Catching up with McLaughlin

Freshman assemblyman weighs in on his first months in office

Freshman Assemblyman Steve McLaughlin, R-Melrose, has something in common with freshmen in college: They were both slammed with reading this past January.

The newly minted legislator admitted that on his first day in the Assembly chamber, he was somewhat overwhelmed.

"The first week or two I was there, I'm showing up on the floor and these bills are here, and I'm like, how the heck are we supposed to vote on these things?" he said.

But after four months in office (his first in any elected office), McLaughlin shows a great deal more confidence when he speaks about the goings on at the Capitol. He's gained a handle on how bills work their way to the floor, what his strengths are and the best way to be prepared.

"I learned pretty quickly to read and read and read," he said.

Though he's part of a large class

of freshman legislators, McLaughlin was one of the few candidates in the Capital District to displace an incumbent in November, defeating Assemblyman Tim Gordon for control of the 108th Assembly District, which includes Bethlehem, Coeymans and parts of Columbia, Greene and Rensselaer counties.


Many have concluded from the election results that New Yorkers are ready for a change in their government. But has the Legislature lived up to that task?

BC moving forward on office sale

Process in early stages, district offices would head to high school

The Bethlehem Central School District is proceeding cautiously with plans to sell its district offices located on Adams Place in Delmar. At its May 4 meeting, the Board of Education voted to solicit proposals from Realtors, with the intent of selecting one at its June 15 meeting and then putting the building on the market.

There are some issues to clear up before the property can be put up for sale, though; not the least of which is ascertaining the value of the building. It was last valued in 2009 at \$670,000, but the housing market has undergone some serious shifts in that time.

"I think it's safe to say that's one of the reasons the board is hesitant to commit to a timeline," said Superintendent Michael Tebbano.

A new appraisal will be obtained in the coming weeks.

Additionally, the 5,575-square-foot building inhabits a residential zone, though it's been used as office space for over 30 years and was the town library before that. The district plans to coordinate with the town to either rezone or obtain a variance to continue using the building as office space. That's not a necessity for the sale of the property, but it could increase its marketability.

As for the sale, if and when it occurs, it will not be a simple windfall to the district. The operations will have to be moved to the high school, which is not a simple task.

Picking up the pieces

Delmar native lives through tornado onslaught

Christine Hackman figured the evening of April 27 would be like any other. The University of Alabama student had plans with friends to go out to dinner despite menacing weather and a tornado warning — after all, there had been several in the preceding days that were followed by nothing more dramatic than high winds.

But then, as the group of students was about to head out, the sirens started whining. Hackman looked out the window of her Tuscaloosa

apartment and saw a massive F4 tornado filling the skyline.

"It looked like it was across the street and behind the high school," she said. "We started hearing people screaming from their balconies."

The group headed to the first floor for better protection. The power cut out. Debris started snacking against the building.

"It was probably the scariest sound I heard in my entire life," Hackman said. "I thought I might die. The last text I got out to my parents was 'I love you.'"

Back in Delmar, N.Y., Hackman's parents were leaving a Bethlehem Town Board meeting that had gone particularly late. Ann Abaray, Christine's mother, switched on her cell phone

A capital competition

BC Science Bowl team finishes ninth in nation in third trip finals

While much of the nation's capital was celebrating on Monday, May 2, a small contingent of students from Bethlehem Central High School had more than one reason to be proud.

For the third year in a row, the school's Science Bowl team traveled to Washington, D.C. to compete in the national finals of that competitive test of scientific knowledge. This year, the team of five and their coach, science teacher Paul O'Reilly, made their best showing yet, finishing 9th out of the 69 high schools at the match. About 14,000 students nationwide entered regional competitions this year.

The three-day event started on April 30. For senior Austin Mayron, this was his third trip to the capital for the competition. The Science Bowl team has only two chances every year to show off its skills: at regionals and nationals.

"You practice for a whole year, then it comes down to 10 games," Mayron said.

BC's team performed admirably at the regional competition in, winning all its games. At the national contest

they played in seven round robin games and three double-elimination rounds.

It was also a tough year, said Mayron, who will be attending Caltech to study chemical engineering in the fall.

"In the later rounds the calculations got pretty intense. They're expecting you to do a lot in 20 seconds," he said.

And these multiple choice questions go a bit beyond knowing the periodic table. For example:

"If a satellite moving in a circular orbit is raised to another circular orbit 3-times as far from the Earth's center and where the kinetic energy of the satellite is 3-times less, by what factor does the centripetal force on the satellite decrease?" (The answer? Nine.)

The team members generally concentrate on their topics of interest and then study it voraciously. Senior Ray Futia (who will study cellular biology at SUNY Binghamton next fall) said he pored over not only his advanced biology textbook but anatomy and molecular biology texts as well. From his experience at last year's event, Futia reckoned the middle schoolers were answering what were previously high school-level questions.

"The questions were a lot harder this year," he said.

Other members of the team are good at doing sums in

their heads very quickly, and others make sure their know detailed principals of physics and chemistry.

For placing in the top 16 high school teams in the country, the Science Bowl team brought back \$1,000 from the Department of Energy for BC's science department. O'Reilly said he'd like to see that money spent on a video system that attaches to microscopes so students can film their observations and broadcast them to the class.

"I can see across the room if they're doing the right thing," he said.

When not competing at the Science Bowl, the team got a chance to see the sights of Washington. (When the news broke late Sunday that Osama bin Laden had been killed, the team woke up O'Reilly to ask if they could grab a taxi to join the raucous celebrations on Pennsylvania Avenue. The answer was in the negative.)

The Science Bowl team will be losing several top players to graduation next year, but junior Michael Clawar said he's confident the group can make it back to D.C. He wants to make sure the team gets

together over the summer to be as prepared as possible.

"We have a lot of young kids we can use on the team next year," he said. "We should have a good team next year that has a good shot of making nationals."

For now, most members of the Science Bowl team are now turning their attention to the Masterminds competition. It's a contest very similar to Science Bowl but it covers all subjects, not just the sciences. The first round of the Masterminds competition is on May 16, with regionals on the 23rd.

Feura Bush factory rolls out new product

Owens Corning hopes EcoTouch insulation will lead to new jobs

Insulation maker Owens Corning is hoping to increase its workforce in the not too distant future after two rounds of recession-triggered layoffs have nearly halved the number of workers at its Delmar plant.

This hope for expansion is driven not only by a possible upturn in the housing market but by the new product the plant is producing. The Delmar facility (actually located in Feura Bush) recently took over three months to retool its lines to produce the company's new EcoTouch insulation, which consists of at least 50 percent recycled material.

Owens Corning showcased the new product and procedures to the public on Wednesday, May 4. Not only has the \$8 million upgrade to the Delmar facility made a new, almost all-natural product possible, it has reduced the plant's emissions, said plant manager Louis St. Pierre.


"It gets down to a people thing. I think that's so important to us, and this product I think is a real people product," he said.

Also on Wednesday, the company presented Pastor Perry Jones of the Capital City Rescue Mission with a check for \$5,000. Owens Corning has been involved in the

organization's efforts to build a 44-unit apartment complex in an old warehouse to act as transitional housing for the homeless, and the company is donating the insulation needed for the building and labor to install it. The recent donation will go towards purchasing materials for the \$3.5 million project, Jones said.

"If we hadn't had the help of Owens Corning and other volunteer groups, we would have had to spend \$6 million," he said.

The company is hoping that the EcoTouch insulation and its other

environmentally friendly products will help boost business. The company has committed \$17 million to expanding the Delmar factory to include another production line. That would also boost employment from the current 196 workers up to around 280. Back in early 2008, the plant employed 360.

There's no timeline in place for the upgrade, however. It will be market driven, so when the housing market picks up and people start building again, it will be a boon for the Delmar factory as well. Rising energy costs could also increase

demand for insulation.

The plant will celebrate its 35th anniversary this June.

The new insulation is produced in much the same way as traditional insulation. Broken up glass is heated up to about 1,250 degrees and forced through tiny openings in a centrifuge, creating the glass fibers. It's then mixed with chemicals, compressed and stuck on to a paper backing.

The Eco-Touch insulation moves away

from using formaldehyde and instead employs a maltodextrine additive (a corn-based sweetener). This makes the pink insulation take on the vague odor of cotton candy as well as the appearance.

But it still performs well, employees said, and thus far contractors have been happy with the way it installs and smells.

[Eco-Touch] represents the reinvention of the product, we believe EcoTouch resets

the industry standards," said Matt Parish, East Regional Sales Lead for Owens Corning.

The Delmar facility is churning out a huge amount of the stuff, too. Running 24 hours a day, the plant makes enough EcoTouch to insulate 450 homes every day. That's distributed all over the northeast (the Delmar plant is one of eight such Owens Corning operations in North America).

Double trouble for Delmar woman charged with DWAI-Drugs

Bethlehem Police on Thursday, April 28, arrested Erika E. Molle, 26, of 74 Delaware Ave., Delmar, and charged her with DWAI-Drugs...twice.

Police said a call was received at just after 9 a.m. reporting a woman slumped over the steering wheel of her car at Dunkin Donuts at 232 Delaware Ave. in Delmar. Police said they recognized her from an April 9 arrest, when Molle was charged with felony criminal possession of stolen property.

Molle was roused from the 2002 Ford Explorer and allegedly admitted to taking "multiple narcotics" at about 2:30 or 3 a.m. She submitted to having blood drawn by Albany County paramedics for testing, was processed and released.

Later that day, at about 2:10 p.m. Molle was spotted by police driving a 1996

Mitsubishi 3000GT in the vicinity of the Bethlehem Police Station, according to arrest reports. She had evidently dropped the owner of the Explorer off at the impound to pick up his car. She was later spotted on Delaware Avenue and pulled over for allegedly failing to signal a turn, took sobriety tests and was again placed under arrest for DWAI-Drugs. Molle again had her blood drawn by Albany County Paramedics and was given a court date of May 3 for both charges. She was transported back to her residence by police, who at the time were responding to an attempted burglary call (see following report).

Trio charged with attempted burglary

Bethlehem Police on Thursday, April 28,

arrested three men who were allegedly trying to break in to a Delmar apartment.

Police charged Justin A. Pabon, 23, of 6 Weston Drive, Clifton Park; Jhafar Sadik Ali, 18, of 18 Pico Road, Clifton Park; and John Patrick Dolan, 19, of 44 Fliegel Ave., Albany, with attempted burglary in the second degree, a felony.

Ali and Dolan were also charged with criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree, a misdemeanor, and Dolan was charged with unlawful possession of marijuana.

Police said a call was received reporting that the trio was trying to break in to an apartment at 74 Delaware Avenue, Delmar. The resident was being processed at the Bethlehem Police Station at the time.

The resident was known by at least one person in the group, according to police, but it was unclear if there was any connection between her arrest and the attempted break in.

The three were located in the parking lot, and Ali gave police permission to search his 20009 Mitsubishi Eclipse, police said. Inside, they allegedly found five hydrocodone pills (an opioid painkiller) and a glass pipe, and Ali and Dolan allegedly admitted possession of the pills.

A search also allegedly found 0.1 grams of marijuana on Dolan's person.

All three were arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to Albany County jail (Dolan and Ali

on \$2,500 cash or \$5,000 bail bond and Pabon on \$5,000 cash or \$10,000 bail bond). A preliminary hearing was scheduled for May 3 and a court date of May 17 was set.

Man en route to Disney World charged under Leandra's Law

State Police arrested a Sullivan County man on Leandra's Law charges Saturday, April 7, after stopping him on the Thruway in Guilderland.

Police said George R. Vandermark, 39, of White Lake, was pulled over around 3:30 a.m. after police received a complaint regarding

an erratic driver on the Thruway. Vandermark had been drinking while on the way to the Albany International Airport and a vacation in Disney World, police said, and had his 3-year-old daughter in the car.

Vandermark had a BAC of 0.19 percent, troopers said, which is over double the legal limit. In addition to the felony aggravated DWI charge, he was also arrested on charges of endangering the welfare of a child and DWI, both misdemeanors, and traffic violations.

He was arraigned in Guilderland Town Court and remanded to the Albany County jail. The child was picked up by family members at the police barracks.

Get out and vote

On Tuesday, May 17, residents throughout the communities we serve will have the opportunity to go out and vote for or against the people and budgets that shape our lives and the lives of our children.

Outside of the family unit, no other organization has the immediate influence on our children than our school systems. And these certainly are lean times, for families and for schools. It is our responsibility as a constituent to at least show up and let our voices be heard on how we feel the school's have done handling our money in these trying times.

For our part, we ask that you consider this: If your intention is to vote down a budget because it cuts a certain service or activity you're particularly fond of, remember that item may not survive in the second chance or contingency budgets.

School budget votes and school board elections traditionally have the lowest turnout of any local race. Judging by the calls, e-mails and letters we receive year-round, this cannot be due to complacency. We're willing to bet that more people are willing to complain about their taxes than to actually come out and vote on the budgets that affect them. That's a shame. Your participation, your vote, buys you the right to complain when things aren't to your liking, or to celebrate when they are.

We hear from a number of the school superintendents in our area that a large contingent of voters perennially come out to vote down the budget regardless of its merits. We also hear there are many would-be voters who perennially don't vote and wonder why the budget didn't pass.

Don't be one of them. On Tuesday, May 17, get out and vote.

Some tools to get you to the polls

Understanding a budget upwards of \$100 million can be a daunting task.

We've taken a few of of the basic terms thrown around at budget time and explained them below:

Bond: Money borrowed to pay for a school district expenditure. Typically, the money is used for capital expenditures, such as the purchase of buses or the construction or renovation of a building, although in some cases school districts also issue bonds for other large expenditures such as the repayment of back taxes in a certiorari settlement.

The goal in borrowing is to spread the cost out over a period of years and lessen the cost to taxpayers in any one year.

By definition, a bond is a written promise to pay a specified sum of money, called the face value or principal amount, at a specified date in the future (the maturity date), together with periodic interest at a specified rate.

Budget cap: In the event of a school budget defeat and the adoption of a contingent budget, school districts must cap their spending increase at 120 percent of the Consumer Price index or 4 percent, whichever is lower.

Consumer Price Index (CPI): An index of prices used to measure the change in the cost of basic goods and services in comparison with a fixed base period. Also called cost-of-living index. However, the CPI does not take into account many of the items that cause school district budgets to rise, such as the increasing cost of health insurance, liability insurance and retirement contributions.

Contingency budget: Under state law, school boards can submit a budget to voters a maximum of two times. If the proposed budget is defeated twice, the board must adopt a contingency budget. The board also has the option of going directly to a contingent budget immediately after the first budget defeat. Under a

contingent budget, the district may not increase spending by more than 120 percent of the Consumer Price Index or 4 percent, whichever is lower. The items exempt from this cap are tax certiorari and other legal settlements, debt service (mortgage payments), and costs associated with enrollment growth.

Under a contingent budget, the percentage of the budget devoted to administrative costs cannot increase from what it was in the prior year's budget or the last defeated budget, whichever is lower.

Once a contingent budget is established, community residents are no longer allowed to petition boards of education to put additional items up for a separate vote.

Tax base: Assessed value of local real estate that a school district may tax for yearly operational monies.

Tax rate: The amount of tax paid for each \$1,000 of assessed value of property. In districts that cover just one municipality, the tax rate is figured simply by dividing the total assessed property value by 1,000 and then dividing that again into the tax levy (the amount of money to be raised locally). In districts that encompass more than one municipality, the formula for figuring the tax rate is more complicated. It involves assigning a share of the total tax levy to each municipality and applying equalization rates to take into account different assessment practices.

Tax levy: Total sum to be raised by the school district after subtracting out all other revenues including state aid. The tax levy is used to determine the tax rate for property owners in each of the cities, towns or villages that makes up a school district.

That last one is very important, because it's the figure that is the least easily manipulated.

See, a tax rate is a very emotionally charged and easily manipulated figure, and it is because of this that it is often the

figure most touted at the local level. A tax rate that increases more than 4 percent is ghastly, a tax rate that drops (it has been known to happen) is lauded. Unfortunately, neither one of those numbers, by themselves, tell you anything about how much you will pay in taxes, let alone if the amount will be higher or lower than what was paid the year before.

A tax rate depends on two other elements: a property's value, relative to the rest of the property in the community; and the total tax levy required by the taxing entity (your town, city, state or school district).

Property values can, and will, change, particularly in a housing market as volatile as the one we are in now. Because property values change, applying a tax rate to those values without knowing what the overall tax levy is, isn't really a good gauge of whether or not an entity is increasing or decreasing spending. A 4 percent tax rate applied to a home worth \$200,000 this year, for example, would yield twice the amount of actual dollars as the same 4 percent rate applied to that same home assessed at \$100,000 last year. The opposite would hold true if the assessed value of a property were to decrease.

The tax levy, on the other hand, is not as easily manipulated. If a taxing entity says it needs to raise \$1 million through taxes, the tax levy is \$1 million. There isn't much of a way to finesse that number, and its increase or decrease over last year's levy will give you the best indication as to whether you're comfortable with the level of spending by your school district.

There is always talk of decreasing tax rates through the application of federal stimulus money or other such aid. Don't be fooled. That money will have to be paid back, and even though it made your tax rate a little easier to swallow, all it did was to shift your tax burden to a different rate for another time. Let's close with the words of journalism and political pundit Kevin Fischer, a veteran of print, broadcast and online media:

"If there's nothing else you remember about your property taxes, remember this: It's the tax levy, friend, the tax levy."



Budget vote an important community decision

Editor, *The Spotlight*:

The proposed 2011-12 budget for the Bethlehem Central School District is the product of extensive community participation; careful fiscal planning; and the contributions of every employee group. In less than a week, it will be time for the community to vote on it, and we hope the turnout is strong.

Many in the community have spent a great deal of time and energy alongside of us on the proposed budget. At this time, it's important to highlight some facts about the proposed budget and the vote.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. at Bethlehem Central High School. Park in the main lot along Delaware Avenue, and follow the signs into the

upper gym.

The ballot will also include a bus proposition — significantly reduced from recent years — and three open seats on the Board of Education. The eight candidates seeking the seats will appear in a Meet the Candidates Night scheduled for this Friday, May 13, at 6:30 p.m. in the BCMS auditorium.

The proposed budget carries a tax levy increase of 2 percent.

The district will lose \$2.28 million in state aid next year.

The Board is committed to living within the district's means, so spending was also reduced. At \$86.83 million, the proposed budget is not just less than the current year's budget of \$88.3 million. It is also less than the \$87.56 million budget for last year (2009-10.)

This level of spending was reached through a combination of factors, including reductions in faculty staff.

As a result, some classes, particularly at the Middle and High School level, will be slightly larger next year. The only program eliminated entirely is the High School GED program, which has generated little student interest in recent years. The Board worked to strike a balance between our limited resources and maintaining the high quality that is a hallmark of a BC education.

The cuts to programs and opportunities would have been substantially worse without the full- or partial-year salary freezes agreed to by every employee group. These

concessions helped save as many as 20 teaching and other positions that provide direct services to students.

The proposed budget came with other difficult choices, most notably the closure of Clarksville Elementary School. After that decision, the district's immediate focus became ensuring a smooth and positive transition for all affected students and families.

The district has started the process of marketing its central offices for sale or lease.

There will not be a student technology referendum on the May 17 ballot.

The budget maintains all athletic, extracurricular, music and drama programs at current levels. At less than 1 percent of total spending, these activities connect students to their community and each other, and help them develop teamwork skills and explore interests. They are a solid investment.

Resources are limited these days, whether for a family, business, or a school system. The school budget is the single largest collective investment the community makes with its tax dollars. It's an important decision.

Please plan to vote on May 17. Better yet, encourage your friends and neighbors to do the same.

Help Post Office Stamp Out Hunger Give it back

On Saturday, May 14, letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns across America will deliver much more than mail when they walk and drive along their postal routes. They will also collect the goodness and compassion of their postal customers participating in the 19th annual National Food Drive to "Stamp out Hunger". This is the largest one-day food drive in the nation.

The efforts of letter carriers represented by the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC), with the help of rural letter carriers, other postal employees and numerous other volunteers has resulted in delivery of over one billion lbs of donations to community food banks and pantries over the past 18 years, including over 77.1 million lbs. in 2010.

The NALC Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive is the outgrowth of a tradition of community service exhibited by members of the letter carriers union. This sense of community service for the food drive

actually originated in a couple of cities across America, including the carriers in Albany, New York... Because of the success local carriers had, leaders of the NALC and Postal Service decided to try a pilot program in a few select cities in 1991. It proved so successful that the parties worked to make it a national effort. A revamped drive in 1993 with the goal of at least one union branch in every state resulted in an astounding 11 million pounds of food collected - a one day record in the United States.

Letter carriers are the eyes, ears, and often life savers in the community going into neighborhoods and towns six days a week. We see the faces of hunger every day and unfortunately it has

increased tremendously over the past few years. Due to a sluggish economy and record unemployment the USDA announced in December 2010 that food insecurity among all Americans surpassed 50 million people or 1 in every 6. Even more shocking was the confirmation that

a startling 1 in 4 children are food insecure. Seniors make up over 2.5 million and at least 4.8 million households accessed emergency food from a pantry. That is why the Stamp out Hunger food drive has become the

single most important food sourcing event of the year for the Feeding America network of food banks. Some pantries have claimed this drive is what they rely on to carry them through the summer.

Simplicity is the key to our success. All we ask is

for our customers to leave their donation in or near their mailbox, or at their local post office.

Letter carriers will collect the non-perishable food and deliver them to local community food banks, pantries, and shelters.

For months, letter carriers across the capital district have been busy planning for the success of this year's drive.

We are ready. Our empty trucks are ready. The pantry's empty shelves are ready to be filled.

We know you won't let them down.

Speaking for all letter carriers and employees of the USPS we are proud to be the service to help complete this first class delivery for our neighbors in need.



Library hoping people will support budget proposal

Last year more than 9,500 people came to the Voorheesville Public Library to attend special programs — not to return books or use the computers or send a fax, but to attend a book discussion or a poetry meeting or a concert. That's pretty remarkable.

Our programs have covered photography, quilt making, author appearances, college prep and life management for seniors. The Small Town Festival and the Ellis Island bus trip were highlights of the year. Two hundred and fifty groups booked space free of charge in the library for organizational meetings, scouting and sports meetings, tutoring sessions and other events. The phones ring with people asking questions, kids tromp in and out for story time and all the public computer terminals are busy every day. This library is a vital part of our community and we are hoping for your support of the budget in order to continue these



great services to you. This year's budget increases by \$45,160; many areas of the budget have been reduced to keep the increase to a minimum. Health care and retirement costs continue to rise. A necessary expense this year will be retrofitting the old fluorescent lights with more efficient fixtures. (Part of this cost will be paid for by a NYSERDA grant.) This budget includes a 2% cost of living adjustment for staff. There is \$30,000 allotted for the fifth, and final, payment on debt service as a result of the building bond. The overall budget increase is 4% and the estimated tax increase for New Scotland residents is \$0.05 per \$1,000 of assessed value or 4%. A family whose home is valued at \$200,000 will see an increase in library tax of \$10 annually—less than the cost to purchase one new book or rent two movies which can be

checked out here free.



Sebastian reeled backward and bumped into a table. Michael, who would have been our server in just a few moments, stepped in front of me as if to protect Sebastian.

Well, four take-home containers and one hasty exit of and banning from the restaurant later, and Jess was driving us home.

"I hope you're happy," she said.

"It was him," I said. "I know it."

She dropped me off in the driveway and announced she and the kids were going to eat at the park. They took my dinner with them.

I walked into the house, heated up some pizza rolls and sat down and listened to my messages.

V'Ville man in over his head

URI doctoral student Matt Horn earns degree examining nitrogen in the world's oceans.

As a swim instructor and lifeguard in high school, Matt Horn loved being in or near the water. But when it came to a career, he considered engineering or medicine before his affinity for the water caught up with him.

Now he prepares to graduate with a Ph.D. in oceanography from the University of Rhode Island after spending six years tracking nitrogen around the world's oceans and tracing its relationship to carbon dioxide in the atmosphere.

Anative of Voorheesville, Horn moved to URI just three days after earning a bachelor's degree from Cornell University, and just three weeks later he went to sea for the first time to begin his research. He began by trying to learn how CO2 moves from the atmosphere into the ocean and back again.

"It enters the water under high wind speed conditions, but most oceanographers only like to go to sea when it's calm," he said. "So I had to go to sea in the worst conditions and try to convince the ship's captain to drive into the middle of the perfect storm."

On an expedition aboard a 300-foot British research ship north of Scotland in 2007, he experienced 120-knot winds and 50-foot seas and eventually had to

get rescued by the Coast Guard.

"After 42 days at sea we only were able to work for two or three days total," he recalled. "The rest of the time we were hunkering down and trying to ride out the weather. It was an expensive trip and we lost a lot of gear, but we made it back safely."

Half way through his degree, he changed his research focus to study diatoms that live at the surface of the Southern Ocean near Antarctica, one of the only places in the world where CO2 both enters and exits the ocean. He grew diatoms—single celled marine plants—in a laboratory under conditions resembling the Antarctic and analyzed the relationship between stable isotopes in their cells and the isotopic relationship found in

sediment core samples from 30,000 years ago.

"CO2 levels have bounced around between 180 parts per million and 280 parts per million from one glacial cycle to another," Horn said. "Now we're at 390. I was looking to learn how nutrient utilization changed in the Southern Ocean and what kind of variability that has on CO2 levels over Earth's history and see what it means for today."

While this latter project did not involve travel to the Southern Ocean, he still looks back nostalgically on his time spent at sea.

"Life is simple at sea," he said. "It's just you and your work. You get to know the people you work with well, you see so many new places, and you see a lot of water. There was great excitement in the unknown. But I also

enjoyed seeing a different side of oceanography with all of my lab work, too."

After graduation, Horn begins work as a chemical oceanographer at Applied Science Associates, just a few miles down the road from the URI Graduate School of Oceanography. He looks forward to applying his diverse background and experience to the company's projects tracking oil and chemicals in the ocean and addressing other coastal and environmental hazards.

"I'm looking forward to getting out of academia and working in the private sector," Horn said. "Some day I may see myself starting my own company or maybe try teaching. But I've been in school for 25 years now; it's time to spread my wings a little bit and make a difference."



BC budget has layoffs despite concessions

Residents of the Bethlehem Central School District will be voting on an \$86.8 million budget, a 1.7 percent decrease from this year's budget.

It's the first time in half a century a budget has been adopted that's lower than both of the past two spending plans, according to the district. It still would mean a 2 percent hike in the tax levy and the use of about \$2.3 million of savings.

BC will be losing \$2.3 million in state aid in the

2011-12 school year. The budget does include the elimination of 24 faculty positions, and while some will be eliminated through attrition there will be layoffs if the budget passes. The teachers union and other bargaining groups agreed to full- or partial-year pay freezes, however, which saved the district around \$1.3 million in contractual raises and will keep many jobs intact.

The school board also voted to close Clarksville

Elementary School next year, which is expected to save nearly \$1 million in efficiencies and staff reductions.

Voters will also see a proposition on the purchase of six replacement buses for \$375,000, an amount that would be bonded.

Voting will take place from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. in the High School gymnasium. You do not need to be registered to vote. For more information, visit bcasd.k12.ny.us.

Voters across the Capital District will head to the polls Tuesday, May 17, to elect members of their school boards, render judgments on referendums and either pass or reject school budget proposals that administrators across



GCSD budget cuts 40 full-time positions

The Guilderland Central School District is putting to voters an \$89 million budget for the 2011-12 school year, which is a 1.7 percent increase on what it's spending this year.

The district will be losing about \$700,000 of state aid in the coming year and will also stop receiving full-day kindergarten conversion assistance. Altogether, the budget calls for a 3.4

percent increase in the tax levy.

Included in the budget is the reduction of 40 full-time staffing positions, 31 of them faculty. 1.6 full-time administrative positions would be cut. Four administrative bargaining units and the superintendent agreed to contract changes for next year, returning a savings of \$47,000, according to the district.

If the budget goes down and a contingency budget is necessary, another \$250,000 would have to be shed.

Voters will also decide on the purchase of nine school buses at a cost of \$778,100, which would be bonded.

There are four people running for four open seats on the school board. The lowest vote-getter will finish the final year of a term

while the three others will serve three-year terms. A meet the candidates night will be hosted by the League of Women Voters on Wednesday, May 11, at 7 p.m. at the Guilderland High School.

Voting will take place from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. at elementary schools. For more information on the budget and candidates, check www.guilderlandschools.org.

RCS budget carries 3.4 percent levy hike

If voters approve the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk School District's \$42.5 million budget proposal, the tax levy would increase by about 3.4 percent next school year.

The spending plan is 0.8 percent higher than this year's budget. \$500,000 of the district's savings would be used to offset the tax levy increase.

The district will see state aid decrease by about \$2 million next year. The budget would see the elimination of 12 full-time positions, including 10.4 full-time-equivalency faculty positions (two of which would be made by means of attrition). Other cutbacks would include several bus

runs and reductions in clubs and intramural budgets.

The school board did elect to keep the district's aquatics center open. It had been proposed the facility be shuttered next year for an estimated savings of \$77,000.

The budget is below the state's contingency budget cap, but if it's voted down the district will not be required to assume a larger budget. The district is operating on a contingency budget this year.

Voting will take place in the High School gymnasium between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. For more information, visit rccsd.org.

Voorheesville budget less than this year's

Voters in the Voorheesville Central School District will be voting on a \$21.3 million budget, which is 1.8 percent less than this year's spending plan.

The tax levy would increase 2.1 percent if the budget were to be passed. Altogether, 1.5 full-time-equivalency teaching

positions would be eliminated, which would be mostly spread out across the middle school level. Average class size would be 23 or 24 students there, the district said.

The district will be seeing about \$350,000 less in state aid next year.

The reduction in teaching positions would

allow VCSD to cut its salary expenses in the coming year, but like in most districts pension and benefits will still cost more than in the current year.

Voters will also vote on a referendum that would authorize the purchase of three school buses and a used Suburban at a cost

of \$216,000.

Incumbent Gary Hubert is the only candidate running for a single open seat on the school board. He will assumedly serve another four-year term starting July 1.

Polls will be open from 2 to 9 p.m. in the Middle School foyer.

District works to stabilize facade at middle school

The main entrance to the Bethlehem Central Middle School was closed for several days last week as contractors stabilized the building's facade.

A visual inspection on Friday, April 29, revealed portions of the building's masonry were loose, and PCC Contracting spent the following Monday and Tuesday knocking down the unstable parts. Netting was also installed as an extra precaution, said district Director of Facilities and Operations Gregg Nolte.

"We've been watching this front facade and other things... We've been getting little pieces of mortar down near the front entrance and we wanted to get a closer look," he said.

The entrance was reopened on Tuesday. A side entrance was used during the closure. A full repair

of the masonry probably won't be done until class is out this summer, but Nolte emphasized the portal is safe for public use.

"All of this was preemptive; it was precautionary," he said.

"There was nothing catastrophic there. I don't want to make any similarity of what happened at Town Hall," Nolte added, referencing the March collapse of a section of the Bethlehem Town Hall's facade onto four cars parked below.

The project, including the initial inspection by Ryan-Biggs Associates of Clifton Park, will end up costing the district in the neighborhood of \$4,000, which will be covered in the operating budget. The cost of the replacement work is not yet known, but it will be a bigger project.





A musical journey

Shaker High teen to showcase his talents at upcoming gig

Jared Alpern's hands seem to move haphazardly over the keys on the organ, randomly striking notes.

But then the music starts to come together, and it's clear Alpern knows just what he's doing.

His parents say he was pretty much born knowing. He can sit down with an instrument and play something beautiful the way most people can sit down and have a conversation.

"He has perfect pitch," his mother said.

"There's no such thing as perfect pitch," Alpern replied.

The tinge of exasperation in his voice underscores the fact that despite the CDs and concert fliers that bear his name, Jared Alpern is still just a teenager. He's 14 years old and a freshman at Shaker High School — one who has darn near perfect pitch.

He rattles off all the things he likes to do: He bikes. He hikes. He kayaks. History is his favorite class, but biology is his favorite subject.

He spends a lot of his spare time playing the piano or the organ or the guitar. He doesn't have a deep philosophical reason for liking music. He likes to create stuff. In the music room in his Latham home, he likes to tinker with his instruments and his amplifiers, looking for cool sounds that he might incorporate into new songs.

As for performing live, as he will on Saturday, May 14, at the Linda WAMC's performing arts studio in Albany, "It's a really fun thing to do."

Alpern was 5 when he first sat down at the family's Steinway grand piano. He took right to it, so his parents hired a piano teacher to come and work with him.

That lasted all of two lessons.

"It was unnecessary," his mother, Laura Bulatao, said.

Bulatao is a musician herself, having studied at the Manhattan School of Music. But it didn't come as naturally to her as it does to her son. Jared learned to

read music, but he rarely does.

"When I learn songs, I can just play it," he said.

Jared's dad, Matt, doesn't play an instrument, but he has a deep love of music. He and Jared talk excitedly about all the concerts they've seen together. When Jared was 9, they took in an Allman Brothers concert at Saratoga Performing Arts Center. That was it. Jared wanted a guitar.

He got one for his 10th birthday, and soon, he started learning from Jim Wilson, the owner of Parkway Music in Clifton Park. One day, Matt mentioned to Wilson that Jared loved Hammond organs.

"It sounds different from any other instrument in the world," Jared said. "It's got a very full sound."

Wilson pointed the Alperns to Tony Perrino, a Saratoga Springs musician who is an accomplished organist. Jared started playing with Perrino in 2009, creating a musical partnership that resulted in a CD, "All Conjured Up," last year. The two frequently perform together, with Perrino chiefly playing organ and Jared guitar. They will share the stage at the Linda.

Jared said they sometimes mix up the instruments they play — "It all just depends on what we feel like."

He said he doesn't get stage fright, no matter how big a crowd he plays in front of. His dad said the bigger the stage, the more comfortable his son seems.

"This is easy for me," Jared said with a shrug.

His mom called him "a really old soul." She doesn't know how else to explain the way he has

such an innate sense for music.

For both his parents, watching Jared play is a thrill. But it's about more than his musical ability.

"It's the way he handles himself," Matt said. His son is respectful to his teachers. "He genuinely wants to learn."

That's true whether it's music or science.

"With school, he's very organized and self-sufficient," Matt said.

His mom added that he's on the high honor roll.

Jared shot her an exasperated look.

The Jared Alpern Band and friends will play at the Linda, 339 Central Ave., on Saturday, May 14, at 7 p.m. Doors open at 6 p.m. and the show starts at 7. and received a string of messages from her daughter. Luckily, cell reception had returned and Christine was safe.

But for the rest of the night, she and her husband, Peter Hackman, were glued to the television and the cell phone.

"We were just relieved. We were watching the Weather Channel and the weather people there were nearly hysterical," she said.

And with good reason. Hackman had lived through one of the worst storm systems to ever sweep the Southeast. The death toll has since climbed into the hundreds. In Tuscaloosa alone, more than 40 were dead at last count, five of them University of Alabama students. Power was out for more than a week in many areas.

Hackman's apartment escaped damage, but the tornado passed within about six blocks. Student areas and low-income neighborhoods were hit hard. Hackman has two friends who barricaded themselves in their pantry with mattresses, which probably saved their lives. The storm ripped the entire second floor off their home.

For Hackman, a graduate assistant in the school's recreation department, the few days following the storm were a flurry of activity. The school's recreation center was designated as an emergency shelter, and so she headed there to help. Over the coming hours, students and residents would straggle in through the

door, some injured, many newly homeless. The workers did what they could, providing first aid, new clothing and a place to sleep for the night.

"It was just craziness," Hackman said. "We were all running on adrenaline for the next two days."

During all of this she had a chance to survey some of the damage. The tornado had cut a path of

graduate assistant job.

Abaray said seeing her daughter was therapeutic, and also that she's proud she's heading back to continue helping.

"I was just proud of her. She hung in there. I'd be a basket case if I realized that people were dying and people had been killed or missing," Abaray said. "She was really able to pull herself together and spend the next couple of days pitching in."

Finding work shouldn't be hard. In the aftermath of the storm, as communications have come back up, social media has served as a tool to direct volunteers to the areas that need help the most. In Tuscaloosa, the conversation has switched from how to recover to how to rebuild. Though the disaster has been horrible, there have also been instances of kindness and support.

"It was just neighbors helping neighbors and strangers helping strangers," Hackman said.

For Hackman, Delmar is her hometown but Tuscaloosa is her home. Helping with the recovery is a foregone conclusion. But the entire area is in shambles, and she asked that people here in New York consider making a donation to the Red Cross and keeping those who are still rebuilding in their thoughts and prayers.

move computer lines, technology lines, phone lines, all the things necessary for us to run the school district's financial and business needs," Tebbano said.

The district office is also home to the superintendent's office, the registrar and other functions, but when it comes to moving, the business and finance operations will require the heaviest lift. The district's recent facility feasibility study suggests the business offices could be moved to a loft space over the High School Library Media Center and other offices could be located in a set of classroom spaces. This wouldn't impact class size or programming, according to the district.

There are a number of meeting spaces at the high school to accommodate school board meetings, which are usually held at the district offices.

The plans are pretty much all set for when the school board decides to pull the trigger on a move. The cost is pegged at \$42,800. The district won't embark on that project until more is known about the value of the office building and the sale process.

The idea of selling the district offices was raised by a think tank the district convened to study its long-term fiscal position. That committee also suggested shuttering an elementary school, and the school board voted in late March to close Clarksville. There are no plans to sell that building.





There's not a lot of freshmen members sitting on their hands. Everybody got up and debated the budget, every one of the freshman class got up and spoke," McLaughlin said. And while he said he was fairly pleased with the budget this year (he voted against the Assembly version, saying it was inequitable to Upstate schools), McLaughlin was adamant that changes must be made to the state of New York, especially when it comes to controlling property taxes and making the state more business friendly.

Though lawmakers seemed poised to at long

last enact a property tax cap this year, this popular proposal took a dive after Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver announced he would not bring a cap to the floor of that body. McLaughlin sees this as a prime example of the Upstate vs. Downstate battle that's always ongoing at the Capitol, and took Silver to task for blocking it.

"I think it's clearly time to get this thing to a vote," he said. "Stop giving the members protection. You have to stand up and be counted. One way or another, you have to stand up and say we're going to do it, or not going to do it."

The Assemblyman was also critical of Gov. Andrew Cuomo's much-lauded mandate relief efforts. Without a serious change in the way

the state controls local governments and schools, he said, a property tax cap would be a win for taxpayers but a death knell for schools and towns.

"To me, they do go hand in hand," he said.

"I was a vocal critic of that. There's not a lot of meat on the bone here; it's all window dressing," McLaughlin said of the mandate relief efforts. He added there should be more private sector input, and bureaucrats should be cut out of the picture.

In fact, the assemblyman has made modernizing government a key agenda point. He's cosponsored a bill from Assemblyman Jim Tedisco, R-Schenectady, that would see legislation and other paperwork be used only as digital copies,

greatly reducing the millions state government spends on printing every year.

He also said government should adopt a 401(k)-type retirement plan for new employees and do away with the pension system, which accounts for a hefty share of state and local government spending.

McLaughlin is a member of the following committees: banks, children and families, real property taxation, small business and tourism, parks, arts and sports development.

BC maintenance fleet vandalized

Police seek information

Nearly all of the Bethlehem Central School District's maintenance vehicle fleet was vandalized over the weekend.

A district representative said the damage to Operations and Maintenance Department vehicles includes slashed tires, broken windows, mud and grass put into fuel tanks and swastikas etched into glass and paint. Fifteen vehicles and seven tractors and grass mowers were damaged or defaced. There are 22 vehicles and 11 tractors in the fleet.

School buses are kept at another facility. Though there is a gate at the Operations and Maintenance building, it is otherwise surrounded by woods.

The equipment was parked outside at the district's Operations and Maintenance building on Elm Avenue, not far from the High School. The

damage was discovered on the morning of Monday, May 9, according to the district.

"...this is a deeply troubling incident, both in terms of the specific nature of some of the vandalism, as well as what it means to our operations and the community's investment in maintaining the school district," Superintendent Michael Tebbano said in a letter to the community.

In addition to swastikas, several vehicles were otherwise scratched or marred. At least one had an obscenity etched into its door.

Contractors were on site Monday replacing the roughly 40 tires damaged. The transportation department lent a hand and some staff were able to use their personal vehicles for the day.


"This really hampered operations," said Director of Facilities and Operations Gregg Nolte. "A lot of people were just stuck here."

The district did not immediately have a figure on what repairing the vandalism will cost.

The Bethlehem Police Department is conducting an investigation and anyone with information is asked to call police at 439-9973.





Crews replace tires after vandals damaged Operations and Maintenance Department vehicles the weekend of May 7 and 8.



should be on their way to the quarterfinal round.

• One yard has made all the difference in high school softball.

Since moving the pitching rubber three feet back, hitters have gained equal footing with pitchers. Games are no longer 1-0 contests decided in 75 minutes or less. Now, many

games feature several hits and multiple runs on both sides.

"You're seeing higher scores now," said Shaker coach Leigh Stevens, whose team knocked off Shenendehowa 3-2 last Friday. "You're seeing hitters making more contact."

"It gives the hitters a little more time to relax [at the plate]," added Shaker first baseman Emily Johnson, who belted the

game-winning, two-run homer in the bottom of the sixth inning.

The greater distance from rubber to home plate has also changed the make-up of a dominant pitcher. It used to be that fastball pitchers had the most success in high school softball. But these days, off-speed pitchers such as Bethlehem's Meagan Sullivan are the ones who are fooling opposing hitters the most.

Frankly, this is a development whose time has been long overdue. It's good to see softball hitters have a chance to make solid contact, rather than having to resort to bunts and slap hits in order to reach base. The game is more exciting when a 1-0 lead isn't safe.

Staying with softball for one more moment, I have now seen three of the four teams that I consider to be the top contenders for the Section II Class AA title: Bethlehem, Shenendehowa and Shaker. And frankly, there isn't much that separates them - as well as Colonie - from each other. They all have solid pitching, strong defense and good hitters throughout the lineup. We'll see how it all shakes out in Sections.

• American Hockey League playoff update: the Charlotte Checkers (aka the former Albany River Rats) are now in the

Eastern Conference finals after knocking off Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, while the Albany Devils are in the middle of their off-season workouts following a last-place finish. Wounds, meet salt.

• Moving to the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League is already working wonders for the Albany Dutchmen.

The Dutchmen have signed 19 players for the 2011 season, and nearly all of them are from NCAA Division I schools. That is a far cry from their past two seasons in the New York Collegiate Baseball League, where they drew mostly Division II and Division III talent.

Just because they signed Division I talent doesn't mean that the Dutchmen will be necessarily more successful in the newly-created PGCBL. The other seven teams - Amsterdam, Glens Falls, Cooperstown, Mohawk Valley, Elmira, Newark and Watertown - have also been signing DI players, so the playing field should be even. That guarantees competitiveness, but not wins.

Still, this is a positive step for a franchise that had a hard time attracting talent - not to mention fans - in its first two years in Albany.

• Finally I want to wish Phil Jackson a happy retirement in Montana, and

that he should try to forget his final game as head coach of the Los Angeles Lakers. A man who has coached 12 championship teams in the NBA and CBA (let's not forget those 1984 Albany Patroons) deserved better than to be blown out 122-86 by Dallas, and see one of his players, Andrew Bynum, commit one of the most flagrant fouls in NBA history when the game was well in hand. Ugly does not begin to describe what





"We just find openings. There is no secret behind it," said Battaglia of her on-field chemistry with Frink, who assisted on three of Battaglia's five goals.

"Their timing was a bit off early on, and credit UMBC for that," said Battaglia. "But they find a way."

The Great Danes scored three more goals in the first eight minutes of the second half before settling into a pattern where they held the ball in UMBC's half of the field and took only a handful of shots.

"We were still going to goal, but there was nothing forced about what we did," said Battaglia.

UMBC ended its scoring

drought with 2:10 left in the second half, but the Retrievers were hopelessly too far behind to make a comeback.

Ariana Parker and Rachael Burek each added a pair of goals for UAlbany, which held a 19-10 advantage in shots.

Delmar teen beats adults at park race

Sydney Shaw was running to her beat when she heard "first woman" being shouted from the sideline.

The Delmar teen didn't immediately realize that it was in reference to her.

"I ran with headphones in ... so I didn't know if I heard him right," said Shaw.

It was only when Shaw neared the finish line at last month's Dodge the Deer 5-kilometer cross country race at Schodack State Park that she fully understood that she was the first woman finisher.

"When it was announced that I was the first female, I think many people were surprised, but I got a lot of congratulations," said Shaw.

Shaw not only won the women's division, but she did so in style. The 14-year-old Bethlehem Central High School student finished with a time of 21:11, which placed her in the top 25 overall of a race that was predominantly an adult race. The next-fastest woman, 28-year-old Susana Garcia Romer of Rensselaer, trailed Shaw by more than one minute.

"There were a lot of people," said Shaw. "I don't know if there were more than last year, but there were some good runners there."

Shaw - who plays lacrosse and field hockey at Bethlehem - said the key to her success was being well rested for the race.

"I ate good the night before, and I slept good the night before," said Shaw. "So, I came into the race feeling good."

To set the right pace, Shaw played up-tempo pop

Danes accomplish dream

UAlbany shuts down UMBC to win first America East title

The University at Albany Great Danes left no doubt who is the best America East women's lacrosse team.

NCAA Division I's lone undefeated team built a 7-2 halftime lead and cruised to an 11-4 victory over Maryland-Baltimore County in Saturday's America East Tournament championship game at John Fallon Field.

The win gave UAlbany (17-0) the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament - the first in the program's Division I history. The Great Danes received the No. 7 seed and a first-round game Sunday

at Dartmouth.

"We're blazing a new trail, and we're the first," said UAlbany senior defender and Guilderland High School graduate Nikki Branchini. "We're really excited."

"I couldn't be happier," said senior attacker Jodi Battaglia, who led UAlbany with five goals and two assists. "We [seniors] have waited for four years to get there."

The game was a rematch of the regular season finale, which UAlbany won 12-11. But unlike that game, the Great Danes never allowed UMBC to get close once they built their five-goal lead. Ball control was the key, as UAlbany possessed the ball for much of the game. The Retrievers went more than 46 minutes between goals at one point.

"I was happy with the pace of play," said UAlbany coach John Battaglino. "We just needed to do a

better job of managing the game and picking our spots [to take shots]."

UAlbany goaltender Anna Berman also played a role in shutting down UMBC. The freshman made three point-blank saves in the first half that swung the momentum in the Great Danes' favor.

"I love looking back and seeing the ball in her stick," Branchini said of Berman. "She's a freshman, but she doesn't play like a freshman."

"The girls just picked up the momentum from those saves," said Battaglino.

UMBC's Amanda Pappas scored on a free-position shot with 18:15 left in the first half to tie the game at 2, but UAlbany ripped off five goals in a seven-minute time span after that to establish its 7-2 lead. Battaglia scored two of the five goals in that stretch - receiving assists from Taylor Frink both times.



Freshman goaltender Anna Berman literally sucked the fight out of UMBC in the first half. Not only did she stop three point-blank shots that could have kept the Retrievers in the game, but she also cradled the ball for more than three minutes during a defensive clear. UMBC never bothered pressuring Berman for the ball, despite trailing 7-2 at that point. The Retrievers just stood there guarding all of the other UAlbany players.

From that point on, UMBC never challenged - a stunning development considering that the Retrievers

fought tooth-and-nail with UAlbany only one week earlier on the same field before the Great Danes pulled out a 12-11 victory.

If UAlbany can continue playing at the level it showed Saturday, I think the Great Danes can make a run at the NCAA Division I title. It won't be easy, especially since No. 2 Northwestern could be their quarterfinal round opponent, but they possess many of the qualities of past champions - balanced scoring (Jodi Battaglia, Taylor Frink, Ariana Parker and Rachael Burek), a tough goaltender (Berman), a shut-down defender (Nikki Branchini) and a great coach (John Battaglino).

UAlbany still has to get past a Dartmouth team that beat No. 1 Maryland two weeks ago. But if the Great Danes play this game like the 17 that preceded it, they
