



The race for the 108th continues

Judge rules in favor of McLaughlin over Gordon's petition objections

Republican candidate Steven McLaughlin said he's staying on the ballot and offered some sharp criticism to Assemblyman Tim Gordon, I-Bethlehem, after a state judge validated his petitions in the 108th Assembly District race.


McLaughlin, R, C-Melrose, is challenging Gordon for his seat and said the first-term assemblyman is playing dirty politics in order to keep him off the ballot. McLaughlin said he believes he is the best candidate for the job in the Democrat-controlled state Assembly because he won't be "a puppet" for the Assembly speaker.

McLaughlin, a registered Conservative, said his petitions were objected to by one of Gordon's "hometown operatives," Veronica Wolfe of Bethlehem, who said that a quorum of county Republican chairmen was not present when he was granted a Wilson-Pakula certificate to run on the Republican ballot line.

A Wilson-Pakula certificate is required for the designation or

Verstandig's plans to grow nursery operations at expanded facility in Selkirk



Bronx man arrested in Job Corps burglary

Christopher T. McKein, 19, of the Bronx, was arrested Sunday, Aug. 3, for allegedly taking a Sony PlayStation 2 and some games from a room at the Glenmont Job Corps on Tuesday, July 8.

McKein was charged with felony second-degree burglary and petty larceny, a misdemeanor.

Bethlehem police say they responded to a reported burglary on River Road in Glenmont, and upon investigation, determined that McKein unlawfully entered a room and stole the PlayStation along with two PlayStation video games and a controller.

McKein signed a consent form to search his dorm room, according to the arrest report, and the items were recovered from his room. Police said a surveillance video was obtained for evidence that showed McKein entering the room and leaving with the stolen property.

Depositions were taken and McKein was placed in custody and transported to the Bethlehem Police Department, the report states. He was arraigned in Town Court by Justice Paul Dwyer and sent to Albany County Correctional Facility in lieu of a \$500 cash bail or \$1,500

bond and is scheduled to return to court Tuesday, Sept. 2.

Other arrests

• Frank J. Dipietro, 59, of Albany, was arrested by police on Thursday, July 31, for felony DWI; felony operating a motor vehicle with a blood-alcohol content of .08 percent or greater; and failure to notify an address change.

Bethlehem police said a patrol on Delaware Avenue ran a vehicle registration while Dipietro was driving east through a construction zone and the registration came back with an "inconsistent" response from the DMV for the license plate assigned to Dipietro.

Police stopped him immediately after the construction zone, and, while interviewing Dipietro, police

reported that they smelled alcohol and saw him display signs of intoxication. When asked if he had been drinking, he told officers that he had "one drink" at a restaurant in Delmar.

Dipietro's vehicle was purchased three days earlier on Monday, July 28, according to the arrest report.

Dipietro told police that he lived in Albany, "but kept looking at a Visa card in his wallet when asked specifically where," the report states. Police said they saw a brown paper bag in the front seat of the vehicle that appeared to be two bottles of wine.

After failing a field-sobriety test and testing positive for alcohol on a pre-screening device, Dipietro was taken in to custody without incident, the report states. Police said he

consented to a chemical test and was released. He is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, Aug. 19.

• Elizabeth Leonardo, 47, of Albany, was arrested by Bethlehem police on Tuesday, Aug. 5, after she turned herself in on a number of outstanding felony charges.

Leonardo was charged with three counts of felony second-degree forgery; two counts of felony first-degree identity theft; two counts of petty larceny — all from two separate incidents on June 7 and 8 — as well as fifth-degree criminal possession of stolen property, a misdemeanor.

Police say Leonardo turned herself in to police custody in the presence of her attorney at the Bethlehem Police Department on signed felony complaints against her.

She was processed, charged and arraigned in front of Bethlehem Town Justice Paul Dwyer, according to the arrest report.

Leonardo was released from police custody on the continuation of a previous bail of \$20,000 and scheduled to return to court on Oct. 7, the report states.

Her case has been waived up to a grand jury.







Hudson Avenue projects move forward

Planning board hears mixed-use and three-lot subdivision proposals

Two Hudson Avenue residential projects received unanimous conditional and draft approvals from the board at the Tuesday, Aug. 5, Planning Board meeting.

The Hudson Glen Subdivision and a Hudson Avenue development proposal both made their way back to the Planning Board in order to move forward with plans to build residential housing.

Anthony Dethomasis laid out his plans to develop 48

Hudson Ave. into a two-building complex with apartments and some commercial space. There is currently a single-family home on the lot.

Planning Board member John Smolinsky asked about the parking situation.

A five-bay garage is being planned for the site and well as 14 additional parking spaces, making a total of 19 parking spaces on the property, according to Dethomasis.

Bethlehem's senior planner Robert Leslie responded that, "He does have 19 spaces and he's required to have 14."

Part of the site plan also calls for 1,300 square feet of commercial space to be added to one of the buildings. Dethomasis pointed out that many of the residents who live there will be gone at work during the day, leaving plenty of parking for the business tenant during the day.

"I think that's one of the advantages of having mixed-use projects," Dethomasis said, adding that there is no parking along Hudson Avenue at his location.

Dethomasis also changed

some of the vinyl siding in plans to brick and added landscaping to the site plan in order to prevent headlights of vehicles in the parking lot from shining into nearby residences.

The Planning Board said that the landscaping included with the site would have to be maintained by the Dethomasis or his tenants and unanimously approved a draft site plan approval.

Up the road, the Hudson Glen Subdivision had its conditional final approval granted by the planning board.

That project calls for a three-lot subdivision on Hudson Avenue and Albright Place.

The three-lot proposal, originally part of a bigger plan to flood the area and install houses, named "The Lakes of Delmar," will be situated on plateaus around the rest of the 25 acres of property.

The rest of the property is largely made up of steep slopes and ravines that would be difficult to develop, according to developer Edward Kleink of Delmar.

Town sees holes in doughnut shop plan

Planning board worries that drive-through could further congest busy intersection

Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa said he encourages new business in Bethlehem, but with potential congestion of an already busy intersection, initial plans for a drive-through business might have to take a back seat to safety.

"We hate to thwart the guy trying to make a living," said Mathusa. "We just want to alleviate the safety issue."

Frank Hessari, the owner of Glenmont Mobil, located at the intersection of Route 9W and Feura Bush Road, went before the board with an initial presentation for the addition of a drive-through Dunkin' Donuts at the Tuesday, Aug. 5, meeting. In the proposal, the drive-through would be located on the front left corner of the gas station, leaving room for parking and vehicles at the gas pump.

Among the concerns the Planning Board had with the site plan was the problem of stacking, or build-up of cars waiting at the drive-through for service, and the safety of surrounding pedestrians and other drivers on an already busy and complicated intersection.

Hessari and Chris Boyea, the lead consulting engineer on the project, said they believe the project will be good for business.

Boyea and Hessari said they have looked at similar nearby drive-throughs to see the peak hours for stacking and overall business.

"I think it will be a good mix. I think we can still make a viable business out of it," said Boyea.

Planning Board member

John Smolinsky said that circulation on site would be a problem, conflicting with pedestrians at the pump or those going inside the store.

Planning Board member Kate Powers said that, "The concept as a whole is a good idea," although she said she has questions with parking on-site and circulation of the different parts of the business with the gas pumps and the drive-through.

"I worry about safety with traffic around the gas station itself," said Mathusa. "At 7:30 in the morning, people get a little impatient."

Robert Leslie, senior planner for the town's Planning Department, said that Boyea and Hessari are "complying with all requests" of the Planning Board and that they will meet all the tasks that have been put in front of them.

The board has asked that they look at the data of other Dunkin' Donuts sites to analyze stacking and send a second option for the site to address the concerns of the planning board and planning department. Leslie said he hopes they are able to get the revised plan back to the Planning Board before the end of August.

To cut down on traffic at the busy intersection, the Planning Board has had preliminary discussions about introducing a roundabout to the area, an idea that was mentioned to Hessari and Boyea.

The Route 9W corridor study has made suggestions of several roundabouts along 9W.

"I would like to place a roundabout there to alleviate traffic," said Mathusa. "They spent a lot of time and effort to refurbish the station, I want the owner to be aware people may not come back again because of traffic."


This week in weather



Cherry Hill gets support for 400-year celebration

Historic Cherry Hill has been awarded \$11,700 from the New York Council for the Humanities (NYCH), a state affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities, for "Where the Past Beats the Present: The Cherry Hill Family's View of Their Hudson River Heritage."

The series will consist of four programs co-sponsored with the Town of Bethlehem during the 2009 Hudson 400-year Celebration.

Programs will explore the issue of history versus nostalgia by focusing on the family's 18th century documented Colonial history and later generations' attempts to romanticize and re-create that past. Programs will explore what drives nostalgia for the past, how nostalgia may omit or distort history and why it was so compelling for the Cherry Hill family.

The four programs will be free to the public.

Each will include new research findings on Cherry Hill's first owner, Philip Van Rensselaer, who built his Georgian-style home, Cherry Hill, on a 900-acre farm in what was then the Town of Bethlehem. Van Rensselaer, a descendent of the first Dutch Patroon, was a Hudson River trader and farmer who served as the town's first supervisor. Philip's 18th century life at Cherry

Hill will be contrasted with the later family's nostalgic views of their Colonial past including their participation in an earlier Hudson River commemoration, the 1909 Hudson-Fulton Celebration.

"We are grateful for this generous support from the New York Council for the Humanities," said Education Director Rebecca Watrous. "[The grant] will allow us to complete much-needed research on the 18th-century occupants of Cherry Hill and continue working with noted historian Tamara Plakins Thornton to develop engaging programs for the public."

Thornton, professor of history at the State University at Buffalo, will kick off the series in April with a lecture at the Bethlehem Public Library.

This will be followed by a summer family event on the grounds of Historic Cherry Hill and a special house tour. The series will conclude in the fall with focus tours of the site's grounds and south end, exploring landscape changes as the house evolved from a farm to urban home.

Watrous will serve as project director, coordinating the work of team members including, Thornton, Historic Cherry Hill's manuscript specialist Mary Doehla and curator Deborah Emmons-Andarawis.

Lighten up, Albany County

Albany County is regulating baked goods.

Starting next year, all fried foods served in restaurants and other food service establishments in Albany County must be cooked in oils that are free of trans-fats. Six months later, the ban will extend to desserts and all baked goods.

The details of the phase-out program came a year after the County Legislature unanimously passed a resolution banning trans-fat and called on the county health commissioner and Board of Health to devise a plan. (See related story, page 8)

This will not affect the flavor of the food, supporters say, but for some reason, we at *Spotlight Newspapers* are left with a bad taste in our mouths.

Proponents of the ban point to studies that have linked trans-fats to an increased risk for heart disease and obesity, and there are also suspected links to dementia.

You know what else is linked to these things? The sedentary lifestyle that most Americans seem to enjoy living.

You can ban all the trans-fats you like, but until you start regulating peoples' actions and activity, it won't mean a damn thing.

And that's what this is all about: No politician in his right mind would ever come out and tell the American public that they have to behave a certain way — that's downright un-American! But what they will do is eliminate choices so that the American public winds up doing it anyway.

It's lazy parenting at its finest. It's hard for a parent to explain to a child that they can't have a toy every time they go to the supermarket; it's easier to avoid the toy aisle altogether.

And this is what has happened to the "children" of Albany County: The county identified something that is potentially harmful; the county decided that we, as individuals couldn't decide for ourselves whether we wanted to be healthy or not; so the county removed the option for us.

Thank you, Albany County, we all feel a little lighter already — as though something (even something as insignificant as our ability to decide for ourselves what we put into our bodies) has been taken away from us.

So the next time you're walking to your local trans-fat-free eatery and a friend spots you in your new skinny jeans and compliments you on your new, thinner physique, tell them your secret: "My government tells me what to eat."

Say what you mean, mean what you say

As voters are inundated with political messages, campaign speeches, pleas for petition signatures and promises that will most likely be heard the very next election cycle, it may be hard to discern what is actually being said.

I encourage readers to put it to a simple test.

Ask any; and I mean any, politician from a county legislator up to the president, who was around to vote on or support the decision to invade Iraq, a very simple question: Did you say "yes" or "no" to authorize the use of force against Iraq?

I guarantee you will not get a yes or no answer.

What will happen is nothing short of a feat that would give David Copperfield a run for his money. That man or women

will preface their answer with statistics and intelligence reports given to them at that time and this and that or throw in a 9/11 reference or two, and then before you know it, you don't even know what you asked in the first place.

The pompous posturing has to stop, and politicians need to just tell the public where they stand on an issue, not what they think the public wants to hear.

You can test this theory with an endless number of issues, but the Iraq question just seems the easiest because of the sheer number of politicians who voted for the war "under false pretenses."

Apparently, "I support this ... but didn't agree with that part of it," is politician doublespeak for, "I will tell you whatever you want to hear and will not give you a concrete answer to pin me down on."

Even better is the "I believe in the spirit of this or that" spiel, which really means, "I don't have guts to outright support this because it may be unpopular in certain circles that support me, but if you do support this then I guess I kind of do, too."

Either way, what they are saying is "vote for me, vote for me, because I coincidentally believe and agree with everything that you do, and what's even more coincidental, is that I also believe and agree with everything that your neighbor does even though the two of you agree on nothing."

Pretty amazing isn't it, and if what I just wrote confuses you, that's exactly the point I'm trying to make.

Is it that hard for politicians to come right out and say what they really mean without pandering to the populous like adolescent school children? Or is it that the populous has become so jaded and fed up that they simply don't care anymore and won't even listen for substance or stance like adolescent school children?

Recently it seems this has never been truer than in New York state.

In fact we have even come to expect it. With all of this talk about New Yorkers "voting with their feet," whatever happened to plain old voting?

Instead, people are just leaving the state in droves, dissatisfied with their elected officials' rhetoric about changing a broken system that's becoming more financially broke by the day. Running

away from the problem won't help because the same people will vote for the same kind of leadership no matter where they move to.

The problem with lazy and uncaring voters is that it breeds lazy and uncaring politicians. With New York's incumbency rate hovering around 98 percent by most estimates, it's really no wonder why we have been consistently labeled as one of the most dysfunctional governments in the nation.

And then you might ask yourself, "Well how did they get their seat in first place?" That 2 percent miracle happens in New York when an incumbent retires, resigns, dies or is embroiled in a sex scandal and someone is appointed (and thence re-elected as an incumbent forevermore), or they win that area's prominent political party primary in a 10-way race.

Although there is plenty of talk that incumbents may be facing a tougher election year this time around with many prominent politicians facing rare primary challengers (in some cases multiple challengers), I don't think they are sweating it too much.

And why should they?

Maybe this year voters will be so riled up over a historical season in New York politics that could easily be mistaken for an episode of "Desperate Housewives," that we could drop the incumbency rates down to 96 percent, maybe even all the way down to 95 percent.

That would be something, huh?

I will continue holding our elected officials and legislative hopefuls accountable and putting them on the record and attempt to figure out what they are really saying.

But I ask you, the reader, the voter, the single parent, the ambitious college student, the teacher, the soldier, the concerned citizen, the taxpayer, and the "I'm way more qualified for this office than the person I just voted for" individual to step up and elect accountable and worthy candidates into office.

Send someone of substance not rhetoric and long-winded rehearsed answers to town hall or Albany or Washington. Don't let your elected officials hide behind press releases and spin-doctors. Go out and vote this year by truly listening to what is being said and hire the best possible person for the job — not just a familiar name.

Vote for people who say what they mean and mean what they say.

Now that really would be something.

Albany County trims the trans-fat

Law prohibits ingredient's use at local eateries

Legislators in Albany County think they have come up with a way to improve residents' health by outlawing the use of a simple ingredient at more than 1,600 food-service establishments.

The ingredient, trans-fat, has long been criticized for containing increased levels of LDL, known as "bad" cholesterol, and lowering HDL, known as "good" cholesterol. Now, Albany County is mandating that all restaurants in the county switch over from using trans-fats in their recipes to various other forms of oils.

According to Kerri Battle, spokeswoman for Albany County Executive Mike Breslin, the resolution to ban trans-fats in the county was introduced by Majority Leader Frank Commisso, D-Albany, and passed unanimously on Friday, Aug. 8, although the Legislature had been discussing it for some time.

"It was introduced and voted on in May of 2007, but it had to go to the Board of Health," she said.

On the passing of the resolution, Commisso said he was pleased with what the county

had done. "With this amendment to the county's Sanitary Code, we're simply saying that we know artificial trans-fat clogs arteries and contributes to heart disease and strokes, so let's do what we can to serve healthy meals to our residents," he said.

In regulating the measure, Battle said restaurants will phase out trans-fat in two parts. The first will involve taking trans-fat out of oils, shortening and margarine that are used in cooking, which will begin Jan. 1. The second involves eliminating trans-fat from baked goods, which will begin July 1.

Battle said this will affect chain restaurants in the county, as well as non-chains.

According to Gail Sokol, author of "About Professional Baking" and an adjunct professor and culinary instructor at Schenectady Community College, the transition should not be too tough for chefs as many have already switched over from using trans-fat already.

"New York City has started it, and as far as the state, I think Albany is trying to follow suit," she said. "A lot of chefs have already made the switchover."

Sokol said she is glad to see the change occur because, "trans-fats are the worst type of fats you can eat."

Sokol said that trans-fat is basically a manmade fat that combines oils and hydrogen so

that they are partially stabilized. As a result, Sokol said, the product is solidified and has a longer shelf-life than alternative options.

While trans-fats do exist naturally in some products, including some dairy and meats, Sokol said, its use has been linked to obesity and some types of cancers. In addition, consumers can tell if they have eaten trans-fats because it leaves a film on the tongue, she said.

As far as what restaurant chefs should be using instead of trans-fats, Sokol said her favorite choice is canola oil. Since it is a liquid, she said, it is healthier for you in that it lowers bad cholesterol.

In the home, Sokol said, household chefs can make a healthier change as well by switching to light butters and tub margarine that is advertised as containing fewer trans-fats. But Sokol warned that it is important to read the ingredients on the labels.

"A manufacturer can legally say there is zero trans-fat in the oil, but on the ingredients it can contain [small percentages]," she said. After eating several products with labels like this, Sokol said the trans-fats begin to add up, and soon you are eating just as many as in products that advertise the amount of trans fat.

Sokol said she is pleased that the county has taken the steps necessary to take care of people who are unaware of the dangers of trans fat.

"I think we really owe it to our customers to keep them healthy," she said.

Former rival to run against Soares

Cusick takes on district attorney on third-party line

Albany County voters will be seeing a rematch between District Attorney David Soares and former Republican challenger Roger Cusick in the November

election.

This time, however, Cusick will be running on a newly formed third-party line called the Integrity Party line, as long as he gets the needed 1,500 signatures by Tuesday, Aug. 19, according to the Albany County Board of Elections.

Cusick, 58, an attorney and political science professor who ran against Soares in 2004, is saying that Soares has not made good on his vow to fight public corruption.

On Nov. 2, 2004, Soares was elected to the post after he defeated incumbent District Attorney Paul Clyne in a Democratic primary and then faced both Cusick and Clyne (on the Independence ticket) in the general election.

Soares handily defeated both of them in the election and went on to become the county's first black district attorney, getting 60.5 percent of vote against Clyne in the primary and then 54.6 percent of the vote in the

general election.

Cusick garnered 41.3 percent in 2004, and Clyne ended his general election bid with 4.1 percent; according to records from the Albany County Board of Elections.

Clyne's brother, Matt Clyne, is the Democratic Albany County Board of Election commissioner and Bethlehem Democratic chairman. The other commissioner for the county is Republican John Graziano, who was recently named the county's GOP chair shortly before Cusick announced his intention to run against Soares.

The announcement to run against Soares comes on the heels of a scathing audit conducted by Democratic Albany

County Comptroller Michael Connors, who said that Soares' office was misusing its petty cash account.

Connors recommended that the Albany County Legislature suspend the office's petty cash account "until someone capable of administering this account is in place in the Office of District Attorney."

Soares denied that he or his office mishandled any funds, but he put together a financial task force to examine the spending practices of the office. The findings of the task force have not yet been released.

Before Cusick's possible challenge, Soares was running uncontested for re-election in November.

Verstandig plans to build a 3,968-square-foot building in Selkirk to house his offices and retail and wholesale plant materials. At a previous planning board meeting, Verstandig was asked about parking, blacktop, landscaping plans and signage.

The plans now call for the entrances and exits of the Creble Road site to be black topped, but that the main driveway will not get any asphalt until a later date.

"At some point we'll probably do more on the blacktop issue," Verstandig said. "The handicapped parking has also been moved closer to the building's entrance."

As for the landscaping, Verstandig said, "We've been in business for over 40 years so we're all about landscaping."

One of the things Verstandig said he wanted was to keep some of the trees smaller in the landscape plans in order to allow for sunlight onto the property for the greenhouses and possible solar panels.

The business will have a 4-by-6-foot sign that will be externally illuminated, according to the plans.

Planning Board member

Nicholas A. Behuniak said the town is always looking to make sure that signage is "commercially tasteful," and thanked Verstandig for keeping his sign below the town's code requirement.

"I certainly appreciate that ... you accommodated that," Behuniak said.

At a previous planning board meeting, Verstandig said that as he gears toward a more wholesale operation in Selkirk, the

biggest change will be discontinuing the gift shop.

"Right now our whole [Selkirk] operation is 100 percent wholesale, so what we're essentially doing is starting a new business," Verstandig said of the proposed new building. "It will probably be more in line with a farmers market kind of deal ... like the Carrot Barn up in Schoharie."

Verstandig said, "The gift shop is a thing of the past."

Assistant Director of Eco-

nomics Development and Planning Michael Morelli said that Verstandig's proposed building has adequate parking and does not need a variance.

"They have around 48 acres over there between Jericho, Elm Avenue and Creble Road ... and the building is being proposed along the Creble side," Morelli said. "It's zoned rural light industrial, which is a permitted use compliant with the zoning."

Morelli said that Verstandig basically needs a building permit and he can start.

However, Verstandig said everything is contingent on the approval of the Keystone Builders project in Delmar and then ultimately the sale of Verstandig's Delaware Avenue property to Stephen Bolduc, Keystone's owner.

"This kind of dovetails together," Verstandig said of his Selkirk project and Bolduc's Delmar condominium project. "One is contingent on the other."

Bolduc is also designing Verstandig's new building.

The board unanimously approved Verstandig's site plan and Planning Board Chairman Parker Mathusa said that the next step for Verstandig is to continue working with the town on finalized details and to get final site plan approval.

nomination of a candidate who is not enrolled as a party member.

State Supreme Court Judge Eugene Devine ruled that McLaughlin's Wilson-Pakula certificate was correctly authorized by the county chairmen. Devine said that the county chairmen represented over 60 percent of the weighted vote in the assembly district, which provided a proper quorum for the Wilson-Pakula certificate.

"I was caught out of the blue on this," McLaughlin said. "There was no notice. I was contacted and said 'What the heck is this?'"

Gordon did not return calls to Spotlight Newspapers before publication.

"They didn't challenge a single signature, not one of the more than the 1,500 signatures I got to be on the ballot," McLaughlin said. "It was a gutless move, and I'm not very happy about it. ... And although justice was served, trying to knock me off the ballot over some drummed up technicality ... was just a waste of everyone's time."

Running for his first political office, McLaughlin said the state's Assembly is being unfairly controlled by Downstate Democrats and that he is challenging Gordon, the Independence Party chairman in Bethlehem, for stepping in line with Assembly Majority Leader Sheldon Silver, D-Manhattan, and other Downstate Democrats.

McLaughlin, who is a businessman, said that he has heard many concerns going door-to-door in the 108th District, which includes parts of Albany, Rensselaer, Columbia and Greene counties.

He said residents are angry and disgusted with New York government and that the el-

derly in particular are fearful of the current economic environment and high rate of taxes in the state.

"I was told by someone over the age of 50 at one home, 'Good luck, I hope you win and fight the good fight, but I'm leaving the state because I can't afford the taxes,'" McLaughlin said. "There's nothing good about people leaving the state."

McLaughlin said Gordon is "fearful" of his challenge.

"Tim Gordon ought to be ashamed of himself for allowing his campaign cronies to engage in such heavy-handed Boss Tweed-style tactics to deny voters their basic constitutional rights," he said.

"It's clear that Gordon is running scared from his inability and unwillingness to take de-

One of those problems was her noisy neighbors, who she claimed caused her walls to crack during a physical altercation.

Despite the damage to the property, she is optimistic that her security deposit will be returned at the end of her stay; her landlord did not seem too worried about the damage.

Kabat said she reported the damage when it occurred.

"You'd think they'd be a little more concerned," Kabat said. "They were damaging the property."

Overall, Kabat is content with her decision to live off campus.

Under New York state law, a landlord is required to return a security deposit to a tenant within a "reasonable timeframe."

Despite this requirement, several landlords keep tenants' security deposits for reasons unknown.

At Mediation Matters, a non-profit organization providing conflict resolution, counselors often meet with landlords and tenants to work out an equitable solution to a conflict occurring from property rental.

Luqunt Graves, a program coordinator for Mediation Matters, said she has helped resolve several conflicts between landlords and tenants, including non-payment of rent, evictions and the returning of security deposits.

She said typically one party initiates the mediation and a letter is sent to the other party requesting their cooperation with a deadline for response.

Graves said if the other party does not respond, the initiating party is provided a letter showing their attempt at mediation, which she said could benefit their case if they decide to take the conflict to court.

One case that stands out in Graves' mind is of a couple looking to purchase the property they were renting. There were several repairs that needed to be made before the apartment would be livable.

The couple came to Mediation Matters looking for help.

Graves said she set up several

meetings with the landlord and tenants, and as the situation was beginning to work out and the couple had completed several of the repairs for a deduction in the rent, the landlord decided he wanted to live in the place himself and the tenants were told to leave.

The couple later qualified for a mortgage and were able to purchase their own home, but Graves said it was disappointing at first to see the outcome because the parties seemed to come such a long way in the four mediation sessions.

Typically, Graves said the conflict is resolved within one session.

"Normally those get resolved," Graves said. "We encourage both parties to come to a middle point."

She said the landlord usually provides a dollar amount for the damages and a tenant provides a timeframe for paying the landlord. She said once the agreement is made, it is signed by both parties.

"They know if they can't resolve it in here, they're going to end up in court," Graves said.

She said the cost of going to court is extensive, considering legal fees and the time off work required.

Several colleges offer alternatives to off-campus housing, including apartment-style living options.

Empire Commons provides University at Albany students with the option to live on campus in an apartment. The Commons provide housing to more than 12,000 students annually.

The apartments, built in 2002, are available to juniors, seniors and graduate students, who want the convenience of living on campus but without the hassle of living in a dorm. Students living in these types of housing are not required to purchase a meal plan.

Dorms on the Albany campus run from \$6,000 to \$8,000 for an academic year while an apartment in either Empire Commons or Freedom Apartments can run from \$7,000 to \$10,000. These are equivalent to about \$1,000 a month.

Christine Bouchard, vice president for student success

at the university said, "We don't really offer graduate housing anymore because there is such a demand for student housing."

She said the college used to have an office of off-campus living, but it was closed in the 1980s due to budget cuts. De-

spite the closure, Bouchard said the college does have many students living off campus. Of the 12,000 undergraduate students enrolled at the university, only 7,400 are housed on campus.

Other options for students is University Heights, a privately owned apartment complex that offers academic year rates and summer rates for students who want off-campus apartments.

The apartments run from \$5,000 to \$6,000 per academic year, which is about \$750 a month.

Troy Student Housing provides apartments off-campus housing to students for \$500 to \$700 a month, but they must sign a yearlong lease.

Jason Hyen, regional manager for Troy Property Groups, said they encourage students to sublet their apartments for the summer if they do not need to live in Troy.

The company, started by a Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute student in the late '90s,

purchases existing multi-family units and renovates the units to include custom kitchens, bathrooms and security systems, according to Hyen.


All of the student properties are within eight to 10 blocks of the RPI campus.

In order to live in Troy Student Housing, students must provide proof that they are attending a local college.

"In general, students are far better tenants than people realize," said David Grandeau, a lawyer representing Troy Property Group.

He said the apartments do see some normal wear and tear, but that the students typically maintain the properties.

"Students take a sense of pride and ownership in the apartment," Hyen said.

Greek Style Turkey Burgers with Yogurt Sauce

- 2 lbs ground turkey
- 1 egg
- 1 c. whole wheat bread Panko crumbs
- 1/4 c. onion, chopped
- 1/4 c. fresh mint, chopped
- 1/2 c. fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 t. sea salt
- 1 small container plain yogurt
- 1/2 zucchini, shredded
- juice from 1/2 lemon
- salt and pepper, to taste
- whole wheat buns

Pulse the onion, mint, parsley and salt together in a food processor until finely chopped. Mix together in a large bowl with the turkey, egg and bread crumbs. Form into patties (you will have about 9.) Brush the grill the olive oil. Cook over a medium hot grill for about 8 minutes per side. Check one burger to test for doneness. In a small bowl, combine the yogurt, zucchini, lemon juice and salt and pepper. Serve the burgers on buns, with a small scoop of yogurt sauce on each.

Taco Tuesday Beef Tacos

- 1 lb flank steak
- 3 T. olive oil
- juice and zest from one lime
- 1 t. each cumin, coriander, ancho chili powder, sea salt
- 10 low-carb tortillas
- shredded monterey jack cheese
- 1 handful cilantro, chopped
- fresh mild salsa

In a small bowl, mix the olive oil with the lime juice and zest, and spices. Pour over the flank steak and refrigerate for an hour. Light a grill to medium heat. Cook 5 minutes each side, or until desired doneness. Let rest until no longer hot. Slice across the grain and set aside.

Preheat oven to 350°. On two cookie sheets, place tortillas and layer each with a few beef slices, cilantro, salsa and cheese. Fold each in half. Bake for 4-5 minutes, until cheese is melted. Serve the tacos hot, with extra salsa on the side.

Healthy meals with meat

Satisfy cravings with smaller portions, substitutions

My kids love to eat meat. And they are not too discriminating about it, either.

They are just as happy to eat hot dogs as they are filet mignon and lamb chops. Not that we are serving that up on a regular basis, but there are special meals and the occasional restaurant.

The list of meat dishes they do eat regularly looks something like this: sausage, roasted turkey, chicken sate, pork tenderloin, meatballs and steak. Of course, everyone jumps for joy when I announce that cheeseburgers are on the menu. They may balk at steamed spinach, turn their noses at quinoa, no matter how much butter I stir in, but any cut of meat is met with a smile and a fork.

A few weeks ago, I was thinking aloud about what I would serve to friends who were coming to dinner. We were on our way to the pool, so I threw out a few ideas to my kids in the car. How about fish tacos? "Noooooooooooo," was their response. Salmon and Asian noodles? "Booooooooooo," could be heard from the back seat. I tried to reason with them: Let's have something fresh and summery and healthy. This line of thought did nothing to win over my kids.

We drove on in silence for a moment or two, and then Zoe exploded with one word, "RIBS!" There was not much I could say or do as we continued to the pool, all three of my children chanting, "Ribs! Ribs! Ribs!" And so it was decided. We had traded fresh and healthy for meaty and finger licking.

The dinner we made that night was pretty good. Yes, we all chomped on ribs. Probably more than was good for us. We also had corn salad, cole slaw with sunflower seeds and peanut dressing, and thick sliced tomatoes from a local farm.

Which brings me to the point of this column: is it possible to satisfy this meat craving in children and still be healthy? I believe it is. If everyone likes to eat meat, well, then, cook it. But it doesn't have to be the main event. You can easily make beloved meals (like cheeseburgers) into a healthy dinner. Serving smaller portions of red meat and substituting turkey and chicken when you can is a smart way to make your family happy, and keep the menus low fat and low cholesterol. And it's cheaper, too.

The first recipe comes from our family's love of Mexican food. Lucy has created "Taco Tuesday" and declared each and every Tuesday night a Mexican food night. This is most often a simple, vegetarian meal for us. Beans, rice, tortillas, cheese, you get the picture. I usually have an avocado and a lime to add flavor and texture to our salad.

A few weeks ago, I decided to spice up Taco Tuesday and treat everyone to a steak, which I knew would be a big hit (see above).


I chose a few Mexican-inspired ingredients, wanting to create flavor, yet keep it simple. Using lime juice and zest certainly added zip. The salt and spices made the steak crisp and flavorful. When planning this meal, I purchased a small steak. I made all of the tacos with the beef, salsa, cilantro and cheese. Then I served it with brown rice, tortillas, refried beans and a big bowl of raw veggies. Bellies were filled up with lots of low-fat protein, fiber and enough steak to satisfy the craving. The beef was part of the dinner, not the main event. We each ate two tacos (except Elliot, he ate one). There was a small piece of steak leftover for Paul's lunch the next day. Served alongside the tacos was a salsa that my kids love to eat: Hannaford's fresh salsa. It comes in a ziptop pouch and can be found in the cheese section.

The other recipe that shakes up a meat eater's diet is a twist on burgers. Everyone here loves burgers, and I do mix it up. We grill veggie, chicken, even salmon burgers. This recipe combines ground turkey with some herbs, bread crumbs and an egg. The result is a moist burger, tasty from the herbs and onions. My kids ate these burgers cheerfully. Lucy even ate the yogurt sauce. Zoe spread yellow mustard on hers, and Elliot ate his without a bun, dipped in mustard. We also made a simple salad: tomato wedges, cucumber slices, raw green beans and feta cheese tossed with olive oil and red wine vinegar. This recipe makes a large batch, enough to share with friends or have leftovers.

Would my children rather have a big ol' steak on their plate? Or a pork chop? Any big piece of meat? Probably. But I don't ask. These recipes, while simple, will take more time and effort than just grilling a steak and serving it up with a side dish. In the interest of feeding your family healthy food, it's time well spent.

One more thing: my husband read this column today and said, "Good grief, you made our kids sound like prehistoric carnivores!" Maybe I exaggerated a little for effect. They do also eat lots of vegetables, whole grains and fruit. And when I asked Elliot what kind of dinosaur he would have been if he had lived millions of years ago, his answer was very definite: "A long neck dinosaur, because they only eat leaves."

whenever possible. Needless to say, it is almost impossible in these overcrowded gyms.

While in the stands, I heard some of the most outrageous comments coming from people. I heard parents talking about other people's children in such shameful ways, it embarrassed me, and I don't even have a child playing. They criticized looks, dress and to get an edge up for their own kid, they put down another kid's academic ability.

You'd be surprised how often academics are talked about, especially when it comes to one kid getting an offer for a scholarship. I have heard some parents who are upset that their kid did not receive similar awards, scholarships, etc. They often resort to putting down the other kid in not so favorable terms insinuating that he or she is undeserving.

It is important for parents to remember all the players are kids, and they should be having fun. They should have supportive parents, not those people who border on being fanatical.

I was in the stands the other day watching a football game, just listening to the parents around me. I had to smile to myself to stop from really bursting out loud with laughter. But when I really thought about what was being said, it wasn't funny.

One parent was asking another parent whether it would benefit her son for a scholarship if he played on the varsity now. I guess

her son was either a freshman or sophomore. Wow, that's really thinking ahead. I looked up at where she said he son was standing and I thought to myself, "I hope he gets off the field tonight without injuries." He was so small.

After the game, I didn't remember hearing many parents ask the most important question, "Did you have fun?" Some immediately began their post-game review by complaining about one thing or another. What does that say to that athlete?

I love the parents that don't try to live through their children. I really love parents whose kids come to play and practice as hard as the so-called "stars" — the parents who are just happy to see their kids having a good time. After the game, they'll ask if their kids had fun and then tell them how well they did without comparing them to someone else's kid. While they want them to work hard and do well, their expectations are reasonable. They don't pressure on the kids, themselves or the coach.

The poor coach

Coaching these days, from my perspective and from the many colleagues I've spoken to, is no bag of freshly picked New York State apples. It's become akin to a gauntlet which you start running once you get the job.

Everyone wants to be a coach, and on game day everyone is — from the person who has never played before to the person that had a couple of snaps in high school, played Pop Warner football, little league baseball, town soccer, etc. I hope you get

the picture.

As for the coach that gets little pay to do the job, he or she never is smart enough even if they've won for a number of years with, in some cases, little talent. It matters little that coaches are there night in and night out working with the kids encouraging them, teaching them and supporting them. From my observation, they try and do the best job possible every day.

Again, I sit in the stands and hear the coach-bashing. I am sometimes asked what I think of a particular coach's decision to do this or that. I have to laugh because it makes me think about what, no doubt, happened while I was coaching. I don't second guess coaches, at least not in a crowd.

I hear second guessing from the parents of the so-called "star" to the parents of the least-used player on the bench. They are asking why their son or daughter is not getting more playing time. I wonder how these same parents would feel if they heard the negative comments from others — just about the time their kid is finally being sent in, especially in a tight game.

Today, we see some parents dictate to coaches how they should coach their kid. They come right out and ask for playing time, and some will even tell the coach their kid should have the ball more and be able to do almost whatever they want during a game. If the coach ignores them, they will take their case to the school administrators. They will even threaten to change schools and even go as far as changing schools — just for sports.

I believe parents that put their kid in a school should trust that coach to have their son or daughter's best interest at heart. Most coaches I knew operated that way. Very few coaches, if they wanted to be successful, tried to purposely destroy a student athlete. Of course, some coaches are better than others in certain areas, and as a parent, you need to seek out those coaches you've seen conduct themselves the way you can appreciate, on and off court.

Winning is important, but it's not everything. The lessons your child will get from a coach might have long-lasting effects, and you don't want it to be just about winning. Make a decision to trust the coach and stick by it. When choosing a school, sport and/or coach, do your research, but make sure your decisions are made for all the right reasons. Don't expect the coach to make your kid a superstar.

How many of those horses run in the Travers and other big stakes races at Saratoga may depend on the weather.





Rain dampens racing season

**Attendance, handle
are down
from 2007 season**

Rain, rain go away. Come back some other day – preferably a Tuesday.

That's what folks around Saratoga Race Course are no doubt saying after a rainy opening half to the six-week racing season.

So much rain has fallen on the 140-year-old race course on Union Avenue that the inner turf courses have been used only sparingly. As of Saturday's 140th birthday bash, 18 races had been moved off the turf – three times the amount of races that had to be moved to the main track all of last year.

"Last year, we ran a record number of turf races," said New York Racing Association CEO Charlie Hayward. "We ran 163 turf races, and that was 39 more turf races than we've run before.

And we only took six races off the turf."

Then, there was last Friday. A severe thunderstorm pelted the track so hard that some of the dirt was displaced, and because more storms were in the forecast, track officials decided to cancel the final eight races on the 10-race card.

"The weather has been killing us," said Hayward.

The attendance and daily handle numbers don't lie. Entering Saturday, the rain – not

to mention high gas prices and fewer people taking vacations – had led to a 17.8 percent drop in daily attendance and a 9.6 percent decline in daily on-track betting from last year.

If it was any other track in America, this would be devastating news. But those declines are off from a record-setting 2007 season at Saratoga that included \$123 million in total handle.

"If you look back, since 1999 our on-track handle has been growing every year," said Hayward. "So

unlike most race meets where their attendance and handle has been declining, ours has been increasing."

On the track, Saratoga received some good news and some bad news last week. The good news is that Curlin – who has been stabled in the Spa City all summer – will run in the Woodward Stakes Aug. 30. The bad news is Big Brown – arguably the biggest horse on the thoroughbred scene – will
