Spring Recycle Fest is this Saturday

BETHLEHEM—The town's annual spring recycling event, co-sponsored by Bethlehem Central School District's Green Team, Delmar Farmers Market, Grassroot Givers and Cornell Cooperative Extension of Albany County, will take place at Elm Avenue Park this Saturday, April 14, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Drop-offs for reuse, recycling and shredding are free, while electronic, appliance and scrap metal recycling require a \$5 donation to the Bethlehem Central High School Environmental Club per car.

The town's third annual "Spring Recycle Fest," held last April, broke previous records with 805 households dropping off approximately 50,730 pounds (or more than 25 tons) of materials, which averages out to nearly 6 pounds for every household in Bethlehem. More than \$2,000 in donations were also raised to support Bethlehem Central School District's environmental programs.

Town Recycling Coordinator Dan Lilkas-Rain hopes to break records again this year.

The following items will not be accepted during this event:

- Batteries
- Fluorescent blubs
- Toxic and/or hazardous materials

However, most of these items can be disposed of during the town's Household Hazardous Waste Day, on Saturday, May 5, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The following items will be accepted:

- **Clothing and other textiles for reuse and recycling**
All types of clothing, fabric, household textiles, stuffed animals, belts, hats, gloves, purses, bags, backpacks, footwear. Okay if worn, stained, damaged, missing buttons or zippers, etc.
Wet, smelly, or contaminated items will not be accepted.
Carpets, mattresses, or loose stuffing also will not be accepted.
- **Document Shredding/ Paper Recycling**
Secure shredding is limited to Town of Bethlehem residents and BCSD taxpayers with ID. *Limit of 3 medium sized boxes per household.*
- **Hard Cover/ Paperback Books**
Books will be collected for reuse or recycling by Grassroot Givers. (Monetary donations will also be gratefully accepted by the nonprofit.)
- **Plastic Toys**
To be sorted for reuse or recycling.
- **Electronics, Appliances and Scrap Metals**
Electronics, appliances and scrap metals recycling for \$5/car donation to BCHS Environmental Club.

Audio/Visual Equipment, Business Machines, Cable or Satellite Receivers, Cash Registers, Cell Phones, Circuit Boards
Electronics: TVs, Computers, Monitors, Keyboards, Printers, Fax Machines. Scanners, Portable Digital Music Players, Servers (small scale), VCR, DVD, and DVR players, wiring and cables, ink cartridges, etc.

Prescription Drug Take Back Day is April 28

BETHLEHEM — The Police Department is once again partnering with the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration for the next national drug take back event.

National Prescription Drug Take Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs. This event allows people to turn over unwanted prescription drugs and controlled substances anonymously.

The event will be held on Saturday, April 28, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the front parking lot of the Elm Avenue Town Park, at 261 Elm Avenue in Delmar. This is a drive up event and people can discard the drugs into an approved container from their vehicle, no questions asked.

Please note that sharps will not be accepted.

Please do not show up prior to 10 a.m.

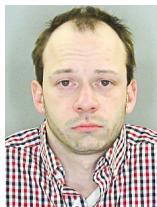

BETHLEHEM—On Wednesday, March 21, Bethlehem Police were called to a reported hit-and-run crash on Route 9W, in the area just south of Feura Bush Road. It was reported that the suspect exited her vehicle and struck the occupant of the other vehicle before fleeing the scene. The investigation resulted in the identity of the operator being determined as Brittany M. Myers, 22, of Duaneburg.

Myers was located by Bethlehem Police the following day. The investigation reportedly revealed that she had more than ten active suspensions on her driver's license, and she was charged with one felony count of aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle. She was also charged with violations of harassment, leaving the scene of a property damage crash, unregistered motor vehicle, improper or switched license plates, driving without insurance, driving and uninspected motor vehicle and unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle. Bethlehem Board adopts proposed budget

BETHLEHEM—The district's Board of Education was expected to adopt the proposed 2018-19 budget during its meeting on Tuesday, April 10. There will be a public hearing on the proposed budget on Wednesday, May 2, and district residents will vote on the proposal on Tuesday, May 15.

At its April 10 meeting, the board took a closer look at projected revenues for the coming year and finalized plans for closing a budget gap that is estimated at \$1.5 million, down from \$3.3 million in February, before the district began identifying areas of savings.

According to Superintendent Jody Monroe, the gap is largely due to increases in mandated pension and health care costs. She said while school districts have minimal control over employee-related expenses, the district has been taking a careful approach to balancing the needs of students with community resources.

While district enrollment is projected to continue to decline in coming years, the national Great Recession (2007-2011) and resulting steep cuts to state education funding caused BCSD to reduce the number of teachers and support

staff during those years, according to Monroe, and the district has spent the last several years gradually restoring or replacing them with new positions as that funding has been gradually restored by the state. The district has expanded counseling staff, she said, and recently added bus routes to shorten rides for students in the Clarksville area.

In addition to a nearly \$2 million increase in fringe benefit costs, the initial baseline budget also included smaller increases in six areas: instructional programs (\$1.08 million); special education support services (\$384,480); debt service (\$276,291); administrative costs (\$61,670); athletics (\$28,083); and technology (\$27,118). Transportation and operations/maintenance both saw decreases—\$171,538 and \$36,537, respectively.

Total budget revenues, however, were projected to be \$37,000 less than in 2017-18.

“Over a series of four public meetings, members of the board have been hearing recommendations from district administrators and department supervisors on areas where reductions could be made and where additions might be needed,” said Monroe. “The last piece of the budget puzzle is to take a close look at revenues, including state aid, to determine

a proposed tax levy and estimate what it will mean for local taxpayers.”

The recently enacted 2018-19 New York state budget included an additional \$161,000 in state aid for Bethlehem. (BCSD Chief Financial Officer Judith Kehoe noted, however, that state law would allow New York to reduce funding by up to 3 percent of the entire \$28.1 million—more than \$800,000—in the event that state revenues fall short.)

“We were certainly pleased to receive the additional state aid,” said Monroe. “This aid will factor into the board’s determination of the tax levy and final vote on the proposed spending plan they will present to voters.”

The tax levy is the total amount of money a school district raises in taxes each year from district property owners. Under the somewhat convoluted state tax cap law, the district’s maximum allowable tax levy limit for the coming year is 3.95 percent. If the board were to approve a tax levy increase above that amount, the budget would require a supermajority vote (at least 60 percent of district voters) to pass.

Each one percent of a tax levy increase would generate approximately \$640,000 for the district, according to Monroe.

For all the money spent by the district, BCSD per

pupil costs are more than \$3,000 below the state average and \$6,600 below the average for districts with similar demographics, according to Kehoe.

During the April 10 meeting, Kehoe offered a preliminary look at different tax rate scenarios for the board to consider when making final budget decisions. Residents are encouraged to attend the public hearing scheduled for Wednesday, May 2, in the Bethlehem Central High School library.

Cost of gas up again

A gallon of regular in the Capital District has risen .4 cents per gallon in the past week, according to GasBuddy, an online company that tracks gas prices nationwide.

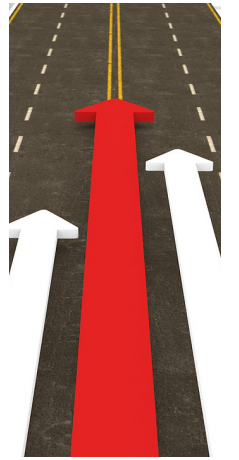
As of Sunday, April 8, a gallon of regular went for an average of \$2.67, according to a survey of 546 outlets.

It compares to a national average of \$2.65 per gallon.

The Capital District prices are 28.5 cents per gallon higher than the same day a year ago and 7 cents higher than a month ago.

The national average has increased 12 cents per gallon during the last month and is 25.9 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

“As markets have seen concern rise of a possible trade war between the U.S. and China, oil prices have been hit hard, leading gas prices to dramatically slow their recent ascent,” said Patrick DeHaan, head of petroleum analysis at GasBuddy. “While the pause button may be hit for the time being on the spring surge, it is still likely we’ll see prices advance again soon.”

Dems replace leader

Domalewicz resigns as Legislative Majority Leader

ALBANY—After just three months in the office, Albany County Legislative Majority Leader Gary Domalewicz abruptly resigned his leadership position during a closed majority caucus meeting on Thursday, April 5. The resignation came after rumors began swirling that he had lost his party's support and would be replaced by Legislator Dennis Feeney, a little-known second-term Democrat from Guilderland.

Domalewicz not only replaced longtime Majority Leader Frank Commisso, Sr., who held the seat for 25 years, but also represented an ideological shift within the legislature when he and Chairman Andrew Joyce managed to secure the votes necessary to unseat Commisso and his favored candidate for chair, incumbent Sean Ward.

"I am humbled by the incredible support I have received from my colleagues," Domalewicz said at the time. "It is time for our body to move in a new direction. My colleagues have embraced this opportunity and I am looking forward to serving every member of the majority."

According to several legislators familiar with events of the past three months, it was Domalewicz' failure to do exactly that that led to his April ouster. By most accounts, his party's support had all but entirely eroded and, by late March, plans were already underway to replace him.

"He has a shoddy interpretation of the charter," said Joyce, claiming that Domalewicz "refused" to follow through on an agreement to reorganize the administrative structure of the Office of the Chair and the Office of the Majority. "He just flat out said, 'the staff stays,' with zero discussion or consideration for what their duties are overall."

The stated intent behind

the reorganization was to relocate certain powers in the office of the Chairman (where those powers generally reside in similar legislative bodies) to ensure all elected representatives have fair access to the legislative process. For example, legislation written by the minority party has been sent to the Office of the Majority for approval before being added to the monthly agenda, which has come out of the majority's office. Ending that practice was reportedly meant to assure minority members that their voices would carry greater weight, the same reason that Joyce appointed minority party members to committee leadership positions for the first time in the Legislature's history.

After reportedly agreeing, in a series of phone conversations with several legislators—including Joyce, Joe O'Brien, Alison McLean Lane and Charles Dawson—that he would be supportive of the reorganization, Domalewicz appeared to have gone back on his word. Some legislators, speaking off the record, speculated that his reluctance to enact certain changes was the result of pressure from Albany County Executive Dan McCoy, who employs relatives of Domalewicz.

One hypothesis is that McCoy may be unhappy with the way Joyce is running the Legislature, primarily due to a desire to have Chief of Staff Tim Maniccia independently review the executive's proposed annual budgets and proposed anti-nepotism legislation that would limit a practice oft associated with McCoy's administration.

Questions to McCoy's office went unanswered.

"Dan McCoy is a very good friend of mine," said Domalewicz, denying that McCoy was behind his unwillingness to move ahead with administrative changes. "I don't know who told you that I agreed to anything," he said. "I was told that it was in the charter and had to be done. When my counsel advised me that it wasn't in the charter and, in fact, the charter said these things had to be done in the majority's office, I said, 'Let's have the caucus decide what we're going to do with this.' And Andrew [Joyce] got very excited and never allowed us to get to that point."

Domalewicz said that, looking for clarification, he asked Joyce for a meeting but was refused.

Domalewicz also said he had already planned on resigning, claiming that the division within his party had proven more than he was able to deal with at this time.

"I just don't have the time for this," he said. "Our caucus is just so fractured and I don't have the time to put into it right now. It's going to require a lot of time. Everyone just has different ideas of how they think the county should be run."

"He has been largely ineffective in dealing with his caucus and working with them, and me, in a positive, productive and collaborative manner," Joyce said of Domalewicz. "His near total lack of support in the caucus is a testament to that."

But not everyone was happy with the most recent shake-up, including Legislator Sam Fein, who said he had no complaints about Domalewicz. Fein unsuccessfully nominated

Answering the call

How DBEMS found success with two-tiered model of care, employment

BETHLEHEM —As recently as the 1990s, few volunteer-based emergency medical service providers in the region were consistently able to provide paramedic-level care when responding to emergency calls, according to Albany County EMS Captain Brian Wood.

Today, said Delmar-Bethlehem EMS Medical Director Bruce Ushkow, both a state certified emergency medical technician (EMT) and a licensed paramedic respond to every call in the Town of Bethlehem.

Delmar's first "Rescue Squad" was organized in 1939 by Floyd Irons, who served as its first captain. Early members were recruited from the Delmar Fire Department, the umbrella under which Delmar EMS began, and learned how to administer first aid.

Peter Applebee of Applebee's Funeral Home donated the first ambulance to the squad in May 1940, which he outfitted with an emergency "resuscitator" a year later. That first Delmar EMS squad serviced residents of the Delmar, Slingerlands and Elsmere Fire Districts. By the 1970s, the Delmar emergency response team had a reputation as one of the best volunteer squads in the region, boasting paramedic-level care when no one else could.

In the mid-90s, however, Delmar was experiencing

problems keeping volunteer paramedics on staff. "It was hard to get people to commit to that kind of training and stay here as volunteers," Wood explained. "There were also people who took advantage and would get the education on [Delmar's] dime and then say, 'See ya! I'm going to go work somewhere I can make a paycheck.'"

Delmar was not only short-handed, but was also responding to Bethlehem EMS calls requiring paramedics for advanced life support. (Bethlehem EMS, which incorporated in 1956 as an independent, volunteer-based organization, served the southern half of Bethlehem.)

"At the time," said Wood, "Delmar EMS was running at a paramedic level, but was really struggling to maintain the high quality of care they were known for, and Bethlehem EMS had no paramedics at all, but knew they needed them."

It was also in the mid-90s that an increasing need to provide advanced emergency care in rural, volunteer-based areas beyond Bethlehem prompted the late Albany County Sheriff James Campbell to implement a county-based paramedic response program in an effort to ensure that responders with paramedic level training were available to county residents in those areas.

The Albany County Sheriff's paramedic program was initially conceived to respond to calls out of Berne, Westerlo, Rensselaerville and the county's outlier hilltowns. According to Wood, however, both EMS squads serving the Town of Bethlehem quickly realized they would also benefit.

The county paramedic program began in February 1996. From day one, the program had

What's the difference between an EMT and a paramedic?

EMTs are educated in skills such as CPR, giving patients oxygen, administering glucose for diabetics and helping with treatments for asthma attacks or allergic reactions. With very few exceptions, such as in the case of auto-injectors for allergic reactions, EMTs are not allowed to provide treatments that requiring breaking the skin, such as injections. They usually complete a course that is about 120-150 hours in length, consisting of lectures, hands-on skills training, and clinical and/or field internships.

Paramedics are advanced providers of emergency medical care and are highly educated in topics such as anatomy and physiology, cardiology, medications, and medical procedures. They are able to perform advanced life support care, including IV fluid therapy, needle chest decompressions, EKG monitoring, manual defibrillation, mechanical ventilation, administering medications, placing sutures and more. Paramedic courses can be between 1,200 to 1,800 hours.

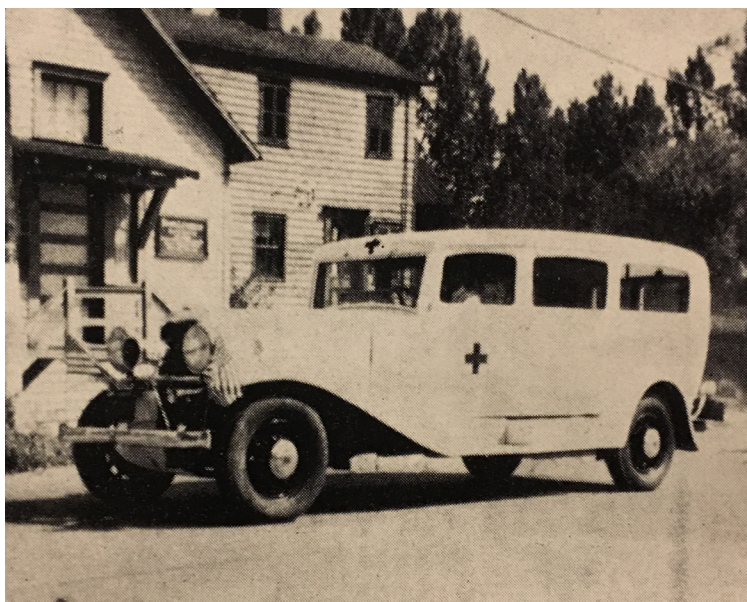
two vehicles serving Bethlehem and one covering the hilltowns, which had a considerably lower number of calls due to population. Immediately, however, it became obvious that the gap in services in the towns of Coeymans and New Scotland would pose problems.

"We had this big canyon in the middle. They didn't want to have anything to do with the program, didn't want to pay into it," said Wood. "So we start doing good care, we have three paramedics on shift." He said it quickly became common knowledge that volunteer emergency services in the areas served by the county paramedics program had dramatically improved.

In one of the worst instances related to that gap in services, Wood refused to send a paramedic to a pediatric cardiac event. He was nearly fired for the decision. "It was very unpopular. I took a lot of heat for that," he said. "Fortunately, I had a level head." (While Guilderland responded to the call, the infant, found at the bottom of a pool, did not survive.) "You could have had ten paramedics there," he said. Wood said he got no criticism for refusing a call for a middle aged cardiac arrest four days earlier.

"I'm not playing God," he said. "Either we're going to go or we're not going to go. So that sort of forced them to take a look and realize that maybe they wanted a piece of the pie too, because these other guys were getting better care."

"So, from '98 on, we've just been providing paramedic-level care," said Wood. "The relationship that we have is simple. We take the cost of the program and we divide it up based on the population, so the Town of Bethlehem has 57.6 percent of the total population of

the six towns and they pay 57.6 percent of the total bill. Rensselaerville has, like, 4.2 percent of the total population, so they pay 4.2 percent.

“Is the level of care as good in Rensselaerville as it is here? No. Do they have access to the same resources? Certainly. The way the program is structured: if there are six cardiac arrests here in the Town of Bethlehem, I can pull the three Bethlehem paramedics, I can pull the one out of Coeymans, I can pull the shift commander [at the Clarksville station],

and, god forbid, I can pull the one off the hilltowns.”

Around 2003, Delmar EMS, then still part of the Delmar Fire District, found that it was again having problems with staffing. Volunteers were increasingly unavailable for weekday shifts and a decision was made to switch to a hybrid staffing model to meet the needs of the community. To cover the costs of paying some daytime staff, Delmar EMS cut ties with the Delmar Fire District in 2010 to incorporate as a nonprofit, which allowed it to take

health insurance payments for services.

Five years ago, Delmar and Bethlehem EMS agencies combined to provide improved coverage to the entire town.

Currently, the agency is predominantly staffed by volunteers from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. every night. Approximately 70 volunteer EMTs, advanced EMTs, paramedics, and ambulance drivers respond to calls for medical assistance. Between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., paid EMTs from the Albany County Sheriff’s Office EMS Unit supplement the volunteers by staffing three of six DBEMS ambulances.

“We’re one of the strongest ambulance

corps in the area because of this model,” said DBEMS Chief Steve Kroll. “We frequently provide assistance to other communities.”

Each 911 call in Bethlehem is answered with a dual response — a Delmar-Bethlehem EMS ambulance and an Albany County Sheriff’s Office EMS Unit Paramedic. The Albany County Sheriff’s Office stations at least two paramedics in the Town of Bethlehem 24 hours a day, seven days a week. As DBEMS is also an advanced life support (AEMT) agency (meaning it can provide licensed paramedics), the two agencies often collaborate to provide care on other local calls requiring advanced life support.

“We don’t have the same relationship with other

agencies as we do with Delmar-Bethlehem,” said Wood. “We meet once a month, probably more, and, for sure, talk once a week. It’s that back and forth communication that allows all of us to provide the level of care that we do here in Bethlehem.”

Comparing the DBEMS model to other local agencies that are fully paid, Wood said there is essentially no difference. “As long as you have the same standards, as long as standards are high, you can’t tell the difference.

“It’s pretty well known that this agency here. . . it just works,” he said. “They’re maintaining where other places are collapsing in a hurry.”

“New York EMS is in a real crisis in small towns right now,” said

Kroll. “It’s something that, society-wide, we have to deal with. I know the state Department of Health and the governor are very actively thinking about it.”

The hybrid model has saved also DBEMS millions of dollars since the two agencies merged in 2013, and Kroll has been invited to speak about it in struggling communities around the state.

“We’re lucky that we built an economic model that allows us to be financially successful while at the same time providing top-level paramedic care on all calls,” Kroll said.

“Money is a big huge thing,” said Wood. “Anybody who can run an organization like this organization and do it with volunteers is a genius. Many have tried.”

In late 2016, the town applied for federally-funded Transportation Enhancement Program dollars from the New York state Department of Transportation to cover the costs of installing a pedestrian friendly roundabout at the aforementioned intersection and completing sidewalks between Glenmont Elementary School and the intersection of Vagel Lane and Glenmont Road. The town was able to secure a little more than three fourths of the expected \$4.845 million project cost, or \$3.876 million. The remaining cost, approximately \$969,000, will be financed through a bond.

Since federal aid funding of transportation projects requires the town to secure funding for the total amount of the project, the town may be required to finance the entire amount short term. As a result, officials have already prepared a resolution to

that effect—one of four related items the board will consider.

The town's Department of Public Works Engineering Division, along with the Department of Economic Development and Planning, has recommended that the board approve the following:

- A resolution establishing the Town Board as lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act and approving negative declaration regarding significant environmental effects;
- A bond resolution for the full \$4.845 million, pursuant to permissive referendum;
- A resolution authorizing the implementation and funding of design services (provided by Creighton Manning); and
- A resolution approving the project generally, and authorizing Supervisor David VanLuven to execute

any necessary agreements with NYSDOT.

According to NYSDOT, roundabout intersections are safer and more efficient than traditional intersections—and are becoming increasingly common in New York state.

“Communities across New York State have benefited from the construction of roundabouts, which improve intersection safety and reduce vehicle emissions including carbon dioxide,” said New York state Department of Transportation Acting Commissioner Paul A. Karas. “As with all our transportation improvement projects, roundabouts support Governor Cuomo’s effort to boost local economies by providing quick, convenient access to area businesses.”

A roundabout is a circular intersection without traffic signals, which is engineered to maximize safety and minimize congestion. Traffic travels counterclockwise with ramps for incoming traffic to yield.

“[That intersection] was judged to be a serious problem in 2010,” said former Supervisor John Clarkson in April of last year, when the federal funding was announced.

According to documents, a residential survey regarding town improvement priorities conducted all the way back in 2008 indicated that 36 percent of respondents considered construction of a roundabout at that intersection to be a high priority at the time.

“And, it has just gotten worse,” said Clarkson.

According to NYSDOT, roundabouts see a decrease in the severity of crashes, which typically occur at a slow speed and include side swipes and fender-benders, and significantly reduce the chance of deadly head-on or T-bone crashes.

Traffic also flows more freely through roundabouts than at traditional intersections, say state officials, cutting congestion and commute time, and reduced vehicle idling time results in reduced fuel emissions and improved air quality. Roundabouts also eliminate the need for

electricity-powered traffic signals.

Bicyclists are permitted to ride within the roundabout and should follow the flow of traffic, riding in the middle of the lane to prevent being passed or cut off, and using hand turning signals. If bicyclists choose not to ride in the roundabout, NYSDOT recommends dismounting and proceeding as a pedestrian walking their bicycle.

Walkers, runners, and dismounted bikers should always to look before crossing and only cross one direction of traffic at a time. Never cross to the center island.

NYSDOT reminds drivers:

- Watch traffic signs and pavement markings to determine the correct lane to be in before entering the roundabout. Once inside the roundabout, do not change lanes.
- Use the left lane to make left turns and use the right lane to make right turns. Follow signs and markings to determine which lane(s) go straight.
- Traffic in the roundabout has the right-of-way.

• Vehicles wishing to enter should yield at the yield line and look for oncoming traffic on their left.

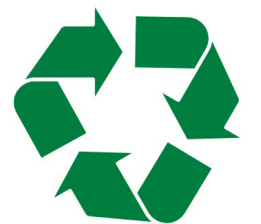
• Enter the roundabout when there is an adequate gap in the circulating traffic flow.

• Always yield to pedestrians and keep crosswalks clear.

• Cars and trucks should yield to bicycle traffic and not pass them.

• As you approach your exit, turn on your right turn signal.

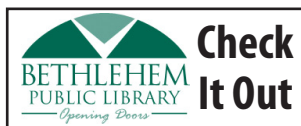

Traffic circle is the right way

One of the better examples of drawbacks to the pace of economic and residential growth in Bethlehem can be found right at Babcock's Corners. That's the intersection where Feura Bush Road meets NYS Route 9W and Glenmont Road, and it is one of the worst for drivers and pedestrians to traverse through.

Longtime residents don't need to think back too far to recall the ease with which drivers could go to and from Glenmont and South Bethlehem on those roads. Outside of the Kmart and Grand Union that once stood at The Shoppes at Town Squire, there were few points of interest to clog traffic.

That intersection, along with several miles of the Route 9W corridor that stretches south from

NYS Route 32 to Beckers Corners, has been the site of incredible development over the past 25 years. The land that was once the Babcock family farm stood vacant until 1990, when another strip mall to rival that of Town Squire was built and helped usher in more housing developments to its south. But, before that time, it was possible for pedestrians to walk along Feura Bush Road to visit Dairy Queen and Grand Union, sans sidewalks, without much threat from motorists.

The state Department of Transportation has taken notice of this growth and the logistics surrounding this troublesome intersection as far back as a dozen years ago, when Bethlehem looked to revisit its Comprehensive Plan. The frequency with which motorists use this intersection has increased along with the same

rate of growth as the houses and businesses that call Glenmont and South Bethlehem home. As a result, the accidents that occur have also increased—to the point that it is now one of the most dangerous intersections in town. Even with sidewalks and traffic lights, the prospect of crossing the street is a dangerous endeavor for pedestrians. There are too many motorists who legally turn right on red, and far too many who illegally travel along the turn lane to bypass those turning across traffic.

Though roundabouts often pose a challenge by themselves, this is a part of town that is in need of such a traffic circle. Drivers often complain, in that some motorists don't know — or don't care to follow — the rules of the road. The headaches such a scenario may cause, however, do not outweigh the need for public

safety. These roundabouts have reduced accident injuries by 75 percent according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, making the decision to construct this roundabout the best direct course for action.

WRGB 'Fake News' message mirrors propaganda

Overdevelopment is rampant in Bethlehem

Letter to the Editor,
Rampant overdevelopment in Bethlehem continues unabated as 1,200 units of housing are under consideration by our town Planning Board. The cumulative detrimental impact on the environment, the character of neighborhoods, the school district, infrastructure, access to clean water, traffic, fire safety and quality of life is ignored by the board. Disregard of our zoning code is commonplace as the board attempts to force inappropriate development down our throats.

For example, the proposal by Greg Biche of Quality Holdings, LLC to build 14 units in two apartment buildings on the 1.06 acres parcel at 224 Delaware Avenue far exceeds the zoning code maximum density allowed of 8 units per acre.

Samuel Fresina, President of the New York State Professional Fire Fighters Association, Inc., and Mike Varno, former City of Albany fire investigator and former Code and Fire Safety Officer for the City of Albany for over 15 years, have testified at board meetings that the site entrance driveway lacks sufficient width for fire apparatus to enter and parking areas have inadequate room for multiple emergency vehicles to maneuver. Also, potential

changes to Delaware Avenue would likely increase response time of emergency personnel and make equipment access more difficult.

Evidence of past petroleum storage and cemetery usage on the parcel was presented but the board has refused to require the applicant to perform his due diligence to thoroughly investigate for contamination or human remains. Instead, the board wasted an unknown amount of taxpayer money having Planning Department staff perform perfunctory investigations on behalf of the applicant.

Over 550 residents signed a petition in opposition to this project and many dozens more have spoken out at numerous board meetings demanding the board deny approval but all have been met with deaf ears and blind eyes. The neighbors were forced to hire an attorney and an engineer to insure true and factual information was presented to the public. Participants at board meetings are never allowed to challenge assertions made by applicants or town employees during the meetings.

This Planning Board chairman does not practice democracy or transparency but merely anarchy. Neighbors throughout town must band

together and oppose overdevelopment in each affected neighborhood by attending meetings and calling or emailing board members in order to stop the destruction of every inch of green space that now remains.

Deputy Majority Leader McLean Lane for the position of majority leader during Thursday night's caucus.

"I just didn't like the way this was done," Fein said, noting that Legislator Joanne Cunningham, Domalewicz' other deputy, was out of the country and said that neither she nor McLean Lane were aware of the plan to remove the majority leader. "If there were disagreements between the chair and the majority leader, I would have liked for us to have discussed those openly at caucus and seen if we could come to any agreements.

"I think Dennis [Feeney] is a great guy," he continued. "And I'm looking forward to working with him as majority leader.

I just don't like the way things went forward. I don't think it needed to be solved in this way."

"I think members have been disillusioned by the current governing style under Gary [Domalewicz]," said Legislator Joe O'Brien. "I think Dennis will strike the right balance with the very diverse caucus: minority members, city, town, suburbs." O'Brien characterized Feeney as "a bright lawyer" and "a gentleman," and said he believes it will be good to have leadership representing part of the county that is outside of the City of Albany.

"I appreciate the support of the Democratic Legislators who selected me to lead our Caucus, and I look forward to working

with our politically diverse members and our staff to advance an agenda that reflects our party's values," said Feeney in a statement.

While Joyce said it was his hope that Feeney would keep Cunningham and McLean Lane on as deputies, McLean Lane said that she turned down the offer and Feeney stated that he will be appointing new deputies in the near future.

"Sometimes, leadership votes focus on disagreements or divisions," said Feeney. "But it's clear after our Caucus that Democratic members are ready to put differences aside and to work together respectfully, especially when we have different opinions. I thank Gary Domalewicz for being gracious and look forward to continuing to serve with him."

"I wish him all the luck," said Domalewicz. "He's going to need it."

Calculated venture

Ambassador Music Group's Andrew Gabriel jumps into burgeoning music scene with both feet

Andrew Gabriel sits for a picture in front of his desk. It's the hub to his music studio. The tools of his trade sit upon its surface in precise symmetry. The flat screen monitor shines with Ambassador Music Group embossed in white against a royal blue field. Below it sits the ivory and ebony keyboard flanked to its left by his daily planner. The distance between the planner and the keyboard is equidistant with the space between the planner and the edge of the desk. His iPhone sits centered in front of it.

The sight implies that a systematic methodology is at play, contrasted by the two unfastened buttons on Gabriel's polo shirt. Perhaps it's a conscious effort to preserve the acoustics in the room. Maybe it's the side product of his years meticulously hitting the right points on the snare drum. Or, it could all be that from a mind molded by applied mathematics at the University of California at Los Angeles. Nonetheless, it is an embodiment of control, something of which he is relinquishing.

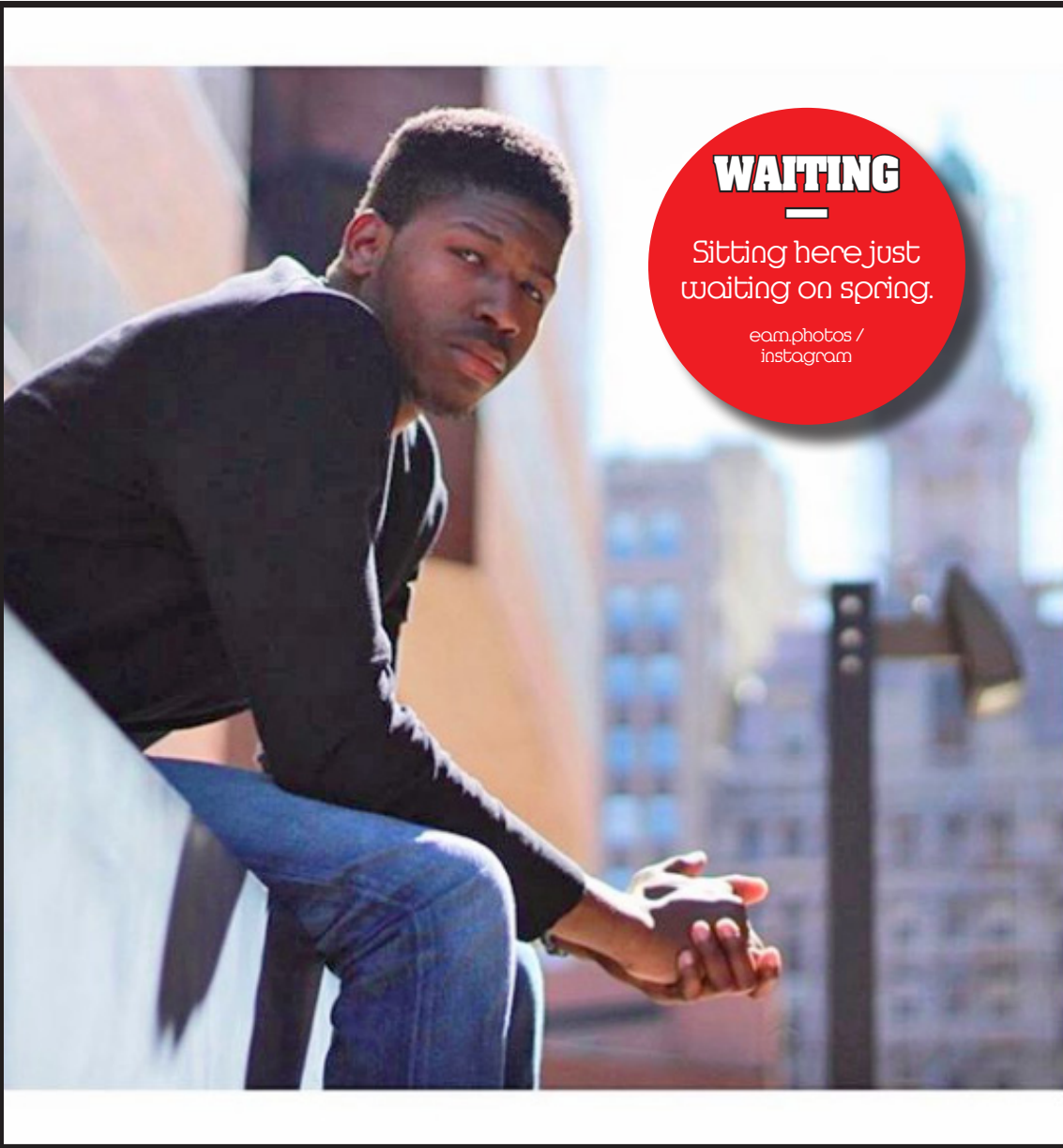

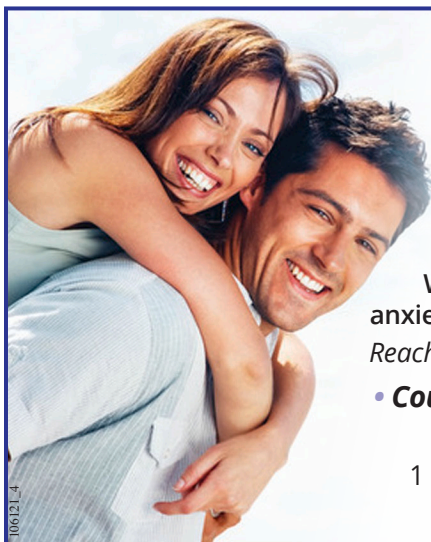

Crab Salad-Stuffed Tomatoes

Here's a quick and tasty weeknight meal. Preparing weeknight meals can be tricky, as busy men and women may want to save money and cook their own healthy foods but have little time to do so consistently.

But healthy, homecooked meals need not take much time to prepare. The following low-calorie recipe for "Crab Salad-Stuffed Tomatoes" from "Weightwatchers: Cook It Fast" (St. Martin's Griffin) can be whipped up in 20 minutes, making it an ideal meal for time-strapped men and women who want homecooked meals without all the work that goes into more complex recipes.

Ingredients: Serves 2

- 1/3 C orzo
- 2 large tomatoes
- 1 C crabmeat, picked over for pieces of shell
- 1/3 C chopped black or green olives
- 2 Tbsp tablespoons crumbled reduced-fat feta cheese
- 2 Tbsp chopped fresh dill
- 2 tsp balsamic vinegar
- 1/8 tsp teaspoon salt
- 1/8 tsp black pepper

Instructions:

Cook orzo according to package directions, omitting salt if desired. Drain and rinse under cold water; drain again. Meanwhile, cut thin slice off tops of tomatoes; reserve tops. Using spoon, carefully scoop out seeds and pulp; reserve for another use. Gently toss together crabmeat, olives, feta, dill, vinegar, salt, and pepper in medium bowl. Spoon crabmeat mixture evenly into tomato shells and cover with reserved tomato tops.

Cook's note: Scoop the seeds and pulp from the tomatoes into a storage container. Cover and freeze up to four months and toss them into a soup or stew.

A chardonnay is fine for this dish, but to step things up a little by adding a little more fruitiness to our meal, we decided to go with a riesling. This riesling out of Mosel provides a fruity flavor that pairs well with our crab dish. 

Shield your eyes

people take steps to prevent sunburns, skin cancer and premature aging, they may fail to consider that UV rays also can damage their eyes.

Just as people protect their skin from the sun, so, too, should they safeguard their eyes. Prevent Blindness America warns that the sun is comprised of UVA and UVB rays. UVA rays may hurt central vision by damaging the macula, or a part of the retina at the back of the eye. UVB rays typically affect the front part of the eye or the lens and cornea. The following are some common eye conditions that can be linked to exposure to UV rays.

long hours at the beach or skiing without proper eye protection. UVB rays cause photokeratitis, and these rays can burn the cornea, potentially causing pain and temporary vision loss.

World Health Organization says that prolonged UV exposure can contribute to this condition. Pterygium may extend over the cornea and reduce vision, requiring surgical removal.

Macular degeneration

According to the American Optometric Association, macular degeneration is a deterioration of the part of the retina that is responsible for sharp, central vision. In addition to UV rays, chronic exposure to shorter-wavelength visible blue and violet light can be harmful to the retina. The sun and many artificial light sources, such as LEDs and smartphones, emit blue light. Some blue light can be beneficial, but some can be harmful to the eyes. Lenses that absorb harmful blue light or block it can prevent retinal damage.

Cataracts

UV exposure also can contribute to the formation of cataracts. Prevent Blindness America says a cataract is a clouding of the eye's natural lens, the part of the eye that focuses the light people see.

Sun protection

Sunglasses should completely cover the eyes, including the skin on the eyelids and under the eye, to provide adequate protection for the eyes. Wraparound frames will offer additional protection to those who spend a lot of time outdoors in bright sunlight. The AOA says sunglasses should also do the following.

- Block out 99 to 100 percent of both UVA and UVB radiation.
- Screen out between 75 and 90 percent of visible light.
- Have lenses that are perfectly matched in color and free of distortion and imperfection.
- Have lenses that are gray for proper color recognition.

Consumers should speak with an eye doctor if they have additional questions about eye protection. Prescription lenses can be tinted and treated to offer UV protection.

Collection of stellar musicians entertain school-night crowd

ALBANY— It was a chill evening for a school night as the Parish Public House prepared to host NYS Music’s presentation of Funk Night on Thursday, April 5.

The headliner was a mash up of local artists from Turkuaz, Kung Fu, the Eric Krasno Band and Wurliday.

The laid back atmosphere was accentuated by the devil may care approach to the start. Only the

instruments stood on stage once the clock struck nine. Each of the musicians were chatting it up at the bar with patrons and fans. No one seemed to

to the band over the past several months. She exhibited that voice singing a few Motown covers. She tied the bow on the whole Wurliday package as the troupe busted into “Getting There” and “Once More” off of “Bedtime Blazer.” Corso is now moving on to pursue other projects. Last month, she announced a duo project with Dan Mayer. The two are currently touring together.

The group stretched out two sets throughout the night, playing a dazzling array of funk music to satisfy a sizable crowd that was enough to fill out the back room of the Parish Public House. Sasser was electrifying on the organ, and the improvisational work throughout the group got people grooving and dancing before the stage. Drabik, who impressed a GE Theatre crowd while playing with the Bryan Brundige Collective at Capital Records last month, continued to amaze an audience with his guitar work from the shadows.

From the back of the room, a member of the crowd took care while taking the show poster down from the wall. He rhetorically asked, “Where were you tonight?” before stuffing the poster in his back pocket.

Bumpin Uglies' 'Beast from the East'

As spring arrives, so does the release of Bumpin Uglies latest studio release "Beast from the East." The 12-track collection dropped earlier this month, just as most of the country begins to wake from its winter slumber, and it's the perfect soundtrack to that ready awakening. Packed full of reggae beats, ska energy and punk attitude, Bumpin Uglies unveils the type of album that's perfect for telling winter to buzz off.

"Beast from the East" marks the band's fourth full length studio album. But more importantly, it also marks the band's first release with keyboardist Chad Wright, whose arrival took the band from trio to quartet when he joined in December 2016. While the album still showcases guitarist and vocalist Brandon Hardesty's trademark catchy songwriting and clever lyrical poeticism, the addition of Wright rounds out the Bumpin Uglies sound. And that is this release's major win.

"Beast from the East" showcases not only the band's growth but also the band's potential. And despite how Hardesty may lament that he doesn't "write songs for the radio" in the aptly titled track "Radio," "Beast from the East" is full of tunes that state otherwise.

The album's lead track "Could've Been Great" switches between edgy guitar riffs and punctuated drums to whimsical reggae cadences with lively keys. In contrast, "Beast from the East" closes with the acoustic soul-searching tune "Optimism in F#." Sandwiched in between these two songs are ten tracks that prove Bumpin

Uglies is more than just a white boy reggae outfit.

"Beast from the East" reveals it has many vastly different sides to this band; all locked, loaded and ready to delight the band's Uglies Nation fanbase while poised to hook new fans along the way.

Prior to the album's release, Bumpin Uglies treated its fans to a smattering of sneak peeks including "All in Stride," "Hard Liquor," "Budtender" and "Crazy." While "All in Stride" showcases Hardesty's ability to write mantra style lyrics that hook you into singing along because you feel like you have been in his shoes, "Hard Liquor" flips you into party mode. It's still a song you want to sing along to, but it's also the kind of song you want to play while hitting the McDonald's drive-thru at 3 a.m. after a night of debauchery.

"City by the Bay" pays homage to the band's Chesapeake Bay roots. The song is subtle, with the punchy horns and mellow timing that takes the listener on a starry-eyed musical journey as Hardesty remembers his past. In contrast "Crazy" rides the upbeat drive of third wave ska tradition while lyrically the song examines the drama and uncertainty of a dynamic romantic relationship.

While much of Hardesty's lyrical content can be described as introspective self-realizations, in tracks like "Apathy" or "Officer O'Herlihy," he doesn't shy away from writing lyrics intend to incite questioning of authorities or provoke insightful thought. We are reminded that "freedom's like a muscle, when not exercised it's lost" as Hardesty encourages the listener to challenge what we are told, educate ourselves, and "read between the

lines."

Beyond the A-plus lyrical content, "Beast from the East" also showcases wonderful song structure, thoughtful musicianship and tasteful songwriting. Bumpin Uglies beautifully melds key elements of reggae, funk, rock, punk, ska and pop while paying homage to the original inspiration. Anchored by the impeccable rhythm section of drummer TJ Haslett and bassist Dave Wolf, the duo lays a solid foundation on which Hardesty and Wright blend a cascade of genres.

Wisely placed vocal harmonies only enhance Hardesty's vocal chops, which sit on top of the band's music like milk and honey. In a time when the world's music charts seem to be engulfed in autotune, mumble and a general lack of diction, Hardesty's rich tone makes you listen. He

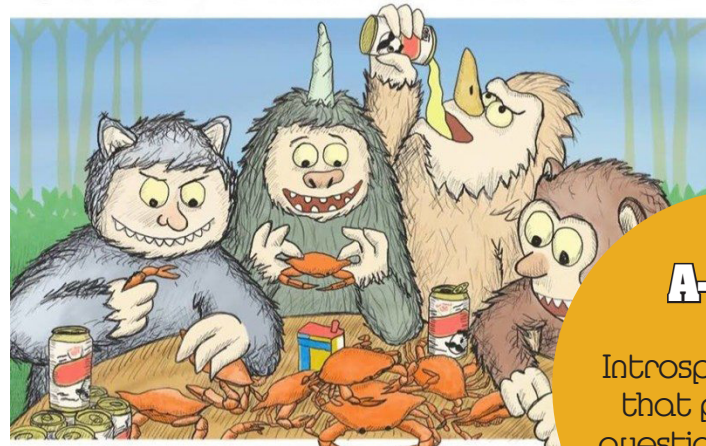
has a point of view and he wants you to hear it.

"Beast from the East" was recorded at the Annapolis Audio labs in Annapolis, Md. The album was produced by Howi Spangler, vocalist and guitarist for the alternative alt-rock outfit Ballyhoo. The album is available for pre-order on iTunes and Spotify.

Haunted Cat's self-titled release 'Haunted Cat'

H haunted Cat released its self-titled 13-track album earlier this year. The album was a solo project developed by Drew Benton. Benton has played with bands like Complicated Shirt and ToUGH in New York's Capital District for fifteen years, and is now working on his own material. The band that stemmed from the advent of this project includes Jason Jette (Complicated Shirt, Moon Worship and Brevator), Brook Degener (Brent Gorton's Band and Better Pills) and Kevin Flansburg (John Rifle). The record was mastered by Jason Loewenstein.

This album kicks off with an 18-second "Phantom of the Opera" like organ passage in "Carfull of Nightmares." Masters of dark synth pop Soviet Dolls strike again with their new EP "Hunters." In a mere four tracks, the Rochester band flaunts their prowess at delivering decadently dark and sensual lyrics shrouded in seductive glittery electronica.

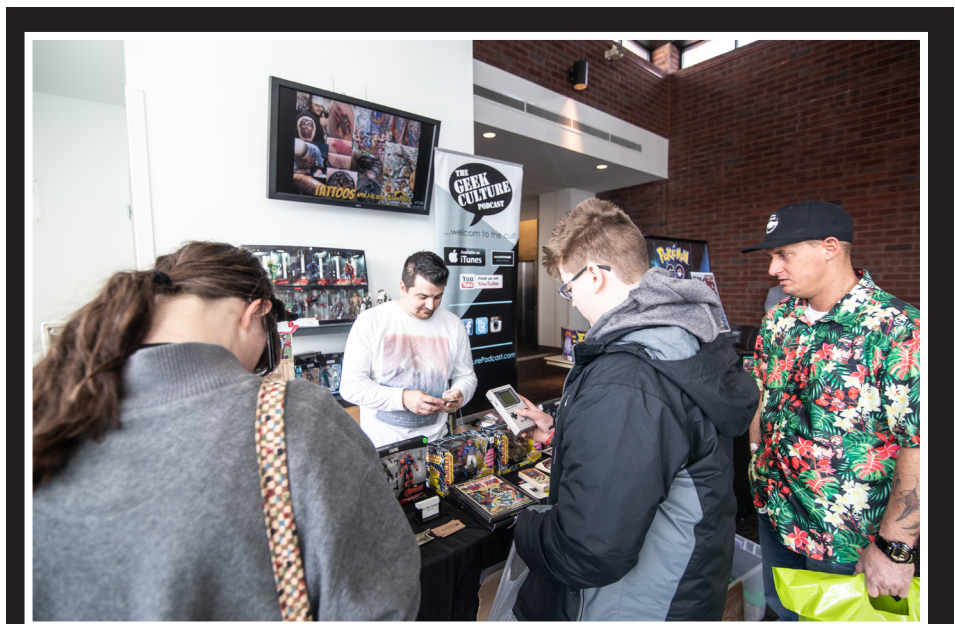

As Gabriel sits down for an interview, he is days away from taking a leap. He is quitting his job to spear headlong into a dream of opening his studio and pursuing a music career; one that, up until this point, was a 12-hour-a-day gig on top of his eight-hour days as an information technology manager for Community First Union. The order of living in the corporate world will be tossed aside, and he is as excited as “a kid who’s a week away from summer break.”

Andrew, and his wife, Rose Gabriel are the marketing and managerial team behind the recent success of local musician Sydney Worthley — who has taken last year’s performance at Tulip Fest and, on the strength of her debut album “Strong,” has moved on to a scheduled appearance at Mountain Jam in June. The Ambassador Music Group also represents local recording artist Michael Razzano.

The Ambassador Music Group is now a full-time endeavor, with a recording studio that caters to musicians and vocal talent. It’s a dream job that Andrew has held on to since his days as a musician in the San Francisco-Los Angeles West Coast megalopolis. Rose describes her husband as “determined.” Tenacious, may be more appropriate. Once Andrew has an idea in his head, Rose said he is determined to see it through.

Since moving from the West Coast more than two years ago, Andrew has

worked his day job as a programmer, and pursued his passion for music in the evening. That passion led him to working relationships with David Bourgeois of White Lake Music & Post studios and WEXT program director Chris Wienk. Ultimately, Andrew worked as an intern at Overit Studios, with the help of Adam Clermont. Andrew shares those names as he describes the Capital District’s music

scene as a “community.”

“The community aspect of the music scene here is unlike anywhere I’ve been,” said Andrew. “It’s unlike Los Angeles. It’s unlike San Francisco Bay area.” The

amount of talent in the area scene is “crazy.” And, unlike the West Coast, the players within it are not fighting each other to gain attention. “The folks that we’ve worked with are always willing to help out. It’s not like cut-throat competition, where folks are trying to sabotage other folks. ... The scene here tries to make the scene grow.”

Last May, Andrew’s first client, Sydney Worthley, took to the Washington Park stage for Albany’s annual Tulip Festival. Outside of talent shows across the Capital District, it was the teen’s first performance before a crowd. She was already at work

writing songs for what would be her debut release “Strong.” For the first time, Worthley could see strangers snapping pictures and capturing videos on their phones as she performed.

Worthley dropped her CD the following September. All 14 of her songs presented within a slick, high-gloss plastic CD cover. Radio play followed, as did an invite to perform at the lineup announcement for Saratoga Springs’ annual First Night. A meeting with WDST-FM in Woodstock opened yet another opportunity. The station organizes one of the largest three-day music festivals in New York. “Sydney would be a good fit for Mountain Jam,” Andrew recalled saying, recognizing the chance to keep momentum moving. Rose recalled it took more persistence than that. That attention to detail, and Worthley’s climb within the local music scene, helped.

The Gabriels hope to take success and pay it back through outreach programs. Last October, the couple helped raise funds and goods to assist the more than 2,800 households victimized by a firestorm that swept through Santa Clara, Calif. AMG delivered more than 3,000 respirators, and raised money to help replace backpacks, jackets, shows and lunch boxes for local school children. That focus to help give others a boost on to their own feet translates back to the Gabriels’ goal for our music scene.

“I think there’s potential for something bigger to happen in the music scene, here, in Albany,” said Rose. “And, we’re on the brink of making it bigger than what it is right now. I think we’re all trying to make it happen.”

Keep in touch with kids at camp

Summer camp is an exciting way for children to spend their extended vacations from the classroom. Camps cater to various interests, including sports, crafts and even technological hobbies.

Children who attend overnight camps may spend several nights away from home. Some kids take this in stride, while others, possibly away from home for the first time, may experience some homesickness. Staying in touch while the kids are at camp can help alleviate fears and show children

their parents care.

Camps now handle communication issues differently than they might have when today's parents were campers. While it once common for campers to send handwritten letters or short missives home to mom and dad, technology has changed that. Today's campers may have access to email accounts, or they even may be allowed to bring mobile phones along. This can facilitate communication, but it also may take away from the camping experience.

Parents need to find a balance between what might be too little or too much contact with campers. After all, camp is kids' chance to grow independent for a few days or weeks.

Learn camp rules

The camp will likely provide information regarding correspondence. Camps may permit parents to send one-way emails and

regular mail, but limit campers to handwritten letters only. Determine if mobile phones are allowed or should be left at home. Knowing the rules can help parents and kids plan accordingly.

Pack supplies

Send kids to camp with fun papers, stickers, pens, and other crafty items. This way they'll be inspired to write home once or twice. Provide brief lessons on how to address an envelope for campers who may not know how.

Check blogs and texts

Some camps may blog about campers' progress, post information on social media or send out mass texts. These messages can reassure parents that their youngsters are doing just fine. Figure out which tech options are available from camp administrators.

Send a care package

Treat the campers to some supplies from home. Pack camp-approved snacks and other reminders of home. Be sure to include enough for the entire cabin and your son or daughter will be the camp star.

Expect some silence

If camp is going well and campers' days are fun-filled, they may be too busy for daily correspondence. Parents may get nervous when they don't routinely see or hear from their children, but chances are everything is going swimmingly.

The camp experience is often harder on parents than children, as campers have their friends and activities to keep them busy. Brief communication helps campers grow more confident and independent.

Get your nose in a book

How to keep kids engaged over school breaks

Children in North America will spend, on average, more than 900 hours attending school in a given year. The average school year in the United States lasts 1,016 hours, the equivalent of 42 continuous days. According to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, many developed countries begin their academic years in September and end them in June. Some, like Australia, feature four terms with two-week breaks in between each term. Others go to school for most of the year — with various holiday breaks in between — and then get the bulk of their time off during the summer.

As much time as kids spend in school, there will be times when they

are left to their own devices, and during these times it's easy for them to forget classroom lessons. Sometimes called "summer learning loss" or "summer slide," this forgetfulness sees many students fail to retain

all of their lessons over prolonged breaks from school. Studies indicate that students score lower on standardized tests at the end of the summer compared to their performance on the same tests at the beginning

of summer. Anywhere from between one to three month's worth of educational achievement can dissipate during prolonged breaks from the classroom. To help ensure that those hard-earned lessons are not so easily forgotten, parents can help children remain intellectually engaged in various ways over school breaks.

Stick to a schedule

Try to maintain a schedule similar to school, with children waking at the same time each day and going to bed at similar hours. This will make it much easier to get back into a routine when a new school year begins.

Encourage reading

Set aside time for reading each day. All it generally takes is 15 to 30 minutes of reading per day for

kids to remember their vocabulary lessons and maintain their fluency and comprehension skills. Children may enjoy picking their own books rather than having a required reading list.

Keep a math book handy

On long car trips or rainy days, children can do a few math problems to keep their skills sharp. This will help keep learning loss to a minimum. Math workbooks may be available at bookstores, or parents can look online or ask a teacher for a summer to-do packet.

Plan educational trips

Vacations and day trips can be fun, entertaining and educational all at the same time. Science centers, museums and living history locations can bring to life information learned in

the classroom, even on family vacations.

Learn at camp

Many children attend camp for a portion of their school breaks. Look for camps that do not simply babysit children, but engage them through enrichment activities

Take a class

Children and families can learn together by exploring new skills. Enroll in something educational and enjoyable, such as a music or dance class, a STEM seminar or something else that engages the mind and body. This gives everyone a chance to learn something new and have a great time together as a family.

Parents and educators can reduce lesson loss over school breaks by encouraging families to remain intellectually engaged in any way they can.

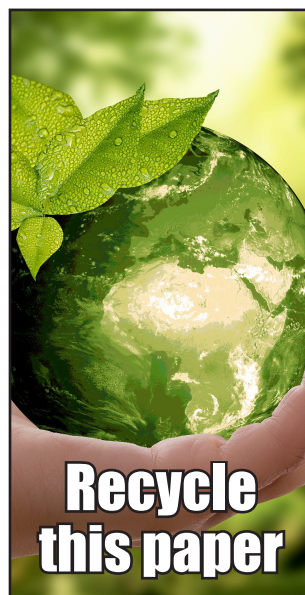

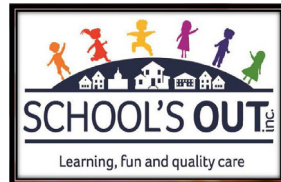
