Grimm to run for G'land supervisor

GOP councilman says he plans to bring 'fairness culture' to town

Republican Town Councilman Mark Grimm announced Friday, May 1, he will seek the position of Guilderland town supervisor in the upcoming November election.

"Open government is our best

hope for positive change," said Grimm in a written statement. "When government becomes more transparent, citizens become more engaged and their collective wisdom and innovation blaze the path for better lives for us all."

Grimm is founder of Mark Grimm Communications, a public speaking training and media relations firm. He is a journalism professor at Siena College, a volunteer producer and host of

Messina to run for supervisor

Incumbent councilman dropped by Dems, vows to open up Town Hall and end partisan rule

After four years of being an outspoken Bethlehem councilman, Independence Party member Sam Messina says he's ready to do the same as the town's supervisor.

Facing off against the well-funded and organized Democratic Party that has rejected him, Messina said he is running to end partisan rule and politics as usual and to allow for a more open and transparent Town Hall

that represents all of Bethlehem — not just Delmar Democrats.

"This here means more to me than just a pin of the Town of Bethlehem," Messina said, pointing to his lapel. "This represents everything I love and care about, and I vowed to serve this town to the best of my abilities. My best is not to just walk away from what I see going on."

Messina had interviewed for his council seat with the Democratic and Independence parties before announcing his intentions for the supervisor position. Democrats opted not to endorse him

400 years of history

Quadricentennial celebrations to dock in Henry Hudson Park this summer and beyond

Like the waters rushing from the melted snow of Mount Marcy down to the New York Harbor, we are reminded this year that the centuries continue to carve away and forever alter the Hudson Valley.

In 1609, change moved up the river, not down, in the form of the Halve Maen, or as we know it today in its Anglicized version — the Half Moon.

In the fall exactly 400 years ago this year, with the wind to his back and sails pushing forward, a man

whose name we have all come to know sailed up a winding river with a curious people along its banks.

And although Henry Hudson wouldn't recognize the landscape of those banks today, or the people along it for that matter, we would certainly recognize the boat that he commanded and those familiar Dutch flags unfurling in the wind.

In recognition of this historic voyage, as well as the discovery of Lake Champlain by French explorer Samuel De Champlain the same year, New York state and its Hudson River neighbors are holding Quadricentennial celebrations throughout the summer and well into the fall.

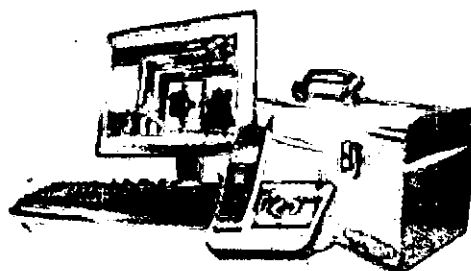
This year also commemorates the 200-year anniversary of Robert Fulton's historic steamboat voyage up the Hudson River from New

Selkirk man gets DWI while riding ATV

Adam J. Prior, 23, of 23 Hobbie Lane, Selkirk, was arrested on April 26, for felony DWI, with prior convictions; felony first-degree aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle;

failure to surrender revoked items, a misdemeanor; and six infractions: an unregistered ATV, failure to display a registration number, illegal operation of a motor vehicle on a highway,

riding an ATV within 100 feet of buildings, inadequate brakes and an insurance violation, having no policy.

Bethlehem Police said they saw Prior diving an ATV south on River Road and witnessed him turn right onto Beaverdam Road and then left onto Hobbie Lane.

Officers activated emergency lights and stopped Prior and identified him with a New York driver's license, according to the arrest report, and officers said they could smell alcohol on his breath while interviewing him.

Police said Prior "had glassy eyes and difficulty with balance," and that he told officers "he drank two beers at a friend's house."

Prior failed three field-sobriety tests and tested positive for alcohol before being taken into custody and transported to the Bethlehem Police Department, the report states.

While in custody, Prior refused to take a chemical test and it was discovered that he had prior DWI convictions, according to police, before he was arraigned before Bethlehem Town Justice Ryan Donovan.

He was sent to the Albany County Correctional Facility in lieu of a \$750 cash bail or a

\$1,500 bond and is scheduled to return to town court on Tuesday, May 19.

The report states his ATV was towed.

Other arrests

• Guilderland Police arrested Karen V. Lewis, 37, of 1220 Kemble St. in Utica on charges of grand larceny in the fourth degree, criminal possession of stolen property greater than \$1,000, both felonies, and conspiracy in the fifth degree, a misdemeanor, on Saturday, April 25, according to police reports.

The report states that Lewis stole \$1,348.92 in merchandise at Macy's in Crossgates Mall. Lewis was stopped after an investigation and was pulled over while driving a white Jeep Cherokee. She allegedly admitted to stealing a bag from Macy's and her vehicle was searched. The report also states she had in her possession additional merchandise from Macy's totaling \$3,649.16 and \$5,232.86 in merchandise from the Banana Republic outlet in Lake George.

She was arraigned later that day and sent to the Albany County Jail, the report states.

Presenting 'Pocahontas'

**St. Thomas Players
bring skill and talent
to school's rendition
of historical classic**

Spring is in the air, flowers are in bloom and the tom-tom drum can be heard coming from St. Thomas the Apostle School, as well as the occasional "Hi-ya-ya-hi-ya."

That can only mean that the St. Thomas Players are warming up for this year's springtime production of "Pocahontas." With a core group of seventh- and eighth-graders who are seasoned theatrical performers, this year's play is expected to be one to remember.

The historical significance of the real-life Pocahontas and John Smith is appropriate during this year's Quadricentennial celebration in Bethlehem, as Smith returned to England from the Virginia Colony in 1609 after being injured in a gunpowder explosion.

Here in 2009, you can listen to the "Wordspinner," played by eighth-grader Mary Drucker, who will open up the show on Friday, May 15, and Saturday, May 16, at 7 p.m. at St. Thomas, located on 42 Adams Place in Delmar.

Alongside Drucker, some of the leads include Nora O'Hanlon as Pocahontas, Nicholas Canovas as Chief Powhatan, Kevin O'Connell as John Smith, and Haley McHugh, who doubles as a student director, and the Spirit of Mother Earth.

Pocahontas is the daughter

to the powerful Algonquin Chief Powhatan. She makes friends with the English settlers in nearby Jamestown, a struggling colony trying to carve its own niche in the wilderness of Virginia.

Pocahontas attempts to help the settlers and goes on to save the life of Captain John Smith when he is condemned to death by the tribe and ultimately brings peace and harmony between the tribe and the colony.

The play is based on the book "Pocahontas" by Vera Morris and will feature music by Scott Deturk. It is being performed at St. Thomas with permission of Pioneer Drama Services.

Janet Griffen, a parent who works with the St. Thomas Players group each year, said the school's adaptation is more history than Disney.

"This is more of an educational version," she said. "All of the students have been working so hard and collaborating together to make this happen. ... It definitely comes together in the end."

The students will be traveling with the school to Washington, D.C., this week before the final dress rehearsals next week before the curtains open.

Most of the students are no strangers to the world of stage and song.

"Since I was 5 years old, I've always wanted to sing and dance," McHugh said of her role in the production. "This one is a lot of fun. We have a much bigger cast this year than we've had before."

However, portraying the princess herself is a leading role that is new to O'Hanlon.

"This is the first time that I've had a role like this," she said.

"But it's been a lot of fun, and we'll be ready for the show."

Canovas, whose height over the other actors serves him well in the role of Chief Powhatan, said he thinks the production is coming together nicely.

"I like how I'm a tough character," he said about his fourth appearance on the stage. "It's a good role to play, and we have a really great cast."

Drucker agreed, saying that she, too, really enjoyed this year's selection of "Pocahontas" over other theatrical possibilities.

And what would any Pocahontas story be without its John Smith, a role O'Connell said he didn't originally try out for but feels comfortable playing.

"I actually tried out for Chief Powhatan, but I really like this role ... I've always had a passion for acting, I was always pretty good at it," said O'Connell, who in seventh grade is putting in his third year on the stage. "I'm still learning my lines right now, but yeah, I think I'm ready."

The play and musical director, as well as the stage and set designer, is Brenda Dwyer, who is also an art teacher at the St. Thomas school, according to Griffin. Dwyer is a veteran director and has produced a number of plays in the community, and it was she who wanted to produce a historically correct version of the life of John Smith, Pocahontas and Jamestown.

Over spring break, a number of students and parents arrived at school with paintbrushes and hammers in hand to help create

the backdrop, scenery and sets, under Dwyer's supervision.

And there to highlight the performances on stage, student Justin Lesser is the resident "spotlight man" for the St. Thomas Players. He said everyone that helped bring the play together would share in the spotlight.

"I think the show is really going to be pretty good this year - actually, I think it's going to be awesome," said Lesser. "Everyone's working really hard on this and coming together to make sure it's a great one."

Guilderland's Camp Nassau a summer tradition

**Facility features newly
renovated playground**

A new playground, zip-line and pickled eggs await campers at Guilderland's Camp Nassau for the upcoming summer season.

The programs are weekly, and run from June 29 through Sept. 4, said Brian Robinson, the camp's director.

The camp began 55 years ago

and was started by the Becker family. The YMCA began leasing the camp 12 years ago, and eventually bought it six years ago.

"We get three generations of people who come and visit," Robinson said. "It's a great tradition, and it's been around in the Capital District for a long time."

Camp Nassau is situated on 33 acres and is located on Route 155 between Guilderland and Voorheesville.

It averages close to 375 campers each week, and employs about 65 staff members during its 10-week run.

"It's great to sign up early, but we will take kids throughout the summer," Robinson said.

The camp serves children from throughout the Capital District, but many are from Guilderland.

Robinson said families who might not be able to afford vacations because of the slumping

economy could still send their children to camp for a week to give them the "summer experience."

On the site there are a number of activities, including a newly renovated \$40,000 playground, a pool, soccer and softball fields, volleyball and tennis courts and a 150-foot zip line.

Robinson said camp includes a number of team-building exercises, including trust falls and competitive events, "adventure games" and archery, Robinson said.

The playground was built largely with donations from Subway Development.

"We let the campers on their own. We kind of let them grow up a bit," he said.

He said the camp also features science and nature activities like rocketry and airplane making, and bird watching and hiking. There are arts and crafts, as well.

The camp is for children between the ages of 3 and 15.

For some people enrolling in camp is a childcare issue. Many working parents find the camp to be a "safe and healthy" place for their children to spend time while they work, Robinson said.

"Keeping everybody entertained and safe" is a challenge he said, since the campers are always looking to push the limits. He said the most rewarding experience, though, is watching the campers and counselors bond and become a team.

He also said knowing that the campers had a good experience is just as important.

"We have campers here for six or seven years and come back to be counselors," he said.

Ryan Stevens, 19, a Colonie resident who attends Hudson Valley Community College, started out as a camper in seventh grade, and is now in his fourth year as a counselor.

"It was a good experience from a friend making standpoint," Stevens said. "I met a lot of good people."

He said being a counselor at the camp is a rewarding experience, especially when a shy new camper

sheds his or her apprehension as the summer goes on.

"The best part is the satisfaction of knowing you changed someone's life," he said. "You want these kids to have a good time and come back."

Each week at Camp Nassau has a theme, like the Olympics, carnival week and under-the-sea week. For carnival week the campers invent games and music, a dunk tank and other staples are brought in to enhance the atmosphere.

"For a lot of kids for one week this is their summer - this is their big deal," Robinson said.

Robinson said one event that gets the campers excited is counselor "Fear Factor," inspired by the popular reality television show that features people eating uncommon foods. On the show, the contestants often eat bugs and other creepy-crawlers, but at Camp Nassau everything is purchased from the supermarket.

"You'd be surprised what you can find in there," he said. He said pickled eggs have been traditionally unpopular among some of the counselors.

I am not sure that I am all that crazy about Mother's Day. Perhaps as a child I enjoyed the excitement of creating and presenting a homemade gift to my mother. But once I grew older, and especially once I became an adult, it became increasingly stressful to find an appropriate token of my affection.

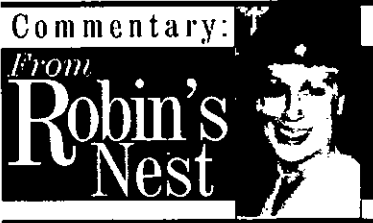
What do you buy for a mom who expresses no wants, who frets over whatever amount of money you spend on her and who doesn't particularly covet jewelry?

Normally I would make a homemade card and write a poem for my mother. Usually the poems would rhyme. In recent years, I'd have my daughter make the card. She's a great artist and has a talent for creating acrostics. Who can resist something made by a young grandchild?

Cards are easy to make or buy. Gifts are much harder.

Two years ago, my sister, brother and I bought my mother a locket. The idea for the locket came from my father. It was my job to put in the photos.

Whose faces should go inside this locket for my mother, I pondered. Should it be her children? My dad? Mom and Dad? Mom and the grandchildren?



I decided to use the five grandchildren. The three granddaughters went on one side, the two grandsons on the other. I fiddled with the size of various digital photos in order to get appropriate-sized faces to fit into the frames of the heart-shaped locket.

My mom loved the locket. A few months later, though, she said she couldn't make out my daughter, Rachel, among the grandchildren's photographs in the locket. I figured her eyesight was worsening. Yet when I took the necklace into the light, I saw to my horror that my daughter's face had disappeared. Her hair remained visible, but there was no face. Over time, the other grandchildren began to fade.

Perhaps the images would not have faded if we had printed the tiny faces on photograph paper instead of plain white. I intended to replace the fading photos, but somehow never got around to it.

Last Mother's Day, I didn't give my mother anything more than a card. In the morning I set out to write her a poem. I fired

up my laptop and typed, "Today is Mother's Day and it is almost 9 a.m., and we are meeting for brunch at 11 a.m., and I am not showered and I don't know what to give my mother."

This put me in a foul mood. How, with 12 months' notice, could I have not had the time to figure out what to get my wonderful mother for Mother's Day? Perhaps I could defend myself by pointing out that my mom just had a birthday in April, and that coming up with two gifts in two consecutive months for the woman who wants nothing is just too overwhelming a task.

What were my options early on a Sunday morning? I seriously considered scooting over to the drug store to find an item to wrap up and present to Mom. But then I imagined that I would end up late to brunch after wandering

aimlessly through the aisles trying to find something suitable. I decided to stick with just the card.

I remember arriving at my brother's house. My parents had arrived just minutes before. We were out on the driveway. Unbeknownst to any of us kids, my dad had kindly given my mother's health aide the afternoon off to spend with her own family. The aide had driven them to my brother's house, but dad was explaining that they would need one of us to take them back home.

I believe the first thing I said was, "Not it." Jeff, Rachel and I had plans to meet another family at the Tulip Festival in Washington Park. It was a beautiful, sunny day and I was looking forward to relaxing on a blanket and listening to the bands play. After all, it was Mother's Day, and I, too, was a mom. My sister also announced that she had afternoon plans.

I admit it, I felt put out. That's right, I went from feeling guilty for not having a present for my mother to feeling put out. Then I felt both guilty and pathetic. We hadn't even gone inside to begin brunch, yet we were already arguing about who would help the guest of honor get home.

I clearly remember standing in that driveway on that sunny morning, looking at my parents, my mom with serious mobility problems, my dad toting his oxygen tank. I suddenly wondered how I could have

been so selfish. I quickly told my father, "Don't worry, if you need Jeff and I to get you and Mom home, we'll take care of it." And then I dashed into the house.

Why had I been so quick to say, "Not it?" Why hadn't I simply replied, "Not a problem, one of us will get you home" instead of making my parents feel like a burden?

In the end, my brother ended up driving my parents back home. My sister and I both reasoned that it was only fair since he is the only non-mother among the siblings. I was able to leave brunch and proceed to the Tulip Festival without any detours.

A few months later, my mother died suddenly. I had seen her the day before, but only for a short visit. Again, I was rushing off to sit out in the sun. What is it with me and the sun? Do I think I'm a tomato plant?

Part of me is hoping it will rain on Mother's Day this year. It would serve me right for all the times I skipped off to be outdoors instead of spending more time with my mother. And rain or shine, I will be paying a visit to the cemetery. My mother, of course, would think me ridiculous. She only went out "weather permitting."

I no longer have to fret over what to get my mother. Why did I make myself crazy about the gifts anyway? She didn't care about material things. She loved simply being surrounded by her family.

I have the locket now. I wish that I had replaced the fading photographs so my mother could have enjoyed them more before she herself faded from our lives.

As Mother's Day approaches, I try to maintain a positive outlook amidst my feelings of grief and loss. All that my mother wanted was for everyone to be happy. Don't work too hard, she would say. Go enjoy yourself, take time to relax.

I really should listen to my mother. So, see you at the Tulip Festival, weather permitting.

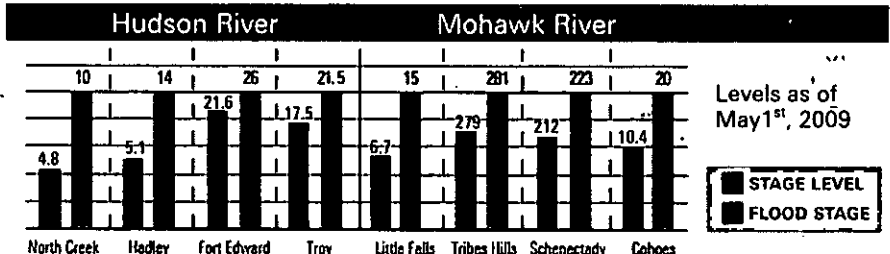

Bomb threat empties Bethlehem Middle School

District officials and police say they are taking incident 'very seriously'

The Bethlehem Middle School was evacuated last week because of a bomb threat, but the school was cleared by police and no suspicious devices were found.

District spokesman Matt Leon said a note that indicated a bomb was in the middle school was found inside of a bathroom just before 2 p.m. on Wednesday, April 29. "We immediately called police, and they went through the school," Leon said. "About an hour later, before 3, the school was cleared by police and the buses began

running again."

Bethlehem police Lt. Thomas Heffernan said he couldn't release the contents of the note that was found, but he did say, "It made reference to a bomb."

"There have been no arrests made at this point," Heffernan said. "Our school resource officer will be following up on this."

Leon said the school has not taken any disciplinary actions against any students at this time.

Students were held outside while police conducted a bomb sweep of the building and its facilities. As a result, buses were detained and ran off schedule that afternoon.

Some teachers and staff went in with police and a State Police K-9 unit to help identify anything

suspicious.

The Bethlehem Police Department has officers who are trained and assigned to the Albany County hazardous material teams.

"We receive training like most other police departments," said Heffernan.

Emergency crews were on standby in case there was an explosion or injuries at the middle school, according to Heffernan, who added that the police usually get a couple of bomb threats at the school in any given year.

"It appears that we get a least one a year. It's not uncommon for it to happen once or more a year," he said. "It usually turns out to be a prank."

District officials sent out notices to parents through an

e-mail alert after the incident occurred to inform them of the situation and warn them that some children may be arriving home late. Some buses ran more than 20 minutes behind schedule because the note was found so close to the end of the school day.

The district wrote on its Web site that it is a Class E felony for anyone to make a false bomb threat against a New York state school. Heffernan said it would also be a Class D felony for falsely reporting an incident. Police and district officials are

urging anyone with information about who might be responsible to contact either the Bethlehem Police Department at 439-9973, or a school administrator.

"I would encourage parents to speak with their kids, and if they have heard anything to come talk to us about it," Heffernan said. "Maybe the kids see it as a prank, but it ties up a lot of resources ... and it's an interruption for the school."

Heffernan concluded that the police and the school district would be taking the incident "very seriously."

Pearls before swine

Chalk up another victim of the swine flu epidemic in America: responsible journalism.

Last week, millions of Americans caught swine flu fever — no, not the actual swine flu; that's affected only about a thousand people worldwide, or about .00000001 of the world's population. We're talking about something far worse: swine flu media hype.

As the first cases of the uber-flu were reported, national and metropolitan news outlets strained to get whatever angle they could on their pages and their airtime to make it pertinent to their audience. By the middle of the week, those same outlets were running with stories that contained such loaded phrases as "confirmed suspected cases" and "potential cases" of the swine flu. Reporting that there are "potential cases" of the swine flu in the Capital District is the same as reporting that our homes are potential fires or that our cars are potential fatal accidents. It's not exactly untrue, but it's sure as hell irresponsible.

Around the middle of the week, the media fires were stoked by the swine flu's (by now called the H1N1 virus thanks to the pork lobby), ascendancy to "pandemic" status. Never mind that this strain of the flu has mostly mild symptoms, a very low mortality rate and has claimed only one life on American soil — public health officials gave "pandemania" some credence.

To most major news outlets the flu isn't a pandemic, it's a celebrity — a celebrity who by its nature has a short media lifespan, so it needs to be exploited more fervently than the usual suspects.

Now the phase of media cannibalism has begun. We are now at the point where media outlets are reporting on the results of the hype they've created, or on the hype itself. Expect this coverage to last longer than your standard case of swine flu.

Providing you're not a member of the public who wishes to be forewarned and informed of a potential health risk without a lot of hyperbole or reactionary embellishment, it's a win-win, really.

In the pages of *The Spotlight* you are reading, you will find exactly one news article regarding the swine flu. It does not contain the phrases "confirmed suspected" or "possible cases." It does, however, convey the news to you that the local international airport is taking precautions to ensure safe travel in light of swine flu concerns.

That's the news. No hype, no mania. Just the news, as local as you're going to find it. That's what we do here.

Election was special in wrong way

Although millions across the country are suffering in this faltering economy, April was a particularly bad month for those employed as assemblymen in New York's 110th District.

Yes, predictions were rampant that James Tedisco's three-decade political career would come to an unexpected close on Friday, April 24, after he conceded to Scott Murphy in the 20th Congressional District special election. He gave up the minority leadership for (or because of) his House bid, and while the party faithful say they expect Tedisco to keep on trucking, only time will tell if Tedisco can back away from the spotlight and go back to the rank-and-file.

Normally a sucker for press coverage, Tedisco didn't return my calls after the concession, which seems to be the case at other media outlets. His assistant told me things were hectic around the office, what with the moving and all.

Well, c'est la vie, Jim. I can respect wanting to take something of a breather after the campaign (I feel like one myself). After all, it was a gritty, messy and jarringly fast experience, followed by a painfully slow legal battle. Like a night of hard drinking.

And good riddance to it, I say. You see, Campaigning, it was fun for a while, but we're just not that into you. We had our kicks, sure, but I think it's time we go our separate ways until an awkward run-in on the way to the polling booth in November.

Consider \$3.6 million. That's what these two campaigns managed to spend in about two months. That's an Enron-style spending spree. And at the end of the day, what did it really buy, other than the annoyance of folks who don't even vote in

the 20th? Thanks to TV ads, I know Murphy must have an enormous dining table and Tedisco prefers to have his sleeves rolled up when he's near stacks of lumber.

It's probably a good thing that this was an abridged campaign, at least from a financial standpoint.

In the 2008 races for the House and Senate, candidates spent nearly \$1.4 billion nationwide. The presidential campaign (which lasted about two years) had a nearly \$1.6 billion price tag. Nowadays, when figures of trillions of dollars are tossed about like so many pink slips, that might not seem like a lot, but it's real money.

Here in the Capital District, the CDTA is using stimulus money to build a new bus garage in Saratoga Springs for \$245,000. Rotterdam wants to build a new water tower for \$2 million, towns along the Hudson need clean drinking water during an EPA dredging operation and speaking frankly, the potholes on my street could swallow a man whole. Then there're the dozens of not-for-profit groups all over the area that help our neighbors in need who are struggling from a dearth of donations.

These are real problems with real solutions that would provide tangible benefits to tens of thousands.

You might see what I'm getting at. There's a lot of need out there, and a lot of good could be done with the money that's spent on 30-second television spots (and that doesn't only go for politics). Unfortunately, a shiny and often-seen image is a necessity for any serious political contender these days. That image generally has little or nothing to do with the politician's views, qualifications or competence.

It would be heart stopping — not to mention encouraging — to see candidates give even half of the money they raise to a worthy cause that actually produces a benefit. That headline would catch my attention. That campaign ad might even interest me in voting for the candidate in question.

But this special election was far more than a shining example of the rapidity of the election process — it was an unshakable monument to the ability of politicians to take any piece of information and fit it to their own needs.

As anyone who hails from the left will proudly declare, voters in the 20th chose a Democrat for the third time in a row, even

though the district has a 70,000-voter Republican advantage.

With Kirsten Gillibrand, "going blue" could be considered flukes propagated by a scandal and a great year for Dems, respectively, but with Murphy, the GOP is pointing the finger at President Obama's lofty approval ratings. Dems, of course, are saying the victory over the well-known Tedisco is a bellwether for their national agenda.

It's easy to view the election as a report card for the larger issues, especially considering the importance of events occurring on the national level. But I don't think that many voters were sitting down with the national agenda of either party before going to the polls, or considering a seating chart of the House floor. They were examining the candidates.

That might seem like a foregone conclusion, but with the two major parties squaring off for a large-scale fight of dominance and survival, it deserves vocalization.

Of course, it's also worth noting that Murphy took just about every plank of his platform and page of his playbook from the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and won, while Tedisco ended up unsuccessfully trying to distance himself from national Republican groups and lost.

The GOP might have a point when it postulates that Murphy is riding on Obama's coattails, but they should be worried about it nonetheless. After all, the youngsters of today are far less likely to be receptive to the tenets of the far right (statistically speaking). Democratic rule has been short-lived in decades past, but with the Old Guard faithful aging, the slow rise of the donkey tide may be at hand.

As it is with America's newest fear phrase—swine flu—it is certain that going to pieces over every sound bite fired across the bow of consciousness by the HMS Mass Media is not the most logical way to navigate the waters of life. Such is it with this past special election. I can't deduce the mindset of every voter, but many of the ones I talked to were not swayed by campaign ads, partisanship and canned statements from Washington leadership. If they're in the majority, the result's small margin paints a much different picture than the one being popularized.

Next time we revisit the roaring 20th, it will be your old-fashioned midterm election, without the glamour, novelty and attention of the special race.

But we can all agree that this election was special. Let's not do it again, shall we?

I'm often heard saying that local government is a team sport, not an individual sport.

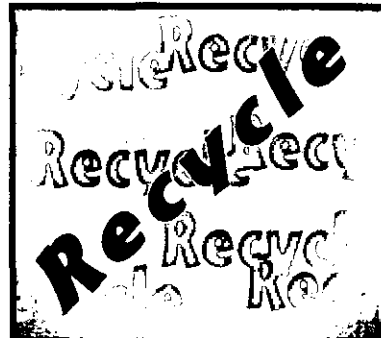

Nelligan launches town campaign

Proposes eight-year limits on town officials

Matt Nelligan launched his campaign for Guilderland Town Board at a fundraising event at his home, and said he plans to push for eight-year term limits for all town officials if elected.

The Guilderland Republican and former teacher said close to 100 supporters attended the fundraiser, and he laid out some of his plans for his campaign.

"I think that the behavior and the lack of action on issues in town that people care about is [unacceptable]," Nelligan told *The Spotlight* on Thursday, April 30. "As a whole we're not seeing a government that's accomplishing much."

He said Democrats are quick to blame Republicans for the town's problem, and vice-versa. He said the buying of Web sites with other official's names, and blocking e-mails, is prohibiting progress.

"What? Are we in kindergarten?" Nelligan said. "What we need is some adult supervision."

He said he will work toward creating a relationship with other board members, and wants to hold a positive campaign.

He said he will push for an eight-year term limit for all

town employees if elected. He said he supports the measure at all levels of government, but especially at the town level.

"I think we should start at home," Nelligan said. "There's no question we can do it."

Nelligan said, if elected, he will limit his own tenure to eight years, even if the proposition is not passed by the town.

"We cannot continue to send the same old people back to sit in seats of power in Town Hall and expect a different result," he said in a written statement.

Guilderland Democratic Chairman Dave Bosworth said he favors a system where the voters have the power to choose who they would like to see in office.

"Generally speaking, I'm in favor of the electoral process," Bosworth said. "It's really up to the people to decide. It's not just tenure, it's performance."

Bosworth said the discussion of term limits is a "two-sided issue" that merits debate, but Guilderland should not preempt the county and state governments in imposing the limits, stating doing so would be "disingenuous."

"I don't think it's something that should be handled out-of-hand or casually," Bosworth said.

Patricia Slavick, one of the two board members up for election, and an eight-year member of the board, said the experience

gained from serving is valuable, and the relationships that a person develops are important to serving the town.

"I don't see why [term limits] should be there," Slavick said. "To me, experience is a very big thing."

Nelligan likened the state of current town board meetings to the "Jerry Springer Show," and said, "petty political posturing ... has not lowered one family's tax assessment. It hasn't built 1 inch of new side walk, and it certainly hasn't helped us solve our traffic problem."

He said he plans to run a positive and independent-minded campaign.

"I'm not a cookie cutter Republican in any way, shape or form," he said.

Nelligan is seeking the endorsement of the Conservative and Independence parties as well, he said.

"I'm a principled person even when it hasn't always helped me to be," Nelligan added.

Nelligan was formerly a teacher at Guilderland high school before being involuntarily transferred to the middle school as the result of a "culture climate inquiry."

He later took a position working for the New York state Senate.

Guilderland Republican chair Ted Danz said Nelligan has the unanimous support of the town's Republican Party.

Guilderland names high school principal

Tenured teachers honored at board meeting

The Guilderland Board of Education recognized hard work and dedication of district staffers and announced the appointment of a principal at Guilderland High School at the Tuesday, April 28, meeting.

At the meeting, the district also presented its annual tenure class, made up of elementary, middle and high school teachers, to the community.

Brian McCann, longtime assistant and acting principal of Guilderland High School has been appointed on a three-year probationary principal, according to information from the district.

McCann will begin serving as principal July 1. His salary will start at \$118,275, according to information provided by the district.

Superintendent John McGuire praised McCann for "stabling a concerned and troubled staff," in previous months.

"It bodes very, very well for your tenure as principal," he said.

McGuire said he was pleased the board unanimously approved McCann. He said the building is in "great shape" under McCann.

"The climate and culture of our high school has never been better," McGuire said.

McCann was appointed as acting principal after Michael

Paolino, the former principal of the high school was placed on administrative leave in August. Paolino was hired as interim principal at Doyle Middle School in Troy in January, on a per-diem basis ending June 30.

McCann accepted the position and made some brief comments to the board and to the community.

"I hope it's no secret what high regard I've always held this district in," McCann said. "Thank you. I am humbled ... and honored."

He said he is thankful for the support of the board, staff and the high school leadership team.

"Being asked to take over in the middle of a difficult time last August ... was a set of circumstances where people, including myself, needed to step up and respond," said McCann.

He said he believed the school is now headed in the right direction.

"We're past that; we're moving past that. We're on a roll and we have to stay on a roll," he said. "We don't plan on standing still now. We'll keep moving

forward."

He acknowledged the tough economic times the district faces but said the school will make the most out of everything it is given.

Board of Education President Richard Weisz said the district

was honored by McCann's hard work.

"This is really a happy moment for us," he added.

The district also held its annual tenure ceremony at the meeting, which featured refreshments, and teachers dressed up with corsages and boutonnieres.

"When I last saw many of you, and you were in your classrooms, I was impressed," McGuire said.

He said it was a great experience and a "treat" to see them in action.

He said receiving tenure is a "sacred trust" and "an act of faith on the part of colleagues." The district recognized 30 teachers at the meeting.

"This is only the beginning. This will be one of the many accomplishments you'll experience here," said Lin Severance, the district's assistant superintendent for human resources.

Jamie Affronti, an eighth-grade social studies teacher at Farnsworth Middle School said she was thrilled to receive the honor of tenure.

"It is probably, beside getting my master's [degree], my biggest accomplishment yet," said Affronti.

Affronti has been teaching at Farnsworth Middle School for three years.

County clerk decides to run for re-election

Three seats are up for vote in Albany this November

Albany County Clerk Tom Clingan said he will be seeking re-election for his sixth full term, and he has met with the Conservative, Independent and Democratic parties looking for their support.

Clingan, a Democrat, has served for more than 20 years as clerk – the longest tenure in 260 years – and said he is looking forward to another campaign.

"It's a serious responsibility. I'm geared up and ready to go," he said.

Clingan said his department was the first in the county to have its own Web site and has recently constructed a brand new Hall of Records. Last year, the office took in more than \$30 million.

He said opponents in previous elections have primarily come from the Town of Colonie, and that is an area where he has had to do extra campaigning.

"I've always had to run a strong door-to-door campaign," he said. "I'm really looking forward to it."

Clingan, along with Sheriff James Campbell and coroner Paul Marra, both Democrats, have seats that are up for election this year, according to the Albany County Board of Elections.

Democratic Party Chairman Daniel McCoy said all three candidates have received the unanimous support of the candidate review committee. The full committee will vote on May 27, he said.

The Republican Party has not yet announced candidates to oppose the incumbents. Dan Farrell, the executive director for the Albany County Republican Committee, said a decision is expected within the next few weeks.

"We're going to announce them on a time frame that works best for our candidates," Farrell said.

He said some "leading candidates have emerged," but more interviews will be conducted before a final decision is made.

Helen Desfosses, an associate professor of public administration and police at the University at Albany, said the parties have a fairly regular schedule leading up to the September primaries.

"They want to select a slate of candidates to give them a chance before the summer," she said.

She said they try to find candidates in time for the summer so they can go collect the needed signatures and begin campaigning, but they do not want to announce their slates too early, since voters are not yet paying attention.

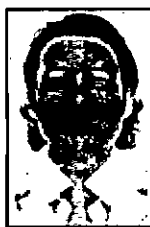
She said the parties are not usually concerned with making their announcements before or after the other party, and generally are not concerned with stealing each other's spotlight.

"The two parties run pretty independently of each other already," Desfosses said.

She added that a common tactic by candidates is to interview for party nominations they are not expecting to make connections with party leaders or advance their political careers.

Airport addresses flu concerns

Staffers instructed to boost cleanliness throughout terminal

While it has not gone as far as to enact its emergency response plan, the Albany International Airport has taken measures to help travelers protect themselves from the H1N1 virus, also known as swine flu.

The virus, which carries symptoms identical to the common flu, such as sneezing, coughing, upset stomach and headaches, gained international attention after more than 100 deaths were reported as a result of the flu in Mexico. Nearly 100 cases of the flu were reported in New York by Monday, May 4, with that number expected to increase.

On Wednesday, April 29, the World Health Organization, the coordinating health authority for the United Nations, declared the virus pandemic alert at a level 5, one below the highest risk level, warning those who think they may have come in contact with the virus to take serious precautions to avoid spreading it.

"Influenza pandemics must be taken seriously precisely because of their capacity to spread rapidly to every country in the world," said WHO Director Margaret Chan in a statement.

The airport has begun taking precautions, beginning with the monitoring of travelers by airport emergency medical technicians.

"Right now our EMTs patrol the terminal from time to time, and they are being vigilant in terms of trying to identify any people who may show flu-like symptoms," said Doug Myers, director of public affairs for the Albany International Airport Authority. "So far, we have not come across anyone [showing signs]."

Another precaution the airport

is taking is the cleaning of high-traffic areas, Myers said.

"Our housekeeping staff has been instructed as to how to deal with high-traffic areas where people are touching, such as hand rails, chair rails and food court areas so that they're paying particular attention to these areas," said Myers.

So that travelers can take cleanliness into their own hands, Myers said, the airport has also installed several anti-bacterial hand gel dispensers throughout the terminal.

For the past week, Myers said, the airport has displayed posters showing airport-goers how to properly cough and sneeze in a manner that avoids spreading their bodily fluids to others.

While the airport has already undergone all of these measures, Myers said, that this is not the emergency plan.

"We have a plan if an incident should occur," Myers said, explaining that the plan is part of the airport's emergency plan, which is confidential.

"[The plan], outlines the specific actions and reactions that would take place at the airport, in the event of a major outbreak, or in the event of an aircraft that may have to be quarantined or passengers that may have to be quarantined. And that is all I will say about it," said Myers.

What Myers did say was that the biggest example of a case in which the emergency plan would have to be implemented is if the airport was notified of a possible contamination of an aircraft bound for Albany. The contamination warranting the emergency plan would have to also be more than simply one person aboard the plane infected with H1N1.

If this incident did occur, Myers also said the airport would have to act in conjunction with Albany County and other governing bodies before taking action.

Myers said such an incident has never occurred at the Albany International Airport and he hopes that one never does.

Library board to look at proposed budget

Next Monday, May 11, the Bethlehem Public Library board meeting will begin at 6 p.m. to accommodate a public presentation of the proposed 2009-10 library budget. The meeting will also be an opportunity to find out more about Project PARC.

Safe access, egress and parking are a growing concern as our library sees steadily increasing use. Project PARC (Parking, Access, Renewal, Community) is a plan to enhance and improve library parking. The project will be partially financed with a state grant in the amount of \$42,796. Additional funds will come from budgeted capital project funds and fundraising efforts. There will be no impact on the 2009-10 tax levy, which will not increase this year.

•Parking

High-profile events like our author and concert series, as well as an increasing number of community group meetings, overstretch available parking. Reconfiguring the existing parking area and developing the Borthwick property will provide a 35 percent increase in parking spaces, including two additional spaces for disabled patrons.

•Access

Our one all-purpose entry-exit driveway is neither safe nor adequate. The bend in the drive



creates a blind spot, delivery trucks often impede traffic and bicyclists and pedestrians are vulnerable. To meet these safety concerns, plans call for separate entry and exit drives, clear sight lines, better pedestrian crossings, additional parking for disabled patrons, a more convenient book drop and shelter for people waiting for a ride.

•Renewal

As its name implies, Project PARC has both practical and aesthetic components. The library's adjacent property will be upgraded and made functional. In addition, retention of trees and green areas will enhance our grounds. Project PARC renews the library's commitment to environmentally sound property development in service to our patrons.

•Community

These uncertain economic times accentuate the need for libraries. When the economy is down, library use goes up. Job and college searches, academic and professional exam materials, financial and environmental information, public computer use and instruction, DVDs, books, CDs and periodicals, cultural and educational programs for all ages — all these opportunities are available free of charge at the library. Project PARC is another way for us to enhance and improve library service at a time of increased demand.

More Project PARC details and site drawings will be available at next Monday's board meeting. The annual budget vote will take place on Tuesday, May 19, from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. at Bethlehem Central High School. The proposed budget is published in the May/June issue of the library newsletter and on the library Web site.

Entertainment *in the* Spotlight

After Sonny Ochs lost her brother, she worried his music would be lost, too.

Phil Ochs was 35 when he committed suicide in 1976. A mainstay in the folk music scene, in his short life, he wrote more than 100 songs and recorded eight albums.

"Some of his songs are absolutely stunning," Sonny said recently from her home in Middleburgh.

Not wanting to see those songs fall silent, Sonny embraced the idea a friend of Phil's pitched to have a Phil Ochs Song Night. In 1983, the first song night was held in Greenwich Village. It was a testament to Ochs' popularity that when Sonny left around midnight, there was still a line of musicians waiting for a chance to perform one of Ochs' songs.

Encouraged by the overwhelming response, Sonny and others decided to turn Phil Ochs Song Night into an annual event. For the past few years, it's been held at The Linda, WAMC's performing arts studio on Central Avenue in Albany. This year's Phil Ochs Song Night is Saturday, May 9, at 8 p.m. at the Linda.

Although Sonny and others share some stories about Phil during the event, she stressed that it's not really meant as a memorial or tribute to her brother. The focus, she said, is on the music.

"He died too soon," she said. "I don't want to see the music die, too."

There are a core group of musicians who have helped Sonny with that goal since Phil Ochs Song Night was launched. Regular participants include

Reggie and Kim Harris, fellow Middleburgh residents who told Sonny years ago that they'd love to take part in a song night.

She asked them which Phil song they'd want to perform.

"They said, 'We don't know any,'" she said with a laugh. "They grew up on Motown."

The Harris found a whole new world of music in folk, which Sonny calls "the most community-oriented form of music." Folk music actually stems from community news stories that were told through song, she said.

Her brother, incidentally, once harbored aspirations to be a journalist. When the student paper at Ohio State University rejected some of his stories, deeming them too radical, he started his own underground paper, *The World*. Eventually, he took on a new kind of writing where he could indulge his strong political views: songwriting.

He dropped out of Ohio State and moved to New York City, where he immersed himself in the Greenwich Village folk music scene. He also organized and took part in a number of protests and demonstrations; when the Vietnam War ended, he staged a "War is Over" rally in Central Park. Pete Seeger was among the performers, and Ochs and Joan Baez sang a duet of "There but for the Fortune."

Ochs made fans with his principles as well as his music. Magpie, the husband-and-wife team of Greg Artzner and Terry Leonino, are regular performers at Phil Ochs night who are "worshippers of his music and what he stood for," Sonny said.

Similarly, the Harris were soon intimately familiar with Ochs' work. They not only recorded Ochs' "In the Heat of the Summer," they made it the title track of their first CD.

Several other artists have recorded Ochs' songs over the years, too, including John Denver, Gordon Lightfoot and Judy Collins. The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland had

At the song nights, performers used to just get up and perform an Ochs song. But Sonny found the format was growing old — she has toured the country putting on Phil

Ochs Song Nights, and she thought it might be fun to hear a little more variety. So, in recent years, performers have sung one Ochs song and one original piece. Sonny sees it as a nice way to ensure that not only her brother's music stays alive, but folk music itself.

"It's always a treat to hear the new songs," she said.

In the early years, it was common for the audience to be mostly made up of "gray-haired, old lefties," she said. But nowadays, there are often some younger faces in the crowd. Sonny remembers attending a show in Toronto not long ago and seeing some high-school age kids watching intently.

"They were hanging on every word," she said.

And that, Sonny said, is the whole purpose behind Phil Ochs Song

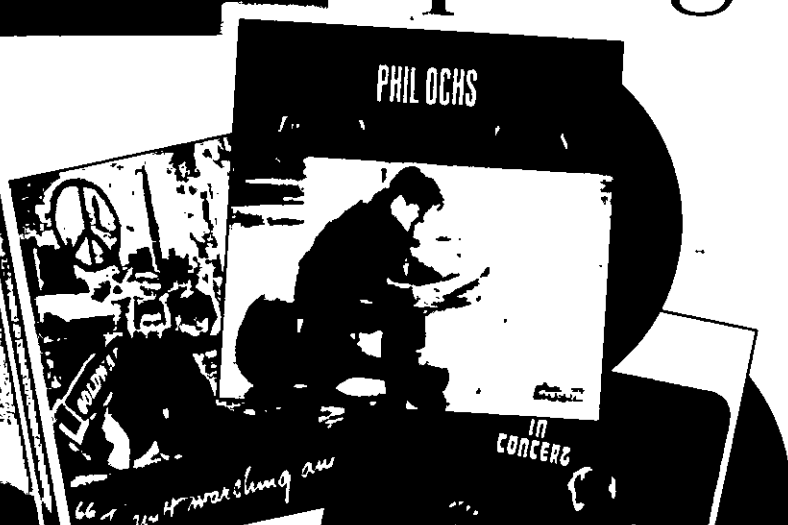
Night — to keep exposing people to Phil's work.

"I'm doing this to see kids like that," she said. "My job is to make sure the music doesn't die. I know he'd love that."

Alliance of Music and Dance on Phil's behalf.

The award, she said, makes this year's song night a little extra special.

the Siena Alumni Connection radio program, and author of "Everyone Can Be A Dynamic Speaker."

He said his platforms include "clear and understandable" budgets, the use of technology in the permit process, a revision of hours to "better serve working people's schedules," involving the town board on budget changes and making video recordings of town meetings available for online viewing.

He has been a critic of Town Supervisor Ken Runion's administration on a number of issues, including the budget process, hiring practices and property assessment.

"The town leadership scandals underscore the need for more transparent government," Grimm said in a written statement. "With just one election, we have a great opportunity to make history by changing a culture that has existed for far too long."

Dave Bosworth, Democratic committee chairman, said a full-committee meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 4, after *The Spotlight* goes to press.

"I'm sure Mr. Grimm's announcement will galvanize many members of our community," Bosworth said. "It should be a very lively campaign."

Runion, who has not yet announced whether he will seek

re-election, was invited to the meeting to discuss the matter.

"I'm still weighing my options," Runion said, adding that he planned to attend the Monday meeting. "I'm not ready to make a decision one way or the other."

Albany County Democratic Party Chair Daniel McCoy said the county is behind Runion "100 percent."

Grimm said, if elected, he would work to implement a "fairness culture" that would "prohibit no-bid contracts to family members of town elected officials, apply consistency to supervisor's zoning decisions, fix problems with questionable assessments, and simplify the assessment appeal process."

"Guiderland has one of the strongest municipal work forces in the area," said Grimm. "Imagine what we could accomplish with a new supervisor who leads with inspiration and a strong work ethic."

Grimm has the backing of the Guiderland Republican Party, said Ted Danz, the party's chairman.

Danz said the committee has unanimously voted to support Grimm, along with Dave Fraterrigo for town board and Chris Aldrich for town justice.

The candidates for town positions will be announcing their candidacies individually, rather than as a slate, Danz said.

"I'm actually letting them speak for themselves," Danz added.

this year after cross endorsing him in 2005, and the Independence Party has yet to propose a formal slate for the fall elections.

He said he doesn't like what he sees happening within town government. However, he said, it's what he doesn't see that bothers him even more and was the impetus behind his decision to run for town supervisor.

Political decisions are taking precedence over "what's best for Bethlehem," according to Messina, who said he has tried to effect a change through his role as a councilman by speaking out against the political appointment process.

"I have gone out of my way to extend the olive branch many times and sought compromise and speak about issues I think are important, but there needs to be a fundamental change, and if I continue on the board as a member I can't change anything," he said. "Everyone just points and says, 'It's only a few appointments.' But it's much more than that... it's an issue of control and poor governance."

Citing an April 15 *Spotlight* article in his official announcement of his run for the supervisor position, Messina took issue with reasons given by Bethlehem Democratic Chairman Matt Clyne about why the party did not endorse Messina for a re-election bid to his council seat.

"When Chairman Clyne states publicly that 'I personally got tired of Sam Messina's grandstanding. He wasn't able to harmonize his views with other board members,' it's time for Bethlehem residents to tell Chairman Clyne and Vice Chairman [Jack] Cunningham that they want balance and representation from their elected officials, not back-room partisan politics," the release states.

Messina also said in his release that he plans to revert to the ways of former supervisor Theresa Egan.

"I was proud to serve with Teri Egan because I believe in and share her values and principles of open, inclusive, non-partisan and competent government leadership," he states. "I intend to bring back those principles and values that made Bethlehem a special place and lead our town government, as a team, to achieve outstanding service and management accomplishments."

Cunningham announced at the beginning of March that he would seek another two-year term as supervisor. This campaign will constitute Cunningham's first re-election bid after handily winning in 2007. Before that he had been appointed to replace Egan, who took a job with the state Department of Transportation. Prior to that, Cunningham served as an Albany County legislator.

Messina was quick to note Cunningham's ties to the town's Democratic Party, and called him a product of political patronage.

"He and Matt Clyne are cut from exactly the same political cloth," Messina told *The*

Spotlight in his first formal interview as supervisor candidate. "Jack and I have a basic philosophical difference. He loves politics and has told me so. I'm all for good politics, but I am for good governance first."

Messina writes in his release that politics should not come before competent leadership.

"Since the appointment and election of Supervisor Cunningham, Bethlehem town government has been under the arrogant, intolerant and partisan political thumbs of Bethlehem Democratic Chairman Matthew Clyne and Vice Chairman Jack Cunningham. Back-room politics has trumped good government," he said.

Looking to represent "all of the people of Bethlehem," Messina said he is seeking the endorsements of all political parties in town, including his own Independence Party.

Bethlehem's new Independence Party chairman is Mark Jordan, who is chief of staff to Assemblyman Tim Gordon, the state's only Independence Party assemblyman. Jordan is seeking a Town Board seat but has not held an official campaign kickoff event.

Democrats originally endorsed Jordan over Messina for councilman, but now Messina will have to re-interview with all parties as a supervisor contender.

With the Democrats already lending their endorsement to Cunningham, Messina said he is doubtful that Clyne would sign off on a petition for Messina to force a primary for the endorsement.

Messina said he disagrees with Cunningham's assessment that "people only care about their leaves being picked up" and that residents want more from town government.

"What the people expect from the town is safety, plowed roads, keeping the streets clean and other quality of life issues,"

said Messina. "What they want is good government, openness and respect."

Knowing that he could easily be outspent during the campaign, Messina said he will begin walking "home to home" and speaking with

residents about his campaign immediately.

He has built a platform for his campaign around seven fundamental principles: become a sustainable community; create a more open and accessible government; institute government best practices; introduce a new leadership philosophy; focus on existing business; evaluate new opportunities; and demonstrate true non-partisan government and politics.

As a 35-year resident of Bethlehem, Messina and his wife, Jan, live in Delmar and have three children. He holds a master's degree in public administration and a bachelor's degree in business and economics.

Messina lists a number of committees and community activities he has been involved with on his campaign literature, including Bethlehem Senior Projects; Bethlehem IDA; Bethlehem Youth Court; Samaritan Suicide Prevention; DWI Impact Panels; organ and tissue donation; Albany Medical Center Chaplaincy; and Slingerlands Methodist Church.

He said he is creating an official campaign Web site called www.messinaforsupervisor.com.

Messina said he believes his stance on appointments and other platforms will resonate with voters come November.

"I have no problem with some political appointments, but let's be reasonable. If you have eight spots, don't do all eight like that," said Messina. "I'm on the right side of these issues, and people will see that during the campaign."

RCS music students earn high marks

The Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk music department earned its largest number of top ratings in 16 years at the recent festival held by the New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA).

- Senior High Band - Level 4 Gold With Distinction
- Seventh and Eighth Grade Band - Level 2 Silver

The NYSSMA rating system has been in effect since 1993. This is the first time in 16 years the high school chorus and band received a "Gold with Distinction" rating in the same year.

A "Gold with Distinction" rating is awarded to those groups that qualify for a "Gold" rating while having achieved a standard of performance deemed exceptional in all three selections.

GAW founders visit area

Grandmothers Against the War calls on president to keep campaign promises

Igniting an international peace movement just isn't enough for some — not as long as there is still a war going on, that is.

Some founding members of Grandmothers Against the War were in the Capital District Monday and Tuesday, April 27 and 28, talking about effective strategies to bring tragedies to light and help spread the word on their anti-war movement.

Joan Wile, an award-winning singer/ASCAP songwriter, and Barbara Walker, who has 50 years in international settings, including the Institute of International Education and the United Nations, both made the trek from the their downstate homes to give guest lectures and media interviews in the area.

The women's visit was organized locally by Grannies for Peace, a project of Women Against War. Delmar resident Maud Easter, who is a part of the local group, said she was thrilled to hear their stories.

"We were very excited to have them," she said. "Their stories are so wonderful and they were the inspiration for our own Grannies for Peace here."

They spoke at the First Unitarian Universalist Society of Albany as well as in classes at Siena College and the School of Social Welfare at the University at Albany during their trip.

Wile describes how her desperation in 2003 about ending the war in Iraq led to the inspiration that a grandmother's action might attract attention.

"I said to myself, I've got to do something," Wile told *The Spotlight* about standing on Fifth Avenue in Manhattan with anti-war buttons and protest signs. "I thought some-

one was going to punch us at first ... but we sat there, two old ladies, and the next week there were three of us, then four, then five."

By the month's end, there were 18 members standing, she said, members who also came to found the "Granny Peace Brigade," an organization that is still highly active in protesting the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Walker said she got involved after seeing a woman wearing some anti-war buttons.

"One day I got on a bus on Fifth Avenue and a woman with a button got on that said, 'Where's the outrage?'" Walker said. "And I said, 'Yes, where is the outrage?'"

The woman happened to be Wile.

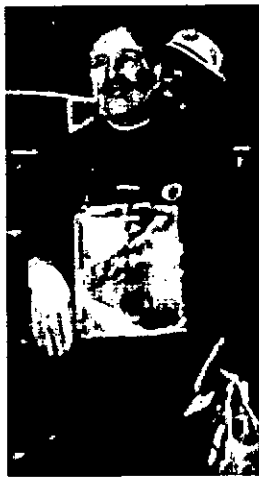
The group garnered national attention after 18 grannies were arrested in 2005 protesting at a Times Square recruiting station. It quickly caught the eye of the international press.

Wile and Walker said they were handcuffed and escorted to the police station but were later acquitted of obstructing the entryway of the recruiting station after a six-day trial. News footage taken of the event clearly showed that the group was not obstructing entry to the building.

Wile's musical talent has lent itself to her anti-war endeavors.

She has an extensive background in recording studios and cabarets and has written seven musicals, five of which were produced off and "off-off" Broadway. She also wrote a song for Barack Obama's presidential campaign.

Wile is author of "Grandmoth-

ers Against the War: Getting Off Our Fannies and Standing Up for Peace," which was published in May 2008 by Citadel Press.

The group's efforts are now focusing on Obama's planned troop increase in Afghanistan as he withdraws troops from Iraq.

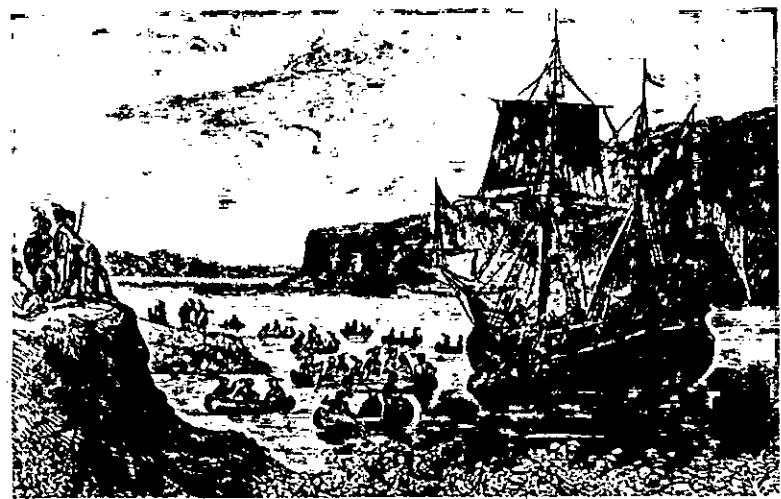
"I loved Obama, I gave my limited income to his campaign and still love him, but I am disappointed," Wile said. "Although we love him, we have to tell him how we feel."

Walker said military pressure might have influenced the president's decision for Afghanistan.

"I wonder how much of this had to do with pressure from the military," she said. "They have this budget ... and I think they want to continue it."

Easter said locally, her group works with school districts like Bethlehem's to inform parents they can "opt out" of having a military recruiter talk with their sons or daughters. For information, visit www.wcmanagainstarwar.org. Wile's and Walker's visit was also co-sponsored by Bethlehem Neighbors for Peace, the Saratoga Peace Alliance, Upper Hudson Peace Action and several other local groups.

Wile ended her interview with some simple advice: "Listen to your granny."

York City to Albany.

"I think sometimes people forget that Bethlehem has eight or nine miles of Hudson River shoreline," said Bethlehem Historian Susan Leath, who also serves on the Quadricentennial Committee. "The river's been an integral part of Bethlehem's history."

Being a primarily agricultural area for most of its existence since European colonization, the river became a vital access route to New York City and its harbor.

Albany County Legislator Tom Cotrofelf, D-Delmar, chairs the town's Quadricentennial Committee and said despite the lack of state funds, residents and local businesses have pulled together to make events possible.

"I'm very proud of the town, the committee and the community on this because we just received a certificate of recognition from [first lady] Michelle Paterson that was signed by Gov. [David] Paterson," he said. "It was not only for the number of events we have planned, but also for the quality of events."

Cotrofelf said the certificate is at Bethlehem Town Hall in Delmar.

The town is also raffling off a canvas reprint of the Half Moon and tickets can be bought at the town clerk's office in Town Hall. Handmade Quadricentennial silk ties can also be purchased at the town clerk's office for \$30 each.

Because much of the support for the Quadricentennial celebration is coming from sponsors and individuals, with a premier riverside event at the Henry Hudson Town Park to be held Aug. 16, the town has hired an events coordinator to help bring in sponsorship and raise money for the many events.

In an opinion posted on the town's Web site, Leath writes, "Fishing on the river was an important subsistence activity for early Bethlehem residents and is still enjoyed by many today. Shad, striped bass, eels, sturgeon, and sunfish are some of the catch."

It is a Bethlehem tradition that continues to this day.

The town's parks and recreation department is sponsoring one of the first springtime Quadricentennial events on Saturday, May 9, with a striped bass fishing tournament at the Hendry Hudson Town Park from 6:30 a.m. until 1:30 p.m.

This event is one of many that

will be held on the river to celebrate the Quadricentennial.

Non-fishermen and families are being encouraged to attend the weigh-in, which will be held near the gazebo between 12:30 and 1:30 p.m., and a fishing license is not required to participate in the tournament itself this year.

Boy Scout Troop No. 81 will serve hot dogs and refreshments and the event is open to the public. Tournament forms can be found on the town's Web site at www.townofbethlehem.org/pages/parks/parkHenryHudson.asp. Residents can call the parks and recreation department for more information at 439-4955, option 3.

Today, the Hudson River continues to be an important transportation route and recreational outlet, according to Leath. The Port of Albany, on land formerly a part of Bethlehem, ships everything from generators to cocoa beans.

Other May Quadricentennial events include a historical presentation at the Bethlehem Library and the annual Memorial Day parade, which will have a 400-year theme.

Fiber artist Estelle Kessler Yarsinsky will talk about her art quilt, "Adriaen and Mahican," which depicts the life and work of Adriaen van der Donck, who from 1641 to 1645 managed the van Rensselaer lands that became the present-day cities of Albany and Rensselaer.

The presentation will be on Tuesday, May 19, at 7 p.m. at the Bethlehem Public Library.

Councilman Kyle Kotary, who is the town's liaison to the Quadricentennial Committee, said the events are a tribute to the late Parker Mathusa, who started planning for the 400-year anniversary before he died late last year.

Kotary said that Mathusa wanted to bring back a "River Fest" style event that used to occur at the park and figured the Quadricentennial would be the spark to bring it back.





"I would personally like to thank Tom Cotrofelf for his leadership and all of the community members who helped put this together," Kotary said. "In particular, I would like to recognize the leadership of Parker Mathusa. This summer is part of Parker's legacy to this community, and we hope to pull off a series of events that are worthy of his vision."

"The town has been very involved in trying to move forward on Quadricentennial events," Cotrofelf said. "I would say we have a very aggressive agenda of events."

The Spotlight will run the second of a nine-part historical series next week, May 13, on the hamlet of Delmar. Each monthly feature will focus on a different hamlet and will include that month's Quadricentennial Calendar of Events.

Third annual Captain Moshier race gets biggest turnout yet

The community came out en masse to run, walk and even hand cycle across the streets of Delmar to prove they have not forgotten one of their own at the third annual Capt. Timothy J. Moshier race.

This was biggest turnout to date for organizers, as more than double the registrants showed their support than when the event began three years ago. According to the race totals provided by ARE Events Productions, there were 392 finishers — 194 male and 198 female.

"This is just amazing, I can't believe the turnout, there was well over 500 signed up last night for today's race," said Moshier at the race. "The weather held and everyone's having a great time."

The event continues to grow each year for the run/walk honors that honors Timothy Moshier who died while serving in Iraq on April 1, 2006, when the Apache helicopter he was flying was shot down.

He was a Bethlehem graduate and the father of a newborn daughter. His widow, Katie Moshier, helps organize the event each year and watches their daughter Natalie run in the Tot-Trot portion of the race.

Taking first place overall, Thomas O'Grady, 23, of Colonie, ran across the Bethlehem Middle School finish line at 16 minutes and 18 seconds, setting a pace of 5:15. The runners up were Matt Gokey, 35, of Delmar, at 17 minutes and 11 seconds, and Andrew Macmillan, 28, of Rochester at 17 minutes and 12 seconds.

The first place female runner was Katie Hodge of Delmar, who finished 22nd overall and came in at 20 minutes and 20 seconds and setting a pace of 6 minutes and 33 seconds. Melissa Brinkman of Cohoes came in second for the females at 21:21 and Roxanne Wegman came in at third with 21:26.

A first for "Tim's Race," as it has become to be known throughout the community, happened when 37-year-old James Chaney of Albany hand-cycled across the finish line with 18 minutes and 5 seconds on the clock. Hand cycles were allowed this year for the first time to allow for more community involvement, something that

is very important to Moshier as she is a spokeswoman for STRIDE Adaptive Sports. The not-for-profit organization is a multidisciplinary, educational organization specializing in therapeutic recreation-related services for individuals with disabilities.

"This is the first year we had hand cyclist participate in the event," said Moshier after the race. "It worked out well and it allows disabled veterans and other disabled community members to really be a part of Tim's race."

Kevin Miller, 26, of Johnstown was the second cyclist to cross the finish line at 20 minutes and 53 seconds, setting his pace at 6:44.

The annual race also includes a kid's race for five to 11 year olds and a "Tot Trot" for kids under five to run 26.2 yards, which like the kid's race is also a free event.

Bethlehem Councilman Mark Hennessey was seen in the mix of runners and the breezy May morning.

"I cut six minutes off my times from last year, so I'm the happiest man in the world right now," Hennessey said en route to the water station.

After the race ended, Moshier thanked those in attendance and hand out first, second and third place winners for each of the categories.

"I've got four of my Wounded Warriors here and they finished the course both figuratively and literally and I wanted to thank them," Moshier said over the loud speaker at the middle school. "I also want to thank the Patriot Guard Riders for being here with us today."

The Patriot Guard Riders are an organization that acts as a motorcycle motorcade at the funerals of fallen soldiers around the nation and sometimes act as an impromptu color guard as memorial events such as Tim's Race.

There were several age group and team winners for this year's race that were honored by Moshier after the race ended.

The 0-14 age group winners on the male's side included Evan Denniag, 14; David D. Sullivan; and Nathan Cohen. The female winners for the youngest age bracket were Sydney Shaw, 12; Briana Swete, 14; and Tara Teal, 14.

The Bethlehem girls lacrosse team picked up a big Suburban Council victory by edging Shaker 8-7 last Wednesday in Latham.

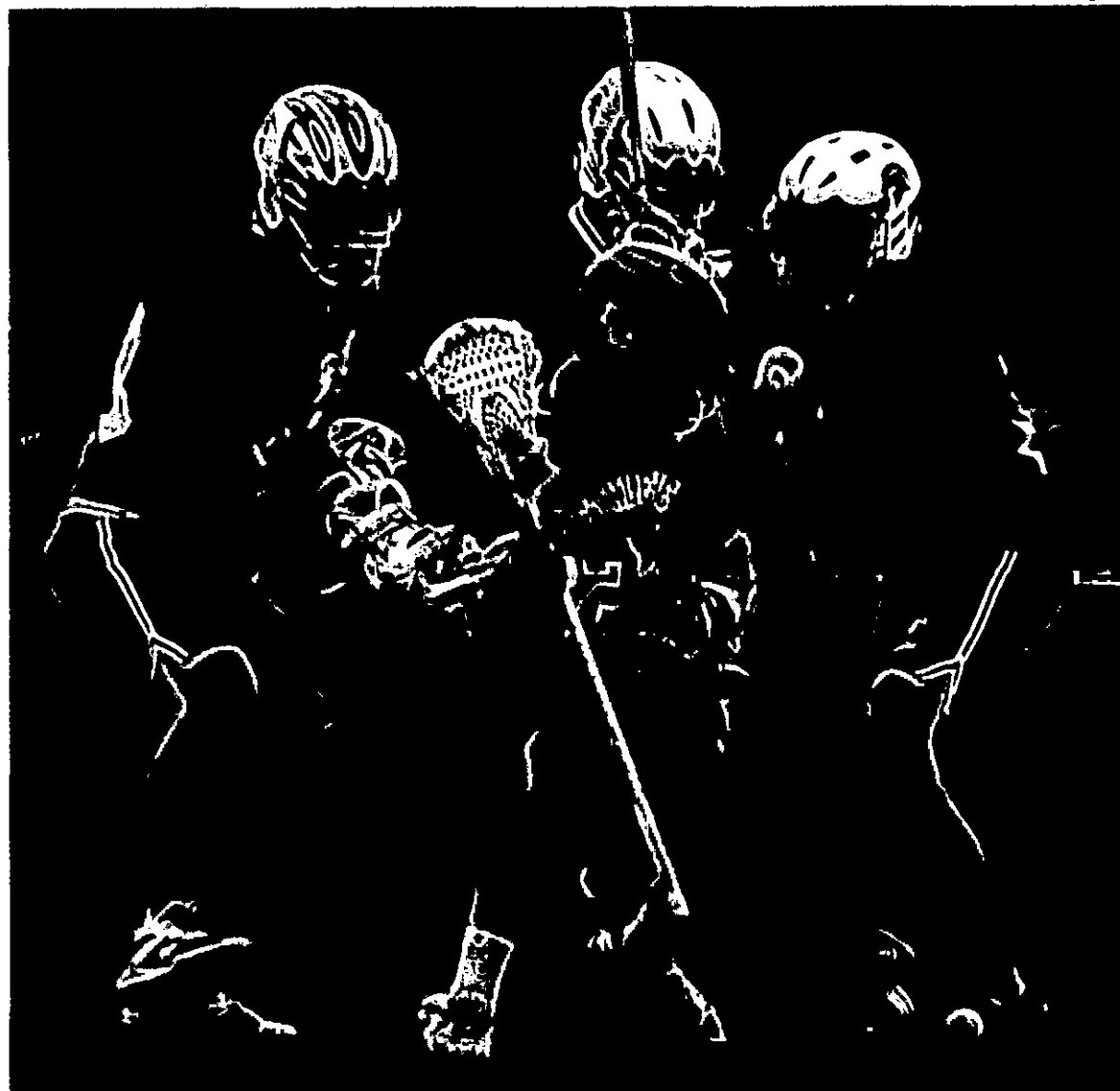
