### Delmar church concert raises \$2,100 for youth camp program

Over 200 people came out to take in an afternoon of music and help a good cause Sunday, April 10, at the 17th Annual Voices of Hope Benefit Concert at the First United Methodist Church in Delmar.

Like in past years, the concert collected donations for Interfaith Partnership for the Homeless, and attendees pitched in about \$2,100. That approaches last year's take, but with about half the number of people in attendance.

One difference is that the money will go specifically to Interfaith's Summer Youth Program.

"We were really excited to be raising funds for those kids," said Nan Rabinow, office manager at United Methodist. "This concert always benefited their general program. We learned about the summer program for the kids a year ago, and just wanted to benefit those kids in some way."

Interfaith's summer camp runs for 10 weeks and gives youth from the Arbor Hill and Sheri-

## Redlich to leave the area

### G'land Town Board member will likely leave term unfinished

Guilderland Councilman Warren Redlich has already announced he won't be seeking a second term, but now it looks like his time on the Town Board will be ending before the year is out.

Redlich will be moving to Florida as soon as he sells his house, which he hopes will be sometime over the summer, he said. Although he cited a number of reasons for the decision, the biggest was one most every New Yorker has dealt with recently.

"The primary motivation really is winter," he said. "You're basically trapped in the house for three months unless you're a skier."

Supervisor Ken Runion said he wouldn't expect the Town Board to appoint someone to fill out the remainder of Redlich's term should he leave early.

## School decides on McDonald memorial

### Clarksville community comes together to brainstorm ways to honor educator

Principal Dorothy McDonald has always cast an endearing shadow over the Clarksville Elementary community.

Now her memory will be doing just that for years to come, when a mature tree is planted near the school's play-

ground dedicated to the deceased educator. A public ceremony will be on May 13 when the tree will be planted. McDonald's family will also be at a school assembly honoring her memory.

"The children are preparing a song about how to make a difference to sing for the family," said Clarksville Principal Melanie Painter.

The decision on how to remember McDonald was made at a community meeting held at the school. Though it preceded a PTA meeting it was open to

# Census will change district lines

**Marginal public interest in the process; number of seats will be unchanged**

With the results of the 2010 Census in hand, lawmakers in Albany County are midway into an effort to redraw the lines of the County Legislature's 39 districts. At stake is residents' representation for the next decade, but after a number of public meetings, it's not clear if anyone cares.

There have been six public meetings on the redistricting at venues around the county, most of which have been sparsely attended. One in Voorheesville drew no residents, and legislators adjourned after a short procedural discussion, according to county records.

Legislator Shawn Morse, D-Cohoes, chairman of the seven-member Redistricting Commission, said this issue just might not have any traction with even the most involved of voters. He also posited residents have nothing to lose and are thus apathetic about the process.

"I think people only turn out when they're unsatisfied. I think it's always been like that," Morse said. "When they have a reason to be heard, people will be heard."

Although the census data will be used to calculate the county sales tax distribution to municipalities in Albany County, that's based strictly on population and the commission will have no control over that formula. What the body is researching is redrawing the lines of the Legislature's districts so they all have about 7,800 people in them, or 1/39th of the county's 304,204 residents (a 3.3 percent growth from the last Census).

This fact alone would require some shuffling, but some areas of the county have seen greater population shifts than others. (See the adjoining map.)

Even in the areas where things are about right, the redistricting presents a rare opportunity to improve representation, said Legislator Thomas Cotrofeld, D-Delmar, and a member of the commission. That could mean making sure districts don't overlap rural and more densely populated areas, so people and their concerns can be more fully represented on the Legislature.


"At the Coeymans meeting, we heard that they'd like to see that district [36] make up pretty much all of Coeymans," he said. "We're going to see if we can logically manage the district so that it works."

Cotrofeld's own district, 34, is considered to be very near the ideal size, but the adjoining 35th district, represented by Charles Dawson, D-Glenmont, has greatly increased in population. It is likely the boundaries in this area will move.

The Town of Bethlehem had a relatively large population shift, growing 7 percent since the 2000 census to 33,656 people.

Unlike efforts on the Congressional level, the countywide redistricting will not

mean a change in the number of seats on the Legislature. Of the meager public comment, some has centered on the size of this body, and restructuring county government completely is something of a perennial topic for those arguing for lower taxes and efficiencies.

Legislators draw an annual salary of \$21,752, and party leaders and the chairman get more.

But changing the composition of the Legislature is not the commission's goal, said Morse.

"At this point, it would be up to the County Legislature to decide if they want to reduce

the size of government," which would require a charter change and likely take many months, he said.

Morse added he usually hears the size complaint from those with an ax to grind.

"There are those who say that. Unfortunately they don't say it with any sort of data, they just say it to say it," he said. "It seems more politically motivated to me than anything."

The commission wants to have a recommendation prepared for the Legislature in the first week of May, if at all possible. The first day candidates for office can start gathering petition signatures

to appear on the ballot is June 7, so to have the new boundaries used in the upcoming race the Legislature must ratify any changes before then.

That's important, said Cotrofeld, "so people who are running this year don't have to go out and run again next year in a slightly different district."

The commission's schedule calls for eight public meetings to be held in all. The last will be on April 28 at the county offices on State Street in Albany, at a time to be announced. Check albanycounty.com for the time.



# Fun in any direction

Hop in the car and experience someplace new this spring

A spring family outing can really make the days seem brighter, but sometimes the familiar local sights and sounds don't feel like enough of a getaway. When you're craving a new trip or activity, set aside a day, a weekend or even just a couple of hours, and hit the road. Some great destinations lie within an hour and a half of Albany, which means they're manageable even with rising gas prices and busy schedules. Most sites offer a variety of activities to appeal to adults and kids of all ages, so there are no sibling wars in the backseat over the day's plans.

## EAST

Bennington, Vt., is about an hour's drive from Albany and affords the opportunity to explore a new state with plenty to do. Though Vermont is famous for fall foliage and has a reputation as a winter ski paradise, Bennington offers fun for the springtime crowd as well.

"Bennington is known for history," said PJ DeVito, coordinator of Visitor Services at the Bennington Chamber of Commerce. "We have the Bennington Battle Monument, which you can take an elevator up into and get a wonderful view; we also have the Bennington Museum, which also has Revolutionary War material."

The monument, which opens in mid-April each year, is a favorite Bennington landmark that affords visitors unparalleled views of the surrounding countryside. Bennington is also home to Old First Church, the

oldest church in Vermont, where Robert Frost was buried. The town has three covered bridges, as well as the Covered Bridge Museum, which is part of the larger Bennington Center for the Arts.

"The covered bridges are probably the thing that most tourists ask about when they come to our welcome center," said DeVito.

At Bennington Potters, one of the oldest continually producing pottery facilities in the country, visitors can take a self-guided tour. Downtown Bennington is the site of the annual Mayfest celebration, an arts celebration that takes place on Memorial Day weekend each year.

Bennington is also a hub for outdoor enthusiasts. Just a few miles out of town is where the Long Trail and Appalachian Trail cross, and there are plenty of short hikes to take advantage of as well.


There are also plenty of

stops to make on the way to or from Vermont. The Berkshire Bird Paradise and Botanical Garden, in Petersburg, N.Y., is a sanctuary for injured or rare birds that opens on Memorial Day Weekend and is home to more than 1,000 birds.

"We have bald eagles, hawks, owls, exotic birds. We also have an extensive array of flowers and plants. It's botanical; we mix the flowers with the birds, and we kind of just give a nice ambiance, a peaceful setting, a nice feeling," said Peter Dubacher, director at the Berkshire Bird Paradise.

Visitors can interact with some of the birds, or just enjoy some time learning about new species. One of the most recent additions is a bald eagle named Mitch, who was rescued by U.S. troops after being shot and injured in Afghanistan.

Nearby Grafton Lake State Park offers 25 miles

## WEST

Cooperstown is the longest haul on this list at an approximate hour and a half drive from Albany, but it's worth the trip. This town is known for the Baseball Hall of Fame, but in addition to the popular shops, restaurants, cultural attractions and lake-related activities, find some time to visit a real-life cider mill. Fly Creek Cider Mill, located just a few miles out of town, is celebrating its 155th year.

"We're just making

cider the old fashioned way," said Bill Michaels, vice president and co-owner of Fly Creek with his wife, Brenda.

But there's much more than just cider-making going on here. Find homemade goodies, including fudge dips, spreads, salsas and cave-aged cheddar cheese; gifts and crafts; and a variety of apple products as well as some animals to feed outside the historic cider mill. While the cider press

# Glenmont man sees another set of DWI charges

Bethlehem Police on Thursday, April 14, at about 9:16 p.m., arrested Albert Gustaf Lindh II, 21, of 1 Concord Road, Glenmont, and charged him with felony aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle, DWI, resisting arrest (a misdemeanor), criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree (a misdemeanor), criminal mischief, failure to comply, unlicensed operation and drinking alcohol in a motor vehicle.

Earlier in the day an off-duty Bethlehem Police officer saw Lindh driving a 2011 Chevrolet CRZ in Glenmont and reported it, knowing Lindh's license to be suspended after an April 7 arrest on DWI charges, according to police reports. A patrol spotted the car in Lindh's driveway but police later observed it backing out with Lindh at the wheel, police said.

Police tried to pull Lindh over but he allegedly did not stop, taking several turns before ending up back at his home, hopping out of the car, running into the house and locking the door.

Officers forced their way into the home and chased Lindh through several rooms to his bedroom, where he locked himself inside and began barricading the door, according to arrest reports. He allegedly told police he had a gun and would kill himself if officers came through the door.

Police began conversing with Lindh and he agreed to come out after about 10 minutes, according to police reports. A later search of his room allegedly revealed Concerta pills, a hyperactivity disorder drug that is a controlled substance. A search of his car allegedly turned up a drinking glass containing an alcoholic beverage in the center console.

Lindh allegedly became combative when placed under arrest and slammed his head into the plexiglass divider of a police car. At the station he slammed his head into the wall of the holding cell and had to be placed in leg shackles, police said. He also allegedly refused to take a breathalyzer test.

Lindh was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail without bail. A

preliminary hearing was set for April 20 and a court date for May 3.

When being transported to jail, Lindh again slammed his head into a police car divider, this time causing a laceration to his head and significant bleeding, according to police. He was transported to Albany Medical Center but refused all treatment. The damage to the plexiglass divider resulted in police filing the criminal mischief charge.

## Other arrests

• Bethlehem Police on Sunday, April 17, at about 12:53 a.m., arrested Brandon Antonio Canty, 23, of 1085 Old State Road, Ravena, and charged him with felony aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle, DWI, driving with no headlights, unlicensed driver and drinking alcohol on a highway.

A police patrol allegedly spotted Canty's 2000 Oldsmobile Bravada driving south on Route 9W in Glenmont without its headlights on. Upon being stopped, police noticed the odor of alcohol on Canty's breath and asked him where he had been. He told police he was driving home from Albany and had consumed one Four Loko about an hour ago, according to arrest reports.

Canty allegedly failed sobriety tests and was placed under arrest. A chemical test allegedly showed his BAC to be 0.12. A records search also showed his license to be suspended, police said. A search of his car allegedly revealed a half-empty can of Four Loko, an empty bottle of Bacardi Rum and an empty bottle of Remy Martin Champagne.

Canty was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail in lieu of \$4,000 bail. A preliminary hearing was scheduled for April 19 and a court date was set for May 17.

• Bethlehem Police on Wednesday, April 13, at about 12:30 p.m., arrested Wesley John Fletcher Jr., 30, of 2 Starr Road, Ravena, and charged him with DWI-Drugs, having a broken front windshield and having inadequate exhaust on his car.

Police stopped Fletcher's 1992 Chevrolet S-10 pickup truck in the parking lot of Casa Mia Restaurant on Route 9W in Glenmont and upon speaking with him caught a "pungent odor of marijuana" coming from his car.

Fletcher allegedly told police he had smoked marijuana about an hour ago and exhibited several signs of being under the influence of the drug. Police said the driver's side seat of the car had burnt marijuana seeds and a package of Zig-Zag rolling papers sitting on it.

Fletcher was placed under arrest and consented to having his blood drawn by county paramedics for a chemical test. He was given a court date of May 3 and released on tickets.

• Saratoga County sheriff's deputies arrested Julie A. Downes, 20, of Gunderland, and Katelyn M. Knaupp, 20, of Schenectady, on April 12 and charged them with aggravated harassment in the second degree. The arrests stemmed from an incident in the Town of Wilton where it is alleged Downes and Knaupp threatened another person via Facebook, according to police reports.

The men were arraigned in Rotterdam Town Court and remanded to Schenectady County Jail. Glasco and Riley were held on \$50,000 bail and Amos was held on \$30,000. They were scheduled to reappear in Rotterdam Court on Monday, April 18.



### No brain freeze yet on brain drain

Guilderland Councilman Warren Redlich is engaging in that one act that seems, more so than anything else, to provide a sense of solidarity between Upstate New Yorkers: he is leaving.

From Charles Wiff's story: Redlich will be moving to Florida as soon as he sells his house, which he hopes will be sometime over the summer, he said. Although he cited a number of reasons for the decision, the biggest, he said, was the harsh New York winter.

As Wiff points out, Redlich will not have to pay income taxes in Florida. Though he doesn't quite come right out and say it, we at *The Spotlight* have to think that this has something to do with the pending move.

Redlich will be best known to most as one of the two dissenting voices on the Guilderland Town Board, but the man has built a successful law practice, taken runs at Congress and in 2010, ran for governor on the Libertarian Party ticket. While it's true that the 2010 gubernatorial race fielded a menagerie of silly and somewhat disheartening characters, Redlich was largely a well-thought and spoken candidate whose strength in his convictions was evident, regardless of whether or not you agreed with him.


The point is that, once again, Upstate New York has proven to be a less than hospitable place for those who wish to succeed.

Redlich's decision to move comes about a week after a panel at Cornell University said Upstate's problem isn't just a matter of graduates leaving and never coming back, it's also the fact that we can't get anyone to move here. According to Associate Professor John Sipple, "The rate in which we lose people from New York state, 18 to 50 year olds, is actually pretty average for the country. And yet the rate in which we have people moving back into the state what we call in-migration, we are virtually dead last in the country."

Sipple and the rest of the panel cited not only a lack of jobs in the private sector, but also a lack of communication in advertising the jobs we do have.

Listen, we're not holding up Warren Redlich's departure as the end-all and be-all of "brain drain" woes, nor do we expect that Redlich will become the poster child for the neglect of Upstate New York (It didn't happen when Tom Golisano left, either), but we do wish to point out that the brain drain still exists, and that intelligent and constructive New Yorkers are still leaving for the same reasons they did a few years ago.

Domestic violence happens...much more than we like to think.

However, there are many more families who need help; and many, many more youth who need the knowledge and skills to avoid unhealthy and violent relationships in order to end domestic violence in Saratoga County.

## Recession no time to cut food stamps

In the Christian-Judeo faiths, Jubilee means it's time to redistribute the wealth to get our country back on its feet. Not more tax cuts for the rich. A living wage job for all and a strong safety net for those who can't work. Instead of trillions to bail out the banks and Wall Street speculators, our tax dollars should be used to rebuild Main Street and invest in green technology to revitalize our economy.

As President Franklin Roosevelt reminded us, "The test of our progress is not whether we add more to the abundance of those who have much; it is whether we provide enough for those who have too little."

# The search is on, and fruitful

## Delmar man organizes day of remembrance for D-Day vets

For soldiers, it was The Longest Day. For Delmar resident Frank DeSorbo, it's spawning The Longest Search.

Since January, DeSorbo's been on a mission that's proving to be a daunting task. He's been trying to identify area D-Day survivors and hold a ceremony honoring them. Booking a time and location for the event was the easy part. Locating veterans has been the challenge.

After months of sending letters, doing research, making phone calls and coordinating with VFWs, American Legion posts and historians, DeSorbo has thus far managed to track down seven D-Day veterans who have agreed to meet on Saturday, June 4, two days before the 67th anniversary of the invasion at Normandy, at the Holiday Inn Express at Latham.

The event will be open to the public, especially

other veterans and their families. Speeches, food and simple socialization time are planned. DeSorbo also wants to publish a sort of "Where are They Now?" type of publication that will hopefully become a running newsletter.

"I'm hoping that this is going to be more than a one-year event," DeSorbo said.

The retired educator and superintendent of the Catskill Central School District came to the idea early this year after reading in the paper about a ceremony commemorating the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. His relationship with one D-Day vet and Selkirk resident Angelo Picarrazzi got him thinking.

"It just struck me that they've never done it, or I've never heard about it," he said. "I just started to run with it."

Since then, DeSorbo started the D-Day

Revisited Association, a non-profit, and has spent plenty of time researching and casting a wide net for veterans. His efforts have brought him across

brothers both served in Vietnam, and he's had a definite interest in military and American history. Meeting Picarrazzi four years ago was partly responsible for inspiring his drive to get the ceremony organized.

Another part is preserving the story of veterans for future generations.

"I can't turn the clock back, but I wish I had done this 10 years ago," DeSorbo said.

So far DeSorbo has contacted the following survivors: Leo Hoge, of Saratoga Springs (Navy); Philip Myers, of Saratoga Springs (Army, 101st Airborne); Ken Bailey, of Voorheesville (Army, 4th Cavalry); Harold Williams, of Chatham (Army); Frank Smith, of Hudson Falls (Coast Guard); Ralph Avery, of Claverack (Army); and Angelo Picarrazzi, of Selkirk (Army, 9th Infantry).

There are also plans to honor deceased veterans at the June ceremony.

Earlier this year, Little's

wife accepted the Medal of Freedom on her husband's behalf from President Barack Obama. It's the U.S.'s highest civilian honor.

Libby Little will be out of the country for Friday's ceremony, but friends and other members of the Little family are expected to be on hand. The ceremony will be held at 11 a.m. and will be open to the public.

# Cooking up a future

## County inmates learn culinary skills from Mallozzi's chef

A new program at the Schenectady County Correctional Facility teaches inmates culinary job skills in an effort to avoid recidivism.

"Our hope is it provides some skills for the inmates when they leave the facility and ... helps them attain some employment and put them on a path that is a positive one," said County Sheriff Dominic Dagostino. "It is in the hopes that this on track to keep them away from this place."

County officials organized the program in partnership with

Mallozzi's, local restaurant and catering operators, to offer an eight-week culinary course to train soon-departing inmates to be better prepared to enter the job market and start on a better path to avoid future crime convictions. The first two classes, separated by gender, held a graduation ceremony recently for the eight male and five female students, who are all low-level, non-violent inmates. Mallozzi's Corporate Executive Chef Ryan Huneau taught the program, which met twice a week for two hours with each group. The course is scheduled to be offered twice a year, with one in the spring and one in the fall.

Dagostino said, so far, the program has been successful. A culinary

program was selected because the job market is better in that field compared to others.

In coming up with the program, the focus was on gaining life skills for reentry and keeping costs down.

"Everything is volunteer and at no cost to the taxpayers for the program," said Dagostino. "We are very, very conscious of budgetary constraints ... and in this kind of climate, we have been tasked out to do more with less, and we are actively pursuing any kind of creative ideas at a cost that is very minimal or none at all."

Completing the program makes the inmates a minimum security risk, when

# While you were away ....

**Cunningham speaks out on the decision to remove, then reinstate, him – all in his absence**

There has been a lot of discussion recently about the commissioner of the Department of Public Works job in Colonie, but none of it has come from the commissioner himself, Jack Cunningham.

"I'm somewhat frustrated," Cunningham said. "You read the headlines, and it creates the appearance that I, as an individual, have done something wrong here."

For much of the debate over whether he could legally hold the commissioner's position, Cunningham was vacationing in Italy. During that time, the New York State Supreme Court Appellate Court Division on March 31 ruled his appointment was invalid because he is not a resident of the Town of Colonie.

Following the decision, the town removed Cunningham from his post, but then passed a resolution on April 7 that changed the residency requirement to include all of Albany County and modified the job description to be primarily administrative as opposed to engineering. At that meeting, the town reappointed Cunningham as the commissioner of DPW.

"I was disappointed," Cunningham said of the Appellate Court decision. "I work hard at this job and the decision has nothing to do with the performance of the works, it only has to do with establishing my residency. So it was kind of disappointing that it becomes the issue."

Cunningham, former town supervisor of Bethlehem, said during that tenure, he hired a commissioner of Public Works who did not live within

the town. He said he doesn't believe the residency of the commissioner's position has any real bearing on the taxpayers in the town.

"I think as long as the person you have in the job is dedicated to doing the work and is committed to serving the taxpayers in the community they're working in, then the residency is really not a major issue here," he said. "My commitment is to try and do the best job I can for the taxpayers of Colonie."

Cunningham said the town was initially confident it would prevail in the appellate court decision. He said the reason for that confidence was based on the fact that a new issue was raised by complainant Theodore Ricketts in the case that was not heard in the Supreme Court. He and his attorneys said the residency requirement fell under the Public Officers Law, which states the public officer must live in town they are serving.

"That was what we went into the Appellate Division and argued they can't appeal on this because they never reserved the right to argue it in the first place," he said, adding that the town said they had never been given the right to argue on the law. "That's why we felt very comfortable we would be successful because that is an ongoing standard that

the appellate division has applied across the board."

While Colonie Republicans did win in court on the decision of residency, there was still an issue over the fact that Cunningham was running a department where they felt a lot of engineering decisions would have to be made. Cunningham said he does not make a single engineering decision nor does any engineering work. And with a combination of the town-designated engineers and the engineering firms the town contract out to, there is no need for him to make any engineering decisions.

In Bethlehem, Cunningham said when he looked for a commissioner of Public Works, he wanted someone who was a good administrator and could look at situations from a broader perspective, as opposed to just engineering. When he worked at Key Bank, Cunningham said, he managed programmers, even though he is not one.

Similarly, Cunningham said, Town Supervisor Paula Mahan wanted to appoint a Public Works commissioner who is an administrator as opposed to an engineer.

"When you get a specialty skill like that transfer to become a

manager, it sometimes becomes problematic," he said. "They tend to look at things from a narrower point of view. ... The issue of whether we have an engineer in this position is really not relevant to the position itself."

Cunningham added that there are many other municipalities in New York that have a commissioner of public works that is not an engineer, which makes him wonder why the New York State Society of Professional Engineers isn't focusing on those areas as well.

Cunningham said it isn't just engineers that are involved in making decisions, but a number of people who are commenting on plans. Cunningham said simply asking why an engineer is deciding to do something on a project isn't considered engineering.

"They're not specific to the engineering of the plan," he said. "If you take that to the nth degree, that would mean only an engineer could work with an engineer and that's not even a realistic approach. That would even extend to Paula saying, 'Well Paula can't run this department because she's not an engineer.'"

The reappointment of Cunningham's position was only for the remainder of his current term, which expires in 2012.



won't be in action for a few more months, visitors can still take a look at the antique machinery and watch a video on how it's used in-season. A snack bar features homegrown products and specialties like cider slushes and floats, apple pie sundaes, and "bloomin' apples," as well as standards like sandwiches and ice cream.

The mill hosts the Taste of Fly Creek series, which features tastings and events for different products throughout the summer. From May 7-8, the featured product is maple syrup.

Michaels suggested pairing a stop with either the Baseball Hall of Fame or the Farmer's Museum, or the Fenimore Art Museum.

"That would be an excellent day trip, especially for the Albany area," said Michaels.

On a kid-free excursion, visitors can spend the afternoon following the Cooperstown Beverage Trail. Comprised of Brewery Ommegang, Cooperstown Brewing Company, Fly Creek and Bear Pond Winery, the Beverage Trail offers tours and tastings of everything from beer to hard cider to both regular and fruit wines.

"If you go to all four, we stamp your passport and you get a free glass at the end," said Michaels.

There are even more options for family fun on the way home.

"The best way to come to Cooperstown is along Route 20, which is now a Scenic Byway," said Michaels. "There are so many places along the way to visit, like the Tipi gift store in Cherry Valley, or Howe Caverns; if people want to stop and

do something on the way home, it's all along that corridor. There are views of the Mohawk Valley and the Cherry Valley Hills. There's usually little to no traffic on it, and it's almost four lanes the whole way. Families that are interested in historical buildings can visit Hyde Hall at the North end of Otsego Lake, and of course there are all the lake activities on Otsego Lake available as well."

Visitors can also stop by the Grumpy Buffalo Farm in Richmondville to pick up buffalo products and see a real buffalo herd in person.

## NORTH

Many Capital District residents are familiar with all the fun of summer in Lake George. Spring brings the opportunity for a new twist on a standard day trip and a chance for some fresh air on the Warren County Bike Trail, which connects Lake George and Queensbury.

"It's a beautiful ride, peaceful and quiet and pretty. It's well-marked and user friendly," said Joanne Conley, assistant tourism coordinator for Warren County Tourism. "I'm on it all the time. There's very little of it that's on the road, and the section that is, is by a country club, so there are nice big wide bike lanes. I've been taking my kids on it forever."

This section of the trail is paved and winds through some wilderness, but doesn't get too rugged, making it a good fit for just about anyone who can ride a bike. There are also plenty of incentives for more reluctant bikers along the way.

"I would get my kids out there because there are several ice cream shops along the way, or we would head up to Lake George and bring a picnic," said Conley. "There are so many possibilities."

The Lake George to

Glens Falls section is about 11 miles, and the route includes parking areas and other access points, so shorter trips are an option. If bikes aren't the family favorite, don't fret.

"There are people with strollers, jogging, in-line skating," said Conley. "There's a hill here and there, but it's all manageable."

Information about the Warren County Bike Trail map is available at [visitlakegeorge.com](http://visitlakegeorge.com), or visitors can receive a full size map by calling (800) 365-1050, ext. 5100. Bike rentals are available in Lake George at Beach Road Bait & Tackle (518) 668-4040; [beachroadbait.com](http://beachroadbait.com); and at Inside Edge Ski and Bike Shop, at the Queensbury end of the bike trail. Bikers who aren't satisfied with the 11-mile trip can follow the route as it continues past Queensbury and connects to the Veeder Canal section of the trail. That section is not paved.

"There's so darn much to do here," said Conley. "The Lake George area is an easy drive from the Capital District. You can

be out of the city in 45 minutes in the beautiful Adirondack mountains, on the lake, on the trail or in the amusement park — there's just a wide variety of things to do here."

Prospect Mountain offers breathtaking views of the Lake George area and can be reached by car or by foot, making it an easy addition to the day after a long bike ride. For thrill seekers, the Adirondack Extreme adventure course in Bolton Landing offers rock walls, zip lines, obstacle courses and more.

If in-town fun is on the agenda, stop by Glens Falls. This town boasts not only shopping and dining, but the Hyde Collection and its new roster of kid-friendly events and activities. On the third Sunday of each month from 1-3 p.m. the Collection hosts Discovery Day. The theme changes monthly, but the event includes a family-oriented tour with an arts and crafts session at the end. Family Kits are a new addition at the Hyde House.

"They're interactive, and help families go through the House and have engaging experiences with the kids and the collection," said Erin Coe, director of Curatorial Affairs and Programming at the Hyde Collection.

## SOUTH

An hour drive to the south will leave day trippers with a wealth of unique opportunities in the towns of Hudson and Catskill, including a different take on art, nature and history.

"One of the things I tell people who are considering day or weekend trips that there is a cluster of things to do right near here that all have to do with the Hudson River School," said Elizabeth Jacks, executive director of the Thomas Cole National Historic Site in Catskill. This historic home of Thomas Cole, an influential figure in American landscape painting, has a fun and

unique twist.

"Surrounding these two sites are all the places that [Cole] painted, and we created this map where you can go and find a place where the view looks just like the painting. Even if you know nothing about art, it's cool to look at the views. They look just like the paintings, but you can see the subtle differences, so it's fun to do the comparison," said Jacks.

The site offers guided tours once a month but a detailed map and guidebook, including directions and reproductions of the paintings as well as history and background information, are available for people who want to follow the trail on their own.

Even those who don't have a significant interest in art can enjoy this trip.

"It doesn't have to be boring, and you can combine it with a walk outside, [and enjoy] the beautiful scenery," said Jacks.

The site itself includes about 5 acres, and a walking tour is available. Visitors can explore Cole's home and his studio, which includes original easels and supplies, and stroll through galleries with the paintings.

The Thomas Cole Historic Site is hosting an Open House event on May 1, with free admission from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. There will be a 2 p.m. lecture by the curator, for which there is a small fee.

There is also kid-specific fun available at the site.

"We are printing this History Detective pack where we make it fun, pretend the kid in the family is a detective and searching for clues around the historic site and discover things that happened here in history, so it's a combination scavenger hunt, making the experience fun for younger people and people who come here with younger people," said Jacks.

It's easy to spend a day in the area even without the hikes. The town of Catskill has a popular Main Street with shopping and dining opportunities, and the same natural beauty that inspired Cole is evident throughout town.

"Catskill has amazing topography. There's a spot where a creek meets the Hudson River and a point of land, so there's a restaurant that overlooks the river and the creek. It's a great spot. There's a park right down there on the water, and it's a beautiful place to have a picnic or something like that," said Jacks.

There are a variety of places to stop and enjoy views of the Hudson River, and sometimes there's even an opportunity to get out on it. The nearby Hudson-Athens Lighthouse, comes to life later on in the summer. On the second weekend of each month, from July to October, Hudson Cruises runs shuttles to the lighthouse and Emily Brunner, who used to live on the island, gives a tour.

"It's history, and the whole thing is special. The views are fantastic and the opportunity to get out there is kind of a rare event in this region," said Guy Falkenheimer, Captain and Owner of Hudson Cruises. "We have Emily go out there, and she talks about living there as a child, and to have the opportunity to talk to the person who experienced it in that age is phenomenal. It's just a really fantastic opportunity."

Back on dry land, a must-stop for kids is the FASNY Museum of Firefighting in Hudson. The 50,000-square-foot museum has enough room to be diverse.

"This is not your typical firehouse museum where you go in and there's one truck and one exhibit," said Jamie Quinn, the Museum's Executive Director. "Our museum is the largest fire museum on the East Coast. We have over 90 pieces of apparatus."

That means this can be a fun stop for all, but the museum is an especially good time for kids.

"We try to cater to families with small children," said Quinn. "We have four trucks and gear [that they can play with], a bucket brigade interactive space where the put out a fake fire, and a discovery room where they can do crafts. On the weekend we have a fire safety puppet show, so there's a lot to do."

A must-see aspect of the FASNY museum is the 9/11 exhibit.

### BOCES working on program to help school districts with health-care costs

It's no secret that health-care costs make up a large portion of school budgets, and the problem can sometimes be that district officials do not have the time to look into what packages would be most cost effective.

Now, Capital Region BOCES is spearheading a program that would help advise school districts about the best health-care programs for them. The project is being led by South Colonie School Board Member Robert Domenici, who is acting as a part-time president of the project, BOCES Assistant Superintendent for Management Services Mark Jones, and Dana Piazza, who Domenici said plays the role of an insurance expert.

"Essentially what this is, it's a not-for-profit initiative made by the BOCES Board of Education to help school districts manage their health care," Jones said. "The initiative is really to gain better management and control over those costs and, ultimately, reduce the costs of government."

Throughout the school year, districts are constantly trying to control costs, save money and modify the budget as time goes on. Jones said something as complex as the health-care system is hard for the district

to invest a lot of time in researching even though the benefits packages continue to increase in cost. He said the purpose of this program is to help alleviate those costs.

Piazza, who is acting as the benefits administrator for the operation, said BOCES can act as a neutral party and discuss packages with various health-care vendors, as well as experts in the industry, to plan out what the best options are.

"When we come up with those types of ideas, we can share them across the continuum of districts that are having the same problem," she said. "It's sort of a no-brainer that if you have somebody looking at this [health care] and nothing else, you'll get to a solution, or at least an idea or concept that you can provide to people as a potential solution."

BOCES officials have been working on this program over the past year, said Jones. Domenici said they wanted to have all the legal entities in place and a clear vision of what they wanted.

With everything being done on a 12-month cycle in the public sector, Jones said, they were trying to keep ahead of that and looking for more long-term solutions instead of quick fixes.

"It's about the much longer term gains within a better management system," he said. "This is an investment in a way to manage differently."

There are some problems working in the public sector, Piazza said,

since their program might be working on a different timeline than some of the health-care vendors. She said they are trying to develop a better game plan with the vendors so they can know where BOCES' budget should be and what the rates are so they can produce a better budget.

"There's another avenue we're trying to pursue, and that is aligning our schedules and calendars to get to better and more accurate forecasting," Piazza said.

Jones said they hope to also bring the unions to the discussion, along with the districts and health-care vendors. The best way for that to happen is using best practice health insurance committees. This would allow labor unions and district management to discuss what the issues are, as well as how the health-care system works.

Domenici said the program will also help districts look into things they don't need that are generally included in medical packages.

"In there, they'll stack it with everything they

can think of because it makes an added value," he said. "What they're doing is educating them and saying, 'You'll never use this, no one in your system is using this and so why are you paying for that benefit,' and tailoring the medical packages so they fit the base you're trying to support."

BOCES is looking to develop a Web site that would have some of the educational materials online, Piazza said. They are also going to try to improve the different data that is being reported through the health insurance committees. This would allow districts a chance to hear what options are available to them and make a collaborative decision with the unions.

She said they will also be looking for experts in the health insurance industry that could bring their skills from the private sector into the public sector.

"We want to try and bridge those relationships much more and take advantage of the expertise we're very fortunate to have in this region through

four major carriers," she said.

There are currently five districts in the area that have already expressed interest in being a part of this project, Jones said.

Piazza said getting a program like this off the ground takes time.

"We have multiple years behind us of not doing everything the way we could have," Piazza said. "And we have to go in stages to get people where they need to be. We're behind what the industry offers, we're behind the private sector. There's lots of attention and information out there in the country all the time with what's going on in healthcare. But until you take the time and sit down on a district or municipality specific basis, folks don't have a chance to learn and ask questions and apply relative thinking to how it can help them."


Dan Rain, the town's recycling coordinator, said more than 206 households took part and more than 7,200 lbs. of paper was shredded on site.

# Guilderland mutual fund receives national honor

**Founders previously worked at competing companies**

Guilderland is a long way from Wall Street, but that's how Adirondack Funds likes it.

This small team of fund managers is making national waves after being awarded the 2011 Lipper Fund Award for Best Small Cap Value Fund in the U.S. This is a great accolade after just being formed in 2005 by two CFAs, Matt Reiner and Greg Roeder, who met in the Albany area but worked at competing companies before striking out on their own.

Since then, initial investor Steve Gonick has come on-board and Alicia Laschi was recently added as an analyst. Gonick left a career at Johnson and Johnson to join up and said he was impressed from the start not only by the fund's business sense but by its character.

"I always saw these guys as a diamond in the rough," he said. "I thought they were real ethical guys and real talented guys."

The name of the Adirondack Small Cap Fund (ticker ADKSX) comes not only from the founders' love of the area, but from the fact so many of their investors hail from around the Capital District. About half of the \$63 million mutual fund is

made up of local money. That creates a different atmosphere, said Roeder, because their own money and the money of the people they know is at stake when they trade.

"We take that mentality to work every day, and I think that basically is a real edge for us," he said.

That edge has translated into rewards for the fund and its investors. The 2011 Lipper Fund Award in this category reviewed performance over the

past three years, including 2008, when the stock market took a precipitous dive.

So did ADKSX. But it also recovered well when compared to the rest of the market. From 2008 through 2010, the fund returned 9.9 percent annualized, nearly 8 percent better than the market as a whole during that period.

The Lipper Fund Awards are part of the Thomson Reuters Awards for Excellence, which cover a broad range of financial products the world over. There

were 195 other funds under consideration for this particular honor.

A "small cap" fund is a great option for a small team like Adirondack Small Cap's. These funds target their investments in smaller companies, not the bigger, "blue chip" stocks. Investors try to target undervalued stocks that have fallen since their public offering or are in sectors about to experience growth. This can make small cap investment a

risky proposition, but also one a smart manager can cull serious gains from.

It's also a corner of the market where the big firms don't necessarily have an advantage.

"We decided to launch a small cap fund. It was a niche, so it was a place where we could compete against bigger, more well-funded organizations and still do well," Roeder said.

Kerry Mayo, of Capital Financial in Clifton Park, said he often recommends Adirondack Funds as a small cap investment to his clients not only because of the strong rate of return, but because he has confidence in the managers.

"It's good to have people you can speak with face to face. You can call the portfolio managers of Adirondack and ask them what they're thinking," he said. "The way they've gone about building their business I think should be respected."

The Lipper recognition should translate into some increased interest in the Adirondack Small Cap Fund, and already the team is receiving calls from all over the country. But the fund managers want to keep things simple and stick with what has worked: focusing on one fund and doing that as well as possible.

"We have upwards of \$2 million of our own money invested in the fund, so we care a great deal about what happens in the fund," Gonick said.

Get your Zumba on at a "Party Hearty" Zumbathon to benefit the American Heart Association on Saturday, April 30, at the Malta Community Center.

Zumbainstructor Stacey Doltz, whom residents might know from classes she heads up at Saratoga

County YMCAs and Yoga Kids, will lead a two-hour marathon Zumba class to raise money, stay active and have fun.

"I'm raising awareness for the American Heart Association because it's the No. 1 killer of women in the U.S.," said Doltz.

Doltz has rallied area vendors who will have booths set up to advertise their products or services, there will be a DJ and 75 percent of the proceeds (tickets are \$20 at the door) will go to the American Heart Association.

"I'm bringing on three other instructors who will be on stage dancing and we'll see what we can do for the American Heart Association," said Doltz.

Zumba is the dance fitness craze popping up in video games and gyms around the country, but for those who haven't heard of it, it's a program set to Latin music where exercisers learn Latin-based dances like Salsa and Reggaeton to get their workout.

"It's high impact and within that class, you're not doing just dancing, you're doing a cardiovascular workout with that," said Doltz.

The routine is all about dance but no dance experience is necessary to excel at Zumba.

"I lead all the songs and teach the steps. It's also my philosophy that you burn your highest calories after you know

the song well, so they'll hear the same playlist after everyone knows the song," said Doltz.

According to Doltz, Zumba-ers burn an average minimum of 500 calories and she has some class members who exceed 1,000 in one session.

"It's not anything you have to sit and think 'I'm getting a workout,'" said Doltz. "It's a party atmosphere. I challenge anyone to come to my classes, listen to this music and not feel like you need to move or want to move around. Your behaviors and motivation change."

Before Doltz was an instructor, she was just another regular Zumba amateur, trying the fitness craze to lose some weight.

"I did it to lose weight and get myself out of a depression and rut. I've had background in gymnastics and dancing and it kind

of fused together," said Doltz.

When she started Zumba, Doltz was a stay-at-home mother, having left a previous job of investigating child abuse reports in Saratoga County. After she started getting into it, Doltz became a full-time Zumba instructor, also teaching yoga to children in Malta and working to become a Reiki master, or energy healer.

Doltz is taking Zumba beyond the gym with the first ever "Zumba in the Club" at Vapor Nightclub in Saratoga Springs on Tuesday, May 17.

"Now it's going into the nightclub atmosphere," said Doltz. "It won't be a class, it'll be like a dance club."

The "Party Hearty" Zumbathon at the Malta Community Center is from 6 to 8 p.m. on Saturday, April 30.



the public at large, and several dozen people came out to share their thoughts and memories.

Many ideas were bandied about, and in the end several were adopted. A scholarship fund already started will be built upon with a goal of making it endowed. With existing funds and a \$2,000 donation from the Clarksville PTA, there's still about \$10,000 to be raised to reach that goal.

The guidelines of the scholarship were laid out by McDonald's family. It will be a \$1,000 scholarship to be awarded annually to a BC graduating senior going on to study in the field of education or human services. Applicants will also have to write an essay outlining his or her generosity and commitment to caring for others in a family and community.

"That was Dorothy, she loved learning, she loved teaching, she loved taking little minds and developing them," said Tanya Choppy, president of the Clarksville PTA.

The PTA will place a portrait of McDonald in the school's lobby. The nature trail surrounding the vernal pond will also be dedicated in memory of the educator with a

ribbon cutting ceremony at the May assembly, and students are now submitting names for the trail.

The shade tree will be donated by the school's Green Club. McDonald had a great love for nature, Choppy said, and this will serve as memorial that will be more accessible come next school year, when the school will be shuttered.

"We realize the school is closing, but we feel like the community as a whole will still be able to use it," Choppy said. "This will still give the community children some shade."

Painter echoed those thoughts, and added that it was a challenge to address the memorial under the circumstances.

"A big part of what Dorothy did is to bring so much life and vitality to the community, it's hard to separate her from the building," she said. "This is something that will live on for many years, and it doesn't matter if the building is used as a school or a community center."

McDonald was principal at Clarksville for eight years, and her death last September came as a surprise to

many. Her career before coming to BC was also in education, and she taught special education at St. Catherine's Center in Albany before eventually becoming principal of the R. and R. May School in Albany.

Parents and community members are invited to the reception on Friday, May 13 (one day after McDonald's birthday), at 3 p.m. The memorial ceremony will be held at 2:30 and will also be open to parents, but seating is limited.



re-entering the community, he said, and before the actual certificates of completion were handed out, three inmates had already left the facility. There is a waiting list to get into the program.

Dagostino thanked Mallozzi's for making the program possible.

"The [company] volunteered their corporate chef for this program, and they have given up their time and resources to make this program successful," said Dagostino. "Those are the types of partnerships between the sheriff's office and the business community and the community itself as a whole we are looking to form in order to provide these programs."

Janet Bowers, of Mallozzi's, said the company thought the cooking program would be a good way to give back to the community. She said that instead of just providing a monetary donation, it was a chance get out in the community and make a difference one on one.

"We originally designed the program with a full syllabus so they understand the basics of cooking and prepping and made sure to cover


sanitation with them," said Bowers. "[Chef Ryan Huneau] could see that they were really starting to get engaged in the whole concept of the class."

Moving forward, said Bowers, the company hopes to lend various chefs to the program, but Huneau said he looks forward to teaching again.

"When I went in there it was like walking into a jail, but by the end, everyone was having a good time and enjoyed being there. ... I definitely feel like I affected these people to some extent," said Huneau. "It was nice to see someone get something out of it when there is probably a lot of unproductive ways to spend their time."

When Huneau was first approached about the program, he said he didn't know what to expect, but the inmates warmed up to him and dove into the work. Only one of the inmates participating had previous culinary experience, but Huneau said they all learned a lot, and he checked their notes after every class. If they did make a mistake, he said they were quick to learn from it.

"I just wanted to give something back. ... I thought this would be a more hands on of an approach of giving back," said Huneau.

# A whistle revival

Not So Common Players present Sondheim's cult classic about individuality

**S**tephen Sondheim's "Anyone Can Whistle" was a big flop on Broadway. A really big flop.

The show lasted for just nine performances after its 1964 debut. Local theater veteran Tom Heckert said audiences of the time weren't used to musicals with a message, and the message of "Anyone Can Whistle" – reject conformity, embrace individuality – was an especially hard sell given that it was an era of cookie-cutter homes and cars.

But a funny thing happened. Sondheim fans turned the show into something of a cult classic. It popped up in the Berkshires about 20 years ago, and Sally Burke went to see it with her husband.

"I fell in love with the show back then," Burke said. "It's wacky. It's funny. It's just a lot of fun."

So when Clifton Park-based Not So Common Players was looking for a show for the 2010-11 season, Burke approached Heckert, who sits with her on the group's board, and suggested "Anyone Can Whistle."

Heckert is an unabashed Sondheim fan, but he was pretty sure the rest of the board would want to keep its distance from "Anyone Can Whistle."

"They'll never approve it," he told Burke. "No one knows it. It's obscure."

Still, the two made a case. And to their surprise, the rest of the board was game.

So, "Anyone Can Whistle" will have what Not So Common players believes is its regional debut when the curtain lifts at the Shenendehowa High School East Little Theater on Friday, April 29. It runs for two weekends: Friday through Sunday, April 29 to May 1, and Thursday to Sunday, May 5 to 8. Admission is free.

The show centers on a corrupt mayoress (Gina Bushey) who fakes a miracle to give her faltering town an economic boost, and a nurse and doctor who fall for each other in the midst of the hubbub.

The nurse is played by Heather Ferlo, a 17-year-old senior at Ballston Spa High School. She said she loves the character's journey, just as she loves learning

more about herself with each role she plays. The nurse adopts a free-wheeling persona with some people that make her realize she needs to be more daring in her everyday life.

"She has two separate worlds completely," Ferlo said. "It makes you look at your own life and how you act one way around one person and one way around someone else."

Ferlo's love interest is played by 27-year-old Jimmy Cupp, who relishes the escape acting offers.

"I love taking on different personas," he said. "Everything else disappears when you're up there." For "Anyone Can Whistle," Cupp transforms into a physician who's labeled crazy and unexpectedly plays a hero.

Cupp said he was drawn to the "many different levels" his character explores, not to mention the show's musical numbers.

Burke said the show's title song is particularly sweet – "I used to sing it as a solo for concerts."

Sondheim shows in general feature notable music, according to Heckert. Just as the message of "Anyone Can Whistle" was kind of ahead of its time for the early 1960s, Sondheim's "intricate lyrics" and "intricate patterns" were groundbreaking so far as musicals went, Heckert said. To illustrate the idea of musical patterns, Heckert pointed to a scene in "Anyone Can Whistle" that captures the "craziness of people coming in and out." The rhythm of the music matches the hustle and bustle on stage.

Beyond not liking the particular message of "Anyone Can Whistle," the Broadway audiences were looking for something

more like escapism, Heckert said. What's kind of funny is that the piece stands more as entertainment value today, since its emphasis on individuality is no longer a new concept.

Heckert had never read the show before Burke gave him a copy. Once he did, like her, he was hooked. He's excited to share it with area audiences, something he's been doing for years, first with Schenectady Civic Players and Schenectady Light Opera before moving to Clifton Park eight years ago and joining Not So Common Players.

"Some people knit and crochet. I do theater," he said. He has a kindred spirit in Burke, who estimates she and her husband, who went to see "The Fantasticks" on their first date, take in about 50 shows a year. Not So Common Players shows offer other theater enthusiasts – or even people just looking for something to do – a rare chance to see a quality show for free, she said.

Showtimes are 8 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, 2 p.m. on Sundays and 7:30 p.m. on Thursday.



The position is up for election in November so any replacement would only sit until the end of 2011.

"During the summer months, we only meet once each month ... and there really isn't much controversial going on right now," Runion said. "It might be a good thing just to leave the position open, and then the voters will get a chance to decide who they elect to the board in November."

Redlich said his exit from the state and departure from Guilderland politics are unrelated. He's serving his first term on the Town Board now, and frequently voices opposition to Runion.

Redlich has also staged Congressional runs, and in 2010 ran for governor as the Libertarian Party candidate. In that election, he was targeted by mailers that falsely identified him as a sexual predator.

The councilman said his time on the Guilderland Town Board soured him to politics more than that incident, though. He said he won't run for any office again until his youngest child is out of the house and in college (2024).

"The steady stream of negative attacks really reduced my attachment to my hometown," he said. "People complain about the nastiness in politics, but they don't do anything about it."

He said he hopes the Republican Party puts up local candidates in the coming election that will best Supervisor Runion, who could not immediately be reached for comment.

Redlich has been cleared to practice law in the Sunshine State, but he said he'd continue to operate his New York law practice from afar. He said he's tired of driving from court to court to represent clients and will contract that work out to other attorneys.

"I think my practice will shrink, we will get fewer cases and there will be things that we won't be able to do," he said.

He also won't have to pay income taxes in Florida.

Redlich said it's hard to say what his future would look like, especially politically, but indicated he would like to find like-minded Libertarians and Ron Paul supporters once he relocates.

"My plan is to network, meet people, find good candidates and good groups and support them," he said.

Hollow neighborhoods a place to spend their days filled with activities and also receive a free lunch. The Regional Food Bank helped Interfaith serve 1,127 lunches last summer.

Kids also get to enjoy arts and crafts, recreational activities and field trips to places like the Museum of Art and History and Albany Aqua Ducks. Between 15 and 50 children usually show up each day of the program. A backpack of school supplies is handed out at the end to help kids in the new school year.

The program started small, with Interfaith handing out peanut butter and jelly sandwiches at a park near its Albany offices. It's since blossomed into a much larger program. For many



families, parents must work or are otherwise occupied during the day, and that leaves kids without proper supervision in the summer, said Interfaith spokeswoman Bonnie St. Onge.

"This just gives them a solid and reliable amount of time with people who are in positions that can be helpful," she said.

"It definitely keeps growing and growing, and it's totally funded by events such as Voices of Hope," St. Onge added. "We really enjoy working with the coordinators of the Voices of Hope and are really thankful for what they do for us."

The concert featured over 100 performers, including the 75-member Capital District Youth

Chorale Senior Chamber Choir, with members from all over the Capital District. Several youngsters studying at The Music Studio also performed piano solos.

Interfaith gives out the Norm Elfeldt Award each year to recognize a person who shows dedication to the organization. This year's recipient was Jasmine Hinds.



# Do you know Candy?

**Area filmmaker debuts short film shot in Schenectady and Albany counties**

Receiving a film script from your father as a birthday present might not be the most conventional gift, but that's exactly how one Albany filmmaker started his recent short film.

Jon Cring, director of "Know Candy," has actually had his father, Jonathan Cring, an accomplished writer, pen all of his movie scripts.

The film is premiering at the Duanesburg Area Community Center, in Delanson, on Saturday, April 23, at 3 p.m., and later that day at The Great Room Theater, in Gansevoort, at 7 p.m. It was shot on location throughout the Capital District, and Jon Cring said wanted to bring the film to hometowns of the 50 extras who appear in it.

"This is a chance for a whole bunch of local

folks to get to see what they were a part of," said Cring. "I had sort of always been in the arts working with my family in music and theater. I met my wife, and she had film equipment from winning a film festival at 18 years old."

Cring directed "Know Candy," but his wife was the one behind the camera filming it all. Cring has made 13 feature-length films, 15 short films and two television series. "Know Candy" was filmed in three days and was completed in March. An Ohio native, Cring lived in Tennessee for a long time before moving to Albany, which he said was a great idea.

"I had been in the South and made quite a few films there ... and this was an area of the country I had never explored, so we moved up here, and really it has been the smartest thing we have ever done," said Cring. "As opposed to almost anywhere else I have been in the country, there are associations and people that want to support the independent filmmakers, and it makes

things a lot easier."

A classic film noir approach was taken for "Know Candy," which starts off with the main character Mitchell Conyers, a lawyer, receiving a text message from an unknown number. The messages are cryptic at first, but Conyers gets drawn in as the texts get personal and the story revolves around Candy Marshal.

Shooting the film ironically started to become a jinx, just like the story it was capturing.

"This film is about bad luck and a jinx, and we had that in spades during the production of this film, but we persevered to be able to have a finished film," said Cring.

Two days before shooting was scheduled to begin, Cring said, the lead actress had to drop out due to a back injury. Then he found a new actress, Sarah Ansley, but she had been in the country for only three weeks and her English was a little rough. Cring rescheduled the shoot to begin a week and a half later. Once shooting began, there were

more problems, with a car breaking down during the middle of the set and people getting sick.

"It was a crazy shoot, but it turned out really, really fun," said Cring. "If you care about what you are going to do, it is not going to be easy, but there is going to be a payoff in the end."

Some of the featured locations in the film are the Chuck Wagon Diner in Duanesburg, CM Fox Real Estate in

Guilderland and The Appel Inn in Altamont; some scenes were also shot in Schenectady, Princetown and Delanson.

"I was looking for locations that had the quality of looking like they could be anytime," said Cring. "You find a couple of locations and they speak to you and sort of form everything to create a look around it ... that is pretty much how it happened."







## Dutch bats silenced

### Two Shen pitchers limit Guilderland to one hit

Pitching and defense propelled the Shenendehowa baseball team to another Suburban Council win.

Miles Kelly and Mike Englert combined to pitch a 1-hitter and help the Plainsmen defeat Guilderland 8-1 in last Friday's game at Dutchmen Field in Keenholts Park.

Kelly and Englert only struck out four batters between the two of them, but Shen's defense did the rest to help the Plainsmen (6-1) keep pace with Niskayuna for first place in the North Division.

"You can always trust them [to

make plays]," said Kelly, who earned his second win of the season after pitching six strong innings. "I feel confident when the ball is hit to them."

Shen's defense did make two errors, but neither were costly. Guilderland's lone run came on Devin Fisher's first inning sacrifice fly that drove in Harry Brodsky, who walked and stole two bases to get in scoring position.

"We haven't had goose eggs on errors yet in a game, but we do play defense well for the most part," said Shen coach James Carrese.

On the other hand, Guilderland (4-3 league, 4-4 overall) committed three errors, and two proved costly. The Dutchmen had a pair of miscues in the top of the first inning, which helped Shen rally for four runs to take an early lead on Guilderland ace Vinny Tamburello.

"You can't start that first inning against a team like that," said Guilderland coach Doug LaValley. "That set the stage for the whole game."

The two errors Guilderland committed in the first inning allowed Shen to load the bases. Then, John Craig started the RBI barrage with a single. Justin Yurchak, Matt Buckley and Mike Cuttita also drove in runs to make the score 4-0.

After Fisher's RBI fly out in the bottom of the first, Brandon Cogswell re-established Shen's four-run lead in the top of the second inning with a solo home run to right field off Tamburello.

"He threw three curve balls in a row, and he knew I was looking for a curve ball, so he tried something high and inside," said Cogswell. "I

Morris, who placed fourth in his weight class at the Section II high school wrestling championships earlier this year, will now compete at the USA state championships.


## Leaman saw an opportunity and took it

• Nate Leaman is heading to Providence, and who could blame him?

Leaman achieved what he could with the Union College hockey team. He transformed the Dutchmen from ECAC doormat to the league's regular season champion and guided them to the NCAA Division I tournament in eight years, and for that he received the Spencer Penrose Award as national coach-of-the year.

On the heels of that success, Leaman decided to go to a program (Providence College) that plays in a premier collegiate hockey conference (Hockey East) and has a pro-level home arena (the Dunkin' Donuts Center), rather than risk seeing his coaching stock grow lower by staying in Schenectady and potentially seeing Union fall from the top of the league standings

The Dutchmen may be able to stay near the top of the standings next year, too. While senior forward Adam Presizniuk, senior defenseman Brock Matheson and starting goaltender Keith Kinkaid move on to pro careers, they will likely have their top three scorers back - Kelly Zajac, Jeremy Welsh and Daniel Carr - plus most of their defensive unit. Those are strong building blocks for new Union coach Rick Bennett to work with.

Still, one wonders if Union will wind up missing Leaman. Coaches like him don't come around very often, which is why Providence wanted Leaman as badly as Union wanted to keep him.

Hopefully for the Dutchmen, Bennett can continue what his boss started.

• Staying in Schenectady County, the Niskayuna baseball team has been exhibiting a flair for late inning drama.

The Silver Warriors enter this week with a 6-1 Suburban Council record - a mark that includes late-inning rallies to beat Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake, Saratoga Springs and Shaker, as well as a 7-5 victory over Bethlehem last week in which they had to fend off a seventh-inning rally by the Eagles. Their only loss was a 9-7 setback against Colonie April 14 in which they rallied from a 6-2 deficit to tie the game before the Garnet Raiders surged ahead with a three-run sixth inning.
