got along so well."

"Everybody was single-minded in getting to the top. Nobody wanted to be the one not to make it to the top," added Markert.

Bryant planted the seed for the trip three years ago when he started thinking about things he wanted to do as he sat in his office at Bryant Asset Management, which he and his brother Jeff run.

"I got up from my desk feeling chipper three years ago, and I walked into my brother's office and said, 'I want to do something before I turn 50 ... Let's climb Kilimanjaro,'" said Bryant.

Fortunately for Mark, Jeff had his sights set on the same mountain.

"It's been my life's goal (to climb Kilimanjaro)," said Jeff.

Not long after that, Jeff Bryant contacted Markert to see if he was interested in making the trip.

"We were just talking, and when we first mentioned it, it was sort of to gain a reaction from each other," said Markert. "We're sort of adventurers, so we were both into the idea."

Markert sent out e-mails to people he thought would be interested. Fashouer was on that list.

"I knew Tom from skiing," said Fashouer. "So very early on in the process, he sent out some e-mails about it, and that's when I jumped on it. It was a trip of a lifetime - it was too good to pass up."

Are there any challengers in the AFC East?


Everyone knew going into the NFL season that the New England Patriots were going to win the AFC East.


time machine to zap its defense back to 2002, when it was actually good.

Eagles need victory to make Sectionals

The Bethlehem football team controls its own destiny heading into the final week of the class AA football regular season.

With a home victory over Christian Brothers Academy Friday, the Eagles will clinch fourth place and the final playoff berth in the Empire Division.

There is a three-way tie for fourth place following last week's action in which Bethlehem lost to division-leading Shenendehowa 24-7, Ballston Spa edged CBA 21-16, Guilderland defeated Saratoga 34-27 and Albany beat Queensbury 27-24. Bethlehem, CBA and Saratoga all fell to 2-4, while Queensbury dropped out of the playoff picture with a 1-5 record.

As long as Bethlehem defeats CBA Friday, the Eagles clinch a Sectional berth because it holds the tiebreaker over Saratoga after beating the Blue Streaks 17-14 three weeks ago. If CBA wins, the Brothers get in as long as Saratoga loses to Albany. The Blue Streaks get in with a win and a Bethlehem loss.

Another division that is up for grabs is the class C South Division, where Voorheesville, Chatham and Watervliet enter the final week tied for first place with 5-1 records.

Voorheesville stayed in the divisional title hunt with Saturday's 50-34 victory over Catholic Central in Troy, while Chatham and Watervliet earned important wins against teams that had also been in contention for first place. Chatham defeated Mechanicville 20-8, while Watervliet downed Coxsackie-Athens 43-7.

Voorheesville will have to beat Coxsackie-Athens Saturday to hold on to its hopes for a division title. Chatham faces 1-5 Tamarac, while Watervliet plays Mechanicville.

In class B, Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk (5-1) can wrap up the Reinfurt Division title with a home victory over Albany Academy (4-2) Friday. The Cadets defeated the Indians in last year's game on their way to winning the Reinfurt Division and the Section II title.



Fashouer then told Brennan about the trip, and the 66-year-old Brennan asked to be included.

"I think I roped them into taking me with them," said Brennan. "But anybody who knows me knows I'm an athletic person."

Once the group was established, everyone started collecting information about Kilimanjaro and learned that it possessed only one physical challenge - its height, estimated at more than 19,300 feet.

"It's not a technical climb," said Brennan. "You don't have to climb any (rock) walls or use any crimp-ons or hand picks to traverse any ice."

"Over the last four or five years, Kilimanjaro has taken over as an everyman's Everest," said Markert.

Everyone trained over two years to prepare for the ascent, but it was what their guide, John Hauf, taught them on the first day of the hike that proved to be the most valuable training regimen for them.

"He had us walking very slowly from the outset, and they had you so focused on walking slowly that it was easy until the last day - that's when they cram everything," said Mark Bryant.

"It was a little different at first because we were used to (hiking in) the Adirondacks, where there's no altitude problems, and we were all in very good shape," added Jeff Bryant. "We were really shocked that we needed to be at that (slow) pace."

The group spent the first day walking through a rainforest to reach the base of Kilimanjaro.

"The rainforest was very Dr. Seuss-like. You'd have these wild branches hanging overhead, and it just looked so surreal," said Mark Bryant.

The terrain and the altitude changed once the group reached Kilimanjaro. Over the next four days, they traversed their way over a rocky landscape formed by ancient volcanic activity as they climbed up and down the mountainside to get acclimated to the altitude. "The physical part was fine," said Fashouer. "It was

the altitude that was a problem, but I handled it well."

Sleeping on the mountain also had its share of challenges. Though each camper was provided two pads - a closed-celled pad and an inflatable mattress - to go along with a sleeping bag, the angle they slept at and the altitude they were at caused some in the group to lose some sleep.

"It wasn't comfortable," said Mark Bryant. "You had all this padding, but you still slept at angles and your sleeping bag would slide off (the mattress) from time to time."

The one advantage the group had was a large support staff of guides, porters, cooks and waiters provided by the travel company that did everything from carry the heavy equipment to serving meals. They also provided entertainment on two occasions - once when they reached the mountain, and the other when they returned.

"There's no question that it made it doable for us," said Brennan. "We wouldn't have been able to do it without the guides."

Though the support staff made it easier for the group to go up Kilimanjaro, the 11 campers had to traverse the final stage to the summit with only the help of their guides. What's more, they had to do so mainly in the dark.

"We got a wake-up call from

our guide at about 11:30 at night, saying we had to be starting our ascent at midnight... not that anyone slept," said Mark Bryant. "You were very anxious about the hike, and you were starting to feel (the altitude) at that point."

Aided only by the headlamps they wore, the group slowly made their way up the final 3,000 feet to the summit.

"I think we were all a little surprised (at the beginning of the trip) at how slowly we were going to walk," said Fashouer. "But on summit day, that's how fast you walked. And I still found myself going two or three steps and then taking a couple of deep breaths."

The payoff came at around 7 in the morning on the sixth day of the climb as each member of the group reached the summit. The Bryant brothers - who took two weeks off from the family's business - reached it together and posed for a picture holding the company's banner.

"I think when we got to the top, it was so emotional for us because we felt very fortunate to be up there together," said Jeff Bryant.

The others followed at their own pace, each determined to make it to the summit.

"It didn't make any difference if you were at the front of the line or the back of the line. You were

going to make it," said Brennan. "The friendship was unparalleled," said Markert. "Everybody was single-minded in getting to the top. Nobody wanted to be the one not to make it to the top."

After everybody made it to the top - an achievement unto itself, as nearly 60 percent of all who attempt to climb Kilimanjaro don't reach the summit - the group returned to their camp, packed up and began their two-day descent. As they made their way down, they started to think about what they had done.

"The one thing I take away more than anything is to live your life," said Markert. "Don't think of things as being great

and not doing them. If it seems like it would be good, then it will probably be good."

They also started thinking about what they could do to top the experience of climbing Kilimanjaro.

"Our guide has a 3,000-acre farm in Patagonia (Chile), and there's this mountain nearby that's 22,500 feet," said Mark Bryant.

"But it's too early. We haven't really talked about it yet," Jeff Bryant quickly added.

If the group does decide to go on another adventure, Brennan would like to be in on it.

"I just have to live long enough," he said. "That's all they have to worry about."
