Still sorting things out

Court denies Bethlehem's request to dismiss lawsuit casting blame for 2015 landslide

ALBANY — A motion to dismiss a lawsuit filed by Normanside Country Club against the Town of Bethlehem following the April 2015 landslide was denied by the state Supreme Court Appellate Division on Tuesday, April 19.

The landside sent approximately 120,000 cubic yards of soil and debris both into Normans Kill Creek and onto Albany property on the opposite bank more than three years ago.

Traffic stop leads to drug charges

BETHLEHEM—

On Sunday, April 22, at approximately 10:52 p.m., state police stopped a vehicle on I-87, in the town of Bethlehem, for an equipment violation. While interviewing the

vehicle's driver, Keeyon R. Latney, 43 of Albany, for the traffic violation, the trooper established probable cause to search the vehicle and its occupants.

Latney was allegedly found to be in possession of approximately 7.8 grams of cocaine and approximately .2 grams of marijuana. He was taken into custody, transported and processed at the Albany state police station, where he was subsequently charged with criminal possession of controlled substance in the fourth degree, a class C felony, and multiple violations.

Latney was arraigned in Town of Bethlehem Court and remanded to the Albany County Correctional Facility without bail on Monday, April 23.

Mock DWI crash provides sobering view

DELMAR — Members of the Bethlehem Central High School chapter of Students Against Destructive Decisions joined forces with the Bethlehem Police Department and other community first responders to stage a "mock crash" at the high school on Tuesday, April 24. The demonstration was attended by students in grades 9-12 and was intended to be a reminder of the importance of safe and sober driving. The event took place outside of the high school cafeteria.

According to Bethlehem Police Department Commander Adam Hornick, the department has collaborated with students to conduct mock crashes at least a dozen times. "It is typically done every other year," he said, "That way, we reach all juniors and seniors at once. We purposely do it just prior to prom and graduation season."

The event, initially organized between the Albany County STOP DWI program and BPD, is now a collaborative effort between the three aforementioned groups and both the Bethlehem Police Traffic Safety and Family Services units.

Several students served as actors who were made up to look like accident victims for the event. The "victims" were treated at the scene by medical personnel, and ambulances, police, fire department

personnel, as well as a coroner, were on hand to "treat" victims who had sustained varying degrees of injuries as part of the simulated crash. There was also a staged arrest of a "drunk driver" by police.

"To have the students actually see a real life scenario, and see the outcome, is a lot more realistic and provides them with the images to relate to the potential effects of drunk or drugged driving," explained Hornick.

'Our officers take pride in working with the students during this event to share the educational aspects of STOP DWI. By teaching the potential consequences, it shows them the strict reality of what can

happen," he continued. "It is important for people to know if they drink there are lots of choices to get home safely, and driving isn't one of them."

"We must impress on the students that their whole life can be permanently altered by driving under the influence just once," said DBEMS Chief Steve Kroll, who provided two ambulances for the event. "No emergency responder ever wants to arrive at an accident and find a person who is mortally wounded because somebody drove under the influence. Those young people need to believe that actions can have dire consequences and they should not risk it even once."

Glenmont roundabout resolutions receive unanimous approval

Project is expected to be complete by spring 2021

BETHLEHEM—Town Board members unanimously voted to move forward with the roundabout and sidewalk extension project long discussed for the intersection of U.S. Route 9W with Feura Bush and Glenmont roads.

"This is just the first step in the whole process," said Town Engineer Paul Penman.

Prior to voting on resolutions related to the project, representatives from Creighton Manning, the civil engineering and surveying firm often hired by the town, not only provided some history about it, but also details about what will happen next.

The package of resolutions, approved unanimously:

- Establishes the Town Board as lead agency under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and approves a negative declaration regarding significant environmental effects
- Authorizes the implementation and funding of design services provided by Creighton Manning
- Provides general approval of the project
- Authorizes Town Supervisor David VanLuven to execute any necessary agreements with the New York state Department of Transportation, and
- Serves as a bond resolution for the full cost of the project, \$4.845 million, pursuant to permissive referendum

Officials expect the construction phase to begin in the spring of 2020 and be complete by the following spring. Surveying, design and acquisition of the Right of Way are expected to occur during the spring and summer of 2018 and 2019.

There are multiple design concepts to explore for the implementation of a rotary intersection in that area. During the design phases, both the town and Creighton Manning anticipate holding multiple public information meetings, as well as a public pre-construction meeting. Impacted stakeholders and property owners will also be invited to share their thoughts.

During the construction phase, the town will host a project website and utilize social media so residents can stay updated on its progress, as well as coordinate with local police, fire and EMS providers to ensure response times aren't impacted.

Major upcoming tasks include data collection (public surveys, crash information, etc.); environmental reviews; coordination with NYSDOT and the Thruway Authority; identification of right-of-way needs; and the evaluation of pedestrian safety countermeasures. Additionally, according to Creighton Manning, it will be necessary to evaluate a both roundabout and a traffic signal at that intersection.

The project will be 80 percent funded by the state, which will reimburse the town after it takes out a bond for the entire cost. Ultimately, the town will pay just under \$1 million.

Penman predicted that at least two of the three expected public information meetings will take place this year. "Two this year, maybe another one next year. And, if we need another one, we can do another public information meeting.

"We have the scope," he said," but now we have to put the actual pen to paper.

"How do you have a walkable

rotary," asked Town Supervisor David VanLuven, noting that many he has seen have been "scary" for pedestrian

Penman responded that roundabout designs have improved and are utilizing more pedestriansafe features, such as raised walkways and lighting. "That is something that has been stressed from day one," he said. "That this has to be pedestrianfriendly." Public conversations and meetings with the board will play a large role in that, he said.

Before the board unanimously voted in favor of the resolutions to move the project forward, member Jim Foster recommended scheduling the public information meetings in such a way that every resident would have the opportunity to attend at least one meeting, regardless of work schedules.

Indian Ladder Trail may not reopen

NEW SCOTLAND—The Indian Ladder Trail, a popular local tourist attraction for generations, is under threat of never opening again.

The two-mile footpath was etched into the soft limestone on the cliff side of the Helderberg Escarpment after the last Ice Age, more than 13,000 years ago, when glaciers scraped across upstate New York. It has long been a place of interest for both nature lovers and history buffs, providing picturesque views of both the Hudson and Mohawk valleys. Hikers who have traversed the trail are rewarded by small caves and cascading waterfalls within and above the nooks and crannies of its surface.

However, the very same properties which created the natural masterpiece have also led to a string of incidents in which hikers have been injured. Limestone is susceptible to water erosion and often leads to rock falls. State officials closed the Indian Ladder Trail indefinitely last summer after injuries from falling rocks left a local woman paralyzed.

The New York state Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation is still in the process of making a decision whether or not to reopen the trail to the public on Memorial Day, the day on which state parks open their trails for the summer season.

The department is "currently conducting an assessment to identify what additional steps, if any, need to be taken to open the trail this season," spokesman Randy Simons told *The Times Union* last week. It is not clear when OPRHP officials plan to make an announcement about the trail's future.

Nancy Ladd-Butz, the local hiker who was seriously injured by falling rocks as she walked the trail last July, has filed a lawsuit against the state.


More than 300,000 people visit Thacher Park every year. Last May, the state opened a brand new \$4.3 million park center. The 8,240 square-foot building was a signature project in the Governor's NY Parks 2020 Plan. Open year-round, it serves as a launching point for visitors to explore the 2,500-acre park. The center was built in close proximity to the start of the Indian Ladder Trail because of its popularity.

Falvo's up for sale

Family meat market has served local community since 1974

NEW SCOTLAND — Falvo's Meat Shoppe owner Joe Robilotto is looking to retire and has placed his market up for sale.

"I'm gonna be 78," said Robilotto. "Wouldn't you look to retire?"

The market on New York state Route 85A has been a staple for local consumers shopping for an assortment of meats and party platters since 1974. Over the years, residents have come to Robilotto by the hundreds to buy their Thanksgiving Day turkeys and his old-fashioned sausage dressing, based on his mother's recipe.

"It is an old-fashioned sausage dressing just like my mom used to make," Robilotto told The Spotlight, in a business feature published in 2013. "We use good, fresh seasonings and the meat is not loaded with fat, so it is not going to be greasy."

The Route 85A corridor has been witness to a substantial amount of development over the past several years. Just a few miles south of Falvo's, the Hilton Barn was moved to make way for a 28-unit residential development at the Colonie Country Club. Additional




development is planned even closer to the family market.

The market itself is listed under Ed Barber, an agent with of Better Homes and Gardens Real Estate, who describes the property as a "turn-key profitable business" located within a growing number of luxury homes, and an upcoming 18,000 square-foot retail store building along Maple Road. According to the advertisement, more than 7,000 motorists drive past the store each day. The market stands on three-quarters of an acre and has a listed value of \$299,000.

Before taking time for a customer, Robilotto joked about only being able to take a week's vacation before recent news of his market being placed on the market. The butcher said he intends to keep his doors open until a sale is finalized.

"It wouldn't be a business worth selling, otherwise," he said.

Still sorting things out

In May 2016, the City of Albany sued Normanside, Bethlehem, and other entities and individuals involved with placing an excess of "fill" on the upper portion of the slope on Normanside's property that ultimately collapsed. Soon after, Normanside filed suit against the town, claiming town officials were aware of the condition of the slope yet ultimately approved a fill permit application without the usual safety requirements.

The first motion to dismiss—"for failure to state a cause of action"— was denied in fall of 2016. The town appealed, and the State of New York Supreme Court, Appellate Division Third Judicial Department rendered its decision to uphold the denial in the middle of April.

"The important thing about today's decision is that the court has made no determination about who is responsible for the slope failure," said Town Attorney James Potter, who is not directly handling the case, which he said has been assigned to an independent attorney by the town's insurance carrier.

"The court had to assume that every fact that Normanside alleged in its complaint was true, and had to give Normanside the benefit of every favorable inference," Potter said, explaining how the appellate court approaches such motions. "The decision simply means that Normanside can now move forward with its case, but it does not change the fact that Normanside still has the burden of proving each of its allegations."

Normanside has alleged that a town engineer offered to "override" certain town-mandated requirements based on confidence in the slope's integrity and didn't require the country club to satisfy all mandated components of a fill permit application.

Normanside has further claimed that the town was aware of prior landslides in that area, and that the aforementioned engineer cited a study indicating that the local soil was prone to landslides sometime after the incident occurred. Regardless of this knowledge, the complaint alleges, he had suggested to third parties that they dispose of fill at the property, resulting in "catastrophic failure of the bank."

"Accepting the complaint's allegations as true," reads the April 19 appellate decision, "plaintiffs established a special relationship because defendant knew that a blatant and dangerous safety violation existed on plaintiffs' property and, notwithstanding this knowledge, affirmatively indicated that the fill activities were safe, and plaintiffs justifiably relied on these representations when they continued to deposit fill on the premises."

While Potter was unsure what damages are being claimed by Normanside, he said that the direction of the case will be determined by the town's insurance provider. "Normally," he said, "the case proceeds to discovery, where documents are exchanged and witnesses are deposed."

"I'm looking forward to the situation being resolved," said Town Supervisor David VanLuven. "So everyone—the town, Normanside, the City of Albany—can move on."

Library budget vote coming soon

BETHLEHEM—On Tuesday, May 15, in addition to weighing in on school district matters, Bethlehem Central School District residents will vote on the proposed \$4.2 Bethlehem Public Library budget and choose candidates to serve two full five-year terms and one partial three-year term on the library's Board of Trustees.

The proposed budget increases spending by 2.5 percent, or a little more than \$102,000. Increases reflect spending on print and digital materials, as well as an additional \$5,000 to purchase items for the 'Library of Things.' There is also an additional \$25,000 included for

furniture and equipment purchases the library says are needed for service enhancements.

Due to a reduction in expected income, the proposed budget includes a tax levy increase of 2.78 percent (\$106,588) to account for both spending increases and income reductions.

Candidate profiles can be found on the library website at bethlehempubliclibrary.org.

Residents wishing to meet board candidates will have a chance to do so this evening, Wednesday, May 2, at 6 p.m., in the library's community room.

There will also be a public budget presentation on Monday, May 14, in advance of the regular Board of Trustees meeting, in the library board room.

We have to address town development

Dear Editor,

I have lived in town as both a tenant and a homeowner for more than 20 years. Two of my daughters graduated from Bethlehem Central High School. My youngest daughter attends Elsmere Elementary. Being a father and a husband has provided little time for involvement in local issues.

However, over the past year, the extent of development projects being considered by the Town Board, absent an up-to-date comprehensive plan, has compelled me to become more involved in our community because I care about the fabric of our neighborhoods.

I am increasingly alarmed by the lack of openness, transparency, clarity, and proactive planning on the part of town government and the lack of effective leadership. The current environment places an undue burden on residents who must become watchdogs, ad hoc community organizers, advocates, lobbyists, and self-educators on zoning, easements, traffic patterns, density, etc. This is not an effective system of checks and balances. Residents cannot match developers in terms of expertise and financial resources to advance their

Another concern is the process that the Town Planning Board uses for the public hearings. The meeting agendas and supporting materials are often not posted until one or two business days prior to the meeting. Public comments are limited to a 10-minute period at the beginning of the meeting — which is before the proposal is discussed by the planning board and the presentation is made by the developer. In the interest of enhancing public

participation, the public comment period for large projects should be held after the proposals are discussed by the developers and the planning board.

While zoning laws should be straightforward, the overarching impact of the current process is a hodgepodge of development that has been evaluated using inconsistent criteria. The lack of clarity further disadvantages town residents.

Zoning is, and always will be, a hot button issue for local communities and Bethlehem has witnessed much growth over the past 15 years or so. What's new, and alarming, is the number of high density developments being proposed in established Bethlehem neighborhoods.

Town government needs to review and update the comprehensive plan that was last updated in 2005. The review process must include a series of public forums that include input from town residents. The need for an updated comprehensive plan has often mentioned been by the Town Supervisor (past and current) and Town Board (past and current), with

When confronted with a similar situation in 2005, the Town declared a moratorium on development pending the creation of a comprehensive plan. Perhaps now is the time for a similar action, which would help alleviate growing tensions and concerns for residents regarding major projects in their neighborhoods, without an updated governing document to rein in developers.












Free Comic Book Day

n Saturday, May 5, superheroes and villains will descend, bringing costumes, gifts, and charity to the Capital District. It's not a bird, a plane, or even the new Avengers movie — It's this year's Free Comic Book Day.

The free comics come from both the DC and Marvel universe, featuring characters like The Avengers and Batman that have exploded onto the big screen in recent years. Other comics featuring Dr. Who, the Star Wars universe, and The Tick will also be available at stores like Earthworld Comics on Central Avenue in Albany.

The day, "Reintroduce(s) everyone to comics, and free is a good entry point," Earthworld owner JC Glindmyer laughs.
Glindmyer grew up a few



blocks down from the store, frequenting it himself before buying it 33 years ago. The store's slogan is "Rotting minds and seducing the innocent since 1983!"

According to the Free Comic Book Day website, the event started in 2002 and is organized by publishers, distributors and other parts of the comic world. The books are selected from by the publishers, which are in turn sold to retailers at cost price, who then give the books to attendees for free.

More than books

Many of the participating stores coordinate events and special offers to go along with the exclusive books made available on Saturday.

Store patrons at Comic Depot in Saratoga Springs will be introduced to artists who bring beloved characters to life. The list of talent expected to attend includes Nikkol Jelenic, Steve Orlando, Jeff Bonesteel, Paul Harding

Paul D. Clarke, PA-C

and Ron Marz.

"It gives new readers an opportunity to come in here and see what's been going on with comics," said Chris Kaminski, manager at Comic Depot. "Not only that, it gives people who used to collect an opportunity to come back in and take a peek at what it has evolved to."

Earthworld's event will include appearances by Captain Marvel and the store's own Earthgirl, but Glindmyer said that customers get into the spirit as well. He often sees people wear homemade costumes in the store, sometimes with their pets done up as characters as well. One notable hero is local cosplayer Kelly Cary, who makes costumes and has been appearing at Earthworld events for the past 8 years as various characters.

The store also uses the event as an opportunity to give back to the community. The store usually has a charity set up a stand by the building to raise funds. This year

it will be the Sister Maureen Joyce Center Soup Kitchen, which helps low income and homeless people, located just over a mile from the store. Glindmyer said he also helps local school set up their own Free Comic Book Day, putting in orders for the schools to his distributor, and charging them cost. "We have been around because of the community and we feel obligated to give back to them," Glindmyer said.

Glindmyer notes that his customers rotate about every three years, and high schoolers go off to college, and a fresh wave of teens come in. He said that he finds one of the nice things about comic book day is to see families coming to store; old frequent customers bringing in their children to pass along the tradition of comic book reading. Whether a new or returning reader Glindmyer is confident about the day.

"Everyone loves comics, they just don't realize it," he said.

Renaissance Man

Van Zandt grew up just outside Asbury Park. His formative years were spent running with a crowd that included Springsteen and "Southside" Johnny (Lyon). They would hit the local music scene, taking in shows along the Jersey Shore. Later, through their own music, the trio would help define the "New Jersey Sound" that incorporated doo-wop, blues and soul.

"[When] we grew up, there was a different trend every year in the '60s," said Van Zandt, "but soul music was always right there next to rock and roll." He quickly recalled being able to see a The Kinks, The Beatles and The Rolling Stones along with Marvin Gaye, Smokey Robinson and Curtis Mayfield on a bevy of television shows that included Hillaballo and Shindig!. "It was always very, very integrated, the rock music at the time and soul music. We kind of grew up with that side by side."

Van Zandt's contribution to the music world, visibly, is that of a guitarist. In the background, his credits include a long sheet of music he has written and provided to other bands. His songs have gone to friends like Springsteen and Southside, to Gary "U.S." Bonds, Joey Ramone, Jackson Browne and more. There's a signature to his music, one that includes the roots of his past influences. Despite his time with the guitar, he's a master at arranging a horn section.

Pick up a Sam & Dave album and listen. Hear that danceable rhythm and blues often accompanied by a horn section. Throw on a record and you may have people mistake it for an outtake from "Born to Run." The similarities are not coincidental. Van Zandt's ear for horn arrangements is what helped him land a spot on the E Street Band. It goes back to a night when Southside, Bruce and Little Steven took in a Sam & Dave show. "It just so completely knocked us out, that me and Southside decided we were going to be the white Sam & Dave," he said.

Strip away his scowl and his Jersey accent, and Van Zandt reads like a poet from that other Renaissance Period.

"I integrate all of my influences and it comes out the way it comes out," he said. "There is a certain rootsy element to it. Frankly, if I don't hear that element to music, I don't relate to it. I want to hear the roots. I want to hear where it's coming from. We build on what came before us, it was just the way we were taught to do it. That's how we came up in that wonderful, flowing river that is rock and roll history. We took what was behind us, we integrated and we came up with something new."

Little Steven takes to The Palace stage Friday, May 4, integrating his music with a grassroots effort to help school children stay off the streets by preserving music programs at public schools. In addition to musician and thespian, Van Zandt is an activist, something that goes as far back as his "Sun City" protests in the mid-80s.

Van Zandt said he was approached by teacher organizations to help convince Washington to preserve music programs that were being eliminated in public Pick up a Sam & Dave album and listen. schools due to lack of funding in the "No Child Left Behind" era. He said he walked away from conversations with Ted Kennedy and Mitch McConnell knowing nothing would be done, so he said he had an idea.

Through TeachRock.org, an outlet from Van Zandt's Rock and Roll Forever Foundation, the musician has written 100 lesson plans meant to integrate music and music history with social studies and English courses. His current tour with his band, the Disciples of Soul, is hitting several cities with the added intent of spreading word of the program.

"Ultimately, we really hope to affect the dropout rate; it's epidemic," said Van Zandt. "One out of two poor kids are dropping out, and two out of five, nationally. It's out of control. So, statistics show that if a kid likes one single class, or one single teacher, they'll come to school. This way, we want to be that class that gets them to school. That's our one, blg, long-term goal."

Approximately 1,000 teachers signup to the curriculum program each year. Lesson planners can attend a pre-show seminar and invite school children with them to attend the concert for free through TeachRock.org.

Steven Van Zandt and the Disciples of Soul released "Soulfire" last year, lauded by *Rolling Stone* magazine as one of the best albums of the year. *Billboard* magazine described it as possessing a '60s sound not often present in today's Hot 100 music list. Whether the magazine intended to cast shade on Little Steven, it didn't bother him.

"I'm a '60s guy. I'm not nostalgic about the '60s. I mean, truth is, I never left," he said. "I'm not particularly interested in the modern world, to be perfectly honest. I'm not against it. Strength training tips for women

density decreases thanks to hormonal changes. That decrease in bone density puts women at risk of injury should they


fall and also increases their risk of developing osteoporosis, a condition in which bones

Stubborn Mules

Talented musicians in Gov't Mule haven't let light fade

ALBANY — Southern bands jammed solidly into Thursday night at the Palace Theatre.

An almost sold out show for Gov't Mule, a southern rock jam band that started out to be just a side project for Allman Brothers Band guitarist Warren Haynes and bassist Allen Woody, drew a shocking fan following, filling the historic Palace Theatre with an eclectic crowd of hippies, gypsies, and serious musicians alike.

Opening band Black Stone Cherry brought the house to its feet and heads banging chins to chests right on time at 7:30. The Kentucky-based opener includes the talent of Chris Robertson (lead guitar and vocals), John Fred Young (dramatically on drums), Ben Wells (guitar and hands down the most energetic dancer of the evening), and Jon Lawhon (bass). Strong right from the start, the musicians show that experience counts in mastering genres ranging from blues to netal. They were in tune, and capable of playing through some malfunctions with equipment.

The layering of heavier rock sounds, well balanced enough so that a trained ear can tease out each chord, reflected how Black Stone Cherry's music is both interesting and surprisingly complex. Like much heavy metal, the compositions took surprising turns with chord structures. The drummer's tossing of sticks added to Wells' well-placed kicks in his rose embroidered denim, added to the tempo changes that smoothly showed the members were breathing together throughout their 50-minute set. Interested

fans are encouraged to check out their new album Family Tree, which they showcased Thursday night.

In contrast to the heavy and complex sound of Black Stone Cherry, Gov't Mule took the stage washed in purples and blues as audio played snips from icons including Beatles, Marley, Dylan, and of course the Dead. Mule emphasized their place in history, including social history of demanding social justice, during this entrance. With a backdrop reminiscent of my college dorm room, the mandala flag of burnt sienna and wooden cut out mules dramatically added to the mood of storytelling as the band swooned out the song "Million Miles from Yesterday."

The band's first set included "World Gone Wild," "Stone Cold Rage," and "Drawn that Way." The lyrical storytelling layered with the upbeat jam vibe had fans jumping and dancing throughout the theatre. Keyboards contrasted the heavy opening sounds and were both soothing and inspiring simultaneously.

"Mountain Jam" reminded fans that this was, in fact, a southern band. With picking and heavy guitar melodies, the first set ended with "The Man I Want to Be" and "I'm a Ram." After a brief break, the second set picked up with "Catfish Blues," a Robert Petway cover. The band reminded listeners these musicians have been performing both together and apart long enough to have earned some street credibility for soulful, bluesy jazz sound. The band played late into the night with "Bad Little Doggie," "Bad Man Walking" and "Thorns of Life," before adding in "Banks of the Deep End" and "Kind of Bird."

"Soulshine," in full disclosure this writer's favorite song, brought all the fans back to the basic belief system that music reminds us to listen to our inner voice when lost. The lyrics encourage



The heavy rain didn't put a damper on blues fans who had stepped inside the music hall to escape the everyday stresses of life, and instead took in a worry-free, entertaining evening of music from both Girl Blue and Serbian-Blues guitarist and vocalist, Ana Popovic.

Almost a full year since her last performance at the music hall, this time around Popovic pulled out all of the stops as she continued to dazzle the audience with her electrifying guitar solos, captivating vocals, and a stunning cast of performers within her five piece ensemble that joined her for her tour to promote her new three disk album, "Trilogy."

Popovic's rhythm and horn ensemble were tight and in full swing throughout

the entire evening. Her rhythm section began the evening with an instrumental of their own rendition of "Ana's Shuffle" from the album, "Can You Stand The Heat."They continued to jam along to the tune before Popovic, dressed in a similar red tank top, jeans, and heels that she wore at last year's concert, joined the band on stage to play some solos on her guitar before moving on to perform a series of her songs from "Trilogy."

"It's great to be back!" Popovic called out to the audience as she launched into, "Can You Stand the Heat," from her previous album.

Song after song, Popovic and her ensemble were outstanding, never outshining each other as they performed their own riffs, rhythms and solos for each song. Popovic took the time to introduce the city of Cohoes to her full ensemble before performing "Train" from "Trilogy: Disk #1 (Morning)" to a happy audience that was excited to also hear Popovic's drummer, Cedric Goodman, play some riffs on the drums that got them dancing and moving in their seats. "Long Road Down" brought listeners back in time to the Oregon Trail. It was a

time to also focus on Popovic's own extensive travels as she has continued her journey from Belgrade, Serbia; Amsterdam, Holland; Memphis, Tenn., and Los Angeles, Calif. where she has currently resided for the past two years.

Popovic is able to smoothly transition well from performing lead to slide guitar as she continued to play slide on "If Tomorrow Was Today." Following suit to her empowering gym-based workout song, "Show How Strong You Are," each of the key players in her ensemble rose to the occasion and performed their energetic, emotionally-felt awakening solos, from the jazz-lead bass playing of the bassist, back to Popovic, to the drummer, and on towards the other performers to close out their main set.

The band returned to the stage for their encore as they concluded the evening with a cover of Popovic's "Mo' Better Love," and closing out the event with a cover of a song that she had discovered recently before she began recording Trilogy, "Fence Walk" from the Brooklynbased band, Mandrill. Popovic's interaction with both the crowd and with her own band

members is both electric and entertaining to watch. Moving from side to side, Popovic joined in on the jam between her horn players, Jon Ramm (trombone) and Brad Walker (saxophone), on the right side of the stage as they had gathered around each other, creating a musical dialogue heard within their notes and soloing while closing out the evening. Popovic left the stage, leaving the remainder of the ensemble to continue to jam to the tune and close out the funky number on a high note that satisfied both the band and the audience.

Albany based act, Girl Blue, featuring vocalist and guitarist, Arielle O'Keefe, opened up for Ana Popovic and her band. Playing a set of eight original songs, O'Keefe did a great job performing solo to tunes that were mixed in with her own vocals being recorded on a loop. My first time hearing O'Keefe perform live, the sound of her voice reminded me of a mix between Norah Jones, Regina Spector, Alanis Morrisette, and Katy Perry, as she sang her own unique, original tunes that related back to teenage and early adult moments of angst, drinking, and other fun, significant moments within her life.

'Chappaquiddick' delves into one of the murkiest Kennedy scandals in history

ew people of my generation recognize the word "Chappaquiddick," or can identify the significant meaning behind it. At 23 years old, I have found myself enamored by the time period of 1968 to 1975 because of the significant American scandals and moments that happened, ones that have impacted America as we know it. The Pentagon Papers and the subsequent Watergate scandal brought on some of the most impressive journalism in our culture. Yet, none of it has the stigma and sadness around it that Chappaquiddick does.

"Chappaquiddick" took place on July 18, 1969. It involved then U.S. Sen. Ted Kennedy and a coveted campaign strategist, 28-year-old Mary Jo Kopechne. Kopechne was deeply involved in Robert Kennedy's political legacy and the youngest Kennedy brother is pictured as

desperately trying to swing her onto his team for a possible presidential run. Kopechne and Kennedy were in a car after a night of partying with campaign staffers and friends when Kennedy drove the car over the side of the bridge leading onto Chappaquiddick island, flipping the car into the water. Kennedy was able to surface almost instantly and did not report the accident until the next morning. Kopechne survived for up to four hours in an air bubble inside the car before dying. She was found the next morning by local police after two fishermen called the floating car in, minutes before Kennedy called the police himself. Kennedy waited more than nine hours before reporting the accident.

The movie was headlined by a team of talented actors and actresses; Jason Clarke ("Zero Dark Thirty") stars as the unsure Kennedy; Kate Mara ("House of Cards") shines as the doomed Kopechne; Ed Helms ("The Hangover") is a superior Joey Gargan, a Kennedy cousin and trusted confidant; and Jim Gaffigan ("Fargo") stars as Paul Markham, another close confidant and the former U.S. Attorney for Massachusetts.

In my opinion, this movie was very

slanted against Kennedy. If you are of the opinion that Kennedy is a horrible man and are out for something that vindicates Kopechne, this will satisfy you. Clarke does a wonderful job of making you absolutely hate Kennedy's guts--he lies about the most mundane things (once he admitted to actually driving the car, he insisted he swam to shore instead of using a small row boat he, Markham and Gargan found.) His sad puppy demeanor is enough to make you feel absolutely giddy when Kennedy Sr., portrayed by Bruce Dern, finally slaps him toward the end of the movie in his withered state. Just when you believe Kennedy will do the right thing and come forward, he does not. In my mind, it's an agenda much like "Making A Murderer" is; while it's giving you the facts, it's also leading you to a solution. If you know about Chappaquiddick through your own research before walking into the theater, you might have a different opinion than the movie tries to tell you. You'll see clips of people who pledge their undying support to Kennedy, even after the incident has blown over and he is sentenced for fleeing the scene of the accident and receives a suspended jail sentence.

Helms' Gargan is the sole voice of reason in the movie. If you've seen movies like "The Hangover" or are a "The Office" fan, you will know him as a funny guy. However, he brings a whole new facet

of his talent into this movie as a strong, moral, defeated man. While many of the figures babied the incident throughout the movie (the police do not release the statement until much later than they should have, everyone around Ted is trying to come up with a believable lie to keep him out of prison), Gargan shines as the sole voice of reason and the one truly advocating for the life of Kopechne. As Kennedy and his team are strategizing for the big televised statement, Gargan shines with, "A young woman is dead and we are going to make Ted the martyr?" Another standout line is when Kennedy is planning his use of the infamous neck brace at Kopechne's funeral, and Gargan wrestles the brace out of Kennedy's hand and screams, "You are not the victim here." It's a shining example of what most people in the movie theater are probably thinking, and it snaps you back into seeing just how crazy the situation has gotten--not in Kopechne's death, but in the cover-up to keep Kennedy in good standing.

"Chappaquiddick" was, in my opinion, one of the best movies I have seen in the past two years. Mara's performance as the dying Kopechne in the sinking car was believable and heartbreaking; I cried as she gasped for a few more breaths, knowing no one was going to save her. The movie does a great job at bringing back the truth of the incident--a young woman needlessly suffered and died because the accident wasn't reported. If Kennedy had

called in and just fessed up, the diver who found Kopechne's dead body "could have had her out in 25 minutes."Throughout the movie, you are forced to see Kopechne's parents, friends and understand the impact of every single lie Kennedy told about the

While politics are much more convoluted today than they were in the late 1960s, one lasting, overarching impression stays with you as the credits roll: the truth sets you free.



Strength training

training regimen. Many fitness centers offer one or two free personal training sessions to new members, and women should take advantage of such offers to learn how to use certain machines and the proper form for the various strength training exercises they intend to include in their routines. If a facility does not offer the sessions free, consider hiring a personal trainer for a few sessions until you are comfortable with each exercise and confident your form is correct. Proper form prevents injury and promotes long-term health.

• Keep it simple. Part of the difficulty with beginning a strength

training regimen rests with the abundance of advice out there, whether "out there" is in your own gym or online. But simplicity is good when beginning a strength training regimen. Learn some basic exercises for each muscle group at first. Once you are comfortable with these basic exercises, and it might take several months to feel comfortable, you can then look to master additional exercises and create a more specialized strength training routine. Speak with a professional trainer at your gym to develop a good beginner's routine and then expand on that routine later.

• Don't abandon

cardiovascular exercise. Strength training should not be introduced at the expense of cardiovascular exercise. An adequate exercise regimen includes both strength training and cardiovascular exercise, which improves heart health (remember, the heart is a muscle, too), helps to boost metabolism and improves recovery time, among other benefits. As you grow more accustomed to your workout routine, increase the intensity of your cardiovascular workout and not the volume.

• Don't be discouraged. It's easy to feel discouraged when beginning a strength training regimen, as results don't come overnight, leaving some to question if they will ever get stronger and

reap the rewards of their efforts. Significant cosmetic results such as finely toned muscles and considerable weight loss won't be immediate, but if you stick to your routine, you will likely begin to notice your energy levels are improving and you feel better, and those kinds of results often come sooner rather than later. Use such encouraging developments as motivation if necessary and always keep in mind that strength training will pay off in the long run.

Many women avoid strength training out of fear that will develop large muscles that compromise their femininity. But such fears are unfounded, and strength training is a great way for women to get in shape and foster longterm health.



















Retirement saving tips for late starters

espite countless television ads touting the virtues of retirement planning, it seems many people are not getting the message. According to a survey from GOBBankingRates.com, one-third of Americans have nothing saved for retirement. The picture is not any rosier in Canada, where Statistics Canada reports that just 65.2 percent of the country's 14 million households contributed to a retirement plan in 2015.

Financial advisors recommend men and women begin saving for retirement as early as possible. The longer people delay opening a retirement account, the less time their money will have to grow. Those who never open such accounts may not be able to meet their cost of living in the future.

While it pays to start saving for retirement early, late bloomers who need to catch up should know that it's never too late to start.

- Sign up for an employer-sponsored retirement account. Many employers arrange for retirement savings accounts like a 401(k) for their employees. Such accounts are typically tax-deferred. As a result, men and women likely won't even notice the money missing from their paychecks each month. Take advantage of such offerings if they exist. Such opportunities can be even more beneficial to late bloomers whose employers match contributions up to a predetermined percentage.
- Start saving as much as possible. Many people contribute 6 percent of

their pay to a retirement savings account such as a 401(k). That rule of thumb may be enough for young workers, but late bloomers may need to contribute a higher percentage of their incomes if they hope to catch up. If 10 percent is doable, then contribute 10 percent, being sure to diversify how that 10 percent is invested. Workers who can afford to contribute more might want to explore other retirement account options so they avoid putting all of their eggs into one basket.

- Avoid high-risk investments. Investors trying to catch up on retirement savings may be tempted to invest their money in high-risk funds with the hope of making up ground quickly. But investors typically want to reduce risk as they get older. That approach should still govern late bloomers' investing decisions, as high-risk funds that don't perform well could leave aging investors with little to nothing come retirement. Prospective investors who need help choosing the right funds for themselves should contact a financial advisor.
- Cut spending. Men and women getting a late start on retirement saving should examine their monthly expenses, looking for places to cut costs so they can reallocate those funds for retirement savings. Some ways to considerably reduce monthly expenses include cutting the cord with a cable provider, driving a preowned vehicle instead of a new model and downsizing to a smaller home.

Men and women who have delayed saving for retirement should not panic. While it's always best to begin saving for retirement as early as possible, there are ways for late bloomers to catch up and/or create a decent-sized nest egg for their golden years.

Easy ways to get more youthful-looking skin



Stay nimble for good health

How to stay flexible as you age

en and women may begin to feel less flexible as they get older. According to the University of Maryland Medical Center, that loss of flexibility is because muscles lose both strength and elasticity as the body ages.

A lack of flexibility can make men and women more vulnerable to certain types of injuries, including muscle strains and tears. While people might not be able to maintain the flexibility they enjoyed in their twenties, there are ways for them to combat agerelated loss of flexibility.

• Stretch frequently. Stretching is a great way to combat age-related loss of flexibility. Stretch major muscle groups, such as hamstrings and shoulder muscles, several times per

week. When practicing static stretching, the goal is to gradually elongate the muscle being stretched before holding the elongated position, and ultimately allowing the muscle to return to resting position. As flexibility improves, elongated stretches can be held for 30 seconds. Avoid stretching muscles that are sore or injured,

and discontinue a stretch if you feel pain or discomfort.

• Include yoga in your exercise regimen. Practitioners of yoga typically love how this unique discipline that exercises the body while relaxing the mind improves their flexibility. Many yoga poses are designed to improve the strength and flexibility

of muscles, and some physicians may even recommend yoga to aging patients. Yoga DVDs or streaming sessions can be great, but beginners may want to visit voga studios or sign up for classes at their gyms so instructors can personally ensure they are doing each pose correctly. As their flexibility improves, men and women can try more difficult poses and classes if they so desire.

• Get in the pool. Swimming is another activity that can help aging men and women improve their flexibility. Strengthtraining exercises are an important component of a well-balanced exercise regimen, but such workouts tend to focus on one or two muscle groups at a time. That means other muscle groups may be inactive and tighten up as a result. Swimming works the entire body, which helps all muscle groups stay loose and flexible. One or two swimming sessions per week can contribute

to great gains in overall flexibility, especially for men and women who remember to stretch when they get out of the pool.



of the tunnel is only about an inch. Injury or inflammation to the tissues inside of the carpal tunnel can shrink the space of the tunnel, eventually pressing on the tendons and the median nerve that runs neck and runs through the arm. The median nerve passes through the carpal tunnel at the wrist and goes into the hand, providing feeling to the palm side of the thumb and to the index, middle and part of the as well as tingling and numbness are the two most common symptoms of CTS. The numbness particularly affects four of the fingers. It can occur when holding a phone, book, newspaper or steering wheel or engaging in just about any activity that involves the hands. CTS also may wake a person up from sleep.

There are a number of other compression issues that can occur in the hand and arms, causing similar pain and tingling in other areas. Ulnar nerve compression in the elbow can cause part of the ring finger and pinky finger to tingle and may be indicative of a different ailment. That's why a professional diagnosis must be sought when experiencing symptoms related to CTS.

When to see a doctor

If pain and tingling are affecting activities and sleeping patterns, individuals should see their doctors. Various nonsurgical remedies and therapies may help. If left untreated, any condition that affects nerve function may lead to permanent nerve and muscle damage.

Hate driving at night?

Three ways aging drivers can see better at night

any drivers are less comfortable driving at night than during the daytime. Despite the fact that far more vehicles are on the road during the daytime than at night, studies have shown that approximately 65 percent of accidents occur at night.

Many of those accidents and much of the discomfort drivers feel at night can be traced to inadequate lighting. Visual acuity, which is directly related to the amount of light provided by the environment, can be diminished by as much as 70 percent at night. The human eye is not adapted for nocturnal vision, so when driving at night, drivers often experience a loss of depth perception and difficulty distinguishing between colors as contrasts fade away.

This is especially problematic for aging drivers, a segment of the driving population that is on the rise. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, there were 36.8 million licensed drivers age 65 and older on the road in 2013, a figure the NHTSA estimates will increase to 57 million by 2030. As drivers age, the lenses of their eyes become more opaque, reducing the amount of light their eyes can receive. For example, at age 40,





the average driver may already need twice as much light than a driver at age 20. At age 65, that need can climb to a whopping eight to 10 times more light (see graph).

But aging drivers need not sacrifice their nocturnal independence just to stay safe behind the wheel. The following are three ways aging motorists can improve their nighttime visibility.

1. Upgrade headlights

According to a recent study from the automotive club AAA, the halogen headlights found in more than 80 percent of vehicles on the road today fail to safely illuminate unlit roadways, even when vehicles are moving at speeds as low as 40 miles per hour. 

How to land that job

Finding work after 50

nemployment isn't easy for anyone, regardless of their age. But unemployed men and women over 50 may find it especially difficult to find work.

Whether it's a byproduct of agerelated discrimination or any of a host of additional variables, jobless older workers often struggle to find work. In a 2016 analysis of government figures, the Schwartz Center for Economic Policy Analysis at the New School estimated that the jobless rate for workers 55 and older in August of 2016, six years after the Great Recession, was nearly 9 percent. At the time, the national jobless rate hovered around 5 percent.

Unemployed men and women over 50 who are struggling to find work can consider the following strategies as they look to rejoin the workforce.

• Revisit your résumé. Unemployed men and women over 50 have no doubt updated their résumés to reflect their most recent professional experience. But they may need to trim some of the fat in regard to their work life 10 or more years ago. Today's hiring managers may only be concerned with recent experience that illustrates skillsets that are relevant to today's jobs. Men and women over 50 may consider their experience from 20 years ago invaluable, but if that experience does not



meet the specific needs of the jobs they're now seeking, then they should remove it from their résumés so hiring managers can quickly access the more relevant information from their work histories.

• Embrace 21st century job hunting. Finding a job in the second decade of the 21st century is unlike job hunting in decades prior, and wholly different from how men and women over 50 looked for jobs upon beginning their professional lives. Networking can mean the difference between unemployment and landing a job. Go to job fairs attended by hiring managers and join professional organizations that host events where professionals in your field can gather.

• Turn your age into a positive. Men and women over 50 should accept the likelihood that their new managers and/or hiring managers will be younger than them. When

interviewing for a job, men and women over 50 should make an effort to showcase their enthusiasm about working with and learning from younger colleagues, while also noting their desire to commit long-term to a company. Some hiring managers may surprise older applicants, viewing them as potentially

more reliable than younger

workers simply looking to gain some experience in a particular industry before moving on to the next opportunity.

• Make use of your existing down time. Another strategy unemployed men and women over 50 can try as they look for work is to make better use of their existing downtime. Enrolling in online courses can give prospective employers the impression that applicants over 50 are both tech-savvy and willing to learn new things. Each of those things can help men and women over 50 overcome any unjustified, tech-related stigmas that hiring managers may attach to older job candidates.





- Age-based memberships. Reaching age 50 or 60 may entitle people to join groups that negotiate deals for their members. For example, the minimum membership age for AARP is 50, meaning travelers who join AARP can enjoy discounts roughly five years before they're eligible for senior discounts offered by other organizations.
- Travel during off seasons. When not constrained by school schedules, men and women over 50 can travel during times of the year when prices are most affordable. This means savings and smaller crowds. This flexibility also can translate into airline discounts, as men and women over 50 with no time constraints can choose to be standby passengers in exchange for discounted or free tickets.

Grandparents called upon to raise grandchildren

lder adults whose children have grown up often look forward to the next stages in life, which may involve retirement, downsizing and enjoying visits with their grandchildren. A growing number of aging adults may find themselves playing a key role in their grandchildren's lives.

According to data from the U.S. Census Bureau, 2.7 million grandparents across the country are stepping into parental roles for their grandkids. Legal advice or advocacy

Certain circumstances may require grandparents to seek legal help so they can raise their grandchildren in lawful ways. If there is neglect, divorce, arrest, or other factors, it may be a smart idea for grandparents to seek the help of an attorney or advocacy group to clarify their legal rights and ensure access to grandchildren. In addition, grandparents may need certain legal documents, such as a power of attorney, citizenship papers, adoption records, or consent forms.

Get educated

The rules have changed since grandparents raised their own children. It is important they learn as much as possible on child safety guidelines. Consumer advocacy groups or pediatricians can help explain how guidelines have changed. New furniture and toys that meet current safety guidelines may have to replace older, unsafe items.

Take care of yourself

Raising grandchildren can be emotionally taxing, especially if poor circumstances led to the grandchildren being placed with family. It is crucial to recognize feelings and one's own health when caring for others. A grandparent who is exhausted or overwhelmed may not offer the appropriate care. Emphasizing one's own mental and physical health is essential, as is getting help and advice when it's most needed. The organization AARP recommends compiling a list of support services, such as respite care providers, counselors and support groups.

Grandparents can focus on providing stable environments and offer support and consistency even if grandchildren are withdrawing or pushing their loved ones away with words or actions.

Ergonomic gardening techniques can make gardening less taxing

ardening is a popular activity that seems to be gaining even more supporters. Statistica reports that the number of people who gardened within the last 12 months in the United States rose from around 105 million in 2008 to 118 million in 2017.

Gardening can be relaxing yet physically demanding work. Gardeners who find themselves battling aches and

pains after spending time in the garden may need to make a greater effort to reduce injuries and improve comfort when tilling, weeding or installing new landscape features.

Ergonomic gardening techniques and tools can help gardeners reduce their risk of injury and make gardening more comfortable.

Warm up

Just as novice athletes wouldn't dive right into a strenuous workout at the gym, nor should novice gardeners immediately pick up a shovel and jump into digging a hole for their new tree.

Weed out aches & pains

Gardening requires bending, stooping, lifting, twisting, and other movements that work the entire body. Spending 10 or more minutes stretching, walking and doing a few back and arm rotations can limber the body up for the physical activity to come.

Use proper form

Think about the mechanics of lifting weights during a workout, as home and garden tasks may mimic movements made when exercising. The occupational therapists at Bend Spinal Care say that strain on the lower back can be reduced by positioning objects close to the body and its center of gravity when lifting them. Furthermore, people can contract their abdominal (core) muscles when lifting and bending to support the back. When lifting heavy objects, power should be derived from the legs and buttocks rather than the back.

Keep items close

Keeping work closer to the body will reduce the need for stooping, leaning or reaching, which should cut down on pulled muscles. Long-handled tools can help minimize reaching. Use step ladders to reach high areas or get down on padded cushions to work closer to the ground. This alleviates strain to the neck from having to look up or down for extended periods of time. Raised garden beds can bring plants to a person's level. The therapists at ProCare Physical Therapy say that working below shoulder level whenever possible can prevent shoulder strains; otherwise, perform tasks for no more than five minutes at a time.

Invest in new tools

Cushioned grips and grip handles can prevent wrist fatigue, as can hand tools that keep wrists straight to improve strength and reduce repetitive motion injuries. Long-handled tools and push mowers should be as tall as the person using them. Seek out tools that keep the body in natural positions to maximize efficiency.

Even though gardening is viewed as a relaxing pastime, the work involved can be taxing on the body. Ergonomic tools and proper form can keep injuries at bay.
