Answering the call

Bethlehem's first responders have improved services and bolstered their ranks by working together

Editor's Note: This is the first in a threepart series regarding Delmar-Bethlehem EMS, which is celebrating the fifth anniversary of a merger that joined first responders from the northern and southern parts of Bethlehem.

BETHLEHEM — Delmar-Bethlehem EMS is celebrating the fifth anniversary of the merger that brought together the EMS companies serving the southern and northern portions of town. While the merger wasn't legally official until one year later, it was on Jan. 1, 2013, that Bethlehem

EMS and Delmar EMS combined forces and began working together to dramatically improve emergency medical services townwide.

"Over time the number of EMS calls in the community had begun to increase," explained DBEMS Chief Steve Kroll. "That's common in communities all over, both with the growing of the population and with the aging of the population, and both agencies were struggling to be successful in an environment where there are fewer and fewer people who are interested in volunteering." Kroll credited visionary leadership and a willingness to embrace change with the unusual success of the DBEMS model, which is now more financially secure and boasts a higher number of volunteers than most upstate New York volunteer-based EMS squads, many of which are currently in crisis.

Bad bug found at the Pine Bush

Southern pine beetle destroyed thousands of trees on Long Island

A southern pine beetle, which has killed thousands of pine trees on Long Island since it was discovered in 2014, was trapped in the Pine Bush, the northernmost location the invasive, destructive beetles have ever been found in this country.

According to the state Department of Environmental Conservation, the single beetle was caught in a trap near Rapp Road. It is considered one of the most destructive forest pests in the U.S. and attacks several species of pine tree including pitch pine, a species that flourishes in the Pine Bush and other pine barrens throughout the

Trees infested with the bug, which are only about the size of a grain of rice, only live two to four

'The southern pine beetle poses a significant threat to New York's pine forests," DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said.

"DEC is actively fighting the infestations of this invasive pest and continues searching for signs of the beetle in upstate New York, to help stay ahead of these destructive pests.

SPB, a bark beetle is native to the southern United States, but has steadily expanded its range north and west.

According to the DEC, the adult beetle enters the tree through crevices in the bark and then creates S-shaped tunnels in the cambium tissue, just beneath the bark. It disrupts the flow of nutrients, killing the tree in typically two to four months.

Most trees resist the initial attacks by secreting resin that can "pitch out" some adults and slow the entry of others, but trees almost always die as their defenses are overwhelmed by thousands of attacking beetles.

DEC's Division of Lands and Forests and the Albany Pine Bush Preserve Commission began placing early detection traps in the preserve in 2015. Additional traps set in the Hudson Valley by DEC and partners confirmed the presence of SPB in Minnewaska State Park, Bear Mountain State Park, Schunnemunk State Park, and Roosa Gap State Forest in 2016 and 2017.

Infested trees, though, have not been found north of Long Island. It is likely the beetles are not flourishing upstate and therefore not causing the widespread tree mortality like on Long Island.

The Pine Bush will be added to the locations of continued aerial and ground monitoring to search for infested trees.

"We're pleased to be

partnering with the forest health experts at DEC to monitor invasive forest pests in the Albany Pine Bush Preserve," said Christopher Hawver, APBPC executive director. "It's important in aiding our understanding of the dynamics of the Pine Barrens here in Albany."

In 2017, Gov. Andrew M. Cuomo targeted \$3 million from the Environmental Protection Fund to help manage the spread of SPB. The 2018-19 budget proposes an additional \$250,000 for prescribed burns, which will help increase forest health and resistance to SPB on Long Island.

The Pine Bush already does extensive forest thinning and prescribed burning to restore inland pine barrens and maintain the habitat of the endangered Karner blue butterfly.

"Healthy ecosystems better tolerate potentially invasive species," said APBPC Conservation Director Neil Gifford. "Based on what we know about the management of this insect in its native range to the south, thinning and burning to restore the barrens should also

not decimate pitch pine in the preserve."

DEC is asking the public to report any recently dead or dying pitch pine and red pine they encounter outside of Long Island, especially if there are several trees grouped together and they are dying quickly.

Signs of infestation include:

- · Pitch tubes, or popcornshaped clumps of resin on the exterior of the bark
- Shotgun patterned holes on the exterior of the bark
- S-shaped tunnels under the bark
- Pine trees that have recently died are characterized by reddish-brown needles.

Sightings may be reported to the Forest Health Diagnostic Lab by calling the toll-free information line, 1-866-640-0652 or by email, foresthealth@dec. ny.gov._If possible, accompany any email reports with photos of the trees and close-ups of any damage. Please include something in the photos for scale, such as a penny, to help with identification.

Board approves purchases, master plan application

BETHLEHEM—The Town Board heard comments regarding the possible conveyance of a parcel of land located near the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail and adjacent to the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard American Legion Post # 1040 from the state Department of Transportation to the town.

The 6,000-square-foot parcel of land in question was initially considered for the construction of a picnic pavilion with restrooms for Rail Trail users.

Scott Anson, chairman of the Legion's Board of Directors explained that it had come to the attention of Legion membership that the town was still trying to acquire the parcel. He said that the post has filed to have the property conveyed to it on a long-term lease.

"We would ask the town not to continue with the conveyance of the property at this point, so that my members can maintain it and work on the long-term lease from DOT to get it back."

The board adopted a new local law prohibiting the parking of commercial vehicles (snow plow attachments, trailers, boats, campers, motorhomes, recreational vehicles, storage containers and heavy construction vehicles) on town streets between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. BPD will have the authority to impound

vehicles in violation of the new law.

Board members also approved purchases of a new track loader for the Highway Department and a new Chevrolet Equinox for the Bethlehem Police Department, to replace a 2005 Impala with 77,493 miles. According to Highway Superintendent John "Tiger" Anastasi, who also serves as the town's Fleet Manager, corrosion on the vehicle would have prevented it from passing the annual state safety inspection.

Board members also approved summer Parks and Recreation personnel to oversee summertime pool, camp and summer sports activities. VanLuven also took a moment to recognize Nan Lanahan, the longtime Parks director who will be retiring this year.

As its last order of business, the Town Board voted unanimously to approve an application for a "Master Plan" required to combine three lots along Route 9W and allow for the construction of four new self-storage buildings—ranging from 7,875 square feet to 11,700 square feet—with driveways, sidewalks and a small parking lot. An existing farm stand and gravel driveway will be removed and an existing curb cut near the farm stand will revised to a right in/right out curb cut. An existing residence will remain. The town's planning board has just under two months to review and make its recommendations on the master plan.

'Tis the season

Freeze-thaw cycle takes its toll on area roads

With the end of winter comes many northeastern traditions: the end of cabin fever, the beginning of spring sports, and the start of pothole season.

Residents in Colonie and Bethlehem are noticing the latter in their daily commutes as their teeth rattle and their coffee spills. All the while, municipalities are doing their best to fill them up.

Colonie' spokeswoman Sarah Weist said the town currently has three crews filling potholes on approximately 310 miles of townowned roads. Weist said, "I know that our crews are out filling them," but that the temperature isn't quite right for it yet, as the cold weather can still cause repairs to pop out of place.

This is a common problem for one of the most common methods used to fill potholes, the cold patch.

One alternative to the cold patch is the hot box, a trailer put on the back of a truck that heats the filler before it is placed,

making them longer lasting than the cold patch that is usually used.

One of Colonie's crews is using the \$45,000 machine this year, and Weist said that the hot box is, "a real step forward in being able to patch potholes more effectively."

While many residents of Bethlehem have noticed the potholes on Delaware Avenue, Supervisor David VanLuven notes that road is not city-owned.

"If you hit a pothole you are probably on a state or county road," he said. While he believes town roads are in good repair, he said that Town Highway Superintendent John "Tiger" Anastasi has been talking to state officials about taking better care of potholes on their roads.

Potholes are caused by ice and snow thawing during the warmer days and then the water — that seeped into cracks in the roads surface — freezing at night and expanding with enough force to damage the pavement.

Answering the call

"Like all things in health care, EMS is becoming more of a business," Kroll said. "We were essentially duplicating many things between the two agencies and so the decision was made in 2012 that, if we brought the two agencies together, we could achieve the economies of scale and bring together two middle-sized groups of volunteers to one large group of volunteers—and that has been very successful for us."

As with any merger, there were bumps in the road. Proprietary instincts regarding traditions and history had to be overcome as the two squads worked together to combine two longstanding organizations—both with different histories, traditions and strengths.

"There was a series of negotiations and both squads got together and talked about what it meant and at the end of the day, everyone decided to move forward," said Kroll. "I think we're all extremely pleased with the result, we found that we've been able to respect the history of both organizations and form a new organization."

"I've been in fires with all of these guys,' said DBEMS volunteer Drew Anderson, referring to first responders from both EMS squads as well as local police and firefighters, many of whom also serve as DBEMS volunteers. "Everybody really respects everybody. I trust all those guys."

Anderson said that, while there are friendly rivalries, the overall feeling is generally one of camaraderie.

The DBEMS model, which employs both volunteer and paid staff, has allowed the force to save the Town of Bethlehem, which subsidizes its activities, millions of dollars over the last five years

"As the number of volunteers shrinks and communities all over New York state increasingly turn to fully-paid and expensive EMS services, we are incredibly proud of what we are doing in our town", said Board Member Linda Schacht of Selkirk. "If our [nearly] 70 volunteers weren't here, taxpayers would have to shoulder millions of dollars of extra expense to maintain ambulance service."

According to Kroll, volunteers put in more than 15,000 scheduled hours each year, saving the agency approximately \$900,000 annually when payroll and

benefits are taken into account. Since 2012, DBEMS has managed to improve service while cutting the amount of taxpayer dollars received from the town, which subsidizes its activities, nearly in half—from more than \$800,000 in 2012 to \$430,000 in 2018.

"We have one quality standard for everyone that works here, whether you're paid or a volunteer - they receive the same training, they have the same standards," he said. "They crews work really well sideby-side. You may have one paid person and one volunteer. It allows us to be really effective and efficient for the community."

Prior to the merger, Delmar EMS had a larger and younger volunteer membership but found it could use the physical assets that Bethlehem was able to contribute. Delmar, which began as part of the Delmar Fire District, separated from the fire company in 2010 to incorporate as a nonprofit and would soon be looking for new accommodations as Delmar Fire expanded and needed the space occupied by the EMS apparatus and personnel.

"We realized that from an economic standpoint, it made a lot of sense, and from a membership standpoint, it made a lot of sense," said Kroll. "Each EMS squad sort of has its strengths and we were very successful at bringing those together."

The merger allowed the companies to consolidate equipment and lodging, as well as bring down group bargaining costs. DBEMS sold an ambulance that cost thousands annually to insure and maintain, was able to downsize other necessary but occasionally used equipment that became redundant after the merger, and offloaded two properties. The company was also able to save on group insurance and bulk purchasing.

Currently, DBEMS operates out of two locations: the south station on Route 9W in Selkirk near A.W. Becker Elementary School, which is owned by the company, and the north station in Delmar, which is renting space for its ambulances in Delmar Fire Station on Delaware Avenue and a residential property for personnel behind the fire station. (Following a \$4 million renovation of a town-owned property on Adams Street this year, DBEMS will relocate its north station to that building, which will be designed for its specific purposes. More about the history of the companies and the move to Adams Street in upcoming issues.)

to other communities that are kind of struggling with what they're going to do," Kroll said. While the model won't work for all agencies, such as the recently defunct Voorheesville Area Ambulance Service, which has been absorbed by DBEMS and the Sheriff's Office, it may serve to improve service elsewhere in the state and, said Kroll, and help to recruit more, and younger, volunteers. Something similar has been proposed for local fire districts, five of which serve Bethlehem, but leadership has proved resistant and voters have supported them.

"It's not a commitment made lightly," said the EMS Chief of his volunteers. "If we don't show up, no one shows up." But, he continued, offering the level of training DBEMS is able to offer, as well as the experience to be gained by the number of calls (approximately 13 a day) and an already robust volunteer group, makes it easier to attract more volunteers.

"We get people from all over," he said, characterizing the current volunteer force as "young and vibrant," notably uncommon in volunteer EMS organizations around the state. "Younger volunteers that are pre-med and want the experience, nurses,

physical therapists. We had one kid who just graduated medical school and became a medical director here."

Since the merger, said Kroll, "We get there faster, no question. And we've been able to upgrade our equipment dramatically. We've managed to achieve the economies of scale and become successful where other companies can't be, which has allowed us to purchase some top-of-the line technology."

"We're very good about spending money," joked DBEMS Medical Director Bruce Ushkow, who also sits on the Board of Directors. "There are a lot of 'toys' that I'd like to have, but we only buy the 'toys' we need.

"This is a fabulous outcome," Ushkow said of the merger, highlighting the two-tiered EMT/paramedic response protocol currently employed by DBEMS (which will be covered in next week's issue).

"It's pretty well known that this agency just works," said Brian Wood, EMS captain in the Albany County Sheriff's Office. "They're maintaining where other places are collapsing in a hurry. I don't know if you can find better care."

RCS, teachers association reach agreement

Contracts approved after 13 months of tense negotiations

RAVENA—After more than a year of contentious negotiations, the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk School District and leadership of the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Teachers Association have announced a memorandum of agreement for the RCSTA employment contract for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2021.

The RCSTA collective bargaining unit is comprised of 222 faculty members. Its last contract expired June 30, 2017, and negotiations began early that year.

A newsletter sent out in November 2017 called the first six months of negotiation "angry and disrespectful," but expressed hope that the new district administration would be more amenable.

"We were very frustrated with the pace of it," Matt Miller, president of RCSTA, told *Spotlight News* last month. "They were saying they didn't have any

money, the typical kinds of things you hear in a contract negotiation, whereas we had looked into the finances and felt the money was there to pay the teachers."

That frustration prompted teachers earlier this year to begin walking in to the high school and middle school together in the mornings, and the elementary school teachers to walk out together at the end of the day, in a show of unity. "Teachers aren't allowed to strike in New York state," said Miller. "So there wasn't a whole lot we could do." A large group of teachers went en masse to a school board meeting in February, he noted, and several have continued to attend subsequent meetings to implore district officials to reach an agreement.

A handshake agreement was finally reached on Wednesday, Feb. 14, of this year—exactly one year after RCSTA and RCSCSD met to commence negotiations—but a miscommunication took more than a month to straighten out. In the final week of March,

the new contract agreements were put before union membership and the RCSCSD Board of Education for a vote. BOE unanimously approved the proposal and it passed RCSTA with 92 percent approval.

The newly ratified contract will be retroactive to July 1, 2017. Under the new contract:

- Those who are hired after July 1, 2018, and work in the district for 15 or more years, will be eligible for a fixed retirement buyout for any unused sick and personal days—up to 240 days.
- Teachers will be required to attend an additional 10 hours of professional development over the course of each school year.
- RCSTA members will move to a new copay model (CASHIC) which will reduce premium increases for both the district and for members.
- A number of language changes better clarify procedures for approving unit member's use of leave time and payment for summer work.
- · Starting salaries for teachers

will be raised by eliminating the first step on the salary schedule during each of the next four years; moving from a 16 step salary schedule to a 12 step salary schedule by 2020-21

- Over the next four years, teachers will receive a 1.4 percent, 1.7 percent, 1 percent, and .5 percent increase, respectively
- Off step teachers accepted a change in how they are compensated, from percentage increases to flat dollar amounts.
- Nurses' salaries will be adjusted from 80 percent to 82 percent of the teacher's salary schedule
- Coaching staff, who are paid on a point system, will receive an increase of \$1 per point in each of the next two years.

According to RCSCSD, new contract increases represent less than one percent of the annual school budget over the next four years.

"I think," said Miller, "in the end, we got some decent money for giving up some major components of our contract that have been there for a while."

"We amicably tackled some relevant issues for both the district and the unit," said RCSCSD Superintendent Brian Bailey. "There had been no new money added to the teacher salary step schedule for almost 10 years. This meant that RCS was falling farther and farther behind neighboring schools in our ability to attract and retain qualified staff members. These improved starting and continuing salaries, combined with additional professional development time and reduced insurance premiums for all parties, will help to improve our district both fiscally and programatically.'

After BOE approved the contracts on Tuesday, March 27, its President, James Latter, thanked both the union and district administration. "I know it's never easy," he said. "They put in a lot of time and effort. I appreciate us getting to 'yes,' and look forward to working handin-hand over these next contract years. It's never fun, sometimes it brings out not the best in us, and hopefully we can put that all behind us and work together the way we're supposed to."





The bell tolls for thee

Market indicators point to the demise of the longstanding compact disc

hether it be a victim of declining box store sales overall, or the internet as a whole, the mighty compact disc is dying.

The demise of the CD is following the same pattern as its predecessors. Last year, NPR reported that Ford Motors would stop including CD players in new cars. That news was followed with Best Buy recently announcing it would stop carrying CDs in all its stores. Those old enough to remember the 8-Track and tape cassette can recall a similar movement away from a favorite form of personal music entertainment.

"I never stopped [listening to CDs]," said Susan Kastan, of Troy. She said she listens to CDs wherever she goes, whether in the car, in the Bose Wave at home, or on her computer. "I have only a few digital music files — mostly albums put out in that format only. I read the album notes and credits and consider them important. And by the way, I only last fall retired a car with a cassette deck — before that, I still listened to cassettes in the car

Since its introduction to the market in 1982, CDs have always had a relative challenge to portability. Though tape cassettes ultimately suffered a common death of being "eaten" by players, they were relatively easier to carry when not in use. About the size of an iPhone, a tape or two could easily be carried in a jacket or shirt pocket. Something that could not be said about the 8-track tape.

Considering the lifespan of each product, the CD has

had remarkable commercial success. The CD ushered in the death knell for the 8-track tape in 1982. That's when major retailers stopped carrying the bulky plastic cartridges. It was that same year that auto manufacturers stopped including 8-track decks in new vehicles. But, for 16 years, that was the means by which music lovers could listen to songs on demand.

The tape cassettes' reign in the consumer world jumped with the advent of Sony's Walkman in 1981. It was wearable technology for teenagers and joggers as the 20th century was drawing to a close. Even when Sony developed the Discman for CDs, tape cassette sales remained strong enough to fight against the dying of the light. But, the digital world was fast approaching. By 2001, the landscape would change.

In 2000, CD sales peaked at \$13.2 billion, but file sharing software Napster posed a threat. Though it was common practice for friends to copy each other's music collection, including the romantic "mixtape," ease of access grew exponentially over the internet. Consumers started burning their own CDs, followed shortly by personal digital players. Apple sold its first iPod in October 2001, and CD sales steadily decreased there after. According to Fast Company, only \$1.2 billion worth of CDs were sold in 2016. Though the tape cassette held strong into the 21st century, car manufacturers stopped producing cars with tape decks in 2010.

Mainstream markets appear to be abandoning the CD after more than 35 years, but the plastic disc is still showing strength within the local music scene. As of 2017, online music store Bandcamp has reported 18 percent year-to-year growth in sales. For bands fighting for airtime on radio stations, the CD is still the tool that receives a favorable response from program managers.







atin American flavors come alive in this festive beef dish with fruity salsa. It's a relatively quick meal to prepare at about 20 minutes, and another 20 minutes to cook.

Ingredients: Yields four servings

1/2 Thsp vegetable oil 1 beef tenderloin roast (16 oz)

For salsa:

½ C canned diced pineapple, in fruit juice, chopped into small pieces

¹/₄ C red onion, minced

2 tsp fresh cilantro, rinsed, dried, and chopped (or substitute ¼ tsp dried coriander)

1 Tbsp lemon juice

For seasoning:

1 tsp ground black pepper
1 tsp ground coriander
1 Tbsp ground cinnamon
4 tsp ground allspice
1 Tbsp cocoa powder (unsweetened)

2 tsp chili powder

½ tsp salt

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 375°F. For the salsa,

combine all ingredients and toss well. Let sit for 10 to 15 minutes to marinate while preparing the seasoning and cooking the meat. For the beef tenderloin seasoning, combine all ingredients. Lightly oil the tenderloin and spread an even layer of the dry seasoning over the entire roast. Place the seasoned roast on a roasting or broiling pan and roast for 10 to 15 minutes (to a minimum internal temperature of 145°F). Let cool for 5 minutes before carving into 16 slices (1 ounce each). Serve four slices of the tenderloin with ¼ cup salsa on the side.

With this Latin American inspired dish, we chose a malbec over a cabernet sauvignon. This one from the Alamos Wintery has a dark purple color with violet highlights, offering bright black berry aromas with light floral notes. It has a full, rich body, with black raspberry and a hint of chocolate, which pairs nicely with this dish.



Lakecia Benjamin's 'Rise Up'

akecia Benjamin is a funk, jazz, and R&B artist from New York City. She is best known for her own recorded saxophone work and her group Soul Squad. She has also performed with other great names including Alicia Keys, Stevie Wonder, Clark Terry, and many more.

Her latest album titled, "Rise Up," comes to us from the New York label Ropeadope. The LP features 13 tracks of a funk and jazz fusion led by Lakecia's voice and her Alto Saxophone. The lyrics span a variety of topics but there is a clear focus on social justice and particularly the issues facing the African American community.

In opening jam, "March On," Benjamin's vocals and instrumentation command your attention and set a poignant tone for what is to come. Track Two, "On The One" keeps up the momentum, but adds smooth male vocals for a different flavor; of course Benjamin continues to flourish with her evocative saxophone. After a thoughtful and meaningful lull in the middle, the album turns it back on with the song "Little Children."

The powerful record not only calls people to arms, but it also offers encouragement to those who have already joined the fight. It's tracks like "Takeback" that Benjamin is able to say so much, without actually "saying" very much at all; her saxophone screaming at the top of its lungs, heavy undulating bass and drums marching forward, and a complete atmosphere of power holding it all together. Perhaps the most urgent and evocative track from the album is "Little Children," which harkens back to the blistering pace and utter catharsis of "Sinnerman" from Nina Simone.

Benjamin's saxophone playing has intensity and poise. Benjamin manages to sew together lead riffs that bring the songs a strong cohesiveness, while also taking the audience on a more personal journey during her improvisations. The instrumentation is akin to the work of Kamasi Washington and the work he did with Kendrick Lamar on "To Pimp a Butterfly," but with Benjamin's own unmistakable style.

SNL alum conjures NYC

Comedian Colin Quinn takes solo act to The Egg

ALBANY — For anyone familiar with Colin Quinn and his New York-style comedy, his performance at The Egg on Friday, March 23 did not disappoint.

Quinn jumped between large societal issues, and the self-involved people you meet on a daily basis. He, himself, spent part of his hour long set trying new material, namely trying to solve the cultural and political divide in America. While the ideas he had have comedic potential, like dividing different social and political groups into various states, with fitness freaks, for instance, living a territory surrounded by mirrors with strict rules on the percent body fat of citizens.

While amusing, these societal diagnoses and solutions came across as material that was still in progress. It was in the same vein as his 2013 special, "Unconstitutional," that poignantly teased and dissected American society.

When a heckler from the back of the audience tries to derail his performance, Quinn reminds him of just how long he's been in the business with a well-oiled "Shut up, sir!" This launched him to the best parts of his on personal interactions, with the self-described comedian from work that tries to startle you when you're holding a hot lidless coffee, to the power tripping friends that play "pranks" on you like sneaking up on you on a deserted street.

The first two openers, Kristen Buckles and Lacey Jeka, performed as a duo, taking shots at each other under the guise of safe space-lingo as they vied for control of the stage. Exchanging biting doublespeak, while encouraging each other to feel empowered, they played perfectly as two narcissistic millennials. Bantering back and forth they didn't show their opinion on the new age of empowerment until the end; "Listen, 'believe all women' is an insane statement, and bull**** is genderless."

The third opener of the night, Tim Gage, brought out the first hard laughs from the sold-out show. Drawing from his own experience as a blue collar worker in Long Island, his imitation of a jonesing lotto-player rocking back and forth at a 7-11 was spot on. He wondered aloud why he would have to be there so early in the morning to play their numbers, "It used to be the mafia would come to your house. Who stopped that, Cuomo?"

Over the hour and 45-minute show Quinn and his openers brought their "A" game to The Egg. While his cultural jokes came across a little thin, Quinn's acute jokes on social situations were great, and after some more shows his new material would be great to see when he returns to the Capital City.

Almost Dead at Palace

Joe Russo's Almost Dead jams for sold out crowd

ALBANY — Joe Russo's Almost Dead continued its sold out Northeast run at the historic Palace Theatre on Friday, March 16. Some fans followed the band after its nonstop show at the Landmark in Syracuse, fighting through the wind chill to get into the theater in anticipation for some Grateful Dead tunes.

JRAD kicked the night off with an energetic version of the classic tune "Feel Like a Stranger," setting the mood for the first set. Tom Hamilton took the helm of the song's jam with a killer solo, and used the ending lick of "Stranger" to help transition into "Help on the Way," which was met by a roar of cheers from the crowd. There was a notably good jam into the last chorus of "Help" before the band segued into "Slipknot!."

"Slipknot!" started off normally with the arpeggio section that fans are familiar with, but after one go around, Marco Benevento made good use of his grand piano and took a lengthy solo, using that same arpeggio section as a home base in between improvisations. The band jumped back into the song with a strange chromatic jam that turned into one more repetition of the arpeggios, until they segued into "The Wheel."

After an emotional peak to conclude

"Slipknot!," an upbeat rendition of "The Wheel" had the crowd dancing like there was no tomorrow. The song featured multiple "Bathtub Gin" teases and a jam on the Phish classic, the first of many teases of songs by the jam powerhouse. The band brought the song into a very high energy peak and one last chorus before Hamilton and Metzger led them into "Uncle John's Band."The whole theater sang along with the fan-

favorite Dead song, and Hamilton took another ripping solo. The jam was discoesque, and made way into an acapella chorus supported by the crowd keeping the beat with clapping.

The group quickly transitioned from "Uncle John's Band" into "Truckin'," playing it more quickly than normal. Scott Metzger and Joe Russo really shined

during this "Truckin'," but you could tell that the whole band was having fun with each other as they steamed through the song. Finishing up the last verses and choruses, the band segued into a version of "Music Never Stopped Reprise" that featured a "Born Crosseyed" jam. This first set was filled lots of classic Dead songs and energetic playing, and it left the crowd

excited for the second set.

To start off the second set, the band went into an improv jam before breaking into the Jerry Garcia Band's classic, "Reubin & Cherise." "Reubin" was met with plenty of cheers from the audience and provided an upbeat start for the coming set, as well as another Phish tease of "The Divided Sky."

The band worked its way into "Viola Lee Blues," the highlight jam

of the night, using the energy built up during the end of "Reubin & Cherise" to kick the song into high gear. "Viola Lee" featured a jam on Dolly Parton's "9 to 5" that sent the energy in the theater through the roof, before transitioning back into "Viola Lee Blues Reprise" that included a jam on "Foam" by Phish towards the end. The group segued into "Jack Straw"

which began with a jam over a jungle-like rhythm that Russo was throwing down. "Jack Straw" featured a psychedelic jam that included a section where the whole band was harmonizing over a lick Tom Hamilton was playing, and every time he played the lick, each member would change the harmony they were playing.

Following a very powerful "Jack Straw," the band broke into "So Many Roads," one of the later Hunter/Garcia collaborations, which was a nice cool down after the intensity of "Reubin & Cherise," "Viola Lee Blues," "Jack Straw." Marco Benevento took another beautiful grand piano solo that made Joe Russo whip his head around, and gracefully passed the torch to Hamilton who soloed his way into one last verse and chorus. The group broke into "Goin' Down The Road Feelin'

Bad" which brought the energy back up following the somber "So Many Roads." Scott Metzger took a fantastic solo over a bluegrassy section before Benevento squeezed in one last solo, during which the entire band was laughing and playing around with each other. The set closed out with an instrumental version of "We Bid You Goodnight" that was quite beautiful.

The group encored with "Magnificent Sanctuary Band" off of Jerry Garcia's "Cats Under the Stars" album, which set a nice, whimsical feel for the end of the show. The whole crowd was getting down and grooving as Hamilton serenaded the theater, and the band was having a ton of fun taking turns soloing at the end of the song. JRAD's first sold out Palace Theatre show was a giant dance party and featured fantastic jams such as "Viola Lee Blues."







He works almost every day; ringing in customers, restocking vending machines, and taking orders for the kitchen he installed. Spinelli added the kitchen and bar after he mortgaged "everything" to help keep the Albany business profitable. According to Spinelli, the renovations were not quite finished before he ran out of money.

Spinelli moves with the confidence of experience, he's been working there since 1973 when his father bought the place. That was the year after he graduated from high school, and he started managing the hall in the mid-nineties. He runs around the store to make sure everything is stocked and set throughout the day, and leans over the counter to talk to customers or catches sports on the bar televisions when he has a

"This is the kind of place where you have to put in your time because long, compared to the ones seen at bars you can't pay people full time," Spinelli

The patron Spinelli joked about not making money from is Bill Stackhouse, a tall gaunt man with grey hair swished to one side of his head. He's one of the

regulars, and he said he's been going there since he retired in the mid-nineties. He said he was one of the men that helped build the hall "about a hundred years ago" in the mid-fifties, and sometimes refers to Spinelli as "the kid". With only a couple others in the hall Stackhouse walks around his table methodically, head hunched over the angles, shots, and green felt of his usual


1980s, leaving only a

the evening. Webbed billiard pockets hang and decorate the underside of the wooden countertop, and billiard themed signs hang from the walls. Here Spinelli serves the beer, wine, and pub fare offered at the Golden Cue. He sells onion rings for \$2.75, and chicken wings for \$9.

The billiards area is light green from the paint on the walls to the leafy design of the grass colored carpet, like the ashy worn felt on the oldest looking tables. In this area sit 20 pool tables for use. Most are nine feet

that are only seven feet long. There are now three bar sized tables, bought for the local pool league that brings in new and younger faces.

Justin Secor-Rubenstein is a young face, but he is not a league member. The

30-year-old bartender comes in on a sleepy, hungover Saturday afternoon. He gets a draft beer and heads to table 12, where he practices by himself and hits shots with one hand while he's on the phone. He said he's been playing pool here since he was 4, but he only comes in once in a while nowadays. He said he likes the history of the place and the beer, plus "It's a great date spot." He said if you can shoot well, you can teach girls how to play for a cheap night out.

He said that he remember clouds of cigarette smoke filling the air of the hall growing up, but those days are gone. Smoking hasn't been allowed indoors at businesses in New York since 2002. Spinelli doesn't allow something else associated with pool halls too; gambling. A couple of players at the bumper pool table may not have heard this though, as they play for a little more than for the love of the game.

Spinelli was born in 1954, and has age-given gray hair. As his day goes on and he stays on his feet, a slight limp appears in his stride. He knows almost all of the patrons by name, and said he ought to after being in business for so long. When his father, Rocco Spinelli Sr., comes in he affectionately calls him "Pops" and drops a K-cup pod in the store's Keurig for him. He talks with him, sometimes repeating himself and smiles.

On a warm afternoon, Spinelli doesn't turn on the air conditioning until the evening, when more patrons arrive. He said it's too costly to put on for three people. Soon the Golden Cue is going to start opening at 4 p.m. on some days instead of 2 p.m. as a cost saving measure. "We got to find ways to make it work, and we're

running out of ways," he chuckles.

As the day presses on, the billiard lamps above the pool tables start to light up as more people show up to play in the pool league and hang out. The tables are the same ones from when the store opened, refelted and fixed as the years went by.

On busy nights, the sounds of the games make an ambient noise in the hall sashaying around the conversations. Sticks woodenly knock cue balls into a clack with the object ball, the plastic rumble of it rolling down the ball return or the player's tsk at a missed shot. When there are many players in the hall, the table's noises overlap and billiard's background babble is punctuated by the crack of a new rack's break

During his 44 years working the hall, Spinelli has seen many changes to the business. He remembers when Tom Cruise starred in "The Color of Money," a 1986 billiards drama that he said was good for business after its release. He saw when he said "Pool went from sport to recreation," something that people did to pass time rather than play seriously. He also saw the other pool halls in Albany close over the years, with the Golden Cue being the last one standing in the city. "I think I survived because a lot of businesses, the business is a side thing... This is my main job," Spinelli said.

With the heyday of pool gone, many pool halls in New York have closed over the years. According to the Billiards Congress of America, Manhattan alone had thousands of pool halls close between the 1930s and the 1980s, leaving only a few remaining.

Tuesday is league night for straight pool players. This billiards variant operates where players can sink any ball on the table for one point, and the game ends at a set number of points. Players only pass play after they miss a shot, so experienced players can appear to be playing by themselves until a ball slides wide of the pocket.

Straight pool is absent from bars due to the number of racks needed to play, and the table charging by rack. This issue is circumvented when players pay \$6.30 an hour to play at the Golden Cue, the same price as the credit card minimum charge. Stackhouse remembers this as the game of choice when he used to play in New York City. This is a game that can be seen in Paul Newman's "The Hustler," where his character plays against Minnesota Fats, played by Jackie Gleason.

Spinelli said that Rudolf "Minnesota Fats" Wanderone once played at the hall, before his father bought the store. Spinelli can name many professional players that have come in over the years, standouts from a crowd where he said many people can consistently pocket 40 shots in a row without missing.

When Spinelli goes home around 8:30 p.m. he leaves employee Michael Smail in charge. He got the job when he was at the store one night and saw Spinelli "running around," and offered to help. Smail said he first went to the store when he was 9 years old, and met his wife in person there for the first time on a date.

A small collection of pool sticks sit on top of a rack shaped like a cut in half eight ball next to the hall's juke box. These pool sticks are different than the ones found in

the billiards area, as they are made out of fiberglass instead of wood. According to Smail, these are good for teaching children and novice players as they lack the power of a wooden stick, curtailing the chance of a new player knocking a cue ball off of the table by accident.

Both Smail and Spinelli work to make sure the tables and sticks are not damaged from careless or clueless players. On a sleepy Friday afternoon, two college students play on one of the back tables when one lays across the table length wise to take a difficult shot. Smail crosses the billiards area and with few words introduces him to the bridge laying on the rack beneath his table, a supplementary pool stick to take long shots with.

With the rise of computers and the fading popularity of billiards, it can be hard to attract younger patrons to play pool. "There's so much to do now for kids, it seems like pool isn't even an option." Spinelli said. Most of the patrons that come in during the day are middle-aged or older, and only some younger make their way to the hall. Led Zeppelin and The Doors croon from the speakers as patrons play, and the hall's background music is dominated by classic rock.

Spinelli had cut down his own hours after suffering a mild heart attack four yeras ago. He said the business doesn't make enough money for him to able to sell the place. His family helps him out at the hall but won't take over as they have their own careers. "When I'm gone the place goes with me," Spinelli said.



The bell tolls for thee

"For legitimate radio promotion a CD is still a requirement," said David Bourgeois, of Bridge Road Entertainment in Albany. It's the most effective way for local bands to gain a program manager's attention, though there is also an industry standard, membership-based digital delivery service commonly used by record labels.

Bourgeois, who represents Jocelyn and Chris Ardnt, sees that fans still gravitate to the CD over digital thumb drives. "On the live touring front," he said, "CDs are received and sell far better than download cards. Since January, CD sales at shows

comprised two-thirds of all merchandise income for our artists."

Here's what some of you had to say when asked if you still listen to CDs:

Andrew Gabriel (Ambassador Music Group): I do! But I think I'm a rare case. My younger brothers (more millennialish) don't. They don't even buy digital downloads. They use subscription services like Spotify.

Tabitha Clancy (Exit 97.7 WEXT): I'm not. [I'm] usually [listening to] a digital download. That said, being in radio, we still do get hardcopy discs over digital downloads... I do think that's going to the way of digital labels as well though. One thing I liked a musician doing was having a vinyl with a digital download available with purchase. That way you get the

physical product complete with art work and liner notes, but also have the files in your computer.

Katy Cole (singer/songwriter for Last Daze): I still believe in the power of the full record. But digital releases are more prominent than physical copies. We definitely have cut down on our production numbers of physical CDs.

Jack Carpenter (Two Buttons Deep): I will buy a local artists' CD if I've had enough drinks to forget that my computer doesn't have a drive anymore.

Allison Mooney, of Delmar: I was disappointed last April when my new car did not have a CD player.

Bernard Harney, of Albany: I usually only buy CDs of artists not available in the U.S. or artists at local festivals that the

major labels have not picked up.


Nicole Suto (singer for Bleak Little World): I like CDs, but listen often on my "devices" as well, so a healthy mix of both here

Vito Ciccarelli (WVCR 88.3 The Saint): Love local 518 CDs. Some really good stuff being released

Samantha Henrikson, of Guilderland: I only buy imported CDs of my favorite artist's music from Australia

George LaFlay (drummer for Lord Electro): Still spending money on CDs but memory drives would be much more cost effective and then they can reuse the drive for something else. Double whammy.

Steve Mink (bassist for Lord Electro): I prefer CDs. But a lot of people do prefer digital or drives.
