
Local schools partake in national walkout day

walked out of Bethlehem Central Wednesday, March 14. At the same time, about 500 students walked out of Guilderland Central High School, while hundreds of students in the Voorheesville and Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk districts held "walk-in" events.

Those students joined others in more than 3,000 schools across the nation to express solidarity with their counterparts at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Fla., who lost 14 classmates and three teachers exactly one month earlier, when Nikolas Cruz, an expelled student, opened fire on the school with a semiautomatic rifle.

Students from Marjory Stoneman Douglas, even in their grief, wasted no time in standing up and demanding an end to gun violence in schools, beseeching lawmakers to implement more restrictive gun control legislation that could reduce the likelihood of tragedies like the one in Parkland... or Sandy Hook... or Columbine.

## Walmart shenanigans result in host of criminal charges, traffic violations

GLENMONT—On Thursday, March 15, at 4:15 p.m. the Bethlehem Police Department responded to the Glenmont Walmart in regards to a subject who had just fraudulently returned merchandise and committed a larceny.

As police arrived on the scene they reportedly observed the suspect fleeing in a 2001 Ford Taurus. The vehicle quickly pulled into the Glenwood Manor

Apartments just south of Walmart and the suspect reportedly fled on foot into a wooded area and an adjacent neighborhood.

Bethlehem officers formed a perimeter in the area and were able to locate the suspect hiding behind a garage in the rear of a residence. He was identified as Everett G. Rasso, 35, of Ravena.

A search of the vehicle that he fled

in revealed hypodermic needles, as well as plastic baggies and a glass pipe with crack cocaine, and a plastic bag containing Fentanyl.

Rasso was arrested and charged with misdemeanor counts of petit larceny, falsifying business records, resisting arrest, criminal possession of a controlled substance, criminal possession of a hypodermic instrument, unlawfully fleeing a police officer in a motor vehicle, unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, reckless driving, and aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle, as well as seven traffic violations.

Rasso was arraigned in the Town of Bethlehem Court by Judge Ryan Donovan and remanded to the Albany County jail. He is scheduled to return to the Town of Bethlehem Court on April 3.

### Accident yields multiple charges, violations

**BETHLEHEM**—On Tuesday, March 13, at 5:33 p.m., the Bethlehem Police Department responded to a report of a two-vehicle crash at the intersection of Elm Avenue and Feura Bush Road. Upon arrival, officers reportedly determined that a 2011 Volkswagen Routan had rear-ended a 2011 Scion xB at the intersection, and that the operator of the Volkswagen was displaying signs of intoxication.

After standard field sobriety tests were administered, the operator of the Volkswagen, Denise M. Ikasalo, 40, of Slingerlands, was arrested for DWI. It was also reportedly determined that there were two passengers in Ikasalo's vehicle at the time of the crash who were under the age of 15.

Ikasalo was returned to the

Bethlehem Police Department and administered a chemical test, after which she was charged with two felony counts of aggravated DWI with a child in the vehicle (Leandra's Law), two misdemeanor counts of endangering the welfare of a child, misdemeanor counts of resisting arrest, DWI, driving with a BAC greater than 0.08 percent, aggravated DWI, for having a BAC greater than 0.18 percent, and traffic violations of following too closely, and refusing to submit to a pre-screening device.

The driver of the Scion was treated for minor injuries at the scene.

Ikasalo was arraigned in the Town of Bethlehem Court and released on \$15,000 bail. She is scheduled to return to Bethlehem Court on Tuesday, April 3.

### Thief caught

BETHLEHEM—On

Tuesday, March 13, Bethlehem Police arrested Jonathan R. Mergendahl, 27, of Ravena, for one felony count of criminal possession of stolen property in the fourth degree. During an investigation into stolen welding equipment that took place in the Town of Coyemans, Bethlehem Police reportedly located the stolen equipment at a scrap metal facility in Bethlehem and determined that Mergendahl was the individual who had scrapped the equipment. He was arraigned in Bethlehem Court and released on his own recognizance to return to court on Tuesday, April 3.

## Volunteer did not make contact with victims through affiliation with BCHS

BETHLEHEM—A BCSD volunteer who was charged this month with inappropriate sexual contact with minors did not make contact with his victims through his affiliation with a high school club, according to the Bethlehem Police

Department.
While officials have not said how David Wood, who was a parent volunteer at the school, made contact with the two victims, they are confident it was not due to his connection with the school.

Regardless, the district is reviewing its processes for vetting school volunteers in light of the recent events. While fingerprinting and board approval are required for some volunteers, there is currently no standard policy for parents who volunteer with school clubs.

District officials met with local law enforcement on Thursday, March 15, for a previously scheduled school safety meeting and will be considering ways to address the issue. Not many schools have systems in place for filtering parent volunteers, but the district is gathering information on the few that do to determine the best way to proceed.

## Tale as old as time

Ambitious BCHS' production of Disney's 1991 musical 'Beauty and the Beast' pays homage to tale's history

**BETHLEHEM**—Students in the Stage 700 theatre club at Bethlehem Central High School are busy preparing for the opening night of their spring production, "Beauty and the Beast," which will take place this Thursday, March 22 at 7 p.m.

More than 120 students in the cast, orchestra and production and technical crews have been working hard to bring the familiar tale to the high school stage, according to Parent Producer Colleen Bonacci, who said the sets, costumes and special effects are primarily handmade, rather than purchased or rented.

Director James Yeara, a retired BCHS theatre teacher who still returns to direct school productions, has plumbed the history of the tale of Beauty and the Beast and the many ways it has been told over the years. While the school is performing the 1991 Disney animated version, with the well-known music by Alan Menken, Yeara said that he has incorporated elements from Disney's 2017 CGI version (which Yeara decried as woefully autotuned) and Jean Cocteau's 1946 La Belle et la Bête, and has added a few touches of his own (Gaston's "selfie" portraiture) to make the performance both familiar and unique.

"We've tried to be true to the core of the tale that goes back to the Greek myths," he said, after briefly explaining the tale of Psyche and Cupid, on which Beauty and the Beast is based. "We don't get to have love at first sight, we have to earn love; love comes from conversations and kind of a sharing and blossoming of the soul. It's not just a dopey musical, there's a great story underneath. A classic story."

"I have enjoyed this experience so much," said BCHS senior Matt Bonacci, who plays Gaston's sidekick LeFou. "It is amazing to be able to work with so many different creative minds! Everyone works so hard and cares so much."

the "over the top," "flamboyant" character. "Even though LeFou is a villain," he said, "he's such a lovable character and it's been so beyond fun to play him. I get to do so much and push myself. I've felt myself grow as an actor and person."

"Bethlehem kids are up to the task of acting," said Yeara. Beyond blocking and memorization, he said students have been working to create a moving set that will shift around during the songs (which he guaranteed won't be auto-tuned). "It's a huge undertaking. The kids constantly have to move, they have to act, they have to react to things."

"The directors have given the chance for everyone in the cast to shine," said Bonacci. "It's great to see the younger kids put them self out there and try so hard. I remember being scared and not willing to take risks, but the older kids helped break out of that shell. I try to be that force to the younger kids, I know that they're great, and I want them to be comfortable so they can be their best. This cast really is a family!"

"Being a part of the BCHS theater and music programs throughout my high school career is an experience I will never forget," said senior Delaney Beck, who plays the role of Belle. "To be able to do Beauty and the Beast my senior year has been such a joy and pleasure and has definitely topped the cake." Beck, who will be attending Skidmore College next year, said that she considers the BCHS theatre program to be a second family and that she hopes to continue to be involved with theatre in college. "Throughout the past four years I have created friendships to last a lifetime." she said.

Senior McKenzie Albrecht, who plays a variety of roles in the performance, said she's "dreading having to say goodbye" to the friends she has made during the four years that she has been involved with the theatre program. "Theatre is what really made BC so wonderful for me because I got to do what I love with all of my friends," she said.

While Yeara declined to say whether he will be directing musicals for BCHS next year, he has already agreed to direct the final BCHS play of this school year. Auditions for On The Razzle will take place only a week after Beauty and the Beast closes.



### What to expect from the mortgage process

hen it comes to getting a loan, doing your homework pays off. You will want to make sure you know what to expect from the process, particularly if you are a first-time homebuyer. The following list will help prepare you.

Pre-approval. A pre-approval is an application for credit and a lender's written commitment (subject to verification) of how much they'll let you borrow. Getting pre-approved will show home sellers you are a serious buyer.

**Loan application.** This is how the bank determines if it will make a loan to you. You will need to provide pay stubs for the past 30 days, W-2 forms and tax returns from the past two years, as well as statements from bank and investment accounts. The lender will also examine your credit history while reviewing your note and deed will be prepared. loan application.

ate you were quoted, you may elect to lock in cation fees, points, title, insurance and credit your rate by paying an up-front authorization fee. processing.

Points. You can pay points, a dollar amount based on a percentage of the loan amount, to the lender to reduce the interest rate on the loan. It adds costs up front but can help save you money

Appraisal. The appraisal is conducted by an independent professional and determines the value of the home.

Down payment. Lenders prefer that a borrower have 20 percent of the purchase price for the down payment. If you make a down payment of less than 20 percent you may be required to purchase Private Mortgage Insurance (PMI). PMI protects the lender if you default on the loan and is part of your monthly mortgage loan payment.

Loan review process. After the appraisal, the loan file is submitted to the lender for your loan to be reviewed.

Escrow and title preparation. A title company will hold the money and documents until all conditions of the mortgage approval are met. Title work will be prepared, including a title exam to ensure the title to the property is clear. Other documents such as the mortgage

## County exec comes to town

BETHLEHEM—When Dan McCoy became Albany County Executive seven years ago, he decided to "take the show on the road," he said, to reach out to residents in the county's many municipalities to share with them how their tax dollars are spent at the county level.

"There are a lot of things that we do that people don't realize how they intertwine with your daily lives," McCoy said on Wednesday, March 14, as he gave his seventh state of the county update at Bethlehem Town Hall.

Saying that state mandates and the state tax cap can make county governance difficult, he noted the work his office has done to improve the financial health of the county—negotiating union contracts, increasing fiscal reserves and keeping taxes down.

Moving forward, McCoy talked about some things his office is working on, such as the addition of rental bikes on the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail in partnership with the Capital District Transportation Authority. "We estimated last year that 250,000 people walked the rail trail," he said. He also answered a question he said he often gets asked when visiting this part of the county: "The final stretch of the rail trail? We're looking at August.

"We're going to be revamping the bridge on New Scotland right out by the Slingerlands Fire house," he said, adding that the county has purchased a house on the rail trail in that area and is considering whether to turn the property into a visitor center. He also said

that the county is looking at options for those who need to use the restroom while walking or biking on the trail, whether that will involve partnering with businesses along the trail or the addition of "porta-johns." He noted that the county already has an agreement with Stewart's on Delaware Avenue that allows trail users to park in its lot.

McCoy spoke about the Albany County Nursing Home, which has experienced a financial turnaround since he took office seven years ago. ACNH is about to undergo a \$60 million renovation that will include the addition of the county sheriff's 9-1-1 division on the top floor. "So response time for our residents at our nursing home is going to be less than ten seconds," he said. "It's going to be a good incorporation. First of its kind in New York state."

The county executive went on to talk about sharing services across municipalities, something his office has focused on for years but has recently been mandated by New York state as a cost-saving measure. Working with the Rockefeller Institute, the county developed a plan that McCoy said would save approximately \$19 million dollars when fully implemented. "Right now we're looking at the Voorheesville school district, maybe taking over their bus maintenance and some other stuff for them. It's going to save the [Village] of Voorheesville a lot of money.'

Another focus of the county, he said, is energy efficiency. "We're trying to be the greenest county in New York state," said McCoy, pointing out that the majority of county buildings are designated as Energy Star efficient and that officials are actively looking for ways to

increase efficiency through solar energy and other renewables, in addition to hosting a variety of informative public programs.

"Some of the un-sexy things we have to do: we have this opiate crisis going on in this nation," McCoy said. "I say this to the young people in the audience: 80 percent of heroin users come from prescription drugs." He spoke briefly about a federal lawsuit that the county has filed against four national pharmaceutical manufacturers, claiming that the companies have engaged in deceptive practices that have resulted in widespread addiction and death.

McCoy pointed out that Four Corners Pharmacy in Delmar is one of four pharmacies that participates in the county's Project Orange program (named for the orange labels on controlled substance prescription bottles), providing packaging and free shipping for those who want to safely dispose of any unused medications.

"Go home and clean out your medicine cabinets," he advised. "Get rid of that stuff. You don't need it laying around."

Before taking his leave to get to another engagement, McCoy touched on a few other topics, such as youth programming at Lawson Lake and his equity agenda, through which his office tries to ensure that county services are accessible by all residents, regardless of age, income, ethnicity or address. He thanked board members and County Legislator Bill Reinhardt, who was in attendance, and offered to answer any questions but none were asked.

McCoy's next town "meet and greet" will take place tomorrow, Thursday, March 22, during the Coeymans Town Board meeting at 18 Russell Ave. in Ravena.

### Paid sick leave proposal under review

ALBANY – There is a proposal in front of the County Legislature to offer paid sick leave to any employee – paid or full time – who has worked 80 or more hours in any given year.

According to the legislation, sponsored by Legislator Alison McLean Lane, D-Colonie, employees can accrue at least one hour of sick time per 30 hours worked.

Employers with more than 10 workers will have to grant at least up to 72 hours of earned sick time per year. Employers with fewer than 10 but more than five employees must grant at least 40 hours of paid sick time per year.

Employers with less than five employees must grant at least 40 hours of unpaid sick time to employees during the first year this law goes into effect. After a year of being in effect, employers with five or fewer employees must start offering paid sick time with at least 24 hours off during the second year of this law being in effect and topping out at 40 hours after three years.

Unused paid sick time can also be carried over to the following year by the employee or the employer can pay off the unused time at the end of any given year. But, under the legislation, an employee cannot accumulate sick time expecting to get paid should they get fired, retire or leave the job for any other reason.

Paid sick time can apply to:
-An employees' physical and
mental health and preventative

medical care.
-Care of a family member.

-To care for a child or if the school is closed due to a public health emergency.

-If the employer needs time off to deal with a family offense matter such as domestic abuse, stalking or human trafficking.

McLean Lane, the Legislature's

deputy chair, could not be reached for comment despite repeated efforts.

"I do not support county financial mandates on small business for same reason I object to state funded mandates costing residents tax dollars," said Legislator Paul Burghdorf, R-Colonie. "Sick time and personal service time should be decided by corporate, small business and sole proprietors in discussion with their employees according to statewide standards so Albany County businesses do not suffer a competitive disadvantage."

His colleague Legislator Mark Grimm, R-Guilderland, said county government should be about creating jobs and improving the economy but this legislation will "make it more difficult."

"We should be coming up with ways to help business, not make it more difficult. Legislators must think businesses have all this extra money kicking around but running a small businesses is not an easy thing and neither is running a non-profit," he said

He is urging business owners and residents at large to show up to the public hearing on Tuesday, March 27 in the Legislature's chambers at 112 State St. in downtown Albany at 7:15 p.m.

All the provisions of the proposed legislation are not applicable if the employer offers better benefits and does not apply to any employee who is a member of a collective bargaining unit.

If an employee misses more than three days of work, an employer can require reasonable documentation.

The Albany County Human Rights Division will enforce the local law, should it pass, and it will have the authority to impose penalties on employers who do not properly offer paid sick leave.

### A call for help...

"I remember coming to school the day after the [Parkland] shooting and feeling the discomfort in the student body," said BCHS senior Josh Hauser, president of the Student Senate and a primary organizer of the March 14 walkout. "It was difficult at first for many to express how they felt, and there was a sense of painful deja vu." Students had some time to process their emotions over the February break, he said, "and realized that we are the ones who can make a difference."

The national walkout, which began at 10 a.m. in each time zone, lasted for 17 minutes—one minute for each Parkland victim. While the event was organized nationally by EMPOWER, a youthoriented arm of Women's March, each school observed the event in its own, student-led way.

According to its website, the national #ENOUGH movement is demanding "that Congress enact an immediate resolution declaring gun violence a public health crisis and dedicating federal funding to research solutions and implement violence intervention programs." EMPOWER is also demanding that Congress recognize all forms of gun violence, even that which is committed by police.

The organization is calling for passage of legislation that would:

Ban assault weapons and high capacity magazines / S.2095

Expand background checks to all gun

Pass gun violence restraining order law (would allow courts to disarm individuals who display sign of potentially violent behavior) / H.R.2598 / S.1212

Stop militarizing law enforcement / S.1856 / H.R.1556

In Bethlehem, students waved signs, observed a moment of silence, talked about the importance of using one's political voice, introduced local officials in attendance—county legislators Chairman Andrew Joyce and Joanne Cunningham; state Sen. Neil Breslin, Town Board member Maureen Cunningham, and representatives from U.S. Sen. Kirsten Gillbrand's office—and shouted for their right to an education free from the intimidation of gun violence.

"I am proud of the 500 or more

students of Bethlehem Central High School—and others from the Middle School—who thoughtfully and powerfully organized the student walkout to protest gun violence in our schools, and to see them using their passion, leadership and voices to try to make this country a safer place," said Maureen Cunningham. "I support these young people, our future leaders, and am inspired by the fact that they are joined by thousands more across the country demanding change. We owe it to them to do everything we can to stop this epidemic of gun violence in our schools and our society.'

At Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk High School, students organized a "walk-in," during which they observed 17 seconds of silence and unveiled a 17 Days of Kindness campaign, meant to encourage their classmates to reach out and connect with other students outside of their peer group.

"Our administrative team has met

assembly to discuss issues of student safety, which they conducted themselves, "with the full support of the administration." Student organizers showed slides of the Parkland victims and 17 Voorheesville students told their stories before talking to their classmates about emotional support systems that are available to them.

"Although it is purely student-organized (and we are not in any way speaking on behalf of the administration)," said BCHS junior Connor Chung, president of the Students for Peace and Survival student organization and another primary walkout organizer, "we have worked with the administration to keep it orderly—to that end, we've received assurances that no one will face disciplinary action for participating, and we've arranged for the schedule to be changed slightly such that participants miss no instructional time." Chung said that the students agreed to a few guidelines and thanked the Bethlehem

that such dialogues can happen. In fact,

have overwhelmingly supported student pressure legislators to pass legislation that could keep guns out of the hands of potentially violent criminals, not all administrators have been as responsive. Students in states such as Georgia, Texas and Maryland reportedly walked out under threat of anything from an unexcused 'tardy,' to multiple days of suspension.

Critics of the movement have claimed that banning assault weapons is impossible as there is no real definition of what an assault weapon actually is, while others say that an assault weapon is one that has the ability to fire without manually reloading. Still other critics have argued that the ability to 3-D print weapons makes the proposed legislation useless, while others continue to argue that it is not guns that kill people, it's people. People on both sides of the issue have pointed out that handguns are responsible for more deaths than assault rifles or other firearms.

"By having this demonstration, students will see the power of unity and the strength of passion, said Hauser. "I hope to inspire my fellow classmates to continue this fight." A representative from the League of Women Voters was on hand to register young voters following the walkout and Hauser said Students for Peace and Survival will be organizing an event for students to write and call their representatives, urging them to act on gun violence. In a few weeks, the student organization will host Rep. Paul Tonko at a high school town hall focused specifically on the issue of gun violence in schools.

Student activists and supporters will now prepare for the "March for Our Lives protest on Saturday, March 24. The main event will be held in Washington, DC, with satellite marches planned across the United States and overseas. In Albany, the event will begin at 10 a.m. and take place on the west lawn of the New York State Capitol at Washington Avenue and Swan

"Our demonstration is just one of many across the nation, but together they are making a loud and clear statement," said Hauser, "we want our legislators to take action so we can feel safe in our schools, and we want it now.'

with these students to listen to their ideas, advise them and ensure a safe and respectful event," wrote RCSHS Principal Lisa Patierne in an email sent to parents on Monday, March 12. "We are so proud of our students and their efforts to give voice to these heartfelt matters.'

At Guilderland Central High School, the student-organized demonstration involved observing a moment of silence followed by the reading of the names of the 17 Parkland victims, and releasing a balloon in memory of each one. They also recognized the many other schools that have been affected by gun violence.

According to Superintendent Brian Hunt, students at Voorheesville's Clayton A. Bouton High School organized an

Police Department for providing extra security during the walkout.

While some 500 BCHS students opted not to take part in the demonstration and spent the 17 minutes safely in the school's cafeteria instead, Chung said that he hasn't experienced much animosity from classmates with views different from his

"There are all sorts of ideas on how to address this," he said, noting that ideas tend to follow grief after events like the one in Parkland, "and quite frankly, that is a dialogue that needs to happen. Even though I have my own passionate views, I think it is vital to have honest conversation with those with whom we disagree—and one of the great things about BCHS is



## A sport played with robots

TROY — There are refs, and a time clock and a score is kept. But this sport isn't played with a ball or a puck. It's played with robots.

Nonetheless, the competition was fierce when 35 teams — some from as far away as Quebec and Brazil – rolled into the New York Tech Valley FIRST Robotics Competition held at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute from March 15 to 17.

Locally, high school students from Colonie, Shaker, Voorheesville, Ballston Spa, Albany and Troy, fielded teams to complete the multi-faceted task of defeating "the boss." Robots do so by either picking up yellow cubes and tipping the scale in their team's favor, or exchanging power cubes for "power ups" to gain a temporary advantage and/or by climbing a tower to face "the boss."

Sounds complicated, but not unlike baseball, the team with the highest score at the end of the match wins.

The lessons learned, too, are similar to those lacrosse, football and basketball coaches try to instill in their players.

"I've learned how to work with a group of people who have different skill sets than me and be able to communicate effectively to accomplish a similar goal," said Colonie high senior


Parker Fields, who is heading to the University of Buffalo next year to study engineering. "Basically, we are a bunch of high school students with almost zero experience and our mentors are teaching us to specialize, and when we get to a competition, we have this problem and we need to figure out what we

need to do mechanically, what do we need to do in programming and how each of us can contribute to that objective."

This year, three teams were regional winners: Center Moriches on Long Island, the Brazilian team of Novo Hamburgo, who also won the Chairman's Award, and the team from Albany High School.

There were four regional finalists: the team from Huntington Station on Long Island, the team from Yonkers and teams from Shenendehowa and Shaker high schools.

Mentor Maxwell Llewellyn, a fifth year student at RPI, has been working with the Shaker team for nine years. Last year,

he said they had 45 students but after winning a competition, that number jumped to 90.

"The biggest thing I hope they take away from their time with robotics is problem solving skills," he said. "It's not about learning CAD or learning to program something, it's about seeing a problem, and working with the rest of the team to find ways of solving it in a technical way.

"The seniors who graduate from here are about the same as a junior in college in terms of practical programming ability, and the ability to take a problem and knock it out with code. And that's pretty impressive."

Johnathan Choi, a senior at Shaker, has been on the team all four years of his high school career

"I think the thing that we all have to do is work as a team and find a niche and realizing other people have their own niches and then all that comes together to complete the final goal," said Choi who was accepted into Georgia Tech to study electrical engineering but has not yet committed.

The Voorheesville team, the Praetorians, is in its third year and the three members have put in about 200 hours each on their robot, known this year as Tiberius.

"It's fun watching them become creative in order to solve difficult problems," said mentor "They are all the skills you need to succeed as an adult, and maybe as an engineer."

His daughter, Camile McDonnell, a junior at Voorheesville, said she never expected high school would present the opportunity of learning how to build a robot.

"I've learned so much about things I never thought I would be interested in," she said. "And, we get to see and talk to and compete against teams from all over the world. It's just amazing."

"Just being able to make something from scratch and see it come to life," said Voorheesville senior Spencer Mason, a third-year team member who is headed to UAlbany next year. "You just don't get too many opportunities to spend thousands of dollars to

build an awesome robot."

Money is a factor in robotics, and teams solicit sponsors from companies who hire engineers like General Electric, National Grid and a host of others. Other companies sponsor prizes and help pay for the cost of building the intricate arenas.

And there are all different areas of focus that each team must accomplish including the raw body of the robot, the mechanics that go into making it move, electrical components to give it "life" and computer programming.

"There are a bunch who do the mechanics, there are a bunch who do programing and there is another team involved in scouting out how everyone else is performing," said Bill Burkhard, a Colonie mentor from Delmar. "But the one thing about this that is so cool, is it's like any other real world job. You have an assignment on day one and a deadline that is six-weeks away and you have to work together in order to complete that assignment."

## Pension fund tops \$200B

Stong second quarter boost earnings 3.67 percent in 2017

**ALBANY** — According to a recent labor report from New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli, the New York State Common Retirement Fund enjoyed a strong second quarter in 2017, earning a 3.67 percent overall return on its investments and surpassing the \$200 billion milestone for the first time in its history. In late September, the fund had an estimated value of \$201.3 billion.

The fund holds assets for more than one million public employee members and pensioners of the New York State & Local Retirement System. DiNapoli attributed the fund's recovery following the Great Recession (2007-2013) to its long-term, diversified approach to investing.

"We take the long view of success," he explained, "investing in ways that provide consistent returns and retirement security for our members, retirees and beneficiaries for decades to come."

Taking the long-term view has made the fund a leader among institutional investors in responding to the challenges associated with climate change. "In addition to the risk of rising sea levels and catastrophic weather events, climate change involves large-scale economic implications," stated the labor message.



'Such factors will have complex effects on the global economy and the Fund's holdings.'

The New York State Common Retirement Fund has been rated a top U.S. investor by the Asset Owners Disclosure Project, an independent global not-for-profit organization working to protect people's retirement savings from the risks posed by climate change, in recognition of the its ability to successfully address the risks of climate change. DiNapoli recently announced a \$2 billion increase to the fund's low emissions index fund, raising sustainable investments to more than \$7

He has also been successful challenging companies on climate change policies and encouraging transitions into the low carbon economy. The pension fund won broad shareholder support for resolutions at ExxonMobil, Duke Energy and others to agree to examine how the worldwide effort to meet the goals of the Paris Agreement will impact their businesses.

### FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

## Children shall lead the way

hile some of us were children, our parents were forced with the dilemma of rationing fuel. Switch plates in our public buildings reminded us of this, asking us to turn off the lights before leaving the room. Our nation was in the midst of an energy crisis. Some of us remember those days. Being a kid, it didn't bother us as much as it did our parents. When we cried for them after a nightmare, they didn't preach to us about the resources expanded by turning on the bedroom light. They turned on the light, soothed our concerns and left the light on while we fell back to sleep.

Last week, in various acts of activism, our children voiced out against gun violence in their respective schools. A young generation gathered together and said, "enough" and "never again" weeks after the latest high school massacre in Parkland, Fla. For some, it was a cry for help. For others, it was the first step towards turning the light on for themselves. But, what happened afterwards is an embarrassment.

We posted a video of one of those gatherings at Bethlehem Central High School. An example of a well organized walk out, done so with the aid of a compassionate school staff. Students peacefully walked out and into the protection of the football field, never leaving the campus. Student leaders spoke, asking for a moment of silence, and later sharing speeches empowering these future voters to take action at the polls. One voice in particular spoke of our tendency to dwell within our own echo chambers. We stay within a community of like-minded people to shelter from those who differ from us, and combat against them. Hyperbole, you think? Read the more than 300 comments left on that post.

Our social media has exhibited just how antisocial people can be. Insults and assumptions fly freely towards strangers, instead of salutations and questions in attempts to understand. Today, we speak of those who chose to lash out and attack these children without once having a conversation with them. Children who some have said are too young to comprehend the message they are standing behind, while many of them are approaching the threshold to vote. The same threshold that obliges them to register for civil service. The same age older generations went on to fight in foreign wars. A 17- or 18-year-old is too

young to understand the world, but we can ask them to to travel halfway around it to die in war. The average age of a U.S. soldier killed in Vietnam was 19.

There is no debate anymore. People have lost the ability to communicate with one another. Instead of earnest attempts at listening and sharing one's side, learning and possibly compromising, there are attacks and straight-line attempts to undermine. Just as some believe conservatives are warmongers, there are others who believe liberals advocate for gun control because AR-15s are scary looking. The same astute student leader who spoke of echo chambers last week also advised his peers to not define this moment as an argument for gun control. There is a need, however, a need for change. Our children are crying for

Regardless of which side of the argument you stand, a civil and compassionate conversation is needed. Unfortunately, many of the adults of this country have proven they possess the inability to do so. Here, we have a young generation biting at the bit, rattling at the gates before they are released out into the world.

Last week, in various acts of activism, our children voiced out against gun violence in their respective schools. A young generation gathered together and said, "enough" and "never again" weeks after the latest high school massacre in Parkland, Fla. For some, it was a cry for help. For others, it was the first step towards turning the light on for themselves. But, what happened afterwards is an embarrassment.

We posted a video of one of those gatherings at Bethlehem Central High School. An example of a well organized walk out, done so with the aid of a compassionate school staff. Students peacefully walked out and into the protection of the football field, never leaving the campus. Student leaders spoke, asking for a moment of silence, and later sharing speeches empowering these future voters to take action at the polls.





## ADK artist pops up in Delmar

**DELMAR**—When town resident Pam Skripak walked into a pop-up art exhibit in Tupper Lake with her mother last year, she didn't expect to encounter the expansive, textured and colorful abstract paintings of Michael Nighswonger, the artist currently showing his work at 343 Delaware Ave. in Delmar.

"It was Tupper Lake," she said, standing amid paintings on the ground floor of the space at the former TD Bank branch. 'We were expecting tame landscape paintings. But nothing like this. I just loved it."

Skripak asked Nighswonger what he was doing hidden away in the Adirondacks. According to the artist, he had moved to Tupper Lake to escape a career that was beginning to feel inauthentic.

Nighswonger began his artistic career as an independent filmmaker in the early days of reality television. He and a partner undertook to drive across the country to get footage for a reality series depicting the lives and struggles of real Americans, push-back against a nascent genre he saw becoming riddled with the sensationalism of man's worst impulses. Unfortunately, a falling out with his partner forced him to rethink his path when he found himself stranded on the East Coast with no money or footage just before the turn of the century.

Stuck in Fayetteville, N.C., near Fort Bragg, Nighswonger was initially unwilling to give up his vision. It was at a party, while he was talking about the series he wanted to get back to Los Angeles, Calif., to make, that a friend asked if he had ever tried painting. Nighswonger said no and, two days later, the same

box of chalks and pick a color that speaks to you. And I knew what that

meant." A few days later, while listening to Vivaldi, he said, he was moved by a bottle of wine and the color cobalt blue. "It was like, 'Hello!' For the next few weeks, I drew everything I could get my hands on.

After attending a rave in the area, where he drew on the walls of the venue, Nighswonger began to do live art at electronic music events and, eventually, making art on stage during live band performances. "It got wild," he said. "But something just wasn't right. And I wanted to pay attention to that because I was really just beginning to trust the process."

He abruptly left the scene one night after seeing his face on a poster made it all too real. "I called my buddy in Tupper and said 'I gotta get out of here.' I knew I had something here, but I had to learn what the hell I was doing.'

After three years, Nighswonger moved back to North Carolina to pursue his craft and met with some commercial success. Then, after two large commissions were abruptly rescinded, he returned to the Adirondacks determined to do things his way. He got a job, built a studio and began to create.

And that's where Skripak found him. Wanting to help him

promote his work, she invited him to come down to the Capital District, where she has helped him find spaces to show his art. She said that when she saw the For Rent sign on the old TD Bank, she knew it would be perfect.

The show, which is free and open to the public, will run through Sunday, March 25, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. While Nighswonger will be on hand to talk with visitors every day, a special artist talk is scheduled to take place at at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, March 21. Children's art activities, such as a color scavenger hunt, have been planned as well, according to Skripak.

"My relationship with the piece really begins with stretching the canvas," Nighswonger said of his process. "Because then I've created space and now it's real, now it's in the world. After that, it's really more of a surrender. And a commitment."

The artist generally doesn't know what he's setting out to do when he's setting out to do it. "You just know when it feels right," he said, comparing painting to being in a relationship. "It's really a very passionate relationship. At times it's beautiful and at other times you fight. But that's also where you make it real."



# David Byrne coming to The Palace

Legendary frontman for Talking Heads will be in Albany this September

**ALBANY** — David Byrne, founder and principal songwriter for Talking Heads, recently announced an expansive tour in support of his first solo album in 14 years.

Byrne latest release "American Utopia" is a follow up to his 2004 release "Grown Backwards." It's his first release in more than a decade, inspired by the current political climate in Washington.


"These songs don't describe this imaginary and possibly impossible place, but rather they attempt to describe the world we live in now," stated Byrne, "and that world, when we look at it, as we live in it, as it impacts on us—immediately commands us to ask ourselves- is there another way? A better way? A different way?"

The David Byrne: American Utopia Tour is scheduled to kickoff with a night at the San Diego Civic Center on Thursday, April 12. The tour stops in Albany at The Palace Theatre on Sunday, Sept. 9.

Byrne is best known as the frontman for Talking Heads. The new wave band was thrust into popularity as part of New York City's CBGB music scene in the 70s. The band earned additional commercial success with the emergence of cable television and the growing popularity of music videos on MTV.

The band released eight studio albums before Byrne decided he wanted to branch off and go solo in 1988. News of the split, however, was not announced until 1991.



The single "Sax and Violins" was the band's final track, released that year.

Talking Heads was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2002. The band famously reunited to play four tracks on stage, including "Psycho Killer" and "Burning Down the House."

Byrne said "American Utopia" is a group of songs meant to answer whether the principles defined as The American Way of Life are still plausible.

"The title is not so much about a utopia, as it is about our longing, frustration, aspirations, fears, hopes regarding what could be, what is possible," stated Byrne. "How and what could we be. Surely, we ask ourselves, it doesn't have to be like this. There is a longing for possibility — and I have a feeling that is what these songs touch on."

### Food & Vino

For sprinkling over the chicken:

teaspoon dried mint flakes Salt as needed Freshly ground black pepper A little homemade garam masala A little ground roasted cumin seed A little cayenne pepper Generous squeezes of fresh lemon juice

### **Instructions:**

Preheat the oven to its highest temperature and arrange a shelf in the top third of the oven.

Cut 3 diagonal slits across the top of each piece of chicken breast, being careful not to cut all the way through and also not to go to the edge. Prick the chicken pieces with the sharp point of a small knife. Put them in a single layer in a large baking dish and rub both sides with the salt and lemon juice. Leave for 5 minutes.

Meanwhile, combine the cream with the garam masala, cayenne, cumin seeds, paprika, garlic, and ginger in a bowl. Stir this mixture well and pour it over the chicken. Rub it into the meat and leave for 10 minutes.

Lift the chicken pieces up (most of the marinade will cling to them) and place them down in a single layer in a shallow baking pan lined with aluminum foil. On top of each, sprinkle a little salt, black pepper, garam masala, ground roasted cumin seed, cayenne, dried mint, and lemon juice. Put into the top third of the oven and bake for 15 minutes, or until the chicken is just white all the way through. Serve immediately, minted side up.

### Garam Masala

### **Ingredients: Serves four**

- tablespoon cardamom seeds
- 2-inch cinnamon stick
- of one nutmeg clove
- teaspoon black peppercorns
- teaspoon black cumin seeds
- teaspoon whole cloves

### **Instructions:**

Place ingredients into a clean coffee or spice grinder and ground to a powder.

To make ground roasted cumin seeds:

Put 4 to 5 tablespoons of the whole seeds into a small cast-iron frying pan and set over medium heat. Stir the seeds and roast them over dry heat until they turn a few shades darker and emit a

wonderful roasted aroma. Wait for them to cool slightly and then grind them in a clean coffee or spice grinder. Store in a tightly closed jar.

right away] but that's not really who I am. ... I'm not really the type to go and grab a major label deal. I don't know. I'm just not green anymore with the industry stuff.

In 2012, she had auditioned for Season 2 of "The Voice." The production had taken on 120 musicians. She was sequestered into a California hotel for a month and a half before the show aired. However, teams were filled before all of the musicians auditioned, and she never appeared on television. Shortly afterwards, she was approached by Nigel Lythgoe Productions for a television project. She signed a contract without knowing the premise of the show. It would lead to her appearance on "Opening Act" in which she appeared on its first show, in which she was the opening act for Rod Stewart in front of a Caesars Palace crowd in Las Vegas.

"That whole attitude to make it nowadays, it's just so not what people think it is," she said. She has nothing ill to say about the television or music industry, only that she felt that in her television moment she was not true to herself. The vigorous pace and push to get something on presentable on television pulled her in many directions. "It's so not what it's presented to be. I got to see behind the curtain just enough to where it became unappealing to me. I don't know, man. Anything that's just going to shoot you up there, I don't know. It seems too good to be true."



"The music I love, if someone can just get up there with a guitar or a piano and make me feel something like that, that's very meaningful to me. That's more meaningful to me than seeing a full band that jams out all night. Which I love, but I've come from hearing singers and songwriters, hearing songs. I want to hear the song."



O'Keefe is less concerned about whether she took the wrong step in moving away from New York City. Her self-described itch to move every year-and-a-half has been quelled. The Albany music scene has allowed her room to explore herself, and the community she couldn't find in Gotham. The past few years have confirmed that a music career is not defined by where one lives. Instead of trying to wedge herself into the industry machine, she's trying to "have the plan fit me a little better."
