# Banner day for Monday

Delmar veteran Joseph VanDeloo named grand marshal of this year's Memorial Day parade

BETHLEHEM — The 2018 Town of Bethlehem Memorial Day Parade will kick off at 11 a.m. at the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard American Legion Post #1040 on Monday, May 28.


Organized by the Legion this year, Grand Marshal Joseph VanDeloo will lead the parade on its route to the Bethlehem Veterans Memorial Park, where there will be a flag raising ceremony, prayer service, and performances of both Taps and the National Anthem.

VanDeloo, who grew up in Albany, served during Vietnam as an engine mechanic in the 1960s,

retiring as a staff sergeant of the U.S. Air Force National Guard in 1966. He worked on C-97 cargo planes and flew overseas missions to places such as Antarctica and France, to transfer supplies.

# RCS counselor charged with stalking

RAVENA—A middle school guidance counselor in the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Central School District has been "temporarily removed from his day-to-day guidance counselor duties," according to a letter sent to families on Friday, May 18, by district Superintendent Brian Bailey.

Kenneth Blair, a 45-year-old middle-school guidance counselor from Mechanicville, has been charged with misdemeanor counts of criminal mischief and stalking a colleague in the school district, a woman he briefly dated four years ago. He was arrested on Wednesday, May 9, about six weeks after allegedly shooting a BB gun through the bedroom window of the woman's home.

According to the district, while there is no indication that Blair's

behavior negatively impacted students, he reportedly continued to make unwanted contact with the victim on school grounds and, at times, followed her from the parking lot in his car. He also reportedly sent a series of emails, including from his district email account, to the victim and others that she knew. While the woman had notified police of Blair's behavior on multiple occasions, the district was apparently unaware of any impropriety until his arrest on May 9.

"There is absolutely no evidence to suggest that the safety of District students was ever in question," said Bailey in the letter. "The ongoing safety and well-being of students remains the highest priority for the District and we will continue to monitor the progress of this investigation."

of Bethlehem Court for felony counts of identity theft in the second degree and grand larceny in the fourth degree, as well as a misdemeanor count of conspiracy in the fifth degree. Brooks, along with a codefendant reportedly fraudulently obtained the personal identification material of another person and used that person's information to make purchases and obtain credit. Brooks

was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court by Judge Kirby and released to the supervision of probation. He is due back in court on Tuesday, June 19.

# Thruway pursuit leads to drug charges

**BETHLEHEM**—New York State Police arrested a man on Monday night, May 14, after he led them on a chase along the New York State Thruway in the Town of Bethlehem.

Investigators say that Dominique Davidson, age 34, of Holtsville, was arrested after attempting to flee troopers for several vehicle and traffic law violations. During the pursuit, Davidson was reportedly observed throwing items out the window of his car, which were later determined to be cocaine.

After Davidson was taken into custody, he was charged with felony criminal possession of a controlled substance in the fourth degree, criminal possession of a controlled substance in the fourth degree with intent to sell, criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree, tampering with physical evidence, obstruction of governmental administration and unlawful fleeing in a motor vehicle, as well as multiple vehicle and traffic law violations.

He was arraigned in the Town of Bethlehem, and remanded to the Albany County jail.

# Banner day for Monday

Upon retirement in 1966, he married his high school sweetheart and moved to Delmar. He has been a member of the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard post for 31 years, serving as commander, chairman of the board and finance officer. Currently, he is on the Board of Directors.

According to Legion Commander Lyle Maddock, VanDeloo, who recently suffered a stroke, attended an annual awards dinner last month where Maddock asked him to serve as grand marshal of the annual parade.

"The grand marshal is someone the community should recognize for their achievements," he said, noting VanDeloo's service and subsequent years working as a local sales manager. The honor is generally bestowed on one of the Legion's older members, as well as those who have held leadership positions in the organization.

"It's an honor and a pleasure," said VanDeloo, who became emotional when he spoke of the "good people" he has served with, both during his time in the service and his time at the Legion. "I think the world of the place."

While VanDeloo and Maddock both identified the mission of the American Legion as supporting returning and aging veterans, VanDeloo pointed out that Post #1040 also provides a significant amount of community support for other local organizations, such as youth athletic leagues and scout troops who use space at Post #1040 for meetings.

"They'll all be marching in the parade," he said.

VanDeloo initially joined the Legion for social reasons, after leaving the USAF National Guard. "Our friends all died there," he said of the Vietnam War. "But it was a way to have some fun." Ultimately, it became important to continue to provide support and recognition for those who were returning from service and those who never did.

The Legion organizes the parade every other year, alternating with the Bethlehem Memorial VFW Post #3185. One topic Maddock, who was just elected to a second term as Legion commander, wants to highlight during a speech he will deliver is the issue of how many veterans are affected by post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

"There are like 15 suicides a day from people coming back," he said. "That's a really big deal." He said much of the Legion's work is dedicated to easing that transition for returning service members.

The annual Memorial Day parade steps off from West Poplar Drive, turns left onto Elsmere Avenue and proceeds right onto Kenwood Avenue. The percession then turns left onto Adams Place, followed by a right onto Adams Street. The parade then turns right onto Delaware Avenue before coming to an end at the Bethlehem Veterans Memorial Park.

Early this century, under the leadership of Supervisor Sheila Fuller, renewal of the small park's landscaping and a Buy-a-Brick Campaign for the park enabled the town to add inscribed bricks to the park "to broaden the honor and recognition of those who served our country."

Some have been inscribed with the military engagements in which local veterans have fought while others have been inscribed with quotes related to those engagements. "The quotes reveal the passion and ideology of the time and are echoes of our history," reads a 2005 article in Our Towne Bethlehem, which describes the layout of the bricks as "a puzzle."

VanDeloo said he hopes that the new town administration will prove to be more supportive of Legion activities than the preceding one, commenting that the town has historically been more responsive under leaders such as Fuller, Jack Cunningham and Sam Messina. 'I think we could do better," he said of recent years.

Prior to the parade, said VanDeloo, at 10:30 a.m., participants will gather at the grave of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard, in front of the post, for a brief ceremony honoring the soldier who was killed in action in November 1918, while serving with the 307th Infantry's 77th division, near the close of World War I.

# State to groom closed trail for opening

Indian Ladder Trail to open once trail project work is complete

**NEW SCOTLAND** — The State is making preparations to open the Indian Ladder Trail starting this week.

State crews will spend the next four to six weeks removing loose rock and debris around the trail, according to a statement from The New York state Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

"State Parks crews will remove any loose surface material that may present a rockfall hazard," stated the May 18 announcement. "Crews consist of experienced rope handlers and scalers, who are suspended along the slope edge to chip away loose rocks and debris."

The footpath was etched into the soft limestone on the cliff side of the Helderberg Escarpment more than 13,000 years ago during the last Ice Age, when glaciers scraped across upstate New York. It has long been a place of interest for both nature lovers and history buffs, providing picturesque views of both the Hudson and Mohawk valleys. Hikers who have traversed the trail are rewarded by small caves and cascading waterfalls within and above the nooks and crannies of its surface.

However, the very same properties which initially created the natural masterpiece have also led to a string of incidents in which hikers have been injured. State officials

closed the Indian Ladder Trail indefinitely last summer after injuries from falling rocks left a local woman paralyzed.

Nancy Ladd-Butz, the local hiker who was seriously injured by falling rocks as she walked the trail last July, has filed a lawsuit against the state.

The Indian Ladder Trail is expected to reopen once work is complete.

More than 300,000 people visit Thacher Park every year. Last May, the state opened a brand new \$4.3 million park center. The 8,240 square-foot building was a signature project in the Governor's NY Parks 2020 Plan. Open year-round, it serves as a launching point for visitors to explore the 2,500-acre park. The center was built in close proximity to the start of the Indian Ladder Trail because of its popularity.

# Juice bar for rail trail

**ELSMERE** — The Bethlehem Planning Board has approved the application for a new juice bar and fitness center next to the Albany County Helderberg Hudson Rail Trail on Delaware Avenue.

Partners Jackie Slattery and Katie Dievendorf became friends when Slattery and her husband, Liam, opened O'Slattery's at 318 Delaware Ave. Dievendorf's husband, Jeremy, has worked as their accountant and Katie, a lawyer, helped them get their liquor license.

When Slattery learned that the Delmar Health Hut at 278 Delaware Ave. was closing almost a year ago, she said she mentioned the idea of opening a juice bar in the location to the couple and found that they had already discussed the same idea.

"It was just too funny that we all had the same

idea," she said. "I thought about it all night and I texted Jeremy a few days later."

The first step was to secure funding, explained Slattery and Dievendorf, and so they went to the town and

were awarded a microenterprise grant in September for \$25,000 to purchase machinery and equipment.

"When you apply for that, you have to have a business plan in place," said Slattery. "So that kind of gave us an idea of what we all wanted. We had a lot of the same ideas and were really on the same page about a lot of things, which was really inspiring." She said the support they received from town officials was also encouraging.

Bliss Juice Bar and Fitness will provide a respite for those traveling along the rail trail, as well as a haven for anyone who wants a healthy treat, to do some guided

#### **Bethlehem Yard Waste Collection**

**BETHLEHEM** — From May to October, properly prepared yard waste is picked up by the town Highway Department and is composted at the town's compost facility.

Yard waste must be placed in reusable containers or paper bags. Brush and branches under four feet in length should be piled neatly along the sides of the road, not so high or so wide as to obstruct roadways or line of sight and not in the roadway itself.

Acceptable items include leaves, grass and hedge clippings placed at curbside in reusable containers or in biodegradable paper bags not over 50 pounds per container, as well as brush and branches under four feet in length stacked neatly at curbside. No other items or materials are accepted, and all non-conforming items will not be collected. No brush or trees from private contractors will be accepted.

# Public hearing set for next Tuesday

Opportunity for residents to comment on three pieces of proposed legislation

ALBANY — County residents will have the opportunity to weigh in on two proposed laws and one resolution that are expected to go before the county Legislature as early as next month. A public hearing has been scheduled for Tuesday, May 29, at 7:15 p.m. at the Albany County Courthouse on Eagle Street in Albany to allow community members to share their thoughts on: county-wide mandated sick leave; a law that would require new residences to be equipped with fire sprinkler systems; and proposed modifications to local agricultural districts.

#### Sick Leave

According to legislators who introduced the law, 40 percent of workers in Albany County do not have access to paid sick leave at their jobs. Per the legislation, which was introduced at the legislative meeting on Monday, March 12, by Chairman Andrew Joyce and other Democratic members, paid sick leave can "diminish public and private health care costs and promote preventative health services in Albany County by enabling workers to seek early and routine medical care for themselves and their family members."

Under the law, all employees in Albany County would accrue one hour of sick time for every 30 hours worked. There are variations for annual limits based on the size of the business and any unused sick time would roll over to the following year, unless the employer opts to pay the employee for that unused time.

Employees would be entitled to use their time to care for themselves or their family (including "any individual related by blood or affinity whose close association with the employee is the equivalent of a family relationship") through sickness, injury, diagnosis, a health "condition" or while receiving preventative care. They could also use accrued sick leave when they

or their family member's place of employment closes due to a public health emergency or when either has been the victim of domestic or sexual abuse or human trafficking, including time to meet with attorneys, relocate or file legal reports. Sick time can be used in the "smallest time increments that the employer's payroll system uses to account for absences or other time,"

Documentation may be required after three consecutive days of absence. Some employers may require advance notice while others may require confirmation that the employee used the time for their stated purposes.

Citing things such as job security, domestic violence, and public contagion, Local Law "C" for 2018 says passage of the law "is necessary to ensure that all workers in Albany County can address their own health and safety needs and the health and safety needs of their families by requiring employers to provide a

# Legislators approve ban on tobacco products in stores with pharmacies

ALBANY — On Monday, May 14, Albany County legislators approved a ban on the sale of tobacco and nicotine-based products in pharmacies and stores that have pharmacies by a vote of 26 to 11.

Advocates of the law say the sale of addictive and deadly products in stores that are supposed to make people well is counterproductive, if not outright hypocritical.

According to the legislation, studies show that tobacco sales decline "significantly" when pharmacies stop selling those products. "Also," reads the bill, "easy access to tobacco retailers

makes it harder for smokers to quit particularly in low-income areas.'

County Executive Daniel McCoy, who vetoed a similar bill in 2014, has to sign the law before it is filed with the state. If he does, it will take effect three months after the filing. McCoy opposed the 2014 bill due to the fact that it included no enforcement mechanism. Local Law "A" of 2018 would charge the county health commissioner with fining stores in violation up to \$500 a day.

According to the Office of the County Executive, there will be a public hearing on the law on Thursday, May 31, at 10:30 a.m. in the ninth floor training room of the county office building at 112 State Street in Albany.

Republican legislators Paul Burgdorf, Todd Drake, Mark Grimm, Brian Hogan, Patrice Lockart, Frank Mauriello, Richard Mendick, Travis Stevens and Peter Tunny were joined by Democratic legislators Ralph Signoracci and Christopher Smith in opposing the law. Peter Crouse, the only Republican not to vote against the ban, abstained and Democrat Alison McLean Lane was absent that evening.

Dozens of Albany County retailers would be affected, including Price Chopper, Hannaford, ShopRite, Walgreens and Walmart.

There was a round of applause in the Legislative Chamber after the votes were tallied near the end of the May 14 meeting.

While it may have been chilly and damp outside Saturday, the competition was heated and intense inside a Colonie Central High School gymnasium during the Greater Capital Region STEAM Exposition. A total of 21 projects were presented by high school students from around the Capital District. This year's grand prize winner is Febronia Mansour of Guilderland Central High School, who received \$650. Mansour used different mutations that have been confirmed to have correlations to Alzheimer's disease in humans and incorporated them into a large model of a microscopic worm. "... if we can't understand Alzheimer's at the human level, chances are we will probably be able to understand it in a smaller scale and that in turn informs our understanding of it in humans," she said. "We see these problems and we want to have great big, big breakthroughs but sometimes it takes going down to a simpler level to understand the problem or the situation in that smaller organism before we can understand it in a larger one."

minimum level of earned paid sick time, including time to care for their family members."

If passed on Monday, June 11, the law would take effect 180 days later.

## **Fire Sprinkler Law**

Advocates of Local Law "I" for 2018 require fire sprinklers in new residential construction in Albany County have pointed to newer, lighter and more flammable construction materials as well as open floor plan designs as the reason for implementing the new standard, stating that studies have shown that new homes burn eight times faster than legacy homes built from different materials.

In 2012, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reported that sprinklers not only reduce civilian deaths by 83 percent and reduce property damage by 69 percent, but they also reduce the amount of water necessary to extinguish the fire by as much as 90 percent.

"Experience from the State of Maryland," reads the bill, "which mandates home fire sprinklers, shows that there has not been a fatality from a home fire in a sprinklered home since they mandated their use."

Under the law, the county would enact the requirements of the International Building Code, which was adopted by the state after removing the sprinkler requirement. Any new construction of one- or two-family homes and town homes

would be required to have a sprinkler system that conforms to NFPA standards after January 1,

If passed, county municipalities would have 60 days to amend their local building codes or the county will assume enforcement and deduct the costs from sales tax receipts due to that municipality.

## **Agricultural Districts**

According to The New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, the purpose of agricultural districting is "to encourage and promote the continued use of farmland for agricultural production. The program is based on a combination of landowner incentives and protections, all of which are designed to forestall the conversion of farmland to non-agricultural uses. Benefits that properties in State-certified Agricultural Districts receive are partial real property tax relief (agricultural assessment and special benefit assessments), and protections against overly restrictive local laws, government funded acquisition or construction projects, and private nuisance suits involving agricultural practices."

Each year, the county holds a 30-day review period, during which landowners can request to be included in an agricultural district. Seven parcels, a total of 264.5 acres, were submitted for consideration in February, six of which were recommended for inclusion by the Albany County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board. Of the recommended parcels, six acres are in Knox, 120 acres are in Berne, 41.5 acres are in Rensselaerville and 97 acres are in Coeymans.

# **Modernization Task Force proposes** online legislation tracking system

ALBANY — A Democrat and a Republican have proposed a sweeping modernization plan for the legislature that would not only make its proceedings more accessible to county residents, but dramatically reduce paper waste

The resolution would allow any citizen or media member to track the status of any proposal from its inception to final disposition online. It would also allow immediate online access to members' votes and attendance records. The modernization plan would also provide a searchable database so a constituent could put in a topic (i.e. redistricting) and find the list of votes on that particular topic, with links to the resolution description and voting

It would also eliminate the use of thousands of sheets of paper used each month for committee and legislative meetings by creating electronic documents for all of them. The public and media would have unfettered access to all such documents.

Co-chairs of the Modernization Task Force, Lynne Lekakis and Mark Grimm, are the resolution's co-sponsors.

"It is amazing and difficult to calculate just how much time will be saved by staff and legislators, but what is easy to calculate is the impact on interested citizens," said Deputy Majority Leader Lynne Lekakis (D-Albany). "Imagine being able to easily find information on a proposal that went out last year, or yesterday. It is time for us all to share in the positive technology of the 21st

"Communication today is about transparency and engagement," said Finance Committee Vice Chair Mark Grimm (R-Guilderland). "This comprehensive plan will make it much easier for citizens to understand and follow what we are doing and therefore more likely to become part of the discussion."

The resolution was submitted on Thursday, May 3, and was referred to committee for review during the full legislature meeting on Monday, May 14.

# It's a matter of common sense

here is a bill pending in the state Legislature that would require those mandated to report the abuse or neglect of the disabled to call 911 rather than the Vulnerable Persons Central Registry, which was established and maintained by the Justice Center for the Protection of Persons with Special Needs.

Calling 911 has been ingrained in our conscious since a young age and we, in turn, have told our own children to call those three numbers in the event of a crisis or emergency.

It's intuitive.

But, the way the current law reads, a mandated reporter — a long list of professions and employees working with or near the

disabled and/or children — must call the vulnerable persons central registry. There is nothing preventing that same mandated reporter from calling 911 too, but he or she must call the Justice Center's registry.

It could be argued that the way things work now is similar to how mandated reporters report child abuse to the statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment, better known as the "hotline." But, when a mandated reporter notifies the hotline, that information is transferred to the local Department of Social Services or the equivalent of such agency in each county and they take appropriate action.

Not so when a disabled person is abused or neglected. Instead, that

goes to Vulnerable Persons Central Registry. That is maintained by the Delmarbased Justice Center and they have the power and discretion to conduct their own investigations. A mandated reporter in Buffalo would have to call Delmar. Same goes for Long Island and New York City and Plattsburgh.

The Justice Center, on its website, states a mandated reporter — or anyone should call 911 in the event of an immediate crisis or if the subject of the call is in immediate danger. But, if the Justice Center does receive the call, and there is no sense of immediacy attached, it may investigate the most serious cases of abuse and neglect without involving local law enforcement.

We are not criticizing Justice Center investigators but those investigations should be left to the local authorities who are in closer proximity to where any incident occurs - like in the same county - and can quickly conduct an investigation and, if need be, collect and secure evidence in a more timely fashion.

The 911 bill currently in the Senate and Assembly committees would make is not perfect by any means. How injuries or signs of neglect are defined, and what would force a phone call to authorities, are much too broad and if passed as written the bill could cause more confusion than is present now.

But, the basic premise is on point - local mandated

reporters should call 911 any time there is a question about abuse or neglect.

There are those, like Michael Carey, a tireless advocate for the disabled, who claim it is a Civil Rights issue. We think it is more about common sense. If it were solely a civil rights issue, then every mandated reporter who calls the "hotline" to report child abuse has violated that child's civil rights?

Of course not.

The child abuse and/ or neglect "hotline" has worked well for years. One reason it does is because investigations are handled at the local level rather than a disconnected state agency that has been under near constant fire since it opened its doors in 2013.





There will be a walkup window and picnic tables, as well as an exterior entrance directly to the restroom, for those who prefer to remain outdoors. There will be a bike rack for cyclists.

"There are really no other places to stop [along the rail trail]," said Dievendorf. "There's Stewart's. That's the only bathroom and place to

get something that's right on the rail trail. You can stop and get off and head to Delaware Plaza, but you have to go through the woods, it's not really stroller friendly or handicap-accessible at all, so this would provide a place."

The business will be the first to get approval from the county to connect to the trail, at least legally. While it has received approval from the Albany County Planning Board, it still requires approval from the full legislature to install a pathway, with handrail, leading to the rail trail.

"So this is setting precedent," said Dievendorf, explaining that Bliss Juice Bar and Fitness is the first business to go through the proper channels to build a connection to the county-owned trail. "We're the first to, literally, pave the way for this." She said that connection will be "phase two" of the project, as they don't know when that approval will be forthcoming.

"We get to move ahead with the rest of it, though,' she said.

According to Slattery and Dievendorf,

construction is next. While they've found someone to help with the major renovations, family and friends are going to help with the bulk of the work.

While she hoped to open "last week," realistically, Slattery said the goal is to be open sometime in July.

After Slattery and Dievendorf received the approval to move forward during the Planning Board's meeting on Tuesday, May 15, board member Scott Lewendon praised the project, saying, "I think it's a great project and I thank you for all your consideration of making that connection to the rail trail and I wish you a lot of success."

"We want people to feel better when they leave than when they came in," said Dievendorf. "Whatever that means for them. If it's the meditation, if they need a break from their busy day or need to get some movement into their day or something healthy that they don't have to stress about. They can grab and then go back to what they were doing, whether they were on the trail or at work. We want to be a friendly place for them."





# Intimate night in Smallbany

518 Songfest at The Egg provides offered special moments shared between musicians and fans

ALBANY — 518 Songfest at The Egg proved to be an intimate experience between songwriters, performers and fans throughout the night on Friday, May 18. Some of the best stories, however, happened prior to the show.

Below, we've captured the evening through vignettes under each artist.

#### **Sydney Worthley**

Michael Worthley looks with a smile on his face as Rose Gabriel puts the finishing touches upon the merchandise table. It's two hours before 518 Songfest at The Egg, and everyone is getting ready. She just placed battery-operated tea light candles in each of several miniature lanterns.

"It's looking good," he said, with the sound of appreciation in his voice.

She looks up with a smile on her face and shares how someone already asked how much the lanterns were going for.

"Priceless," she said.

Rose and her husband Andrew Gabriel make it their jobs to make his daughter, Sydney, look good. The owners of Ambassador Music Group have been doing just that since Sydney dropped her debut album last September.

Michael shakes his head when asked how things are going. He and his wife, Shauna, are sports parents. They're accustomed to corralling the kids and traveling long hours on the road for their son's hockey games in Buffalo or in Plattsburgh. Sydney's burgeoning music career has added another wrinkle to that lifestyle. The two parents helped convince their son to put a hold on hockey. He's since transitioned to soccer. The family just recently returned from Ohio, where the Gabriels hoped to persuade one of the largest radio stations in the Midwest for more airplay by offering facetime and an interview. Michael shows off a few pictures from when the family stole away a few hours to visit the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland.

The local music scene has looked at Sydney and asked two common questions;

The first is, "Who is this?," once asked in a disconcerting tone. Here was this local girl with a 14-track CD with a high-polish shine. It made no sense until you popped it into a player and listened.

Then, the following question, "Where'd she come from?" would follow with surprise.

"We thought Tulip Fest was big," said Michael, at which Sydney played only last May. Next month she'll be at Mountain Jam. She'll play at one of the largest festivals in the Northeast, on the same playbill as Grammy Award-winning artists Sturgill Simpson, The War on Drugs and Portugal. The Man.

Nonetheless, Michael said, she hasn't developed an ego. Her softball teammates have nicknamed her "Famous." But, he said, there's still plenty of her classmates who don't know who she is.

#### Lori Gold

Lori Gold listens attentively while seated in the auditorium with her companion as Super 400 conducts its sound check on stage. Despite attending the show as the night's special guest, the Grammy Award-winning artist sits unassuming while attendees prepare the theater.

Gold is from Pennsylvania and lives in New York City. In this one-day festival focused on showcasing music from the 518 area code, the commonality she shares with the region is her proximity to the Hudson River

"I love this piano," she exclaimed during her own sound check. "I could play it forever, but The Egg would kick me out."

The river served as inspiration for her song, "Love Is Love Is Love." Later in the evening, while introducing the song to the Songfest crowd, she shared her fascination with the river.

Each morning, at 9 a.m., Gold would call and speak with her mother while walking along the banks of the Hudson River in New York. Gold's mother



immigrated to America and processed at Liberty Island in 1930. She was a part of what she called the "great generation" of people who left their homeland for a better life for their children. As she watched the river roll past, Gold said she imagined that some of that same water helped bring her mother to America.

Gold fell in love with music while watching The Beatles on the Ed Sullivan Show when she was 8 years old. Her first

piece of music was a 45 of Petula Clark's "Downtown. Within its dust cover was the mystery behind finding who "T. Hatch" was. Gold approached her mother, only to learn that there was such a thing as a songwriter. "Before that moment, I thought songs were always there," she said. Tony Hatch, the songwriter behind the words to "Downtown," was "one of the lucky ones" to create them.

When it looked like music would be in Gold's life, her mother didn't stand in the way. She was open to all sorts of music. In their home, rock and roll was not the "Devil's Music," she said. When Gold introduced friends to her mother, with music ever-present in her life, she would always ask what instrument they played. On those morning phone calls — despite her clockwork-like frequency — Gold's mother would answer, "Oh, Jules! I was

hoping it was you." Last year, on the last day of summer, Gold's mother died. She said it was the most appropriate time for who she called the "most beautiful of people."

"Everyday, for all those years, I had her in my life. Until just recently."

#### Super 400

Hohman said he learned to appreciate playing acoustically while teaching people the guitar.

Hohman, Friday and the band's drummer Joe Daley sat inside the auditorium to talk about catching a quick dinner before the show when Lori Gold interrupted.

Gold was listening in on the sound check and wanted to compliment each of them on their musicianship. Before long, a genuine moment of musicians bonding over their craft ensued. Hohman immediately complimented Gold on her "radiating positivity" and the two hugged.

Musicians have a natural curiosity to learn how another started in music.





The following recipe for "Barbecued Shrimp" from Neal Corman's "Virgil's Barbecue Road Trip Cookbook" (St. Martin's Press) is flavorful and simple, making it an ideal meal for barbecue fans who enjoy making their own meals.

# Ingredients — Serves four to six

Garlic Barbecue Sauce

- 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- 1 teaspoon chopped garlic
- 1 cup mild barbecue sauce
- 2 tablespoons Virgil's Dry Rub (see below)

#### Shrimp

- 8 6-inch bamboo skewers
- 2 pounds fresh jumbo shrimp
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 4 tablespoons Virgil's Dry Rub (see below)
- 2 lemons, cut into wedges

## **Directions**

In a small pot over medium-high

heat, combine 1 tablespoon of butter and the garlic for the garlic sauce. Sauté the garlic for 1 minute, add the mild barbecue sauce and Virgil's Dry Rub, and heat to a boil. Remove from the heat, whisk in the remaining butter, and set aside to use as needed. Soak the skewers in water overnight. Peel and devein the shrimp, leaving the tails on. Lay 4 shrimp out on a flat surface. Align them so that they are coiled with the tails on the same side, facing in the same direction. Slide a skewer through the shrimp. Run another skewer through the shrimp, parallel to the first and about 1/2 inch apart. (This will prevent the shrimp from spinning on a skewer.) Repeat this process until all of the shrimp are skewered. Brush one side of the shrimp on the skewers with olive oil, then dust with the dry rub. Flip the skewers over the repeat the process. Place the seasoned skewered shrimp in a container, cover, and refrigerate overnight. Preheat the grill to high heat. Reduce to medium heat and position the skewers over direct heat. Grill for 2 minutes, then flip and grill for 1 to 2 minutes more. Remove the skewers from the grill and brush each with 2 tablespoons of the garlic sauce. Serve with lemon wedges.

# Giving fat the cold shoulder

Fat-freezing tech 'heating' up

at freezing is billed as a treatment that can eliminate people's fat cells in predominately troublesome areas of the body to create a slim physique. Also known as cryolipolysis, this noninvasive procedure is attracting a growing number of people interested in reshaping areas of their bodies without the need for going under the knife.

This was the science
behind cryolipolysis.

Cles. The doctors developed a system to deliver precisely controlled cooling to target fat cells under the skin. The crystalized cells die and are naturally eliminated from the body through time.

"There's going to be a flood of people coming in later, so let's get this started," he said


The folk artists did well to keep the atmosphere jovial. Despite the talent promised that night, the Swyer Theater did not sell out. However, the night developed into an intimate experience.

# Freeze fat

CoolSculpting technology, the FDA found the procedures offered "clinically meaningful" changes in 60 patients after treatment for the reduction of love handles. Six months after treatment, ultrasound measurements found an average 19 percent reduction of the targeted fat layer.

During a roughly onehour treatment session, a vacuum device pulls on fat bulges and exposes the fat to cold. It may take several treatments to achieve desired results, and decreases in fat do not immediately occur, but can be seen two to four months later, on average. Treatments are not covered by insurance and can range from \$750 to \$2,000 per area.

Currently, there are no safety concerns, but the technology is still very new and there are no long-term study results. Side effects can include temporary redness, swelling, blanching, bruising, firmness, tingling, stinging, tenderness, cramping, aching, itching, or skin sensitivity, offers CoolSculpting. According to the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, CoolSculpting accounted for almost half of all body-sculpting treatments in 2016.

Freezing fat cells is another way that people may be able to rid themselves of stubborn, unwanted fat.





# Winter folk

Her tags don't mislead you. Her 2017 release "Book of Belonging" is a string of soulful songs about heartbreak, loss, and often times tripping over the mistakes of falling back into the bed of an ex-lover.

"While all my songs are personal to me and often specific, I want people to walk away with feeling connected to them through their own experiences," said Strumfeld. "Which is usually the case for all music anyway."

#### **Book of Belonging:**

This is my book of belonging:

How I've never belonged to anyone, any place, any time.

This is my story of longing:

How I've longed for someone every day of my life.

And then I met you. I'm lost from that, And I hold onto that, So this whole damn thing is for you.

Strumfeld's voice and acoustic guitar dominate in each recording, with a little bit of bluegrass and a smidge of Gillian Welch, whose name she drops on the second track "New Girl."

"I love Gillian. She's ballsy," said



Strumfeld. "[She] sings about beauty and darkness, all with this gorgeous voice that truly never gets old. And her musical chemistry with her guitarist Dave Rawlings is the kind of musical relationship I crave. It's flawless." Strumfeld said the song was inspired after a night of running into not one, but two ex-partners. Michael Jenkins, who plays upright bass on the CD, was listening to Welch with her that night. In addition to Welch, Strumfeld listens to mostly female songwriters — Joni Mitchell, Carly Simon, Laura Marling, June Carter.

This winter folk music lulls you in like a hot cup of coffee next to warm fire in

February. But, like the cruelest of fates, the point of the year that promises love on Valentine's Day is also the month when most couples split. "Second Plate" wraps you into a false sense of security being alone, never minding you're stuck in the same routines of brewing coffee and fixing dinner for two.

Strumfeld is a writer. The metronome for her speech sways a little slower. With a pensive stare, she takes in her surroundings while fully engaged in conversation. Like the late Tom Wolfe, she is saturated into the moments that surround her so she can later write about it. When her stint with newspaper journalism ended at Spotlight News, she picked up and moved to Greenland to be a farm hand. She said, she wanted to know how if felt.

Strumfeld gets to writing only when she's inspired. That inspiration comes in spurts that maybe spans once every two years or so. Not by coincidence, that's about the same time interval between each of her broken relationships. The raw emotion from each romantic bond severed is poured into lyrics. She said, it's almost understood now that when a man comes into her life he is committed to one of two outcomes: a relationship, or a song.

Part of that emotional cycle includes what had been an on-again, off-again relationship with live performances. The songs would come, followed by the performances, and then it would stop until the inspiration came back again. Last year, Strumfeld deviated from that pattern. Last September, she was asked to perform at Sydney Worthley's CD-release party at Jupiter Hall. The band she had asked to perform on her own CD agreed to perform. A few more pieces were added to the band as a one-time fling for the live performance, but afterwards, they all wanted something more. Practices were scheduled and more gigs were planned. They fooled around and fell into a band.

Strumfeld and her band will play at Rare Form Brewing Company as part of Troy Night Out this Friday, May 25.
