

District expands language offerings

Mandarin Chinese to be taught at middle and high schools next year

In the fall of 2008, Bethlehem Central students will have the opportunity to learn Chinese, positioning them for a variety of future opportunities in an age of globalization.

The district's initial Chinese offerings will include an introductory course for sixth-grade students at the middle school, and juniors and seniors at the high school. At this point, the district plans to phase in a complete Chinese sequence over the next several years.

The introduction of Chinese was approved by the Board of Education in December after months of study by a Chinese Exploratory Committee, which consisted of parents, students, administrators and teachers, and was led by the district's second languages supervisor, Marisa Bel.

"In the past few years, students, parents and community members have expressed a strong interest in Chinese, and students are extremely excited about this opportunity to study it," Bel said. "Business and government leaders note China's increasing presence and influence in world affairs and global markets, and we join them in recognizing the importance of the language for our future graduates."

At the middle school, next year's sixth graders will be the first group to begin study of Chinese. Because Bethlehem Central students study the same language for all three years of middle school, the Chinese Committee recommended some guidelines for students entering the program at this level in its first year. To ensure students and their families are familiar with what entering the program will entail, current fifth grade students interested in studying Chinese next year and their parents will be required to attend one of two evening informational

sessions scheduled for Feb. 6 and 11 from 6 to 7 p.m. in the Bethlehem Central Middle School Library Media Center.

At this session, a Chinese teacher will introduce students and their parents to the language and its particular challenges. The sessions will also feature an overview of Bethlehem's Chinese language program and an opportunity to ask questions. Attendance at one of these meetings is mandatory for students wishing to enroll in Chinese at the middle school next year.


At Bethlehem Central High School, Chinese will be offered next year to juniors and seniors who have completed a Regents exam in French, Latin or Spanish. BCHS students have just begun their course selection process for the 2008-09 school year.

For both the middle and high school program, should more students enroll in the courses than seats available, a lottery will be conducted to determine placement. As stated in the high school's curriculum handbook, preference will be given first to seniors and then to juniors, who have completed or are also enrolled in an intermediate language course.

Bel reiterated her excitement in announcing that Mandarin Chinese is coming to Bethlehem Central: "We plan to build the program from the bottom up and at the same time, from the top down," she said. "In a few years, we envision the program being fully integrated with our current second language program, so that, like our French and Spanish programs, students will be able to study Chinese for seven consecutive years."

"It is a wonderful opportunity for our students and an exciting addition to our second language program."

New life, new language

Literacy Volunteers needs tutors for Albany, Schenectady counties

The chalkboard reads, "Hi, my name is Liz Allen. What's your name?"

Although the students sitting in front of Allen range in age from 22 to 70, only a few are able to read it.

Allen is a teacher with Literacy Volunteers-Mohawk/Hudson, Inc., a nonprofit organization that provides free individualized instruction to English-speaking adults seeking help with basic reading and writing skills (from non-readers up to sixth-grade level) or to speakers of other languages with conversational English. Trained volunteers provide two hours of instruction, once or twice a week, in locations throughout the Capital District.

Allen teaches a class of Burmese adults every Saturday from 9 a.m. to noon at the First Unitarian Universalist Church of Albany, 405 Washington Ave. Most of her students have come from the Mae La Refugee Camp, 70 kilometers north of the Thai/Myanmar border town of Mae Sot.

"These people are victims of the civil war there. Some have lived in refugee camps on the border of Thailand for up to 20 years. Yet they still remain unbroken in spirit," said Allen. "It is very inspiring to work with them."

One of her students, Law Tha Pwi, spent 15 of his 23 years in the refugee camp. That's where he met his wife. They came to the Capital District four months ago with their 20-month-old daughter with help from the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI) settlement program. Through a laborious mix of English and Burmese, Law said

he is sad because the USCRI relocated his sister to a city in Texas.

"It's nice when the families end up in the same place," said Allen, "but it doesn't always happen that way."

Seventy-year-old Laza Ru and his wife, Po Hser, 67, act as guides for the younger refugees in Allen's class. On a recent Saturday, Po is helping a 22-year-old student named Mu Mu with career-related words.

"She wants to learn because this is her new beginning," said Po. "She wants to learn."

The children of relocated refugees will get the help they need through public school systems, said Allen, but the adults are left to their own devices. The help they get is two-fold, she said.

"Our goal is to get them to a point where they can improve their employment," said Allen. "But they also form little support groups for each other while they're here."

Allen says many of these refugees are in desperate need of English instruction to help them survive in their new homes in the Capital District. Once the small classes end in the spring, the organization would like to match the students with individual tutors to help them improve their English skills.

There is always a need for tutors, Allen said, and there are plenty of seats left in the tutor training that is to be held at the Bethlehem Public Library on Feb. 19. Tutors are unpaid. Another workshop in Guilderland is for tutors who will be trained to work with people who already speak English but need help with reading and writing. There are about eight spots left in that class, she said.

Allen said the classes are not only for relocated refugees. She said one-in-five people in the Capital District can't read beyond a fifth-grade level. All are welcome at Literacy Volunteers-Mohawk/Hudson.



Let the Dance Flurry sweep you off your feet

I dance everywhere: down the aisles in the supermarket, in the hallways at the office, on the way to the mailbox at the end of the driveway, in my living room. There's almost always a song in my head and I don't own an iPod.

So, yes, people do tend to raise their eyebrows at me, or at least smile. Doesn't bother me in the least. I dance when I'm happy and dancing makes me happy.

Most people don't dance. I know this because time and time again people say to me "I don't dance." And it's not just men, either. Lots of women have decided to just say no to dancing. They have no idea what they're missing.

Later this month I'll be going to a fantastic event called the Dance Flurry. It's a weekend festival of music and dance held annually in Saratoga. And there will be hundreds and hundreds of people who love to dance.

I know, I know, most of you don't dance. The Dance Flurry is not just for dancers. Contrary to the name, you don't have to dance, but it does help if you like music. The schedule of events includes countless opportunities to hear and watch musicians play, to watch dancers, to learn dances, to learn about musical instruments and to hear story telling.

What makes the Dance Flurry a magical experience is the sense of community. Strangers traveling from many different cities, and even several different states, come together to make music, learn (or teach) a dance, show (or buy) crafts and share laughs.

Even people who don't dance enjoy this event, unless they are the type of non-dancers who are against having a good time of any sort.

The people who may get the biggest kick out of the Dance

Flurry are the people who secretly want to dance, but are too afraid. You know who you are. You're the ones who sit on the sidelines because you don't want to risk looking stupid.

Not me. I can't worry about looking stupid if it means I'd have to stop dancing. Plus, by the time you get to be middle-aged you should realize that too much of life is wasted worrying about how you look to others. If you are lucky, you stop being self-conscious about appearances much sooner than middle age.

Alas, many people are forever trapped by the memory of some awkward sweaty-palm junior high school dance moment. They refuse to move on and enjoy the experience of dance.

I encourage all wanna-be dancers to check out the Dance Flurry. The crowd is non-judgmental and there are tons of beginners. And there are numerous introductory, instructional sessions where you can learn almost any traditional dance.

There are sessions on swing dance, contra dance, English Country dance, international folk dance, Scottish dance, modern dance, and many more. Or maybe you prefer to tango, waltz or foxtrot.

And really, you don't have to dance. You can just watch and that can be fun too, especially since so many diverse cultures are represented. Last year there were sessions on traditional Japanese dance, South African Gum Boot dancing, clogging, polka, schottische, and village dances from Northern Italy.

There are tons of musical

performances. You can hear guitars, fiddles, mandolins, accordions, and banjos. There are sessions on guitar styles and drumming techniques. Plus there are groups of people informally jamming in the hallways. Yes, the hallways are literally jammed with musicians holding impromptu jam sessions.

It makes me want to pick up a fiddle right now. Only I don't play the fiddle. But I do dance. And I'll try nearly any kind.

Last year I went to a belly-dancing session, along with my daughter and her friend, both 10 at the time. The kids were perplexed by some of the moves, because they didn't have hips. It helps to have hips if you are going to belly dance.

There were live musicians at the belly-dancing session and I believe two of them were playing drums. The drums were so loud that it was hard to hear the instructor. She didn't seem to want to instruct without the beating drums, so we basically had to catch glimpses of her as she demonstrated the movements.

We started out in lines with the instructor at the front of the room, then she switched so that she was in the center of the room with all the students around her. "Your back is a tree" I heard her say, indicating the need to stand straight. I kept my back straight as I shifted my weight, knees slightly bent, moving my hips from side to side. I moved my hips left, then right, left, then right, left,

then right, left, then right, and very soon I was thinking "OK this is getting tiring." And that was just the warm up.

After the swinging hips step, the instructor taught us a new move: chest out, then back, out, then back, out, then back, etc. My daughter lifted her eyebrows at me. The people with the bigger busts were looking more successful at this move than, um, others of us.

A good 20 minutes of warmup went on, then we got into several long lines and traveled, one line at a time, across the floor, doing I'm not sure what. That's when a guy with a video camera came into the room. I cautiously looked at the mirror and saw my

reflection convulsing across the floor. I thought maybe I would look better if I was either wearing one of those belts with the jingling charms, or had a paper bag over my head.

OK, so I was afraid of looking stupid on video. But that didn't stop me from forging on. And that's because I can laugh at myself. Not as heartily as others can laugh at me, perhaps, but enough to accept that sometimes one has to risk looking goofy in order to experience joy.

People need to recapture the abandon and delight they let themselves feel as children. I think about the toddlers and preschoolers at the Dance Flurry. They are jumping around and clapping their hands, wide smiles on their faces. They understand my love for dancing. They aren't worried about how they look, they are just enjoying life. Don't you just envy those kids?

Stop being a couch potato or a wallflower, at least for a few hours some time during the weekend of Feb. 15 to 17. Check out the Web site www.danceflurry.org and start practicing your moves.

Tough talk won't protect kids

On Tuesday, Jan. 22, Christopher Culver, a 33-year-old former teacher at Shenendahowa was sentenced to 12 years in prison after he pleaded guilty to a 49-count indictment in November that stemmed from allegations that he molested eight of his first-grade students in his classroom. He faced a maximum of 20 years in prison if his case had gone to trial.

Less than a week later, Brian K. Stauches, a 38-year-old Saratoga County man, pleaded guilty to first-degree attempted sexual abuse of a 6-month-old child. He will serve six months in jail when he is sentenced April 7, and 10 years of probation when he is released, according to the district attorney in that county.

Both men will be required to register as Level 3 sex offenders for the rest of their lives.

Twelve years for eight children; half a year for one. In too many cases, the aftermath of the abuse will stay with the victims long after their abusers have been released from jail. Sexual predators do not steal any quantifiable object. They steal trust, confidence and, most of all, innocence. One cannot put a price tag or an equivalent amount of time on these things, but it has to be longer than six months.

The argument could be made that these predators are stigmatized for the rest of their lives with restrictions on where they can live, what professions they may have and, of course, their inclusion on sex offender registries.

The counter-argument would be that with so many restrictions placed on a convicted sex offender after he or she is released from jail, how is it possible to claim that a six-month jail term for one child — or a 12-year jail term for eight — is adequate?

Meanwhile, the practice of creating new laws instead of enforcing existing ones has crept into the realm of child abuse. Attorney General Andrew M. Cuomo and state legislators, with the cooperation of social networking sites MySpace and Facebook, are pushing a bill that would crack down on sex offenders' use of the sites.

One of the bill's provisions would require that sex offenders report their screen names, e-mail addresses and Internet service providers to authorities. There are two major problems with this provision: Never mind that the information could be easily falsified — it is already required for submission as part of a convicted sex offender's sentencing.

But nevertheless, Albany will push it through because it deals with a very emotional issue and everyone will want their name on the bill. But in reality, the law would be as enforceable and as meaningless as telling convicted child molesters they cannot post their initials on their best Donkey Kong scores.

We have real laws, with real penalties, on the books.

We must press for those laws to be enforced and for the punishments to be as severe as the crimes themselves.

Make CP rail trail a reality for Albany County

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

In 2005, the Town of Bethlehem launched its first-ever comprehensive plan and updated its zoning regulations.

One important aspect of the town's plan was the creation of pedestrian and bike trails. In its report last year on the status of the town's implementation of the plan's recommendations, the town

concluded that... "pedestrian and bicycle safety remains a very important goal of the community. The town should continue to make pedestrian and bicycle improvements in strategically located areas."

One of these areas, clearly, is the nine-mile stretch of the former Delaware and Hudson Railway Co. route, currently owned by the Canadian Pacific (CP) railroad. It is ideal for expanding the region's trail network west from the Hudson River in Albany's South End and into Bethlehem and New Scotland.

Because piecing together such a long thoroughfare for biking, hiking and other alternatives to automobile travel would otherwise be extremely difficult, the rail trail offers a unique opportunity to connect these parts of Albany County. In addition, because parcels of public land around it

could be linked by the CP rail trail, it will help fulfill important aspects of the town's comprehensive plan and the vision the town is currently realizing for its citizens.

As a founding member of Bethlehem Tomorrow, I look forward to working with County Legislator Charlie Dawson, County Executive Mike Breslin,

Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham and interested citizens and groups throughout the rail trail corridor to move this project forward.

I personally have heard from dozens of people over the past few months asking when the rail trail will be available for use. I would like to be able to tell them that it will be available this summer. With CP's cooperation, this can become a reality.



Doll provides childbirth training

Emergency responders use lifelike model to become familiar with deliveries

Expecting mothers can now count on the Clifton Park/Halfmoon Emergency Corps to safely deliver their babies if they don't make it to the hospital in time.

Eight members of the Clifton Park/Halfmoon Emergency Corps trained on the Noelle Birthing Simulator Friday, Jan. 25, at Seaton Health/St. Mary's Hospital in Troy.

Before training on the Noelle doll, the anticipation of having to assist in the birth of a baby weighed on Clifton Park/Halfmoon Emergency Training Supervisor Eric Hanchett.

Hanchett, who has been a member of the corps for more than three years, said he always avoided calls where women were in labor.

"I have dodged OB calls like it was my job," Hanchett said.

Similar to Resusci Annie, which is used to train people in cardio-pulmonary resuscitation, the Noelle doll is used to provide real-life training to medical staff. The doll, which costs \$25,000, mimics a real birth by providing childbirth scenarios, which signals changes in Noelle's heart rate, breath sounds,

fluid discharge and cervix dilation.

A microphone also allows a woman to play the part of mother, allowing her to express distress or concerns.

With the help of four nurses from the hospital's Childbirth Center, the members successfully delivered nine babies with several complications including short umbilical cords and breech births.

While the doll was at St. Mary's, 20 emergency responders from around the Capital District trained on the doll. The hospital's obstetric staff also practiced on the doll during its stay at the hospital.

Even as an instructor at

Hudson Valley Community College, Hanchett said he had not been exposed to anything like the Noelle doll.

"Every other thing we do in the field has a hands-on component except child birth," said Hanchett.

Throughout the training session, members of the corps referred to a book they read about childbirth and said the book was nothing like the hands-on practice.

Hanchett said two members of the corps are certified physician assistants, and have not received any similar

training before their practice at St. Mary's Hospital.

He also said he now feels more confident in the possibility of going on OB calls.

The nurses also gave a demonstration on how to properly intubate a baby during the training session.

"To see Seaton Health using this technology to train staff for birthing emergencies is a wonderful thing for the medical community and certainly for the women of the Capital Region," said Donna Montalto Williams, executive director of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists District II in New York.

Seaton Health is a member of Ascension Health, which purchased the doll to share amongst four New York state hospitals. St. Mary's will have the doll for three months every year to train new staff and emergency medical personnel in the area.

St. Mary's is one of 20 locations in the Capital District operated by Seaton Health.

Towns consider future of Exit 9

Workshop brings together Clifton Park and Halfmoon residents

More than 70 residents of Halfmoon and Clifton Park shared their visions for Exit 9 off the Northway at a public workshop held Wednesday, Jan. 23, to discuss a study of the area.

"We're very excited to be here working on this joint effort," said Halfmoon Supervisor Mindy Wormuth.

The residents, who gathered at the Halfmoon Senior Center, discussed in groups several questions dealing with land use and transportation. The questions were designed to guide the study of the area, which is highly commercial.

Resident's suggestions included implementing a park-and-ride incentive; synchronizing traffic lights on Route 9, especially near Route 146; adding an exit on Interstate 87 to cut back on traffic exiting at 9 and 10; and fixing road conditions to provide safer paths for pedestrian and bike traffic.

Preliminary goals of the study are to improve performance of transportation systems, enhance conditions for all travel modes, especially pedestrian and bike traffic, and enhance the community character of the area.

The study area is a connection point between the two towns.

"This is really the economic engine of our towns," said Kate Maynard, planning director for Clifton Park and a project coordinator.

Halfmoon and Clifton Park have worked together in the past on projects that have benefited the two communities, according to Clifton Park Supervisor Phil Barrett.

The towns recently collaborated on a trail project, and they provide joint emergency services.

According to the study, which is partially funded through a grant from the Capital District Transportation Committee's Linkage Program, 11,686 residents in the area are employed, and more than 50 percent commute to work outside the study area. Forty-two percent travel to Albany County for work while 34 percent work in Saratoga County. They also concluded that 4,200 people work in the study area, and 90 percent drive by themselves to work.

The heaviest volume of traffic is between the Northway and Route 9 on Route 146.

Study on the area will continue through March when the study group, which is made up of officials from the towns and Department of Transportation representatives, will hold another public workshop to issue their findings, and discuss any concerns the residents may have at that point.

Q: What is a patient portal and how can I use it to communicate with my doctor?

A:

The internet is playing an ever increasing role in our everyday lives. Healthcare is no exception. With new technology, patients are able to communicate with their physician's office through secure patient portals. This new and evolving form of communication is referred to as "e-communication." Across the nation, many larger medical groups and health systems are beginning to utilize this new communication medium.

How do start an "e-communication" with my physician's office? You should begin by asking if your physician's office participates with a patient portal service. In order to set up the lines of communication, your provider needs to first, enroll with this service and second, allow for this form of communication. If they do enroll in a particular product, ask them to guide you to the specific website to use for the patient portal. Many physicians have not begun using this type of service. However, you can still utilize a patient portal to keep track of your own personal health with the Personal Health Record (PHR).

Why can't I use my general email to communicate with my physician? The general internet is not secure and it is not a recommended way of communicating sensitive information. If your physician's office offers a secure email service, then general email is sufficient to communicate because the information is protected according to HIPAA regulations. However, general email is limited in that it cannot store information related to your medical health or allow you to create a personal health record.

What does the "e-communication system" offer me as a patient? First and foremost, the "e-communication" system is a secure method for communicating with your physician and your physician's office. Most "e-communication" systems go further by allowing you to create a personal health record. The PHR is an electronic record that allows you to securely store your health information, including lab test results, allergies, medications and past medical history. You create this record. The internet allows you to access your medical information wherever you have access to the internet. You are also able to control who views your record.



Once logged on, you can view the library items you have out and renew them if you wish. You can search the catalogs of

all libraries in the system, and request books, CDs, DVDs, and other library materials. You can check to see if you owe any fines, or make changes to your address, phone number, or PIN number. To find out what's brand new at the library, click the "Search" tab and select "New Items" to view the latest releases.




Children's Oral Health is focus of February

Looking for love ...

While online match-making may be the new phenomenon, there are still plenty of people who prefer to meet others the old-fashioned way, or at least with a little help old-school style.

Local dating services cater to everyone from working professionals short on time to senior citizens looking for companionship.

For those who need a little help from cupid, there are number of different options.

Many singles feel they have to justify why they are not "off the market," but the reality is it can be difficult to find places to meet people because the bar scene is not for everyone.

"I was looking for a place that would help me network with people my own age with similar interests. It didn't necessarily have to be a love connection but a way to find a companion," said Kiersan Corona, 33, of Guilderland.

While many of her friends were finding love after college, Corona was busy working full time and getting her master's degree, which didn't leave her a lot of time to date.

She said she's looking at resources other than online dating services, even though she knows it has been successful for many people.

"I just want someone to point me in the right direction. It can get to the point of frustration, and the worst thing you can do is try too hard," said Corona.

One organization that has been getting a lot of positive buzz lately is It's Just Lunch, a local dating service that is part of a national chain that pairs up professionals. Owner of the Albany franchise Kimberly Brandt said that she gets phone calls every month about wedding news from former clients.

More than 1,200 people in the Capital District have turned to It's Just Lunch for dating help. Single clients meet with a "matchmaker" at the Wolf Road

location to discuss what they are looking for in a mate.

The service is not cheap: for \$1,000, singles are sent on eight dates to restaurants in Albany and Saratoga. For many people, the price is worth both their time and tireless efforts. It also helps to alleviate stress for many working professionals who already have a lot on their plates.

"In the past, there was a stigma that dating services were for people who couldn't get dates, and it couldn't be further from the truth. It (dating) is a tough game, but everybody's going to win one day. I suggest, do not ever settle," said Brandt.

Singles Outreach is another local dating choice. It differs from "It's Just Lunch," in that it is a nonprofit organization, which helps connect singles for romance or just companionship.

designed to give adult singles opportunities for personal growth, social interaction and cultural enrichment. The group is located on New Karner Road in Colonie, which is where they hold many of their events. More information is available on the Web site at singlesoutreach.org.

Another approach to finding a perfect match is called "express dating." It is a way to cut to the chase and see if two people are compatible. One such example, a national franchise called Eight-Minute Dating, has plans to set up shop in the Capital District this year, according to the corporate Web site. During Eight Minute Dating, singles spend eight minutes with another person before deciding if they would like to pursue a date. According to the company, 90 percent of their participants meet someone they would like to pursue for at least a second meeting. They are currently recruiting employees for an event to be held in the Albany area. For more information, visit the Web site at 8minutedating.com.

Then there is always the infamous fix-up. Marlene of Angela's Bridal in Guilderland said it is not uncommon for brides to tell their tales of

how they met their fiancés on a blind date or a fix-up through a mutual friend or family member. An old standby, it usually ends in either disaster or with wedding bells. It is easy to trust your friends and family, after all they know you best.

Sara Edwards of Clifton Park said she has fixed her cousin up twice. She said the first time did not go so well but the second time led to that very crucial second date.

"We'll have to see where this goes, but I could not help myself. It seems like a perfect match," said Edwards.

"In the past, there was a stigma that dating services were for people who couldn't get dates, and it couldn't be further from the truth. It (dating) is a tough game, but everybody's going to win one day."

band," she said, including some 30 or 40 first dates that never moved on to second dates.

With that experience, she also developed a system. When she contacted someone, she would limit interaction to email for as long as possible. "It helps as a screen," she said, to dissuade suitors who were more interested in a physical relationship than an emotional one, per se.

"I really dragged them on as long as possible," she said, adding that she learned from early mistakes.

And yet, some people view online dating as "a last desperate step," said a Saratoga woman, who didn't want to be named. Despite the perceived stigma, she has used an online dating service because, as a 40-year-old, most of her peers are married folk.

Beyond the ease factor, online dating didn't make much sense to Tom Denham of Albany. Using friends and peers to make personal connections may take more effort, but there's a greater chance for payoff, he said.

"Networking is the number one dating strategy," said Denham. "Tell everyone you know that you're single and that you're

interested." Denham compared online dating to finding a good career through online job sites.

Match.com and e-Harmony, the two biggest online dating sites, make the process as easy as possible. You can view profiles for free (although you must register) to get a feel for how it works.

You need a subscription to make contact. With a host of special offers, subscriptions generally run between \$20-35 per month. After explosive growth earlier this decade, growth of the industry has been flattening in the last few years, perhaps a result of the growth of other social networking sites like Facebook and MySpace - which are free.

Once subscribed, you can be as active as you want or you can take the passive approach and let others contact you.

Bergman recognized that it was a numbers game. She contacted a lot of men and went on a lot of dates. "I like getting to know people anyway," she said. "I'd rather be out than sitting at home."


That same attitude underscores a mindset that many use in dating, online or off. Go on a date and enjoy the moment without worrying about a second date, much less a long-term relationship.

Perfect Blend for sale

Owner of five years looking to move on

How 'bout a business with your coffee?

After five years in business, the Perfect Blend café on Delmar's Four Corners is for sale, said owner Roberta Bastow.

She said the decision to sell the business has less to do with economics than it does with creativity.

"The business is still very profitable," said Bastow. "The Perfect Blend is turn-key now. It runs on its own and doesn't need my creative energy."

Bastow started the business from scratch five years ago, after spending over 20 years in "corporate America." Bastow spent 21 years as a senior vice president at Fleet Bank, and came to know her coffee by spending days traveling across New England. In her travels, she said, she came to recognize what people wanted in a café and decided that she would start her own business.

Bastow and her husband, Jack, started brewing the idea for a coffeehouse in the summer of 2002, and the Perfect Blend Espresso Bar and Café was born.

The business was listed on the Web site www.albany.craigslist.org in September of last year and has received some inquiries from that listing. A few months later, at the suggestion of one of her customers, Bastow placed a "for sale" sign on the service counter in the café. She said she's received just as many inquiries due to that sign, mostly by small groups of customers who are looking together.

"I would be very extremely satisfied to see a couple of my customers run this café," she said.

"The big opportunities I see here are hosting private parties and maybe doing beer and wine in the evenings," she said. "These are things that I've always thought about, but I'm only one person."

Long-time customer and Delmar native Richard Pryor comes to the Perfect Blend weekly for a latte and panini.

"It's become a second office and a home away from home," he said. "I was never really a coffee person, but this place is more

about the environment."

"It's a beautiful business. Roberta's done a wonderful job with it," said Marty Delaney, president of the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce.

Delaney said the Perfect Blend is on what she calls the "morning-side" of Delaware Avenue, so it's perfect for a coffee shop. She also said that the shop is great for meetings and has been used by the chamber numerous times.

"When the clock was being built at the Four Corners, I used it as my surrogate office," said Delaney.

Bastow said she is asking \$150,000 for the building and business and said she'll provide up to four weeks of training to the new owners.

"I'm pricing it to sell, but I want to see it carry on," she said.

Bastow said she's not sure where she's going next, but is looking to help local businesses grow.

"I think going from banking to starting my own business from scratch, I've taken the biggest risk I could have," she said. "So anything I do from here I would have more support in doing."

The tragic death of their son raised awareness of the need to provide parents and guardians with timely information about incidents affecting the health and safety of their children in residential care facilities. They have since become tireless advocates for changing the law governing the disclosure of such records.

Michael and Lisa Carey, the parents of Jonathan Carey, believe their son was abused before his death, while a resident of the Anderson School in Dutchess County. Follow-

ing an investigation by several state agencies, determinations of the extent of abuse by the school was inconclusive. The Careys were denied the records of those state investigations on which those findings were based.

After the alleged abuse occurred at the Anderson School, the Careys pulled Jonathan out, eventually enrolling him in the O.D. Heck facility in Schenectady.

The culmination of their legislative efforts was Jonathan's Law, which is a combination of two bills that expand access to records related to incidents and allegations involving individuals residing in residential mental hygiene facilities, including in-

certain circumstances, records related to incidents that occurred prior to the enactment of these laws.

Former O.D. Heck employees Edwin Tirado and Nadeem Mall were found guilty of the negligent homicide of Jonathan Carey. In October, a jury convicted Tirado, 36, of manslaughter and was he was sentenced to 5 to 15 years in prison.

In July, Mall, 33, who drove the van, pleaded guilty to criminally negligent homicide and agreed to cooperate in the case against Tirado. He testified that Tirado told him in the van that he thought he had killed the boy. Mall is serving six months in the Albany County jail.

"It was an experience," said Rachel Porter, 16, of Delmar. "It's not something you're going to forget."

The group, based out of Prince of Peace Church in Clifton Park, danced and acted to several songs during the service.

Maggie Belenz, 15, of Clifton Park, who played a clown in the service, said, "I like seeing people's reactions. The emotions you get out of people are amazing."

The service featured a sermon, with the songs "We're Not as Strong as We Think We Are" by Rich Mullins and "Waiting on the World to Change" by John Mayer played as the teens carried heavy rocks down the aisles and later threw them in garbage bags marked forgiveness.

They also wore vests with different country's names on them and pretended to fight with one another while attempting to lift a large globe from its base. Since the group did not speak throughout the service, worshippers were forced to draw their own conclusions from the performances.

Another feature of the service was the offering, during which the clowns used popcorn tubs in place of the church's regular offering plate.

"At the end it wasn't so much that they were clowns," said Porter. "It was their message."

The teen performers develop a new program every year. They are in the process of creating a new service that they can deliver to churches beginning in March.

Georgeanna Frasier, director of the King's Clown Troupe, said the kids spend between 80 and 100 hours picking out music for the performance.

She explained that the children brainstorm a theme, and develop it into a performance.

"It's really their message," she said of the teens. "They decide how they want the theme played out."

The troupe has been a part of the Prince of Peace Church for more than 20 years, and has had more than 200 high school student performers. The group has performed in 1,000 congregations throughout the United States and Ireland.

Cotant said his parishioners were very responsive to the service.

"These are committed folks," he said. "No matter who they are, they recognize the commitment of these kids."

Richard Harper Mattox

Richard Harper Mattox, 92, died at St. Peter's Hospital Monday, Jan. 28. Born in Shenandoah, Iowa, he was educated at the University of Michigan, Harvard University and Syracuse University.

He had a lifelong interest in community service and cooperative ventures. While at the University of Michigan, he started a housing cooperative. In the 1940s, he was a founder of an Albany food co-op and a Slingerlands nursery school. In retirement, he enjoyed working as a reading mentor at the Griffen Elementary School as well as participating in the Delmar Men's Garden Club and Five Rivers Environmental Education Center. Throughout most of his adult life, he was an avid tennis player, skier and gardener.

He was an active member for more than 45 years of Delmar Presbyterian Church, where he served as an elder.





"I know that you don't always get a lot of good photographs," Moskowitz said. "This one wowed me."


She said that as a photographer for a newspaper, she saw first-hand how difficult it was to capture a perfect moment.

Rosasco has taught art for more than 30 years and helped to judge the Annual Juried Art and Photography Show in 2001. She focused on the art while White judged the photography.





announced that he wanted to talk to NFL commissioner Roger Goodell about "Spygate." Surely, the reminder of the Patriots' biggest embarrassment would lead to an embarrassing blowout, just like it did back in September when the Pats rolled over the San Diego Chargers the week after "Spygate" came to light.

Even if "Spygate" didn't have an effect on the Patriots' play, surely there was no way Bill Belichick's perfect crew would allow the Giants to hang close a second time this season. Tom Brady was going to connect with Randy Moss for at least two touchdowns. And if it wasn't Moss, it was going to be Wes Welker or Donté Stallworth or Jabar Gaffney who would. There was no way that the Giants were going to stop the Patriots.

Except the Giants found a way to stop the Patriots. They applied near constant pressure on Brady with a ferocious defensive line, which forced "Mr. Perfect" into hurrying his throws. Yes, Brady threw for 266 yards and a touchdown pass to Moss, but it

took Brady nearly 50 attempts to get those 266 yards. And that pass rush sacked Brady five times. Hardly what Brady expected.

(Side note 1: I think it's time single quarterbacks like Brady and Tony Romo stopped bringing their girlfriends to games. Romo was never the same after Jessica Simpson saw him throw three interceptions in a 10-6 loss to the Philadelphia Eagles. Now, Brady's gal, Gisele Bundchen, watches him lose in the Super Bowl. So, I guess the lesson is you can date a supermodel or a pop singer if you're a superstar quarterback—just don't bring her to the stadium.)

Still, the Patriots had a 14-10 lead with 2:42 left in the fourth quarter. That lead should have been safe, especially with Eli Manning guiding the Giants' two-minute offense. The perfect season was in the bag.

Except, Eli Manning must have read Joe Montana's guide to successful two-minute drives (not available to the general public) and guided the Giants down the field. At one point, he eluded three Patriot tacklers and threw a pass that David Tyree pulled down by trapping the ball against his helmet. Four plays later, he

connected with Plaxico Burress for the go-ahead touchdown.

Where was that Eli Manning the past three years? He wasn't at training camp at UAlbany, was he? Yet, he must have been there all along. He just needed the right stage to show himself.

(Side note 2: One play before Manning connected with Burress, he threw a key third-down pass to Steve Smith, and the rookie had the sense to tiptoe down the sideline for the first down before being knocked out of bounds. One week earlier, I interviewed Smith at the Center for Disability Services Telethon in Colonie. Coincidence? Yeah, but it's something I'll likely remember for years to come.)

Yet, the Patriots still had 35 seconds to make something happen. Perhaps a tying field goal or—gasp—the game-winning touchdown.

Except, nothing happened. Jay Alford sacked Brady on second down. Then, two Hail Marys fell incomplete. Game over. Perfect season over. Giants are Super Bowl champions. Patriots are the forgotten runners-up.

So when training camp opens on a late July day at UAlbany, we'll be welcoming the defending Super Bowl champions. And chances are, there will be a lot of people there to greet them.

Certainly, there won't be a lot of people there doubting them. Not now. Not ever again.

Quillinan, a 2006 BCHS grad, was named to the Big East preseason first team after scoring 50 goals in her freshman season at Syracuse.



Meet still draws area teams**Smith takes
high jump title
at Engineer Games**

The Engineer Games in Troy isn't a big high school indoor track meet on a scale of the New Balance Games in New York City or the Yale Invitational in New Haven, Conn.

But it is still the only local high school indoor track meet, and as such it draws a large number of Section II teams. Sunday's

installment at RPI's Robison Gymnasium featured nearly every Capital District squad not named Saratoga Springs.

"There's supposed to be 42 teams represented here today," said long-time Guilderland girls indoor track coach Dick Usher.

"It's a highlight for a lot of the kids. For some of them, it might be their last race because our next meet is Sectionals (in two weeks)," Usher added.

Shenendehowa took the meet seriously. The Plainsmen won both the boys and girls titles with dominating performances. Shen's boys team more than

doubled runner-up Shaker's point total to claim the title by a margin of 120-56, while the girls team defeated Saratoga County rival Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake 101-63.

"We didn't put all of our top kids in there, but we'd like to do well," Shen boys coach Don Paretta said midway through the meet. "This is a good prelude to Sectionals."

The only negative at the meet was the slippery tartan track surface inside Robison Gymnasium. The poured concrete offered little or no traction, which led to several slips and falls by the

competitors. Colonie's Jim Kehrer — one of the section's top sprinters and jumpers — slipped during the 50-meter hurdles qualifier and fell on one of his approaches in the high jump.

"It's better (to happen) today than at the state qualifier," said Colonie boys coach Mike Palmer. "We're resting most of our big guys today anyway, but it's still a lesson learned. They still have to perform."

"(The surface is) terrible, but you still have good competition," said Paretta, who also coaches


Who saw this coming back in July?

Now, we're going to be the summer home for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants. Not the NFC wild card Giants or the NFC champion Giants. The Super Bowl champion Giants.

Somebody pinch Albany Mayor Jerry Jennings and University at Albany athletic director Dr. Lee McElroy to make sure they're not dreaming. Heck, somebody pinch all the Giants fans to make sure they're not dreaming.

This wasn't supposed to happen. Not to this bunch of Giants, anyway. Eli Manning



wasn't a Super Bowl-caliber quarterback. Tom Coughlin wasn't a Super Bowl-caliber head coach. The backfield didn't have a Super Bowl-caliber tailback without Tiki Barber.

Those were the thoughts most football analysts had heading into the season. Those were still the thoughts most analysts had heading into the playoffs. Then, the Giants proved the analysts

wrong.

Following the blueprint the Pittsburgh Steelers drafted two years earlier en route to their improbable Super Bowl title, the Giants hit the road and turned into road monsters.

They went into Florida and beat up a decent-but-questionably good Tampa Bay Buccaneers squad.

They went into Texas Stadium and rallied to beat a Dallas Cowboys team that had beaten them handily twice during the regular season.

They went into the Arctic Circle and stunned the Green Bay Packers with a Lawrence Tynes overtime field goal.

Did anyone who watched the Giants train last summer at UAlbany see this coming? Did anyone see this coming? No. But then again, we are talking about the NFC — a conference that went from being dominant in the 1980s and 1990s to mediocre in the 2000s. It wasn't impossible for the Giants to win the NFC title, but it was certainly improbable.

What was deemed impossible was a Giants victory over the New England Patriots in the Super Bowl. All anyone heard from the analysts was how the undefeated Patriots were going to steamroll the Giants, especially after United States Sen. Arlen Specter
