## Two arrested in shoplifting ring

### One suspect still at large

Bethlehem police have charged two men with stealing merchandise from area stores, but said an alleged female accomplice who was spotted at the scene has not been taken into custody.

Edwardo A. Carrera, 37, of Glenmont, and Dwight Anderson, 48, of Albany, were both arrested Friday, May 23.

Carrera was charged with fifth-degree criminal possession of stolen property; fifth-degree conspiracy; criminal possession of anti-security devices; and petty larceny.

Anderson was charged with fifth-degree criminal possession of stolen property; sixth-degree conspiracy; possession of burglary tools; and possession of anti-security devices.

Bethlehem police said they received a call from a department store on Feura Bush Road "regarding a shoplifter inside the store," and asking for police assistance.

Upon arrival, the caller, who identified himself as a security officer, was seen waving down the patrol car and told police that he was chasing a shoplifter, according to the arrest reports.

Police were told the suspect was last seen running from McDonald's and across Route 9W to a gas station before heading east.

Initial reports said that two other suspects were spotted running toward a gray convertible.

Police said they eventually stopped a vehicle matching the description of the car in the parking lot of Towne Center Plaza, with Anderson driving and Carrera as the front-seat passenger.

The security officer identified Carrera and Anderson as the two men from the store, but said a third person, a woman, was concealing merchandise in the store, according to the arrest report.

"Upon being confronted ... the suspects dropped the bag and fled," the report states.

Police said the bag was found to be "lined with foil to prevent security alarms," and that merchandise was recovered from more than one store once Carrera and Anderson were apprehended.

A K9 unit was dispatched to find the third suspect, according to the report, but she was not apprehended.

Carrera and Anderson were arraigned by Bethlehem Town Justice Ryan Donovan and sent to Albany County jail on a \$1,500 cash bail or \$2,000 bond, and they were scheduled to appear in town court on June 16.

### Other arrests

• Benjamin L. Meyers, 67, was arrested on fraud charges Tuesday, June 3, by Bethlehem police and the state insurance department.

Meyers, who runs the Meyers Funeral Home on Delaware Avenue, was arrested for allegedly submitting fake claims to his insurance carrier. He is accused of trying to get paid for expenses from having to close down his business, which he said were caused by a leaking roof.

Meyers is alleged to have sent in false evidence of payments when making the claim with Harleysville Insurance, according to police.


Investigator Philip D'Angelo of the state insurance department worked with Detective Adam Hornick of the Bethlehem police on the case.

• John L. Weidow, 39, of Cohoes was arrested on May 29 on a warrant from Otsego County.

Bethlehem Police said Weidow was wanted by the Otsego County Sheriff's Department on felony falsifying business records and petty larceny charges and a warrant was sign by Town Justice Bruce Smith in Oneonta.

Weidow was transported back to Otsego County, according to the arrest report.



# Groomer's dog days lasted decades

Local woman has cared for canines for 30 years

Between petitioning to ban dog racing while still in high school and building her home-based business as a dog groomer, Erma Klein has been busy taking care of dogs for the past 30 years.

"I just don't know where 30 years have gone," said Klein in her workshop as she groomed Peppy, a white Coton De Tulear who looked right at home on the table where Klein works her magic on a daily basis. Peppy had recently returned from Florida, where his owners go during the winter, and his hair was "wrecked by the Florida groomers," according to Klein.

Peppy's owner Meg Reed said she's thrilled with the grooming and care that Klein gives her pet.

"She's great, wonderful," said Reed. "We love her and Peppy loves her."


Klein is the owner of Delmar Dog Grooming, a service that she runs out of her own home on 30 Hudson Ave. From there, she works 10 hours a day to take care of a tight-knit group of dogs that see her workshop as a home away from home.

"Some dogs are like little kids," she said as she caringly brushed Peppy.

She said that her name cannot even be spoken in front of some of the dogs while they are at home because they get so excited. Much in the same way Pavlov ringing the dinner bell made his dog salivate, merely speaking Klein's name makes them jump into a fit of excitement.

Maureen Smith, the owner of Shih Tzus Samee and Trixie, has been bringing her dogs to Klein once a month for the past six years.

"I can't mention her name because they'll go crazy," Smith said. "They whine on the way down because they love coming

here."

It's no stretch to imagine why. The workshop, located in the corner of the lower part of her home underneath an almost completed deck, is a comfort zone for any dog that loves to be pampered. A second living room filled with cages of all sizes surrounded by toys and blankets opens up to her workshop, where an assortment of trimmers, a worktable, high-end dog shampoo and an old bathtub assist her in her trade.

She said she knew what she wanted to do as early as the sixth grade, when she was given papers to fill out about future goals. She said it was easy for those who wanted to be engineers and businessmen because there were boxes there to check for those professions, but there wasn't one marked for anyone who wanted to take care of dogs.

Her three goals since the beginning of middle school had been to get married, own a home no one else has ever lived in and take care of dogs.

While in high school, she helped gather signatures for a 250-name petition to outlaw dog racing in New York. The sport was eventually banned. As a member of the Albany Obedience Club, she grilled members on the different techniques of how to teach and train, which gave her the knowledge necessary to start her own dog-walking business before graduation.

At the age of 19 and fresh out of high school, Klein became the teacher of a continuing education course on dog obedience at Bethlehem High School, teaching two, hour-and-a-half courses on dog training per week. On the first night there were so many dogs that she was unable to work with all of them and had to split up the class into two sections, one of which had the town superintendent's wife as a student. She said that she was under pressure to, "give that dog a diploma even if it died," because of who the owner was.

Today she no longer teaches a dog obedience class at the high school, but she dispensed plenty of free advice to her friends and clients.

Having owned a number of cats and dogs in her life, Klein currently has just two cats that wander around her home. Over the years she has owned

eight dogs, and at one point owned 23 cats, which resided in the basement and barn of her parents' house when she was growing up.

She said the cats are good company because after working all day grooming dogs and standing up for hours on end, she believes she would not be able to give the proper attention to a dog, while the cats are able to keep themselves entertained.

The cats have the run of the house, which, she is proud to say, was built by her and her husband. Klein said that when the house was first done, it took her longer to groom dogs because every time an owner came to pick up a dog, she would find herself giving that person a quick tour of her new home.

As Klein put the finishing touches on Peppy, she talked about the sometimes odd stories that come out of pet grooming - getting between spouses who want the dog trimmed differently, people getting angry because their dog loves Klein more than them and the ongoing relationships she has with her clients.

"A sense of humor helps in this job," she said. "The thing that surprised me the most was when I got engaged, clients brought wedding gifts and some came to my reception."

She said she loves her clients as much as she loves their dogs, some of whom are better than family. Her clients have helped her business grow, graciously accepting a price increase because they knew all the work she put into the dogs and her business. Her schedule is jam-packed months ahead of time, with Christmas appointments being booked by the end of August.

"I'm very lucky, I enjoy working with the same people," said Klein.

"She's great," said Karen Mahar, a client who was introduced to Klein by Reed. One of Mahar's dogs, a Yorkie named Dior, has been coming to Klein for grooming since she was 6 months old.

In the 30 years of caring for dogs, Klein has seen generations of pets and their owners, built her own home, gotten married and has kept on doing something she loves.

"It seems like yesterday," Klein said.

# State officials blast abuse investigations

Family's claims mishandled, report says

The state's Inspector General released a scathing 244-page report last week, criticizing the way the state's Commission on Quality of Care and Advocacy for Persons with Disabilities and the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities handled claims of abuse involving Jonathan Carey.

Carey, who was autistic, died while in the care of O.D. Heck center employees in 2007. He was 13. His death ultimately led to legislation called "Jonathan's Law," which opens up records regarding the disabled, such as abuse complaints, that were previously withheld from family members.

His parents, Michael and Lisa Carey of Glenmont, have been outspoken proponents of the law after reporting signs of abuse to the state in 2003 and 2004, when Jonathan attended the Anderson School in Dutchess County, and then died last year in the Niskayuna facility's care.

The Anderson School is state-licensed but privately run.

Inspector General Joseph Fisch released the report on both the state-run agencies on Wednesday, June 11, which was titled, "A Critical Examination of State Agency Investigations into Allegations of Abuse of Jonathan Carey."

The report focuses on how the CQC and OMRDD handled the earlier investigations involving reports that Jonathan Carey was abused.

"There is no justification for a child placed in a private, state-

certified facility to be afforded less protection from abuse than a child in a state-run facility," the report stated. "The Inspector General encourages OMRDD to re-examine draft regulations on behavior management ... to ensure consistent safety and oversight protections for all consumers statewide."

The Inspector General was even more critical of the CQC, saying it ran a "shoddy child-abuse investigation," and had failed to fully address the claims that Jonathan Carey was being abused, adding that the allegations included that the autistic child was "neglected, inadequately fed and left to lie naked on a urine-soaked bed."

Michael Carey, who now runs The Jonathan Foundation and is rallying for more comprehensive legislation before the session ends, said the report reveals the major problems in the care industry for the disabled, but more is still needed to be done.

"The report revealed that Jonathan was abused ... and is bringing the truth to light," Carey said. "The report was strong, but it could have been much stronger."

Carey said the Inspector General's report verified what he and his wife have been saying since 2003 and was proof that "the state can't keep investigating itself."

Carey, too, was more critical of the CQC, saying they "misled the senate and the governor ... and concealed information."

"We believe Jonathan's was one of hundreds of investigations in this state," Carey said. "We thought the report should have been released earlier ... but we're extremely grateful that it was."

# Bethlehem man convicted of sexually abusing girls

The Albany County District Attorney's Office announced the conviction of 59-year-old Richard Clevensine for sexually abusing two teenage girls.

Clevensine, a Bethlehem resident, was found guilty by a jury on 11 separate counts, which included two counts of felony second-degree rape; three counts of felony third-degree rape; one count of felony third-degree criminal sexual act; three counts of misdemeanor endangering the welfare of a child; one count of misdemeanor third-degree attempted criminal sexual act; and one count of misdemeanor third-degree sexual abuse, according to District Attorney David Soares' office.

Heather Orth, a spokeswoman for Soares' office, said Clevensine was found guilty of repeatedly abusing the minors between January 2006 and August 2007.

He was convicted in front of Albany County Judge Steven Herrick and originally arrested on Aug. 19, by state police officers, according to Orth.

"Clevensine engaged in

sexual and oral intercourse with one child who was less than 15 years old," according to a release. "He directed both girls to masturbate and instructed them how, and also engaged in sexually explicit dialogue by way of instant messages with both girls."

Orth said that Clevensine "befriended the family of the two victims in order to gain their trust and then engaged in a grooming process with both girls in order to ensure their silence in committing the crimes."

"He was a family friend," Orth concluded of his relationship to the girls.

Police discovered Clevensine engaging in "inappropriate behavior" on the Internet with the two teenagers, according to Orth.

Clevensine faces up to 26 years in prison during his sentencing in July and Assistant District Attorney's Christina Calabrese and Shannon Sarfoh handled the prosecution of the case.

Twice a year, I'm a bundle of nerves as I drive my daughter to Proctors. One trip is for Rachel's dress rehearsal and the other is for the actual dance recital. She's been dancing for six years now, so you'd think that I'd have the process down pat. But no matter how much I plan or how early I leave work, we always end up rushing.

Every year I go through the same worry list: We are not going to get to the theater on time. We have forgotten a key piece of the costume. The tap shoes are not in the car. There is going to be a traffic jam.

The panic begins in the weeks before the recital when I see the sheet from the dance studio that includes the instruction "Hair and make-up should be done at home."

This year I was determined to take the whole adventure in stride. I decided I wouldn't stress out about the hair-do for the dress rehearsal. After all, her costume included a hat, so would the audience really be able to distinguish a French braid from a regular braid?

As luck would have it, my college-age niece, Leslie, an extremely talented French braider, was able to come by on

short notice to handle Rachel's hair.

"We're going to have to pin these bangs up," Leslie said.

I was pacing back and forth. I told my daughter, "See, this is the exact reason I did not want you to have bangs, because they are hard to hide during the dance recital."

"I used to have long bangs. These are kind of short," Leslie said, picking up her cousin's hair.

"I know," Rachel said, flashing me that special disgusted look daughters give their moms.

I confessed immediately, explaining that I had instructed the hairdresser in April to keep trimming off a bit more. "You should have seen how short they were then," I said. This elicited more eye rolling.

In no time at all Leslie produced a beautiful French braid out of Rachel's long, wavy hair.

As a bonus, she agreed to do the makeup too.

Leslie decided to apply the blush first. "Make a fishy face,"

she told Rachel. Then both Leslie and I demonstrated sucking in our cheeks. For the true fishy look I turned my hands into fins, positioning one on each side of my face and flapping for full effect.

Soon I had to leave the room because I keep cracking silly jokes, which made Rachel laugh, which made her face move, which was not a good thing when someone was decorating her eyes.

As with the hair, Leslie was a pro with the makeup, a little too good, because when she finished my 11-year-old suddenly looked 16.

Now that "hair and makeup were done at home" it was time to get to the theater. In fact, it was past time to leave.

How did it get to be so late? How did I end up having to rush?

This year was particularly intense because Rachel's tap class was performing the opening number of the show. There was no wiggle room for being late to the dress rehearsal. With over 30 dance numbers to go through, the rehearsal starts on time and plows through to the end. There's no waiting for stragglers.

"We're late, we're late, we're late," I said, pulling out of the driveway.

"We're supposed to be there at 4:30," said Rachel.

"That's not happening," I said.

"Well, we need to be there by 4:45 at the latest," she said.

"Then we should be OK," I told her, praying there'd be no roadwork to cause delays.

"Yes, we're going to make it," Rachel announced. "Let's not be negative."

Let's not be negative? Was that my daughter shunning negativity? Does this mean she sometimes actually listens to me?

We got to the theater at 4:40 and dashed up to the dressing room. Several of Rachel's classmates had not yet arrived. I breathed a sigh of relief.

My daughter got into her costume and applied her own lipstick. "Uh, Mom, this doesn't look right." I grabbed a tissue and got rid of the excess red. Then she headed down to the stage with her classmates, and I scooted out to the seating area to watch and take photographs.

The next afternoon it was a variation on the same theme.

I left work early, feeling relatively relaxed and confident that the evening would proceed smoothly. Rachel came home from school and had something to eat, and we took an inventory of her costume parts and other items (snacks, deck of cards, etc.) that she would need backstage. Leslie was meeting us at the theater since she was going early to do her sister Samantha's hair. All we needed to do was wait for my husband to finish work. We were all set.

And then the phone rang. Leslie would not be going to the theater early after all. She was doing Sam's hair at their home. We'd have to go to her house to get done up.

I considered my options: On the one hand, if we went to Leslie's house, then we would be leaving for the theater later than I wanted. On the other hand, we would also know that Rachel's hair and makeup would

look great for the recital. It came down to: "great hair versus arrive early."

I decided we had to go with "arrive early." It would make for a more relaxing ride. Besides, last year I was able to find another dancer, one of the teenage girls, who took care of the French braiding. It wasn't the preferred method ("hair and makeup should be done at home"), but it was the best I could do.

And then I remembered that Rachel's aunt was meeting us at the recital, Aunt Carol, the one who can cook and sew and French braid!

I quickly phoned her and asked if she could come to the theater early to do Rachel's hair.

"I thought I had this all worked out." I told my sister-in-law, "but here I am scrambling again."

Carol laughed, "You were in a panic last year too."

"Yeah, I know. Why does this keep happening?"

"You're a mom," she said.

Aunt Carol arrived at the theater just minutes after we did. We went up to the dressing room and Rachel sat down in a chair.

"I haven't done this in about 10 years," Carol announced. I felt my eyebrows pop up, but I stayed calm and said, "I'm sure you'll do a fine job." And she did!

I pulled out my camera. "You have to take pictures of me getting my hair done?" Rachel griped.

"Pull that braid tighter, Carol," I urged. "Ouch," said Rachel.

As I took the photographs, I explained to my daughter that when she was older she'd be happy to have a record of these events.

The photographs capture only parts of the story, the parts where everything is under control. But looking at them may spark memories of the frazzled mommy behind the camera. The one who lovingly put all her energy into making sure the costume was labeled, the snacks were in the bag, and the hair and makeup got done.



# St. Peter's head doctor passes away

William Francis Conway Jr., MD, of Glenmont died on Wednesday, June 11.

Born in Albany, he was the eldest child of the late William F. Conway and Elaine Rose (Lawrence) Conway. Dr. Conway graduated from Vincentian Institute in 1957 and from Georgetown University College of Arts and Sciences in 1961. One year later, he married his childhood sweetheart, Barbara Butler Conway.

Dr. Conway began the pursuit of health care by following in the footsteps of his grandfather, William Francis Conway, MD, when he became a physician upon graduation from Georgetown University School of Medicine in 1966.

Between 1968 and 1970, he served as a captain in the United States Air Force Medical Corps, receiving the Air Force Commendation Medal for his service as chief of internal medicine at McClellan Air Force Base in California. Following his distinguished military service, Dr. Conway

continued his postgraduate training at Albany Medical Center Hospital, serving as chief resident in medicine in 1971 and 1972.

Dr. Conway served as assistant professor and assistant attending physician in infectious diseases at Albany Medical College and Albany Medical Center Hospital before engaging in the private practice of medicine between 1974 and 1985.

Throughout his medical career, he held many positions of distinction and received countless honors recognizing his service to his patients and his community.

At the time of his death, Dr. Conway was chairman of the infection control committee at St. Peter's Hospital; chairman of the physician advisory board of the Visiting Nurses Association of Albany; chief of the department of medicine at St. Peter's Hospital; clinical professor of medicine at Albany Medical College; chairman of the board of directors of Our Lady of Mercy Life Center in Guilderland; chairman of the board of directors of the Villa Mary Immaculate; and chief medical officer at St. Peter's

Healthcare Services.

Dr. Conway was an active member of the Albany County Medical Society and the Medical Society of the State of New York.

He received the Family Practice Education Award from Albany Medical College in 1999; the New York State Police Special Appreciation Award in 2000; and was named Physician of the Year at St. Peter's Healthcare Services in 2002.

"His life here on earth was truly an inspiration and gift for all of us who knew him and who loved him," his family wrote in tribute. "One of the greatest joys of his medical career was the opportunity to teach and try to challenge young residents. It brought him immense pleasure and satisfaction. His commitment to his profession and to the countless people whose lives he touched and made better was exceeded only by the boundless love he had for his family."

Continuing, the tribute read, "All who knew him understood that it was in his family that Dr. Bill found his greatest happiness and joy."

Survivors include his wife, Barbara; two sons, Timothy Butler Conway of Delmar, and William F. ## Duty links fire service workers

There is a well-worn tradition in the fire service that drives firefighters, when visiting another city, state or country, to stop in the local firehouse and share stories about the universal fight against Old Man Fire. Whether the firefighter is traveling for business, on vacation or even on a honeymoon (as some have been known to do, with all the risks of such well understood), the trip to the fire station in the town where they happen to be usually produces similar stories, concerns and attitudes concerning the mutual commitment to public safety on the part of both the visitor and the host.

If they are lucky, the visiting firefighter is also treated to a good firehouse meal and maybe even a "run" — fire service lingo for responding to an alarm of fire.

Such was the case when the firefighters of the Verdoj Volunteer Fire Department in Latham recently hosted Thomas Hyde, the assistant chief of the Ghana National Fire Service, known as the GNFS.

Hyde, a 37-year veteran of the 5,000-member fire service in his native country, was in the Latham area visiting a childhood friend, Dr. Robert Nii Nartey, an associate professor of history at Siena College. Nartey, in turn, happens to live next door to a longtime Verdoj firefighter, Don Carnegie, who arranged for Hyde to visit with the chiefs of the department and address the members who were assembled for the fire company's monthly meeting.

While Hyde's hometown of

Accra on Africa's west coast is more than 5,200 miles from Latham, the distance melted away as he described to Verdoj's volunteers both the challenges and concerns of firefighters half a world away.

"Safety of the firemen is paramount," Hyde said, echoing a sentiment often heard in America's firehouses.

If the firefighters aren't safe, the logic goes, they then are not able to help those to whom they have a duty to protect and serve. Therefore, firefighters in both countries learn that firefighter safety is a primary concern along with the safety of the public they are sworn to protect and serve.

Hyde noted, however, "Fire is the No.1 terrorist; it does not discriminate" in the way it hurts firefighters or members of the public.

The GNFS, in order to enhance both firefighter and public safety, is currently taking part in a multi-year training program with the United Kingdom Rescue Organization, through which GNFS members visit and train with fire services in the U.K. A recent focus of this joint training initiative has been on road safety; according to the Tyne and Wear Fire Rescue Service, one of the hosting fire departments, more than 1,500 Ghanaians are killed on the country's roadways each year, prompting the concentration on this discipline during the exchange program. Coincidentally, prior to the reconstruction of State Route 7 in Latham, which is the main roadway through the Verdoj Fire District, it was one of the most dangerous roads in New York, offering an appreciation among Verdoj's members for the challenge now confronting the GNFS.

There is also a mutuality of interest and concern for the enforcement of appropriate building codes and fire regulations in both Ghana and the United States. Several months ago, the GNFS made headlines with its Western Command's closure of several hotels leading up to the start of a major international soccer competition.

"We will have visitors from all over the continent and we want to ensure that they will be safe in our hotels," one of its commanders was quoted as saying at the time.

Interestingly, the Verdoj Fire District, the home of numerous hotels and a major transportation hub that includes a portion of the regional airport and major state roads within its borders, faces those

same responsibilities as its population mushrooms during the workday with both regular visitors and travelers from out of the area.

Assistant Chief Hyde, whose department was established in 1957 and is part of the Republic of Ghana's Ministry of the Interior, explained some of the differences in equipment and firefighting tactics, and marveled at some things that American firefighters probably take for granted.

Firefighting gear individually assigned to members — and the type of gear provided — were two of the starkest differences noted by Hyde. Each firefighter being provided full turnout (fire-resistant) gear of bunker coat and pants, helmets, breathing masks and other routinely issued equipment compares favorably to the limited turnout jumpsuits being shared by the members of the GNFS.

Thermal imaging cameras, which allow firefighters to see through smoke and are now considered must-haves in most fire departments here, are almost unheard of in Ghana. Hyde was taken with both the technology and how user-friendly it has become for the typical firefighter. Verdoj currently has two such cameras in service.

Hyde, dressed in an official sweater with "GNFS" embroidered along the left-front, also found the Verdoj department's 26-foot rescue boat with twin rescue platforms that fold out of the sides of the boat — used to patrol and respond to emergency calls on the Mohawk River and Erie Canal corridor — to be singularly appealing; he made several trips back to the boat during his guided tour of Verdoj's Route 7 facilities.

Equipment aside, the Ghanaian chief's views of what's important in the modern fire service were comparable to the views held by the Verdoj chiefs and members with whom he spoke, and probably also to the perspectives of most in today's American fire service.

"Training, training, training is the only way to make it in the fire service," he said.

Even as a veteran of 37 years, he acknowledged that he still learns every day his business of fighting fires and leading firefighters into battle.

During Hyde's visit, the volunteer firefighters of Verdoj learned a few things also, courtesy of a fire chief from a far-away land holding up his end of a longstanding tradition in the fire service, and not the least disappointed that neither meal nor "run" could be scrounged up during his short time there.

## Boycott beef production

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

Earlier this week, more than 100,000 South Koreans demonstrated against newly elected president Lee Myung-bak, as his entire cabinet offered to resign. At the root of this massive protest was not a declaration of war against North Korea, a boycott of the Chinese summer Olympics, or even escalating oil prices, it was a

treaty allowing U.S. beef imports.

Beef production accounts for more greenhouse gas emissions than automobiles. Its insatiable demand for feed grains has raised world food prices to levels beyond the reach of the world's hungry and the relief agencies that support them. Creation of beef pastures is the key cause of worldwide deforestation, including

the destruction of the Amazon rainforest. A beef-based diet requires more than 20 times as much land and water as a plant-based diet with equivalent amounts of calories and protein.

Nutritionally, beef offers protein, iron and some B vitamins, but no fiber, carbohydrates, nor most vitamins and minerals. On the other hand, it is replete with saturated fat, cholesterol, pesticides and pathogens, including occasionally, the prions of "mad cow" disease.

We should have 100,000 demonstrators marching on Washington to protest taxpayer subsidies to the U.S. beef industry. In the meantime, each one of us can demonstrate our own outrage with beef production on our next trip to the supermarket by selecting from the rich variety of soy- and plant-based meat alternatives in the frozen foods and produce sections.





## Office unveils device for cancer screening

A Slingerlands dental office has added the state-of-the-art VELscope Oral Cancer Screening System to its practice.

The office of doctors Wilson, Hart, Bausback and McGarry announced the purchase of a new screening device in March and says the technology is key to early cancer detection. Oral cancer affects three times as many victims as cervical cancer and is one of the few types of cancer that has not seen a significant reduction in incidence over the past 30 years.

Recent studies have shown a strong association with human Papilloma virus (HPV), which can be sexually transmitted. For this reason, Wilson, Hart, and Bausback believe that individuals over the age of 18 should have at least an annual comprehensive oral examination, and ideally at every dental hygiene visit.

The FDA and Health Canada recently cleared the VELscope System for assisting dentists and hygienists in discovering cancerous or precancerous growths that may not be apparent to the naked eye, and screening with the new system traditionally adds only one or two minutes to a conventional examination, and as many dental hygienists are quick to point out, is completely pain and discomfort free.

"With regard to oral disease, we recognize the importance of early detection and prevention,"

said Dr. Joseph Hart. "And this is why we feel the VELscope will help us provide the best care currently possible for our patients."

Oral cancer is typically discovered in late stages, according to Hart, when the five-year survival rate is only 22 percent, but if detected early, the five-year survival rate jumps to 80 percent or higher.

# Finance *in the* Spotlight

## Gift with purpose this graduation season

If we could grab a gift wish list of high school and college graduates, it would probably look a little like this:

- iPhone
- Sony Playstation 3
- New Car
- Plasma Television
- Vacation
- Cash

If a personal session feels over the top, enroll your graduate into a money management seminar.

3. Health — The Beatles sang: "I don't care too much for money, money can't buy me love." Well, money may not be able to buy you love, but studies have shown that people who earn more money are generally healthier and fitter than those who are not. While there's not any evidence that more money equates to a healthier lifestyle, or if looking fit leads to more opportunity, one thing is certain—when you're healthy, you always come out ahead. So help your graduate look better and reduce stress by giving them the gift of a gym membership. The bonus: lower health-care costs as they get older.

4. Clothes — Whether your graduate is an incoming freshman or aspiring professional, dressing for success when opportunity presents itself is important, and a nice suit is the way to do it in style. Stick with a dark or neutral color. For guys, go with a crisp shirt, quality tie and traditionally styled shoes. Girls should get a suit that includes a pair of pants and a skirt.

5. Travel and Entertainment — When it comes to being practical, a nice backpack trumps backpacking. So consider luggage as a gift option. Both students and young professionals travel, and quality travel gear is often out of their budget. If the backpacking spirit is too hard to hold back, and if it's within your means, give the gift of a trip. It can prove to be the experience of a lifetime, and it's better than your grad putting the can't-miss trip on plastic. Tickets to concerts, sporting events and/or dining out at restaurants are other things young people often spend money on but shouldn't.

According to a survey by the National Retail Federation and Hallmark, here are some gift-giving statistics this graduation season.

- 56.8 — The percentage of shoppers who will give cash as a gift. About 32 percent will give gift cards.
- \$52 — How much Americans shopping for graduation gifts this year will spend on each present. One-third of Americans will buy at least one gift. The average graduation gift shopper will buy two.
- 20.6 — The percentage of apparel and electronics gifts given to graduates.
- 17 — How many cards the average high school graduate receives.
- 4.5 — Amount in billions that Americans spent on graduation gifts in 2007.

So helping them out with gift certificates and passes to events can help them enjoy a little more of life without setting them back.

6. Books and Magazines — Forget *US Weekly* and romance and mystery books. I'm talking *Money Magazine* and books-like *Get a Financial Life: Personal Finance in Your Twenties and Thirties* by Beth Kobliner. The simple truth is that most kids go to college unprepared to make good financial decisions, and they pay the price as a result—more than \$20,000 of combined student loan and credit card debt on average. The idea is to raise awareness about money, so that when your grad is faced with making financial decisions, they are equipped with the knowledge to make decisions that are in their best short- and long-term interests. For kids going off to college for the first time, try *Young Money Magazine*. It's age specific, with realistic, easy-to-understand advice.

However, financial education doesn't have to wait until your grad dons her or his cap and gown. Banking basics, such as savings, budgeting, charitable giving and planning are things you should begin working with your children on at an early age, and it should continue throughout their young lives, at least through college. Because if you can teach your children how to manage money wisely, it is the gift that keeps giving, and they will thank you for it for the rest of their lives.

# Restaurants brace for lean times

## Local eateries stay positive in flagging economy

If there's one business that's feeling the crunch of the tight times we now inhabit, it just might be the restaurant industry. With food prices rising, shipping costs soaring and consumer behavior becoming more cautious, it seems that those enterprises that rely on all three to turn a profit would be in trouble.

While to declare the restaurant industry on the verge of collapse is reactionary, it has definitely seen decline. According to the Restaurant Performance Index — a monthly report compiled by the National Restaurant Association — the industry as a whole actually had a slight

improvement in April, the most recent month in which figures are available. It was only a 0.4 percent gain from March, however, when the index reached a record low.

Restaurant owners have also reported negative same-store sales for the fifth time in six months, and cited the economy and food prices as their top concerns.

The point is that operating an eatery can be a dodgy business, at least on a national scale.

However, some local restaurant owners are resting easy despite the slowdown.

Desiree Kalleigh, who has owned and operated Good Times Restaurant in Ballston Lake for 20 years, says that while there has been a change in consumer behavior, business owners must simply learn to adapt.

"I change my menu from day to night sometimes if I find the menu isn't what they're looking

for," said Kalleigh. "I change constantly."

One of those changes is the reintroduction of pizza to Good Times, which the restaurant hasn't seen in 20 years.

"It helps keep their bill reasonable," said Kalleigh.

Desiree for a smaller bill is a consumer trend not limited to any one area. In the service industry, however, frugal meals could have a direct impact on an entire occupation: servers.

Michael Lynn is a professor of Marketing and Tourism at Cornell University and an expert on tipping. There are currently no academic studies investigating the impact of the economic climate on tipping.

"Nevertheless," said Lynn, "you would expect that tip income is going to go down in three ways."

If fewer people are dining out to begin with, servers will have fewer chances to scoop up money as meals end. Secondly, since gratuity is generally based on how much one spends, smaller bills will mean leaner tips.

Lynn also suspects that the percentage people tip will go down.

"It's logical," he said. "The closest data I have is that price sensitivity is related to tipping. The more price sensitive people are, the less they are going to tip."

Under New York State Law, the minimum wage for food service workers is \$4.60 per hour; \$2.55 less than the general minimum wage.

Rebecca Schroepfel, a manager at the Pump Station Restaurant in Albany, says that she has noticed changes in her clientele.

"People are tending to order cheaper dishes, have fewer drinks and tip worse," said Schroepfel.

The restaurant has been seeing more customers, however, making their sales on par with last year's.

The Pump Station has changed their menu recently, cutting out a lot of bread-based dishes due to the escalating price of flour. Schroepfel also said they are considering switching from using increasingly expensive Styrofoam containers, whose production requires petroleum.

The consensus among local eateries is that people will still be eating out, and they'll want a more unique experience than that afforded by chain restaurants.

"I don't think what we're reading in the newspapers is affecting us here in the northeast area," said Michael Bauer, owner of Bloomers Bistro in Malta. He says that while the cost of food and fuel has gone up, he hasn't raised prices and is still seeing plenty of customers.

"People still do look to go out to dinner as a form of entertainment," said Bauer. "Instead of taking a vacation, they'll be going out to eat."

Kalleigh said she's seeing a lot more repeat customers these days. "People are willing to take the drive locally," she said. "I'm not seeing as many people coming off the Northway, where I have signs up. That business is almost obsolete."

Consumers definitely want an equal experience for less money these days, and that will be a boon for those offering the cheaper options.

Bret Daniel, owner of the Union Inn in Schenectady, says that he's "seen an increase in coupons. Business on our specialty nights has increased."

The Union Inn's menu mainly consists of burgers and other bar fare, and though he recently increased his prices for the first time since his business opened, Daniel says people are still looking for good food at a low price.

"Instead of a \$20 restaurant, people are going out for the cheaper options," he said.

want to get out of the house for classic vacation fun. The good news is you can stay in the area to soften pump pains — and you can take advantage of free or low-cost opportunities all over the Capital District.

According to Joe Dalton, the President of the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce, this summer should be a boon for the area simply because there's so much to do close to home.

"The person who might have flown out to Florida might not do that now, but there are more than enough things to do in Saratoga," said Dalton. "We think it's going to be a good summer; our inquiries are up."

That's what's happening in Chicago, where 61 percent of visitors to Fields Museum over Memorial Day Weekend were local. That's compared to just 37 percent last year, according to a *Sun-Time* article.

Christine Miles, Director of the Albany Institute of History and Art, said that while it is still early in the season to draw conclusions on attendance, some of the museum's volunteers said they may not be able to afford to travel to the museum for much longer.

So if you are one of the many who will be sticking close to home this summer, why not explore what the area has to offer? As the following examples show, you can even do it at low or no-cost.

### John Boyd Thacher State Park

Thacher Park offers not only an unparalleled view of Albany, 15 miles to the southwest, but plenty of picnic areas, an Olympic-sized swimming pool, volleyball courts and the Indian Ladder Trail.

Though the park holds more than 12 miles of trails, the Indian Ladder Trail is by far one of the more interesting walks you can take this summer. After descending a ladder, one follows a narrow path along the Helderberg Escarpment, one of

the richest fossil-bearing formations in the country. There are also waterfalls and a narrow cave that plunges into the rock for the adventurous.

Thacher Park is open from 8 a.m. until dusk in the summer, and it will cost you \$6 per car if you wish to park on-site.

### The Adirondacks

Residents of the Capital District live just hours away from the 2,000 miles of hiking trails, 3,000 ponds and lakes and hundreds of campgrounds in the Adirondack Region of New York.

Though you can book space at a resort or campground, true low-cost warriors will seek to experience nature firsthand by hiking the trails of the Adirondacks. All it will cost is the gas you use to get to the trailhead and back.

Though an extended expedition will require you to be well prepared — which will mean having the right (read: expensive) equipment — there are plenty of day hikes available as well.

There are plenty of resources to find the hike that is right for you. There are a slew of books and maps available at area hiking stores, and visitadironacks.com has guides to Adirondack hiking and other activities.

### Saratoga National Historical Park

Also known as the Saratoga Battlefield, this park was the site of a crucial 1777 American victory in the Revolutionary War. The visitor center features Revolutionary War exhibits, including a 20-minute orientation film.

Visitors can drive their car through the battlefield for \$5, or take a hike/bike trail for \$3. An annual pass is available for \$10.

Admission to the nearby Saratoga Monument and guided tours of American General Philip Schuyler's house are free.

The park is located off of Route 32, north of Stillwater.

### Ballston Spa free outdoor movies

As part of Ballston Spa's First Fridays, the Ballston Spa Busi-

ness and Professionals Association will be projecting family friendly movies onto the wall of the Front Street Deli building in Wiswall Park until October. The movies start at dark (around 9 p.m.). There will be reasonably priced concessions courtesy of the Union Fire Company.

Also note that the Ballston Spa film festival will be taking place Aug. 1 and 2 in Wiswall Park, with more than two dozen short films being screened. Check ballston.org for more information on both events.

# Hometown rivalry for state Senate primary

## Voelker challenges Breslin on the Democratic ticket

One Delmar Democrat thinks it's time for a new hometown senator to represent the 46<sup>th</sup> District, which encompasses Albany County, in the New York Senate.

Political newcomer Charlie Voelker is one of two challengers six-term incumbent Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, will be facing in the primary. The other is David Weiss of Rensselaerville.

Although technically his hometown is on Long Island, Voelker, who has lived in Delmar for nearly a decade and in Albany for 25 years before that, knows just how tough it will be to take on the Breslin family.

He says he's up to the task and that it's time to take the family out of family politics when it comes to the business of state and county government.

"The decision to run stemmed from needing to put some regular people back in government," Voelker said. "I have the utmost respect for the Breslins and their community service ... but I also believe you have to have some variety."

Referring to Breslin's two brothers, Albany County Executive Michael Breslin and Albany County Judge Thomas Breslin, Voelker said, "I believe I can be a more objective person in the state Senate when it comes to Albany County decisions. ... Sometimes it seems like family decisions are being made."

Running on a campaign of "Demand More Albany," Voelker said he plans to be the 46<sup>th</sup> District's full-time senator if he is elected in the fall.

"I believe we deserve a full-time state senator," Voelker said. "Sen. Breslin works for a

law firm, and that's fine ... but I plan to make it my main priority."

Having worked in corporate development for the past 25 years, Voelker said New York needs to raise more revenue without turning to taxes. Quickly pointing out that he's "not a pie-in-the-sky optimist," Voelker said he knows the solutions won't happen overnight.

"Our number one problem in New York state ... is our tax base," Voelker said, adding that when it comes to financial needs, "We throw a tax at it and think it will go away."

Voelker proposes having more private-public partnerships in order to increase state revenues.

Living and working with the residents of Albany County, Voelker said he is running as "an average guy" who knows the issues facing the constituents of the district.

"I'm not knocking Sen. Breslin on this ... but we need to have more people who know it's like to have to choose between buying groceries and putting gas in their car," Voelker said. "People are having to make these decisions."

Breslin responded by saying Voelker has every right to run but that having the full support of the Albany County Democratic Committee speaks for itself. The senator said he is comfortable in his re-election bid and that he welcomes the challenge.

Voelker said he did not seek the Democratic Committee's support because he didn't want to force people to take a public stand against the Breslin family when many committee members are state and county workers.

As for Voelker's suggestion that he wasn't a full-time senator, Breslin said, "I'm a little part-time lawyer, and I put in 100 hours a week on this job."

Breslin's last primary was in 1998 when Anthony S. Esposito ran against him but dropped out

of the race before Primary Day. The senator's last Republican challenger was in 2004 when Democratic Albany County Comptroller Michael Conners switched parties to run unsuccessfully against him.

Breslin was unsure why he had two primary challenges after a decade of none, saying, "You'd have to ask them."

Either way, Voelker said, he is ready for the Sept. 9 primary against Breslin and that he doesn't need a Democratic Party endorsement to win over Albany County Democrats.

"People are pretty politically savvy in this town with the Capitol and state government. People know politics," Voelker said. "I'm banking on that."

Raised in Garden City, Voelker is the youngest of six children and attended the University at Albany. Graduating in 1987 with a bachelor of science degree in rhetoric and communications, Voelker said he decided to stay in the area to pursue a career.

After graduation, he joined Capital Cablevision, later to become Time Warner Cable, as a commercial engineer and in 1995, he began working as the radio commentator for the College of Saint Rose's men's basketball team. The next year he partnered with Rodger Wyland of Channel 13 WNYT to become the voices of Great Dane Football and Basketball at the University at Albany from 1996 to 2002.

In 1997, Voelker left Time Warner Cable to become vice president and general manager of the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs minor league baseball team before returning to his alma mater in 2003 to become the university's associate athletic director of external affairs.

Voelker and his wife, Kim, live in Delmar in their 7-year-old son.

it's not an insignificant number," Lytle said.

Giordano said he is not targeting teachers or district staff, pointing out that their salaries are contractually protected and they will be paid and given their negotiated raises whether or not the school budget is passed in any given year.

He said he believed there should be "true disclosure of contracts when they are completed."

Lytle and Loomis responded that much of the school's budget were items "out of the hands" of administrators.

Loomis said the district is in a constant struggle to remain competitive with the 12 members of the Suburban Council in order to attract and retain the best possible teachers for the district.

"Even though we are one of the highest academic performers ... our teachers are in sixth place," Loomis said, referring to the fact that a Bethlehem teacher's base pay is the sixth highest out of the 12-district council.

Giordano said that's an issue that needs to be addressed region-wide.

"The problem is that the contracts are done every three or four years and by the time the contracts are up you're back at the bottom of the list. So every time one of the 12 schools raises their teachers pay everyone has to get a raise?" Giordano asked. "The school budget will never be conservative, it will only grow."

Incoming superintendent Michael Tebbano agreed with Loomis, and added that he plans to continue the Citizens Budget Group process under his tenure.

The school offers teachers with a master's degree a starting salary of \$42,000, plus benefits, according to school records. The school also

pays \$75 a day for substitute teachers, but as Loomis put it, "It's hard get good substitutes when they can go to the next town and get \$100 or more."

Lytle said healthcare is another rising cost for the district, with the biggest bulk of the budget lying in staff expenses.

"It's obviously a sensitive issue," said Lytle. "I can appreciate the fact that people are looking at a tough economic environment."

Giordano said he only wants to open up the dialogue on the school's biggest expenditure.

"I know it's going to be uncomfortable and the unions are going to hate it and hate me," Giordano said. "What is everyone afraid of? Why can't we talk openly about this?"

Lytle and Giordano differed on their views of what the citizens group was allowed to work on, with Lytle saying "they're privy to everything, really," and Giordano saying budget group members were relegated to "deciding to redo the gym floor."

Giordano, who has a business background and is active with the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce, said the group pushed through a savings of about \$84,000 on a budget that was around \$84 million.

When asked why he didn't run for the board of education, Giordano said he only has this one concern and that the current board is doing "a great job."

Giordano reiterated that he was in favor of giving teachers raises, but questioned if they were on pace with the taxpayers who pay their salaries. He said he wants to have the community take a good look into the process and bring more people "off the payroll" into the discussion.

"I want teachers to get raises, but I want it to be rational," he said. "It may very well be that what we find out is that this is very comfortable. But if you don't get let in ... it begins to smell like something is wrong."

on behalf of the town; Assistant Town Attorney Andrew Kirby is handling prosecution.

The matter began last year when Quinn put up two banners underneath his permanent restaurant sign on Route 9W in Glenmont. He was advertising a lunch buffet special in order to draw larger lunch crowds away from nearby national chain competitors.

Quinn said it worked, but was told by the town's chief building inspector Gil Boucher to take it down. When he refused, he was cited for violating town code and forced to take the banners down.

He originally applied for a sign variance for the banners, according to the zoning board of appeals administrative assistant Nanci Moquin, but was denied because he did not provide evidence that he was losing business. Quinn contends he is being singled out by Boucher and would have been denied the variance with financial records or not, and that at the time he was asked for records, the previous restaurant owner had just died.

Quinn asked for a jury trial and went to town court on Wednesday, May 14, for his violation of the town's zoning code, but Town Justice Paul Dwyer denied Quinn a jury and heard the case himself, according to Quinn.

Dwyer is expected to make a decision on the case in early July.

The town has repeatedly said

Quinn was given several opportunities to clear up the matter. Officials said banners are illegal in town without a variance, and Quinn was cited for being in violation, adding that he was never arrested and is not being targeted.

Quinn, however, said he is convinced Boucher is unfairly attacking him and he said there are numerous illegal banners throughout town that go unchecked. He claims local and independent businesses are put to a different standard than the national chains popping up along 9W.

Boucher has not responded to repeated inquiries on the matter but did appear in court in May on behalf of the town.

Supervisor Jack Cunningham said the local law to change the zoning code would go into effect as soon as the paperwork is filed with the state. Cunningham said town justices will have discretion in the sentencing of such cases and could impose both a fine and a jail sentence or successive sentences.

However, Cunningham pointed out that code violation trials are "extraordinarily uncommon."

Quinn said he remains confident that he will win his trial, and although he originally sought to represent himself, his case was referred to Ryan.

"Harvey was representing himself and he had wanted a jury trial because he thought there would be jail time involved," Ryan said. "This is just a violation, not a crime."

Ryan said whatever the town justice decides; Quinn will be facing a fine at most.

# Entertainment *in the* Spotlight

**W**hen Chuck Brouillette was a kid in Albany, he went down to a local store and gave the comic book rack a spin. Something he saw changed his life.

Brouillette, who had read a few Disney and "Archie" comics to that point, was transfixed by the cover of a comic depicting "The Flash." The superhero's red outfit with a yellow flash stood in stark contrast to the white paper it was

printed on, and Brouillette had to have it.

"I just fell in love," he said.

In the roughly 30 years since, comics have played a huge role in Brouillette's life. Their influence will be on display Saturday, June 21, at the Saratoga Springs City Center, Brouillette and his brother, Ed, will host their second comics and art convention.

Brouillette is quick to point out, though, that people need not be comic book aficionados like him to enjoy the

show. There will be art of all kinds on display, along with a vintage Batmobile and Star Wars characters, including a fully functional R2-D2.

"If you want to be surprised or delighted by any kind of art form, you should come," Brouillette said.

For years, Chuck and Ed had dreamed of having this kind of convention locally that they could attend (Brouillette, 46, used to pass his comic books down to

his brother, who is five years younger and became an avid collector in his own right). Albany used to host conventions at the Egg, but it's been more than a decade since the Capital District really had a big comic show, Chuck said.

So he and his brother decided last year to stage their own. Their credentials extend beyond just collecting comics; Chuck is an artist and

used to manage the Warner Brothers store in Colonie Center, where he oversaw a gallery featuring original comic book drawings (or cels).

The stereotype of a comic book collector is "a guy who lives in his parents' basement," Brouillette said. In truth, comics are a sophisticated art whose stories are almost like America's own breed of mythology, he said.

Given his reverence for comics, he and Ed didn't want to take a traditional approach to their convention, stocking it with just comic book vendors and artists.

"I wanted it to be an art expo," Brouillette said.

So alongside the people selling comics were people drawing calligraphy and showing off other kinds of artistic talent.

Brouillette, who lives in Saratoga, figured it was a good location for the convention because it's close to Montreal, New England and New York City. Even so, he and Ed were surprised at just how many people turned out for the inaugural convention.

"It was a great success," Brouillette said.

"We had at least 800 people there."

This year's show, he said, will be even bigger and better. There will be a slew of guest artists, such as Rob Granito, an artist/illustrator who has worked for Warner Brothers, DC comics, Disney, MTV and VH1 and designed the one-day special-issue Batman postage stamp for the United States Postal Service. Sid Couchey, who worked on the Harvey Comics characters Richie Rich, Little Lotta and Little Dot, will be on hand, along with Fred Hemback, whose work has been published by both DC and Marvel Comics.

Several local comic book stores will have booths at the convention. The Brouillettes regularly shop at Spa City comics on Phila Street in Saratoga Springs, and owner Shaun Belisto will bring books, toys and other merchandise to the show. Darren Carrara, who owns The Comic Depot in Greenfield Center, returns, and this year will host a Magic the Gathering card gaming event.

Carrara, who's heard customers reminisce about the big comic conventions Albany used to hold that inspired the Brouillette brothers, said the lure of the convention is about more than selling merchandise.

"It's fun to chit-chat all day with people who are into that stuff," he said.





as a camper and Michael works there as a counselor.

Many of his baseball players from St. Rose work at the camp each summer. According to Casey O'Connor, the St. Rose baseball team's current coach, the camp employs about 10 to 12 players each summer both past and present.

It seems like once players had the chance to work with Bellizzi, they took advantage of as many opportunities as they could to continue doing so. Casey O'Connor, for instance, worked with Bellizzi as a baseball player on his team, a coach at the summer camp, and as a coach with him at St. Rose. O'Connor took over the team after Bellizzi's death.

"We're a very tight family, even to this day," says Casey O'Connor.

"I took the job and ... I was very appreciative to keep his legacy going. All the coaches on my staff are graduates of the college of St. Rose and all played in the program. We tried to keep the [program going] because it was something that was so good and so special—we tried to keep it as close to what it's been as we can," says O'Connor.

O'Connor began working with Bellizzi in 1994, and worked with him straight through until his passing. O'Connor reminisced about his time spent with Bellizzi and how he was more than just a coach.

"He signed on and took great interest in his players, and actually many players responded to him almost like a second father," says

O'Connor.

He was understanding when it was appropriate (if his players made a mistake or two on or off the field), but he was direct and strict when he had to be.

Bellizzi knew baseball well and taught it well, but maybe what made the biggest impact on Bellizzi's players was how he taught them about interacting with one another and the world. He was loyal—he always made sure the members of his team had a fair shot at their future. O'Connor tries to remember these values that Bellizzi instilled in him when working with his own players and when working on his own coaching style.

"There are 412 people who came through the baseball system and nobody has a negative thing to say about [Bellizzi]," says O'Connor.

Bellizzi used these same values when working with his campers.

In the last years of Bellizzi's life it was physically difficult for him to participate as much as he did in the beginning with both his camp and baseball team (amongst the other programs he ran). Confined to a wheelchair,

he would enter the gym where his baseball players were practicing, bring it into the highest gear, and chase his players around. He always tried to have a good attitude about life.

Bellizzi's Grand Slam camp is geared towards children aged 6 to 15. Considered a summer day camp, it's run out of the Elm Avenue Park in Delmar from 9 p.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday, and each session is five days long. The first session starts Monday, July 7. The camp will run straight through for the following six weeks. Campers can sign up for as many sessions as they'd like. Some campers have attended Bellizzi's Grand Slam Baseball Camp for all six weeks straight.

"We do some light instruction with the kids, but mostly we focus on [them] having a positive and fun experience," says Kim Bellizzi, who helps run the camp.

Campers are broken up into small groups during the day, mostly by age. During the morning they work on a particular baseball skill, and then in the afternoon they eat lunch in the pool complex, take a dip, and return to the field for

a game of baseball or a contest, which encourages light-hearted competitiveness.

After Bellizzi's death, his family and those he worked with him closely decided to keep the camp going along with the St. Rose baseball team, which he started with no baseball field and no uniforms.

"He had the idea that he was going to start a team and through a lot of hard work, sweat and adversity, he did that," says O'Connor. It seems that Bellizzi put a lot of sweat and hard work into everything he did, from starting his baseball team at St. Rose to starting his baseball camp in Delmar.

While a strong knowledge of the game of baseball and strong skills are necessary to play on the St. Rose team, anyone can participate in the camp.

"Even for the kids who weren't so much the baseball type, they

went there because their friends were going and they knew they could have a good time," says O'Connor.

"Coach Bellizzi was such a big figure and had such a big name, (parents) often sent their kids there as more of a summer camp experience. It was a good time and it was a fun time. I wish I had the time to do it now," says O'Connor.

Above all, Kim Bellizzi emphasized that the camp is a positive and nurturing experience for the campers—just as all of Bellizzi's efforts were for his students and players.

## The legacy of Bob Bellizzi

### After coach's death, Grand Slam Baseball Camp carries on

When you hear Bob Bellizzi's name, perhaps the first words that come to mind are compassionate, mentor, teacher, and, of course, baseball.

Perhaps you knew him as a

teacher at Albany High School, or as founder and coach of St. Rose's baseball team, or as Bob Bellizzi of Bob Bellizzi's Grand Slam Baseball Camp. Located in Delmar, the baseball camp celebrates its 15th anniversary this summer.

It is part of the legacy that Bob Bellizzi, the camp's founder, left behind after he died from leukemia in May of 2006. In addition to starting and running his summer camp, he taught

social sciences at Albany High School and founded, coached and managed St. Rose's baseball team until his death.

Throughout all of his endeavors, he consistently provided unwavering mentorship, support and a strong sense of community for his students, baseball players and colleagues.

Ask anyone who had the opportunity to work with Bellizzi, and they'll attest to this statement: Bellizzi's Grand Slam Baseball Camp stands as an example of the work he did and how he made his impact on those with whom he surrounded himself.

The staff of the camp consists of players from the St. Rose baseball team, Bellizzi's family, and campers-turned-baseball coaches (including two of Bellizzi's sons).

Alongside Kim Bellizzi, wife of the late Bob Bellizzi, are Rich Seebode and Aaron Haacker, both of whom are schoolteachers. Seebode and Haacker played for St. Rose, while Bellizzi was coaching, and went on to coach

for St. Rose before pursuing careers in education.


"I've been working at the camp since a year after Bob started it—since 1994. I've played for Coach Bellizzi and I coached with him. I've been with the camp basically since the start," says Seebode.

Seebode isn't the only one who's been working with the camp since its inception. Bellizzi's son, Robbie Bellizzi, a student and baseball player at St. Rose, started attending the camp as a camper at age four. Now, at age 20, he works there as a counselor.

"They've cut their teeth on this," says Kim Bellizzi of Robby and her two other sons, Michael and Alex, who are also involved with the camp—Alex still attends
