Woman charged with DWI following Slingerlands accident

An Altamont woman was charged with driving while intoxicated by Bethlehem police following a motor vehicle accident on New Scotland Road near Fisher Boulevard.

Linda Evangelista, 53, of 603 Meadowdale Road has also been charged with operating a motor vehicle with a suspended license.

Police report that on Wednesday, Dec. 5, a Volkswagen was in the middle of Route 85 facing south with extensive front-end damage. Police at the scene also noticed damage on a nearby utility pole.

According to witnesses,

Evangelista was the operator of the vehicle and the Volkswagen she was driving crossed over the center line several times before crashing into the utility pole.

Reports also indicate police found two beer cans inside the vehicle.

Evangelista was taken to St. Peters Hospital by emergency crews at the scene and treated. She told police she was leaving her home in Altamont and driving to a doctor's appointment at the time of the accident.

Evangelista will appear in Bethlehem Town Court Jan. 15 to respond to the charges.

A Selkirk man was charged with misdemeanor DWI by Bethlehem police after the car he was driving went off the road in Glenmont into a ditch.

Christopher Ira, 23, of 77 Old Ravena Road, Selkirk, was additionally charged with unsafe lane violation and driving with more than .08 percent blood alcohol content.

Police initially received a call of a vehicle off the road on Sunday, Dec. 2, near Wemple Road.

Police said when they arrived Ira was questioned and he first told them that someone named "Eric" was driving the car he was in when

it crashed.

Ira allegedly said that person then fled the scene but could not provide police with any more details.

After further investigation, police determined Ira was the driver. Police said a passenger in the vehicle told them Ira was the driver and the two were coming back from a bar when the accident occurred.

Police said Ira then told them he was the driver and that he consumed several beers before getting in the car.

Ira has a return court date in Bethlehem Town Court of Dec. 18.





Businesses make lots of requests

Planning board seeks improvements before parking spaces added

The Bethlehem planning board asked owners of the 333 Delaware Ave. strip mall to upgrade their outside landscaping before a new parking lot can be put in.

Tadi and Havzi Ipek were before the board Wednesday, Dec. 5, requesting to pave a dirt parking lot near the back of the property and reconfigure the lot to accommodate 88 parking spaces instead of the current 30.

The owners told the planning board they have been making

site.

"I think over time, the corridor will change completely," said board member Daniel Odell.

The Ipeks cited improvements they have already made, including a new roof, siding and shutters.

"The hardship is incredible, but I want to continually improve the property," said Ipek.

The planning board has scheduled a public hearing for Jan. 15 so nearby residents can review the site's proposed changes.

A Farm Family Insurance representative also came before the board with a request to expand a parking lot. Dan Greene, the facilities manager at the Glenmont branch, asked the planning board to approve a project that would expand the lot by 21 spaces.

"We are at the capacity of people now," said Greene, adding that the company has grown from 300 to more than 500 employees in the past few years.

Planning board member John Smolinsky asked if Farm Family would like to put a sidewalk in front of its property along 9W that would connect sidewalks from the Glenmont Elementary School all the way to the Price Chopper Plaza.

Greene said a meeting with representatives of the town and Farm Family will take place regarding the sidewalk matter. Mathusa said if the company were to install sidewalks along Route 9W, it would be considered a good neighbor.

"I think Farm Family would become a celebrity in Glenmont putting in sidewalks there," Mathusa said.

Mike Morelli, assistant economic developer, said the town would need a 10-foot right-of-way along 9W to be able to install a sidewalk in that area. The board is expected to vote on the company's request for added parking spaces at its first meeting in January.

Planning board members were in agreement, though, that the site needs improved landscaping before the parking lot proposal moves forward.

Planning board chairman Parker Mathusa said the town is trying to improve the Delaware Avenue corridor and is working with property owners who come before the board requesting changes.

"We have an overall plan for Delaware Avenue," Mathusa said.

Board member Christine Motta said better landscaping would make a "big improvement" to the

Schools step up security

Officials say locked doors and cameras a 'proactive' approach

Ringing an outside buzzer at the now locked front entrance to every elementary school is one of the many new safety features installed in the Bethlehem school district.

The changes also include installation of security cameras and radios at the high school and camera monitors at all schools as part of a districtwide effort to secure the premises and limit access.

"We need to know who is in our buildings," said Gregg Nolte, director of district operations and maintenance.

Many of the safety features were paid for through the \$93 million district infrastructure bond that included structural improvements and expansion to all schools. New safety measures like swipe cards for student and faculty access will be paid from the recently approved Excel (Expanding Our Children's Education and Learning) Aid, which allows the district an additional \$4.9 million in facilities funding.

The security initiatives are not a result of any specific security breach. Instead, the changes, which include motion detectors at the high school, are being viewed as vandalism deterrents by district officials.

"Yes, there has been vandalism at every single school, and, yes, this will reduce vandalism," Nolte said.

Upgrades to the district's security measures are being viewed as a positive step at both the elementary and high schools.

"The cameras are a great deterrent, and it helps us in evaluating a disciplinary situation," said high school principal Chuck Abba, who said the enhancements allow for better use of the six high school hall monitors.

"Cameras are becoming more common in schools and everyday life," said Abba, who has fielded a few complaints from students who have said they feel at times like they have entered a page of "1984," the George Orwell novel.

"It's more a sign of the times trying to be careful and proactive, setting a tone for students and everyone in the building," said Abba.

A letter was sent home to all parents identifying security changes.

Dave Ksanznak, principal of Hamagrael, said all doors are now locked, and the only way of getting in is to ring the front door buzzer.


"We are absolutely positive now no one can come through any other door but the front door," said Ksanznak.

The new security measures at the elementary school went into place on Nov. 6, and parents have been receptive so far.

"They have been very supportive of it," said Ksanznak.

Years ago I helped out my friend Cara by feeding her cat while she was away. Woody

would try to run out the door when I came to feed him. He'd hear the key in the lock and he'd run right over. I'd open the door just a crack and toss my keys into the room as my friend had instructed. Woody would run over to the keys and I'd slip into the apartment.

On the first day I went to feed Woody I learned the following important lesson: If a cat greets you by rolling onto his back and holding his paws up in the air, he does NOT want his belly tickled. 

A collection of memories

Dollhouse is one woman's connection to the past

Gerry Klett reached into her dollhouse to lift out a miniature Spode candlestick. She couldn't recall the name of the famous English china factory, but she remembered buying them on sale in England.

Next she showed off a rug she made for her granddaughters' dollhouse.

"Then when I got my dollhouse, they gave it back to me," she said.

Klett's son-in-law, Carl Hiener, built her dollhouse, a nine-room, three-story mansion, some 15 years ago. In the intervening time, Klett has furnished and decorated every inch of the inside, as well as the grounds in front and back.

Klett's apartment at Delmar Place in Bethlehem is dominated by the dollhouse. It's set on a table in the middle of the main room. Decorated for the holiday season, Klett has been hosting visitors this month, from friends to Girl Scout troops, to see her miniature marvel.

The back yard features a picnic table, two Adirondack chairs and a privy. Inside are knick-knacks, dolls and a player piano; a lace-covered bed, chairs and a hat rack; and lamps, tables and a woodstove. Some used,

some new, some very old, the objects represent a collection assembled over time, arranged and rearranged.

When Klett started buying furniture for the dollhouse, she said, "I didn't get the best. The wood wasn't good."

A flip-top table in the living room is a real antique, as it came from a dollhouse older than many homes in Delmar. She doesn't buy high-end things very often, and still, she said, "It's been a costly little dream."

One room on the third floor functions like a real attic, a dusty collection of collectibles, retired to storage when something newer takes their places.

"Someday I'll have to have a sale," quipped Klett.

Klett has lived in Bethlehem for more than 60 years. She worked as a school nurse educator for the Bethlehem school district and was married to Stan Klett, a local dentist.

She said she had pushed Hiener to make something for "the girls" — her granddaughters — and he did. He built a dollhouse.

"The next year I got one," said Klett.

Four tiny coffee mugs sit on the kitchen counter. Each has a name: Geraldine, Stan, Carl and Sandy. Klett's voice wavered as she recalled her daughter's memory. Sandy Hiener predeceased her mother.


Other personal touches include the number 37 over the front door, the address where Klett used to live. Likewise, the dollhouse is painted yellow, to match Klett's real house.

A southwestern pottery urn stands out against the more traditional furnishings. "I go to Colorado — my other daughter lives out there," she explained. "There are wonderful gift shops there."

Other memories are less poignant, but no less sharp. The piano is from Washington, D.C., the Jacuzzi tub was painted by a child in art class, and an antique rug came from a lady in Troy.

As Klett approaches her 90th birthday, her memory is showing signs of age. She searches for words and loses her train of thought. But the objects in the house, placed with attention and consideration, seem to hold certain memories in place and trigger a clear connection once again.

For those interested in seeing her dollhouse, Klett is holding an open house for residents and guests on Thursday, Dec. 13, from 3 to 5 p.m. Delmar Place is located at 467 Delaware Ave. in Delmar.

The much-debated Thruway Authority toll hikes are another reason to shop near home. Business owners are worried about a decrease in business if the cost of getting there goes up; if we all shopped in our towns, it would keep things on an even keel.

We could also help keep our tax bases on an even keel by shopping close to home. Town taxes and county taxes paid in retail outlets come back to us in our infrastructure and services.

December brings a sense of nostalgia: Lots of advertising images are of brightly lit store windows and snow gently falling around shoppers making their way down Main Street, Anywhere, USA. Many of our towns hold tree lightings and open houses around village greens and at the centers of towns, where some merchants are still going strong. Those business owners are the financial backbone of our communities. In addition to paying taxes, they often support us in ways we don't think of immediately. They're the ones who contribute to Scouts and school groups; who buy ads in the programs for the high school drama productions; and provide internships for the students interested in pursuing their line of business. A dollar spent in a local shop can return to you many times over.

There's one big reason to shop locally: time. Finding time to shop is a struggle when you're already swamped with work, family and home repairs. You might save a few bucks by driving a little farther, but think of the adage that time is money. If you saved 40 minutes worth of time by not driving far, what could you do with it? Drink an extra cup of coffee, watch one sitcom on TV, read the whole paper, play Hi-Ho Cherry-O with your children; or sit on the couch and look at the lights on your Christmas tree.

Doesn't that sound better than looking at taillights in a long line of traffic?

Holiday thoughts for dog lovers

Has someone in your family asked Santa for a dog or puppy this Christmas? Even the Grinch would have to agree that there's no better way to start the New Year than with a new best friend.

When deciding to get a new dog or puppy, though, it is important to consider the best time to introduce her into the family. Most importantly, make sure the recipient actually wants a dog and is willing and able to accept the responsibility for her care and training. A dog or puppy is not a gift that can be easily returned if it does not fit.

The holidays are a noisy and busy time. The new arrival will need some quiet and stability. As we all know, "quiet" and "stable" are not words usually associated with Christmas. "Chaos" describes it a little better. There are unusual smells, sights and sounds, and strangers coming and going. Remember that, when a new dog is brought home, even the new human is a stranger. It is better to wait until a quieter time so the new dog can begin to bond with the human the second she comes through the door. When a new dog comes into the home, you want her to focus on that new important person in her life. With so much going on during the holidays, the pup will not know who to look to.

A new dog needs to come into a quiet, orderly home. A puppy can easily get under foot in the confusion of the holidays and get hurt, scared or both. She should have a schedule she can rely on if she is to be housetrained right away. Who of us has a regular schedule during the holidays? With all

the distractions, a new dog could get lost in the shuffle at a time when she should be the focus of attention. The holidays can be nerve-racking for an existing dog who knows the ropes. A dog or puppy who is unfamiliar with her new home and family can become very stressed. Puppyhood is a critical time during which your pup should have only positive experiences if she is to grow into a well-adjusted adult. The noise and confusion of a Christmas morning might not qualify as a positive experience for a dog or puppy unfamiliar with her new environment.

Supervision of a new dog is critical in order to keep the dog safe and prevent any budding behavior problems before they happen. Many holiday decorations and foods can be dangerous to dogs. During the uproar of the holidays it would be difficult to supervise to the degree that is necessary to interrupt and redirect any unwanted or unsafe behavior.

A dog or puppy can still be given as a Christmas gift. But how about giving it as an I.O.U. to be redeemed after the holidays? There are all sorts of things that can be put under the tree that represent the new arrival. Have Santa's elves wrap a framed picture of the family member-to-be. Give a gift certificate for training classes or private lessons: You can wrap a crate, bowls, bed, leash, collar, food, treats, chew toys, and books on positive reinforcement training. By having these things ahead of time, the recipient will be all set up and ready to make the new arrival's transition into the family a smooth one when things settle down.

Please make sure that the gift-giver gets the dog from either a reputable breeder, rescue group or shelter. Please do not buy a puppy from a pet store. The puppy is less likely to be emotionally and physically healthy and you will be contributing to the dreadful puppy mill industry.

By waiting until after the holidays, the new friends will have fewer distractions as they get to know each other. If the new dog comes into the home after the dust settles she and her new guardian will have the quiet introduction to each other that they will both need to get started on their life together.

For those of us with dogs already in our homes there's a lot to think about to keep our four-legged kids safe and out of trouble. This is the season when all sorts of new and unusual things appear in our homes. This makes it an occasion when your dog will need more supervision than usual. This is doubly true if you have a marauding puppy who is still learning his house manners. Dogs will naturally want to investigate

anything new that comes onto their turf ... especially if that item is edible. Remember, what we view as inedible may be irresistible to a natural scavenger.

There are lots of things to think about to keep your dog safe and out of trouble with the Christmas tree. You may want to consider bringing your tree in a day or two early and putting it in an isolated area. This way it will smell more like your home when you put it up and your dog may be less likely to urine-mark it. Keep the tree water covered. Pinesap and preservative can be toxic. Don't put breakable ornaments at the level of a wagging tail. While we're talking about that appendage, keep burning candles out of tail's reach, too. It's a good idea to secure the tree with some sort of line so it cannot get toppled onto an exuberant dog. Hang electric lights so your dog will not get tangled in the wires. Hide all exposed wire to avoid chewing, which can cause electrical shock and burns.

Don't be tempted to feed your dog human food. Rich holiday food eaten in excess can make your dog sick. Heck! It can make people sick!

So many things we have around us during the holidays can be poisonous to dogs. Alcohol, mistletoe berries, holly, balsam, poinsettias and pine can all be toxic. Use snow spray only if labeled for pet consumption. Chocolate and batteries can be highly toxic and potentially deadly. Symptoms of chocolate poisoning include vomiting, diarrhea, tremors, hyperactivity and seizures. If your dog does get sick, consult your vet before giving any medications. The hotline number for Animal Poison Control is (888) 426-4435.

Avoid wrapping food gifts and putting them under the tree where they may be discovered by a prowling proboscis. Ribbons, wrapping, tinsel, ornaments, hooks, small pieces of toys and material shed from artificial trees can all cause intestinal blockage. Be careful to immediately pick up any of these things if they fall on the floor. Symptoms of blockage include decreased appetite, vomiting, diarrhea, listlessness and weight loss. When giving your dog a gift avoid toys with small parts, string or yarn.

Try to keep on a normal schedule for feeding, exercise and potty trips. Give your dog lots of calm love and attention. Do some mini-training sessions occasionally to keep him focused more on you than on the commotion.

Please be vigilant. There will be no joy in Whoville if Rover beats you to your gifts on Christmas morning and you have to take a trip to the emergency animal clinic. Most of all, may you and your four-legged and two-legged family members have a safe and joyous holiday.

Little file a big help in emergency

A big salute goes out to all the volunteers who helped to get the File of Life out to each residence in the Town of New Scotland.

• To the Voorheesville Volunteer Fire Department for distributing the File of Life with its annual calendar to more than 1,200 households in the village.

To the New Scotland Kiwanis, along with many other civic-minded volunteers including many seniors, who are completing the door-to-door drive outside the village so that every single household in New Scotland will have received a life-saving File of Life within the next few days. That's about 3,600 homes altogether!

In particular, to the Voorheesville High School Key Club and its adviser, Sherry Burgoon. They deserve special recognition for all their help. The Key Clubbers volunteered two days to fold and stuff the files with inserts, and then, on a Saturday hand-delivered them throughout the hamlet of Clarksville and elsewhere in town. It's refreshing and wonderful to see the youth of our community show

such commitment to public service.

What is a File of Life? It's a red plastic pocket held by a magnet to the outside of your refrigerator or some other conspicuous location in your home. It contains two forms inserted for members of the household to fill out, listing the person's name, emergency medical contacts, insurance policy information, Social Security number, health problems, medications, dosages, allergies, recent surgery, religion and a health care proxy.

Why is this information so important? Because it could save your life! Research studies show that more than 90 percent of medical emergency calls lead to treatment on-the-spot without knowledge of the patient's medical background. Stickers for outside doors of each house or apartment inform emergency personnel to look for the "File of Life" inside. The information asked for enables fire, police and EMS squads to obtain a quick and accurate medical history when a patient is unable to offer one, and also can be taken with you to the hospital.

If you don't want to put

down all the information that's requested, that's up to you; but remember, it's a life-saving tool to help others help you when you're in need.

If we missed delivering a file to you, please stop by New Scotland Town Hall to pick one up. We have extra insert forms, too. And, if you're a senior or disabled and need assistance to complete all of the paperwork involved, please phone me at Town Hall, 439-9038.

Finally, this enormous feat of distributing the File of Life to every single household in the town could not have been possible without underwriting from two grants: \$1,500 from the Ten Eyck Group, an independent insurance agency in the Capital District, matched by \$1,500 from the Voorheesville Community and School Foundation, which previously helped the town's seniors with funding for the Senior Services Directory.

How blessed we are to live in such a friendly community as New Scotland where neighbors help one another out and the spirit of volunteerism is so much alive.







Comptroller warns of gift card problems

With the holiday shopping season already in full swing, State Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli warns consumers to make sure they ask the appropriate questions when purchasing gift cards or they could face significant fees.

"Gift cards are a great gift option," DiNapoli said. "But all too often, consumers are not aware of the fees that can eat into the value of a gift card. Consumers should be sure they know all the terms and conditions of the gift cards they buy. No one wants to give a gift that shrinks in value if it's not used right away."

Gift cards often come with terms and conditions that can decrease the value of the gift card. These include charging:

- a service fee when the card is purchased;
- a dormancy fee if the gift card is not used within a certain period of time;
- a fee to call and check the balance remaining on the card; and
- a replacement fee for lost or stolen gift cards. The bar code number and proof of purchase are needed to replace cards.

Unclaimed gifts cards issued by New York corporations are turned over to the comptroller's office as abandoned property after five years, but in most cases no identifying information is provided, making it extremely difficult to return the property to its rightful owner.

Animals rescued from squalor in Coeymans

More than 24 Chihuahuas were found in unheated, dilapidated home

Animal rescue workers and police pulled 25 Chihuahuas out of a dilapidated Coeymans home Tuesday, Dec. 4.

By early Wednesday, Dec. 5, that number grew to 28, with one mother delivering pups while under the care of Mohawk Hudson River Humane Society, another female is expecting soon.

It is the second time in seven years that Humane Society investigators and police have raided the River Street home in Coeymans. Both times, more than two-dozen dogs were removed, said shelter staff.

The man who was living at the home is facing charges for animal cruelty for the most recent incident. In 2000, the shelter and law officials confiscated animals from the property and required him to pay \$1,000 in fines. He was also prohibited from owning animals.

According to Humane Society officials, the man did not have a certificate of occupancy because the home was declared unfit for habitation and there had been two fires at the property. Both the owner and the dogs are not supposed to be living there, said Coeymans officials.

Many of the dogs were packed into a 6-by-8-foot pen. There was no water or heat. Adult dogs were mixed with puppies; it was crowded, unsanitary and feces was plastered everywhere, said Tina Murray, director of operations at MHRHS. She was the first investigator on the scene last week.

In just two days in a separate wing of the shelter, the dogs adjusted quickly to staff, and were eating and living well. The animals range in age from 2 days old to 6 years old.

"For the lack of human contact these dogs have had,

they are very, very good. They are definitely responding well. They were all skittish of people. Now you can tell holding them, they didn't want to be touched," Murray said.

However, the dogs' and shelter's problems are far from over.

They will have to wait for the Coeymans man to plead his case before the shelter can begin adopting out the animals. The shelter is the agency that enforces the states' animal cruelty laws as the local Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals chapter.

Since news of the recent raid, hundreds of calls for adoptions have come in to the shelter for the dogs, but it could be anywhere between three weeks to months before the matter is settled in the courts. In that time, the expense of caring for the dogs grows.

"The average expense to take care of a dog is \$30 a day, so it's about \$750 a day, and we had to bring in an outside vet to look over the dogs," said Brad Shear, shelter executive director. "If this goes on for two to three months, it could be a hardship for the shelter."

Luckily, Chihuahuas have grown in popularity, as have all toy breeds, he said. But adoption does not recoup the losses; donations do.

"What we need most is donations to pay for the care," said Murray.

Unfortunately, the shelter sees this kind of mass breeding a lot, said Shear. Just recently the shelter had a similar case with cats.



Last fall, Bethlehem-area residents had the opportunity to participate in public opinion polls on three issues of interest: national health insurance, global warming, and alternative energy. Participants could respond online or at poll stations in the library and at Delmar's Perfect Blend Café.

In addition to registering their opinions, participants were invited to comment in an accompanying blog. For each poll, librarians compiled a list of related resources.

The project contributed to one of our five Plan of Service goals: to serve as a center for public discourse in the community.

In our first poll, 211 out of 266 responded that they knew someone who could not afford or did not have access to health insurance; 229 would support a national health care plan.

In the area of climate change, 109 out of 220 thought both

natural phenomena and human activity contributed to recent changes in weather and climate; 191 thought the world was not doing enough to prevent severe global warming.

In our latest poll, 142 out of 165 thought that the U.S. is not investing enough in new technologies and alternative energy sources; the same number also said they have taken steps to reduce energy consumption in the past 12 months.





Westmere student Angela Leto said the most difficult part of creating the 3-D snowmen was drawing them from memory and then painting them on canvas.

Naomi Downes said she likes art because it is fun.

"We get to do whatever we want. It is like we can do nothing wrong with art, and we get many compliments," she said.

"It is up for the public to enjoy until the first week in January," Weeks said. "It is a great exchange for the store, the city and for all of us."







Recent Tax Law Changes Can Save You Money

SUMMARY: For most people, tax laws are often passed with little notice. However, these changes can have a big impact on tax and investment planning. This article, "Recent tax law changes can save you money," takes a look at some of the recent modifications made to the Pension Protection and Tax Relief and Health Care acts of 2006 and why they should have a broad appeal to taxpayers.

For most people, the majority of whom are not accountants, the passing of tax legislation is a little like a tree falling in a forest. We know it happens. We know it makes an impact. Yet who really takes the time to investigate it?

However, as the recent California wildfires demonstrate, what may seem trivial—one tree falling, one

tax law passed—becomes relevant as it increases in breadth and becomes more significant to more people. And just as undergrowth and unpredictable winds can fuel a forest fire to dangerous consequences, missed opportunities to leverage tax savings can accumulate and grow, costing you money that you never get back. It can impact your future.

For this reason, noting some of the tax bills Congress has passed over the last few years that have a broad appeal, particularly the Tax Relief and Health Care Act of 2006 and the Pension Protection Act of 2006, is important.

Tax Relief and Health Care Act of 2006

The Tax Relief and Health Care Act of 2006, or H.R. 6408, was passed last December and kept a number of tax provisions alive for one or more years. In fact, the act contained more than 50 modifications—far too many to list in one article. Here are four changes in the act that may have a broad appeal:

1. Tuition deduction:

Individuals are allowed an above-the-line deduction for qualified tuition and related expenses for higher education paid by the individual

during the tax year. This was set to expire in 2005, but it was extended through December 31, 2007. Qualified tuition and higher education expenses include tuition and fees required for the enrollment or attendance at an eligible educational institution for the taxpayer, spouse or a dependent. Keep in mind that expenses must be reduced by certain scholarships, educational assistance allowances and income used from some U.S. Savings Bonds and Coverdell education savings accounts. In addition, expenses must be reduced by the earnings portion of distributions from a qualified tuition program or 529 plan. The maximum deduction is \$4,000 for an individual with adjusted gross income up to \$65,000 for the taxable year (\$130,000 for a joint return) or \$2,000 for an individual with adjusted gross income up to \$80,000 (\$160,000 for a joint return). An individual or joint return is ineligible for a deduction if their adjusted gross income exceeds the limits given, as well as a married individual who does not file a joint return or an individual with respect to whom a personal exemption deduction may be claimed by another taxpayer for the taxable year.¹

2. Classroom expenses deduction:

This modification to the act was also extended through December 31, 2007. It allows elementary and secondary school teachers to make an above-the-line deduction up to \$250 annually of expenses paid for books, supplies, computer equipment (included related software and services) and other equipment, as well as supplementary materials used by the educator in the classroom. An eligible educator is a kindergarten through grade 12 teacher, instructor, counselor, principal or aide in a school for at least 900 hours during a school year. A school means any school that provides elementary education or secondary education, as determined under State law.²

3. State and local sales tax as an itemized deduction:

For the purposes of determining regular federal tax liability, an itemized deduction is permitted for certain state and local taxes paid, including individual income taxes, real property taxes and personal property taxes. At the election of the taxpayer, an itemized deduction may be taken for state and local general sales taxes instead of the itemized deduction provided under present law for state and local general income taxes. Taxpayers have two options with respect to the determination of the sales tax deduction amount. They can accumulate their receipts showing the general sales taxes paid or, as an alternative, they may use tables provided by the Treasury that show the allowable deduction. The itemized deduction is not permitted for purposes of determining a taxpayer's alternative minimum taxable income.³

4. Rollovers from health flexible savings accounts into health savings accounts for a limited time:

This provision allows employers to transfer employee flexible spending account balances into a health savings account (HSA). An HSA is a tax-favored account used in conjunction

with a qualified, high deductible health plan as defined by the IRS. The provision is designed to assist individuals in transferring from another type of health plan to a high deductible health plan. Individuals who have a high deductible health plan cannot also be included in a second group or individual health care plan. The amount that can be distributed from a flexible spending account to an HSA may not exceed an amount equal to the lesser of the balance in the flexible spending account as of September 21, 2006 or the balance in the flexible savings account as of the date of the distribution. Contributions must be made directly to the HSA before January 1, 2012. The provision is limited to one distribution with respect to each health flexible savings account of the individual.⁴

The Pension Protection Act of 2006

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) implemented numerous changes that empower employees to bridge the gaps in 401(k), 403(b) and 457(b) retirement plans. In addition to these changes to employer provided retirement plans, the PPA includes a little-known provision that allows an exclusion from gross income for distributions made directly from an IRA to an eligible charity.

The way the law is written, any individual who is 70½ or older on the date the qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is made is eligible to take advantage of the tax break. However, time is running out; distributions must occur no later than December 31, 2007. Qualified charitable contributions do not require donors to claim a charitable deduction, so taxpayers who don't itemize may take advantage of the charitable deduction as well. The aggregate maximum a donor may contribute is \$100,000. Married couples may contribute \$200,000 in one year if each spouse owns at least one IRA and can make a \$100,000 qualified charitable contribution from their IRA. Importantly, QCDs will count toward meeting the IRA owner's required minimum distribution. SIMPLE IRAs and SEP-IRAs, 401(k)s, 403(b)s, annuities and Keoghs are not eligible. Qualified charities do not include donor advised funds or supporting organizations.⁵

Leverage Tax Savings

The major difference between a tree falling in a forest and the passing of tax legislation is this—the enactment of a new tax law is always heard. Maybe not by you, and certainly not by the average American, but one group always keeps an ear to the ground listening—accountants.

So as you begin to plan for end of year taxes, include your accountant in the process. Because the fact of the matter is that people's lives are just too busy to keep track of shifting tax laws; however, missing out on the opportunity to save money is a costly mistake that can have very long-term consequences.



On Christmas Eve, when you're stopping to get gas on your way home from Grandma's house, you may see a man in the gas station stuffing a basket with pens, lighters, tree-shaped air fresheners, puzzle-books, shoelaces and birthday candles.

That would be me.

I'm doing my Christmas shopping.

I marvel at those of you who can get your holiday shopping done in August. I am amazed and a little frightened by those of you who manage to drag yourselves out of bed at 3 a.m. on Black Friday so you can get a washer/dryer set for \$14.99.

I cannot. I'm possessed of a genetic imperfection — shared by most men (and nearly as many women, a new survey shows) — that doesn't allow my body to purchase a Christmas gift until the day before they're supposed to be opened.

This usually means I'm faced with slim pickings at my

local mega-mart, and as more and more people wait until the last minute, the selection of cars and robots and dolls dwindles more and more.

A new national survey conducted by independent research firm Decision Analyst, Inc. indicates

last-minute shopping is on the rise. The survey of more than 3,300 parents also shatters the myth that you'll only have to fight with procrastinating dads for the last Cabbage Patch Kid on the shelf.

Almost one-in-four of the parents surveyed said they'll finish gift shopping the day before the holiday, a significant increase from three years ago, when 16 percent admitted shopping at the last minute.

Of those, 21 percent of women admitted they'd shop on the last day, trailing their procrastinating male counterparts by only three percent.

Among the survey's other findings: 32 percent said they

finish holiday shopping one week in advance; 31 percent said they finish holiday shopping two weeks in advance; 15 percent said they finish holiday shopping one month or more in advance.

Locally, malls and big re-

stay open to accommodate our shoppers," he said.

But Townsend said those who wait until the very last minute are out of luck.

"On Christmas Eve, we try to give our people a break and close a little early," he said.

And so we procrastinators are faced with the last refuge for holiday shoppers — the only place you can get a toy at 11:59 p.m. on Christmas Eve: the gas station.

There are gas station items that lend themselves to gift giving. Everyone needs a frozen breakfast burrito, for example. But for some items, you have to get creative, especially when it comes to toys.

tailers have extended hours to accommodate this growing trend.

Malls usually stay open as long as their larger, "anchor" stores do, said Jeff Townsend, director of marketing and promotions for Clifton Park Center.

"Our hours accelerate throughout the season," he said. Three weeks before Christmas, noted Townsend, J.C. Penney, one of the Clifton Park Center's anchors, is open until midnight. "We'll

nator who worries if the gift he or she is going to buy will make someone happy.

"The act of giving is bigger than the gift," said Forsyth.

Davis said the National Retail Federation has the answer for holiday shopping procrastinators — the gift card, one of the top choices of many consumers.

"Gift cards are the most requested gift this year," said Davis.

In fact, gift card sales are expected to top \$26.3 billion this holiday season, up \$1.5 billion from 2006.

"Many consumers pulled back on spending for themselves this year and are hoping to receive a gift card so they can purchase something they may have had their eye on for months," said NRF president and CEO Tracy Mul-

lin. Retailers are also keeping stores open later on the week-ends and on Christmas Eve to accommodate busy consumers.

But for those who are still unable to get all their holiday shopping done this year, there is always next year.

"Next year, however, there will only be 27 days of holiday shopping between Thanksgiving and New Year," said Davis.

For more help on procrastination or other anxiety disor-

list and pick the easiest one to do and just do it," said Forsyth.

Another way to solve the procrastinator's holiday shopping problem is to not worry if someone will like the gift because the gift of giving itself has a greater value attached that no one can take away.

A new wave of gift giving — online shopping — may be alleviating some of the stress. A quick click of a mouse can bring shoppers to a number of online catalogs. However, there is no substitute for the personal interaction of actually going out

to a store, meeting the clerk and other shoppers, dropping a coin into the Salvation Army red kettle and experiencing the holiday ambiance.

"You may have the discomfort, but with it comes the vitality of creating a life worthwhile," said Forsyth.

Forsyth said procrastinators tend to be perfectionists who consistently question and judge their own performance. Holiday gift giving is the ultimate stumbling block for a procrasti-

Thanksgiving discounts, coupons and red dot and blue light specials, why all the delay in picking a gift for Mom and Dad?

"It's hard for people to find the time to get all their shopping done," said Davis. "From a consumer psychology standpoint people take a break after the Thanksgiving shopping weekend."

The good news for procrastinators this year is there are 32 days between Thanksgiving and Christmas, giving consumers plenty of time to hit the malls or to take a ride downtown.

"If people feel they have plenty of time to shop this year, then it's easy enough to lull yourself into a sense of security," said Davis.

To prevent further procrastinating, John P. Forsyth, associate professor of psychology from the University at Albany and director of clinical training for the campus anxiety disorder research program, said a procrastinator needs to find out "what is driving the avoidance."

"For some people, it could be anxiety over starting a task, completing a task or making a decision," said Forsyth.

That's when the procrastinator begins to fall into the trap of putting off an essential task. Forsyth, however, said he believes the procrastinator encounters more pain after the honeymoon of avoidance is over.

"Things pile up like more mountains, setting them up for a crisis of sorts," said Forsyth.

Most of the procrastination is due to a self-conscious sense of doubt. The solution, according to Forsyth, is to take the one giant task and break it up into an Alka Seltzer of tiny task particles.





Tree trimming nearly complete

Power company's efforts to minimize outages is more functional than festive

National Grid's tree-trimming program designed to minimize power outages in Bethlehem is moving along, and company officials said they have already seen positive results.

National Grid began removing trees Oct. 22, and the program is almost 70 percent complete, according to National Grid spokesman Patrick Stella.

"We have been working steady the last few weeks and will continue to do as much tree trimming through winter, depending on the weather," said Stella.

At an October public forum, National Grid representatives explained the tree-cutting program and why they believed it would help reduce the frequent power interruptions of recent years.

"I think people were skeptical," said town Supervisor Jack Cunningham, who called the forum as a result of requests from several residents. "The difficult part is

that it will not be a quick or dramatic improvement."

Since the tree trimming began, Bethlehem has seen a number of windy days, with gusts of more than 40 miles per hour occurring on three separate days between Nov. 27 and Dec. 5.

"We really have done pretty well," said Stella. "There have been a few outages, but we have seen positive results from the tree trimming already done."

Bethlehem is not the only town that has endured weather-related outages. Because of frequent outages in

interruptions per 1,000 customers.

"We definitely have a vested interest in making the system more reliable," said Stella.

Residents have seen independent contractors hired by National Grid throughout Delmar the past eight weeks cutting down branches hanging precariously above power lines and removing old trees that could topple with the next spell of bad weather.

"We are finding a lot of trees close to lines, and we are trying to take care of that," said Stella.

Cunningham said he has not received many complaints regarding National Grid's work in Bethlehem other than people questioning whether specific trees needed to be chopped down.

"Other than that, there has been little feedback," Cunningham said.

The company's tree-trimming caravan, which has been spotted around Kenwood Avenue, will head to Prospect Avenue and Morningside in the next few weeks.

Stella said residents are mostly receptive to the tree-trimming effort.

"Whenever we tell them what we're doing and why we're doing it, the majority of them are willing to have us come out and alleviate an outage situation," Stella said.

school board selects the other boundary scenario, there would be a net change of 106 fifth graders changing schools in 2008. The total number of students in grades one through five changing schools next year is around 400.

"The Elsmere committee unanimously believes scenario five is the one that should be selected because it affects the least amount of students," said Elsmere committee member Tim Sheraw. Hamagrael representatives also selected scenario five, while Glenmont representative Amy Grant said her group was split between the final choices.

"We feel both scenarios are

similar statistically," said Grant. Bethlehem school board president James Lytle thanked the community for its patience, reminding the 40 people present that a final selection would be made at the next meeting.

Establishing the appropriate school enrollment, achieving rational boundaries and addressing transportation efficiency were some of the main criteria identified by the school board in the redistricting process.

Board member Lynne Lenhardt recalled the last time redistricting took place almost 10 years ago and how different and positive this process has been compared to the last one.

"The fact that there are only a couple of issues left is a major accomplishment," said Lenhardt.

threatening wounds," said Delong of the 40 pieces of shrapnel that cut through the room. "I count myself very lucky."

Delong entered the military in 2004 and was sent to Fort Benning in Georgia. He quickly moved up the ranks and was commissioned to officers candidate school at Fort Stewart, Ga., in 2005.

"My family history has taught me to value public service," said Delong, who said he could never have anticipated the many experiences he has encountered in three short years. After spending a St. Patrick's Day in Dublin and an Oktoberfest in Munich, he rang in the New Year in Switzerland before beginning his first 12-month tour of duty in Iraq from 2005 to 2006. Delong said every day is different serving as part of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

"I count myself lucky that my job does not demand that I go patrolling the streets of Baghdad day in and day out like so many other men and women serving over here," he said.

Delong's father, Barry, a Vietnam veteran, who now can better understand the thoughts and feelings of his own dad, who did not believe in the Vietnam War when he served.

"Both of my brothers were

also Marines, and I now see how my father felt because I don't agree with the war in Iraq either," said Barry Delong.

There is a difference, he said, however between disagreeing with your country's position and serving your country.

"I am very proud of what he is doing," said Delong.

The days are long for David Delong, the Bethlehem High School graduate who often

works 10 to 15-hour days in the Brigade and Battalion communication shops. Delong has seen the 130-degree summer season of Iraq and is preparing to endure another rainy season.

"Unforgiving mud cakes onto your boots by the pound, turning walking into a fairly significant workout," Delong said.

Delong has not been home for the holidays since 2003 and will not be spending New Year's in Delmar until 2009.

"Don't worry, it'll come sooner than you think," he said.

Eagles fall short

Privatera's 3 helps Niskayuna rally past Bethlehem

Joe Privatera gave the Niskayuna boys basketball team a lift when it needed one the most.

The senior guard hit a three-pointer late in the fourth quarter to help the Silver Warriors rally to defeat Bethlehem 58-51 in Friday's Suburban Council game in Niskayuna.

The win helped the Silver Warriors (1-1 league, 2-2 overall) put a 46-27 loss to Shenendehowa three nights earlier behind them, and in the process avenge a 60-47 loss to Bethlehem (1-1, 3-1) in the Niskayuna Invitational finals one week ago.

"I'm just really proud of our guys," said Niskayuna coach Mike Black. "It does a lot for our confidence because we beat a great team."

"We played each other six days ago, so we were familiar with each other," said Bethlehem coach A.G. Irons. "Coach Black did a nice job of preparing his team."

The lead swung back and forth all night. Bethlehem grabbed a 9-4 advantage early in the first quarter before Niskayuna went on a 9-2 run to close the period with a 13-11 lead. The Silver Warriors extended their advantage to seven points in the second quarter, but Joe Kane drained a pair of three-

Connections are everywhere these days

Every once in a while, you discover some interesting side stories involving high school coaching staffs.

Take the Colonie wrestling program, for example. To encourage the next wave of Garnet Raider grapplers, varsity coach Matt Stein hired three former members of the 2000 Colonie wrestling team — Matt Stuart, Matt Stenglein and Matt Tarullo — to be his junior varsity coaching staff.

"I am a firm believer that when you have people on your staff that not only have built the program but also have a genuine interest in helping the program, they will work extra hard," said Stein.

All three have impeccable résumés, even if only one of them (Tarullo) has a teaching degree. Stuart, Stenglein and Tarullo all won Section II titles, and Tarullo has a state heavyweight championship.

"The (wrestling) room is loaded. All that the kids have to do is open up their ears and



listen," said Tarullo.

Stein began building his all-Colonie coaching staff last year when he brought Stuart in to be the JV head coach. As the 2006-07 season wore on, Stein saw Stenglein in the stands and found out the former light-middleweight was back in the area. So, he brought Stenglein in to coach the youth team and eventually be Stuart's assistant.

"I'm getting old," said Stenglein, who had been living in Colorado and competing in international wrestling tournaments. "I got injured, came back home and found myself here."

Landing Tarullo as another JV assistant coach was easy for Stein. Tarullo had bounced between

four NFL teams looking for a job as an offensive lineman the past two years, and he was looking for a sense of stability when he came back to Colonie. Coaching at his alma mater was a perfect fit.

"This has been an interesting couple of months, and I'm happy to be home and to be here," said Tarullo, who also assisted Mike Ambrosio with the varsity football team.

Now, Stuart has some familiar faces to help him in his second season with the JV team.

"We've had some fun this year," said Stuart. "It's like a little homecoming for us."

"We've always been good friends — ever since we walked through the halls here together," said Stenglein. "But it's different seeing things from the other side."

There's no telling how long Stuart, Stenglein and Tarullo will coach together, but it is clear that all three are now looking at the profession seriously.

"As long as we do our jobs and as long as the kids perform up to their abilities, why not?" said Stenglein.

Another storyline to potentially watch for is in class AA basketball, where Bethlehem's new varsity coach A.G. Irons may have to face his father-in-law Dave Doemel's CBA Brothers in the playoffs.

"It will be an interesting matchup. We play similar styles," said Irons. "I learned from (Doemel) in my one year at CBA, so naturally I try to incorporate that into what I do here."

Irons has been nearly as successful as his father-in-law in his first four games as Bethlehem's varsity head coach. The Eagles won their first three games before stumbling to a 58-51 Suburban Council loss to Niskayuna Friday.

Meanwhile, CBA is showing no signs of slowing down, despite graduating several key players from last year's Sectional
