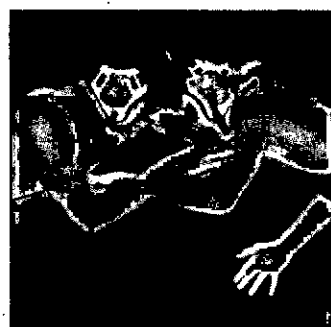

"There was smoke coming out both the front and back of the home," said Kerr.

Cold weather brings increased risk of home fires and carbon monoxide poisonings

Winter weather brings more than colder temperatures, snowstorms and holiday celebrations. It also brings a significantly higher number of residential fires and accidental carbon monoxide (CO) poisonings, tragedies that can be prevented if appropriate safety precautions are in place.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), home fires are most

prevalent in December and January and the number of CO related injuries and deaths increase in winter months when furnaces, space heaters and other fuel burning appliances are in use.

"There are several reasons for the increase in fires and CO accidents in winter months," says Debbie Hanson, director of external affairs for BRK Brands/First Alert, a leading manufacturer of fire

extinguishers, smoke and CO alarms and other home safety products. "Candles and holiday decorations such as Christmas trees and lights, along with increased use of kitchen appliances for holiday cooking, all contribute to the higher incidence of home fires," says Hanson.

"Storm-related power outages and the improper use of supplemental or alternative heating sources play a big role

in the number of CO poisonings. The consequences are often tragic and our goal is to help folks protect themselves during this critical time of year."

Winter fire safety tips

According to Hanson there are simple steps people can take that will greatly reduce the risk of fire-related injury and property loss, which is especially important in cold weather months.

the U.S. It is a by-product of combustion produced by cars, stoves, water heaters, fireplaces, gas grills and a number of other appliances.

The following safety tips will help residents avoid CO and other dangers associated with power outages and changes in seasonal temperatures:

1) Never run a generator indoors or in a poorly ventilated area, such as a garage or porch, and use the appropriate-size power cords to carry the electric load.

1) Install smoke alarms with both photoelectric and ionization sensing technologies on every level of your home and in all sleeping areas for maximum protection.

2) Test smoke alarms at least once a week.

3) Change the batteries in smoke alarms every six months or when the low battery signal is heard.

4) Create and practice a home escape plan at least twice a year, making sure everyone is involved, from kids to grandparents.

5) Keep a fire extinguisher or fire extinguishing spray in your kitchen and near other areas where a fire could occur, such as in a workshop, garage or near a fireplace.

Winter carbon monoxide safety tips

Often referred to as the silent killer because you can't see, smell or taste it, CO is the leading cause of accidental poisoning in

2) Install one battery-operated CO alarm (or AC-powered alarm with battery backup) on every level of the home and one in each sleeping area.

3) Ensure that CO alarms have working batteries installed.

4) Never burn charcoal or other outdoor cooking appliances indoors or in the garage.

5) Inspect and clean any soot and debris, such as bird nests and paper, out of the chimneys, flues and stacks.

Carbon monoxide is difficult to detect without the help of CO alarms. Outward physical symptoms of CO poisoning include headaches, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain and confusion.

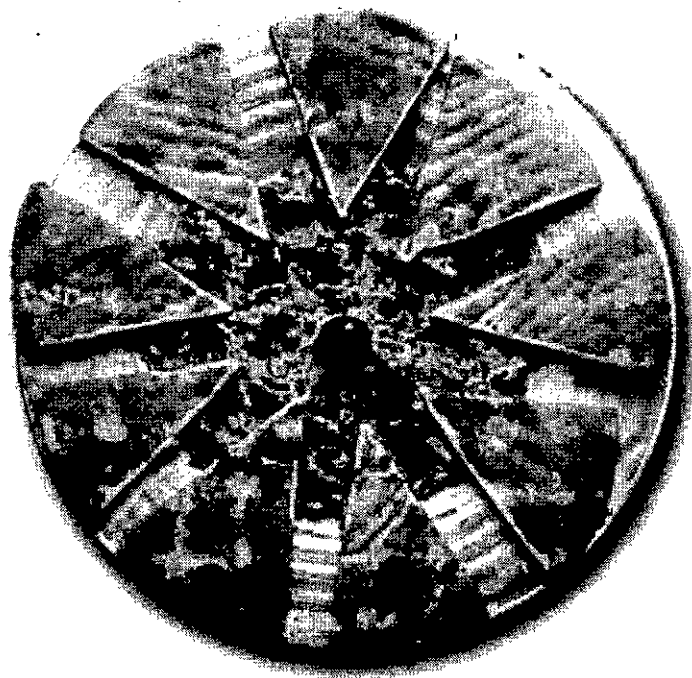

Church serves feast

For two decades, volunteers have made community Christmas dinner a success

The first Community Christmas Day Dinner in Delmar was held 20 years ago in December when First United Methodist Church parishioners Vincent and Sally Gazzetta offered fellowship along with a hearty holiday meal for residents in need. They contacted other local churches, civic leaders and the Town of Bethlehem Senior Services Department to make the dinner a reality.

On Tuesday, Dec. 25, the 20th annual Community Christmas Day Dinner will take place from 1:30 to 4 p.m. at the First United Methodist Church, 428 Kenwood Ave.

"It's really a celebration of Christmas, love and joy in the community," said Arthur Copeland, dinner committee chair.

Ten area churches and more than 20 different community businesses and organizations participate in the annual event that offers a full menu that starts with a shrimp platter and continues with turkey and ham and all the trimmings.

"About 150 meals are served each year and we do deliver to people who can't make it to the church," said Joyce Becker, assistant director of Bethlehem Senior Services.

Committee members and chefs Bill Pearce and Bernie Smith prepare the holiday feast. The culinary department of the Glenmont Job Corps prepares the turkey and stuffing.

"There are probably about 40 volunteers, but that number grows because so many people volunteer items and many different churches contribute certain parts of the Christmas dinner," said Copeland.

The meal ends later in the afternoon with homemade pies and cakes along with a visit from Santa.

"Santa goes around during dessert with goodies, and stops off at each table taking a picture with the kids," said Copeland.

The turkey and ham dinner will be served at 2 p.m. Bethlehem Senior Services will provide transportation for town residents older than 60.

"It makes Christmas very special for not only the people who come for dinner but all of the people who help," said Becker, who has participated in the event since its inception.

To make dinner reservations or arrange for transportation, contact Senior Services at 439-4955, ext. 1176. There is no charge for the dinner, but an offering is accepted. Monetary donations can also be made by calling Senior Services.

Delmar Place adds on-site physical therapist to staff

Assisted living facility offers a range of services to residents

It's been only three years since the 6.7-acre Delmar Place assisted-living facility was built for area seniors. But the 90-unit apartment site has seamlessly integrated with the community; so much so, it's like entering a mini-Delmar when you walk inside. Corridors, libraries and dining areas are named after Delmar sites including Adams Place, Adams Street and the Four Corners.

Now, the locally owned and managed facility is offering physical and occupational therapy services to Delmar Place residents and eventually to those outside the community.

"We never had an in-house occupational or physical therapist," said Terri Fishman. "Our folks would go out, and we would transport residents."

Weston Paxxon Senior Rehab Services is now leasing space inside Delmar Place, offering daily therapy for all residents.

"Our main goal is to keep

residents here well and strong," said Amanda Deyo, on-site Weston Paxxon occupational therapist.

"More people want to stay in an assisted living community, and we help them with strength training, range of motion, flexibility and other endurance activities," Deyo said.

One full-time occupational therapist and physical therapist will be on site Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., according to Deyo, with future plans to market to residents outside Delmar Place.

"We can take people who are not residents, and offer home safety assessments to the Delmar community," Deyo said.

Delmar Place offers 24-hour, on-site personnel with daily activities, three square meals served by a professional chef in the dining area and several other amenities.

"It affords you to be able to be more independent than a nursing home," said Donna Cardish, director of community outreach.

There is a beauty salon and

barber service, dry cleaning service, and a daily social calendar with activities like bridge, dancing and movies in the Old Delmar Theater along with Friday happy hour.

"We offer a very good social schedule," said Terri D. Fishman, director of marketing. "There are many activities outside the building as well."

Residents can stay for as little

as two weeks or as long as they choose.

"There is no move-in or buy-in fee," said Fishman of the private care facility designed to meet the needs of a growing elderly population who want to maintain their current lifestyle without the drudgery of daily cleaning, cooking and other household chores.

Board praises Plummer

Longtime town official cited for service at final meeting

Daniel Plummer continued to ask thorough and insightful questions at his last official Bethlehem town board meeting on Wednesday, Dec. 12, moments after receiving a town proclamation and state citation for his eight years of service to the town.

Plummer, who did not seek reelection, received a standing ovation from the residents and members

of government in attendance at his last official meeting.

"He will be greatly missed by those he served so well," said town Supervisor Jack Cunningham, who noted that Plummer was

right there for him when he needed guidance after taking over when Terri Egan left in April.

"Dan helped me through the budget process and on a number of issues," Cunningham said. "The depth of his experience really adds a lot of value."

Plummer worked through three town supervisors and saw the town grow and change over the years. He has seen the town through its moratorium on development, followed by a comprehensive plan and a push toward economic development to expand the tax base.

"I never knew what to expect," said Plummer, recalling the highlights of his tenure. "Over the years you learn to find the right balance."

Plummer said the most difficult job of a town board member is balancing the budget and the needs of the community without burdening seniors and other taxpayers and without driving young families away.

"You have to work with everybody; it doesn't matter if they are Democrat or Republican," he said.

Kyle Kotary, who has served with Plummer for the past two years on the town board, said his colleague treated everyone fairly and always displayed proper judgment with the public and people he served with.

"Dan has been an exceptional colleague, an outstanding board member; he has been a friend, confidante and teacher," Kotary said. "He always responded to residents with courtesy and respect, no matter what the issue or position was."

Former town board member and newly elected state Assemblyman Tim Gordon, R-Slingerlands, stopped by to show that Plummer also earned respect from the members of the state Legislature.

"When Dan spoke, everyone sat up and listened because of the content of what he was saying," said Gordon.

All of Plummer's colleagues urged him to continue to serve the town as a volunteer in another capacity.

"I had a great opportunity to work with three great supervisors, a number of excellent town board members and town employees," Plummer said.

"It goes by so quickly," Plummer said. "I will stay involved."

If the number of applications is greater than 40, the number of openings in the freshman class, a lottery will be conducted on Friday, Feb. 28. Students will be notified during the first week of March by their school district and by Tech Valley High if they are accepted.

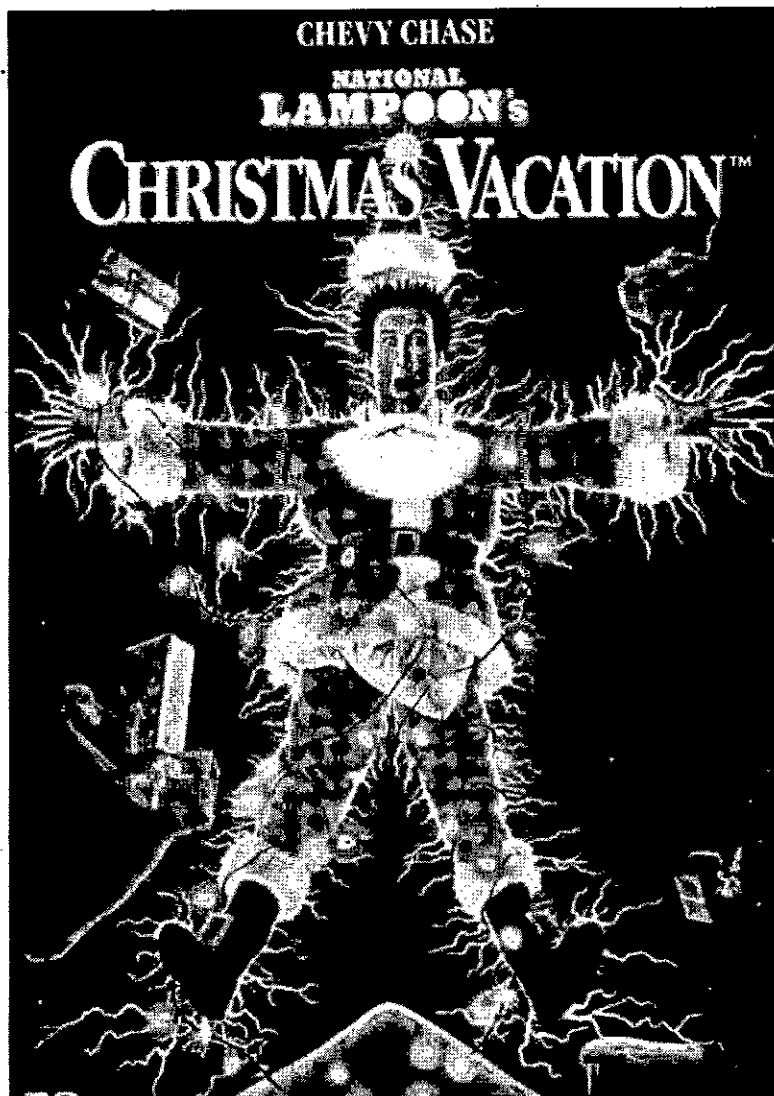

Hamagrael has heart

Elementary school lauded for its commitment to health

Hamagrael Elementary School doesn't take the health risks associated with a lack of physical activity sitting down.

The American Heart Association recently named the Bethlehem elementary school the winner of the prestigious Heart Healthy School Award, given for a schoolwide dedication to heart health and overall wellness via the Heart Association's educational programs and physical activities.

Only one Heart Healthy School Award is given out annually in the entire country.

According to Jeffrey A. Masline, the American Heart Association Regional Director, Youth Markets, Hamagrael deserves the honor because of its steadfast and proactive commitment to the health of all staff members and students. Masline, who works with schools in 14 counties, including Albany County, nominated the school for the award.

A few years ago, the school formed a Healthy Kids Committee. Spearheaded by physical education teacher Chris Berschwinger, the committee's work led to a variety of fitness-related activities and educational programs such as the use of American Heart Association materials in physical education and classroom settings; a student "Fit Club" designed to get students who do not participate in intramurals to embrace a physically active lifestyle; a parent nutrition committee that has met with the district's Food Services Director Tom Cook to discuss nutrition in the cafeteria; and a school-wide Healthy Steps program featuring a walking path in and around the school.

In addition, the school participates annually in the Jump Rope for Heart fundraiser of the American Heart Association. This past year, Hamagrael raised \$11,082.91 - and nearly \$30,000 total over the past three years - for the Heart Association's lifesaving heart and stroke research efforts through student involvement in the Jump Rope for Heart program.

"This could not have been accomplished without the support of the principal, the PE staff, the school staff and the community as a whole," Masline said in describing the

school's accomplishments in his nomination letter. "They have all rolled up their sleeves, gotten past their differences with regards to health/wellness and worked together to achieve their goal of a healthier school."

The American Heart Association has been instrumental in the programs and activities Hamagrael has implemented by providing educational materials, leadership and technical assistance. Hamagrael Principal David Ksanznak thanked the organization for all of its support and assistance in programs that have made Hamagrael a healthier school. He also recognized PE

teachers Berschwinger and Kate Charvat, as well as Masline for all of their efforts on behalf of the Hamagrael community.

"Any award from the American Heart Association is prestigious, but I am particularly proud of this because it recognizes our efforts schoolwide," Ksanznak said. "That means we have been recognized as a team - this award belongs to every student, every staff member, every parent, every PTA member, every member of the school community. Our students deserve special mention for the way they have embraced the very important effort to lead all-around healthy, active lives."

Wildlife walk to be held at Five Rivers

A guided walk focusing on wildlife adaptations will be offered on Saturday, Dec. 22 at 2 p.m., at the state Department of Environmental Conservation's Five Rivers Environmental Education Center, 56 Game Farm Road, Delmar.

Make the holidays lead-free

If you have children on your holiday gift list this year, be careful that you don't give them something that no one wants: lead poisoning.

As you are probably aware, lead and lead-based paint have been found recently on a number of brand-name toys and other gifts for children manufactured in China and elsewhere. Children — especially those under age 6 — are more sensitive to the effects of lead than adults. Children exposed to lead can experience slowed growth and physical development and speech, hearing and learning problems. At very high levels, lead poisoning can even be fatal.

Lead is not absorbed in the body through the skin; it has to be inhaled or swallowed to be dangerous. Most lead poisoning cases are caused by dust from lead paint in old buildings or industrial sources. But toys made of lead or with lead-based paint are particularly dangerous because most children put things in their mouths.

Lead poisoning often has no symptoms. When symptoms are present, they vary from person to person, but may include muscle or joint pain, stomach pain, vomiting, headaches, fatigue, irritability, lack of energy or tremors. Only a blood test can determine for sure if these symptoms have been caused by lead. Consult a doctor

immediately if you suspect exposure to lead or lead poisoning.

All children should get lead tests as part of well child check-ups. Doctors know when to do the tests, but it's always good to ask when you take a child to a doctor. Talk to your child's doctor about lead testing. In New York, the state recommends testing children for exposure to lead once between the ages of 12 and 24 months, and up to age 6 for high-risk children.

To be sure that you do not own or are using an unsafe toy, it's a good idea to check with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission. Most retail stores have postings of toy recalls, and you can be sure that most unsafe toys have been pulled from the shelves.

Be wary of buying used toys. Toy resellers like eBay, Amazon, Once Upon a Child and Salvation Army are on the lookout for recalled toys; however, buyers should be cautious and know which products could be hazardous for their child's health.

To get the most up-to-date information on toys that have been recalled because of lead and other dangers, you can call the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission toll-free at 800-638-2772 (TTY 800-638-8270). Or you can visit the commission's Web site at www.cpsc.gov/cpscpub/prerel/prerel.html. To join the commission's e-mail subscription list of recall updates for toys

and 15,000 other type of products when they are issued, go to www.cpsc.gov/cpsclist.aspx.

Is your child at risk?

Answer these questions and show them to your child's doctor. It will help the doctor know if your child needs to be evaluated for exposure to lead.

Does your child display any of the following signs?

- Learning and behavioral problems
- Tiredness
- Headaches
- Hearing problems
- Weight loss
- Hyperactivity
- Irritability

Was your home built before 1978?

Does your house have lead pipes or copper pipes with lead solder joints?

Does your child spend a lot of time in a friend's, relative's or babysitter's home or a day care or preschool center that was built before 1978?

Is anyone in your home exposed to lead at work?

Does anyone in your home work with lead as a hobby?

Do you live near a company or business that uses lead?

Do you live next to a heavily traveled highway?

Are your child's toys, crayons, and sidewalk chalk lead-safe?

Does your child take any home remedies or folk medicines?

Do you use pottery plates and bowls at home?

Does your child have a sibling, a relative or a playmate being treated for lead poisoning?

Care for veterans needs attention

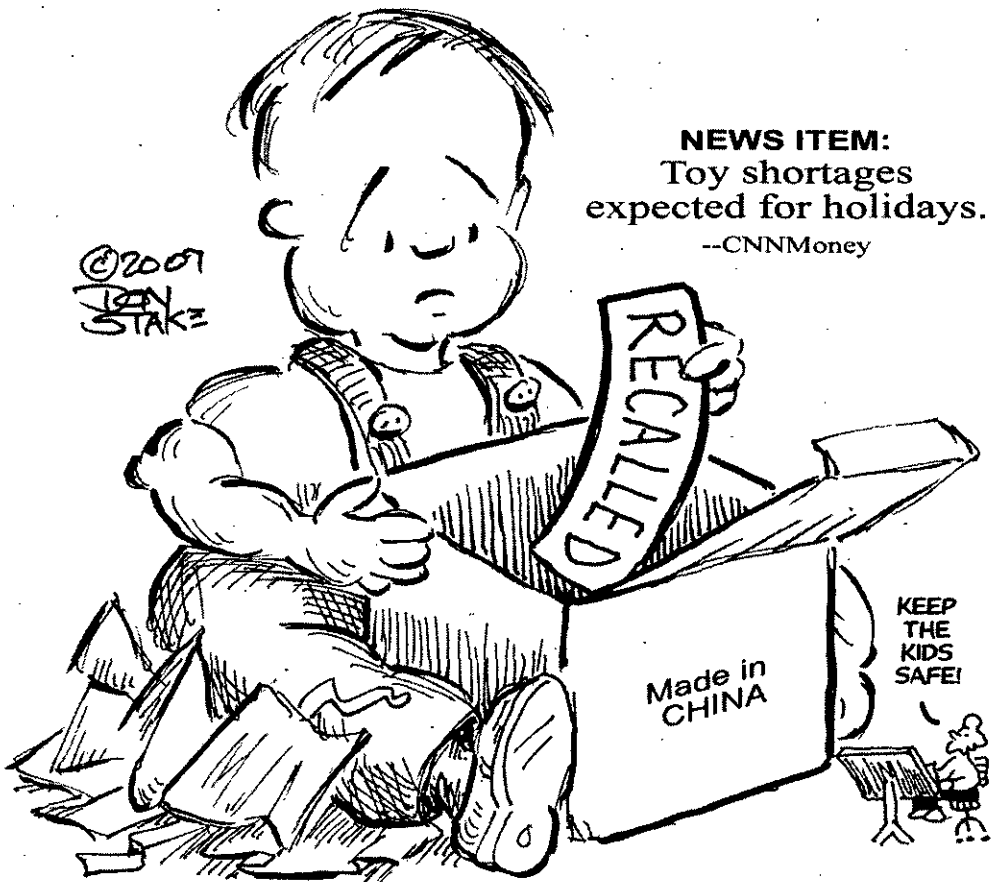
Editor, *The Spotlight*:

School official sees need for curriculum coordinator

Superintendent proposes two part-time positions

Superintendent Linda Langevin proposed creating two half-time curriculum coordinators to oversee curriculum development at the Voorheesville Central School District.

A full-time teaching position will be split into two half-time curriculum coordinator positions, one at the elementary school and one at the middle-high school.

Langevin said that due to the increasing dependence on

data obtained from the testing and assessments that impact school curriculum, the need for staff devoted to curriculum, assessment and data is very important.

"We look to see if our students are learning as much as last year," Langevin said.

She said parents and the whole community are always looking for more support for their children.

The curriculum coordinators will work directly with their building principals and will be responsible for coordination of curricular initiatives, state test coordination and value-added assessment analysis.

Value-added assessment is a new way of analyzing test data that can measure teaching and learning. Based on a review of students' test score gains from previous grades, researchers can predict the amount of growth those students are likely to make in a given year.

In addition, the curriculum coordinator at the middle school and high school level will assume responsibility for the coordination of the Advanced Placement and University in the High School program responsibilities.

The position will also assist the principal in the coordination of professional development in support of the annual professional performance review

and the districtwide professional development plan.

"The coordinators will look at estimates of how grades exceed over time. It will then help our teachers," Langevin said.

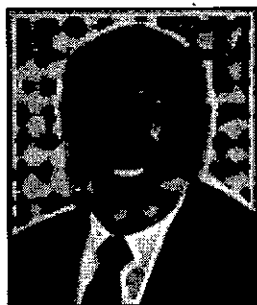
Langevin said because of new state initiatives to data, the district clearly needs training in teachers and they need someone to oversee curriculum development.

"We will look at the areas in which teachers need support," she said.

These positions would be held by members of the Voorheesville Teachers Association.

The cost to the district would be an additional full-time teacher needed to teach the classes formally taught by the coordinators with a reallocation of resources in support of the position in the amount of \$36,000. The remainder of the cost would be new district monies.

School administrators will meet with the VTA at a later date and Langevin will present the proposal to the Voorheesville Board of Education at its January meeting for a vote. The district voters must then either approve it or not during the school budget vote next year. Langevin said she hopes to have curriculum coordinators in place by school year 2008-09.

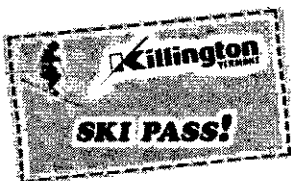

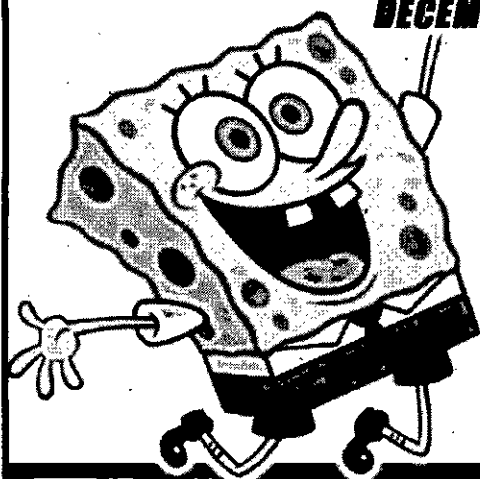

Grant to be used for literacy education plan

V'ville officials earmark \$10,000 for creating list of best teaching practices

The Voorheesville Central School District received \$10,800 in grants from the Voorheesville Community and School Foundation.

Eight hundred dollars will support the elementary school's Odyssey of the Mind program's registration fees. In Odyssey of the Mind competitions, groups of students use creativity to solve problems.

Voorheesville Elementary School Principal Kenneth Lein said since he first came to the school four years ago, he has seen the organization grow from just a couple of teams to 10 today.

In the Voorheesville school district this year, 75 students signed up for the Odyssey program, 65 from the elementary school and 10 from the middle school, according to a district press release.

Lein said because of the overwhelming interest at the elementary level, the money in the PTA's school budget isn't enough to cover registration fees.

"The grant will help support the continued growth and cost of the teams," Lein said.

Another \$10,000 grant is earmarked for the creation of a list of best practices in teaching methods and assessment of those methods.

to create a comprehensive approach to literacy," Lein said.

Lein wrote the grant proposal. He said his main goal was to have the funds available to create a philosophical statement and to look at best practices in teaching literacy with a focus on assessing kindergarten through second grade.

Superintendent Linda Langevin said the core literacy curriculum the elementary school will be developing are in reading, writing, speaking and listening.

"This is to make sure the kids

are served and have literacy skills by the time they leave elementary school," she said.

Langevin said curriculum mapping; used as springboards to discussion as well as using curriculum coordinators at the elementary, middle and high schools, will reduce gaps in learning.

"Voorheesville is not low in anything," Langevin said regarding test scores. "We are making sure that kids who could gain entry into college make it."

The \$10,000 grant is to pay for consultants to make sure

students achieve literacy skills, she said.

Lein said the Voorheesville Board of Education is really supportive of curriculum development.

"Ultimately, by the end of this year, we will have a unified philosophy and a sense of direction," Lein said. "We will be working on the 'what' we are going to do and then the 'how.'"

According to the district press release, school officials believe this new approach, including having students take a more active role in learning, will improve scores on the English Language Arts state assessment exams.

"Test scores will continue to creep up, but we are looking past high test scores. There is always room for improvement in lifelong learning," Lein said.

Understanding Autism

Public awareness information brought to you by the UAlbany Center for Autism and Related Disabilities



What is autism?

- Autism is one of several pervasive developmental disorders (PDDs), also called autism spectrum disorders (ASDs), all characterized by significant impairments in social and communication skills, and stereotyped patterns of interests and behaviors. Common ASDs include autistic disorder, pervasive developmental disorder - not otherwise specified and Asperger syndrome. These conditions all have some of the same symptoms, but they differ in terms of when the symptoms start, how severe they are, and the exact nature of the symptoms.

Who is affected?

- ASDs occur in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups and are four times more likely to occur in boys than in girls. Autism is the most common ASD, affecting an estimated 1 in 150 births (CDC, 2007).
- In New York State, there has been a 452% increase in the number of school age (4-21) students with autism between 1996 and 2006 (NYS Department of Education).

What are some signs of ASDs?

- "Red Flags" that indicate a child should be evaluated:
(First Signs, Inc. ©2001-2005)
 - No big smiles or other warm, joyful expressions by six months or thereafter
 - No back-and-forth sharing of sounds, smiles, or other facial expressions by nine months or thereafter
 - No babbling by 12 months
 - No back-and-forth gestures, such as pointing, showing, reaching, or waving by 12 months
 - No words by 16 months
 - No two-word meaningful phrases (without imitating or repeating) by 24 months
 - Any loss of speech or babbling or social skills at any age



What causes autism?

- There is no known single cause for autism, or for the many forms of the disorder ranging from mild to severe. It is generally accepted that autism is a biologically based neurodevelopmental disorder with multiple causes.

What is the best treatment for children with ASDs?

- No two people with ASDs are exactly alike. So, each person with an ASD needs a treatment program to meet his or her individual needs and the needs of his or her family. While there is not yet a cure for ASDs, early, intensive treatment can help children with the disorder reach their full potential.

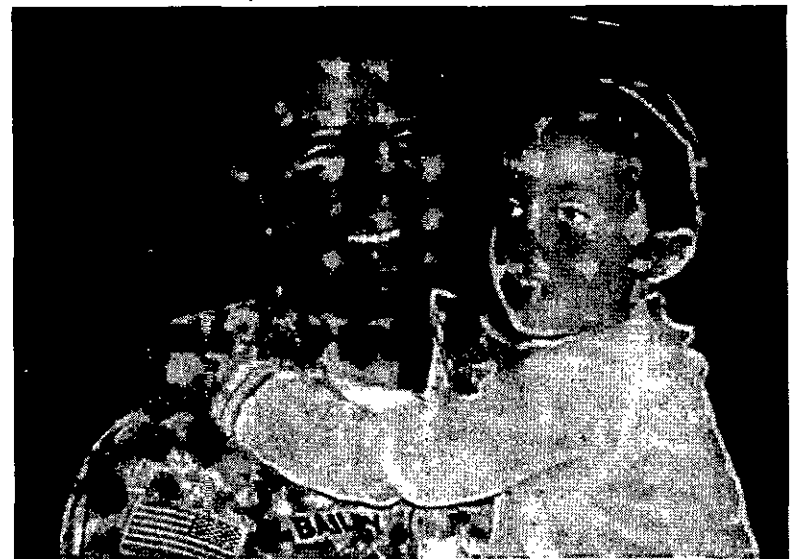

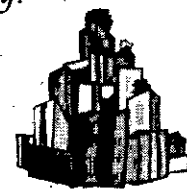

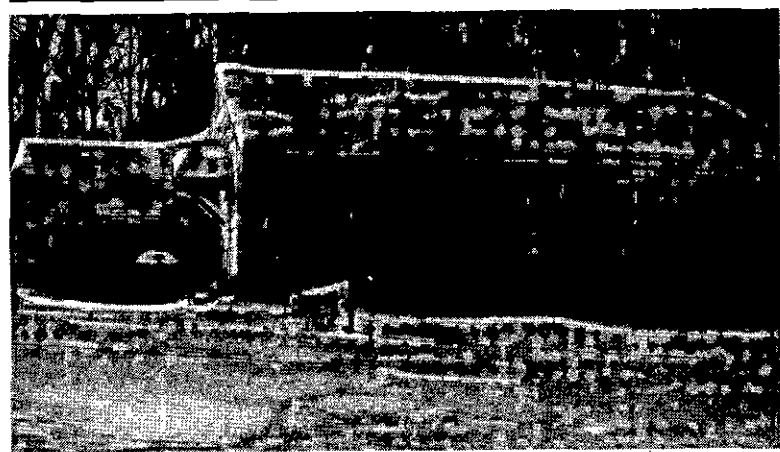

gan in the back of the bedroom and spread through the house, according to Kerr. Firefighters cut a hole in the roof for ventilation to let out the smoke.

"The snow and cold made it a little interesting, but none of the firefighters and no one in the family were hurt," said Kerr.

Aldrich's husband was out Christmas shopping for the family when the blaze broke out.

"They lost all of their Christmas gifts, and obviously the family was devastated," said Siobhan Gallagher of the American Red Cross of Northeastern New York.

The Red Cross is providing

the Aldrich family with temporary lodging, financial assistance, food and clothing until they can get back on their feet. The family was renting the home at the time of the fire.

Gallagher said several neighbors have already asked how they can help.

"We have had inquiries from neighbors in Delmar who would like to help, and they can call our office," said Gallagher.

The Red Cross will continue to assist the family to work with them to develop a recovery plan to return to pre-disaster conditions as quickly as possible.

Anyone who would like to help the Aldrich family can contact the Red Cross at 458-8111.

The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

YouTube takes a Glenmont boy to Hollywood

Christmas came early for 8-year-old Anthony Garguila of Glenmont, the YouTube sensation of Hamagrael School who is singing his way into stardom.

Garguila appeared on two nationally televised programs, The Today Show on Tuesday, Dec. 11, and the Ellen Degeneres Show in California Friday, Dec. 7, just weeks after a YouTube video of Garguila was released showing the local boy belting out the national anthem at a Siena basketball game.

"The phone has not stopped ringing since The Today Show ended," said Richard.

"I started singing at 2 years old," said Anthony, whose fame began by watching his favorite show American Idol.

Anthony entered a local Disney musical competition in 2006 winning that event and then coming in second nationally.

Then he and his brother Louis were videotaped singing before an American Idol concert at the Times Union Center. Their combined singing talents and youthful exuberance so charmed the American Idol singers that saw the videotape of Anthony that they were asked to go backstage and meet all the singers. American Idol singer Melinda Doolittle was the one most impressed.

"She fell in love with Anthony," said Jude-Ann Garguila, Anthony's mom.

Doolittle then downloaded Anthony singing the National Anthem and put it on her MySpace account.

Keystone designed the building to fit with the town's hamlet concept in the comprehensive plan.

Bethlehem's updated town comprehensive plan recently changed zoning for the new site to a hamlet zone, which is designed to bring a more pedestrian-friendly atmosphere to the mixed-use development.

The new site also allows Keystone more square footage and the opportunity to set up display areas with private offices for staff. Directly behind Keystone's new offices are two apartment buildings that will accommodate eight rental units. Bolduc said the idea of bringing a hamlet zone to the property peaked his interest in purchasing the site and making the move.

"It opened the doors for us as far as potential," said Bolduc.

Keystone has a strong reputation in the community, constructing more than 60 custom homes throughout Bethlehem, Voorheesville and the surrounding communities.

to five custom homes a year," Bolduc said.

Bolduc said he believes in the new town planning concept of trying to maintain the rural character of the fast developing town.

"I think the town is doing a good job creating that village feeling," Bolduc said.

Mike Morelli, assistant economic developer for the town of Bethlehem, said the idea behind creating hamlets in different parts of the community is an outgrowth of the new comprehensive plan designed to give areas a "Main Street" appeal.

"There are only certain areas of the town that are zoned hamlet," said Morelli, citing the Delmar Four Corners and an area of New Scotland Road near the Blue Cross Blue

Shield building.

"A hamlet has more design standards, including no front yard parking, a setback; and it allows for mixed uses reflecting more of a traditional Main Street look," Morelli said.

A new hamlet study along Delaware Avenue brings the potential of more pedestrian friendly development.

"The 7 Elm Ave. project is the first project approved by the planning board under the new hamlet zoning," Morelli said.

Bolduc is working on a new project in town to create 40 new condominiums at the current Verstandigs Florists site along 445 Delaware Ave.

"We have submitted a site plan to the town for preliminary approval," said Bolduc of the condo project. Keystone is looking to break ground on the condo project in the spring.

The new units are expected to be 2,000 square feet in size, and Bolduc said the buzz around the condos is already building.

"We have 35 people on a list so I think they will sell quick," said Bolduc who credits town government with keeping Bethlehem on the right track for its residents.

"I think they have got a good staff that's really working hard to keep Delmar a unique community," he said.

Christmas Day.

Some people will pop out for morning coffee and pastries with which to feed their guests. Local supermarkets Hannaford and Price Chopper will be closed, as will Wal-Mart. But Stewart's shops are open all day.

Other people like to go out for their holiday meal. Jack's Oyster House in Albany and the Old Shaker Inn are two area restaurants that have a tradition of serving Christmas dinner.

Where there's a market, there's usually a service provider. And thus, for some, Christmas is a workday.

The Spectrum Theatre in Albany will screen matinees and evening shows on Christmas Day.

"It's actually a pretty popular day to go to the movies," said Andrea Richard, general manager of the theater.

But when it comes to finding people to work that day, Richard said, "It's a tough one. Of all the holidays, Christmas is hardest to staff."

As inducement, the Spectrum pays its employees time and a half to work on Christmas.

Paul don Giovanni gets double pay for working the morning shift at the Stewart's Shop on Watervliet Shaker Road in Colonie.

"I'm the only one here who doesn't have kids, so I volunteer to work that day," he said.

Don Giovanni has worked Christmas before. In addition to the morning rush for coffee and breakfast, he expects to see some out-of-towners who have never been to Stewart's before.

"They come in to check it out," he said.

His own family is understanding, and waits until he gets home to eat Christmas dinner and share gifts.

Local news media will cover whatever happens on Dec. 25, whether it's a holiday or not.

"The news still has to go on," said producer Maura Merola of Fox 23 television station, who adds that not everybody celebrates Christmas.

Often the news of the day is on the nicer side, said Merola, like human-interest stories. Other times, the necessity of providing news is more obvious, like the year there was a major snowstorm on Christmas.

"You never know what's going to happen," she said.

Merola has been in television news for several years and is used to working on Christmas. She doesn't have children and the rest of her family is in the Capital District, so she doesn't find it a burden to work that day.

"If my family didn't live around here, it would be harder," said Merola.

The biggest drawback to being open on Christmas, according to Tom Wallace, owner of the Old Shaker Inn in Latham, is "the negotiation one has to go through to get staff to work."

Wallace raises the issue when interviewing job applicants, emphasizing that working on holidays is part of the job for a restaurant that's open 365 days a year.

"I stress Christmas Eve and Christmas Day because those are the days people presume we'd be closed," he said.

Indeed, employees are expected to work at least one of those shifts each year.

The restaurant serves a capacity crowd that day and a majority of patrons are repeat customers.

"It's my second busiest day of the year," said Wallace. (Valentine's Day and Mother's Day vie for No. 1.) "It's become a tradition for people."

That tradition is shared by Jack's Oyster House in Albany, whose owner Brad Rosenstein is proud to serve on Christmas.

"People are more generous on the holidays," he said.

One benefit is larger tips for the waitstaff. But a second benefit is more intrinsic. It's a business devoted to pleasing others.

"Some people are made for it," said Rosenstein.

It's an enjoyable day, said Wallace, because the restaurant's atmosphere is more relaxed than usual.

"People are in a much better mood."

mas Eve is what he calls the A shift. Kasko said Cpt. Charlie Keller and Lt. Kenneth Almy would be working this shift, making sure that Santa Claus gets through the village safely. On Christmas Day, the D Shift, Cpt. Tom Wayand and Lt. Tim Kinnaly will be on duty. The two will prepare a firehouse meal to celebrate the holiday.

Kasko said that typically the families of the firefighters on duty visit the firehouse.

"Like our military, the fire department is the first line of defense in case something happens. However, it is tough to be away from family on a holiday. It makes us feel good that the families in Scotia trust us, and sleep securely, knowing we will be at their door in less than three minutes if fire or medical emergency may come along," said Kasko.

At the Rotterdam Police Department, Lt. Mike Brown said Christmas is like any other day. He said they make the schedules out in January for the entire year, so the officers who work holidays are not surprised when they are the schedule.

"Pretty much every year that I can remember, I have had to work on Christmas Day, and it's a regular eight-hour shift. A lot of the guys feel a little bit of guilt for leaving their families, but it's part of the job, and they understand that," said Brown.

Brown said that Christmas

tends to be rather quiet compared to other holidays, although he said the blizzard of 2001 kept them busy making sure holiday travelers were safe.

Like Brown, Rotterdam Highway Superintendent Jim Longo said his employees remember the 2001 blizzard, and not fondly. He said his department celebrated Christmas on Dec. 26 that year after plowing for 27 consecutive hours to keep the roads safe.

"On that Christmas, we started plowing early in the afternoon and finished the next day. Then we came back the night after Christmas and cleaned the roads again, which took another eight hours or so. Even though many in the crew welcome overtime, no one wants to be away from their families on Christmas day," said Longo.

Like the fire and police de-

partments, Longo said his crew knows it's part of a job that ensures safety.

"We know how important the job is that we do, to keep the roads open and safe for our residents and emergency vehicles," said Longo.

Longo said highway department employees are generally not on call, but they do stay well informed of the weather and are available when they are needed.

When Devan Zeimann of Altamont was growing up, his mom, Joanne, a nurse, always worked on Christmas. She said the family adjusted to the Christmas schedule and either celebrated before or after, but it sometimes did put a damper on the day.

Kasko said he understands how people easily forget that there are those who work on Christmas. In the midst of all the presents, music, food and family, it is easy to forget that there are some people punching timecards that day. "Sometimes people don't think about us being here on the holiday, but you know that's a good thing, it means they feel safe and secure," said Kasko.

For some, it is a lifelong calling that impels them to reach for the paintbrush or sit behind a potter's wheel and create compositions with colors and textures that draw the audience in. For others, it is the happenstance of an unexpected splash of color on canvas that opens doors to an avocation that will only truly blossom later in life when they have time to explore their talents to the fullest.

We may never really know the full story of art and how it reveals itself to the artist and the audience. But the connection has existed for centuries, and the relationship says a lot about who we are and who we can become, since it goes to the very heart of creation.

Making that vital connection between the

artist and the audience is what motivates Kristen Schweigard every day she goes to work. An educator with the Albany Institute of History and Art, she spends much of her time developing programs and connecting with those who have never stepped foot in an art gallery or seen a painting in person.

"I always enjoyed art as a child," Schweigard said. "It

touched me in so many different ways. I think it may have helped me build my self-confidence and played a part in making me who I am today."

In more recent years, her programming has acquired a well-earned reputation.

"We try to have programs that actually give young people a hands-on opportunity to create their own works of art like the Vacation Art Break program we put together for the upcoming holiday break," said Schweigard.

"That way the kids can see the connection between their art and the pieces we exhibit, and it can have a major effect on them," she said. "For many, it helps bring them out of their shells and you can see it in their self-confidence and their self-expression. It really is a very positive experience."

A staple of the Capital District's cultural scene, the Institute is the home of more than 20,000 objects, including a mummy and one of the country's most extensive collections documenting the life and culture of the Upper Hudson Valley from the late 17th century to the current day.

It also contains a series of contemporary exhibits with local connections including

brightly colored fabric compositions by Estelle Kessler Yarinsky, a local artist and grandmother.

Highlighting little-known historical figures, Yarinsky's fabric portraits mark a clear departure from the conventional

Wednesday through Saturday, and from noon to 5 p.m. on Sundays.

During the Vacation Art Break, kids will learn how colors affect one another when mixed together or placed side by side. The basics of composition will also be discussed, and kids will integrate color and design. The following sessions are being offered from 1 to 4 p.m. for kids 6 to 13 years old:

Create decorative papers using printing, cutting, and painting techniques to explore design and collage compositions.

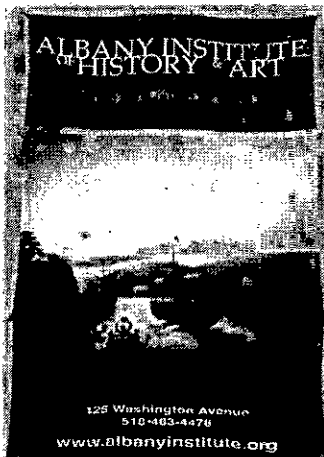
• Thursday, Dec. 27: Color Theory

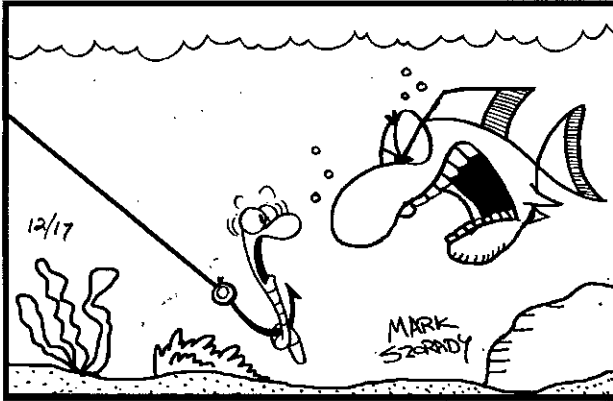

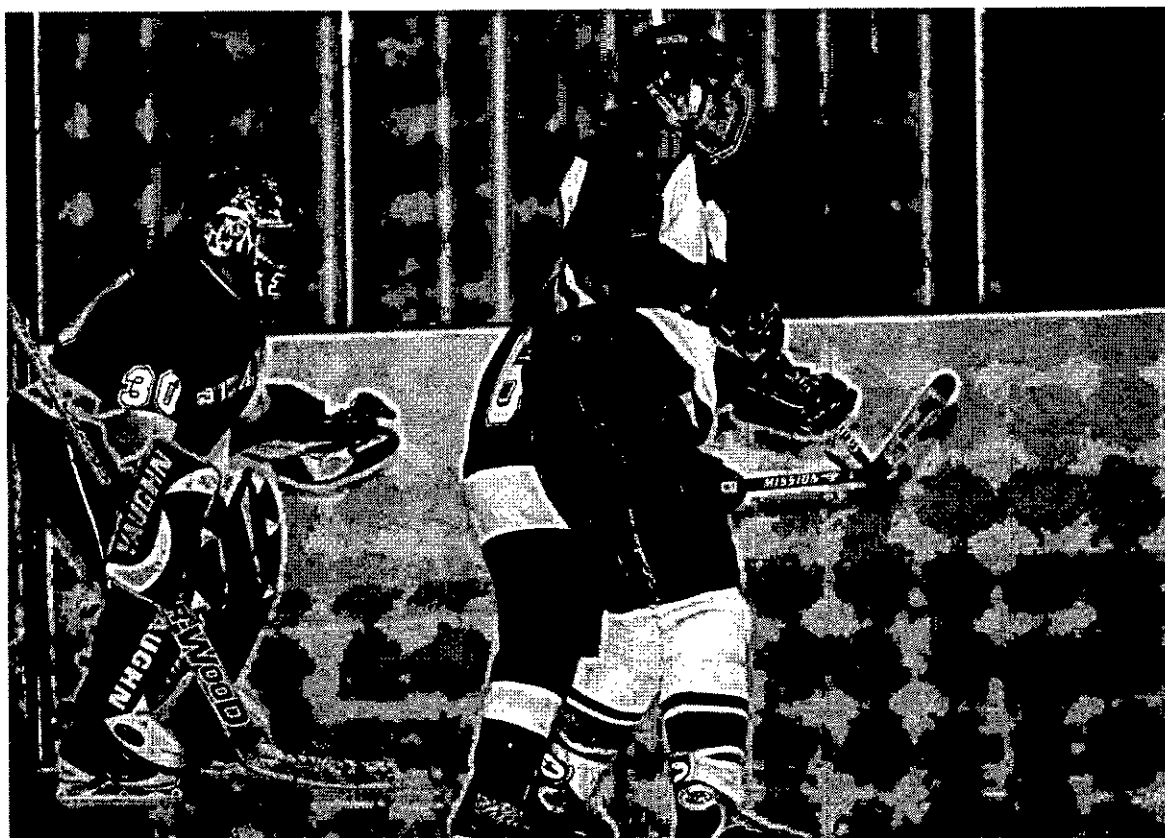

• How is it possible that no one openly questioned whether Roger Clemens was using steroids until

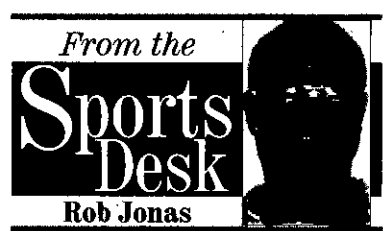
George Mitchell released his report last Thursday? Did no one notice Clemens' transformation from skinny 20-something phenom to an age-defying, 40-something Mack truck? I realize working out as much as Clemens can build muscle, but workouts

alone can't build that much muscle.

What's more alarming is that while we weren't questioning Clemens' possible involvement with steroids, we were all condemning Barry Bonds as a steroids-using freak of nature. Whether it was because of race or because Clemens was more likeable than the surly Bonds, it's obvious now that Clemens and Bonds should be despairingly mentioned in the same breath - along with all the other people named in Mitchell's report and any other baseball player who gets caught using steroids.

Staying on baseball, who at CBS News decided Katie Couric should interview Alex Rodriguez? Were none of the other investigative reporters on the staff available that day? Seriously, when Couric asked A-Rod if he ever used steroids and then if he ever saw any of his teammates use steroids, I felt bad for her because I knew A-Rod was only going to deny all of it, and all she could do was sit there while a producer gave her another question to ask.

If CBS News really wanted



to get the goods on A-Rod (that is, if he uses steroids), it should have put one of its investigative reporters on the job and obtain things that he couldn't deny such as receipts to a pharmacy that produces the drug or association with Clemens' physical trainer. 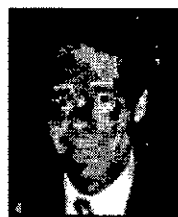
