Historic change

New Legislature Chairman appoints first GOP committee chairs in Legislature's history

ALBANY COUNTY — The newly elected Chairman of the Albany County Legislature announced committee appointments on Monday, Jan. 29, following through on his promise to appoint more minorities, women and minority members to positions of power. He also announced the creation of five new task forces with specific agendas, three of which will be co-chaired by a bipartisan team of two legislators.

McCoy delivers 7th State of County

County executive highlights accomplishments, introduces new initiatives

ALBANY COUNTY — Moriah Formica sang the national anthem before Albany County Executive Dan McCoy delivered his seventh State of the County address in the atrium of the Times Union Center on Thursday, Jan. 25.

"As we continue to face the very real possibility of even more cuts and more unfunded mandates from Washington and from New York state, it is critical to remind ourselves of the mission of County government and what is at stake," said McCoy. "Our mission is about serving those most at need in our community... so as to improve their lives and the quality of life of our community."

Using the recently renovated county-operated Times Union Center as an example, McCoy was full of praise for county employees, elected representatives and others who have worked on various county projects and initiatives. According to a list of "101 Ways Albany County Serves and Strengthens the Quality of Our Communities," published by the county executive's office, the TU Center generates roughly \$1 million in annual revenue and employs 479 part time and 32 full time employees.

McCoy talked about the upcoming renovation of the county nursing home, noting its significant financial turnaround since he and the legislature agreed to work together on the notorious money pit; the work that was done to identify millions in municipal savings through shared service agreements; and an agreement with Saratoga County to build and operate an organic waste facility. He spoke of the work done by each county department, commending them for various accomplishments and efforts, and he talked about immigration, children, poverty, veterans, the environment and the opioid crisis.

One highlight of the speech included a statement that McCoy had, earlier in the day, signed an executive order stating that the policy of his administration is that no settlement agreement entered into by the county in employment-related cases involving harassment or discrimination will be allowed to contain a nondisclosure provision.

"All across the county we have seen far too many cases of harassment [law suits] being covered up with financial payoffs," he said. "While we will protect victims who wish to maintain their privacy, employees, no matter how senior, should not and will not be protected by such agreements.

I have also directed our County Attorney to submit draft legislation to our Legislature, banning such agreements county-wide and I look forward to action on this important issue."

He also announced he's submitted legislation that would guarantee all employees in Albany County have the right to earn sick leave. "Approximately 40 percent of workers in our county lack even a single paid sick day," he said. "This legislation will result in healthier workplaces, improved child and family well-being and reduced healthcare costs."

McCoy took care to recognize long-time Democratic Party leader Frank Commisso Sr. and Sean Ward, both of whom recently left leadership positions in the County Legislature. McCoy worked closely with both men, as county executive and, before that, as a legislator himself. Speaking fondly of each, he thanked them for their service before welcoming the Legislature's newly elected Chair Andrew Joyce and Majority Leader Gary Domalewicz, and saying he looks forward to working with them as well.

"We need help from the county as we look to, not only physically but philosophically, change things," said Joyce. "We need help from county staff and key people in McCoy's administration and they've been very helpful."

"Tonight I can say, without reservation,

www.CDYMCA.org 518.869.3500 that the state of our county is strong and that working together we will make it even stronger, more inclusive and more equitable. It is our mission and it is my commitment," said McCoy.

He wrapped up his address with a quote from Bobby Kennedy:

"... What we need in the United States is not division; what we need in the United States is not hatred; what we need in the United States is not violence, but love and wisdom and compassion toward one another and a feeling of injustice towards those who still suffer within our country..."

Republican Legislator Mark Grimm said he would have liked to see more emphasis on controlling county spending and ideas for new job creation, and that he felt that his criticism of federal immigration policy was "misplaced." Grimm also said, "Dan McCoy rightfully underscored some significant achievements: the flat tax rate, TU and nursing home upgrades, and his new executive order to require full disclosure for any sex harassment deals."

"It sends a clear message that we're not going to protect abusers and predators," said Joyce. While he has not yet seen the language of the proposed legislation, he said he is likely to support it.





Historic change

According to the county charter, new chairs must appoint members to the legislature's standing committees within 20 days of their election to the office. "We have been working closely with leadership of both the Majority and Minority caucus to to build standing committees that reflect the great talent across the entire Legislature," said Joyce. "Assignments were chosen on a merit-based criteria, taking into consideration the member's professional experience, in addition to their leadership potential." Sixty percent of leadership positions on standing committees and task forces are women or legislators who represent minority majority districts, he noted.

Joyce, the son of Harold L. Joyce, who also served as chairman of the Legislature and the Albany County Democratic Committee and for whom the county office building is named, made history when he appointed four Republicans to chair committees and five to serve as vice-chair. No Republican has ever held a committee chairmanship in the legislature's history. Two women were also appointed to chair committees and three were named to vice-chair. (The 39-member Legislature currently has 10 Republicans and eight women.)

"In order to harness the full talent and potential of each and every individual member of the Albany County Legislature, and to address critical issues for both our own body and Albany County," said Joyce. "We've created the following task forces. The task forces will immediately get to work to deliver recommendations, and a plan to address them."

The new Albany County Legislative Modernization task force will be cochaired by Mark Grimm (R-29) and Lynne Lekakis (D-8).

They have been tasked with looking at ways to reduce paper waste through development and delivery of an electronic voting system; making legislators voting records more easily accessible to the public; and streamlining legislative operations.

The Legislative Rules Reform task force will be co-chaired by Gil Ethier (D-18) and Richard Mendick (R-36), and will utilize "input from legislative colleagues and both of their combined institutional knowledge" to refine and update the Legislative Rules of Order, as well as develop a plan to educate members on any potential changes in coordination with the Legislative Modernization Task Force.

The Economic Development & Sustainability will be co-chaired by Chris Smith (D-39) and Lucille McKnight (D-1), and will focus on what small business owners in Albany County can do to thrive and sustain their success and follow up on the beginning of Shop Albany County by continuing to coordinate with local Chambers of Commerce on business trends and best practices to promote local small businesses.

"This is great news for Guilderland because I will be in a stronger position to further the interests of my constituents," said Grimm. "I'm excited about working with the new Legislature Chairman Andrew Joyce and Republican Leader Frank Mauriello."

Albany man arrested on larceny charges



BETHLEHEM — On Tuesday, Jan. 16, Bethlehem police arrested Nikolas G. Martino, 29, of Albany, in regards to an on-going larceny investigation. police to work with officers in East Greenbush to compare similar larceny cases. Martino was developed as a suspect in these larcenies and subsequently charged with petit larceny in Bethlehem. He was arraigned in Town of Bethlehem Court and remanded back to Rensselaer County jail, where he is being held on other larceny charges.

Distracted driving stop leads to DWI arrest

BETHLEHEM — On Sunday, Jan. 14, Bethlehem police arrested Thanh-Nhan T. Ma, 43, of Philadelphia, Pa., after a traffic stop on Kenwood Avenue. He was reportedly stopped by police for crossing both the double white fog lines and using a cellular phone while driving. He was

administered standardized field sobriety tests and arrested for DWI. He was issued appearance tickets for Bethlehem Court for Tuesday, Feb. 6, for the above traffic charges and misdemeanor counts of driving while intoxicated, and driving with a BAC greater than 0.08 percent.

Selkirk man faces multiple charges

BETHLEHEM — On Tuesday, Jan. 16, Bethlehem police arrested Brett A. Seibert, 29, of Selkirk for his role in an automobile accident last month.

On Friday, Dec. 22, 2017, Seibert was reportedly involved in a hit and run property damage auto crash on River Road in Glenmont. Seibert allegedly fled the scene after striking a telephone pole on River Road near Smultz Road. He was stopped by Bethlehem police on Maple Avenue in Selkirk and issued citations for leaving the scene of a property damage accident, driving while using a cell phone, unlicensed operation, driving an uninsured motor vehicle, unsafe tires and crossing the hazard markings of a roadway. Authorities

impounded his vehicle and obtained a warrant to search the vehicle. While executing the search warrant, police located two forged checks and a stolen credit card. Seibert was charged with two felony counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second



degree and one felony count of criminal possession of stolen property in the fourth degree. He was returned to the Rensselaer County jail, where he is being held on unrelated charges.

Man faces theft, drug possession charges

He was charged with: third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, a class B felony; and thirddegree criminal possession of stolen property, a class D felony.



Troop G among first to launch drone program

ALBANY — The first four New York State Police aerial drones will be put into service this month in troops based in Batavia, Oneida, Middletown and Latham. By April 2018, an additional 14 aerial drones will be deployed throughout the

The launch of the New York State Police Unmanned Aerial System Program will be used to support law enforcement missions, including disaster response and traffic safety.

Acquiring and operating the systems provide a significant cost savings over manned aircraft,

reducing response times and making operations more efficient and costeffective. The aerial drones can also be used in dangerous situations and environments, including natural disasters, keeping state troopers out of harm's way.

The Unmanned Aerial System can document and help reconstruct serious motor vehicle crashes in less time than with current methods, resulting in shorter road closures, lessening the impact on motorists. Investigators will also use the aerial drones to document and photograph crime scenes.

BCSD enrollment projected for perpetual decline

Enrollment lowest in 20 years

BETHLEHEM — Student enrollment is expected to go down in the

enrollment is expected to go down in the Bethlehem Central School District next year, and further down in the near future.

The Capital District Regional Planning Commission (CDRPC) estimates the district will see a 2.1 percent downturn in enrollment next school year and an overall decline of 8.5 percent by 2022-23. The 4,518 students currently enrolled at Bethlehem Central is the lowest number in 20 years.


BCSD Superintendent Jody Monroe is to present the commission's findings to the Board of Education on Wednesday, Feb. 7 as part of her State of the Schools address.

The commission's projections contrast with those of national figures predicting an overall increase in public school enrollment in prekindergarten through grade 12.

The National Center for Education Statistics estimates a 3 percent increase in overall enrollment from fall 2014 to fall 2026. However, that increase includes a 42 percent increase in District of Columbia, and a 14 percent decrease in Connecticut. That report, released last May, projected a 1 percent overall decrease in New York state.

This is the second consecutive year the Albany-based commission has compiled school enrollment projections for BCSD.

The commission used district

enrollment trends, generational patterns, birth rates, housing stock and residential development to calculate its findings. According to BCSD, the commission's enrollment projections for the 2017-18 school year were off by just two-tenths of one percent of actual figures.

"Enrollment data is critical to the district's long- and short-term decision

making," said Monroe. "Demographics and housing stock fluctuations can make some changes to enrollment hard to anticipate, however, we feel confident that by employing the services of the experts at CDRPC and staying in constant contact with local planning officials, we are working with the most accurate forecasts possible."

District enrollment peaked in 2006-07 at 5,182 students.

In making the enrollment projections, CDRPC staff examined the following:

- Historical enrollment trends since the 1990-91 school year;
- District grade-to-grade survival multiplier calculated from the enrollment data in 5, 10, and 20-year increments;
- Annual school district birth data since 2002;
- District-wide housing data including total count, and types of homes;
- Residential building permit issuances from the towns of Bethlehem, and New Scotland;
- Existing home sales; and
- Anticipated new residential building activity in the District.

But, what about new residential development?

The report cited approved and proposed residential developments in the Town of Bethlehem as "an area to watch closely moving forward," noting it was not clear how quickly units will be constructed. The CDRPC projections were calculated based on the assumption proposed developments will not be constructed in the near future.

In Town Supervisor David Van Luven's State of the Town address earlier this month, he cited approximately 1,200 approved or proposed new housing units townwide. Monroe said of those homes, 847 are within district. She also said a majority of the planned residential growth is from multi-family units and town houses, suggesting a decreased likelihood

that growing families are driving the development trend.

Of the units located in the Bethlehem school district, 170 are single-family homes and 92 townhomes that have been approved or are in the construction phase. The 585 units that have been proposed or are under Planning Board review include 264 single-family homes, 108 townhomes, and 213 multi-family units.

"The district monitors the pace of residential development year-round in consultation with town officials. The information we look at helps paint a fuller picture of the data included in the CDRPC report," said Monroe.

Key findings from the CDRPC report

- Total enrollment has been on the decline for most of the last ten years. After peaking in 2006-07, enrollment in 2017-18 declined 12.8 percent to its lowest level in the last 20 years.
- Enrollment in the three age cohorts (K-5, 6-8, and 9-12) has declined across the board. While there is no indication that declines are slowing, there is evidence to show that declines in 9-12 will become more pronounced.
- Enrollment is experiencing a generational shift. The final millennials are projected to graduate within a handful of years. This will leave BCSD with only children of Generation Z attending, a generation significantly smaller than millennials.
- Birth rates continue a slow, but steady decline. In 2002, the district had almost 300 births, but that declined to 198 in 2015. With women waiting longer to have children, and averaging fewer children in their lifetime, it is unclear when the district should expect a turnaround in births.
- At least 20 residential developments are either approved or proposed in the district. Such a large number of units could have a significant impact on future enrollment; however, the timetable for construction of these units is not yet clear. Close monitoring will be required to see how this develops.
- Enrollment projections from the 2016-17 report were very accurate. Not counting special education students, projections for total enrollment were off by just eight students. Projections for the three grade cohorts were all within 1 percent actual enrollment.
- Both total enrollment and enrollment by grade cohort are projected to continue to decline throughout the projection period. There are few signs that declines will slow.

"The CDRPC projections were very much on target for 2017-18," said Monroe. "Using these projections as a resource and keeping a close eye on residential development will help us make informed decisions on behalf of our students and the community at large."

Those three goals were sandwiched in between two by Thomas Liebold, the first on an assist by Thibodeau and the second by Chenaille and Henry Kopplin.



GCSD seeks community input on budget

GUILDERLAND — Guilderland Central School District is asking residents to weigh in on budget priorities and what to do with a historic, one-room school it currently maintains.

While the budget planning process "officially kicked off" last fall with a public budget input meeting in late October, no one signed up to offer any input at the time. Over the subsequent months, building and department level budgets were developed, enrollment projections were reviewed and staffing and equipment needs were assessed.

In January, as part of a two-month community engagement phase, an online survey went live on the district's website, allowing residents, students, parents, teachers and others an opportunity to share priorities, concerns and suggestions with district officials.

On a four-tier metric ranging from "critical and essential to GCSD's mission" to "not important to preserve in a time of limited resources," survey respondents are asked to identify the programs and areas they want to financially support most, including: the arts; sports; English as a new language (ENL) programs; accelerated learning programs; current technology; clean buildings; and safe transportation.

The survey also asks respondents for suggestions on how to close an expected revenue gap and what should be done with the Cobblestone School in Guilderland

Under Gov. Andrew Cuomo's proposed budget, GCSD would receive a state aid increase of \$64,317, approximately 0.25 percent over last year, according to Assistant Superintendent of Business Neil Sanders. "Revenue is essentially flat," he said. "We have increasing expenditures and we have the property tax cap to deal with as well.'

On a "roll-over budget basis," said Sanders, "we're looking at a \$1.6 million gap." State budget negotiations and how federal revenue streams might be impacted are significant undecided factors, he explained, saying that there aren't many other revenue streams available aside from smaller local options, such as investments. "It's primarily a state aid issue," he said, explaining that the district is hoping state legislators will fight for increased education

While Cuomo touted state investment in education as one of the largest items in his proposed budget, that investment still falls well short of the \$4.2 billion owed to schools across the state under the foundation aid formula, developed in response to a 2006 lawsuit in which the NYS Court of Appeals found that New York State was violating students' constitutional right to a "sound and basic education" by leaving schools without the funding necessary. Schools were ordered to receive \$5.5 billion increase in basic operating aid statewide over the course of a four-year phase-in from 2007 to 2011.

In 2009, however, during the national fiscal crisis, the state froze funding for the Foundation Aid formula. During the recession, \$2.7 billion was cut from school aid, effectively reversing the state's commitment to fully fund its classrooms.

"We weren't overly optimistic that [2018-19] was going to be a big state aid increase year," said Sanders, noting the \$4.4 billion state budget deficit and potential federal actions. "But it ended up being much smaller than we expected," he said of the governor's proposal.

If the district does not receive any additional aid, the survey asks respondents whether it should dip into savings, adjust spending on programs or attempt to exceed the tax cap (which would require 60 percent of district voters to approve). There is also a space for alternative ideas.

In the case of the Cobblestone School, the historic one-room schoolhouse located in Guilderland Center, the district is looking to residents to help decide what

course of action it should take.

The district came into possession of the structure in the mid-'90s, during a statewide consolidation of school districts, more than a decade after it had seen its last students. There is some question as to whether the district should have been able to take possession at all, as the deed to the property stipulates that ownership would revert back to Stephen Van Rensselaer, the property's donor, or his heirs, in the event that it were to be used for anything other than a schoolhouse.

In recent years, the district has spent tens of thousands of dollars to maintain the building — shoring up the foundation, replacing the floor and replacing sections of the roof and exterior. If it retains ownership, explained Sanders, there are other needed expenditures. The most pressing, he said, is the trimming of a large oak tree overhanging the rear of the building. Other needed repairs include roof replacement, more foundation work and, depending on the expected uses of the building, replacement of the interior walls and ceiling. Sanders said costs could exceed

He explained that, according to the terms of the deed, the property should have reverted to a Van Rensselaer heir. The only heir known to the district, who resides in Maine, was not interested in taking possession of the property. However, that heir indicated there were numerous others across multiple states for whom he

could not speak. (Stephen Van Rensselaer, who donated the land in 1840, had eight

"In order to find out who actually owns the property, we would need to do a title search," said Sanders. A full title report, he said, would cost between \$5,000 and \$10,000, and would be likely to take several months. It is possible, he added, given the amount of time heirs have had to claim the property which ceased being used for the school in 1941, they have a diminished ownership claim.

The budget survey asks respondents whether it should continue to "own, maintain and potentially use" the schoolhouse, or seek to transfer the property to another entity. If not to an heir, the district has looked at the possibility of transferring ownership to an entity such as a historical society or the county, something that could potentially be done with or without clear legal title to the property, depending on whether the recipient would be willing to assume the property and indemnify the district from any future actions initiated by individuals claiming an ownership right in the property.

According to Sanders, however, the district has reached out to potential recipients and has met with little interest. "That kind of leaves a little bit of a dilemma for us," he said.

Nor has the district identified any potential uses for which it might employ the historic site. "We have some health and safety issues that would have to be addressed before we can bring students into the building," he said, explaining that there is no heat, no bathroom and a concern about lead paint.

Ideally, the district would like to transfer ownership to someone interested in maintaining its history and working, perhaps in partnership with GCSD, to make it open to the community for educational purposes.

"We'd like to see it exist... as a community resource," said Sanders.

Not a bedroom community

here's a lot of information to chew on when it comes to looking at the latest enrollment projections for Bethlehem Central, and it's not what you'd expect for one of the best public schools in the state.

An outstanding public school district drives real estate sales. Homeowners of recent past understand this rule. Many of whom were then newlyweds looking to start families, and were planning ahead to enroll children into a good school. Bethlehem Central was the deciding factor. And, though the school's caliber of excellence has not diminished, the Capital District Regional Planning Commission again sees less children coming to the school district.

The number of kids enrolled at BCSD is at its lowest in two decades, and if projections hold up, we'll see nearly 9 percent fewer children walking within those halls. Assuming 21 students in each classroom, the average claimed by the district, that's a reduction of 18 total classes.

It's not exclusive to Bethlehem. New York state is projected to see public enrollment decrease by 1 percent, and that's better than all of New England and most of the Northeast corridor. Despite national figures that see a 3 percent increase, Massachusetts and Rhode Island will go down 4 and 5 percent, respectively. Vermont and New Hampshire will see more drastic decreases of 10 and 14 percent. Maine public schools see a decrease of 12 percent, and Connecticut will see the worst of it, 14 percent, by

Housing trends don't appear to be following tradition. When BCSD Superintendent Judy Monroe speaks before her school board, she's going to share with them that, yes, there are new residential developments coming into town. However, far less of them are single family homes. Townhouses and multifamily units suggest child-free households. This defies what real estate forecasters believed to be a recent exodus to urban apartment living for empty-nesters and

young professionals who wanted to live, work and play in our downtown cities.

Bethlehem has long fought the stigma of being called a "bedroom community" for Albany professionals, and these planned residential units don't suggest any allies coming in to help fight off that perception. We certainly hope developers — and those residents they envision bringing into our community — will be as invested in our neighborhoods as they are with the dollars and cents they hope to earn with their real estate transactions. As local government promises to look at the town's comprehensive plan, it appears that needs to be done sooner rather than

Here's another perspective why walkers and runners may opt to use roads instead of sidewalks. Residents rely on the town sidewalk plow. It does a great job getting





ASO to debut at JFK Center

SHIFT Festival in D. C. chooses Albany Symphony as one of four national orchestras to showcase contemporary classical musicians

ALBANY — The Albany Symphony Orchestra (ASO) has announced it has been selected as one of four orchestras to perform during this year's SHIFT: A Festival of American Orchestras. Co-presented by the John F. Kennedy Center and Washington Performing Arts, the weeklong festival will celebrate both the contributions and skills of contemporary North American orchestras in the nation's capital April 9 through 15.

Teaming up with Discover Albany, Albany County's official tourism promotion agency, the ASO also hopes to use the opportunity to promote the cultural and community assets of the Capital District in our nation's capital.

Now in its second year, the festival is intended to celebrate "the vitality, identity, and extraordinary artistry of orchestras and chamber orchestras by creating an immersive festival experience." SHIFT will be composed of mini-residencies, with each orchestra presenting educational events, symposia, and community events in venues around Washington, D.C., as well as full-orchestra performances in the Kennedy Center Concert Hall. Other participating orchestras are the D.C.-based National Symphony Orchestra, the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra and the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra.

"We're particularly honored and excited to be in company with three very impressive national orchestras," said ASO Music Director and Conductor David Alan Miller, noting that the budgets for those orchestras fall between \$12 million and \$36 million. "So, the Albany Symphony, with our \$2.7 million budget, is punching way, way, way above our weight."

Calling the SHIFT model "radical" and "exciting," Miller said the Kennedy Center is requiring

each participating orchestra to bring two additional kinds of programs in addition to the full orchestra program on Wednesday, April 11. The 18-member pop chamber orchestra Dogs of Desire will perform a collection of compositions by the Sleeping Giant composers collective at the Blind Whino, an arts collective in D.C., on Thursday; and a youth music education program will be run by members of the orchestra

and composer Clarice Assad.

"An incredible opportunity to show the panoply, the variety, the diversity of all of our different creative and unique activities," he said.

For its full orchestral performance, and its Kennedy Center debut, the ASO will perform a collection of contemporary works that explore the history of Upstate New York through

the lenses of the bodies of water that surround and connect our communities called "The River Flows Through Us."

"I want to assure everybody that not everything the Albany Symphony does is water themed," said Miller, referring to the symphony's celebration of the bicentennial of New York's Erie Canal that took place last summer, Water Music NY. "The confluence of these two great rivers makes the Capital Region a very special place," he explained, citing cellist Yo-Yo Ma, whom he said spoke at length about how waterways connect communities.

The announcement took place at the new Albany Capital Center, in front of the culture mural in its main lobby, which depicts the Albany Symphony being conducted by Miller, who has led the orchestra since 1992

Nationally recognized for its commitment to new works by living American composers, the

ASO is unique in its commitment to performing new works by modern composers, thereby exposing audiences to a new generation of orchestral music. It has received more ASCAP Awards for Adventurous Programming than any other orchestra in America, 26 to date, including the John S. Edwards Award for Strongest Commitment to New American Music in 2013 and 2014.

"Opera Saratoga exceeded its annual budget for both fundraising and ticket sales in [2016-2017], building on the strategic initiatives launched by Artistic and General Director Lawrence Edelson, when he joined the company three seasons ago," stated President of the Board of Directors Rosemarie Rosen. Edelson's tenure has been defined through intermingling Englishspoken operas with classic productions, often times featuring internationally acclaimed artists.

Renowned director David Schweizer made his Opera Saratoga debut two years ago with the world premiere of "The Long Walk," by Jeremy Howard Beck and Stephanie Fleischmann. Twice, Opera Saratoga has welcomed "punk" ballerina" and decorated director and choreographer Karole Armitage. She most recently came to Spa City to direct the American premier of The Witches of Venice, featuring the music of Philip Glass and Beni Montresor. Last year John Mauceri conducted the full orchestration of the once controversial "The Cradle Will Rock" — which was shutdown on its original opening night in 1937. "We look forward to continue working with Larry to build upon these successes, and we are very excited to see where his artistic vision leads the company in the coming seasons," said the Chairman of the Board Robert C. Miller.



Z'paghetti Marinara with Shrimp

paghetti is a staple of many family dinner tables. But home cooks who want to veer away from traditional pasta without giving up their love of marinara can try the following, zucchini-inspired alternative to traditional spaghetti, "Z'paghetti Marinara with Shrimp," courtesy of Lisa Lillien's "Hungry Girl Clean & Hungry" (St. Martin's Press).

Ingredients: (2 servings)

28 ounces (about 4 medium) zucchini

8 ounces (about 16) raw large shrimp, peeled,

tails removed and deveined

1/4 teaspoon Italian seasoning
1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
1/8 teaspoon black pepper
1 cup marinara sauce

2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Instructions:

Preheat the oven to 375°F. Lay a large piece of heavy-duty foil on a baking sheet and spray with nonstick spray. Using a spiral vegetable slicer, cut zucchini into spaghettilike noodles. (If you don't have a spiral veggie slicer, peel zucchini into super-thin strips, rotating the zucchini after each strip.) Roughly chop for shorter noodles. Place

zucchini noodles in the center of the foil and top with shrimp. Sprinkle with seasonings. Top with marinara sauce and Parmesan. Cover with another large piece of foil. Fold together and seal all four edges of the foil pieces, forming a well-sealed packet. Bake for 25 minutes, or until zucchini noodles have softened and shrimp are fully cooked. Cut packet to release hot steam before opening entirely. Transfer packet contents to a large bowl, and toss to mix.

Clean & Hungry Marinara Sauce

Ingredients: (6 servings)

cups canned crushed tomatoes

1/4 cup tomato paste

1 tablespoon white wine vinegar

2 teaspoons Italian seasoning

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/2 teaspoon onion powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon black pepper

Instructions:

Combine ingredients in a large sealable container. Mix until uniform. Seal, and refrigerate until ready to use.

anuary 2009 was perhaps the most significant month of my life because I was unwittingly handed the keys to a sparkling new world, all while sprawled on the couch with a bag of potato chips and watching The Oprah Show.

Two hours prior, I'd been given the disconcerting news by my doctor that I'd reached an all-timehigh weight of 345 pounds. On a particularly cold January day that happened to be as bitter as I was feeling at the time, I flipped on the television, knowing that Oprah would be talking candidly about falling off the wagon — I wished to commiserate with her. Instead, I learned from my fellow fat-girl-doppelganger Carnie Wilson that, yes, Virginia, there is hope after all.

I had long considered the pop singer my genetic twin. We were fat kids who were treated poorly because of our size, and we both grew into obese adults, using food as a coping tool and a refuge from the ravages of life.

That significant January day, however, I gazed upon Carnie as I'd never seen her before: at a significantly lower weight and glowing with happiness. In all honesty, I had once considered both of us irreparable. Lord knows

we both attempted countless diets over the years; Carnie even had gastric bypass surgery and ended up gaining much of it back. To say I was intrigued by the new and radiant version of Carnie Wilson was an understatement. It spurred on with a direct IV infusion of possibility.

Dropping my bag of potato chips to the ground, I beelined to my computer to do a Google search for her trainer. I found him, and his cardio-yoga DVD's and the rest is history: I dropped 180 pounds and have kept it off for nearly 8 years (a little menopause fluctuation notwithstanding).

Of course, there's significant backstory involved to this. Hope was my starting point. And that was bolstered by action. My "I can do it, too" moment motivated me to becoming at last ready to examine why I was hiding from the world and myself. That required courage, support, and a willingness to face things that scared me.

Simultaneously, I found a great support system (and way of healing my food-abused body) in DDPYOGA and tremendous motivation from its founder Diamond Dallas Page. His interest in my progress fueled my resolve. Ask any recovering alcoholic how they did it and my educated guess is, they didn't do it solo, but with the support of fellow-sufferers.

Once I was able to release my grip on binge-eating, I discovered food comas weren't really all they were cracked up to be, and multi-colored food groups from the produce section were pretty good, if I just gave 'em a chance.

There's no one formula, and it's not all a bed of roses. Some close to me aren't so thrilled with the new me, and not just because of my new look. Permanent change begins from within, and during the course of my journey I found it crucial to not only give up junk food, but that longingrained habit of people-pleasing. That takes time, it's a truth that diet books don't tell you, and it's worth every ounce of effort.

I'm living a life of freedom and happiness I thought was completely out of my reach. Giant leaps are possible. But they're made with generous amounts of love and patience, which took me farther than any diet ever could.

Ten years for Youth FX

Youth FX celebrates 10th anniversary with opening of new studio space in Albany

ALBANY — Youth FX, a hands-on, educational, youth media organization, recently opened its new studio space with a public grand opening celebration at its 25 Warren Street location.

The organization utilizes the space for production workshops to teach cinematography, sound and production design, editing and acting. Youth FX also plans to host community events and workshops, film screenings, poetry nights, open mics, dinner and movie family nights – all while maintaining a strong presence in a neighborhood with close proximity to many community based-organizations.

"We are about empowering young people and giving them a platform to tell their stories and amplify their voices," said Bhawin Suchak, executive director, Youth FX. "Now that we have a space to call home, we plan on expanding our programming to reach people of all ages who want to engage in media production. I'd like to thank the Albany Housing Authority and our leaders in Albany for recognizing the impact we've been able to have on the youth in our community and allowing us to obtain the resources we need to continue to grow."

The building was purchased by the Albany Housing Authority and City of Albany, in conjunction with the Albany Community Development Agency. Additional funding commitments were made by Assemblymembers Patricia Fahy and John McDonald, the three organizations will work together to rehabilitate and furnish the building with video and sound equipment for Youth FX and a kitchen for the neighboring South End Children's Café. Both tenants are leasing the building for \$1.

"This new initiative in Albany's South End will provide a safe place for young people to receive the academic, social, and creative support they need for success," said New York State Assemblymember Patricia Fahy. "Helping youth develop workplace skills while addressing food security puts the Dream Center at the cutting edge of poverty alleviation. Many thanks to Youth FX, the South End Children's Cafe, the City of Albany, and the Albany Housing Authority for forging this new partnership to give Albany's youth the tools to thrive!"

Youth FX films have been screened at more than 80 film festivals in the U.S. and around the world, including Tribeca Film Festival, Los Angeles Film Festival, and the Chicago International Film Festival.

Youth FX is a youth media organization designed to empower young people ages 10-24. Youth FX teaches youth the technical and creative aspects of digital filmmaking and media production. Our primary goal is to work with diverse groups of young people from communities that have been historically under-served and in need of opportunities for training and engagement in emerging media technologies. Youth FX develops leadership, creativity, and critical thinking, though the collaborative process of digital filmmaking and media production giving voice to the stories of young people in the Capital District.



True Lynn

Fans will discover just how much they really do know about Lynn when she performs at the Massry Center for the Arts on Friday, Feb. 2.

Lynn played the sulking singer in the dive bar frequented by Colin Farrell's and Vince Vaughn's characters. Her music, such as the single "The Only Thing Worth Fighting For," set the tone of a gutwrenchingly somber television experience. She earned the opportunity to write and appear on the show after producer T Bone Burnett heard her cover of Johnny Cash's "Ring of Fire." To separate herself from legions of musicians who preceded her, she said she tweaked the tune by playing it with a melancholic minor key. It was just the sound Burnett wanted to capture for the show's second season.

Nearly four years later, people aware of her acting career, and less so of her musical career, still see her as the brooding bar singer from the show.

"Following the show, a lot of people expected that the girl — that character — I was playing was me," said Lynn. "It's interesting to try to bridge the gap between a character who people perceive to be as me, and me."

Lynn's Americana sound is defined by her sultry voice and a succinct narrative. Lynn's 2016 release, "Resistor" drew comparisons to Gillian Welch, Joni Mitchell, Fiona Apple, Margo Timmins

and Norah Jones. It was an album she started writing while on set. To offset the gloom from the show, she said she poured a glass of wine and popped in a Pink Floyd CD. The result was the upbeat track "Shape Shifter."

"Resistor' was a challenge," said Lynn. "Because, I am a happy person, and I like to have fun! I like to dance, and I like to headbang, and I like to play a really loud electric guitar! I want those things to come through in my music, too."

"Resistor" was that bridge for Lynn and the fans who found her through the television series. There was a touch of the melancholy with a splash of the whimsy, such as the surf-noir track "Drive." The play of her fuzzy guitar helps draw some fun from the surf rock genre local fans would recognize by Troy natives, and now Nashville residents, The Los Straitjackets.

Lynn has already caught a big wave in 2018. She was named guest judge for the ongoing American Songwriter's 2018 Lyric Contest alongside Charlie Worsham and Peter Bradley Adams.

Two years removed from "Resistor," Lynn said she has two albums worth of song material. A few of them she plans to play before audiences. Currently, she's on a brief tour that will take her into New York City followed by Northampton, Mass; Albany and Vienna, Va. She hopes to have a new album out by this summer.

Lynn's writing process has changed over the years. Despite her gift for prose, she hates the process. Whereas her younger-self would sit down, write and be happy; she said she continuously works on



each draft to strengthen her weaknesses. It's a "squirmy" act she said she enjoys once it is done.

"As you progress in songwriting... you learn to revise," said Lynn, "and revise, and revise. Try to strengthen and outdo yourself. Learn to identify the weaknesses... I'm trying to hone, always." Later this winter she will headline a show at Celtic Connections and perform overseas in a television tribute to one her

favorites, Tom Petty. Petty, too, is said to have struggled through the writing of his songs. But, the finished work, Lynn said, "no one did that better."

"I think my whole life I've been searching for a way to write something that is succinct and poetic," said Lynn. "Something that is commercial and artful. Something that people can understand on the first listen, but also has layers beneath for people to dig into."




