



Volunteers fight poverty by working, living among the people they are helping

The \$10,000 yearly stipend Yalitzia Negron receives as an AmeriCorps VISTA worker doesn't stretch very far.

Negron gets a \$790 stipend check each month. Her rent alone is \$794.

Because AmeriCorps employees are prohibited from having second jobs, Negron has learned to get by with less. She passes up clothes at the mall that catch her eye. She relies on food stamps for groceries. She counts her blessings that she can turn to her family for financial help.

Adopting such a frugal lifestyle hasn't always been easy, but Negron, who graduated from Siena College in December, said the experience has taught her valuable lessons about making do without material things and not passing judgment on the poor.

"I think I've grown more this year than I did in four years at Siena," she said.

AmeriCorps is a federal service program commonly referred to as the domestic Peace Corps, and VISTA (Volunteers in Service to America) is an arm of the program designed specifically to fight poverty. VISTA workers essentially take a vow of poverty themselves for the year they commit to VISTA, eschewing any taxable income other than their stipends.

Across the country, AmeriCorps workers combat poverty not by simply holding food drives or fundraisers, but by immersing themselves in poor and

rural communities. They work with nonprofit organizations and local governments to create ways to fight illiteracy, improve health-care services and strengthen community bonds.

Matthew Johnson, a sociology professor at Siena, launched the VISTA program there in January, securing the grant money to do so as a way of giving back to his alma mater.

Negron had planned to go to graduate school this fall. But, she graduated from Siena early and was staring at several

months with no schoolwork and no job lined up. The VISTA program seemed like a natural fit since Negron had a long history of volunteering.

So she signed up, even though the prospect of living on \$10,000 was daunting.

"To be honest with you, my parents were really worried," she said. "Ten thousand dollars isn't a lot. Our whole staff has learned to conserve. We know what it's like to live in poverty."

They all receive food stamps. Carly James is getting married while she's in the program, so she's had to scale back her wed-

Town OK's budget

Group of residents blast 6.89 percent increase; board says it's maintaining quality of life

Despite a handful of pleas to take another look, the Bethlehem Town Board approved its 2009 budget.

The board unanimously approved the proposed 6.89 percent town tax increase on Wednesday, Nov. 12, after a group of residents asked the town to table the budget and propose a zero percent tax increase in the face of a possible national recession.

Residents said more cuts could be made before the budget's passing and that the town should be willing to make the same financial sacrifices every taxpayer is now facing in a worsening economy.

Supervisor Jack Cunningham, along with fellow board members, said the budget process wasn't taken lightly and that Bethlehem needs to look out for its financial future.

Putting off tough financial decisions and investments until

it's too late is not an option, the board explained. However, a group of residents, including the town's Republican Chairwoman Melody Burns, disagreed and spoke against the proposed tax hike.

"As a taxpayer, I am asking you to not pass the budget as proposed, but to take it back and make it a zero tax increase budget," Burns told the board. "I know you have until the 20th of November to do that, so you have eight days to review the budget and bring it back to zero."

Norman Morand, a vocal resident and former Republican committeeman, said town cars should be the first item eliminated from the budget.

"I don't like the budget. ... I just recently filed a FOIL request; I want to know who has town-owned cars for their personal use. I don't think it's necessary. I don't think Jack Cunningham or the head of the department of public works or anybody deserves a town car," Morand said. "I don't have a town car. When I worked for GE they didn't give me a car - I used my own. ... Take those items out of the budget."

Funding cuts the talk of area schools

Governor wants to trim aid to educational institutions

Area schools are bracing for the full impact of Gov. David Paterson's proposed state aid cuts.

Paterson proposed a series of measures on Wednesday, Nov. 12, to close the state's projected budget deficits, including an across-the-board cut in aid for school districts.

Under the governor's proposal, Bethlehem Central School District would lose \$1,764,730 in state aid in the middle of this school year - money that the district said it has already counted on to provide programs and services for all students, meet its contractual obligations and pay the bills necessary to operate.

In neighboring Ravena-Coe-

mans-Selkirk, district officials reported that they would lose more than \$700,000 if the mid-year state funding were cut.

While the state aid cut is only a proposal at this point, district officials in both schools have already begun looking at what it all could mean for its students and its taxpayers.

State Sen. Neil Breslin, D-Delmar, who represents Albany County, and was returning to Albany for a special session on Nov. 18, said because the Republicans still hold the majority in the Senate until next session, he didn't expect much to get done.

"I've been extremely supportive of education over the years," Breslin told *Spotlight Newspapers*. "But it looks like we won't do much on Tuesday with a Republican majority."

Breslin said he doesn't want to see a mid-year cut of funds already promised to area schools, but some

Golf cart joyride in Delmar leads to DWI charges

After receiving a call about "annoying youths," in Delmar, Bethlehem police followed a golf cart down Murray Avenue before arresting its 20-year-old intoxicated driver.

Timothy J. Marci, of Selkirk, was charged Saturday, Nov. 8, for

DWI; operating a vehicle with a BAC of 0.08 percent or greater; unlawful possession of alcohol; a vehicle lights violation; failure to have a valid inspection certificate; an insurance violation; a registration violation; a traffic device violation; and miscellaneous vehicle and

traffic law violations.

Bethlehem police said upon arriving on the scene "officers ... observed [the] listed golf cart traveling southbound on Murray Avenue," and that "the operator of said golf cart failed to stop for the red light at the intersection on Murray Avenue and Feura Bush Road."

Police activated their emergency lights and pulled the golf cart over on Feura Bush Road, according to the arrest report, and Marci identified himself with a New York driver's license.

While interviewing Marci, police said they could smell alcohol on his breath and observed him display signs of intoxication. When officers asked him if he had been drinking, Marci told police "he drank six beers at a friend's house," the report states.

Another officer arrived on the scene, and Marci was asked to perform a field-sobriety test, which he failed, and he was placed into custody after he tested positive for alcohol, according to police.

Marci was transported to the Bethlehem Police Department where he submitted to a chemical test that revealed a BAC of nearly double the legal limit of 0.08 percent, the report states.

Police said the golf cart was towed and that the beer Marci had been consuming was confiscated as evidence. He is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Dec. 2 and was released to the custody of his mother, the report states.

Police said they did confirm the owner of the golf cart used in the incident.

• Cornelius Brown, 44, of Albany, was arrested Friday, Nov. 7, on Route 9W in Glenmont for third-degree attempted robbery, a felony.

Bethlehem police said they received a call about a shoplifter at the Wal-Mart in Glenmont and that the suspect "was giving the loss-prevention officer a problem."

Officers arrived on the scene and placed Brown into custody without further incident, according to the arrest report, and security officers told police "that when Brown was stopped and brought back to the security office, she forcibly pulled away from them and took her cart of merchandise ... to push through them in an attempt to get away."

The property was recovered and taken for evidence, as well as a surveillance video from the store showing the incident, the report states.

Brown was arraigned by Bethlehem Justice Paul Dwyer and sent to the Albany County Correctional Facility without bail.

She is scheduled to have a preliminary hearing on Thursday, Nov. 13, and return to Bethlehem Town Court on Dec. 2.

Police said Brown attempted to steal \$214.29 worth of merchandise that included men's and women's clothing, children's clothing, bathing products, food and water.

Bethlehem sets up Web site for parents

District set to pilot Internet parent portal in January

Parents no longer need to worry about those "missing report cards" in Bethlehem.

The Bethlehem Central School District announced that in the second half of this year, the district will pilot a Web-based communication tool that promises to strengthen communication between home and school. The program will offer parents online access to personalized information about a student's academic program and progress.

Assistant Superintendent for Educational Programs Jody Monroe and program developer Peter Kowalski of the district's technology department gave the

Board of Education an overview of the new program, known as "BC @ Home," at its Wednesday, Nov. 6, meeting.

Parents will be receiving a letter next month describing the pilot phase of the program with detailed instructions about how to register and log in, according to school officials.

The program has the capability for teachers to post a class calendar, upcoming assignments and assignment grades, five-week reports and report cards, and an assortment of study materials, as well as facilitate electronic communication between parents, students and teachers. However, in the pilot phase, beginning in January, parents of students in grades six through 12 can only expect that five-week reports

and report cards will be available through BC @ Home.

Elementary students will, at this time, receive report cards as they have in the past. Some teachers, both in grades six through 12 and at the elementary level, may make immediate use of some of the more advanced capabilities of the system.

Monroe presented BC @ Home to faculty members at the Tuesday, Nov. 4 Conference Day and reported broad interest, particularly at the secondary level.

"This will be a really great tool to strengthen communications between home and school," she said. "It is our hope that through the pilot phase, teachers will familiarize themselves with BC @ Home and explore what it has

to offer their students and their families. And, we'd like feedback from everyone so we can be sure it is as effective as possible as it is used more broadly across the district into the future."

BC @ Home is a secure system, meaning that parents and students don't have to worry about student information being available to any users other than themselves. The letter that parents receive next month will include a 16-digit code and user name for their initial log in, and then they will be prompted to enter an e-mail address and to establish a secure password.

BC @ Home was developed by Peter Teal of the district's technology department, under the direction of Monroe and Superintendent Michael

Tebbano. Tebbano noted at the district's Wednesday, Nov. 5, board meeting that by having the expertise in-house, the district saved money compared with purchasing a commercially available parent portal system. He added that by developing it within the district, the program can be continually customized to the needs of the district.

"We have heard from parents who would like access to more information so they can support their child's learning; we are committed to doing everything we can to help parents take such an active role," Tebbano said. "This system shows great promise, and I encourage our faculty and district families to explore it during this pilot phase."

Parker Mathusa loses battle with ALS

A man known for celebrating and honoring the history of Bethlehem has now become a part of its pages.

Parker D. Mathusa, a friend, mentor and community leader to many, died after a courageous battle with ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease, Sunday, Nov. 16, at his Delmar home, surrounded by his family.

† He was 70.

Born on April 5, 1938, in Cedar Hill, he was the son of the late Frank and Margaret (Tansey) Mathusa.

Mr. Mathusa was a graduate of the Historic Little Red School House in Cedar Hill and Ravena-Coeyman-Selkirk High School Class of 1955. In 1958, he was a community ambassador for the Town of Coeymans in Amsterdam, Holland. Mr. Mathusa received his bachelor's degree in physics from the University at Albany in 1959 and his master's degree in engineering management from Northeastern University in 1970.

He was an Eagle Scout and served in the National Guard.

Mathusa worked in Newport News, Va., under the command of Admiral Rickover in 1959, helping build the first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, *The USS Enterprise*. He also helped build nuclear power plants in

several locations including, Alaska, Las Vegas, San Francisco and Boston.

In 1964, he met his wife in Pittsburgh. He was working for Westinghouse, where he built a propulsion system for the first Mars space orbiter.

In 1970, Mr. Mathusa came home to New York to begin his work on energy management related programs. It began a 38-year career starting at the Public Service Commission and then was Program Director for New York State Energy and Research Development Authority.

He was selected and served as emissary to China for Energy Infrastructure Development.

After retirement, he served on the NYSEERDA Board of Directors as a Research Scientist for 10 years and was Bethlehem's Planning Board chair, member of the Planning Advisory Committee, the Comprehensive Planning Oversight Committee and the Quadricentennial Committee.

Mathusa was a member of the Normanside Country Club, the Bethlehem Grange, the Bethlehem Historical Society, the University Club, Steuben Athletic Club, Southwood Tennis Club, and

New York State Senior Golf League.

He has received multiple national and state program awards and was twice Citizen of the Year for the Town of Bethlehem as well as a town historic tour guide.

In October, Mathusa had a bench and plaque dedicated in his name for his vision and dedication to the Quadricentennial Committee. The bench was placed near the Hudson River in Henry Hudson Park in Bethlehem.

He enjoyed golfing, sailing and helping his community. He most enjoyed spending time with his family and friends.

"Parker Mathusa was a loving and generous man," his family wrote in tribute. "He will be greatly missed by the many people whose lives he has touched."


Bethlehem Supervisor Jack Cunningham said the town also feels the loss of the Mathusa family.

"He's an institution here at Town Hall," Cunningham said. "He's really going to be truly missed."

Survivors include his wife of 45 years, Polly Anne; four daughters, Elise (Jim) Flynn of Chester, Heather (Michael) Tangora of Delmar, Ashlee (John) Church of Delmar, and Bethany (John) Furgele of Delmar; 10 grandchildren; a sister, Verne (Ted) Nyquist of Bartlett, Ill.; and several nieces, nephews and great-nieces and nephews.

Calling hours will be held Wednesday, Nov. 19, from 3 to 7 p.m. at the Applebee Funeral Home, 403 Kenwood Ave., Delmar. A Mass of Christian Burial will be held on Thursday, Nov. 20, at 9:30 p.m. at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Delmar.







Mix it up

As adults, it seems like we have enough of a hard time stepping outside of our comfort zones. Perhaps it's because as children we didn't teach ourselves to be comfortable in an assortment of social situations.

Last week, *Spotlight Newspapers* brought you the story of how one school district addressed this issue. On Thursday, Nov. 13, Draper Middle School in Rotterdam will have participated in the nationwide Mix it Up at Lunch program.

The concept is a simple one, and may seem a little Orwellian on its face: On Mix it Up at Lunch day, students are forced to sit with people with whom they wouldn't normally sit with. The students are arbitrarily placed — there's no overt attempt at some preconceived "desired" mix — usually by selecting playing cards or, in the case of Draper Middle School, by the color of their shirts.

During lunch, students are encouraged to share feelings with one another or somehow engage in a dialogue with students they wouldn't normally.

The Mix it Up at Lunch program was started through an organization called Teaching Tolerance, which is dedicated to reducing prejudice, improving intergroup relations and, of course, teaching tolerance.

We at *Spotlight Newspapers* applaud this initiative, not only for its message of tolerance, but for its exercise in practicality.

The grade-school classroom is the most homogenous environment most people will be a part of in their lives. Virtually nowhere else in life are we surrounded by people who are the same age, are experiencing the same things, and are, with some degree of variance, from the same economical and social strata. That's why it's important to find, acknowledge and be comfortable with the differences between us that exist in even those regulated circumstances.

Getting out of our comfort zones as children will only make for well-rounded, emotionally stable, productive adults. As we enter into adulthood, go to college, the military or the workforce, we have to be able to encounter, accept and sometimes capitalize on peoples' differences.

Variety is not just the spice of life, as some like to say, but is a staple of life in our growing global social and economic world.

No shame in a life well-lived

The thought of writing this column almost made me sick to my stomach.

But that's exactly why I decided to do it.

Saturday, Nov. 22, is National Survivors of Suicide Day. It's a day when people across the country will gather at conferences or online to remember lives that have been lost to suicide. One of its goals is to bring suicide out of the shadows — to educate people about it and eradicate the stigma surrounding it.

It's a mission I can attest hasn't been accomplished yet. That's why this column is so hard for me to write.

My older brother, Mike, committed suicide last summer. I've never lied to anyone about how he died, but it's never easy information to volunteer, either. I hate subjecting him to the judgment some people pass on suicide victims — they were weak, they were selfish, they just didn't care.

To be honest, I might have harbored some of those same thoughts myself once. Mike and I always enjoyed an easygoing, fun relationship. One night about five years ago, when Mike suffered his first prolonged bout with anxiety and depression, we played Monopoly. He tried to persuade me to trade properties with him, but I said no, not wanting to give him an advantage.

Much to my surprise, he snapped that I was unreasonable and that he didn't want to play anymore.

Later, he told me he was having a hard time at work and that he wasn't himself. With tears in his eyes, he apologized

and said he was getting help.

"Good," I said, my own voice cracking. "I don't want anything to happen to you."

Even though I was emotional when I said it, inside I was kind of laughing. Suicide? I knew it would never come to that.

Then, with a single phone call on Aug. 14, 2007, I suddenly didn't know if I would ever laugh again.

The phone jolted me awake at 5 a.m. I remember cursing as I jumped out of bed to get it, thinking that despite the early hour, it was an annoyance instead of an emergency.

Instead, I learned Mike had tried to kill himself.

In hysterics, I asked over and over, "Is he OK? Is he OK?"

He wasn't.

My brother was dead.

It took six weeks for me to go one full day without crying. As I grasped for anything that would help me cope, I turned to the Internet, reading up on suicide. One site said that survivors of suicide would always have to deal with the shame that their loved ones had taken their lives.

I was indignant. I refused to feel shame. Having Mike in my life for as long as I did has been one of my greatest blessings. At his wake, one of his co-workers shook my dad's hand and said simply, "You raised a good man."

This is the type of man Mike was:

He drove eight hours to spend the weekend with me the first time I had my heart broken.

He loved music. He wrote a song for my 30th birthday and sang it dressed like Elvis. He created elaborate dance routines with his daughters.

He would get up and dedicate a love song to his wife whenever we did karaoke.

He insisted on bringing his 3-year-old daughter to Shea Stadium when I offered him two tickets to see the Mets play the Yankees and said he could bring anyone he wanted. He didn't change his mind even after she broke her leg. He carried her all the way to our seats in the upper deck.

He volunteered with the United Way and Habitat for Humanity. He collected a half-dozen trash bags filled with popcorn, drink mixes, magazines and other items to send to the troops.

He spent three hours planning the toast for my parents' 35th anniversary party. He wanted to be sure he paid tribute with just the right words.

He would seek out people at parties who didn't know anyone and make sure they were part of the conversation. He could make anyone feel included.

He always saved a dance for me at weddings.

He got hit by a car when he was 6, and neighborhood kids flooded our house when he got home from the hospital. He was the nicest boy on the street, the girl told me after he died. He was the only one who didn't pick on her and make her cry.

I worry, though, that the way he died overshadows all that. That to some people, he's been reduced to, "He committed suicide." I'm trying to compile a book of memories of Mike, and I reached out to a lot of his friends and co-workers. One wrote back that he didn't want to take part — that Mike was one of the best people he's ever worked with, "but now I'm just mad at him for giving up."

I've had my own moments of anger. There are times I can't help but wonder why this had to happen, how life would be so different for Mike's friends and family if we could just wipe away that one fateful night.

By the grace of God, I've never experienced the kind of anxiety and depression he did. I don't know what was going through his mind. I do know he was smart and successful, and he worried he was working too many hours and didn't have enough time to spend with his family. But he agonized over the financial implications of taking a less demanding job.

The last time I saw him, I told him that whenever I went through a tough time, I reminded myself of other times I had felt despair. Somehow I had gotten through those, I reasoned, so I would get through this, too.

"Despair is a good word for it," he said.

Later that day, we said goodbye for the final time.

He told me he loved me.

I loved him, too.

On Nov. 22 and always, I will remember him as a great brother, father, son, husband and friend. I hope events like the National Survivors of Suicide Day will help other people see and remember those lost to suicide the same way.

Ethics matter dropped; moratorium extended

New Scotland will have three more months to draft new zoning laws

The New Scotland Town Board unanimously passed a resolution to not take any further action against Commercial Zone Advisory Committee member Liz Kormos after meeting on Wednesday, Nov. 12. At the same meeting, the board voted unanimously to extend a building moratorium that has been in place since May.

Kormos had been at the heart of conflict of interest concerns raised by committee chairwoman Roz Robinson, but the board decided to drop the issue after much debate. Robinson raised questions about the nature of the relationship between Kormos and a potential buyer of the Bender melon farm property.

Town Supervisor Tom Dolin said each board member had his own reason for choosing not to pursue the matter, but said his vote stems from Kormos' role as an advisory committee member. He said since Kormos acts in an advisory capacity, she should not be subjected to the same level of scrutiny as those with decision-making powers.

"I don't think they should be subjected to the same code of ethics as elected officials," he said.

Kormos' lawyer, Peter Lauricella, issued a statement on behalf of his client regarding the dismissal of the matter.

"It vindicates her position that she never had a conflict of interest. She looks forward to getting back to work with the CZAC process," he said.

Kormos said that since she has no control over the final outcome of the zoning law and no financial interest - two key factors in a conflict of interest - she did not break town code.

A moratorium on commercial development in the Town of New Scotland for commercial buildings larger than 30,000 feet has been in place for six months, and at Wednesday's meeting, the board opted to extend it for three more months, ending on March 1.

The Kormos matter dealt with a business relationship she had with a potential buyer, Mark Schafer, of the Bender melon farm, located at the heart of the commercial zone.

That developer was later outbid by Sphere Development LLC, which has plans to develop the farm with a 137,000-square-foot anchor store.

Kormos, who is also a member of advocacy group New Scotlanders for Sound Economic Development, which supports a 50,000-square-foot size cap on

commercial retail stores, said she considered resigning from the committee, but has received so much support she will stay on to finish the recommendation to the Town Board.

She said she was satisfied with the outcome, but not the process.

"The matter was not handled well by all parties," she said. "It was designed just to get me off the committee."

She also said she questioned the motivations of Robinson in raising the matter, but she expects CZAC to continue to function despite the conflict.

"We're both professional. We don't have to be best friends to work on this committee," said Kormos.

Kormos added she believes she will be able to provide CZAC with information that supports her original position that a big-box development is not the best way to develop the land.

Dolin said he expects CZAC will be able to continue its work, and he is happy to see the matter resolved.

He also said since the board was committed to a three-month extension to the moratorium, they decided to see if they

could finish before the March 1 deadline. He said in hindsight, though, a six-month extension would have been better, but they did not expect a six-week delay at the time they held hearings for an extension.

Robinson said she is not convinced that a conflict does not still exist, and said she is concerned with the process moving forward.

"I still feel there's clearly a conflict of interest," Robinson said. "I do have a trust issue."

She said she felt that letters of intent to make Kormos a potential partner in the purchase of the property changes the situation and "taints" some of the information she brought into CZAC meetings, citing it as subjective.

Kormos had previously stated she was a consultant for the buyer, Mark Schafer. Kormos also said, though, that while no formal partnership agreement was made to be a "minority partner," there were letters of intent discussing the issue.

At Wednesday's meeting, Marlene Prentiss read a statement on behalf of her husband, Bob, an active member in NS4SED, supporting an extension to the moratorium.

She said she and her husband supported a one-year moratorium, as was recommended by the county, rather than the six-month one that was put in place.

She also said that 800 people in the area spoke at the public hearing at the high school against big-box retail development, and that more than 2,000 people signed petitions opposing it.

"We want sound economic development, but not unbridled development. And, we definitely don't want regional-drawing, big box stores here," the statement read.

Bringing more to those who live with less

North Albany doesn't have many Girl Scout troops, and there's no after-school dance program at the YMCA.

Carly James is trying to change that in her role as an AmeriCorps VISTA worker.

James, one of eight VISTA workers based at Siena College, is in charge of the program's North Albany initiative. Her

mission is to "bridge the gap" between the area and the campus.

So when she heard that there weren't any Girl Scout troops, she got Siena students together and enlisted training for them to be troop leaders. The Y needs a dance program? James is in talks with Siena's dance team to set something up.

Those are a couple of real-world examples of the kind of work Siena's VISTA workers are doing. The program aims to fight poverty by having its

workers pair with community organizations and governments to bring about change.

"We're behind the scenes," said Yalitza Negron, a VISTA worker whose official title is "community based research partnership program coordinator." Put simply, she tries to pair classrooms in the Capital District with community groups that need assistance.

For example, police in Albany's Arbor Hill neighborhood were wondering how they could improve their interaction with minorities in the area. So a class at Siena coordinated focus groups in the neighborhood to gauge people's feelings about local law enforcement, presenting the findings to the police.

Casonya Young grew up in

Albany and graduated from the Academy of the Holy Names. As a VISTA, she works in Siena's Franciscan Center for Service and Advocacy, helping to coordinate all of the volunteer and event programs that the Franciscan center hosts. In the past two months, she's helped recruit more than 1,000 student volunteers for major events on campus like the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure, raising more than \$5,000 in the process.

Nicole Tommasini's VISTA work also involves student volunteers. Tommasini helped launch Siena's Bonner Program, which awards service-based scholarships. Seventeen Siena students have received such scholarships and must commit eight to 10 hours of service a

week to a community organization of their choice.

Among the places students are volunteering are the Humane Society, the Boys and Girls Club and Joseph's House, a shelter for the homeless in Troy.

"Our goal is just to bring students in and give them something to care about," Tommasini said.

James, who is originally from Vermont, didn't have a vested interest in Albany herself until she came to the city to study at the University at Albany.

Now, she takes pride in becoming a familiar face in North Albany.

"I came into the community as a stranger, and I'm ending as a fixture," she said.

ding plans. Nicole Tommasini has gotten used to spending nights at home instead of going out.

"My friends will say, 'Let's go do something,' and I'll say, 'I can't, I have to pay my electric bill,'" Tommasini said.

But the VISTA volunteers are bonded by more than their tight budgets. Each share Johnson's vision of giving something back.

James wanted to step outside the typical college "bubble" she lived in at Siena that consisted chiefly of socializing and going to class.

"I wanted to do something real," she said.

So James, who graduated from Siena in the spring, spends her days in North Albany, working to "bridge the gap" between the area and the college, which are separated by only 8 miles but have never had much of a relationship.

Tommasini had always wanted to commit a year to service, but she worried about the financial hardship it would create. Then she learned about VISTA after graduating from the University at Albany. The program needed someone to launch a service-based scholarship program at Siena, which would let Tommasini explore a subject that had always interested her: how and why students get involved in volunteering.

"It just got me really excited," she said.

Negron's role is to connect classrooms with the Capital District through so-called "service learning opportunities." The idea is to find community organizations that need help with some kind of project and have classes provide it.

"We want to give them hands-on projects without using a case study out of a textbook," Negron said.

VISTA workers commit to the program for a year. They can re-up for up to two more years after that. When their service is complete, they are given either \$4,725 to put toward schooling, or a \$1,200 stipend.

There are other benefits, too, the Siena VISTA workers say. They've gained invaluable experience in their chosen fields. They've networked and built professional connections. They've learned what it's like to have to rely on assistance programs to make ends meet.

James remembers applying for food stamps and drawing a curious look from the clerk, who wondered why she needed food stamps. James, after all has a degree in social work; she could easily have spent this year in grad school or with a job that paid significantly better than \$10,000 a year.

Instead, she chose to work with VISTA. And so, the answer was simple.

She needed food stamps to survive.

cuts would be inevitable for next year. He also questioned if the governor's cuts proposed for next year are too deep for education and health care.

"We have to be very, very selective ... and although we've made some determinations, to take that money back now would be harsh to the districts," Breslin said. "I agree that cuts will have to be made for next year, but you've got to give notice."

The nearly \$1.8 million mid-year aid cut proposed by the governor is 9.7 percent less than the state pledged in aid this year and a sum that is nearly 2 percent of Bethlehem's entire budget.

"We recognize that the state has entered very difficult fiscal times and that the governor has a responsibility to address the situation," said Bethlehem Superintendent Michael Tebbano. "But, it is students and taxpayers who lose when state aid is cut in the middle of the school year. Such a devastating hit would threaten existing programs and services and may lead to an even greater burden on local taxpayers."

Tebbano noted his district proactively instituted a non-essential spending freeze last month. At that time, the district largely cancelled student field trips, professional and curriculum development opportunities that required substitute teachers, and conference attendance. All hiring, and supply and equipment purchases are to be reviewed by the superintendent and assistant superintendent under the freeze.

At the Wednesday, Nov. 19, Bethlehem Board of Education meeting, Tebbano said he will brief the board and the community about the governor's proposal and potential implications for the district.

He said he will put the proposed \$1.8 million mid-year state aid cut into some context by showing estimates of select areas of the current district budget in relation to the

proposed cut.

"My message is basically that we are being as careful as possible already with taxpayers' investment in the school district," Tebbano said. "In our current budget, there is no good way to accommodate savings that are on par with the recommended state aid cut."

RCS officials said the governor's proposal would reduce state aid the district had already allocated by approximately \$738,573, down to \$16.7 million.

"We have taken a number of steps to reduce costs this year. As we look at budget reductions, we will put forth the impact of each of these on our school district. Our goal will be to minimize the impact on our students. The task before us is very difficult," said interim Superintendent Michael Johnson.

The RCS administration and board of education said it would work to develop a plan to implement the proposed cuts. Johnson, however, said he remains hopeful the state legislature and governor will reduce "this very large and significant impact on our district."

RCS officials report that the reduced funding proposal would come mid-year after the budget for this year has already been allocated and, in the case of supplies and other items, largely spent.

Johnson noted that his district, too, has already taken steps to reduce costs this year, including placing on hold the approximately \$60,000 expenditure of funds to start a distance learning program in the high school, as well as a \$50,000 plan to hire a firm to conduct a long-range strategic planning study of the district's academic and facility needs.

"We understand the severity of the times; however we are confident that state officials clearly understand the need to be cautious and not reactionary in their moves to reduce expenditures," Johnson said.

As for the economic crisis that prompted the state aid cuts, Breslin said, "If anyone didn't think this is real, they would be misinformed."

dressed the car issue later in the meeting, saying the town had already begun curbing its transportation expenses.

"I wanted to commend the supervisor on actually addressing this months ago by creating a fleet manager position for the first time, taking all of our vehicles and looking at them town-wide by pooling them together, and we're doing exactly what was recommended earlier," Kotary said. "As for looking to find ways for savings and also putting in operation cuts, this is something that Jack has taken leadership on."

Resident Robert Miller said he, too, supported a "zero tax increase."

"I support the zero increase, you have not justified your needs, and I think this is the year you should justify your needs for a tax increase," Miller said. "There's no reason for this budget increase."

Miller spoke against a proposed additional officer to the Bethlehem Police Department during the budget's public comment meeting on Wednesday, Oct. 22. He said "tax increases should be need-based only, not on want-based," and that "if I don't see a crime, then I don't see a need to increase the police staff."

He argued at that meeting that the town's police force constitutes 1.4 officers per 1,000 residents and that number was "much higher" than other towns its size. He said the same number of officers is often found in a city of 600,000 or more.

However, Bethlehem's Deputy Police Chief Tim Beebe said Miller's numbers "were way off."

Beebe said with an estimated population of 33,922 in Bethlehem and 42 sworn officers, there are 1.26 officers per 1,000 residents. According to the state's Division of Criminal Justice Services, the town had 570 crimes in 2007.

Beebe released statistical information of other municipali-

ties that showed in the city of Albany, which has a population of 94,741, 334 officers dealt with 5,376 crimes in 2007. Albany works out to have 3.52 officers per 1,000 residents.

According to the statistics, Albany, Schenectady, Troy, Rensselaer, Cohoes, Watervliet, Menands, Colonie, Niskayuna, Rotterdam, Scotia, East Greenbush and North Greenbush all have more officers per 1,000 residents than Bethlehem and all have populations under 600,000.

Jared King, a former Bethlehem Republican committeeman, asked, "What about Guilderland?"

"Guilderland is a slightly larger town than Bethlehem and they have 32 officers and we have 42," King said. "Now, we have Wal-Mart, if you read *The Spotlight* you'll see in the blotters that there's something always going on, but they have Crossgates [Mall]."

Cunningham told King that the Guilderland Police Department may have only 32 officers but that the Village of Altamont, which is a part of Guilderland, has its own police force of "nine or 10 full and part-time officers."

According to Commissioner A.J. Salerno, the Altamont Police Department has 10 part-time officers and one full-time officer.

King also told board members that he believed a \$10,000 increase for "town beautification" was unnecessary and commented that "nobody should be taxed out of their home."

Other Town Hall regulars asked officials to look at the budget again.

"I also agree we need to take this budget back, things have change dramatically since we put it together. In the last six weeks the economy has really tanked," said resident Linda Jasinski. "The governor has proposed cuts and said 'nothing is off the table.'"

Jasinski's father, Robert Jasinski, a one-time supervisor candidate and Noise Ordinance Task Force member, said with a shaky stock market, now is not

the time to have unnecessary expenditures.

"It seems like we all have dreams and wants ... but there's a time and place," he told the board.

Councilman Sam Messina said the tax increase would be \$17.45 per \$1,000 and that considering the quality of life in Bethlehem, it was a good deal.

"With the average home in Bethlehem around \$285,000 ... that cost would be about \$48 a year, and that's what we're talking about in terms of total tax levy," Messina said. "What do people in Bethlehem really want? Jack and Kyle [Kotary] have made this point in the past, people in this community want to keep this a quality community."

Councilman Kyle Kotary said he is proud of this year's budget.

"We cut our actual operating and equipment budget this year versus last year, something that very few communities have done. We have implemented more cost-savings measures and found more ways to improve efficiencies over the last couple of years," Kotary said. "Our fund balances are among the healthiest of any community and our quality of life in Bethlehem has been recognized as one of the best in the nation. Finally, in actual dollars, our town tax rate is among the lowest in the region, and I'm proud to say our hard-working town employees provide some of the best municipal services in the state."

The supervisor said safety and financial preservation were key to building the 2009 budget.

"The budget process is something that we began in August, it wasn't something we started last week. We have taken a long, hard look at our expenses and our revenue streams and this was not an easy process to go through," Cunningham said. "One thing we will not do is put the safety of resident in jeopardy and that safety doesn't just come with the police department it comes with the highway department, which takes care of our roads."





Finance *in the* Spotlight

Even with a little money, you can invest in your future

In today's America, disposable income is in short supply. Spare cash. Who has it? Savings? Most people are just trying to make ends meet. Still, even with a survive today mindset, many people are concerned about their long-term financial future. They wonder if they'll be able to meet the demand of an unexpected expense or have enough saved to put their kids through college or to comfortably retire. Most want to do something about it. They just don't have enough money...so they think.

The truth is, most of us have more money than we realize. We just fail to take a close look at how we spend it. Or we look at what we spend and conclude that cutting out some of life's little indulgences—gourmet coffee, beefed up cable packages, magazine subscriptions, dining out—won't make much of a difference when it comes to the big picture. Well, it does. If you don't believe me, start saving \$25 a week. That's dinner out for one person. At the end of the year, without accounting for interest you will receive, your account will be \$1,300 richer.

Sure, the return on your investment isn't great, but it's a start, and starting is what's important. Here are other ideas for investing in your future on a tight budget.

Erase your debt

Do you consider credit card payments an investment? Chances are, you don't. However, most credit card debt carries an interest rate that is higher than the rate of return on any investment you can make. In fact, investing money while you're carrying debt could actually cost you money in the long term. For example, the traditional rate of return on long-term equity investments is between 11 and 12 percent. If you have a credit card with an interest rate above 11 percent, whatever gains you make from

your investments will be cancelled out by the interest you pay on your credit card. So sometimes, the best

investment you can make with your money is to pay off your high-interest rate debt as quickly as possible.

Not all debt is bad debt, though. Mortgages, student loans, and other debt that is tax deductible usually carry lower interest rates. The key is to calculate whether your investments

will earn you more than the interest on your debt will cost you. If the answer is no, pay down your debt, and pay more than the minimum balance due. Being debt free is your first step toward financial independence.

Learn how to save

According to a report by the Commerce Department, the average U.S. household did not save any money in 2006. In the 1980s, families were saving close to 11 percent of their annual earnings. The result is that when unexpected costs arise, as they always do, today's families do not have the cash on hand to meet the demand. They have to borrow money. Too often, they borrow with a high-interest rate credit card and dig a deep hole of debt that is hard to get out of.

Therefore, increasing savings and finding ways to limit spending should top the list of every financial plan. Here are three ways to accomplish this.

1. **Maximize savings for retirement.** Take advantage of employer-based, tax-deferred 401(k) and 403(b) plans. If your employer matches your contributions, regularly contribute the maximum of the match. It automatically doubles your investment.

2. **Accumulate regularly planned short-term savings.** As I noted above, even a weekly deposit of \$25 into a savings or money market account accumulates fast. Most financial experts agree that your goal should be to accrue three to six months worth of living expenses in your account.

3. **Live within your means.** Before you can save and invest money you need to know how much money you earn and how you spend it. So take an inventory of your finances, then create a realistic budget that is based upon your long-term goals. Having a clear view of the big picture is the best way to ward off instant gratification expenditures.

To save successfully, you must create a balanced plan that fits your lifestyle. It doesn't mean that you are not allowed to spend money. It just means that saving money needs to be your priority.

Invest with purpose

Once you have your debt in order and have developed a healthy savings plan, it's time to invest for wealth. Fortunately, even with a little money, you can invest in your future.

Seven steps to eliminate debt

If you're thinking about investing, the first thing you need to do is to eliminate the debt that is holding you hostage. In addition to consulting a credit counselor or financial services planner, here are seven ways to help you do it.

1. Get organized and prioritize.
2. Make a solid plan for attacking your debt.
3. Keep only one or two credit cards.
4. Make prompt payments.
5. Cut out luxury buys and the purchase of items you can live without.
6. If you own a home, consider a home equity loan or line of credit to consolidate debt.
7. Renegotiate the terms of your loans with creditors.

In addition to 401(k) and 403(b) plans, a good place to start investing is in an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Traditional IRAs allows pretax contributions to grow tax-deferred. This means that what you would otherwise pay in taxes on an annual basis is a source of additional income. The Roth IRA, on the other hand, allows after-tax contributions to grow tax-free, provided you wait until the age of 59 1/2 to withdraw the money.

Also, take the time to develop a plan that has well-defined financial objectives that encompass short-term, midterm and long-term goals. A sound investment plan balances low-yield, safe investment vehicles and higher-growth potential stocks, as well as a targeted return rate that accounts for the rate of inflation and taxes. It may be worth your while to go over your plan with a financial advisor.

The most important thing, of course, is regular contributions. Small, consistent payments are more powerful than most people can imagine. The reason? Compounding interest. For example, an individual in their mid-20s who invests \$2,000 a year for only eight years (a \$16,000 total contribution) will earn more money by the age of 65 than an individual in their mid-30s who begins investing \$2,000 a year for 30 years (a \$60,000 total contribution).

Again, the key to investing is not to invest big but to get started and be consistent. If this means making some changes to your lifestyle, it's worth it. Sure, you probably won't generate enough money through your investments to live like a rock star, or even a highly compensated corporate executive, but you might just earn enough to live the later part of your life on your terms. In my book, that's a high-yield return worth investing in.

The Dance the World series at the Egg in Albany has featured flamenco dancers and Celtic tap dancers. Troupes have come from Canada, Spain and the Netherlands to perform as part of the Egg's mission to showcase dance forms from around the globe.

But one style of dance that has never taken center stage at the Egg is belly dancing.

Peter Lesser, the Egg's executive director, said he's wanted to include belly dancing in the lineup; he knows it's popular locally, with at least 10 Capital District dance schools offering belly dancing classes.

The problem was finding a touring belly dancing group.

Enter the Bellydance Superstars. The group launched at the Lollapooza music festival in 2003 as something of a lark, according to Lesser. But it proved so popular that the Bellydance Superstars are now touted as the only full-time, professional touring belly dancing troupe in the world.

"They are THE belly dancing group," Lesser said.

Area residents will have a chance to check out the Bellydance Superstars themselves when the group comes to the Egg on Saturday, Nov. 22. Tickets for the 8 p.m. show are \$24 for adults, \$20 for seniors and \$12 for children.

"Everyone should be exposed to belly dancing at least once in their life, and this would be the show to see," said Beatriz Arencibia, who dances under the name Bozenka. "It's an experience filled with color, expression and creativity."

It's also one with a long history. Belly dancing is thought to have originated in the Middle East hundreds of years ago, a mix of both strong and fluid movements. The Bellydance Superstars wear elaborate costumes, hairpieces and

jewelry that harkens back to ancient times.

They see their craft as more than just a hobby or interest; it's a way of life.

Arencibia, for example, has been belly dancing for a decade. She has her own "belly dance academy" in Miami Beach and says she belly dances "24/7." It's the form of dance she's most comfortable with and one that she feels "defines" her.

Ansuya Monroe can relate. She learned to dance when she was just 4 from her mother, Jenaeni, who was a well-known dancer in Los Angeles and New

York in the '60s and '70s. She said she's "proud" to be a belly dancer - that the dance style "gives you a glimpse

into the mysterious world of the Middle East on several levels."

"One is by feasting your eyes

on the elaborate and ornate costuming that combines jewelry, fabrics and make up from all over this diverse land," Monroe said.

Belly dancing also lets the audience feel the emotions of people in the Mideast through their music - both their voices and their instruments, she said.

Belly dancers connect with that music, Monroe said, combining it with dance to "portray the drama, sensuality, conflict and joys of life."

It's something women have been doing for ages, Monroe said, and modern-day belly

dancing is "an example of a bridge between cultures, uniting us through our common understanding and appreciation of feminine strength."

It may sound a little New Age, but Lesser thinks the show will keep people's interests even if they're not quite as immersed in belly dancing. There will be a lot of modern music and energetic movement, he said.

Arencibia noted that one of the numbers involves "cane dancing," which is just what it sounds like: dancing with canes. She has a solo and promised lots of spins and turns.





you truly be called a Cinderella team?

Think about it. Every expert is predicting that Siena will win the MAAC, go to the NCAA Tournament, get past at least the first round and possibly into the Sweet 16, or even the Elite 8. All because the Saints have their entire starting five back from last year's 23-win team that annihilated Vanderbilt in the first round of last year's NCAA Tournament.

Now, let's look at the definition of a Cinderella team in the sports world. A Cinderella team comes out of nowhere to win their league or division and make a deep playoff run, perhaps even winning the championship. Some recent examples: George Mason (2006 NCAA Tournament Final Four), Davidson (2008 Elite 8) and the Tampa Bay Rays (2008 American League champions).

Please note: those three teams I just mentioned did not receive the level of preseason hype from national publications that Siena received before they reached those lofty heights.

The 2007-08 Saints certainly qualified for Cinderella status. After all, the only people who expected Siena to win 24 games were probably the coaching staff and the players. Perhaps a few fans started to believe in the Saints after they defeated Stanford at the Times Union Center last December, but no one expected them to dismantle Vandy in the

NCAA Tournament.

But now, the expectations are that Siena will do that and more, which is more along the lines of what is expected from a perennial major power such as UCLA, Duke or Connecticut. None of those programs are considered to be Cinderellas. Heck, those programs have long ceased to be Cinderellas.

So, what happens if Siena lives up to the hype? Are they still a Cinderella story just because they happen to be representing a small, Franciscan college in "little" Loudonville, or are they merely one of the best teams in the country just like everyone said they'd be?

On a more insidious level, what happens if the Saints fall flat? Are they a major disappointment? Were they overhyped? Did they believe their own press clippings too much?

Siena's non-league schedule certainly could set the team up for some major struggles. After Boise State and Cornell this week, the Saints play in the Old Spice Classic with such national big shots as Tennessee, Georgetown, Michigan State and Oklahoma

State. Later in December, the Saints visit Big East power Pittsburgh, and there's an early January road trip to defending national champion Kansas. The possibility exists that Siena could lose most, if not all, of those games, which would create a less-than-stellar overall record.

The bigger danger, though, exists within the MAAC itself. Do you think that Loyola, Fairfield, Niagara, Rider and the rest of the league wouldn't love to knock Siena off its pedestal? Believe it when I say there won't be an easy game for the Saints this season.

But if Siena is truly what every national college basketball expert says it is, then the Saints should rise to the occasion, win the MAAC, knock off a couple big-name schools in their non-league schedule and make a glorious run in the NCAA Tournament.

Personally, I just want to see what happens. Fortunately, I have a ringside seat - as does every Capital District sports fan.

So, let's hope that Siena lives up to the hype.

The Bethlehem girls basketball team is going to be one of the top Suburban Council squads again this year. It may just take a little time to show.

Several players are still transitioning from their fall sports to basketball because their teams went deep into the playoffs, which puts the Lady Eagles at a disadvantage as they head toward their season-opening trip to the Lady Dutch Holiday Classic Nov. 28 and 29 in Guilderland.

"There's not a lot of time (to prepare)," said Bethlehem coach Mark Nealon. "With a lot of girls playing other fall sports, we're a little behind some of the other teams."

There's also the question of filling some holes in the roster. Guard Christine Murphy and forward Sara Thompson both graduated, and forward Kiersten Swete is out with a foot injury.

"We're going to miss them, that's for sure," said Nealon. "But some of our girls we have coming back have had a year under their belts, and a couple of players who came up from the JV team for the playoffs last year gained some valuable experience."

Bethlehem does have three key players returning this year - guards Meg Olsen and Taylor Teal, and forward Alex McCullough, who has added a perimeter skill to go along with her abilities near the basket.

"She's developed a very nice outside shot, which we're excited about," said Nealon. "She's expanded her game."

McCullough may see some court time as a guard, since Bethlehem is loaded with

forwards up from last year's junior varsity team including Julie Landrigan, Tracy Koch and Rosie McKee, who made her presence known with a five-point performance in last year's Section II, Class AA semifinal victory over Amsterdam.

"We're going to be big, there's no question about it," said Nealon. "Pretty much every game - gosh, I hope we don't see a team that's bigger than us. If we're smart and aggressive, then we should do well on the (back)boards."

While a lot of attention will be paid to Bethlehem's forwards, Olsen and the other Lady Eagle guards should find some openings for taking shots.

"With Meg, she's silent at times. Sometimes, you don't even realize what she's doing out there," said Nealon. "She'll just go about her business and reach double figures in scoring."

Jaci Oskam, Paula Gadowski and Abby Lawlor will also play

key roles for Bethlehem this season as the Lady Eagles look to make another run at the Class AA title.

"This year, we're going to challenge ourselves (with tough non-league games) so we're prepared for Sectionals, and there won't be any surprises," said Nealon.

The challenges begin next weekend at the Lady Dutch Holiday Classic as Bethlehem plays Big 10 pre-season favorite Bishop Maginn in the opening round Nov. 28 and Section IV's Horseheads Nov. 29. The Lady Eagles open their Suburban Council schedule Dec. 2 against South Division rival Colonie - one of the teams that Nealon said could challenge for the best record in the league.

"Colonie is going to be very good, and so is Averill Park (in the South Division)," said Nealon. "Shen is going to be tough (in the North Division)."
