RCS attempts long-term plans

District holds forum to plan for its future

RAVENA — During an initial budget presentation on Tuesday, Feb. 6, Dr. Brian Bailey, superintendent of schools for Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Central School District, began by talking about anticipated revenue and the state tax cap — and how “mean” New York state is to public schools.

“The process is not fair,” he said. “It’s like asking you to design your house, having no idea how much money you’ll have to build

it.”

Calling the timeline “unjust,” Bailey explained that the district is expected to have its budget planning done before the state has settled its budget negotiations, which directly affects how much money the school district will receive in state funding. “And, as we know, in New York state, they very frequently don’t meet their deadline,” he said.

While Bailey noted the \$1.1 billion increase to education aid across the state that is included in Gov. Andrew Cuomo’s proposed 2019 executive budget, he says that the increase falls \$300,000 short of the amount that would be needed to continue current programming

BCHS Robotics Club stacks up

After winning local VEX competition, Robotics Club team members are preparing for regional state championship

BETHLEHEM — Since the beginning of the school year, the brand new high school robotics club has been working to design, build, program and test robots to compete in the 2018 VEX Robotics Competition In The Zone, which was held at Queensbury High School on Saturday, Jan. 21.

In the club's first year, BCBS Robotics Club Team A — club President Christian DeFranco and members Luke Andres, Molly Bogardus, Abby DeFranco and Lance Tamchin — brought home the championship title out of almost 40 competing teams.

The club thanked Science/Technology Supervisor Jen Gonyea for her support, the parents who were able to come and cheer for the BCBS teams, and the Robotics Education Foundation for providing a team grant.

VEX Robotics is a design platform for students providing hands-on discovery of career opportunities in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). Students design small robots that then compete against each other in variety of matches.

The VEX Robotics Competition In the Zone is played on a 12-foot by 12-foot square "field" resembling a game board. Two alliances — one "red" and one "blue" — composed of two teams each, compete in matches consisting of a 15-second autonomous period followed by one minute and forty-five seconds of driver-controlled play. The object of the game is to attain a higher score than the opposing alliance by using the robots to stack cones on goals, score in goal zones, build the highest stacks,

and by "parking" the robots. A bonus is awarded to the Alliance that has the most total points at the end of the autonomous period.

"All the teamwork, late nights and dedication they put into being successful was great to witness," said Club Advisor Eric Fana. "One great aspect of these competitions is the bond that forms between teammates. As problems arise,

The BCBS team is now preparing for the Northern New York State Championship, which is slated to take place on Sunday, March 11 in Syracuse.

Tax hike proposed

District still hoping for more aid to cover anticipated expenditures

VOORHEESVILLE— School district officials released the first draft of a proposed 2018-19 budget that calculates total expenses at \$24,759,000. However, even after increasing the tax levy by two percent, which is below the allowable calculated rate of 2.78 percent, the district would still fall \$206,000 short of covering those expenses under its preliminary budget.

While \$134,600 of the expected deficit could conceivably be made up by going to the maximum allowable tax levy, district officials are hoping that the final version of the state's 2019 fiscal year budget, which the State Legislature is expected to pass by April, will include additional funding that would make the additional increase to the tax levy unnecessary.

Officials suggested several possible ways to cut the district's 2018-19 budget during the presentation. One option is to eliminate one full-time secretary position in the business office and one full-time teaching assistant position for a total savings of \$97,000. Another \$109,000 could be saved by eliminating a full-time

computer instructor and a part-time middle/high school dean position though attribution, and another \$58,000 by eliminating a Distance Learning service, which would cause students to lose access to certain electives. Altogether, the identified cuts would save the district exactly \$206,000.

Of several potential budget additions, the district feels a new part-time special education teacher is needed to help provide mandated services at a cost of \$11,000 a year. Providing Chromebooks to students in grades 5 and 7, as well as additional social studies, math, business and technology instruction are also on the VCSD short list for budget additions, amounting to a total of \$171,000 in potential additions to budgeted expenditures.

According to the district, the budget will be a discussion topic at each board meeting from February through Tuesday, April 23. The State Legislature is expected to pass its final budget by Thursday, April 1, at which time final state aid figures will be clearer.

A special budget meeting is scheduled to take place on Monday, April 9, prior to the Board of Education finalizing and adopting the proposed budget, which is anticipated to take place at its regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, April 10. District voters will head to the polls on Tuesday, May 15 to accept or reject the measure.

and far short of the \$4.2 billion behind fulfilling its foundation aid obligation.

The foundation aid formula was developed in response to a 2006 lawsuit in which the NYS Court of Appeals found that New York state was violating students' constitutional right to a "sound and basic education" by leaving schools without adequate funding. The state was ordered to increase basic operating aid statewide by \$5.5 billion over the course of a four-year phase-in from 2007 to 2011. In the wake of the 2008 national financial crisis caused by Wall Street, the state froze foundation aid funding in 2009. During the recession, \$2.7 billion was cut from school aid, effectively reversing the state's commitment to fully fund its classrooms.

According to Bailey, RCSCSD is currently receiving a larger allotment of disbursed foundation aid funding than it should under the formula, as the state is still calculating aid based on enrollment numbers from eight years ago, when the district had around 450 additional students. Should the state decide to equalize the formula, he said, "that would not work out well for us."

Pressure felt from actions at the federal level, which have left programs like Medicaid and other sources of federal funding in a state of uncertainty, he explained, have also caused the state to put more pressure on local municipalities and school districts. "We have all these great mandates we're expected to accomplish," he said. "And they're all unfunded obligations."

In addition to that, Bailey continued, the state has enacted a 2 percent limit on "expenditure driven aid," or funding for things such as transportation costs, many of which are state-mandated additional expenses. That means that if those costs exceed 2 percent of the total budget, the district will no longer receive reimbursement. "This is the enemy of public schools," he said. "Public schools are under attack and we're not the only game in town. Stay tuned."

Joanne Moran, the district's business manager, explained how the actual "2 percent" tax cap is calculated. The calculation, she said, is based on a tax base growth factor, a measure of municipal

property developments and improvements, that is determined by the state and the Consumer Price Index (CPI), or the national rate of inflation.

According to Moran, 2018-19 will be the first year that the tax cap calculation allows the district to go over 2 percent. While it is currently calculated at 2.65 percent (a total of \$655,249 the district is allowed to raise through taxes), that could increase to 2.75 percent, depending on a Payment In Lieu of Taxes from Coeymans Recycling. While the district can opt not to go to the full tax levy, Moran characterized that as a lost opportunity due to the fact that the district will not be able to recover lost funds in future years.

A more comprehensive explanation of the tax cap calculation can be viewed on the district's website (www.rcscsd.org) by going to the Budget & Taxes tab under the Main Menu.

How RCS homeowners will be affected by the tax levy, said Moran, will depend on property assessment information that will not be available until this summer. If assessments go up, she said, the tax rate increase will be lower than if they go down.

On the following Tuesday, Feb. 13, RCSCSD held a "future forum," inviting all district stakeholders to a discussion about its future.

"We had just under 60 people attend, representing district and building leaders, staff, students, parents, community and business representatives," said Bailey. "Joanne [Moran] and I did a brief overview of the budget process, with the understanding that the Future Forum would be focusing on identifying our priorities, ultimately informing current and future programming decisions."

He said the forum began with a question; "How do we prepare the next generation of RCS students for their future in the workplace and the world?"

In a rotating focus group format, participants looked at four overarching questions about the district's mission, its place in the world and community, student engagement and allocation of resources.

"We were so impressed by the positivity and participation during the process," said Bailey, "[with] many voices combining to tell a story of the larger RCS community."

6th annual community bee spells F-U-N

Still plenty of ways for members of the community to 'bee' involved

BETHLEHEM — Bethlehem Opportunities Unlimited will host its sixth annual community spelling bee on Thursday, March 1, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in the Bethlehem Central High School cafeteria.

Whether participating in or simply spectating at the unique event, there will be plenty to enjoy while also supporting BOU, a not-for-profit organization that works to promote the health and safety of Bethlehem youth, during its largest fundraising event of the year.

Residents, teachers, local businesses, book clubs and other community groups will compete in the uniquely formatted bee.

Competitors, grouped into "swarms," play in teams of three to five individuals, deciding together on the spelling of various words before submitting a final answer. Teams have the ability to purchase "lifelines," opportunities to consult a dictionary or phone a friend. No one is eliminated before the end of each round, as the winners for each one are decided by a point system.

Teams, who are encouraged to don costumes to show team spirit, enter the bee by making a contribution of \$120. Sponsorships are also provided by local businesses, community groups and other organizations, for teams with limited funds.

Additional money is raised by allowing community members, businesses and organizations the opportunity to either purchase lifelines for teams or sponsor submitted words.

Local businesses, such as orthodontist offices, often sponsor words that apply to their professions, said Cindy Ferrari, BOU president. "They can get to be pretty tricky," she said. "Some of these words I've never even heard before."

Information on how to buy a lifeline can be found on the BOU web page, at www.bethlehemschools.org/community/bou.

There is no cost to attend the event, however, attendees are encouraged to purchase tickets for raffle drawings and a silent auction. Items that have already been donated include a Samsung tablet, dinner for two and a 50-minute massage. Refreshments will also be available for sale. Last year, the event raised more than \$6,000 and Ferrari said they hope to exceed that amount this year. So far, ten teams have signed up, but BOU is expecting a total of closer to 20, which is about how many have signed up in the past.

"I like that students in the audience get to see their teachers being part of something fun and wearing goofy costumes," said Ferrari. "Another favorite part is the spelling bee itself, watching the emcee say "time's up" and watching teams run their whiteboard up to the front for the judges."

While the spelling bee is BOU's major fundraiser, the organization also provides what Ferrari calls "a public service" by selling pads of pre-formatted notes, such as a parent would write to the school in the case of an illness or special request, during school hours and the fall open houses. Pre-printed with basic information areas such as the child's name and homeroom, the notepad includes commonly occurring instances in which a parent would need to notify the school.

Money raised by BOU supports a variety of community youth programs and education. The organization has close ties with the Bethlehem Central School District, which hosts its website and connects needy programs with grant funding offered by BOU. Since the 2014-15 school year, BOU has donated thousands of dollars to the middle school's costume ball, Girls Night Out at the high school, fifth grade survivor day, health advocacy projects, indoor games, Youth Court training, the middle school pavilion and a program for kids with special needs.

The organization also collaborates with other organizations including the BCSD Student Senate and the Bethlehem Parks and Recreation Department to promote healthy youth development.

Ferrari says that while money raised at the spelling bee is made available to local youth-oriented

initiatives, groups in need must actively seek it. "We have monthly meetings," she said. "Any grant application that comes in, we review it, we vote on it and then we let them know." When, as sometimes happens, the organization is not able to approve the entire amount, she said, it will often offer some portion of the amount.

"Our grants are very easy to apply for and are available any time of the year," she said. "The application can be found on our web page where you will find details on which projects are eligible. If you ask any board member what the best part of their volunteer role is, I believe they would say it is giving out funds for positive things for our youth to do."

Established in the '80s as an organization dedicated to helping kids make good choices, BOU has a volunteer board made up of teachers, parents, community members and a student representative. It eventually became a not-for-profit in order to offer grants and free educational programming. Every year, BOU offers a program titled "Talking with Your Teen," which has covered such topics as how to talk to your teen about drugs and alcohol and how to help your teen use electronics and social media in a safe and positive way.

Town Supervisor plows snow while working overnight shift

VanLuven makes plea to town residents to keep trash cans in driveways after snowfall

— Supervisor David VanLuven opened the Town Board meeting on Wednesday, Feb. 14 with two community announcements before addressing official business.

“The Highway Department graciously allowed me to ride along in a snow plow last Thursday night, from 3 a.m. to 7:30 a.m.” said VanLuven. “And it was great to see them in action and to see what a complete pain in the neck trash cans are.”

The supervisor asked that town residents be mindful of keeping trash cans off local streets when the snow plows are out. Explaining that trash collectors have arms that can reach to residential driveways, he added, “And, keeping them in the driveway will dramatically decrease the possibility of me knocking them over when I’m working the plow.”

Next, VanLuven read a letter from a town resident commending the Bethlehem Police Department for the work it does to help residents feel safe. “It is not often that one thinks of all the duties and responsibilities that are required of law enforcement and the important role they play in many aspects of our daily lives,” he read. “They deserve our deepest respect and gratitude for the dedication and work they perform to keep the

public safe.’

“I don’t think I could agree with that any more,” said VanLuven.

Following those announcements, the board took care of several agenda items.

Lisa Fortin was named to succeed Caryn Zeh on the Board of Assessment Review, while Fran Sheehan was appointed to succeed new Town Board member Maureen Cunningham on the Conservation Easement Review Board. Fortin’s term will begin on September 30 and Sheehan will finish Cunningham’s term, which ends on Dec. 31, 2019.

The board also approved a background check policy for the town’s Employee Manual that would allow background investigations for all potential new employees.

“With the increased publicity of inappropriate behavior in a variety of workplaces, employers have a heightened concern to explore options that provide additional protection to our employees, and the public we serve,” wrote Director of Human Resources Mary Tremblay-Glassman in a memo to the Town Board.

In addition to approving a purchase and a sale for the Department of Public Works, town board members also voted to set a public hearing for a proposed legislative amendment that would extend the Cold War Veterans tax exemption beyond ten years.

Apple on gun attacks: ‘Run, Hide, Fight’

ALBANY — Stricter gun control could help a bit. Better care for the mentally ill could help a little too. Armed guards at entrance of where people gather might help. Banning violent video games and encouraging prayer in schools might help. A total and complete shift in how our society views everything would probably do the trick — but that could take a few generations.

Sadly, most believe, if someone wants to do what Nikolas Cruz did in a Florida high school on Feb. 14 there is little any legislative body or school board policy that will stop it. And, it just doesn’t apply to schools, though the mass murder of children is particularly hard for a psyche to digest.

“This is becoming the new norm. It has come to the point where we have to be prepared to encounter an active shooter,” said Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple. “Knowing what to do — how to get out of a building safely and what weapons are available to use — could save your life.”

The Sheriff’s Department offers training for schools and businesses in how to prepare for an active shooter situation. The classes, which last two to four hours and rely on three very basic, almost instinctive, principals: “Run, Hide, Fight.”

In December, the Sheriff’s Department gave a training seminar at St. Ambrose for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Albany. Three-hundred people attended.

“We want to make sure we do everything we can to be aware and know our employees have the best tools,” said Mary Deturris Poust, the director of communications at the diocese. “We don’t think we are a more likely target but we are certainly not immune so it is better if people are prepared and know what to look for and how to respond.”

She said since every property is different the diocese is encouraging each parish and school to host the sheriff or other law enforcement agency and

hold their own training.

“The sheriff was fantastic. He wants to train people,” she said. “They are informative without being overly upsetting and our staff responded really well.”

While the classroom settings do help, he said, when it comes to a school, the best tool at his disposal is the life-like simulation of an active shooter like the drill conducted at the Clayton A. Bouton High School in Voorheesville last year.

“We had EMS and police and role players and we were shooting off cap guns and tried to do everything that could happen in such an event and that is the best way to teach people what they should do,” he said.

While he would like to conduct such active shooter drill at schools throughout Albany County, it is an expensive and a logistically complex endeavor to pull off. But, the basic skills of surviving an active shooter — “Run, Hide, Fight” — are discussed on a video

produced for Apple’s office and emulated nationwide.

Run, Hide, Fight

That is the order of what anyone who finds themselves in an active shooter situation.

Run: Always try to escape or evacuate, even when others insist on staying. Encourage others to leave with you, but don’t let them slow you down with indecision, according to the video.

Hide: If you can’t get out, the next best option is to hide — and don’t forget to silence the ringer on your cell phone — and then do your best to remain calm and quiet.

Fight: Finally, if there are no other options: “Act with aggression. Improvise weapons. Disarm. And commit to taking the shooter down, no matter what.”

A combination of an all-out simulation and the video training is the most cost-effective and practical way to teach active shooter

response preparations and there are three schools signed up over the next week to present the course to students.

One that came to the forefront since the shooting did happened a school rather than a concert or a mall, is over armed guards or police officers at the schools.

Apple, though, while adding it wouldn’t hurt, said it’s not the answer and not as effective as each student being personally prepared.

“The cops can’t be everywhere,” he said. “Look at the Shen campus, for example. There is no way one cop or even six cops can patrol that entire campus if someone is on a mission. He or she would not be the person who puts an end to something like this.”

“There are millions of guns in this country and there is no way we are going to get rid of all of them so let’s deal with the safe storage and safe handling of these weapons,” Apple said on the topic of gun control.

Guilderland gymnasts finish second

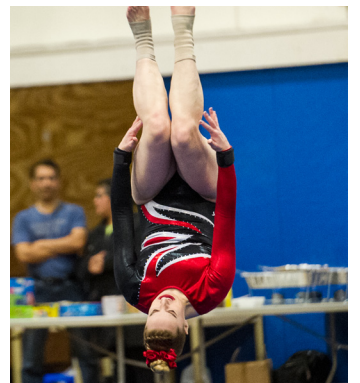
COLONIE — Saratoga High School won the team gymnastics Section II championship on Wednesday, Feb. 14, at Shaker High School with a score of 171.075.

Second problem is politicizing this type of event. Immediately we hear about gun control, the NRA, the left, the right etc., etc., etc.

This is helping nothing.

There is no simple solution for this problem. However, I will outline below a way to move to a solution.

Parents need to know what their kids are doing in real life and online.

This shooter had an assault weapon, gas mask, smoke bombs, etc. ... And no one knew.

We need to address mental health in America.

This shooter enjoyed killing small animals and posted related information on social media. This is a strong indication of pathology that was never addressed.

Assault weapons need to be outlawed.

I am not, and never have been, a gun owner. I feel Americans who qualify have every right to own a gun for hunting or sport or collectibles or whatever. However assault weapons should only be in the hands of the military and police. These weapons have one purpose only: to kill as many people as possible in the shortest amount of time.

We need more of an armed police

presence in our schools, period.

They are the best deterrent to shootings and other crimes.

Teachers and students need training in how to prevent these incidents.

They need to know what to look out for and how to report concerns and suspicious activity to school officials.

We need a multi-faceted approach to a very complex problem. There is no one action, no one law that will end it.

I only wish there was.

The solution to the problem exists; the question is, do we want to solve it or not?

Boost your savings for better financial health

Saving money and achieving financial stability rank among the highest priorities for most people. Yet most people struggle with both—often at the expense of their financial wellness.

News gathering long served the purpose of answering the simple yet key questions of who, what, when, where and why. The Five W's — and sometimes “how” — addressed the information needed to inform audiences, but that way of presentation has since grown stale. Nearly 40 years after CNN went to 24-hour news coverage, people now consume news at 40 megabytes per second on tablets and cellphones.

The proliferation and popularity of social media has enabled everyone to answer The Five W's. Think of Arab Spring in 2010, when news outlets across the globe depended upon videos and texts from everyday citizens to reveal what was happening in North Africa and the Middle East. That same information, however, was already on Twitter for everyone to see.

Information no longer flows through CNN, and newspapers rebrand themselves amidst the threat of going the way of a dial-up internet service. Now, the operative term *to inform* has moved on, or at least paired with, the transitive verb *to engage*.

“At a time when the internet seems to be mostly an echo chamber of negativity, Two Buttons Deep can bring some levity and happiness to your social media feed,” said Vic Christopher, of Clark House Hospitality in Troy. The then-upstart media outlet hitched a ride with Christopher for the Capital District’s momentous first Uber ride last June. “They understand what viewers want, which is

short, entertaining and local content.”

Two Buttons Deep co-founder and producer, Jack Carpenter says content continues to be king. He has a knack for knowing what catches your attention. He developed a YouTube channel in his first year of high school. By the time he graduated in 2011, he had garnered a million viewers.

A high school business project nearly landed Carpenter in trouble with Kentucky Fried Chicken. He and a classmate produced a mock commercial involving a puppy (not actually) being tossed from a moving car after taking a bite out of their chicken. When the posted video went viral months later, animal activists attacked the Colonel. When the food chain approached the high school, Carpenter took the video down.

Flash forward six years later, Carpenter and fellow Shenendehowa alumna Taylor Rao founded Two Buttons Deep, calling the Ignite U NY shared office space in Troy their home base. Together, they are teamed with a handful of staffers who focus on what news they think people want to talk about.

“There’s no type of innovative media outlet up here,” said Carpenter. “Everyday, we’re coming up with ideas. Our tagline is

“Stuff Worth Talking About.” We talk in the morning with all of our writers and we just find things in upstate New York that we think people will want to talk about.”

Such content includes articles on upstate happenings, often times accompanied by a two-minute video with a humorous and personal slant. Earlier this month, Rao tackled the contentious drama between RPI President Shirley Ann Jackson and her alumni. An email from one of the school’s lecturers stoked

the fire after it allegedly accused its former students for holding back donations because she was a short, black woman. Rao, who stands five-feet tall, proceeded to ask RPI students if height truly was an issue. Other headlines on the news and entertainment website include national topics: “One of Us: Teen

Olympian Overslept, Lost His Coat, Dropped an F-Bomb on Live TV And Won USA Our First Gold Medal” and “This Student Snapchatted Today While An Active Shooter Shot At Him Because That’s The World We Live in (VIDEO).”

“Our idea, in general, is that every piece of news that you consume on the local level is “who, what, when, where, and why.” And, what Two Buttons Deep does is go out to events, we interview people, and we

cover the “Wow” and “What the F?” said Rao.

Rao is a journalism graduate from Ithaca College. She has interned and continues to freelance at the Albany Times Union, where she impressed Kristi Gustafson Barlette. The features writer has called Rao her “top former intern.” She comes across as thoughtful, yet sassy and free-spirited in front of the camera, none so as evident as her “Nobody asked me, but...” segments. In short clips she shares her opinions on trivial subjects while showcasing a local hotspot. She is an avid news consumer, a frequent reader of The New York Times, local and international news, but she understands that’s a rare quality among her peers.

“The people around here, the 20-something demographic, is not consuming [traditional media] content,” she said. As the team’s editor in chief, she doesn’t see Two Buttons Deep as anyone’s first destination for news. However, she said, it will continue to be the place to go for a personal take on trending events.

“That’s been the biggest transformation,” said Carpenter, “that people are starting to recognize us and they know a little bit more about what we do.” The business venture has yet to generate enough income to support its staff. But, with its growing popularity that could change.

“Jack Carpenter and Two Buttons Deep are on to something good,” said comedian and entertainer Greg Aidala. “I can say that I admire his passion to bring awareness to the professional talent in the 518... and he’s got a good head of hair.”

Tonkatsu (Crispy Fried Pork Cutlets)

Experimentation draws many people to cooking. Amateur cooks who are passionate about food can't wait for the opportunity to prepare a meal that strays from the norm while testing their culinary skills.

Japanese cuisine is beloved the world over, but many non-Japanese people may be hesitant to prepare a favorite Japanese meal at home. Those who want to try can prepare the following recipe for "Tonkatsu (Crispy Fried Pork Cutlets)" courtesy of Amy Kaneko's "Let's Cook Japanese Food!" (Chronicle Books).

Ingredients: Serves four

- 4 boneless pork loin chops, each about 1/4 pound and 1/2- to 3/4-inch thick
- Canola or another neutral oil for deep-frying
- 1 to 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 large egg
- 3 to 4 cups panko (see note)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Tonkatsu sauce (see note)
- Karashi (optional; see note)
- 1/2 head green cabbage, finely shredded
- 2 tomatoes, cored and quartered

Instructions:

If your pork chops are on the thick side (3/4 inch), use a sharp knife to score one side lightly, making the cuts about 1 inch apart. This will ensure that thicker chops cook through.

Pour the oil to a depth of 3 inches into a wok or deep, wide saucepan and heat to 350° F on a deep-frying thermometer, or until a bit of panko dropped into the hot

oil rises immediately to the top.

While the oil is heating, spread the flour in a small, shallow bowl. Break the egg into a second shallow bowl and beat with chopsticks or a fork until well blended. Spread 3 cups of the panko in a third shallow bowl. Sprinkle a little panko on a flat plate or tray.

To bread the cutlets, one at a time, sprinkle both sides of the cutlets with the salt. Dust them with the flour, shaking off the excess; coat with the egg; and then coat with the panko. Using your fingertips, lightly press the panko in place. As each cutlet is ready, place it on the prepared plate. As you work, add more panko to the bowl as needed.

When the oil is ready, add 1 or 2 breaded cutlets (it is imperative not to crowd the pan) and fry, turning often, until very crispy and medium-dark brown, about 6 minutes. Using tongs, transfer to a wire rack or paper towels to drain. Repeat until all the cutlets have been fried.

To serve, cut each chop crosswise into narrow strips and then reassemble the chops on 4 individual plates. Drizzle the tonkatsu sauce over the top and place a dab of karashi (if using) on the side. Serve the cabbage and tomatoes alongside.

Panko: Also called Japanese bread crumbs or honey-wheat bread crumbs, these light-colored, nearly flat "shards" of flaked wheat flour are used for many deep-fried dishes like Tonkatsu. Panko is readily available in plastic bags in the Asian or international foods section of regular markets.

Tonkatsu sauce: Also called fruit sauce, this thick, slightly sweet, spiced sauce is indispensable in the modern Japanese kitchen. Bull Dog is a famous Japanese brand, but Kikkoman is the most widely available brand outside of Japan. This

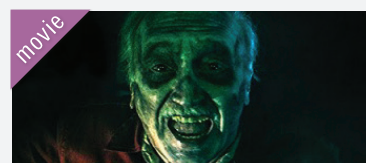

Cousin Earth, Ampevene shine

Albany prog rockers give taste of new record before Cousin Earth dazzles in headlining slot

ALBANY — The Hollow Bar and Kitchen was in a New York state of mind on Friday night, Feb. 9.

Albany progressive rock quartet Ampevene, celebrating the release of its new album “Ephemagoria,” and Brooklyn-bred Cousin Earth threw down the perfect blend of Led Zeppelin-esque energy and a quirkiness in the Frank Zappa vein at Albany’s leading rock club.

Kicking things off with “Romethu,” Ampevene displayed its prowess for technical proficiency, led by guitarist Gabe Stallman and bassist Mack Hogan trading runs. Hogan’s thumping rhythm was a constant throughout the group’s set. “Tracalysis” was followed up with an all out rock ‘n’ roll drum solo from Brian Fahey.

Pulling from one of its main influences, Ampevene launched into the chunky opening chords of Nirvana’s mega hit “Smells Like Teen Spirit.” Stallman added a unique spin to his short solo, making the song take a psychedelic spin. “Goliath” preceded “Tumultous,” the latter of which morphed into a crowd pleasing segment featuring Zeppelin’s “Dazed and Confused.” The jam saw the crowd grow a little rowdy and the band responded with the highlight of its set. “New Song” and “Valencia” closed out the set to a roaring applause from the band’s friends and family in attendance.

Up next was Cousin Earth, playing its first headlining show at the venue. The five-piece group melds together a wide array of musical variety, which it proved right out of the gate with a searing take on the “Zelda” theme song. Joey Calfa, on his trusted electric ukulele, showed his prowess on the unconventional rock instrument by transforming each note into a blend of guitar and ukulele.

“Zelda Sarias Song” > “Think of all the Things” > “Tale Spin Theme Song” was next, as Calfa and bassist Corey Feldman,

who plays on a Kala U Bass the size of a ukulele, continued to feed off each other’s energy. Tara Lawton, who also plays the melodica, and Terry Brennan held down the vocals with the confidence of a seasoned opera singer, giving the band a sometimes Vaudeville-like feel.

(Side note: I first saw Cousin Earth a little more than three years ago, just as it was transitioning into its new name from Ukulelian. They opened up a small festival and the crowd was sparse to say the least. I was unsure what this band was going to be like given the irreverent instrumental selections, but the band blew me away that afternoon. Since then, Cousin Earth has been on a steady upward climb, and its headlining slot at The Hollow was proof of their professional work ethic.)

“Dancing Fool,” “Keep it Greasy,” “Super Fun Laser Beams” and “Alive” allowed each member to stand out at times, while also showcasing its incredible

improvisational skills. Drummer Nate Searing held it all together throughout the night, while at the same time providing a loose and fun atmosphere.

The funniest part of the night is when they burst into a cover of actress Natalie Portman’s rap from Saturday Night Live. Attendees sang along and the band had some trouble containing laughter on stage.

The closing segment of “Blisters,” “Keep On” > “Scuttle Buttin” > “Little Wing” > “Capricorn on the Cob” saw Calfa switch between his ukulele and his cherry red Fender Stratocaster to do his best Jimi Hendrix impression.

All told, this show was great in every aspect. As both Ampevene and Cousin Earth continue to ascend and grow, both groups still put all of its effort into a pleasing live experience.

Bandmates bring Starman back

An All-Star lineup celebrates David Bowie at The Egg

ALBANY — With members of his touring bands on stage at The Egg, David Bowie's catalog was celebrated in earnest, featuring a mix of classics, rarities and fan favorites that sprang an audience from their seats throughout the night. Having lost Bowie just over two years ago, the stars sounded very different tonight thanks to the voices of Bernard Fowler (The Rolling Stones), Gaby Moreno, Joe Sumner and Corey Glover (Living Colour) bringing life to Starman's songs once again.

Celebrating Bowie featured an incredible lineup fronted by Queens native Mike Garson, who performed with Bowie at his first and last U.S. concerts, and noted early on that he was blessed to play 1,000 concerts and 20 albums with Bowie and was proud to continue bringing his music to you. Joining Garson were guitarists Earl Slick and Gerry Leonard, Carmine Rojas



on bass and Lee John Madeloni (Slick's son) on drums. Over the course of two and a half hours of more than 20 songs, between five and ten musicians were on stage at a time, echoing Garson's remark, "It takes a village to get Bowie's music across."

With all this talent and Bowie's music, it raises the question, "Is there such a thing as too many hits to play?" The answer, by the end of the marathon performance, was a definitive no. Rojas noted after the show that with all the tunes to choose from, it is hard to pick what to play, however they intend to mix it up night after night this tour. Bowie indeed had too many hits to count, plus a bevy of under-appreciated albums, many of which found themselves in the limelight this evening, performed by the musicians who knew the music better than anyone other than Bowie himself.

Starting the night with "Bring Me the Disco King," an extended cut from 2003's "Reality" album, Fowler took the lead on vocals from the get-go, following with "Rebel Rebel," "Moonage Daydream" and "Fame" which saw the crowd rise with encouragement from Fowler. Glover, who sang backup for Fowler on many songs during the evening, took to the mic for the first time singing "Changes," followed by "Space Oddity," the first song vocalist Gaby Moreno, a 2017 Grammy nominee for Best Latin Pop album for "Ilusión," sang amid a starry backdrop. Sumner, Sting's son, sang and played acoustic guitar for "Quicksand" off "Hunky Dory," followed by Glover back

on vocals for "Young Americans."

An immense highlight of the show followed in the form of "5 Years," performed elegantly by Moreno. The gritty, dark rock of "Station to Station" brought Slick into the limelight to perform the title track of the album to which he contributed. During the outro to "Alladin Sane," a piano medley by Garson included Bowie, Beatles, and old timey piano tunes mixed in. Moreno and Fowler performed a duet on "Wild is the Wind" while Sumner sang "Ziggy Stardust" better than anyone alive, with Slick shredding throughout.

During "Suffragette City," Glover ventured into the crowd for the latter part of the song, and admiring the amphitheater in front of him, he took a seat in the top row to take in the set closing "All the Young Dudes," where Sumner had everyone waving hands in the air.

For the encore, Leonard came out for a solo guitar rendition of rarity "Loving the Alien," followed by Sumner stepping out to sing "Life on Mars?," an emotional rendition of one of Bowie's best songs. For the grand finale, "Heroes" closed the show, bringing all 10 musicians to the stage for an all-star ending to an emotional tribute to one of the greatest rock 'n' roll legends ever.

sauce keeps in the refrigerator for a long time after opening.

Karashi: Japanese brands of Chinese-style hot yellow mustard powder, or karashi, are hard to find outside of Asian markets. But Chinese brands, which are more common, will do. This condiment is served in a little dab for mixing with Tonkatsu sauce for accompanying Tonkatsu. It's pretty hot, so taste it before you start mixing it in. Most brands are mixed in a ratio of 2 teaspoons mustard powder to 1 tablespoon water. Check the package for directions.

We certainly wanted to go red with this dish, something fruity and light. Because this is a fried dish, we also didn't want to pair this meal with something dry either. With that said, a grenache would pair wonderfully with this dish.
