



National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is Saturday

BETHLEHEM/GUILDERLAND—The Bethlehem Police Department is once again teaming up with the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Administration for a drug take back day.

The event is scheduled to take place this Saturday, April 28, in the front parking lot of Elm Avenue Park, located at 261 Elm Ave. in Delmar from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. People will be able to anonymously discard their unwanted drugs into an approved container from their vehicle; no questions asked.

Please note that sharps will not be accepted. Participants are also asked not to arrive until 10 a.m.

The Guilderland Police Department and Guilderland Public Library are also teaming up for this one-day effort to remove potentially dangerous controlled substances from local homes.

Between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., the public can surrender expired, unwanted, or unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications to law enforcement officers for destruction at the library, located at 2228 Western Ave., in Guilderland. Medications may be discarded of in their original containers (remove identifying information prior to arrival) or in bulk directly into the disposal box.

The library cannot accept medications prior to the event. Please note that syringes and sharps will not be collected during this event.

Traffic stop results in drug charges

BETHLEHEM—On Tuesday, April 17, at approximately 3:50 p.m., state police stopped a vehicle on I-87 in the Town of Bethlehem for a moving violation. During the interview of driver



Jose E. Bonilla, age 48, of Rotterdam Junction, for the traffic violation, probable cause to search the vehicle and its occupants was reportedly established and Bonilla was allegedly found to be in possession of approximately seven grams of cocaine and three pills identified as

Clonazepam. He was taken into custody, transported and processed at the Albany state police station, where he was subsequently charged with: criminal possession of controlled substance in the fourth degree, a class C felony; two counts of criminal possession of controlled substance in the seventh degree, a class A misdemeanor; controlled substance not in original container, a violation; and a traffic violation.

Bonilla was arraigned in the Town of Bethlehem Court on the same day.

Passenger arrested for drug possession

COEYMANS-On Friday, April 20, at approximately 9:19 p.m., state police stopped a vehicle on I-87, in the town of Coeymans for a reported vehicle and traffic violation. During the interview of the driver, probable cause to search the vehicle and its occupants was reportedly established

and the passenger, Elizabeth Peralta, 38, of the Bronx, found to be in possession of approximately



10.6 grams of bath salts, one gram of cocaine and four baggies containing approximately 50.6 grams of marijuana. Also reportedly located were nine separate controlled substance pills not in their original containers.

Peralta was taken into custody, transported and processed at the state police station in Albany. She was subsequently charged with: criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree, a class B felony; criminal possession of controlled substance in the fifth degree, a class D felony; nine counts of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree, a class A misdemeanor; criminal possession of marijuana in the fifth degree, a class B misdemeanor; and controlled substance not in original container, a violation.

Peralta was arraigned in the Town of Coeymans Court and remanded to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$40,000 cash or bond. She was set to return to court on Tuesday, April 24.

Man arrested following robbery

Accident sends three to Albany Med

One driver charged with operating a vehicle while ability impaired by drugs

BETHLEHEM—A man allegedly driving while ability impaired by drugs caused a serious accident at the intersection of Glenmont and River roads on Tuesday, April 17. The incident occurred about 40 minutes before he was due in court to answer to a previous DWAI by drugs charge stemming from a March arrest.

According to the State Police, Russell Schwimmer of Glenmont was arrested on March 16 after troopers responded to a report of a suspicious person in Bethlehem.

New York State Police allegedly found Schwimmer in possession of amphetamine and dextroamphetamine pills and determined he was driving after taking the stimulants. Results from standardized field sobriety tests conducted at the scene indicated he was driving while impaired and he was arrested.

He was set to answer those charges in Bethlehem Town Court at 4 p.m. on Tuesday, April 17, said Bethlehem Cmdr. Adam Hornick.

At about 3:18 p.m. on that same day, he allegedly blew threw a stop sign while driving on Glenmont Road and crashed into a Volkswagen driven by Sarah Dujack, a 27-yearold from Selkirk who was travelling south on River Road.

Dujack and her two passengers, a 4-year-old and a 5-month-old, were taken to Albany Medical Center Hospital for minor injuries.

Schwimmer was extricated from his blue Ford Focus by Selkirk firefighters and transported to Albany Medical Center with serious injuries. Based on the

investigation, according to Hornick, Schwimmer was charged with DWAI by drugs, failure to yield the right of way at an

intersection and unlawful possession of marijuana. Additional charges are

pending. He was due back in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, May 1 at 5:30 p.m. While Schwimmer was represented by attorney Derek Hogan on the State Police arrest, it is unclear whether he has as an attorney for the latest charges.

The crash remains under investigation and police are requesting anyone who witnessed the crash contact them at (518) 439-9973.

GUILDERLAND-

On Tuesday, April 17, The Guilderland Central School District Board of Education adopted a \$100.9 million budget proposal for the 2018-19 school year, which is an approximately \$2.4 million increase, or 2.48 percent over the current year.

If approved by voters in May, it would result in a 2.22 percent tax levy increase in the coming year-just below the district's maximum allowable tax levy limit of 2.23 percent. Due to projected assessment growth within the district, tax rates are estimated to increase by 1.97 percent for residents of the school district.

Under the proposed levy, district residents in the Town of Guilderland would

reserve fund balance, which is currently at \$3.9 million, according to GCSD Assistant Superintendent of Business Neil Sanders.

The proposed budget would maintain current academic programming at all three levels, provide additional staffing for reading to support students at the elementary level, provide additional classroom teachers at the elementary level to maintain class sizes within guidelines, and add a second permanent building substitute for Guilderland High School. It would also create a new American Sign Language elective at Guilderland High School, and restore two Advanced Placement courses in English and Computer Science.

The proposed budget would also create a schoolbased mental health clinic, in partnership with Capital Region BOCES and Parsons Child and Family Center/Northern Rivers, to serve Guilderland students and their families, and provide funding for additional special education teachers at the high school and elementary levels "to support co-teaching."

Ôn Tuesday, May 15, district voters will also decide on a ballot proposition and elect Board of Education members.

The ballot proposal is for the purchase of new school buses and equipment at a

total cost of \$1,117,700. The purchase would include eight 66-passenger buses, one 60-passenger wheelchair bus, one transportation minivan, and one large track mower to be used for district maintenance. The new buses will replace vehicles that are 11 years old and have logged an average of 130,000 miles each. Approximately 50 percent of the bus purchase would be returned to the district in the form of future state aid, according to the district, reducing the cost to local taxpayers by \$532,600. The new mower would replace a 2003 model used for mowing at all seven school locations. The entire cost of the purchase would be bonded and paid back

over five years beginning in the 2019-20 school year. Voters will select four board members to fill three 3-year terms and one

2-year term. For complete biographies on all four candidates, please visit www.guilderlandschools. org. The candidate with the lowest total of votes will fill the 2-year term.

Additionally, a "Meet the Candidates" night will be held on Wednesday, May 9, at Guilderland High School, 8 School Road, Guilderland Center.

Voting will take place between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Tuesday, May 15, at all district elementary schools.

EDUCATION **BCMS students receive detention** for participating in 4/20 walkout

BETHLEHEM—A handful of Bethlehem Central Middle School students received in-school suspensions after participating in a nationwide walkout organized in the aftermath of the shooting at Marjory Stoneman High School in Parkland, Fla.—held on the 19th anniversary of the shooting at Columbine High School.

According to 8th grader Aliza Cotton, while the few students who chose to demonstrate were aware that there would be likely repercussions, they were unsure what form that might take.

However, neither Aliza nor her parents are upset with the district, which all three believe handled the situation with respect.

Aliza explained that she felt administrators were fair when they insisted on consequences for walking out of class and said she still felt that both teachers and administrators were supportive of the stand that she and her classmates were taking.

Dan Cotton, Aliza's father, said he spoke to his daughter about her motivation. "One of the reasons that she walked out is that she doesn't want the issue to disappear from the public consciousness," he said, noting that an apparent lack of messaging and diminished participation in the most recent post-Parkland demonstration could be an indication that the national conversation may already be losing steam.

Cotton's parents, both of whom work in education, expressed pride at the fact that their daughter was willing to face the consequences to reinforce and reinvigorate a movement that has been championed by students across the country after young survivors in Parkland Fla. took to the national stage to say, "Never

Again."

Since the Columbine High School shooting in 1999, at least 193 schools-more than 187,000 students-have experienced a shooting during school hours, according to a Washington Post analysis that looked at data from April 1999 through March 2018. During that time, The Post found an average of 10 shootings a year, with the most, 15, occurring in 2014.

"Less than 3 months into 2018," states a March article, "there have been 11 shootings, already making this year among the worst on record."

While Aliza said she feels safe attending class at Bethlehem Middle School, she added, "There are a lot of people that feel that there needs to be a change and this can't keep happening again."

'She definitely has a strong sense of compassion for her fellow human, her strong sense of justice comes out when she feels that people are being mistreated, or misunderstood, or put in harm's way," said Katie Yezzi, Aliza's mother, "and I think she feels that in this instance.'

Of the school's response, Katie said, "They followed through with a consequence, but not a punishment. They supported her right to demonstrate, and she knew going in — and we discussed it with her — that there were potential consequences."

Both of Cotton's parents, individually, reiterated a quote by education expert Robert Pondiscio: "A school-sanctioned protest is a field trip," and both agreed that, to make a statement, sometimes it's necessary to break the rules.

'We think it is about guns," Aliza Cotton said. "Bullying is an issue, but it's not the issue. It's about access to guns." She said that, while she was only joined by three other students on Friday, she feels most of her

classmates support the stand they were taking. A few, she said, took part in the demonstration organized by BCHS senior Lydia Martell at the state Capitol, where Marjory Stoneman survivors spoke and demonstrators staged a lie-in.

Prior to walking out for 13 minutes (in remembrance of the 13 who died in the Columbine shooting), Aliza told her teacher and school administrators. At 10 a.m., along with students across the country, she walked out of class, met with her codemonstrators in the school cafeteria, and walked out of the building to observe 13 minutes of silence. Upon re-entering the building, the students were met by an administrator and taken to in-school suspension.

"Part of the history of protest," said Dan Cotton, "is that you willingly accept the consequences of speaking up for your position. So, for us, that was very much part of the learning and experience. And we have no problem with that. I think it makes the decision to do it that much more a decision of conscience on Aliza's part."

He said that the students were allowed to complete their schoolwork, and that the school made it clear that repercussions were not meant to be punitive.

"Advancements are achieved by individual people making individual choices along with other people to create movements and so it's important for us that she know she has a voice and that she wants to use it in the service of making the world a better place," said Dan Cotton.

"I know that I will always use my voice to speak up for what I believe in," said Aliza, who has been writing to her state and federal representatives as well. "I'm hoping that people will take notice, the ones with power. I'm hoping we can get more gun legislation passed."

One candidate, two open seats on BCSD Board of Ed

DELMAR — On Tuesday, May 15, residents of the Bethlehem Central School District will have the opportunity to elect two members of the Board of Education to three-year terms that begin July 1, 2018.



While there are two open seats on the Board of Education, only one candidate, Christian Myer, filed a petition by the deadline. Therefore, any resident who meets the qualifications of being a board member – at least 18 years of age, is a United States citizen who is able to read and write, and has been a resident of the district for

at least the last year – may be elected as a write-in candidate. If there are no write-ins then the seat is deemed vacant and is subject to being filled either by a special election or by board appointment until the date of the next annual election.

With only one declared candidate, the League of Women Voters will not be holding its annual Meet the Candidates Night that had been scheduled for May 1.

BCSD mourns longtime aide

DELMAR — District officials recently announced the passing of one of its longtime aides.

Paul Moylan, a 15-year employee within the district's Special Education and Student Services Department, died unexpectedly on the weekend of April 14. He was employed at the high school where he worked closely with students and was a test coordinator who helped ensure every student was provided the opportunity to demonstrate his or her knowledge or mastery of a course.

"As one of our department's paraprofessionals for many years, Mr. Moylan worked closely with our students helping them become more independent and find success at school," said SESS Director Kathy Johnston. "He had an easy rapport with the high school students he worked with and is being remembered by them today as someone who had great respect for students in the classroom and who was easy to talk to. He will be greatly missed."

Moylan is survived by his wife, Jackie, and his daughter, Sarah.

Voorheesville CSD residents to vote on \$24.7 million budget

VOORHEESVILLE—On Tuesday, April 17, the Voorheesville Central School District Board of Education approved a 2018-19 budget of \$24,718,575-an increase of \$531,052, or 2.19 percent, from the current year.

While the estimated tax levy is \$17,662,147, a 2.50 percent increase from 2017-18, it still falls below the statemandated tax cap of 2.78 percent.

'We included the elimination of three positions due to retirements to save expenses," said VCSD Superintendent Brian Hunt. "In all three cases, the job duties of those positions will be redistributed among existing employees," adding that the cuts do not have a direct impact on student instruction.

The three positions that will be eliminated following retirement are a business office secretary, a computer teacher and a teaching assistant.

"The NYS aid increase was only 1.7 percent, and our tax levy increase is 2.5 percent, below the 2.78 percent [statemandated tax cap] for the district," explained Hunt. "The budget preserves our core instructional programs."

The 2018-19 proposed budget would increase spending for distance learning by \$23,500, to allow students to take classes that the district is unable to offer including Introduction to Computer Programming; JAVA Programming; Italian 1; Mandarin Chinese 1; Sign Language 1; and Sports History.

In addition to the budget, district voters will also be asked to weigh in on three ballot proposals and elect two board members.

Incumbent board members, Vice-President Cynthia Monaghan and Michael Canfora, are both running unopposed for re-election to another four-year term.

The Propositions

Bus Purchase Proposition: VCSD is proposing to purchase one 65-passenger International School Bus and one 28-passenger TransTech School Bus for a cost not to exceed \$178,000.

The district intends to auction off Bus #103 (59 passenger), which has more than 111,200 miles and Bus 114 (28 passenger), which has more than 133,100 miles. According to VCSD, the district

runs buses for 10 to 13 years, as they must continuously meet stringent state Department of Transportation inspection requirements. The new buses will be paid for with a five-year Statutory Installment Bond and the district will receive state funding for the bus purchases over those five years for approximately 56 percent of the cost.

Capital Reserve Fund: A Capital Reserve Fund is a voter-approved fund that school districts set up for a long-term capital improvement project. While the account allows districts to contribute up to \$10 million on an annual basis, the money accumulated can only be used for a large building project or renovation.

Explaining that the Capital District Regional Planning Commission projected district enrollment to grow by 168 students over the next five years, Hunt said, "We can handle that within our existing buildings, but if enrollment were to grow more in the out years, the district might have to consider building additional instructional space. The new capital reserve will help prepare us for that."

RAVENA-The Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Board of Education

approved a proposed budget of \$47.7 million for the 2018-19 school year.

The proposal calls for a \$1,908,942 spending increase and a tax levy

If the proposed plan is approved by voters, RCS would continue all current programs and services, and would enhance school security, increase instructional support for at-risk students and offer better mental health and social emotional supports for all students.

The plan would reallocate some staff members to meet the growing STEAM initiatives in the elementary schools. It will also allow educators at the middle and high school to identify spaces for future alternative learning environments.



Answering the call

DBEMS, set to kick off May fundraising effort to furnish new home, hopes to add new recruits to its ranks as well

Editor's Note: This is the third in a three-part series regarding Delmar-Bethlehem EMS, which is celebrating the fifth anniversary of a merger that joined first responders from the northern and southern parts of Bethlehem.

BETHLEHEM — The Delmar-Bethlehem EMS squad will kick off its fourth annual fundraising campaign next month. Conducted through the mail, it is the only active fundraising the non-profit organization does, despite saving taxpayers millions of dollars since the Delmar and Bethlehem EMS services combined forces five years ago.

The annual campaign is held in May to coincide with National EMS Week, which takes place during the third week of the month.

"This year's theme is going to be 'Stronger Together," explained DBEMS Chief Steve Kroll, "and that's apropos because that's what we've gone through in this community."

According to Kroll, Bethlehem residents were responsive the first three years that DBEMS sent out mailers, with donations making up around five percent of the budget. However, as the north station will soon be moving into its new home, he said, "this year will be really important."

While the town is footing the \$4 million cost of building a new station at 114 Adams St. in Delmar on town-owned property, DBEMS will have to find the money to outfit the new building.

"It's going to be an excellent, brand-new building," said Kroll, "but we're going to have to

He said the squad will need to install a generator and an information technology system, as well as a security system to keep both staff and equipment safe. Money raised this May will help to make the new space "habitable," he said.

The town and DBEMS have long known the agency needed to find a new home. Since splitting from the Delmar Fire Department in 2010, the EMS agency has continued to rent space at 145 Adams St. However, it has slowly been displaced as the fire department continues to grow. While DBEMS still keeps both ambulances in fire bays, its personnel have moved into a rented house across the street where an extra emergency vehicle is kept outside. In cold weather, said Kroll, that vehicle must be kept constantly running constantly to keep emergency supplies at required temperatures. In addition, he said, there is no space to store files which are currently "in basements all over town."

"Everything will be where it belongs in the new space," he said, smiling. "We're not really

a celebration crowd," said Kroll, explaining that DBEMS has not planned a fifth anniversary celebration nor an eventbased fundraiser. "Lots of friendships are built here, we have people who have met their future spouse that more than 40 percent of the EMS corps is made up of women. He said that fostering diversity is something his organization takes pride in, and that DBEMS members respect and appreciate each other.

"Everybody treats you the same," said DBEMS Captain Jen Kerr. Growing up in a family that was active in Delmar EMS, Kerr said it was simply natural to her to donate her time as well. "This is home," she said with a smile.

In each station, there are three bunk rooms to accommodate a medic and two-person ambulance crew on shift. While the doors lock, it's far more common to find staff socializing in the station's common areas between calls.

Kerr joined the agency at the age of 18. After completing her classroom EMT training, she began training on an actual ambulance. From there, she said, she worked her way up to crew chief. As captain, she is now DBEMS' second-in-command.

"We've done a great job of having women in all levels of our leadership," she said. "Our board, our operational leadership is, I would venture to say, even half female. So we have a lot of feminine voices across leadership, which is really nice. I don't think that we really have any barriers for women."

Male or female, Kerr recommends volunteering to anyone who is interested in learning about emergency care, gaining more experience in the field or sharing skills they've already acquired.

Experience, Kroll said, is one of the reasons that volunteers are drawn to DBEMS.

"If you want to learn how to be an EMT, this is the place to go," he explained. "We get 10 or 11 calls each day. If you come here, you're going to get experience. If you're in a small town, you may only get three calls a week. This is a profession where experience builds on your skills.

"We get people from



pre-med and want experience, nurses, physical therapists."

Kroll said it also makes it easier to attract volunteers when you already have volunteers. In EMS organizations that are stretched thin, a prospective volunteer would be making a considerably larger commitment.

In 2010, after experiencing difficulty keeping daytime shifts staffed for several years, Delmar EMS made the decision to switch to a hybrid staffing model in which some responders are paid staff and others are volunteer. It is a model DBEMS has maintainedand is a big part of the reason that it is able to pay for quality training and equipment, which also attract potential volunteers.

According to Albany County EMS Captain Brian Wood, who works closely with DBEMS to supply paid county paramedics and coordinate shared EMS services, there is little animosity between those who donate their time and those who are compensated. In fact, he said, there are some who do both.

"First of all, we wouldn't put up with it," he said. "But, really, this is just a great group of dedicated individuals who go into some really tough situations together. You have to trust each other."

EMS volunteers do not need to have careers in the medical field—many, including Kerr, do not-or go to school for years. Other than completion of an initial EMT classroom course, paid for by the state and DBEMS, and subsequent field training required before a responder can go on calls, volunteers can choose the extent of additional time and training they want to invest. There are different levels of EMT training: basic requires approximately 150-190 hours of training; advanced EMT certifications are available at intermediate and "critical care" levels, which require a greater time investment; and an advanced EMT paramedic certification can require as much as 1200 hours of training, but allows the responder to perform a wider range of potentially life-saving techniques. (DBEMS sends a paramedic out on every call.)





While Kroll asks volunteers to commit to one shift a month, he said most work six hours a week or 24 hours in a month. He hopes to recruit more volunteers, he said, "because then we'll be able to do other things, like get out into [the] community and teach CPR and first aid." He also predicts that population growth will soon necessitate a third overnight ambulance crew.

Benefits of the job, Kroll noted, are not limited to experience and flexible schedules, or to the social interactions between members, but include interactions with community members as well—even those who may be in need of their help.

"There's nothing like walking into the room and seeing someone's WWII certificates of meritorious service," he said, "and you realize that these are the people who made our country great."

Asked what she likes best about working with DBEMS, Kerr said, "Being able to help the community I grew up in."

"When people call us, they're having a bad day," said Kroll, who tries to instill his new recruits with the same compassion. When someone needs you, remember that they're having a bad day. I think we do it because we like doing good things for the community.


"And I have a family," he added. "I would want someone to show up at my house."

The home team came in second with 90.5 and Colonie finished third with a combined score of 74.75.



average U.S. household spends just about 13 percent of its monthly budget on food. Parents who examine their spending habits over the previous year can look at how much they're devoting to food and find ways to reduce that figure if it's well over 13 percent. Reducing food spending may require more savvy spending at the grocery store, including shopping sales or buying certain items in bulk when it's advantageous to do so.

Transportation

Parents may find this odd, but the BLS reports that the average U.S. household spends more of its monthly budget (roughly 17 percent) on transportation than it does food. Parents who want to trim their monthly budgets can opt for more

affordable cars and trucks, reserving their splurging on luxury vehicles for later in life when their kids have moved out of the house.

Miscellaneous expenses

When creating their household budgets, parents should leave room for unexpected miscellaneous expenses, such as healthcare costs if the children get sick and clothing and entertainment. Without accounting for such expenses, parents may find themselves taking on potentially crippling debt in times of emergency.

Carefully constructed household budgets can help parents survive the often expensive costs of raising a family.

transportation for summer symposiums for students transitioning from eighth to ninth grades.

• Continuing investment in expanding student access to instructional technologies with the purchase of 300 Chromebooks.

The school budget vote will take place on Tuesday, May 15, at Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk High School, 2025 Rte. 9W, Ravena. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

In addition to the budget, voters will also decide on a proposition to purchase six new buses as part of the district's long-term bus replacement plan and fill three seats on the Board of Education.

The school bus replacement plan

at RCS is a long-term program that seeks to maintain a fleet where the average age of a bus does not exceed 10 years. To continue the program, the district is asking voters to consider the purchase of six new buses at an estimated cost not to exceed \$720,463.92. The proposed purchase includes four 65-passenger diesel buses with cameras, air conditioning and five-year extended warranties at a cost not to exceed \$122,446.81 each; and two 65-passenger gasoline buses with cameras, air conditioning and five-year extended warranties at a cost not to exceed \$115,338.34 each.

Transportation Director Jennifer Houck said that a newer fleet, managed by an experienced team of mechanics, has resulted in a 96 percent passage rate on Department of Transportation inspections.

The state would reimburse the district for 57 percent of the purchase,

or \$410,664, over five years. The district would pay for the remaining cost, \$309,799 using short-term bond anticipation notes, paid off over five years from the general fund.

On May 15, residents will also vote to fill three seats on the Board of Education. Candidates will be elected to three-year terms beginning July 1. Candidates will appear alphabetically on the ballot: Howard Engel III, Kristin Hill-Burns, Taknika Mickey, Edward Reville. More information about the candidates can be found on the district website at rcscsd.org.

Residents will also vote on the RCS Community Library budget and elect two trustees. The library has a proposed budget of \$580,000 for the 2018-19 fiscal year, an increase of \$10,090 from the current year. The two candidates seeking election to the library board of trustees are Laurel Dickerson and Sheila Schwartz.

Our toughest intersection

ur town has countless of bad intersections. Some are as easily to point out, such as Adams Street and Delaware Avenue. Others are the few remaining intersections without four-way stop signs near Hamagrael Elementary in Delmar. None of these intersections are as dangerous as turning on to a road leading to drug addiction.

According to the Addiction Center, there are more than 20 million people in America over the age of 12 who are going through addiction. Astonishingly, that number excludes tobacco. What's most alarming is how this figure includes young teenagers, children. But, what also needs to be pointed out is that more than 90 percent of addicts start drinking, smoking or using illicit drugs before the age of 18.

Our community is no stranger to addiction and there is no socio-economic demographic immune to the behaviors that lead to it.

There was a recent accident in Glenmont. Two cars collided at the intersection of Glenmont and River roads. A one-stop intersection just outside the Albany City Line where the speed limit drastically reduces from 55 mph. Residents familiar with the intersection immediately responded to how dangerous the

one-stop intersection was. The fact that two children were involved in the crash— one infant and another 4-years-old — struck a chord with readers. Then, police releasing more information.

Without casting

innocent until proven guilty, the information shared by local police reminds us of how dangerous a choice it is for people to get behind the wheel while judgement is impaired, whether that be by alcohol, illicit or

prescription

drugs, or

of the weight behind that privilege. Quite literally, that right weighs no less than 4,000 pounds.

Our automobiles are nothing more but aerodynamic blocks of plastic, glass, aluminum and steel full of highly combustible oil and gasoline. We seldom consider, or often scoff at the thought, that while traveling twice the speed of any human on foot, these machines are piloted death traps. What keeps them from causing harm is that everyone on the road is maintaining a healthy appreciation of this fact.

We do not know if the driver was impaired by drugs or distracted by other means, that's to be decided by the courts. But, should this be true, it would be just one of more than 9 million people who have reportedly drove while under the influence of drugs. Across the nation, drugs were present in a staggering 43 percent of drivers involved in fatal accidents - 36 percent had marijuana, while nine percent tested

positive for amphetamines. Addiction is something that should be handled with patience and compassion. It's a level of care that often must be addressed by experts outside of the family unit. But, when addiction leads to decisions that harm other people, or the life of a child, there is little room for patience. If you are one of those people who carelessly chooses to get behind the wheel after drinking alcohol or taking drugs, stop right now and get help.

2018-19 proposed library budget

B ethlehem Public Library has a proposed budget of \$4.2 million for the 2108-19 fiscal year. The levy portion of the budget comes in at about \$3.9 million, an increase of 2.78 percent over last year and within the statemandated spending cap.

With the proposed spending plan, the library strikes a balance between new and core responsibilities with a greater allocation of funding for the materials line, allowing for the ongoing purchase of movies and books – in print and digital formats – and providing a boost to the Library of Things collection.

Salary and general operations costs remain largely stable, with a small increase to the furniture and equipment line to accommodate some planned service enhancements.

"The 2018-19 budget is based on actual lending data and allows us to



remain flexible in serving the needs of the community while staying within the state-mandated tax cap," said library director Geoffrey Kirkpatrick.

A detailed budget chart is available in the May/ June issue of the Footnotes newsletter and online at bethlehempubliclibrary.org.

Bethlehem Central School District residents will vote on the budget Tuesday, May 15, from 7 a.m.-9 p.m. at Bethlehem Central High School.

Also on the ballot are two full-term, five-year seats and one partialterm seat on the board of trustees. The partial seat has a term of three years. Seats will be filled in order of the number of votes received. On the ballot are Caroline Brancatella, Mark Kissinger and Harmeet Narang, all of whom are current trustees on board. An informal Meet the Candidates evening will be held at the library Wednesday, May 2, at 6 p.m.



Summer Ed at Music Hall

Summer education program offered with the City of Cohoes, Cohoes School District

COHOES — City Hall and its neighboring school district, in partnership with the Music Hall Arts Alliance, Park Playhouse and Peak Music, announced a three-week performing arts education pilot program for the summer.

"It is energizing to see these entities come together for the benefit of the arts and children of Cohoes," said Holly Brown, Executive Director of the Music Hall. "I am proud to be a part of this program, and also to be able to share this historic theatre with children and their families. This is an important experience that lasts long after the final showcase performance is over. I look forward to working alongside these professionals to grow arts education in this City and our region,"

The three-week program starts in July and will culminate in a showcase presentation on the stage of the Cohoes Music Hall. Tuition will be free thanks to support from Prime Companies, Pioneer Bank and the Cohoes LDC.

The program's musical theatre curriculum will be designed by the staff of Park Playhouse, and will cover all areas of musical theatre performance, including instruction in dance, acting and voice.

Teaching artists from Park Playhouse and staff from the Cohoes City School District will provide instruction geared to students in fourth through eighth grades. This three-week long pilot program will serve 75 students.

A songwriting and video presentation program, IGNITE Music Passion!, designed by Jeff and Crystal Moore of Peak Music will also be offered. Peak Music, a new business to downtown Cohoes and adjacent to the Music Hall, has developed this program for aspiring singer-songwriters of various ages. "As a small business, we welcome this collaboration with the City and School District. What a great opportunity to mentor and work with the youth of Cohoes to cultivate their creativity while helping them develop skills that will serve them well in their academic and personal lives," Crystal Moore of Peak Music noted. The program will culminate in the screening of a world premiere of a music video featuring a song written and performed by the participating students. The goal of IGNITE Music Passion! is to excite students about the personal and professional transformational qualities of music. Students will spend half-days for one week (three different age groups hosted weekly) working in an age-appropriate, welcoming, supportive, fun, and challenging environment designed to promote creativity, a sense of belonging, community pride, and self-discipline. No musical experience is necessary other than an interest in musical expression. Students will draw on their diverse backgrounds and rich life experiences in the City of Cohoes to compose the featured song.

"This is a great example of community resources working together to engage students with high quality 'hands-on' arts education in our great city. Providing our students with more opportunity to channel their inner creativity is an integral part of development," states Mayor Shawn Morse.

Studies show that performing arts education enhances a child's interpersonal skills, collaborative abilities, and boosts confidence. Additionally, exposure to arts education helps students make sense of their emotions and develop new ways to express themselves.

"This is such a tremendous opportunity for the students of Cohoes. Just last year, we were able to add back band and chorus at our elementary schools. Now, we are forming key partnerships with music professionals to help further inspire our students and strengthen their engagement in the arts," Cohoes Superintendent Jennifer Spring said.

"Music education spurs creativity and this type of collaboration provides academic, social and personal benefits for our students. We feel so fortunate to be forging these partnerships. Few districts have the privilege of having arts professionals in their backyard. Fewer still make connections that offer opportunities for students to experience and participate in the arts," Spring continued.

Podcast Incorporated

Earplug Podcast Network founder turning to studio work

For the better part of a decade, he's been known as a podcaster, taking the digital airwaves as "DW" under his FanBoys, Inc. production. There no longer the need to add an extra nut graph after the word podcaster. People know what one is. After more than ten years since the phenomenon broke out on the internet, microphones are easily found at retail stores. Today, Cloutier is excited over the ABC television sitcom "Alex, Inc." hitting primetime television. It tells the story of an established radio


personality quitting his job to start a new career as a podcaster.

Cloutier has a day job that supplements the passion for his everevolving career as a podcaster. Last year, a partnership with other broadcasters manifested into his Earplug Podcast Network. It's a growing concept within podcasting. It's a go-to place for audiences to find something new, and a hub for podcasters to increase their number of listeners.

[Editor's Note: TheSpot518 produces a podcast called "The Gravy Gig," which is hosted on the Earplug Podcast Network.] "I like giving that full

The giving that full service for someone that's coming in," said Cloutier, who speaks of multiple responsibilities that are associated with a successful podcast, and network. He is the radio personality and the producer. As a graphic designer, he's the network's marketing department. "I was joking with the guys the other day that I need a clone. It's getting overwhelming."

Trying to find an



audience is becoming more difficult for podcasters. In February, Variety Magazine reported that there are more than half a million active podcasts on iTunes, alone. According to Edison Research and Triton Digital survey data, the percentage of podcast listeners in America has increased exponentially over the past ten years. Last year, 40 percent of Americans aged 12 or older have listened to a podcast, and 24 percent have listened to a podcast in the past month — up from just nine percent in 2008.

So, podcasting has developed into a popular outlet for ordinary people to add their voice into the world, much like blogging was in the late 90s, or vlogging was shortly there after. Those vloggers on YouTube ultimately moved to Twitch.tv. The latter has become the most frequented website on the internet, behind Google, Apple and Netflix since it launched in 2011. Though it's more commonly known as an outlet for gamers, artists, cosplayers and musicians often appear as

well. Despite this growth of video broadcasting, Cloutier said audio remains the best way to engage with an ever mobile audience.

"More than 57 million people listen to podcasts," said Cloutier. "And, 64 percent of all podcasts are listened to on smartphones and tablets." It's an argument that holds merit when compared to how other industries are responding to consumer habits.

Car manufacturers have taken notice to how motorists choose their listening entertainment. After more than 30 years, automakers are not installing CD players in cars. Instead, the next option is allows for a more enhanced interface with your cell phone. As cell phone providers have offered friendlier datausage packages over the years, consumers are more likely to listen to podcasts and music streaming services like Spotify. The Pew Research Center found that 53 percent of respondents had used their phone to listen to online radio or a streaming music service in 2012. By 2015, that figure increased to 67 percent, or two out of three people.

Creating a podcast can be as simple as recording one's voice on a smartphone, or be as elaborate as investing in high-end equipment and spending money to purchase rights to broadcast music. Starting this week, Cloutier is opening a studio in Glens Falls to help would-be podcasters levelup on their broadcasts with the use of professionalgrade equipment.

Arugula Risotto

delicious way to use arugula outside of salads or pastas. This recipe uses only one pot and is especially great in early spring or late fall when arugula is abundant. Serves 4 generously as a side.

Ingredients

- 6-8 cups arugula, loosely packed
- 2 cups arborio rice
- 3 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1/2 yellow onion, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup white wine
- 6–8 cups vegetable stock
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 1/4 cup parmesan, grated

Directions

Finely chop the arugula and set aside. In a large saucepan, heat the olive oil over medium heat. Sautee the rice for one minute or until the rice begins to look toasted. Add the onion and cook for an additional minute. Add the wine and stir frequently until most of the liquid is absorbed. Add the vegetable stock 1 cup at a time, stirring almost constantly. With the 5th cup of vegetable stock, add the chopped arugula. Continue to add an additional cup, stirring almost constantly until the rice is cooked through. When the rice is done, remove from the heat and stir in butter and parmesan. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Don't make this mistake

Dan explains why you should mix up your workouts

esterday, I got an email from Lucy, one of our faithful readers. In it, she described how she has been going to the local Big-Box gym for a couple years now spending anywhere from 60 to 90 minutes on the treadmill or elliptical 4 or 5 times a week.

While she saw some results when she first started, over the past few months she doesn't feel she's gotten any better and to quote her: "The scale hasn't moved."

She's not alone in this and I thought it was such an important point that I'd share with all of you.

Smarter not harder

I'm sure you've heard the phase "work smarter, not harder" before. When I worked for companies, it was something I heard in management seminars and meetings almost weekly.

To be fair, it is a fair, pretty relevant statement and when done right can be very powerful in every area of life... including fitness.

A common mistake that I see folks like Lucy make is to up the volume on their training when they hit a rut: "If 90 minutes a day at the gym isn't working, then I'll go to two hours, or three, or four. But, it leads to diminishing returns.

Penatonix's 'PTX Presents: Top Pop, Vol. I'

Matt Sallee's first album with the band showcases 11 new covers

cappella power group Pentatonix released a new album on April 13, which brought 11 new covers from the band. The three-time Grammy winners took on the task of covering popular artists including Ed Sheeran, Luis Fonsi, Bruno Mars, Dua Lipa and Camila Cabello.

Perhaps the most noticeable part of this release is the absence of former member Avi Kaplan, the basso profundo who was part of the core five when the band shot to stardom during season three of "The Sing Off." When he departed the group at the end of 2017 for personal reasons, many fans were skeptical whether the band would actually find a suitable replacement for Kaplan, who was a huge part of Pentatonix's song-writing team.

Pentatonix has since brought on Matt Sallee, a fixture in the a cappella community who has a low voice, a rich tone and a big personality to match the silliness of the group's four other members. Sallee, a graduate of Boston's Berklee College of Music, is known for his work in its world renowned a cappella group Pitch Slapped. Sallee became a temporary member of Pentatonix last winter for the holiday season, and was made a permanent member earlier this year.

Sallee and the group's four seasoned members—Scott Hoying, Mitch Grassi, Kirstin Maldonado (known as kirstin in her solo endeavors), and Kevin "K.O." Olusola—used "Top Pop" to mirror their 2017 release, "Classics," which featured covers of seven classic songs, such as Queen's "Bohemian Rhapsody" and a-ha's one-hit wonder "Take On Me." Now moving to pop, the group lent its voices to popular songs like spicy "Havana," catchy "Despacito" and the feel-good hit "Finesse."

The album has several shining stars. First is "Havana," which is strongly led by Hoying. The cover will make you forget that it is indeed a cappella because of the full back-up vocals from the group; I found myself liking it more than Cabello's original. Maldonado uses her impressive vocal range to provide fans with a more than superior substitution for Cabello's voice. Olusola's "trumpet" is absolutely fantastic and will remind you just how impressive and versatile this group is.

"New Rules/Are You That Somebody" is also a standout. This is the perfect song for someone going through a break-up or needing an anthem in her or his love life. The group manages to mash Dua Lipa and Aaliyah's songs beautifully, having the lyrics play off of one another without it becoming boring or annoying. Personally, this is what makes the group unique in my eyes; its members are able to mash together songs and remix them in a way that actually flatters the lyrics and the overall beat. Sallee's bass also comes to play in this song, making the beginning a real treat.


"Stay" is another a highlight of this album. Hoying leads the pack again on this song, originally performed by Zedd and Alessia Cara. I find it oddly reminiscent of "Take Me Home" from PTX's original, self-titled album released in 2015. If you've ever listened to "Take Me Home," you should hear the similarities between it and "Stay" when the beatboxing stops and the whole group is singing. It's a truly beautiful song and the group skillfully uses its changes in tempo to its advantage.

In my honest opinion, the biggest disappointment on "Top Pop" was "Finesse." To make a note here, the group covers the original Bruno Mars hit and not the remix with rap princess Cardi B. For me, this was a bit of a disappointment because Grassi has lent his vocals to rapping before (the group's early cover of Ariana Grande and Iggy Azalea's hit "Problem" comes to mind). I was hoping to see some of that spunk come through for Grassi, arguably the group's sassiest and feistiest member. Overall, I just found the song to be awkward; the arrangement for the chorus was either too high or just doesn't work for this type of group. It was an utter disappointment too, because I had tweeted the group asking it to cover the song when I first found the Cardi remix about two months ago. While it's not a bad song, and I will listen to it, I still found it to be the weakest link on the album.

Overall, I'm impressed with "Top Pop" and the group's ability to belt out another solid set of covers. I don't think this album tops "Classics," but it's a great album in its own right. The vocal growth that we've seen from the four original members, especially from Maldonado, is incredible to listen to. Maldonado is currently performing in "Kinky Boots" on Broadway and you can hear how strong and powerful her voice has become in the time since she has joined the group, and even since she joined the cast. If you're looking to hear Maldonado in her prime, "Despacito/ Shape of You" showcases her linguistic skills and how incredibly far she has come in this journey.

With Maldonado's Broadway run ending next month and the group hitting the road for a national tour, I am looking forward to seeing them on August 22 at Saratoga Performing Arts Center and seeing these songs performed live.

With a price on his head

Salman Rushdie speaks of American politics at UAlbany

ALBANY — Salman Rushdie, famous author of "Midnight's Children" and his new book "The Golden House" visited the New York Writers Institute for craft talk and a public Q&A session on Thursday, April 19.

The author made his appearance for the first time since his original 1989 invitation that was cancelled due to the controversy surround "The Satanic Verses."The book was banned in India and Saudi Arabia due to passages that some Muslims found blasphemous. The religious leader of Iran, Ayatollah Khomeini, placed a fatwa, or bounty, on Rushdie and anyone responsible for publishing the book in 1989. As a result, Rushdie had to go into hiding to protect himself, missing the Writers Institute event that he had planned on attending. The head of the Writers Institute at the time, founder William Kennedy, responded to these developments with his own staged reading of the novel and then planned an event on censorship.

In the nearly 30 years since his original expected appearance, Rushdie has published several books, and started off the night reading his recently published "The Golden House." The book follows the tale of a wealthy Bombay businessman that immigrates to the United States with his three sons following the death of his wife.

Reading some comical cuts from the book, the crowd of 530 attendees laughed at passages about an "Eastern European gold digger," who ensnares Nero, and her itemized list of needs in order to continue their relationship. Rushdie also introduced a character borrowed from DC Comics, a

Trump-esque version of The Joker that wins the presidential election.

While Rushdie says he wrote most of the book before the 2016 presidential election, the analogies to real world politics were upfront in his reading, with one passage equating President Donald Trump to the Joker.

"What was astonishing and what made this election year like no other was that people backed him because he was insane, not in spite of it," he said.

Noting the starkly different views on politics and facts in America, Rushdie noted the prevalence of identity politics, and how they have "...Come to dominate thinking, not just in this country but in an extraordinary degree in different countries." He posited that the solution to this is pluralism, "Keep saying it, keep arguing it, or there are a great series of losses that follow," and novels, "[Novels] can remind us of what human beings are really like, that they are many things at once – and if we can remember that we can find a way forward."

Magic Beans throw down a stunner

Let's Be Leonard opened stellar night for jam at The Hollow

ALBANY — A friend recently referred to Albany as the "super deep-tiered jam band capital of the Northeast." As mediocre as that sounds, we actually do alright. Thursday, April 12 was a "Tier 3 Night" at the Hollow Bar and Kitchen, but good luck convincing those there to see The Magic Beans that it was anything short of incredible.

Saratoga's rising star, Let's Be Leonard, opened the evening with an ultra energetic "Spit It Out." While the members of this band may be young, their sound is mature and smart. Even their vocal jam included nicely blended harmonies. Connor Dunn's saxophone skills only added to the fun. Although the volume may have been a bit too high for some, it was refreshing to see a band with this much potential. It won't be surprising to see these guys on the festival circuit for years to come.

Around 10:30, the crowd began to swell as locals arrived to see Boulder, Colorado's The Magic Beans. Despite their current Rocky Mountain hometown, Albanians claim a small piece of the Beans as their own. Bassist Chris Duffy, formerly of Dirty Paris, is originally from the Capital City and fans are always delighted to bring him home.

Like a hurricane gaining strength over water, The Magic Beans' jams tend to rise in energy and explode with each powerful crescendo. Just when you thin they're finally ready to set everyone back down on Earth with something light and breezy, they burst back into a fast paced yet funky jam to fuel the groove of the crowd.

With thick bass lines, heavy synthesized keys and occasional hip hop beats, their transitions are still crisp and seemingly effortless. Scott Hachey's facial expressions as he flexes his guitar provess indicate the



thrill for both the band and the audience.

Nearing the end of the night, the Hollow was pulsing with some pretty impressive lights. A powerful "Luck" could have closed the evening, but the Beans decided to throw in some Talking Heads "Girlfriend is Better," with their latest "Casino Cabaret" for fun.

After picking my jaw up off the floor, I've came to the conclusion we were witnessing the steady rise of what is now a lower tiered jam band. This show was better than the last and light years beyond what we saw a few years ago. Although not someone I'd compare them to in style, I have not been this excited for a band since discovering Pigeons Playing Ping Pong. I fully expect to see this band become a household name in the jam community and they will always have a home here in Albany.



Hartley's Encore's sound is anchored by rock-solid songwriting flowing from Malamood (lead vocals/keyboards) and co-founder Chris Oliver (lead guitar and backing vocals). The band also includes Jeff Nania on saxophones with regular contributions from Phil Chow on trumpet and Suren Kyaruns on saxophones. Josh Gordon (bass), Mike Gilet (drums), Erik Pravel (drums), Brad Monkell (bass) and Alex Gonzales (percussion) are also a part of the band's lineup.

Malamood and Oliver have been friends since attending Guilderland High School. They've played music together for just as long, separated only by several years of college, grad school, careers and just life in general. They got back together soon after Oliver moved back to the Capital District, frustrated over the pay-to-play music scene in New York City. Before long, the two started writing music together.

"When he and I first started doing it, it was songwriting, songwriting, songwriting," said Oliver, "and that's all we cared about. The demand of that seemed like that was too much for what we originally had." There was initial frustration trying to fill the missing pieces to the band: the common challenge to any band, finding someone you can work with and learn the material. "Basically, we're writing everything anyway, let's just get whoever wants to play to jump in on these songs, and layer on top of it."

Then, through an act of serendipity, Hartley's Encore found itself without a drummer on the night of a gig in Troy. Malamood recalls frantic moments on the phone. Each person he called seemed to settle on one name, Mike Gilet.

"We got him off the couch," said Malamood, in that Gilet just so happened to be free that night. And, despite never having played the material before, picked up to it quickly. Oliver remembers how Gilet would listen to each song on his phone. How he nodded and said, "alright," before proceeding to play. After two-hours of playing on stage, Malamood said, "This dude's our drummer."

Oliver and Malamood sit together in their small rehearsal room at North Albany Studios talking about music in a way one wouldn't expect by looking at them. When Oliver writes, he's conscious of structure. The guitarist sits next to the drum kit in the far corner of the room. Dressed casually in dark pants, dark jacket, with his outfit accompanied by a dark woolen cap, he speaks of Verse. Bridge. Chorus. Verse. Bridge. Chorus. Malamood, squeezing in the interview between clocking out from his law firm, where he is a partner, and family time, speaks of the relative unstructured funky improvisation of The Meters. He's dressed in a pressed suit, leather shoes, and astude eyeglasses. It's an urban personification of the Chinese yin and yang symbol that describes two powers that oppose one another in appearance actually work together.

Malamood has that yin and yang structure working for him as a husband and father, too. Music is a passion of his. With Hartley's Encore picking up and playing gigs, he finds himself robbing sleep and pay towards playing the keyboard. This Hartley is unwilling to take away from his family time.

Oliver moved back to the Capital District with simple aspirations. He just wanted to play music without having to beg or pay venues to do it. Malamood is on the same page. "We wouldn't be able to do this if we weren't on the same page," said Oliver. "I'm right there with him."

Malamood looks at another music scene in New Orleans and wants to replicate it here. He wishes to establish a strong enough reputation to allow the band to play whenever it wants, wherever it wants, and to have people fill that venue. Unlike Hartley's attempt to network by traveling thousands of miles across the ocean, Malamood intends to do it here at home. "I think there's a way to do it all," he said.

As it prepares to drop its debut album, Hartley's Encore is throwing a party at The Hollow Bar + Kitchen on Friday, April 27, at 8 p.m. Its eponymous debut album is a six-track EP, from which a tease of its first single can be heard on NYSMusic.com.

The band's live shows reveal an everexpanding catalogue of funky, high energy and infectiously danceable material, peppered with a variety of funk, soul, R&B, and '90s-era hip-hop covers.

Joining Hartley's Encore on the playbill is the eight-piece Afro-jazz funk band, Victory Soul Orchestra.

The show starts at 8 p.m. Tickets are available at eventbrite.com.
