EDUCATION Open discussion about net neutrality

BCHS club hosts net neutrality conversation with FCC Commish, U.S. Rep. Paul Tonko

BETHLEHEM — Despite a series of technical difficulties, Bethlehem Central High School's Students for Peace and Survival (SPAS) Club held an informative conversation with Federal Communications Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel and U.S. Congressman Paul Tonko to discuss the recent repeal of net neutrality rules by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and its impact on internet customers.

Last December, Rosenworcel was one of only two commissioners on the fivemember FCC to vote against rescinding net neutrality regulations, implemented in 2015 under Democratic FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler. The net neutrality rules essentially classified internet providers as telecom providers, giving the FCC broad powers to regulate providers on everything from prices to privacy practices. Rosenworcel agreed to speak to the students after SPAS club members reached out to the FCC with their

concerns about the decision would impact students and other internet users.

The 3-2 decision was split along party lines. Both Democratic FCC Commissioners — Rosenworcel and Mignon Clyburn — voted against repealing the regulations, while all three Republicans voted to repeal, including Chairman Ajit Pai. (Pai released a video the night before, featuring himself dressed as Santa clutching a fidget spinner, brandishing a lightsaber and Instagramming his food to mock widespread criticism against the contentious move.)

During the net conferenced discussion via Google Hangouts, curious students wanted to know what, exactly, net neutrality is. SPAS President Connor Chung, a junior at BCHS, negotiated the conversation on behalf of Bethlehem, relaying questions from students to Rosenworcel and Tonko during the half-hour discussion. When the internet connection failed on more than one occasion, both students in Delmar and Rosenworcel's and Tonko's staffs in Washington, D.C. joked about how the failures were apropos to a conversation about internet reliability.

"Net neutrality means you can go where you want and do what you want online without your broadband provider getting in the way or making choices for you," explained Rosenworcel. "Without it, your broadband provider has the right to block websites, to throttle online content and engage in pay-for-play prioritization schemes.

Essentially, providers will now be permitted to block or favor certain websites, affecting how quickly they download compared to other sites. Opponents of the decision believe it will result in unfair competitive advantages, especially for larger companies, and could negatively impact freedom of speech on the internet.

"Net neutrality, for me," said Tonko, "is about freedom: Freedom of speech, of opportunity, of being able to interact with the world.'

"The future of the internet is the future of everything," said Rosenworcel. "It's where we connect, it's where we create, it's where you're going to share ideas, build community and, in time, probably build businesses. I think it's important that we make sure that that platform is as open to as many ideas and services as possible, and has as few gatekeepers as possible."

Asked what happens next in the fight for net neutrality, Rosenworcel said she sees several things that could impact her agency's decision, including: legal challenges to the FCC vote; legislation at the state level that would supersede the federal decision; efforts in Congress, like a bill sponsored by Tonko that could roll back the decision; or other long-term

Tonko, who represents the school district in the U.S. House of Representatives, is co-sponsoring a bill that he hopes will ensure net neutrality. The Capital Region, he said, is a mecca of innovation. "Greater Albany," he said, "was cited as the third best in the country for innovation job growth." According to Tonko, innovation businesses and startups of all kinds are dependent on an open internet for their success

He also thanked SPAS for the invitation to speak and commended the club for its tenacity in seeking out information about the FCC decision to end net neutrality. Tonko said he is concerned that a lack of open internet access could present roadblocks for students who rely on connectivity for homework and to complete college applications.

Thanking the students "for caring so much,"Tonko said, "This is how our democracy grows. This is how our community strengthens."

SPAS is focused on raising student awareness of social issues through a guest speaker series (last year, its members hosted state gubernatorial candidate Zephyr Teachout, whose running mate, Tim Wu, coined the term 'net neutrality') and by helping both local and global communities. The club's various fundraisers also collect funds for charities that fight poverty and hunger.



Brand new year, new Town Board

Bethlehem board gets down to business in first meeting of 2018; appoints, organizes, appreciates

BETHLEHEM — At the town board's organizational meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 10, Supervisor David VanLuven's first order of business was to appoint Giles Wagoner to serve a one-year term on the board seat he vacated after he was elected supervisor last fall.

Wagoner was sworn in by Town Clerk Nanci Moquin on a Bible held by Councilwoman Joyce Becker, after VanLuven explained that he was chosen from a field of 22 candidates for his experience and familiarity with town issues.

Becker was later named Deputy Supervisor by VanLuven, a position that does not come with additional pay. Item 4 on the agenda set the salaries of the elected officials: Supervisor - \$118,017, Town Board Members (each) - \$15,571, Town Clerk - \$76,926, Receiver of Taxes - \$55,604, Superintendent of Highways - \$103,996, and Town Justice (each) -\$51,466.

In a little more than half an hour, the board approved more than 60 housekeeping items such as re-appointing certain board members, department staff and town counsel, setting salaries and fees, adoption of the town purchasing and investment policies, and authorization of elected officials to handle town funds, among other things.

VanLuven made a series of

announcements, commending the town's Department of Public Works for fixing the six water main breaks that have already occurred in 2018 and thanking residents for coming out to celebrate First Night in frigid temperatures, as well as the sponsors that made the event possible.

He also noted that the town's Receiver of Taxes, Alicia Roney, received \$3 million in 2018 property taxes, in just two days, from residents who chose to file before federal changes could take effect, and thanked them for their patience.

"Normally, tax payments come in in a steady stream over several weeks," said Van Luven. "But, this year, because of changes to the tax code, thousands and thousands of residents submitted their payments in two days. Alicia and others are working hard to process all of the payments that they've received, but so many came in so quickly that it overwhelmed our usual capacity."

The new supervisor also recognized town employees for working to ensure that three residents, displaced from their homes due to severe water damage that caused part of their senior living development to be evacuated, had somewhere to go.

"Jack Brennan, the director of the Emergency Management Office, worked with our police department and the Good Samaritan Village senior community to find safe places for them to stay," said VanLuven. "This is one of those small things for most of us, but it has a real impact and I think it shows the character of our town employees and our dedication to taking care of our residents."

The board will meet next on Wednesday, Jan 24, at 6 p.m. at Bethlehem Town Hall.

Child disappears from Walmart, found in Albany four hours later

BETHLEHEM – A 12-year-old boy missing from the Walmart on Route 9W in Glenmont was found four hours later on Broadway in Albany.

According to Commander Adam Hornick, police received the call at approximately 11:12 a.m. Surveillance video showed the child, who was shopping with his parents, voluntarily leaving the store and heading south on Route 9W.

At around 2:56 p.m., members of the Bethlehem Police Department located the child on Broadway. He was not injured and there is was no criminal conduct involved in this incident, according to Hornick.

Bethlehem police were assisted by the Albany County Sheriff's K-9 unit and a State Police aviation unit in their search.

Traffic stop leads to arrest

ALBANY — State Police conducted a traffic stop on Sunday, Jan. 14, that resulted in the arrest of a New York City man on several drug-related and weapons charges.

State Police stopped Simon Goris, 49, in the northbound lanes of the Thruway early Sunday morning, after he allegedly violated several vehicle and traffic laws, including a suspended registration.

During their roadside investigation of the vehicle, State Police discovered Goris was not only allegedly transporting a large amount of drugs, including almost a kilogram of cocaine, 104 grams of crack, along with marijuana, investigators reportedly found drug paraphernalia and a loaded handgun.

Goris was charged with felony criminal possession of a controlled substance in the first degree, three counts of felony criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree, criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree (a misdemeanor), criminal use of drug paraphenalia (a misdemeanor), felony criminal possession of a weapon in the third degree, and unlawful possession of marijuana, a violation.

He was arraigned in the Village of Ravena Court before Judge Charles Brooks and remanded to the Albany County jail without bail.

Joyce elected as chairman of legislature

Choice indicates changes in body's leadership style could be forthcoming

ALBANY COUNTY — Long established Democratic leadership took a hit earlier this week during the Albany County Legislature's first meeting of the year on Monday, Jan. 8, when independently minded majority member Andrew Joyce (D-9) was unanimously elected chairman of the legislature.

The organizational meeting began with the swearing in of Vicky Plotsky, the new Democrat representing the county's 38th district in New Scotland and Bethlehem. Plotsky, the eighth woman to join this 39-member legislature, represented the deciding vote to support Joyce in the 29-member Democratic caucus. The 14 members who opposed his election were all in favor of re-electing Sean Ward (D-16), the most recent chairman and the favored candidate of long-time Majority Leader Frank Commisso, Sr. (D-11).

"A number of members have expressed frustration with the leadership not engaging with our members," said Joe O'Brien (D-25), one of the legislators who approached Joyce about running for the position a month ago. "Some of them have talents in different fields, and they just seemed to be not tapping into that. Andrew, on the other hand, is a young individual who wants to engage all members."

"I don't want to impugn Sean at all but, in terms of his leadership style, the membership didn't see a whole lot of daylight between him and the majority leader," said Joyce. "And I think leadership of the body should be about the members, every single one of them. It's about listening."

Two years ago, reform-minded members of the majority party tried unsuccessfully to unseat Commisso - who has led the party since 1993 — and get their own chairperson, Alison McLean Lane (D-14), elected to lead the legislature. Entrenched party leadership prevailed in both cases and Ward was elected to succeed outgoing Chairman Shawn Morse, the now-embattled mayor of Cohoes. (Incidentally, Joyce, who was a member of the reform coalition, ultimately voted for Ward in 2016, along with three other coalition members.)

In 2016, the reform coalition was also disappointed when four Republican legislators chose to support Ward and, by extension, Commisso. The resulting division within the GOP caucus ultimately ended in the unexpected choice of Frank Mauriello (R-27) as minority leader, after presumptive leader Peter Crouse (R-24) voted for Ward. That division, according to minority member Mark Grimm (R-29), has persisted within the 10-member GOP conference. Six members, including Grimm and Mauriello, once again voted with the reformist agenda, which they believe will give a greater voice to minority members, both in committee leadership positions and on the legislative floor.

"Andrew and his supporters really have a lot in common with our conference," said Mauriello, "in that we're looking to reform Albany County government and want it to be more open." He said there have been times when legislation not supported by the majority leadership has simply languished in committee, without being given a chance in a floor vote. He also said independent redistricting, something supported by Joyce, is a priority of the minority conference.

"It was time for a change," Mauriello said, adding that Joyce and other Democrat reformists assured their Republican counterparts that they would be given a bigger role in legislative committee assignments. "You will be seeing Republicans chairing some of these committees as well," he said.

"There are four factions, really," said Grimm, noting that the four Republicans who voted to support Ward have a history of voting "mostly with Commisso. We don't talk much publicly about it, but it's the reality and people ought to know what the score is. The Democrats are split, and the Republicans are too."

This year, however, both parties resolved in caucus to vote with one voice to elect Joyce.

"It was a tight race for chairman," said Grimm. "Let's not pretend it wasn't. [The majority] chose to elect [Joyce] unanimously as a courtesy, after they realized they didn't have enough Republican votes to elect Ward."

Touting Joyce's military service and record of passing bipartisan legislation, Legislator Gary Domalewicz (D-10), chairman of the Audit and Finance Committee, nominated Joyce for the position and was seconded by Sam Fein (D-6), a young, firstterm legislator representing the newest minority-majority district in downtown Albany.

"Andrew has the tenacity and drive to lead the legislature, and I am glad to work closely with him to support his vision," said Domalewicz. "I look forward to working with him on launching new ideas and initiatives to

improve Albany County."

Joe O'Brien suggested that Joyce was able to secure not only the support of Fein, who voted for Ward two years ago, but that of Wanda Willingham (D-3) as well, due to a perception that legislative leadership has been unresponsive to minorities in Albany County. Willingham, who was a successful complainant in two lawsuits accusing the county of violating minority rights during redistricting, walked Joyce to his new seat at the front of the legislative chamber, along with his brother, Legislator Raymond Joyce (D-13).

Both Joyces are the sons of Harold L. Joyce, who formerly served as chairman of the Albany County Legislature and chairman of the Albany County Democratic Committee, and for whom the county office building on State Street in Albany is named.

"I am glad to support Andrew and am excited to work closely with him," said Willingham. "Andrew brings a fresh perspective to the role and this next chapter of the legislature is going to produce positive and tangible results that we will all be part of and proud of."

"My number one agenda priority is to figure out what each member's top three priorities are," said Joyce, "and figuring out how to utilize the staff to make those things happen." He also said he wants to bring county government into the current century, and has plans to implement a modernization committee, headed by both parties, to look at ways to make that happen. One immediate change he's looking at is the reduction of paper waste through improving electronic access to lengthy agendas. Another thing he said he wants to do is improve outreach to county residents.

Commisso congratulated Joyce on his election in a press release, saying, "We recognize that it's a new era of leadership for the legislature, and we wish Andrew Joyce much success. I look forward to working with the new chairman."

"We have a person that's coming in to change," Commisso said later. "We've had lots of changes in the Democratic party over the years, and I've been

LOOKING BACK

BETHLEHEM — The changing of the calendar to a new year turns many of us pensive and causes us to think back on auld lang syne. Such was the case for Ruth McDowell, a former longtime resident of Delmar, who was reflecting back on her days as a "blushing bride" in upstate New York in 1941 when she wrote her old hometown newspaper, The Spotlight.

"It's winter in Delmar and a new year," she wrote in January 2005, when she was living in Miami, Fla., after her husband, Authur, had passed away. "It's time to sit in front of burning logs and let their glow take you back to past years."

The former educator and freelance writer continued to pen a "once upon a time" story intended to walk readers down the proverbial Memory Lane, to which only former neighbors would recognize and recent residents could make out the ghosts through today's townscape. As Delaware Avenue, Delmar's Main Street, is reconstructed to recapture its glory as the community's center of commerce, McDowell's letter seems all the more appropriate to share today.

The following is the rest of her letter.

A stroll down Memory Lane

Reader's letter takes us on a historic walk down Delaware Avenue

This is a "once upon a time" story because, though true, it seems like a fairy tale now. I was a blushing bride when I moved to Delmar in 1941, and we didn't even have a key for the little house we rented because nobody locked their doors.

After all, Dave Main, the only policeman in town, patrolled the street on foot and all was well.

With a pocketful of change, I could dash to the store and buy a menu to please a new husband. Bread was a nickel a loaf, but man cannot live on bread alone, as the saying goes. Two lamb cutlets were just 35 cents and Dempf Pastry Shop was right on Delaware Avenue and specialized in apple squares at just five cents a piece and very delicious.

Waltermire's drug store was across the street and had a soda fountain with just three flavors available, vanilla, chocolate and strawberry. For a bit of refreshment, you might treat yourself to an ice cream cone for another five pennies. (the last cone I had was at Toll Gate for \$2.50. Of course it was a

triple-decker and made with an exotic rum flavoring.)

On special days, we patronized Libby's Restaurant a few doors away and enjoyed a full-course dinner for 75 cents. This included a midmeal dish of sherbet to "enhance the palate" before the main course. Adams Hardware was a big asset. Earl had

stockpiled things you couldn't buy elsewhere. It was a treasure trove.

We lived on a cul-de-sac so all our neighbors became close friends. Frequently one of them churned a bucket of ice cream, and all gathered for the treat and then harmonized around the piano, just as you see in old movies on television.

There was no TV, so entertainment was mainly homemade. There was a tiny theater "The Pit," which catered mostly to the young set for cowboy pictures on Saturdays.

In the space of four years, several of us who were already neighbors, moved to larger houses near each other and stayed friends for many, many years.

Later, when we all had children, Dooley's gas station on Delaware Avenue and Oakwood Place became a haven for them. It was not just the penny candy he sold that was the attraction, but Mr. Dooley would repair their bikes or fill their tires and not charge anything.

At that time the Fireman's Fair was a big event in the town, a fund-raiser for those loyal volunteers. I still treasure a glass



pitcher my son finally won after tossing away so many nickels that he used up his whole allowance, but he knew I collected pitchers, and he wanted to surprise me.

The present site of Bethlehem Central Middle School was the senior high and the annual Christmas festival, later called White Christmas, was held there. It brought the whole town together with 500 people appearing on stage during the evening. There was a Delmar Men's Orchestra, school choirs, a pageant and Home Scene, which I often wrote and directed.

It fostered a great feeling of togetherness with hopes for peace in the near future because war had been declared and made a difference in our lives.

My husband was drafted but was sent back home because an erratic heart beat. Meanwhile, as a member of the Motor Corps, I drove a Red Cross truck during the war, delivering medical materials to all the churches where they folded bandages to be sent abroad. One night, I had to meet a troop train in Rensselaer to dispense boxes of lunches that I had picked up at headquarters.

A whole train of soldiers was heading for New York City to go overseas, and this would be their last meal until they boarded the ships. All lights were off, and they made a quick stop to pick up our food.

Since the candles of my birthday cake could now heat up a room, I have moved to the sunny climes of Florida to be near my son Walter McDowell, who attended kindergarten through graduation in Bethlehem Central schools.

> My mind goes back to those thoughts of earlier years. We all look up at the same stars and pray that wars will cease and terrorism ends, and that we may return to that peaceful realm of a small town we once knew those many years ago.

McDowell would see the change of one more calendar before joining her husband in eternal slumber. The ode to her hometown could be adopted by many communities throughout the Capital District; just replace the names.

We're thankful Ms. McDowell did not forget her old acquaintances.

Know the right-of-way

he prospect of gaining a crosswalk in the front of our offices through the Delaware Avenue Street Enhancement left us rather excited when it was proposed last year.

Residents who find themselves needing to cross our town's main street are too familiar with the challenges of navigating through the steady stream of vehicular traffic during rush hour. It's a dangerous situation. From our windows, we often see drivers driving above the speed limit and carelessly ignoring the right of way of pedestrians and on-coming traffic, alike.

It was only two years ago when we witnessed a pedestrian-vehicle accident in front of our office. In that case, the pedestrian came off the bus and was crossing the street before being struck by an oncoming car. But, authorities found that no one was at fault. There was no crosswalk, so pedestrians had to cross the street at their own risk.

Since the crosswalk was installed in front of our office, we've noticed it has

done little good for pedestrians. Though it has been New York state law for well over 20 years, most drivers do not yield to people attempting to walk across the street in a crosswalk. One could argue that drivers still have to familiarize themselves to the new street markers, but let's be honest about that for a second. There's a crosswalk in front of the Delmar Post Office, and has been there for decades, and many drivers still ignore it and the people trying to use it.

People need to understand the definition of the "right of way." May we suggest looking of the "New York State Department of Motor Vehicles Driver's Manual." It's online in PDF format, which means you can do a keyword search. You'll find in particular "drivers must yield to pedestrians who legally use marked or unmarked crosswalks. This means you slow down or stop if necessary." Yeah, we took that directly from the book.

While we're on the subject, we can talk about those of you leaving the Bethlehem Central Middle School parking lot at the beginning and conclusion of each school day.

"A vehicle that enters a roadway from a driveway, private road or another put that is not a roadway, must stop and yield the right-of-way to traffic on the roadway and to pedestrians."

That would mean that if you are leaving a parking lot, you are not in traffic. Any other car on the road, however, is and therefore has the right-of-way. In this case, it means they go before you. Nowhere does it state any provisions for cars with more horsepower or those assessed at a high market value. It simply states that if you're not in traffic, and someone else is, you stay.

On the flip side, there's a peculiar behavior we've noticed with residents who decide to walk and jog around town. In Bethlehem, we're fortunate to live in a town with an exceptional network of sidewalks, but a lot of us choose to walk on the road. As we pose the argument to motorists that they recognize and follow the right-of-way, pedestrians need to exercise more common sense. Walk on the sidewalk, pay attention to oncoming traffic and, even if you're using a well-marked crosswalk, don't walk into traffic until you're confident motorists see you.

Though we make reference to our highly coveted crosswalk outside our offices, this message is not entirely selfserving. As your local newspaper, we often find ourselves at a variety of accidents, many of which would have been prevented if someone slowed down, exercised a little common sense, and drove down our streets the right way.

part of that change. I was one of the people that called for change at various times on different issues.

"I don't think it's a referendum on past years of leadership," he said. "I think we've had very good leadership. But from time to time, people may decide that they want to advance themselves and it's a democratic process."

While there are rumblings that a democratic member may challenge Commisso for leadership of the party in coming weeks, Commisso says he is not concerned. "I have two more years remaining in my seat," he said. "I run with the term of the Legislature."

Other members have pointed out that the county charter is unclear on the topic of party leadership and are not ruling out the possibility of a challenge in the wake of the recent reform victory.

"I think this is a watershed moment for our Legislature and for Albany County government," said O'Brien.

"I am thrilled by the vote of confidence by a bipartisan group of my peers in the Legislature and pledge to bring my vision of collaborative and positive change to the Legislature's activities," Joyce said. "I am grateful for this support and look forward to an era of progress that will utilize the skills and talents of all of my colleagues. I also want to thank Sean Ward for his dedicated years of leadership to the Legislature and look forward to working closely with him in my new role."

Legislators earn \$23,084 a year; the annual pay for chair is \$38,477.







A marvel of science and imagination

Troupe of magicians plans to amaze and surprise Proctors crowd this weekend


SCHENECTADY — Magician Kevin James goes by the moniker "The Inventor" for good reason.

Before any good act sees time on the stage, James said it starts as an idea flushed out on pen and paper. The performance of a magician involves just as much science as it does entertainment.

"Magicians have a lot of tools in their arsenal," said James. The physics behind the slight of hand action help define the logistics of the act, but "lots of psychology elements" help create the wow factor that turns an experiment into magic. "Scientists are the easiest people to fool, because they already think they know everything. You can just gently suggest something and they're going to jump to the conclusion, but you're taking a back door. Kids are the hardest to fool, in fact, because their minds aren't closed with these assumptions. They think out of the box. They don't really have a box."

James is known for his innovative illusions. The awardwinning magician has not only wowed audiences, but has also earned the respect of his peers within the magician fraternity with his inventions. He has created unique effects used in shows of famous magicians including Doug Henning and Mark Wilson. His "Floating Rose" trick is performed by David Copperfield.

He is an accomplished knife thrower, archer, escape artist, marksman, martial artist, free diver, and free climber. Unlike the other performers in the show, Jonathan is not a magician or illusionist. However, he will leave the audience breathless with his deathdefying stunts.

"It's the five top magicians in the world doing their best material," said James. "They all have different styles, vibes and flavors, and we're all at the top of our game, right now."

The girls are back

TROY— Bob Dylan's scathing words to an unnamed friend in "Positively 4th Street" contrast in nature to the friendships made in the Troy bar that once shared the song's name.

Unlike the Greenwich Village sycophants Dylan described in his 1965 hit, these friends return.



How to avoid **muscle soreness**

Four easy tips to avoid fatigue

uscle soreness can affect people from all walks of life. While exercise enthusiasts who work out several times per week may feel like they should be immune to muscle soreness, this potentially painful condition that can adversely affect quality of life can fell even the most ardent fitness fanatic.

Those who find themselves routinely battling muscle soreness can employ the following tactics to feel better and enjoy the fruits of their labors in the gym.

• Listen to your body. Daily exercise can greatly benefit long-term health, but it's important that men and women listen to their bodies, paying attention to any signs that it might be time for a break. Each person is different, but exercise aficionados who recognize any abnormal signs such as unexplained fatigue or cramps may need to take a day off. Bodies need time to recover after a workout.

• Get adequate sleep. Getting enough sleep provides recovery time. The National Sleep Foundation recommends that adults between the ages of 18 and 64 years of age get between seven and nine hours of sleep per night. The NSF recommends adults 65 and older get between seven and eight hours of sleep per night.

• Don't overdo it. Pushing a body too hard increases a person's risk of injury or illness. Muscles that are overtaxed will very likely begin to feel a type of pain known as delayed onset muscle soreness, or DOMS. The American College of Sports Medicine notes that any type of activity that places unaccustomed loads on muscle may lead to DOMS, but activities such as strength training exercises, walking down hills, jogging, step



aerobics, and jumping are known examples of contributors to DOMS. Such activities should not necessarily be avoided, but it's important that men and women not push themselves to the point of overexertion when performing them.

• Stay hydrated. Muscle soreness may appear if men and women are not drinking enough water before, during or after their workouts. A dehydrated body's muscles do not have enough electrolytes, and that can be contributing to the feelings of soreness some exercise enthusiasts feel. Drink lots of water throughout the day, and don't forget to bring a water bottle along to the gym when working out.

Muscle soreness can be painful and difficult to deal with. But the solution to address such soreness is oftentimes very simple.

Blackened Shrimp and Corn Chowder

hen winter arrives, colder temperatures typically arrive as well. Staying warm on cold winter days can sometimes be challenging, but food can be just the thing to make you feel warm on a chilly day.

Chowder is a robust dish that can stick to the ribs while warming people up. Just about anything, including beer, can be added to chowder, making it a uniquely flavorful dish. Ideal for cold days, the following recipe for "Blackened Shrimp and Corn Chowder" from John Holl's "The American Craft Beer Cookbook" (Storey) can be just what you need to warm up.

Ingredients: Serves eight to ten

- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
 1 medium Spanish onion, finely chopped
- *celery stalks, finely chopped*
- 2 medium banana peppers, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup red or amber ale Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1 pound fresh shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 2 teaspoons chili powder
- 2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- 11/2 cups fresh or frozen corn
- 4 cups fish broth
- 1 large sweet potato, baked and mashed



Fresh dill, finely chopped

Instructions:

Heat 1 tablespoon of the olive oil in a soup pot over medium heat. Add the onion, celery and banana peppers, and cook, stirring occasionally, until the onions are translucent, 5 to 7 minutes. Add the ale and salt and pepper to taste. Reduce the heat to medium-low and continue cooking and stirring until the beer's foam subsides and the liquid reduces by half, about 5 minutes. Rinse the shrimp under cold water and pat dry with a paper towel. Toss the shrimp, chili powder and paprika together in a bowl, coating thoroughly. Heat the remaining 1 tablespoon olive oil in a cast iron skillet. Add the shrimp and cook, stirring once, until nicely seared, about 2 minutes. Immediately transfer the shrimp to the soup pot, and then stir in the corn and broth. Bring the mixture to a light boil over medium-high heat and add the mashed sweet potato. Reduce the heat to low, and cook, stirring occasionally, for 20 minutes longer. Divide the soup among bowls and top with the fresh dill before serving.

Pairing:

La Crema 'Sonoma' Chardonnay La Crema Winery — Sonma Coast, Calif.

This dish would call for a chardonnay. This one from La Crema Winery in California offers floral, lemon, green apple, subtle oak and spice aromas, with plum and honeydew melon flavors. It pairs well with both the chowder and shrimp.





"Because, nobody knows what that is." he said.

Shared workspace

In 2018, the shared space concept can no longer be considered a trend. It is, in fact, a full-fledged industry patronized predominately by start-ups looking to curb costs while still maintaining a professional environment for clients.

Bonnie Liebers is one of 1.2 million professionals worldwide who are estimated to have worked in a shared office space in 2017. The owner and CEO of Genetic Counseling Services moved into Urban Co-Works late last year.

Liebers' story is a familiar one. Her company, too, is a start-up; one she created after working 30 years in the genetic counseling field. Much of that time was spent in offices provided by local hospitals. She acts as an intermediary between her clients

and medical professionals, and helps them with assessing needs for genetic testing.

With hospitals, Liebers said she often found herself on the wrong end of budget cuts. But, with the demand for genetic testing on the rise — 10 million people have sought a genetic test, roughly 2 million through Ancestry. com on Black Friday, alone — it's enabling Liebers to branch out on her own. Just doing so from home with the dog barking during phone calls, was not the solution.

Through a membership fee less than the monthly rent of a two-bedroom apartment, Liebers and a handful of college interns she employs have access to WiFi, electricity, a conference room and an individual office. Perhaps the biggest draw for such shared environments is the collaboration of ideas and solutions, sometimes with

people of different companies and industries.

"It's been very nice," said Liebers, who looks to strengthen her company's presence on the internet. Some of her fellow office residents include Beekman 1802, Buzz Media Solutions and Magic Digital Media. "I have enjoyed the camaraderie of a group of people who have a better understanding of doing business in the online world."

Expanding world

That type of interaction has attracted larger corporations looking to not only capitalize on commonplace brainstorming but also to trim office space expenses, and coworking spaces are taking note.

Goronkin said he's looking to expand the Urban Co-Works brand to other locations outside of Schenectady, and he's not alone. Deskmag.com reported last year that two-thirds of coworking spaces aim to expand, with nearly 40 percent looking to open a new location entirely.

The industry perceives a growth in demand in the coming years. Intuitively, with the increasing demand for residential property within the nation's metropolitan areas, more people seek to work, sleep and play downtown. Some of those working professionals would look towards a shared work space.

There is, also, demand from larger corporations stepping in to utilize shared environments in a way not originally anticipated. WeWork, which has more than 130 shared environments, struck a deal with IBM last April that allowed the business computer giant to move approximately 600 employees to its 70,000 square-foot office space at 88 University Place in New York City. It's a move industry pundits see as advantageous for big businesses, not only for cutting building maintenance costs, but to free larger corporations from long-term leases, too.

right into the culture of our space, and we get to help mold the cultures of those companies."

It's a potentially successful formula that has more than 80 percent of coworking spaces anticipating growth in the upcoming year according to Deskmag.com.

Goronkin said the trick for a succesful coworking space is location. Companies are looking for the internal amenities, the networking potential and the proximity to restaurants, coffee shops, airports and train stations. In the end, it offers something for businesses big and small.

For start-ups and freelancers like Liebers, it takes her out of her house and into something clients expect to see.

"Now, to be able to say 'come up to my office' adds more legitimacy to the business I'm trying to do here."
