Public hearing set for riverfront properties seeking conservation tax exemption

BETHLEHEM —The Town's Conservation Easement Review Board (CERB), a five-member volunteer citizen board that reviews landowner applications for the Conservation Easement Exemption (CEE) Program, has recommended the approval of a private landowner's application for the perpetual (forever) protection of two forested parcels that contain approximately 500 feet of frontage along the Hudson River, just north of Henry Hudson Park.

The public is invited to hear more about this open space and its conservation values to the town by attending a public hearing on Wednesday, March 28, at 6 p.m. in the Bethlehem Town Hall auditorium at 445 Delaware Ave. in Delmar.

The two contiguous parcels, totaling approximately 14 acres, are part of the Upper Hudson "Significant Biodiversity Area", according to New York State Department of Environmental Conservation data, and are considered important to protect for the health of the Hudson River Estuary ecosystem. The lands are connected to a large

deemed an important wildlife habitat and provides water quality protection. The riverfront lands also provide flood protection and natural scenic views for boaters enjoying the Hudson River. According to Bethlehem Open Space Coordinator Karen Shaw, the town's 25-point conservation value assessment rated the land "significant" - the highest rating possible.

The Town of Bethlehem's Conservation Easement Exemption (CEE) Program is one of only four such programs in New York. Since it was implemented in 2014, interested private landowners can apply to reduce property taxes by conserving forest patch of 640 acres that has been five or more acres of contiguous open

If approved, in exchange for foregoing development on the land for a minimum of 15 years and up to perpetuity, the landowner saves on their local, county and BCSD school tax dollars - from 50 percent up to 90 percent. (Other school districts in town have not yet joined the

According to Shaw, the program is growing each year as community members become more aware of this "unique win-win conservation and tax savings opportunity." Landowner applications for the CEE program are accepted anytime throughout the year.

In February, the CERB welcomed their newest member, Francis Sheehan. Sheehan helped to develop New York State's first Open Space Conservation Plan in 1992 and has helped to conserve more than one million acres of land during his tenure at the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. The board meets about four times a year and meetings are open to the public.



Schaffer, who recently earned his Eagle designation, was hosted by the space shuttle pilot who flew in both the Orbiter Columbia and Challenger Space shuttles. Captain McBride, during his time aboard the Columbia Space Shuttle, deployed the Earth Radiation Budget Satellite, conducted scientific experiments with the OSTA-3 pallet and large format camera and demonstrated refueling protocols for future missions.

Drug charges



endeavors. He established the Pine Hollow Arboretum in 2007 so he could preserve his collection and share it with the public, and he was the Pine Hollow Arboretum Founder and Board President from 2007 to 2018.

Upon retiring from Schoolhouse Road, he continued to serve at the Parson's Child and Family Center (now Northern Rivers Family Services) well into his 80ss. Abbuhl was also a founding member and advisory board member of the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy and a Trustee Emeritus of Historic Cherry Hill in Albany.

Lenhardt was a member of the Board of Education for the Bethlehem Central School District from 1998 to 2018, and a Capital Region BOCES Board of Education Member from 1997 to the present. She was

The town's Management Information Systems Department has received a Silver Award for its achievements in the State Electronics Challenge, a nationwide environmental sustainability initiative administered by the Northeast Recycling Council.

"The Town of Bethlehem is truly an outstanding example of a commitment to environmental leadership," said State Electronics Challenge Program Manager Lynn Rubinstein, who noted that Bethlehem is one of only 16 award recipients. "This is the first time that the town has earned recognition from the program and that is a major accomplishment."

Bethlehem received the Silver Award for its accomplishments in green purchasing and responsible recycling of electronic office equipment in 2017. As a result of its environmental initiatives, the town avoided greenhouse gas emissions equivalent to removing 821 cars from the road last year and reduced generation of solid and hazardous waste.

"Susan Alexander, Information Services Specialist for the town, handles the recycling of our old equipment and this recognition demonstrates the extra effort she puts in to ensure it is done in an environmentally friendly manner," said Bethlehem MIS Director Jeff Dammeyer.

Positive peer pressure

Youth Court director gives annual update on 22-year-old youth criminal justice diversion program

BETHLEHEM — Youth Court Director Katrina Charland gave her annual update to the Town Board during its bi-monthly meeting on Wednesday, March 14, highlighting aspects of the program, which, in 2017, saw a 97 percent success rate.

Established in 1996, BYC is an alternative to criminal and family court for young offenders between the ages of 10 and 19 who have committed a first-time, low-level offense or crime in the Town of Bethlehem. The voluntary program can divert the youth's case out of the traditional system.

Youth court hearings are held with a peer jury, composed of student volunteers in grades eight through 12, which decides on appropriate and constructive sentences for the offense committed. Those sentences may include the completion of community service hours, participation in educational classes, paying restitution or serving as a juror on other youth court hearings.

"The idea is based on the concept of positive peer pressure," explained Charland. "Kids actually give more weight to what their peers think about something than they do about what an adult says or imposes on them.

'The other tenet or concept that this program is based on is that we all make bad decisions or bad choices at some point in our lives, especially young people, that's part of growing up. And one bad decision

shouldn't define someone for the rest of their lives.'

Trained student youth court members perform the roles of prosecutor or community advocate, defense attorney or defense advocate, judge, clerk, jury foreperson and victim advocate. Charland and an attorney mentor oversee the proceedings.

According to Charland, BYC handled 31 cases and heard a total of 40 charges in 2017, up from 21 cases and 34 charges the previous year. While charges varied, the most common was unlawful possession of marijuana, which represented 27.5 percent of offenses heard, followed by petit larceny (15 percent) and criminal trespass in the third degree (15 percent). Traffic cases dropped considerably, comprising 32 percent of offenses in 2016 and only 5 percent in 2017.

Only one case was returned to criminal court due to non-compliance.

Three cases were referred directly to BYC from the Bethlehem Police Department through a Direct Referral Diversion program that allows juveniles under the age of 15 to be referred directly to youth court without an actual arrest or the filing of any charges. "This diversion process has been a wonderful resource and has been well supported by victims, families of offenders and the police department," Charland said in her report. At the request of the town judges, Charland also said that BYC is looking into implementing a traffic referral pilot program that "would address the issue of distracted driving and other offenses

that could lead to crashes involving young

"Alternatives like this are beneficial to the all parties involved, the defendant, their parents, the courts and the victims, as we typically reach rapid conclusions and the cases don't languish in the court systems," said Bethlehem Police

Commander Adam Hornick. "With the 'raise the age' [legislation that would raise the age of criminal responsibility in New York state] changes that are coming to the law, we see a potential growth in the use

of the diversion program."
In 2017, BYC oversaw 1,632 hours of community service-682 of which were the result of sentencing, 950 of which were performed by volunteers and mentors. Project sites included the Bethlehem Middle School garden, the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail, the Capital City Rescue Mission, Bethlehem Senior Services and St. Thomas School.

Seventeen new volunteers graduated from training last year and were sworn in as official members by Judge Ryan Donovan in May. At the same time, BYC held its fifth Judge Jordan Scholarship Competition, in which it awarded first and second place prizes to members who delivered oral arguments to a panel of judges. The scholarships, which are funded by the Bethlehem Police Supervisors' Association and the Police Benevolent Association, were awarded to BYC members Grace Cavanagh and Hannah Merges. A BYC-sponsored Judge Wenger Scholarship was also awarded to BYC member Louise Xie.

In the fall, an annual skills assessment day provided an opportunity for members to focus on professional development, attending workshops, listening to guest speakers and receiving additional training outside of the courtroom setting.

Charland pointed out that there were several changes to the Board of Directors and spoke about grant-raising efforts to subsidize the town's \$35,000 annual contribution and donations received from the community. She also noted that she serves as secretary of the Association of New York State Youth Courts.

Town Board member Jim Foster said that he participated as a volunteer in the program when he attended Bethlehem Central High School, before going on to become a lawyer. "It's a phenomenal program," he said to Charland. "Thanks

Student voices on gun control rallies

ALBANY —The Capital District has students from all walks of life, but on Saturday, March 24, they became a united force to protest a common issue at March for Our Lives, a national student-led rally and march to bring awareness to the issue of gun violence in schools.

Whether it was sharing their voices by speaking in front of the crowd, holding up signs or even just being present in West Capitol Park, students showed their adamancy and proved that America's youth are not too young to bring about change.

"I am proud of us young people," said Kaelyn DiCocco, a junior at Schalmont High School. "We are the future and you are going to listen to our voices." DiCocco helped to organize the march and was one of seven student speakers at the protest. Alongside her were Hamza Noor, a sophomore at Schalmont; Sydney Lemire, a junior at Columbia High School; Asma Bawla, a senior at Shaker High School; Shamyla Bhatti, a freshman at Albany High School; Lydia Martell, a senior at Bethlehem Central High School, and Adeline Weatherwax, a freshman at Tech Valley High School.

Students in Albany and across the nation are saying enough is enough, and they will not back down until action is taken. "Stand with me as we stop asking, 'What will change? When will it change?' And start saying, 'Now. Now it will change," said Lemire in her speech.

Students in the crowd had equally strong opinions on the issue. Izzy Rutkey, a senior at Ballston Spa High School who helped to organize her school's involvement in a national walkout on March 14, stated "We will be voting, we will let our voices be heard, and we will continue to fight for what we believe in."

Multiple students mentioned that, for them, this is not a political issue, but rather a life or death issue. Bethlehem senior Greg Jusino said, "This is a matter of our lives, it's not a policy debate. There's a problem that needs to be fixed."

Bawla of Shaker High made a similar point in her speech,

stating, "This isn't about what your political views are. This is about human lives."

Although all the student speakers were from local high schools, the march was made up of students of all ages. There were children in elementary school and middle school and college students.

Marley Amico, a junior at Skidmore College, said, "It's really important that I use the privilege and the voice I have to speak up for what I believe is important on behalf of those who don't have the resources to do so or are not here anymore to speak."

Jackie Gold, a senior at Bethlehem, was passing out flyers during the march for the next step in the movement. On April 20, the 19th anniversary of the Columbine shooting, students across the region will leave school after homeroom and head to West Capitol Park, where there will be speakers and protests. Gold said, "(Students) are coming together to take a stand and show everyone that this is serious and we're not going anywhere until there's a change."

These are the voices of the students. They are questioning the current system of gun control, they are stating the changes they wish to see and, though many are still too young to vote, they are demonstrating leadership in this movement.

violence tends to occur in places with greater regulation, spoke of the impact that school shootings have had on contemporary students, challenged the idea that the Second Amendment is carte blanche to carry any type of firearm, and encouraged each other to make it to the polls in November and keep up the current momentum.

"You have re-inspired me, you have re-inspired every parent, you have re-inspired your teachers and administrators and every elected that is here," said Assemblymember Pat Fahy (D-109) to the students who organized and participated in the event. She acknowledged that

past efforts to increase gun control regulations have been consistently met with opposition and failure, but she also pointed out that New York state is the third safest (in terms of gun violence) state in the nation, and carries some of the most stringent regulation. "We still have so much more to do," she said, encouraging those present to keep fighting. "Let me remind everyone that it was America's youth that led the fight for civil rights," said Bethlehem senior Lydia Martell. "It was America's youth that protested for peace in Vietnam. And it's America's youth that is fighting for gun control."

BCSD reviews, updates school safety measures

BETHLEHEM—

Bethlehem Central School District administrators met with members of the town's police department on Thursday, March 15, to talk about school safety.

Following events such as the Parkland, Fla. shooting last month and the arrest of a BCSD volunteer for alleged sexual assault earlier this month, the conversation about district safety could not have come at a more opportune time. The national student walkout demanding safety in schools happened just one day earlier.

Representatives from the Bethlehem Police Department, including resource officers assigned to the schools, met with BCSD Superintendent Jody Monroe, all district principals, department administrators and the district counseling supervisor to discuss building security, staff training, communications, vetting procedures for school volunteers, and providing a tool for students and the community to report suspicious behavior that could threaten school safety.

Both district-wide and building-specific safety plans, developed in conjunction with

"Since the tragic events at Marjory Stoneman Douglas" High School last month, I have fielded many different questions regarding safety and security in the Bethlehem Central School District. I want to assure you that these issues are always at the forefront of the decisions we make here in Bethlehem."

BCSD Superintendent Jodi Monroe

BPD and other local law enforcement agencies, currently exist and are reviewed and updated annually. District staff is trained in emergency response, and a variety of emergency drills are practiced throughout the year. Evacuation and lockdown drills are required by New York state law; evacuation drills, which used to be known as fire drills, are required eight times a year, while lockdown drills, which review the procedure used when there may be an imminent threat inside the building, are required four times a year. The district also practices lockout drills (bringing students inside, securing perimeter), bus evacuation drills (three times a year), shelterin-place (tornado) drills, and hold-in-place drills (lockdown lite).

Also now available to students, as well as the rest of the community, is the rededicated town underaged drinking tipline. Now called the Confidential Tip Line (518-439-1503), it utilizes either voice mail or e-mail and may be used to report any type of tip, including threats of school violence.

"A student's right to feel safe at school is paramount," said Monroe in a safety newsletter sent out to district parents on Tuesday, March 20. "While we always encourage students who have safety concerns or are worried about themselves or someone they know to talk directly with an administrator or counselor, we understand that sometimes these concerns may take place outside the school day or when time is of the essence. This confidential tip line provides an additional and welcome resource for students and families alike."

New district safety initiatives include:

The addition of extra security cameras to school buildings, a component of the \$32 million bond project approved by district voters in 2016; plans are currently under review by the state Department of Education and the cameras will be installed once approval is received;

The addition of regularly scheduled "tabletop" exercises that include key district personnel and first responders, including police and fire, who take part in simulated crisis scenarios;

The expansion of the district's mass notification system, which alerts parents in the case of an emergency or a school closing, to include text messages, beginning Tuesday, April 3.

"The [new] system also provides us with the capability to send

automated voice calls to parents as well," said Monroe. "You will be hearing more about School Messenger, and the new text and voice features, in the coming weeks. Before then, be sure review your contact information in Aspen and if you need to update your information, please contact our District Registrar Melissa Haas at mhaas@bethlehemschools. org or at 518-439-2442."

BCSD is also exploring a new visitor access system that would allow employees to ID visitors and check them against the state sex offender database in real time.

"My administrative team is gathering information to determine the logistics of installing such a system districtwide," said Monroe. "A scan entry would also provide the district with a ready resource to check school volunteers against the sex offender registry." Currently, the district requires that volunteers who will be working regularly with students or without staff supervision, get fingerprinted. This includes all coaches, who are also subject to board approval.

"Since the tragic events at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School last month, I have fielded many different questions regarding safety and security in the Bethlehem Central School District," wrote Monroe in the March 20 newsletter. "I want to assure you that these issues are always at the forefront of the decisions we make here in Bethlehem. We continuously seek out ways to better safeguard the health and well-being of our students and staff, learning from our own experiences and from those of others, while honing our practices and reviewing areas for improvement.'

LUMBERYARD announces inaugural summer season schedule

Construction on NYC-based contemporary performing arts venue's new facility in Catskill continues

NEW YORK— LUMBERYARD

Contemporary Performing Arts is pleased to announce programming for its inaugural summer 2018 season, which will fill venues surrounding the organization's highly anticipated new facility in the village of Catskill, set to open its own doors in Fall 2018. The season, which runs from June 28 – Sept. 1, represents the fullest realization to date of LUMBERYARD's unique dual promise: to make transformative contributions both to the cultural landscape and economic health of Upstate New York and to the field of contemporary performance in New York City and the U.S. by bringing renowned and emerging artists across the performing arts landscape to Catskill for out-of-town premieres, usually incubated through LUMBERYARD's signature technical residencies.

Adrienne Willis, Executive and Artistic Director of LUMBERYARD Contemporary Performing Arts, said, "We are thrilled to begin presenting performances in Catskill and Hudson as we enter the final stages of construction on our new home. We didn't want to wait for the new facility to be finished before starting to welcome various Hudson Valley communities to our work. The summer season—spanning a diversity of artists and a wide range of artistic practices offers a sneak peek at a number of new productions, before their New York or national premieres, as well as the chance to experience, close to home, performances that have won considerable acclaim in other cities.'

The season will open with Scat!, a premiere from the vital company Urban Bush Women, which has "interpreted the black experience with passion and focus for thirty years" (The Village Voice). Created by Urban Bush Women's founder and choreographer, Jawole Willa Jo Zollar, with dramaturg Talvin Wilks and composer, bandleader and musician Craig Harris and set in a fictional jazz club with a five-piece band and two vocalists, Scat! tells the story of the Zollar family during the Great Migration. LUMBERYARD presents the work from June 28-July 1 at Club Helsinki in Hudson.

LUMBERYARD will also provide residency support and a premiere to d. Sabela Grimes, a Los Angeles-based interdisciplinary artist that The Los Angeles Times calls "one of a mere handful of artists who make up the vanguard of hip-hop fusion." Performances will take place from July 27-29 at Bridge Street Theatre in Catskill.

A third premiere, supported with a LUMBERYARD residency, is Freedom (working title), from veteran New York choreographer John Jasperse, from August 17-19 at Hudson Hall at the historic Hudson Opera House.

MacArthur "Genius" Award-winner

Elizabeth Streb and her company STREB Extreme Action—whose internationally acclaimed productions combine dance, athletics, and death-defying stunt work, and are feats of pure daring and strict precision—will present a site-specific iteration of their work SEA (Signature Extreme Actions) from July 6-8 at LUMBERYARD'S underconstruction site in Catskill. The following week, Bridgman | Packer Dance, led by Guggenheim Fellows Art Bridgman and Myrna Packer, will perform Truck inside a 17-foot U-Haul truck, July 13-14.

Choreographer, dancer and frequent LUMBERYARD collaborator Jodi Melnick brings her "laudable power to take ordinary gestures and give them opulence," (New York Times) to two distinct but equally acclaimed works at Hudson Hall from August 3-5: her lauded 2012 solo One of Sixty-Five Thousand Gestures, choreographed with the legendary Trisha Brown; and NEW BODIES, which Melnick created with Sara Mearns and her fellow acclaimed New York City Ballet (NYCB) dancers Jared Angle and Gretchen Smith.

The summer season continues with Ishmael Houston-Jones' Variations on Themes from Lost and Found: Scenes from a Life and Other Works by John Bernd, from August 24-26 at Hudson Hall. Conceived by for Danspace Project's series Platform 2016: Lost and Found, Variations is an examination of the impact AIDS has had on artists of multiple generations—including Bernd, who died in 1988. Lost in time

Local author helps shine light on a once prominent woman who shaped modern nursing

nside the office of Roger Noyes' Slingerlands home stands a broad, wooden desk, something that's been in the family. But, the desk has a history with a significance that stretches well beyond that of the Noyes family.

The desk was once his second great aunt's, Clara Noyes. The name once held more significance than simply as Roger Noyes' distant relative. At a time when women could not vote, Clara Noyes played a leading role in directing aid during some of history's most noted events, and set the foundation for standards in nursing

"I had heard some family stories about her life," said Roger Noyes. "But, I think the biggest entry into learning about her was from inheriting her desk. It's funny how when you receive an artifact like that, that was

once owned by somebody in the past, it really becomes a physical symbol for you. In a sense that it's a reminder of that person... it prompts a lot of

The author initially knew of her as a "famous nurse" who worked with the Red Cross. The depth of her story lacked details of her role as director of the American Red Cross Nursing Service. What was shared glossed over her responsibility to orchestrate the emergency medical response for World War I, the Spanish flu pandemic and the 1927 flooding of Mississippi.

Through the help of family, the internet, and investigative skills he learned as a newspaper reporter, Roger started to learn more details. In one newspaper archive, he said, he received more than 6,000 hits by searching her name, alone.

Clara was born in 1869 to New England family, her father a Civil War veteran. She established a strong work ethic at the Maryland farm in which she grew up. When she decided to attend Johns Hopkins School of Nursing at 27, despite standards established by Florence Nightingale in England, nursing was a disorganized

"Especially in that time, nursing was a new profession," said Roger. "My aunt was a beneficiary to this system that was created by Florence Nightingale."

Schools started developing graduate courses based on Nightingale's curriculum at her nursing school at St. Thomas' Hospital in London.

Roger spent two years researching and writing his book, "Clara D. Noyes, R.N., Life of a Global Nursing Leader." In it, he details how nursing evolved from a trade to a well-structured profession. One that provided women the opportunity to rise to the ranks of influential executives before women's suffrage. It was from Clara's position with the Red Cross where she was able to fight for equal pay for

"My aim in this book is to show how the women-led American Red Cross Nursing Service enrolled, deployed and demobilized wartime nurses in a structure that paralleled and was virtually indistinct from –

much fun he had with the language of music itself," said Rockower. "He would just drive the musicians around him in the band, and he really sets the bar very high."

Nash shared his idea for "Baby" with Rockower a few times. Eventually, the two would work on it together. Nash would go to Rockower's place and lay down tracks of him playing drums. Rockower would sit down with his guitar, and as Nash would hum out a harmony that was stuck in his head, he'd start strumming a few chords. "During the writing process, it was very clear that he has a strong gift as a lyricist, and he really has a strong vision of how a song should evolve," he said.

Once "Baby" was completed, a CD-release party was thrown.

"The CD release party for his album was sold out," said Rockower, "which was a wonderful testament to how many people in the community he had strong relationships with, how many musicians truly supported him."

In an interview with The Spot 518's Ali Hibbs, Sly Fox described Nash as a "pro drummer."

"He's a sweet guy and a great drummer," said Fox. "He's someone you could call and, if he didn't already have a gig that night, he could just show up and not even know what songs were going to be played and just hit it off. His musical vocabulary is fantastic; he can play anything. He's just a force to be reckoned with.'

"Grace Abandoned," as a

phrase by itself, is a cruel way to describe a stroke victim. It's an attack on the brain, described by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a blockage cuts off blood flow to the head. Every 40 seconds, someone in the U.S. has a stroke. Every four minutes, someone dies. Each year nearly 140,000 people die from stroke. One day last March, Nash woke for work and knew something was wrong.

"I was late for work, so they sent a co-worker to check on me at my house, but I do not remember this," stated Nash through email. It's still difficult for him to speak. "When I woke up for work, I could just tell that something was wrong."

While getting ready, Nash recalled blacking out several times. Curiously, he could not move his right arm. He later found he was not able to speak. He remembers getting into his car to drive to work and hitting a parked car. Once he ultimately arrived to work, his co-workers assumed he had "fallen off the wagon," though Nash has been sober for 20 years. They sat him in the backroom where he proceeded to blackout again. "At this point I knew that I was having a stroke, but I did not want to admit it because I thought I was too young," said

Hospital in Schenectady. While there, he worked with Jonathan Brendese, a speech and language pathologist. With additional help from long-time friend Pat Battuello, Nash's speech slowly returned. "It's a very frustrating process, but I could not be here at all, so I am lucky for that," stated

More than a year after his stroke, the drummer has control over his right arm again. Though he's not able to sing "yet," he's able to get behind the drum kit again. His ability to play has been pushed back to a beginner's level, he said. To reach this point in his development, it required "lots of patience and persistence" with hours of practice in the studio. Prophetically, the name of the last track from "Baby" describes Nash and the scene that will take place at The Hollow this Saturday: "My Resurrection."

Last month he announced his intent to perform at The Hollow Bar + Kitchen, on Saturday, March 31, at 8 p.m.. He expressed his gratitude for Fox organizing the "Love for Nash" fundraiser last March. Now, he wants to pay it forward and help raise funds for Sunnyview. The night is billed as "One Stroke Roll - Benefit for Sunnyview Stroke Victims." Toys in the Attic, Blase Debris, Stripped, Walpurgis and Maryanne are to perform. Proceeds from ticket sales and raffle go to Sunnyview Stroke Victims. Those who can't make the show can send donations to www.givetosunnyview.org

"[What's] most important to me is my drumming," stated Nash. "I have no kids, no wife, no girlfriend. Playing drums is where I spiritually connect with an audience."

"Everyone is Polish on Dyngus Day."

TROY—A Polish beer garden and restaurant in Troy is boasting the best Dyngus Day around. The Hill at Muza Beer Garden and Muza Restaurant will be celebrating the Polish-American holiday all day long this Easter Monday, April 2, with live Polka music, never-ending kielbasa and Polish beer.

The celebration at The Hill at Muza and Muza, begins at noon with DJ Podeswa "spinning" Polka hits from noon to 5 p.m. Live music will be provided in the indoor/outdoor beer garden by Eddie Forman Orchestra from Hadley, Mass. from 5 until 9 p.m.

There will be a \$3 admission fee from noon to 8 p.m. and a commemorative cup will be provided. Muza is also dropping the price of beers by \$1.

I never expected this to happen when we considered hosting Dyngus Day 2016. It's pretty wild."

A first generation Polish-American, Adam Siemiginowski opened a beer garden, The Hill at Muza, in late 2015, adjacent to its parent restaurant Muza. Siemiginowski's parents Jan and Alicja Siemiginowski immigrated together from their native Poland to the United States nearly 40 years ago. he return of warm weather is synonymous with many things. For men and women who love to grill, spring marks a return to grilling their favorite foods and dining outdoors.

Burgers and hot dogs may never go out of style, but plenty of additional foods can make for delicious grilled meals. Grilled chicken, for example, makes for a healthy meal the whole family can enjoy. Grilled chicken sandwiches, such as the following recipe for "Grilled Chicken Ciabatta with Romesco and Baby Greens" from Karen Adler and Judith Fertig's "The Gardener & The Grill: The Bounty of the Garden Meets the Sizzle of the Grill" (Running Press), can make for a nice change of pace from more traditional grilling fare.

Ingredients: Serves four

- loaves ciabatta or 4 ciabattini (ciabatta rolls), sliced in half lengthwise
- Olive oil (for brushing)
- Fine kosher or sea salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- boneless, skinless chicken breasts, pounded to a 1/2-inch thickness
- recipe Romesco Sauce (see below) 1/2
- Small wedge (about 4 ounces) of Manchego or Parmesan cheese, for shaving
- cups baby greens

Prepare a hot fire in your grill.

Brush the cut sides of the ciabatta with olive oil. Brush the chicken breasts with olive oil on both sides and season with salt and pepper.

Grill the chicken, turning once, for 5 minutes total. Grill the ciabatta, cut sides down, until it has good grill marks, 1 to 2 minutes.

Slather all the grilled sides of the ciabatta with the Romesco. Place the chicken breasts on the bottom half of the bread, shave some Manchego cheese over the chicken, then top with baby greens and the top half of the bread. If you're using a loaf of ciabatta, you'll have 2 chicken breasts on each loaf, so cut each loaf in half horizontally. If you're using ciabattini, you'll use 1 breast for each roll. Serve immediately.

Romesco Sauce

Ingredients: Makes 2 cups

- cup toasted slivered almonds
- jarred roasted red bell peppers, roughly chopped
- garlic cloves, minced
- slice white bread (crust removed), toasted and crumbled
- tablespoon roughly chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1/3 cup red wine vinegar
- 2/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil

In a food processor, grind the almonds. Add roasted peppers, garlic, bread, parsley, and hot pepper flakes. Blend until it becomes a paste. Add the vinegar and pulse to blend. With the motor running, gradually pour the olive oil through the feed tube in a steady stream until the mixture thickens like mayonnaise. Sea to taste with salt and black pepper.

Store in a covered container in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.



Spring cleaning can alleviate allergies

Invest in a HEPA filter

Vacuums with HEPA filters can trap allergens that are so small that they pass through regular vacuum filters. That means instead of containing them, these small particles are only being shot back into the air where they are easily breathed in. WebMD suggests vacuuming

once or twice a week to keep carpets and floors as clean as possible. Plus, don't forget to vacuum upholstered furniture and drapes as well.



So glad we made it

Mike Gordon Band At The Egg

ALBANY — The Capital City gave Mike Gordon Band a warm welcome for their fourth performance at The Egg this past Sunday. With its odd shape designed specifically to create incredible acoustics, it is no wonder that a musical genius and eccentric like Gordon has openly expressed his affinity for this venue. The band even featured its first show here in 2011 as a specially released live recording. Since its last visit in 2016, the band has released its fifth studio album, "OGOGO." This album was created with the current touring members, featuring Scott Murawski on guitar, John Kimmock on drums, Robert Walter on keys, and Craig Myers on percussion.

The band opened the show last Sunday with a clean start, playing "OGOGO's" ninth track, "Stealing Jamaica," showing us that the band has had plenty of time over this past tour to get properly dialed in. With his self-dubbed "psychotropically transform(ative)" sounds reverberating throughout the room, we are instantly reminded of just how incredible the

acoustics in this room truly are. This song featured a tight jam that included "Waking Up Dead" teases before coming to a slow and steady halt, leading us into the haunting intro to this familiar tune. Written by Gordon and Murawski, this was the only Gordon original to land a spot on Phish's latest studio album, Big Boat, released in 2016. This featured a dark and funky jam that led the band into the Leo Kottke original "Noon to Noon," which Mike Gordon Band debuted at the tour opener in Seattle. Kottke has collaborated with Gordon in the past on the two studio albums Clone and Sixty-Six Steps, and Gordon has recently revealed that a third album is in the works. This tune kicked into high gear and could be considered the heavy hitter of the first set, causing the room to heat up and make Gordon shed his scarf.

After a brief acknowledgment of the crowd, the band played the Max Creek original "Cruel World," which has been a part of the band's repertoire since 2003. This included "Steps," teases coming from Gordon before a seamless transition into this tune, which was the first single released off "OGOGO." A definite crowd pleaser, it is no wonder why the band repeated this song for the third time in the past three consecutive shows this weekend.

The song featured a heavy organ jam from Walter, during which Murawski switched guitars to match Gordon's luminescent Moire bass.

Gordon gave a shout out to local friends and family, expressing gratitude for being so close to home this past run. The band then closed the set with a cover of Tower of Power's "You Strike My Main Nerve" off the album Bump City, a track which has stayed in rotation since the band started touring in January.

Set two Gordon came out scarf-less with guns blazing, opening with the West African influenced song "Angatta," featuring Myers on the Ngoni. With its upbeat, exotic tempo, the crowd is given a natural boost of energy and reminds us that Gordon has a world of influences

outside of the jam world. Next, the band played OGOGO's seventh track, "Up and Down," which featured an upbeat jam that kept the energy in the room lively. The band stopped before playing "Pendulum," also off OGOGO. Consistent with the theme of the album, these two tracks are a reflection of of the ebb and flow of life, our ability to see the light and do our best while also inevitably having darker moments, and tonight's jam within this song was a perfect interpretation of that concept. With a catchy, bouncy swing, the band brings us to a point where it feels like The Egg itself is a spaceship getting ready for take off, before landing gracefully back into familiar, lighthearted territory. Gordon's words couldn't seem more authentic while singing the lyrics,

"thankful that I have reentered this room with all this vibrating gear."

"Peel" came next, the Overstep original that has been in rotation since its release in 2014. This led into a jam layered with ominous sound effects, leading us from another dark and haunting jam into an irresistibly danceable beat. This was followed by a cover of Tame Impala's "Mind Mischief," a song which has been a reoccurring favorite for MGB since the debut of its own version in 2017. This transitioned back into the familiar territory of "Crazy Sometimes," which is one of two OGOGO tunes that Phish has borrowed in 2017, (the other being "Marissa," played once in Pittsburgh this past summer). This heavy jam featured teases from The Guess Who's original

"American Woman," before transitioning into another Overstep original, "Say Something" to close the second set.

The band came back for an encore, playing Spencer Davis Group's "Gimme Some Lovin'," which left everyone in the crowd singing along with a final burst of energy, reminding us that we are "so glad we made it." From the quality of this show, it is safe to say that Gordon will be planning another visit here in the near

Albany Hip-Hop outshines headliner Riff Raff at Jupiter Hall

ALBANY — Local hip hop acts found their beat at Jupiter Hall in Albany, on Saturday, March 10, sharing the stage with headliner RiFF RAFF. The evening saw multiple acts from New York's Capital District bring short, yet effective sets to the futuristic venue tucked inside Lucky Strike at Crossgates Mall.

Interestingly, hardcore metal band Misgiver joined the opening acts with a loud, yet memorable performance. Misgiver's sound is not only unexpected at a hip hop show, but memorable and surprising as well. To the band's credit, it is certainly difficult to perform as an "outlier" at a show, and with a quick set, they showcased their abilities well.

Along with them, Philly Fine\$\$e delivered a high strung hip hop set joined by DJ David Acevedo, SwaggyT, and friends. Having streams on songs like "Lonely," "GUCCI," and "Like This," Fine\$\$e and his fellow performers got the eyes of the crowd in a short amount of time. Their show has entertaining potential, and their music lends itself seamlessly to the club scene and they were received well by the crowd, even in the earlier part of the

Along with Philly Fine\$\$e, show attendees dove in for Wavy Cunningham & DJ Mercy, a creative duo who mix wide varieties of samples with old school sounds to create a fun, beach-type atmosphere. Their music is a departure from stereotypical thoughts of hip hop being such a serious matter, and in a lot of ways it has the ability to make the listener smile. the larger War Department effort to supply American troops during the First World War," said Roger. "Oftentimes these structures stood in conflict, but the War Department's need for a mass mobilization of professional nurses, all of them women, also provided leverage for the advancement of women's causes, and many of these causes intersected with the nurse professionalization movements."


Before her death in 1936, Clara would have direct ties to the largest medical institutions known today. There's St. Luke's Hospital in New Bedford,

Mass., and New England Hospital for Women, for which she served as superintendent. She played a pivotal role at Bellevue Hospital's nurse training school in New York City. She would later be named president of the American Nurses Association and subsequently become chair of the Women's Joint Congressional Committee.

Clara also founded the first not-for-profit school for midwives in the United States, published extensively on nursing issues of the day and worked in the post-war period to oversee nursing relief activities in Europe and to develop schools of

"I had heard some family stories about her life, but, I think the biggest entry into learning about her was from inheriting her desk. It's funny how when you receive an artifact like that, that was once owned by somebody in the past, it really becomes a physical symbol for you. In a sense that it's a reminder of that person... it prompts a lot of inquiry."

"Not to diminish icons like Florence Nightingale and Clara Barton, who shares my aunt's name and worked at the Red Cross, she would exhaustively name them in speeches," said Roger. In his book, there is a composite of his aunt standing at the foot of a stairwell with Nightingale and Jane Delano from a Red Cross postcard. In her time, she was held in as high regard. "She was coming from a very similar tradition... If you include Clara Barton, those four figures really loom large in the public imagination."




