

High food prices, where they come from and what can be done

The prices on the grocery store shelf have read like a book over the past few years, and it has not been a particularly upbeat tale.

The prices of nearly every food commodity — meaning raw, unprocessed foods, think corn, not Corn Pops — have increased markedly, some more dramatically than others.

According to figures from the US Department of Agriculture, the price of a dozen eggs rose 28 percent between May 2007 and May 2008. A box of lemons, \$8.12 in 2007, cost \$20.77 a year later. Wheat jumped 80 percent to almost \$9 per bushel. Then there's corn, which is fluctuating in the \$6 and \$7 range per bushel.

All in all, the consumer price index for food is forecast to increase 4.5 to 5.5 percent by the end of 2008, according to the USDA. Food commodities as a group had risen 60 percent over a two-year period as of May.

Area consumers have noticed the changes.

"My mother and father never looked at prices," said Ronda Jeffer, an Albany resident who was shopping at a Price Chopper grocery store in Delmar. "Now she is looking at prices for the first time in 37 years."

Jeffer continued: "I used to buy whatever I wanted. Now I'm more careful. I don't throw anything out, and if I see something on sale, I'm going to buy 10 of them."

Delmar resident Angela Leary echoed those thoughts.

"Everything I bought was on sale," she said, pointing to her shopping cart. "I've been shopping at different stores. I got to Wal-Mart to get the things I can't get on sale."

The situation is being felt by the area's needy population as well. Lynda Schuyler is the executive director at Food Pantries for the Capital District, a group that helps 48 food pantries across Albany and Rensselaer counties meet their goals. She said that

Audit critical of Soares' office

County comptroller says district attorney's petty cash funds mismanaged

Albany County Comptroller Michael Connors has released the findings of an audit on the Albany County District Attorney's Office that states there are several financial discrepancies involving the office's petty cash fund, as well as other bookkeeping errors.

In response, District Attorney David Soares said he "emphatically disagree(s)" that his office has misused or misappropriated any of its funds.

Connor's office conducted the audit on May 8 on the district attorney's petty cash fund of \$5,000, which is managed by Soares' director of administration. The critical audit condemned several areas of financial management by Soares' office and cites a lack of proper paperwork.

"The findings of this audit illustrate that in the case of fiscal management of its petty cash fund, the director of administration of the Office of the District Attorney has routinely ignored attempts to properly and accurately maintain this account," Connors wrote in the audit's conclusion. "The director of administration of the Office of the District Attorney has demonstrated a total disregard for fiscal management, a complete lack of compliance with county guidelines for the use of the petty cash fund and exhibits a sense of entitlement that is dangerous to the fiscal matters of the District Attorney's Office."

Vista zoning law discussed

Change required before development can move forward

On Wednesday, July 23, the public discussed a draft of a law that would turn the Town of New Scotland's share of the Vista Technology Park development into a mixed economic development district.

Development of the tech park cannot begin until New Scotland changes the zoning regulations on

the piece of land, which is currently zoned residential/agricultural.

Some of those who spoke at the a public hearing at the New Scotland Town Hall pushed for the proposed law to have more specific language and guidelines for environmental protection.

The Vista Technology Park, which will feature a variety of buildings and offices, will be located in both New Scotland and Bethlehem, and is being developed by the BBL Development Group.

"The purpose of this [mixed economic development] district is to allow for coordinated intermunicipal development of planned office, industry, service and retail business and technology-based

business," according to the law's filing form.

The technology park is expected to cost an estimated \$200 million and take up 458 acres. The project will require 1.4 million square feet of office space, and developers say it could lure up to 5,000 employees to the area.

New Scotland Supervisor Tom Dolin said that while New Scotland does currently have a moratorium on commercially developed zones, it would not apply to Vista now or if it were to become a mixed economic development district.

Dan Hershberg, who spoke on behalf of the developers, said the

Domestic dispute leads to felony DWI arrest

David R. Lengyel, 50, of Slingerlands was arrested on July 4, for felony DWI, second offense, and leaving the scene of a property-damage auto accident.

Bethlehem Police said they received a call to respond to an incident on Olympian Drive in Slingerlands where a vehicle was reported as damaged after it was struck by another vehicle driven by a possible intoxicated driver "who fled the scene."

Upon arrival, the complainant flagged down officers and investigators saw a damaged four-door blue sedan in the parking lot and that there was also a Chevrolet pickup

truck improperly parked that "appeared abandoned by the operator," according to the arrest report. Police said the pickup had corresponding damage and points of impact with the other vehicle.

The complainant described the driver as a white male with a green shirt and said he was last seen going around the apartment building on the premises to the upstairs rear apartment, the report states.

Police proceeded to the rear apartment entranceway and say "a white male was observed slouched in a plastic patio chair," according to the report, and the man appeared to be "heavily

intoxicated" and was wearing a green shirt, pants, white socks, and no shoes.

The outer screen door to the apartment was knocked out the frame and was on the deck floor, according to police, but the inner door was closed.

When the man was asked to identify himself he used the chair for support and stood up and then fumbled through his wallet, the report states, and then took out a stack of personal papers before handing the wallet over to police with his driver's license in it, which identified him as Lengyel.

When asked what had taken place, Lengyel "replied he had a fight with his sister," according to police, and he admitted he was backing his vehicle up and hit the other car.

Lengyel's right eye was injured with bruising and

swelling where his sister had allegedly hit him, the report states.

Police said they escorted Lengyel down the stairs of the apartment and away from several family members who had "exited the apartment and were verbally escalating the situation."

The complainant positively identified him as the driver who had hit the vehicle and Lengyel was given a field-sobriety test, but, according to the report, due to the eye injury and his level of intoxication, Lengyel was unable to complete the test and was taken into police custody.

Police said he tested positive for alcohol and his vehicle was towed, and once at the Bethlehem Police Station, Lengyel refused three times to submit to a chemical test.

A check revealed that Lengyel was convicted of DWI and a

personal-injury auto accident on June 21, 2001, and also of DWAI on Sept. 28, 1999, according to the arrest report.

Emergency Medical Services workers arrived on the scene to treat Lengyel, but upon evaluation he "signed off" on additional treatment, the report states.

Lengyel is scheduled to return to Bethlehem Town Court on Aug. 5.



Ride fearless for a second chance

Charity event and bone marrow drive set in memory of Anthony Hill

Anthony Hill lived fearlessly during his struggle with lymphoma.

His death in 2006 rocked the community and left a void in the lives of his family and friends, but his legacy has been one of giving second chances to those still fighting and living fearlessly every day.

A charity fundraising event in his honor is being held on Saturday, Sept. 13, at the Eastern New York Laborer's Training Center in Glenmont.

The third annual Fearless Ride for Life and Bone Marrow Drive will benefit Link to Life Bone Marrow Testing and a local child in need at Albany Medical Center. The event began with Anthony Hill's struggle to find a bone marrow match and was carried on by his mother Jacqueline Hill and several other community members who were inspired by his life.

"This actually was Anthony's idea. He wanted people to be put on the registry. He didn't want anyone to go through what he went through," said organizer Ella Ruff of the bone marrow drive. "It's pretty important, and I don't think people think about it until it affects them."

Anthony Hill died at age 17 after he was unable to find a willing donor.

Free bone marrow testing (normally \$45) will be provided at the event, which will put possible donors on a registry. There are currently 6 million enrollees in

the National Bone Marrow Donor Program, with 3,120 matches found last year. Roughly 35,000 people are waiting to find a bone marrow match, according to the National Marrow Foundation, most of whom are under the age of 17.

Only 30 percent of those will find a match within their family, leaving the other 70 percent seeking outside donor matches, which is why the registry is so important, according to Hill and Ruff.

The Fearless Ride for Life and Bone Marrow Drive will include a 100-mile scenic ride open to all modes of transportation that will begin and end at the Laborer's Training Center. There will also be a raffle for a 2008 Harley Davidson Anniversary Edition Soft-tail Deluxe and several theme baskets; a dunking booth; games and prizes; face painting; airbrush and Henna tattoos; and other organized activities.

Live music will also be on hand with Playing with Fire headlining the event. The band is made up of Elsmere Fire Department members and they are playing at the event for free in order to help raise money for Hill's cause.

"This event is in memory of my son Anthony Hill ... a strong and caring young man," said Jacqueline Hill, who is organizing the event. "We want people to know how important this is. ... We hope by next year we have a foundation set up in his name."

In the meantime, Hill has to buy the Harley Davidson that is raffled off each year, and the winner has to pay the taxes on the bike. Tickets are \$20 each and are limited to only 1,500.

"The odds are pretty good," Hill said. "The guy that won last year only bought one ticket, so you never know."

Hill will be at Spitzie's Harley Davidson, 1970 Central Ave., in Albany, every Saturday in August from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. to show off the motorcycle being raffled.

Tickets for the event and for the Harley Davison raffle can be purchased at CynderElla's Subs, which is owned by Ruff, on the corner of Delaware Avenue and Kenwood Avenue, or at Spitzie's. Pre-registration for the ride is

\$20, and \$30 for drivers on the day of the event, and \$10 for passengers. General admission to the event, which includes food, music, and entertainment, is a donation of \$10 for adults and \$5 for children under 10.

The event continues to grow each year, according to Ruff.

"We had 200 plus people last year and this year we hope to have 300 or more," she said. "We've added a lot of people to the registry."

However, Hill asked that people only do the bone marrow testing if they intend to go through with the donation.

"Don't do it unless you're going to do it. You're giving someone a second chance at life," Hill said. "Our main concern is getting people on the registry."

Anthony Hill did find one potential match on the registry out of tens of thousands of names, according to Hill, which was a very rare type to match — but the donor decided not to go through with the procedure when contacted.

The testing is not as invasive as it once was and is now done with a cotton swab of a potential donor's cheek, Hill said.

She and her son lived in Clarksville, where she still resides. Anthony Hill died the December before his graduation from Berne-Knox-Westerlo. The graduating class that year honored him at the ceremony and elected Hill to give the commencement speech, which she did, in a moving and emotional pre-recorded message to her son's classmates.

Organizers are still accepting donations, prizes to be raffled off, and sponsors for the 2008 Drive Fearless Ride for Life and Bone Marrow Drive. To sponsor the event or to donate, call Ruff at 439-8277; Hill at 768-2443; or Lynnemarie Bertrand at 439-0732.

"It's a really great time," Ruff said. "People helping people; it doesn't get any better than that."

Golf mixer swings into Latham

Women's charity golf outing for players and non-players alike

If you think a birdie, a bogie, and an eagle are animals of the sky, or if your ideal day ends playing the back nine, then either way, this golf event is for you.

Seasoned golfers and "I have never played in my life" golfers are invited to the Sadie Hawkins Golf Mixer on Friday, Aug. 22. Registration has begun for the women's charity event, which will benefit the Thomas P. Morrison Foundation, Women's Fund of the Capital Region, The Legal Project, and the Quik Flight Air Ambulance Service.

The event will be divided into two tournaments of experienced golfers, and the not-so-experienced golfers, or as organizer Melody Burns puts it, the "OK, this is a club" golfers.

"I'm not a golfer, I just started. ... For years I couldn't see what all the excitement was about chasing this little ball around, but now I'm hooked," Burns said. "This gives them the opportunity to say, 'OK, this is a club,' and even if you have to swing at the ball 25 times to hit it, it's a fun time."

A sizable list of current sponsors includes the Colonie Chamber of Commerce, Crossgates Mall, Panera Bread and the Capital District Women's Bar Association, which described the fundraiser as a "girls only" golf tournament.

The event will be held at the Mill Road Acres in Latham and all 18 holes of the course will be a part of the fundraiser, with the non-golfers on the front nine and experienced golfers on the back nine, according to Burns.

The golfers themselves, depending on their play, will choose which of the four main beneficiaries of the golf outing gets the lion's share of the money raised.

The Thomas P. Morrison Foundation was created in order to provide financial support to children and families of children suffering from

metabolic disorders and similar rare diseases and conditions.

The Women's Fund of the Capital Region has a mission to promote "the independence, growth, and self-determination of women and girls by supporting projects that create systemic change and move women and girls toward financial stability and independence."

The Legal Project is a private, not-for-profit organization, founded by the Capital District Women's Bar Association in 1995. It provides a variety of free and low-cost legal services to the working poor, victims of domestic violence and other underserved individuals in the Capital District.

Quik Flight is an on-demand private aircraft charter and air ambulance company with administrative offices in the Albany International Airport.

"I have women coming all the way from Orange and Rockland counties," Burns said. "Besides being a great opportunity to network with other business women, it will be a fun way to help other organizations."

Registration costs \$100, and a tee-sign will also cost \$100. Corporate and business sponsors can be a part of the event for a flat \$250 sponsorship fee and be included on all literature and forms and have a tee-sign.

The event includes lunch; "agoodie bag"; nine holes of golf; carts or pull carts; beverages on the course; contests; raffles; and photos of each foursome.

The Colonie Chamber of Commerce is sponsoring the registration, which begins at the golf course at 11:30 a.m. A "golf clinic" will be held for non-golfers at noon, with that group taking to the course at 12:30 p.m. Experienced golfers will begin at 1:15 p.m., and the event will be followed by a cocktail hour.

RCS tries plotting bus routes to save on fuel costs

You can only cut so many bus routes, and school buses can only hold so many students. Those are two hard and fast facts that Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk officials are dealing with this summer as they attempt to plan bus routes without busting the bank — so to speak.

Transportation director Janice Prior and head bus driver Kevin Williams are in the midst of planning bus routes for the 2008-09 school year and the cost of diesel fuel is weighing heavily on their minds.

Diesel prices have increased from \$2.35 a gallon in July 2007 to \$4.20 a gallon this July; the overall fuel budget has increased more than 100 percent, up to \$575,000 this school year.

District buses travel between 5,600 and 5,800 miles each day.

"We already cut two bus routes each of the last two years so we are really limited in what we can do there," said Williams. "However, we are looking at maximizing our bus loads — if it's a 66-passenger bus, then placing 66 students on it — knowing that when the school year gets going we will lose some of those

kids as their parents start bringing them into school or they get rides with friends."

Williams said the department has just begun plotting next year's routes as placements in out-of-district schools are still being delivered to him, as well as registrations from each district school.

Like in the past couple of years, Williams said the department is using computerized logistics routing programs to determine the quickest routes with the least amount of miles to be traveled to pick up and return students, as well as to transport other students to their various out-of-district placements.

Likewise, a no idling rule will be enforced whenever possible in the district to reduce fuel waste, as well as cut down on emissions.

There are no plans to reduce field trips within the district, although each school is operating within a specific budget they must adhere to for the trips.

"We are working the best we can to maximize our fuel expenditures while providing the services we need to," Williams said.

Good vibes come from finding right doctor

About halfway through my pregnancy I switched doctors. After the initial consult with the new doctor, I turned to my husband and said, "I love that man." My husband said, "I understand."

Don't get me wrong, it wasn't a romantic kind of love; it was more like idol worship.

At the first appointment with Dr. Wonderful (don't look him up in the phone book; it's a pseudonym), I struggled for an appropriate explanation for why I had switched doctors. Not that Dr. W. even asked; I just felt I needed to say something.

But what could I say that wouldn't sound like the hormone-induced complaints of a pregnant woman? There wasn't a single issue; it was an accumulation of incidents. Should I tell him even my super-calm husband was irritated by the former doctor? Would that boost my credibility?

Still, I was there to have my pregnancy monitored, not to vent about previous care. So I looked at my husband, then I looked at Dr. W., and I said of my former physician: "Dr. Jekyll and I were not a good match." And Dr. W. replied, "Neither were we." Turns out the two had worked together at some

point. This meant Dr. W. and I had both parted ways with Dr. Jekyll. I felt an immediate kinship.

After that, I was able to open up and talk about my inability to keep down food. I expressed concern that my lack of weight gain might be a problem with the baby. He responded by describing how cave people would hunt the woolly mammoth. He said sometimes the people killed the mammoth and brought home dinner, but other times the mammoth killed the people. This he somehow related back to how a pregnant woman's body knows to store up what it needs, assuring me that I was doing just fine.

Another time he downplayed his role in the birth. "You're going to do all the work," he told me, "I'm just a high-priced bottom wiper."

Throughout the remainder of my pregnancy, we met regularly. First it was monthly, then twice a month, then once a week.

"What did you learn in Lamaze?" Dr. W. asked me one day. "That there are people even more anxious than me," I

replied. "You, anxious?" he said incredulously.

He was so calm and reassuring. In his presence I wasn't my usual nauseated, nervous, cranky self.

Somehow my husband refrained from blurting out, "This woman's an imposter. This is not her real personality."

And during all those prenatal appointments, and all my annual visits after my daughter was born, what impressed me most was that Dr. W. always maintained eye contact, and I never felt rushed. He would talk to me like I was the only patient he had to see that day.

One year I showed up for my annual check-up and a different doctor walked into the exam room. Turns out Dr. W. had gotten a partner in the practice since my last visit and due to a scheduling snafu the partner was handling my appointment. I was close to bursting into tears, but I held it together.

The substitute doctor was certainly nice and professional, but he was no Dr. Wonderful. I had a history with Dr. Wonderful. I had a recent photograph of my daughter to show him. This other doctor had no connection to my daughter!

The next year I made sure that I would be seeing Dr. W. I grilled the receptionist: "And it's going to be Dr. W., right? Because last year some other

doctor, a complete stranger, appeared in the exam room, and it wasn't even because Dr. W. had been called to deliver a baby!"

I'd bet not everyone who went to see Dr. W. thought he was wonderful. Each person connects with a physician in an individual way. One person's Dr. Wonderful could be another's Dr. Jekyll. Much of a doctor-patient relationship has to do with individual circumstances and personality.

For me, Dr. W. was a good match.

Even in recent years, when he switched from paper charts to recording notes directly into a laptop computer, he never let the technology dehumanize the care. He always apologized if he was running behind schedule. He always shook my hand at the end of the appointment and said, "Pleasure to see you again."

Now, did Dr. W. really think it was a pleasure to see me again? With hundreds of patients did he even really know who I was? Did he appreciate that I stayed with his practice even after I moved across town?

I didn't care. I looked forward to my annual visits. It was about me, not him.

"What's on your mind?" he'd ask, nodding toward the paper in my hand (I always prepared a list of questions and concerns).

I remember the one conversation we had in the middle of the night. It was pouring rain outside, the contractions were coming more frequently and I was considerably uncomfortable. He suggested I take a shower and go on over to the hospital. Then he said, "Are you going to name the baby Brenda?"

For a split second I was perplexed. Then I realized he meant to say "Bertha," the name of the hurricane wreaking havoc with the weather. "Uh, no," was my reply. About eight hours later my daughter was born.

Twelve years flew by and one day after work I was standing at the kitchen table flipping through the mail. When I saw

the envelope from Dr. W.'s office I thought it must be a reminder about my annual mammogram. But I was wrong. It was not a reminder. It was a letter from the doctor explaining about his plan to relocate, spend more time with family and pursue personal goals.

"Oh, no!" I gasped, searching out my husband to deliver the news. "Dr. W. is ending our relationship."

"I'm sorry," said Jeff, looking truly contrite.

Sporadically throughout dinner, regardless of the conversation topic, I would interject with, "I'm not going to be able to see Dr. W. anymore. I have to find a new doctor."

My daughter, Rachel, asked if she could read the letter. After she was finished I told her about the qualities that made Dr. W. a good doctor.

"But now he's leaving," I lamented.

"I never got to meet him," Rachel said.

"Actually, he was the very first person you met," I laughed. "He was the doctor who delivered you."

I thought about the photo albums in the waiting room filled with the faces of the babies Dr. W. delivered. They represented just a fraction of the number of lives he helped bring into this world.

I don't begrudge Dr. W. the right to spend more time with his family. He was middle-aged when I started with his practice. When I became middle-aged I should have realized that it wouldn't be long before he would reach retirement age. Or relocation-age.

I'm trying to focus on feeling happy for Dr. W., rather than feeling sorry for myself. Surely he would be the first to insist that I have been the one responsible for maintaining my health all these years and that he had done nothing spectacular.

So, thank you, doctor, for more than a dozen wonderful years, and best of luck in your next adventure.

Trails and trials in the Adirondacks

I think it was somewhere around 4,000 feet up that the thought hit me: This is kind of crazy.

At the time, I was searching for a crevice to lodge my fingertips into before my boot slipped off the narrow ledge where I had placed it but a moment ago. Below me was over 30 feet of slanted, smooth rock, pitching downward onto a rock ledge, dropping off onto a steep trail of (what else) massive rocks. And every surface was slickened by the previous day's rain.

Soaked in sweat, beaten, bleeding and cursing, I heaved myself and my pack up another foot of the trail. "This is what separates the men from the boys," I thought to myself. "This might be the most difficult thing I've ever done."

That's when a white-bearded gentleman I'd peg at about 60 years old strolled by me, whistling a tune as he nodded a greeting to the 20-something husks of humanity that were my girlfriend and I.

All right, so I'm not in terribly good shape. A day in my life involves driving to the Spotlight offices in Delmar, where I sit at a computer for a few hours and make phone calls before grabbing a doughnut and a cup of coffee. Later on, I might drive to a municipal meeting or similar function, where I usually sit for hours before driving home to seat myself at the computer to write my copy. My routine doesn't epitomize a healthy lifestyle.

That's why I surprised even myself when I acknowledged a suggestion to climb Algonquin Peak over a June weekend in the affirmative. Most of the camping I've done in the past decade involves lifting a cooler out of a trunk, and then sitting by a fire until the beer is gone.

We would be making camp in the high peaks region of the Adirondacks. Fires aren't allowed

there, and I don't think I'd even want a beer after carrying a cooler over 20 miles of muddy and rocky trails. A respirator would be more appropriate.

So I spent several weeks and several hundreds of dollars outfitting myself with the necessary gear. Boots, a proper pack, new sleeping bag. I more or less neglected to prepare myself physically but, as I was soon to realize, it would be no substitute for cast iron will and unwavering motivation.

Our hike called for us to strike out from a small campsite/car park a few miles from the Adirondack Loj, in the general vicinity of Lake Placid, bright and early on Saturday morning. After a quick hike to the Loj, we would tackle about seven miles of trails (give or take) to Lake Colden, where we would make camp for the night. That's near the base of the peak, so the next morning would hold another two miles that ascended almost vertically in spots, and then it would be up and over Algonquin Peak and down four steep miles of trail back to the Loj.

Piece of cake. But well-laid plans are there to be destroyed.

Our first spot of trouble was the fact we couldn't find the supposed "unmaintained service trail" that would have put us at the Loj in about a mile's walk. We stopped along the trail for a moment to peer down a thin line in the foliage that appeared to have last been used by a French and Indian War raiding party. No dice.

That meant walking out of our way to connect with a trail one and a half miles down from the Loj, walking to the Loj, and then walking down the very same trail yet again. All together, that made for almost four miles of unnecessary hiking.

Why would we go to such an effort to reach the Loj, you ask? Well, that's where we could pick up a few bear canisters.

For those not in the know, a bear canister is a bulky, unattractive receptacle that you stuff all of your food, toiletries, garbage and anything with a scent into before you go to sleep. It's recommended you even put the clothes you were wearing while cooking in there. You lock the top on and toss it into the woods at least 100 feet away from your campsite.

You see, bears have an uncanny sense of smell. The canister won't mask the smell of your food, but it will prevent the bear from eating it all and hopefully keep it away from your campsite, where it might decide the inside of your tent smells like delicious Cup-O-Noodles and attempt to investigate further.

That preparation didn't stop some sort of rabid muskrat-like creature from stealing into our camp while we were cooking and making off with a bag of trail mix. It dragged the bag into the underbrush, where we could hear it having its way with the partially hydrogenated goodness within, and no doubt causing our camping area to smell like a Doritos factory for larger, more demanding creatures for miles around.

Luckily, we found upon reaching the campground at Lake Colden that there was a ranger outpost nearby, complete with a ranger and a healthy stack of bear canisters waiting for us. Next time out, I think we'll try to get our canisters at a similar location.

That's because walking out of one's way adds up to a significant effort. My pack contained, in no particular order, a two-person tent; change of clothes; map and compass; knife; food; essential toiletries; two bottles of water; disposable camera; flashlight; extra socks; sleeping bag; sterno canister for cooking; ultra light hiking stick; and a flask of whiskey. My girlfriend carried a number of other essentials (water purification gear, cutlery, etc.).

Without super special hiking equipment or a suicidal love for "roughing it," it's tough to get away with less than 30 pounds for an overnight stay. Lugging that stuff over miles of hills and then up a mountain becomes tiring.

All the same, you fall into a pattern, over time. The first steps on the path feel great—you adjust your pack a bit, munch some trail mix, snap a picture of some interesting fauna. Perhaps a spirited round of song is struck up amongst the group.

Somewhere after the fifth mile, your shoulders are aching, your feet are swelling, and your legs feel like they are about to liquefy underneath you. There is no singing, only the steady panting of hikers whose hearts are about to explode.

Then, further down the trail, there is a certain point—some would call it the "hump"—that the physical ceases to matter. You are resigned to the fact that one foot will have to be put in front of the other, that the next bend in the path will present another 100 feet to ascend. And then another. And another. At that point, when you are most weary, miserable and simply un-human, you can really start to enjoy the hike. That's the unwavering spirit-thing I was talking about above.

After all, what are you going to do about the hardships? Turn back? That would be just as bad as going forward, exhaustion-wise. At that point, misery becomes humorous.

Besides, there's so much to look at in the Adirondacks that represents beauty in its purest form. Stepping out of the dense forest onto the shore of Avalanche Lake nearly bowled me over. It was like emerging from a cave of foliage to meet a beautiful mirage. There is only a smattering of human souls standing between you and God's creation in all its glory.

When we hit Algonquin Peak, the view was considerably less picturesque; the skies were overcast that day and our view was cut back to about 50 feet in any direction by the cloud we entered. The winds were howling at 40 miles per hour, the treeline left behind long ago. Picking our way from trail marker to marker, it was like walking on the surface of another planet.

The scenery may have been less than ideal, but the experience was unforgettable. And the next time a trip to the high peaks comes up, my pricey equipment (worth every penny) will be ready for another round.

Get together on storm water management

Editor, The Spotlight:

Detention, not retention, is best for controlling water runoff on new development sites.

Retention ponds, defined as holding the water until they dry out, give the result as seen between WalMart and Lowes: a green slimy mosquito breeding ground that never empties.

A detention pond, by contrast, has an outlet-conduit at the bottom of the pond, the size which is chosen to control the runoff to manageable levels and not

cause significant erosion.

Allowing that topography may not always provide a path for water to drain to a natural waterway, a retention pond may be an acceptable solution, but only as a last resort if the bottom is porous and will absorb the water.

Hopefully, the town of Bethlehem and Albany County can agree on the use of detention ponds for a better way to manage storm water runoff.

County should bill election costs by town

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

Jarrett Carroll's July 23 *Spotlight* article on new voting machines, *Counties brace for new voting machines*, provides insight into the transition into electronic voting. Unfortunately, he has understated the financial implications.

The article indicates there are three options of paying for these election costs. The first option, which is the present method, allocates that election cost be based upon assessed value. Mr. Carroll reports that

method results in some towns paying about 20 percent more than the town's actual election cost.

What the article doesn't tell you, is about \$161,000 of the 2006 election costs were shifted out of some cities/towns into suburban towns. The City of Albany reaped the biggest benefit by being billed \$121,000 less than their actual costs, which represented a 50 percent reduction of their actual cost. Three towns -- Colonie, Bethlehem and Guilderland -- took the brunt of the additional

cost by being billed \$153,000 out of the \$161,000 of shifted costs.

Colonie was billed almost \$102,000 (92 percent) more than actual cost. Bethlehem incurred \$28,000 (a 51 percent increase) and Guilderland \$23,000 (37.5 percent increase) of this additional cost.

While the overall shifted cost is about 27 percent of the total, 95 percent of it hit these three municipalities. The second option is to bill by actual cost incurred by the municipalities.

This is the essence of Resolution 197 that I proposed in

the Albany County Legislature. Presently this resolution is locked up in the Audit and Finance Committee and has not yet come to a vote on the floor.

The third option is to have the county, rather than the municipalities, pay for the election costs. Election costs would be included in the total county cost, which is assessed to taxpayers by assessed value through their county tax rate that appears on tax bills.

This is essentially the same as option one and would perpetuate the over billing to some suburban towns. The only difference is the election costs would be part of the county tax

line on your tax bill rather than shown in your town's tax rate.

A slight twist of the third option would be to have the actual costs, by municipality, be included in the county tax rate by specific municipality.

This solves the over-billing issue, but you lose the visibility of what it costs to run the election at the town level. Part of the reason for billing by towns is to provide the visibility of the amount and motivation to make the election process as cost efficient as possible.

This is in the hands of the town officials in conjunction with the county board of elections.

Billing actual election costs by town is the only fair and equitable method if towns are to manage their own costs and taxpayers are to get a fair shake.

Passage of Resolution 197 in the Albany County Legislature would accomplish these goals.

I encourage taxpayers to make the feelings known to their elected officials regarding this issue.

food pantries had taken in over 55,000 pounds of food at the end of July 2007. They've collected just 37,587 pounds so far this year, and she suspects the disparity isn't a lack of generosity.

"The food thing is definitely down," she said. "People kind of have an idea in their head, 'I will buy \$15 or \$20 of food for the food drive.' If you do that, last year, you got more."

The reason behind the sticker shock

So what exactly is causing almost every type of food to jump in price?

There are many factors, according to a new report from researchers at Purdue University entitled "What's Driving Food Prices?" The finger is pointed in many directions, but fuel costs, food stocks and the status of the U.S. dollar are the big three causes.

"Today, it's like a perfect storm of all these things coming together at the same time," said Wallace Tyner, an agricultural economist and one of the authors of the Purdue report. A big part of the picture, he said, is simple supply and demand economics.

ried three to four months of food stocks," said Tyner. "Today, we carry six to seven weeks of stocks. That means any kind of disruption — all of a sudden a flood hits or a drought hits — and people get nervous."

He pointed to the June flooding in the Midwest that wiped out large corn crops. The event bumped up corn prices more than a dollar over the course of 10 days before they topped out at \$7.96 a bushel.

"The reaction of markets is very different now when stocks are very low compared to when stocks are really high," said Tyner. As long as there's not enough corn out on the market, prices will have to remain high to keep consumption in check.

The price of all agricultural commodities is invariably tied to the poor state of the U.S. dollar as well. A weaker dollar makes U.S. agricultural exports far more attractive to foreign nations. Between 2002 and 2007, the value of the dollar slid 22 percent.

Developing nations are also demanding more and better foods, especially meats, and they are often feeding their livestock with American grain.

Additionally, some nations with food shortages are shutting down food exports altogether. Fourteen countries have limited or banned the exportation of rice; 15 have done the same for wheat; and more than a dozen have cut down on corn exports.

The G8 — a group of eight industrialized nations — has

called for an end or decrease of such restrictions, saying more open trade would lower food prices worldwide.

The golden grain

Corn in particular is a hot commodity now that ethanol has become a big factor in battling high gas prices. Corn is used to make ethanol in the United States, and there has been a massive push to get more of that alternative fuel to the market. Some would say the increased demand for ethanol has led to a backlash, creating high corn prices that cause a ripple effect into other markets.

"Essentially, the mechanism is higher crude leads to higher gasoline, which leads to higher ethanol, which leads to more ethanol production, which increases corn demand, which increases corn price," states the Purdue report.

But a change in the price of a bushel of corn does not change the value of a box of cereal. According to the Economic Research Service, an arm of the USDA, an 18-ounce box of Corn Flakes contains about 12.9 ounces of milled field corn. Even \$7 per bushel corn would mean only 10 cents of corn is in a box of Corn Flakes. The rest of the cost is composed of things like packaging, processing and transportation.

Corn is a big component of other things, though. One of those things is animal feed. Texas recently requested a lower requirement for ethanol in gasoline lately from the Environmental Protection Agency, citing, among other things, the high price of animal feed's effect on cattle farmers. The EPA is considering the waiver.

The lesson is that the higher prices of meat and dairy that are being seen (and will be coming) to the grocery store isn't just the result of increased transportation costs, it's because it costs more to feed the animals that create the product.

That doesn't mean that the government's subsidy for growing corn is boosting the price, however. The \$1 federal subsidy on a bushel of corn is only a small part of the \$4 spike in the price of corn.

"If you took away the subsidy tomorrow, it would still be high," said Tyner.

The Purdue report states that 65 percent of the increased demand for corn is tied to ethanol, with the remaining 35 percent tied to feed use.

Some businesses actually do rely on corn quite a bit, though. It is not an industry secret that most movie theaters make their profits off of concession sales. With inflated corn prices, the cost is going to be passed — once again — on to the consumer.

AMC Theaters, a movie theater chain with over 300 theaters nationwide, has bumped up ticket prices at many locations and increased the price of popcorn by 25 cents across the board to account for the jump in the price of corn.

Corn syrup is also more expensive, and that sugar substitute can be found in many of the processed foods Americans routinely consume. Heinz, the

extremely popular ketchup-maker, uses corn syrup in its ketchup, but has also been in the process of growing a sweeter tomato that would require less corn syrup for years.

"The sweeter tomato has a clear economic advantage," said Michael Mullen, a spokesman for Heinz. "It does reduce the cost for us."

The long-term solution to spiking food commodity prices is not decided upon. Tyner says that the agricultural markets will eventually undergo a self

correction, just like any other economic model. The difference is that most agricultural products are only produced a few times a year.

"It takes a while for the response to occur," said Tyner.

He noted that while oil prices remains high, food prices will never go back to the levels of yesteryear.

"We won't revert back to the old standards as long as crude remains high," he said.

The long-term implications of higher food and fuel prices

worry Schuyler, who is concerned about how the food bank will fare in the winter months.

"I'm a bit afraid of what may happen in November and December when folks have to start paying higher heating bills," she said. "Donators will turn to consumers."

"If the pie gets smaller, and you have more people chewing on it, everyone's piece gets smaller and smaller. It can only get so small before we have problems."

Lunch programs feel sting of high food costs

Parents who pack a brown bag every morning before their kids get on the school bus are probably keeping a wary eye on the prices at the grocery store. Even those students who buy their lunch in the cafeteria will be feeling a pinch in the fall.

Schools across the Capital District — and all over the nation — are getting ready to bump up the cost of breakfasts, lunches and milk. Many students will be paying an extra quarter, like kids in the Ballston Spa Central School District; elementary lunches there will be \$1.75, secondary school prices will raise to \$2.

It's the same story in the Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake School District, where secondary lunches will cost \$2.50, up from \$2.25, and elementary lunches will be an even \$2 after a 25-cent jump. Adults will be paying \$3.75 for their meals, an increase of a quarter. Milk will also be going up 10 cents to 50 cents.

Prices in South Colonie are lower than those in Saratoga County schools, but will still be going up. Secondary lunch will increase 20 cents to \$1.80,

breakfast across the board is up a quarter, and milk will cost 15 cents more at 45 cents.

It's not an isolated phenomenon. Nationwide, 75 percent of public schools will be increasing the price of school lunches.

The culprit is higher prices from food vendors.

delivery costs are increasing, in other words gasoline," said Christy Multer, a spokesperson for BH-BL schools. "So our vendors are passing their increased costs to us, and unfortunately we have to pass them on to the residents."

Ballston Spa contracts with Chartwells, which specializes in providing vendors for educational food programs. Though foods make their way to schools in a variety of ways, the increasing cost of food means strain is put

on everyone, according to Guy Potvin, a regional director for Chartwells.

"Foods are more expensive at the supermarket, and it's more expensive at the wholesale level," said Potvin. "Less consistent commodity deliveries have driven up the cost for schools."

Another contributing factor is the quality of the foods being offered in schools. Dietary requirements have become stricter over time — calling for more fruits, vegetables and whole grains — and that often means more expensive foods.

"The federal food [assistance] isn't keeping up with the changes in the dietary programs," said Ballston Spa Central Schools Assistant Superintendent Brian Sirianni. "These kinds of foods cost more money."

The programs in many school districts are self supporting, meaning that proceeds from sales of meals and milk make providing the food possible and the food program doesn't directly impact the budget.

"If we didn't raise prices, the program wouldn't be self-supported," said Sirianni.

Albany County GOP changing guard

John Graziano will take over as head of the Albany County Republican Party

Albany County GOP Chairman Peter Kermani announced that he would not be running for re-election this November.

The announcement was made at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Albany County Republican Committee on Wednesday, July 23. Kermani has been in office as chairman since 1999, when he replaced Fred Field.

Kermani's successor will be Albany County Elections Commissioner John Graziano, of

Colonie, as voted by the GOP Executive Committee.

"I am confident John's ability and commitment to the basic fundamentals of the Republican Party will move us forward and get the job done now better than ever," Kermani said in a written statement.

"It is simply time for a change. I am proud of the accomplishments we as a party have achieved over the past nine years," said Kermani. "I chose to step away now because I feel that it is in the best interest of the party to provide my replacement with enough time to prepare for the 2008 and 2009 election seasons."

Kermani said he fought for Republican values and even helped former Republican Gov. George E. Pataki win the state's top position.

"Not many party leaders can

say that they played a part in keeping New York State Republican," Kermani said. "We must continue to pursue the basic Republican principles of core family values, lower taxes and smaller government."

Kermani said he pioneered fair districting and a more voter friendly, non-partisan, approach for the Albany County Board of Elections.

"During my nine years as chairman we never let the fact that we were outnumbered by the Democrats stop us from standing up for all the voters," he said.

Guilderland Town Councilmember Mark Grimm called the selection of Graziano as the new Albany County Republican Chair a "positive step forward in the battle to bring Albany County residents a long overdue alternative to one-party rule."

"The Republican resurgence must center on building grass roots organizations in the towns and cities," said Grimm in a written statement. "That means making hard work and a laser focus on what matters to everyday people as the top priorities. John Graziano has the experience and the commitment to help generate enthusiasm for our mission. I look forward to working with him," Grimm added.

Grimm also thanked outgoing chairman Peter Kermani for his years of service to the party.

Bethlehem Republican chair Melody Burns said Graziano's leadership will provide the guidance the Republican party needs, especially with a presidential election coming up this year.

"I think it's going to be very easy for us to achieve our goals," she said. "He's got a great sense

of Republican values."

Kermani took a parting blow at Albany Democrats, saying they are responsible for "rising property taxes, high crime and a bloated government."

"Under Democratic, one-party rule, Albany County and the state of New York have seen an increase in property taxes, families torn apart by financial stress by having to work two and three jobs, and seniors losing their homes because they cannot afford both their prescription drugs and mortgages," Kermani said.

He said former Gov. Eliot Spitzer and former Comptroller Alan Hevisi are examples of corruption in the Democratic Party, and beckoned voters not to hand the Democrats a majority in the State Senate.

Connors is recommending that the Albany County Legislature suspend Soares' petty cash account "until someone capable of administering this account is in place in the Office of District Attorney."

Soares released a statement saying that although he respects the comptroller's work, he disagreed with the audit's findings.

"I have reviewed the audit of the petty cash account done by the county comptroller and agree with some of his findings as they relate to process and accounting issues," Soares said. "Although I respect the comptroller, there are also some conclusions with which I emphatically disagree, particularly those which might lead to the conclusion that funds have been misused or misappropriated in any manner."

The audit included a three-page list of issues including missing receipts; not implementing previous recommendations on petty cash transactions; poor handling of paper work; inappropriate reimbursements and expense write-offs; and the depositing of a \$351,117 victim restitution check in the petty cash account from a

jeweler convicted of bilking customers.

The account is not supposed to exceed \$5,000, according to Connors, and he said that victims in the crime were over-compensated with taxpayer money by Soares' office.

The jeweler, Peter Spinelli, a New Scotland resident and former Colonie jewelry shop owner, was caught selling fake diamonds and swiping his customers' gems with fakes. One of the defendants in the case alleged that Spinelli replaced a 73-year-old family stone with moissanite when it was given to him for resetting.

He was originally arrested in May of 2006 when a customer at Spinelli Jewelers, located at 1315 Central Ave. in Colonie, noticed that the stone in her ring looked different after dropping it off at his store for repair, according to Soares' office.

Spinelli pleaded guilty to two counts of felony third-degree grand larceny and was sentenced in March of 2007 by Albany County Judge Thomas Breslin to the state maximum of three to nine years in prison and was required to pay full restitution to his victims in the amount of \$391,117.56.

Connors said the restitution money eventually made its way into the petty cash account, and

Soares' said he is now conducting his own investigation into the matter.

"It is my responsibility to ensure the public safety of Albany County, but it is also my responsibility to ensure the integrity of the fiscal controls within this office," Soares' said. "I am in the process of convening a panel of financial experts to review the fiscal dealing of the Office of the Albany County District Attorney and will report those findings to the people of Albany County when they become available to me."

Calling himself the county's "fiscal watchdog," Connors has been no stranger to controversy during his years of public service. In 2004, in a move that angered several county Democrats, Con-

nors ran on the Republican ticket against state Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar.

The Albany County Democratic Committee has endorsed opposing candidates in Connors' re-election bids, most recently in the 2007 Democratic primary, when the committee backed Guilderland Councilwoman Patricia Slavick. Connors won that primary and another four-year term without his party's official endorsement.

Also in 2004, Soares had defeated the incumbent Democratic district attorney Paul Clyne in that year's primary, eventually winning in the general election. Clyne is the brother of Bethlehem resident Matt Clyne, who is the Bethlehem Democratic chair-

man and the county's Democratic board of election commissioner.

Soares, who appears to be running unopposed this year, maintains that nothing inappropriate has happened under his watch.

"First and foremost, I take full responsibility for the inner workings of the Office of the Albany County District Attorney and want to assure the citizens of this county that departmental funds are being used appropriately to carry out the mission of the office," Soares said. "I promise the citizens of Albany County that I will take the necessary steps to guarantee that departmental funds will continue to be used responsibly and appropriately by my office."

development would not be an intrusion on the residents of New Scotland.

"Only a portion of the town is looking to rezone," Hershberg said.

He said that sewer and water will come from Bethlehem, and there is no roadway that will intrude on New Scotland.

Bob Prentiss, a former state Assemblyman, Albany County legislator and current local resident, said he supports the development.

"We recognize the need for jobs, and sound economic development. We're not talking about any big-box retail, ... whatever retail is there would service the [tenants of the] buildings," Prentiss said.

Resident Christine Galvin-Rettig said she was troubled by the absence of certain language in the law, specifically dealing with "performance standards," and a definition for "light industry," with regards to the environmental impact and function of the development.

Teresa Bakner, who spoke on behalf of the developers, said the proposal itself has built-in environmental standards, and those will limit the environmental impact of the development.

Galvin-Rettig replied that even though Vista plans to have its own environmental standards, municipal law is needed to govern them and keep them in check.

"There is absolutely no standards whatsoever attached to this law," she said. "[The planning board] has no guidance whatsoever of what is appropriate and what isn't."

She said that she is glad there will be a Planning Board review, but the board does not have the "proper tools" to conduct the review because there is no language in the law to measure the plan against.

"The town needs to apply some unified standards," Galvin-Rettig said.

She said the Planning Board cannot take each individual project and study it from a unique perspective, and that its job is to implement town law.

Dolin said New Scotland is trying to work with Bethlehem, draft a satisfactory version of the law and get the project moving.

"We're trying to be cooperative with our neighbor," Dolin said.

"New Scotland is trying to catch up to Bethlehem as far as developing the mixed economic development zone. Personally, I think [Galvin-Rettig] is probably right."

Dolin said they must look into the issues raised at the meeting regarding zoning and industrial programs.

"We've been kind of slow on our end of it," he said.

Mike Morelli, assistant director of economic development and planning in Bethlehem, said the conceptual master plan had been approved in July 2007 and the Bethlehem Planning Board is now waiting on individual building site proposals from Vista.

He said they have been given a preliminary proposal for a 40,000-square-foot office building, but are mostly concerned with the water and sewer reports at this stage.

He said all the environmental reviews for Bethlehem have been completed.

A proposal to include Bethlehem's definition of "light industry" and Colonie's definition of performance standards was made at the meeting.

Dolin said Bethlehem's light industry definition would most likely be included in the proposed law, which is expected to be voted on at the Aug. 13 meeting of the Town Board, although the final draft of the law would most likely not include performance standards.

Colonie's performance standards include guidelines for noise, odor, vibration and glare.

They also include provisions related to hazardous materials, smoke and ash and material storage, according to the language of the law.

Dolin said the board has not expressed much interest in including Colonie's performance standards into the new zoning law, although a final decision has not yet been made.

"The purpose of the public hearing is to entertain thoughts and suggestions," Dolin said.

He and the board will discuss the suggestions before the next meeting, and come up with a revised draft of the law.

(John) Mainwaring of Guilford, Conn.; a brother, Robert K. Hayes of Center Brunswick; two grandchildren; and several nieces, nephews, great-nieces and great-nephews.

Services were from the Church of St. Thomas the Apostle in Delmar, and arrangements were by the Applebee Funeral Home in Delmar.

Burial was in the Bethlehem Cemetery in Delmar.

probably feel more like August this year, anyway.

For women, dresses of every length are draping bodies of all shapes and sizes. This year, long dresses made a return from the '60s, and are now called the "maxidress." They come in all hues, from bright colors and bold prints (more appropriate for taller women), to soft, toned-down hues, which flatter women of any height. Shorter sundresses in all colors and prints are also gracing frames of every woman, from the starlets of Hollywood to the administrative assistants of the Capital District.

"Dresses are selling like crazy," says Rick Spanello, owner of The Shoppe in Saratoga Springs, of the various printed dresses he carries.

For those bolder dresses, tone the look down with a pair of simple, neutral-colored sandals. If it's a shorter dress, try a flat sandal, and for longer dresses, flats look simple and pretty, but a heel can add that necessary height.

Depending on the color of your dress, it can be worn into the warmer months of fall seamlessly, just add a cardigan or a wrap.

"The jewel tones are coming back — your eggplant colors, chocolate, [etc.]," says Spanello. "My prints for fall in dresses will be in dark colors."

For shorts, any length goes. But ladies, keep it classy. If you're going for less on the bottom (i.e. short-shorts), go for more on top with something like a blousy top. When it gets cooler, a long-sleeved blouse is classic with shorts. Satin shorts can work for dressing up when worn with an equally dressy top and proper shoes (heels, for example).

There are certain materials for shorts that we'll be seeing for the transition into fall.

"We have a lot of linen and cottons here,"

says Sandy Onderdonk, Manager of Clothes Horse in Saratoga Springs. "A lot of the [shorts] and tops are either Tencel, or linen or cotton."

For shoes, gladiator-style sandals prevail — these carried over from spring, as well as wedges, and of course, the flip-flop.

"A lot of metallics [are in for summer], and wedges," says Kimberly Burton, owner of Pink Paddock Boutique in Saratoga Springs.

"Wedges are very big this year. We have bold metallic wedges, and some are fancier with little rhinestones on them," says Burton.

Wedges are surprisingly practical, because you can add a little height with them, while still maintaining comfort. Wear them in cooler weather with wide-leg or boot-cut jeans. Gladiator sandals can be worn into fall with longer skirts, dresses and skinny jeans.

Men are wearing more comfortable clothing for the summer months, abandoning traditional suits and other heavy, constricting items.

"Microfiber trousers [are popular] because guys can use it in their office, and if they leave early on a beautiful afternoon to go golfing, it doesn't wrinkle and it's cooler than cotton," says Robert Amore, owner of Amore Clothing in Albany. Pastels and bright hues are popular for ties and various tops.

"Pastels — bubblegum blue, banana yellow and some pinks," says Amore. "Guys are getting a little more adventurous in their colors."

For summer, and those warmer months of fall, it's about comfort.

"It's comfortable clothing that they're going to get diverse uses out of. They can use it in the office and [while they're out and about]," says Amore.


Plaids in bright colors against white backgrounds on dress shirts are fresh, but masculine, as well as silk ties inspired by the madras style in hues of pink, green, orange and purple.

Polo shirts and rugby shirts in blues and yellows and stripes continue to dominate the menswear scene, as well as silk-screened T-shirts with designs ranging from muted grays to vibrant neon letters and shapes. For cooler weather, layer and you'll be comfortable for fall, too.

In fact, for all pieces transitioning from summer to fall, all you really need to do is layer, layer, layer. When it's too cold for your sundress, throw on a cardigan. If it's a little too brisk for a polo shirt and jeans, throw on a blazer. You're good to go for at least another month.





Bethlehem Police said Morrison was driving south on Route 9W when officers saw him driving 53 in a 40 MPH zone, and, before being stopped, he was also observed driving on the road's shoulder and failing to keep right by making "abrupt turns from one side of the lane to the other."

Morrison displayed signs of intoxication when interviewed by police, according to the arrest report, and when asked if he had been drinking, he told officers he "had a couple" and said that he knows how it works because "I

was arrested for DWI before, do what you have to do."

He failed a field-sobriety test, during which he stated "I've been through this, I can't do it," the report states, and he tested positive for alcohol and was transported to the Bethlehem Police Station without incident.

Police said that when taking inventory of Morrison's vehicle they discovered two plastic Baggies of marijuana, with one weighing 6.78 grams and the other 1.52 grams, and a marijuana pipe containing residue.

Morrison had a BAC level more than double the legal limit, and he posted a \$250 bail, the report states.

His vehicle was towed and he is scheduled to return to Bethlehem Town Court on Aug. 5.





Adirondack teams strike gold at Empire Games

The Adirondack region had one of its best medal hauls at last weekend's Empire State Games in Binghamton.

Adirondack was third in the medal count with 165 and was tied for second with Long Island for the most gold medals (66). Western was the top region with 222 medals including 79 gold medals, while Long Island was

second with 200 medals.

Several Adirondack teams claimed medals including gold medals for the open women's basketball team, the open women's softball team, the masters women's volleyball team and the masters men's rugby team. The scholastic men's baseball team, the scholastic women's hockey team, the scholastic women's

soccer team and the masters women's rugby team earned silver medals, while bronze medals went to Adirondack's open women's soccer and scholastic men's volleyball squads.

The open women's basketball team earned its first gold medal in seven years by beating Western 70-57 in Sunday's championship game. The Siena College duo of Melissa Manzer and Shondaya Burrell - a Colonie Central High School graduate - led the way for Adirondack. Manzer finished with a game high 27 points, while Burrell contributed 14 points.

The masters men's rugby team defeated Central 19-12 in Saturday's gold medal game to win its second consecutive title. Adirondack defeated Central by the same score in its first meeting Friday on its way to a 6-0 record.

The masters women's rugby team was hoping to also return home with a gold medal, but Western edged Adirondack 15-10 in the final game. Adirondack defeated Western 10-7 in an earlier match.

At least the masters women's rugby team played its gold medal game. The scholastic men's baseball medal games were rained out. Hudson Valley was awarded the gold medal by virtue of its higher seed after round robin play, while Adirondack received the silver medal.

Adirondack's open women's softball team had better luck with the weather and the competition. Adirondack breezed through round robin play with a 4-1 record and then knocked off Western 7-4 in Saturday's gold medal game. Shenendehowa High School

graduate Michelle Connors drove in two runs with a pair of hits to lead Adirondack's offense, while fellow Shen grads Amanda Ferro and Jennifer Granato each scored a run.

The masters women's volleyball team swept Western 25-18, 25-18 to win its gold medal match. The team included three Clifton Park residents - Shannon Combs, Sally Gillich and Christine McCarroll - as well as Gretchen Belanger and Courtney Deming of Ballston Spa, Paula Isaksen of Glenville, Kristina Kemmer of Voorheesville and Ann Mantha of Selkirk.

 • Western built a 3-0 lead and held on for a 3-2 victory over Adirondack in the scholastic women's soccer gold medal game. Niskayuna High School's Whitney Frary had a goal and an assist, and Ballston Spa High School goaltender Renae Cairns stopped five shots.

• Adirondack's open women's team downed Hudson Valley 3-1 for the bronze medal Sunday. Shen graduate Ashley Moore scored all of Adirondack's goals, and Niskayuna High School graduate Marie Mutryn had seven saves in goal.

• Long Island defeated Adirondack 2-0 in the scholastic women's hockey final, but not without a strong effort from Adirondack goaltender Jennifer Conophy. The Glenmont native stopped 36 of the 38 shots she faced to keep her team in the game.

that we had last season," said Giants head coach Tom Coughlin at last Wednesday's pre-camp press conference.

"You kind of treat training camp as a new start, a new beginning," added quarterback Eli Manning. "You erase everything from the years before ... that has always been my approach in years past. I tell myself that the last year doesn't matter and that I'm going to learn from my experience, to try to become a better quarterback. This year is the same way. I'm going to learn from my experiences from last year, but you've still got something to prove."

The Giants have something to prove in general. There are holes to fill after the departure of several players including tight end Jeremy Shockey (traded to New Orleans) and defensive lineman Michael Strahan (retirement), and several preseason NFL magazines don't have Big Blue winning the NFC East.

"Perception is not necessarily reality, and I think you have to give us a chance to have our training camp and see where we go," said Coughlin. "I think we do have a number of players that have played ... if you just take our young players alone and the experience factor that they had, I think that the level of play and the way in which they have upgraded their individual talents and the way we can utilize them is going to put us in a good position right off the bat."

The defense played a key role in the Giants' playoff push, as it shut down the high-octane offenses of Dallas, Green Bay and New England. And defensive coordinator Steve Spagnuolo said the key to maintaining the Giants' high level of play on his side of the field is tinkering without radically changing anything.

"I think you have to stay ahead of the curve a little bit because there are too many smart offensive coordinators in this league, but you don't ever abandon what you've done in the past," Spagnuolo said.

The offense will have to recapture the magic it had in last year's playoffs, too. Manning has to continue to show improvement at quarterback, the running backs have to stay healthy, and tight end Kevin Boss must show he's as good at catching the ball as Shockey was.

Those issues and others will be resolved in the next three weeks of training camp. In the meantime, the Giants fans are glad to see their Super Bowl champions back on the field.

"I think it's just exciting - that's all I can tell you," said Mark DeRusso of Albany.

Giants open 13th training camp at UAlbany

The sun came out Friday, and more than 2,900 fans flocked to University Field at the University at Albany to see the defending Super Bowl champion New York Giants begin training camp.

"Day one is usually the one we try to make, but this year is a little more special," said Halfmoon resident Keith Reed. "It's got a spring training kind of feel to it."

"I come up here every year," said Jim Allegrino, who made the trip to Albany from Wilmington, N.C. "I used to live in Binghamton, but I moved to North Carolina five years ago. I still make it up here."

Many fans sat in the bleachers on the steps of University Gym, but others such as Colonie twin brothers Justin and Jared Berdar staked out a spot at the entrance to the field so they could get autographs from the players as they passed by to the locker room.

"I meet players all over the place," said the 16-year-old Justin, who added he's been to nearly every camp since the Giants

started training at UAlbany in 1995. "The parking lot, the campus, the gas station - I met (running back Brandon) Jacobs there. He was cool with it. He took pictures with us, signed autographs and talked with us for a little bit."

"I'm hoping these guys aren't going to be too tired coming off the field to sign autographs,"

added Tommy Calabrese, who made the trip from Speonk on Long Island to attend his first Giants training camp.

The Giants were just as anxious as the fans to get on the field and start the process of defending their Super Bowl title.

"We are very excited about the start of camp - about continuing the momentum, if you will, from

the playoff run; about integrating a lot of our rookie players and some of the veterans that we have brought into the program this offseason; about trying to work to see how exactly those individuals will fit into our program; and about continuing to emphasize team above self, which was such a critical, critical part of the success
