Wanted man taken into custody after foot chase

COEYMANS —

Troopers from the New York State Police barracks in New Scotland arrested 26- year-old Joseph S. Persico on Sunday, May 20.

Troopers reportedly determined that Persico, who was wanted on an active state parole warrant, was in the Coeymans area. According to state police, Persico fled on foot

from a residence on Alcove Road when troopers arrived. With the assistance of the Albany County Sheriff's Department, the Coeymans Police and the NYS Park Police, Persico was found a short time later hiding in a wooded area near the Alcove Reservoir where he was taken into custody.

Persico was lodged at the Albany County jail on the warrant, and is now in state parole custody.

Former property manager charged with felony larceny

GUILDERLAND—On Thursday, May 24, Jamie L. Bonkoski, 41, of Cohoes, was arrested for second-degree grand larceny, a class C felony. It is alleged that

Bonkoski, while working as the property manager at Deer Valley Apartments, located at 11 Farnsworth Drive in Guilderland, stole in excess of \$50,000 by making unauthorized personal purchases using the corporate checking account, stealing renters' security deposits and fees, and receiving personal services from tenants in lieu of rent.

She was arraigned in front of Guilderland Town Judge Napierski, who set bail at \$5,000.

27 arrested at Capitol, more protests expected

ALBANY—On Monday, May 21, approximately 200 protesters from the New York State Poor People's Campaign converged on the state Capitol after marching down Washington Avenue in Albany. Once inside the building, protesters blocked the entrances from Washington Avenue, State Street and a tunnel from the concourse. As a result, 27 arrests were made by state troopers for disorderly conduct, a violation. These subjects were released with appearance tickets returnable to the City of Albany Court.

One of the individuals, Peter G. Heltzel, 48, of New York City, was arrested for disorderly conduct, resisting arrest, a class A misdemeanor, and second degree assault, a class D felony, after he actively resisted being taken into custody and allegedly injured a state trooper.

Both the injured trooper and Heltzel were treated and released from Albany Memorial Hospital.

Heltzel was held at Albany County jail and arraigned the following day in the City of Albany Court.

More protests are expected in the coming weeks.

Excelling at excellence

State recognizes two BCSD teachers for their dedication to education

BETHLEHEM—Two

Bethlehem educators received 2018 Empire State Excellence in Teaching Awards earlier this month. Bethlehem Central Middle School Spanish teacher Shannon Lundgren and Eagle Elementary School fourth grade teacher Julianna Palomba were both recognized for classroom innovation and a commitment to sharing best practices with fellow educators.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo created the Empire State Excellence in Teaching Program in 2016 to support exemplary teachers across New York state who "foster creativity, instill a love of learning, motivate students to maintain high expectations and academic goals, and make a difference in the lives of students."The program recognizes 60 teachers from around New York state who work to prepare a new generation of learners for the

Lundgren, a longtime teacher at the middle school, coordinates the district's Teacher Mentor program, which pairs veteran educators with new teachers to provide support, encouragement and understanding in an effort to ensure their success in the classroom.

Lundgren not only learned that she had been selected for the honor, but was also presented with the award on Monday, May 7, in front of a packed room during a regularly scheduled faculty meeting. The surprised teacher received a standing ovation from both faculty and staff, along with a surprise visit from her husband, David.

Daniel Fuller, assistant secretary for education under Gov. Cuomo, presented Lundgren with the award.

"Teachers of excellence hold high expectations for every student and provide access to higher levels of learning for all," said Daniel Fuller, Gov. Andrew Cuomo's assistant secretary for education. "We want to acknowledge these teachers, we want to thank them, give them a prize and have them tell their stories so others can be inspired by them.

"And now it's happening at Bethlehem Middle School," he said.

Lundgren received \$5,000 to use for professional development purposes, in the form of an oversized cardboard check presented by Fuller and the Governor's Capital Region representative Jeff Quain.

While Monday's award presentation was a surprise for Lundgren, school leaders — including BCMS principal Mike Klugman learned the good news the previous week, and were asked to keep it under wraps until the formal presentation.

"Shannon is extraordinarily deserving," said Klugman. "While her work in her classroom continues to be exemplary as is her work with our new teachers, she also remains passionate about her own

learning. Her learning curve is phenomenal because she is immune to complacency."

At Eagle, students and staff from every grade assembled in the gym on Monday, May 21, for Palomba's surprise announcement. Principal Dianna Reagan also arranged for her family to be present for the award presentation.

"Since Julianna first walked into Eagle as a student teacher, she has been energetic, happy, dedicated and just loves being with kids," said Reagan. "Over the last two years, she has grown to be an outstanding educator who goes above and beyond to make learning meaningful, challenging and joyful.

"She is a teacher who constantly wants to better her teaching skills and enjoys working with others to be the best she can be. We are extremely lucky to have such a talented teacher at BC."

Palomba also received \$5,000 for professional development, which also came as an oversized cardboard check presented by Fuller, himself a BCHS graduate, and the parent of a Hamagrael student.

"I am pleased, honored, and humbled to accept this award with my Eagle family whom I admire and appreciate so much," said Palomba. "I want to thank my students for making me love teaching more and more every day and to my colleagues for keeping me afloat my first few years teaching.

Bethlehem Yard Waste Collection

BETHLEHEM — From May to October, properly prepared yard waste is picked up by the town Highway Department and is composted at the town's compost facility.

Yard waste must be placed in reusable containers or paper bags. Brush and branches under four feet in length should be piled neatly along the sides of the road, not so high or so wide as to obstruct roadways or line of sight and not in the roadway itself.

Acceptable items include leaves, grass and hedge clippings placed at curbside in reusable containers or in biodegradable paper bags not over 50 pounds per container, as well as brush and branches under four feet in length stacked neatly at curbside. No other items or materials are accepted, and all non-conforming items will not be collected. No brush or trees from private contractors will be accepted.

Educating the board

Outgoing Bethlehem Board of Ed member shares what she learned in nine years

fter serving nine years on the Bethlehem Central School District Board of Education, outgoing member Charmaine Wijeyesinghe had some insight and advice for the two incoming members who will take their seats in July.

She decided to leave the board after this term, she said, because, "There were other things I wanted to do professionally and I felt like it was time to dedicate more time and attention to that." While she noted the fact that her youngest will be graduating from the district this year, she said that wasn't the deciding

Serving as an effective board member requires a significant time commitment, explained Wijeyesinghe. "Some people think it's just meeting twice a week, but we all serve on committees and

"For the most part, I enjoyed my time on the board. I've had some great colleagues over the years. I gained a lot of good friends and a real appreciation for the complexity of the organization. And, it's a great way to do community service."

have to take the time to review materials between meetings. So it is a substantial commitment and it made sense for me to be going at this time so I can spend time doing other things.'

"I jokingly tell people my hair was black when I started," she said with a smile.

Wijeyesinghe joined the board after attending meetings for more than a year in an effort to get them to paint Elsmere Elementary School, where she served as PTA president at the time. "And, as you know, the public comment period for issues not on the agenda is at the end of the meeting. So I sat through a year and a half of meetings. And after watching them and seeing that, wow, they're covering lots of different issues, I thought, I could do this."

During her time on the board, Wijeyesinghe said that she gained an appreciation for the complexity of district operations. "It is a complex organization with lots of moving parts, but understanding how many parts and how many people contribute to this district was a great gift," she said.

"I would tell board members to continually seek out opportunities to understand the role of the board," she said. "A lot of community members will say they're interested in joining the board because of a single issue. Being a board member is not a single issue. It's not defending a single school, it's not watching out for a single area of the program like athletics or theatre. It's being

Financial disclosure

Comptroller Michael Cohen presents 2017 financial report, outlines future considerations

BETHLEHEM — The Town of Bethlehem was left with less of a budgetary surplus after 2017 than it has had in years past.

Town Comptroller Michael Cohen said there was no need to worry when presenting the information to the Town Board on Wednesday, May 23; however, it is the first time in four years the town's fund balance has dipped below the maximum percentage identified under a spending policy it established in 2012.

The fund balance percentage is calculated by taking the unassigned fund balances at the end of each year, as a percentage of the following year's budgeted appropriations. In 2012, the town decided that 15 percent is optimal and 20 percent should be the maximum. Conversely, the minimum is set at 7 percent.

Beginning in 2013, the town has been able to maintain the maximum balance at the end of each year in each of its fundsgeneral, highway, water and sewer. When the fund balance exceeds 20 percent, the additional money is put into a capital reserve fund to be used for infrastructure projects, thereby reducing the amount of money the town has to borrow to pay for those larger projects.

While, "despite weather-related challenges," the town still ended 2017 with a net surplus across all four funds, the balance in the general fund dropped to 17.3 percent due to increased debt service costs, primarily related to two things:

Appropriations grew by \$849,000 due to the renovation of the Adams Street building to be used by Delmar-Bethlehem EMS and the Delaware Avenue Streetscape Enhancement project, as well as increased police operating costs after the department added staff; and

The town pre-paid a \$992,000 workers comp invoice, which allowed savings of 2 percent, but rendered that money "nonspendable."

Cohen discussed several changes that affected town finances throughout the year: bad weather, which required more highway resources and reduced solar power generation; decreased mortgage taxes, which Cohen called "very difficult" to predict, and decreased composting sales; decreased water and sewer revenues; and a variety of other variables, none of which were entirely unexpected.

Cohen also spoke about the current fiscal year and beyond. New debt payments will cost \$561,000 annually, across all four funds, beginning this year and lasting through 2042—"Long after I'm gone," he said. The final payment on a 10-year police pension bond, however, will be made this year, freeing up \$263,000 in the general fund annually.

Based on a consumer price index projected to be "quite a bit" above 2 percent, Cohen said he expects the calculated 2019 tax cap will be 2 percent — the first time the town has been able to levy the full 2 percent — since 2013. A 2 percent tax levy increase, he said, would net the town approximately \$274,000 to be shared across all four major funds, as

well as the EMS fund. That amount, he explained, is a little more than half of what it would cost to give town employees a 2 percent cost-of-living wage increase.

Cohen also noted that an expected savings of \$73,000 has not materialized in 2018, as the progress on a tri-county shared emergency dispatch and records

system spearheaded by Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple has been stalled.

Upcoming projects expected to incur more debt include replacing gutters at the town pool complex, installation of a roundabout on Route 9W, replacement of water mains and upgrades to the Clapper Road Water Treatment Plant.

The Garden is a 10 x 20 foot plot with access to tools and water. There will be one chair-high raised bed and several lower raised beds. mindful of the district's commitment to all its programs, it's being mindful of the commitment to the staff and faculty, and you have to be cognizant of the needs of the community, too. So, understanding the role of the board is a fundamental thing that people have to learn and maintain foremost in their minds."

According to Wijeyesinghe, the Board of Education has three major functions: developing policy, approving a budget and overseeing the district superintendent. "The superintendent is our employee," she explained, saying it's the board's responsibility to hire, supervise and, when necessary, fire the superintendent. "The superintendent is answerable to the board. Every year, there's an evaluation process that is ongoing throughout the

year. At the end of the

academic year, any contract

extension or raise in salary,

which is a matter of public record, is done by the board."

To serve effectively, Wijeyesinghe recommends that board members take advantage of various training opportunities throughout the year, offered by state and capital area school board associations such as the New York State School Boards Association, which holds regional sessions throughout the year and holds a statewide conference each fall. She also said to not be afraid to ask questions.

"It's important to be informed," she said. "So if you don't know, keep asking questions. Even though sometimes votes are pressing, try not to vote if you don't understand. Don't vote if you don't have enough information."

While votes are often taken several at a time and without much conversation during the bimonthly meetings, Wijeyesinghe said that thoroughly reviewing the materials between those meetings is extremely important. More divisive or complicated issues can sometimes require more public conversation, she noted, saying that she might even prompt conversation or ask questions she knew the answers to at times when she felt the public might need more understanding of the issue at hand.

"I gained a huge understanding of education," she said. "And not only that, my family did. Because when my kids were younger, we went through a couple of really tough budget cycles. And it's all public, so I could discuss it at the dinner table with them.

"For the most part, I enjoyed my time on the board," Wijeyesinghe said. "I've had some great colleagues over the years. I gained a lot of good friends and a real appreciation for the complexity of the organization.

"And," she added, "it's a great way to do community service."

Good inking

"We do as much charity as we can," explained Holly Robinson, one of Resolute Tattoo's owners. "Last week, we did a Mother's Day flash. We put together a sheet of mom tattoos and we donated the proceeds to benefit the Prevent Cancer Foundation."

The Get What You Get for Charity fundraiser serves two purposes, she said. Resolute chooses a worthwhile charity to donate the proceeds to each month while promoting classic tattoos at the same

"It's kind of a way to get them out into the world and remind people that they exist and that they're really awesome," said Robinson, who has several books of classic designs lying around the place. "So, we wanted to give back in a cool way. Plus, it invites sort of a fun kind of person. Because the uptight are not going to be okay with getting whatever tattoo comes out."

She said it tends to bring in those who already have multiple tattoos. "There's some pretty wacky stuff in there," she said, looking at the capsule machine. "I kept it tasteful, but there's definitely some

weird stuff in there." A crying baby face ended up on one man's chest and a pregnant hula girl now adorns another woman's ankle. "She was aghast when it came out," Robinson said, laughing. "But she was like, Tm gonna do it no matter what comes out!' And she did."

"The most exciting part is watching them see what they've gotten," said Dan Belcher, another tattoo artist and owner at Resolute, as well as Robinson's fiancé.

Carly Hillmann, of Altamont, pulled a devil's face out of the machine on Wednesday, May 23, and said, "I love it!" before becoming the 51st "daring and caring" customer in about as many days to let fate choose her tattoo.

"That one's awesome," exclaimed Belcher.

"That is a classic Jerry piece," said Robinson, referring to a style made popular by a former Navy man named Norman Collins, aka Sailor Jerry, in Hawaii during World War II. Collins combined vivid color, bold (and, often, bawdy) iconography and the techniques of Japanese tattoo masters

to come up with a new style of tattooing. He was also innovative on a technical level, pioneering modern tattoo machines, sterilization techniques and purple ink.

Hillmann said she heard of the fundraiser and is a fan of the charities they've chosen, and she was inspired to take advantage of the opportunity to benefit a good cause and add a little art to her life. "I love dogs," she said, noting that the tattoo would be benefiting Upstate Underdog Rescue.

Those who would really prefer not to permanently ink themselves with the tattoo they receive are welcome to try again for another \$20. According to Robinson, one individual ended up spending \$200 before they got one they liked. But, she said, most customers are happy well before that point.

The fundraiser has been so successful that Resolute has begun taking appointments. Walk-ins are still welcome, but there's no guarantee an artist will be available. In June, proceeds from GWYGFC tattoos will go to Street Soldiers, an organization dedicated to helping the homeless.

"You can always use another tattoo," said Hillmann.

The growing threat of vaping

igarette smoking continues to decline among pre-teens and teenagers according to a survey from Monitoring the Future. But the number of young people who are vaping or smoking e-cigarettes has increased. This underscores the importance of greater education for youngsters and their parents about the potential hazards of vaping.

A study from researchers at the Department of Psychiatry at Yale University School of Medicine that was published in the journal Pediatrics found the rising frequency of e-cigarette use was a significant risk factor for future conventional cigarette use. In the study, researchers surveyed 1,408 Connecticut high school students three times, in autumn 2013, spring 2014 and autumn 2015, on their use of e-cigarettes and traditional tobacco

cigarettes. Teens who used an e-cigarette within a month of participating in the survey in 2013 had seven times greater odds of smoking tobacco cigarettes in 2014. A year later, e-cigarette users were more than three times more likely to smoke tobacco cigarettes.

Vaping ads may be enticing kids, too. Cigarette ads glamorizing smoking have all but vanished.
However, vaping ads are becoming more noticeable. According to a National Youth Tobacco Survey, about seven in 10 middle and high school students were exposed to e-cigarette advertisements in 2014, when the vaping trend began to explode.

Even though e-cigarettes are marketed to be safer than traditional cigarettes because they purportedly contain fewer chemicals and harmless water vapor, some experts say this isn't the case. No federal agency oversaw initial development of the e-cigarette industry, so no standards exist — although this may be changing soon. One Food and Drug Administration review of 18 different e-cigarette cartridges found toxic and carcinogenic chemicals in some but not others. Also, some products that were labeled to be nicotine-free actually did have nicotine.

The American Lung Association says some e-cigarettes use diacetyl, a buttery-flavored chemical once used in food production like popcorn. When inhaled, diacetyl causes bronchiolitis obliterans — more commonly referred to as "popcorn lung." This is a scarring of the tiny air sacs in the lungs that results in the thickening and narrowing of the airways.

Vaping may seem like a harmless trend, but parents should be cognizant of the threats it poses.

11 bill is about Civil Rights

It is hard to fathom that the 911 call systems are being bypassed for people with disabilities regarding medical emergencies, physical and sexual assault crimes and even deaths, but

Upwards of one million people with disabilities who live in state run or private mental health facilities and group homes all across New York state do not have equal access to 911 first responder medical and police services and assistance.

There is no law in place currently to protect and save the lives of our most vulnerable, until the vital 911 Civil Rights Bill S4736B/A6830A is signed into law. This legislation will finally require mandated reporters to call 911 for all medical emergencies and when a crime is being committed against a person with a disability.

The 911 call systems were put in place decades ago, in the '80s throughout New York and our country to provide everyone swift emergency assistance, usually within seven minutes or less, but the disabled have been treated unequally and denied equal access to 911 services.

In New York state the number one known documented reason for what are being called "untimely" deaths is staff in these facilities and group homes not calling 911 when there is a medical emergency. This is very important for everyone to grasp, only imagine if

this was you or your child in an emergency medical situation and no one called 911?

As the writers of *The* Colonie Spotlight editorial said this is a matter of common sense, but it also is without a question a Civil Rights and discrimination matter.

Our state's Constitution under Article 1 of the Bill of Rights Section 1 states, "No member of this state shall be disfranchised, or deprived of any of the rights or privileges secured to any citizen thereof..." 911 emergency first responder assistance is an equal privilege that can no longer be denied our most vulnerable. In the same portion of our constitution under (equal protection of laws; discrimination in civil rights prohibited) Section 11 it states, "No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws of this state or any subdivision thereof." A person with a disability cannot have equal protection of the laws when



Los Lobos to play Cohoes

The Spindle City will be doing 'La Bamba' in the streets

COHOES — Guthrie/Bell Productions will present Los Lobos at The Music Hall on Sunday, July 22, at 7 p.m.

Los Lobos were already East L.A. neighborhood legends, Sunset Strip regulars and a Grammy Award-winning band by the time it recorded its major label debut "How Will The Wolf Survive?" in 1984.

Although the album's name and title song were inspired by a National Geographic article about real life wolves in the wild, the band—David Hidalgo, Louie Perez, Cesar Rosas, Conrad Lozano and Steve Berlin—saw parallels with its struggle to gain mainstream rock success while each member maintained his own Mexican roots.

Around the time of the band's last big anniversary Rolling Stone magazine summed up that distinctive, diverse and spontaneous Los Lobos aesthetic perfectly: "This is what happens when five guys create a magical sound, then stick together for 30 years to see how far it can take them."

The rhythm will get you

'On Your Feet!', the hit Broadway musical, opens tonight at Proctors

SCHENECTADY — "On Your Feet!", the jukebox musical based on the life stories of Gloria and Émilio Estefan, was a hit on Broadway and it opens a fiveday run tonight, Wednesday, May 30, at Proctors in Schenectady as part of its national tour.

This latest production is more than just another visit by a Jerry Mitchell directed musical. It's a stop by a unique troupe comprised predominantly of Latin performers that celebrates a culture seldom portrayed on stage.

In a 2015 interview with Dance Magazine, "On Your Feet!" choreographer Sergio Trujillo described his efforts to bring authenticity to the stage. That involved visiting Cuba, the Estefan's homeland. There, he surrounded

himself within the community, observing dance in the the country's dance halls and on the streets. The attention to detail was not missed by veteran Broadway actress Doreen Montalvo, who plays Gloria's mother, Gloria Fajardo.

"In the movement of this piece, there are so much authentic Cuban moments," said Montalvo. She describes a "magical" number in Act II accompanied by the song "Cuba Libre," which she describes as the "11 o'clock tap number." Ironically, it is not a tap number, she said. However, there is the clacking sound from each dancer as they perform in chapaletas, or wooden slippers.

"Literally, that's one of those things Sergio picked up from the streets of Havana and brought to our show," said Montalvo.

Montalvo said she can associate with the musical's storyline. The character she plays, she said, is her own mother. Like Gloria, her pursuit of a career in theatre was not well received by her mother when she decided to leave her New York City home. She drew from that experience







Festival life needs

Must-have supplies for outdoor events

utdoor venues boast certain advantages over indoor facilities. That is why many concerts, movies, dramatic productions and other types of entertainment frequently take place outside when the weather cooperates.

One advantage to outdoor events is space. Parks or fields typically can hold many more participants than theaters or auditoriums. Cost is another factor. Less maintenance and fewer amenities translates to lower ticket prices — with some outdoor events even being free.

Attending music festivals, outdoor movies or other events outdoors requires careful planning. To increase comfort, certain must-haves are par for the course.

Some place to sit

Hearing protection

If you attend a loud event, such as a fireworks display or a rock concert, using ear protection is a smart idea. You'll still hear what's going on, but at lower decibels. Plus, you won't head home with incessant ringing in your ears. Also, dust off those binoculars. You may need them for an outdoor concert if you want to see the stage and performers. You may not need them for an outdoor movie if the screen is large enough.

Water and snacks

Concessions may be expensive and far away from your seating area. Pack nonperishable refreshments that will satisfy your hunger and thirst. Water is



always best for staying hydrated. Avoid alcoholic and caffeinated beverages, which can make you even more thirsty.

Hand sanitizer and flushable wipes

Outdoor venues often are serviced by outdoor restrooms. Those portable toilets, depending on maintenance and the size of crowds, may not be the cleanest nor the best stocked. Avoid germs by packing an alcohol-based hand sanitizer and a package of flushable toilet wipes.

Child identification

In addition to having mobile phones to keep in touch with other members of your party, bring along photos (or take a recent one with said phone) of children in attendance. Should kids get lost or separated, you'll have a means to identifying them to others who are helping in the search. Children also can wear temporary tattoos featuring parents' phone numbers. Designate a visible meeting spot if anyone gets lost.

Attending outdoor events can be enjoyable. Bring along the right items and the fun factor is increased.

News From Planet Kniffen's 'Dreamland'

arryl Kniffen's brainchild News From Planet Kniffen released its debut album "Dreamland" last month and the Vermont-based sextet has shown it has the chops to produce some truly innovative fusion jazz/funk music.

An eclectic musician from Clifton Park, Kniffen has performed with a number of bands and musicians, and dominated the stage solo. He is responsible for all the arrangements found in NFPK's triumphant debut album.

The nine-track album begins with the promising "Blackness," a worthy introduction track with soaring horn and trumpet lines, setting the tone for the high-energy voyage the listener is about to embark upon. "Peace Journey" features a memorable piano line and some layered drumming with some ultra-smooth sax and trumpet, culminating in a peaceful and ambient tune. The third track is the only cover on the album, a fresh take on AC/DC's "Back In Black," which manages to be both inventive and new, while remaining faithful to the hard rock classic.

The aptly-named "Midnight Drive" builds the groove up slowly, and lets each member of the group take turns showcasing their ability and cultivating an entrancing atmosphere. After the sultry mellow groove of "Midnight Drive," the band lets loose with the titular

track, "Dreamland." This is arguably the most danceable number on the album, with a salsa influence shining through their already-recognizable style. This intoxicating Latin-inspired track is sure to animate a crowd.

"Song of Everest" follows on "Dreamland's" heels with a heavy-metal inspired riff and some aggressive piano, adding more depth to the eclectic palette of the album. "Everest" brings some dark, raw energy that adds interesting variety and features a riveting peak and breakdown. "Beautiful Mystery" is essentially the tonal opposite of the previous song, with NFPK returning to their original, undeniably jazzy sound. "Inspiration" builds on a wave of pleasant horns and a steady build to a euphoric crescendo before the epic coup-de-grace that is "Tick Tock." "Tick Tock" evokes the feeling of an old spy movie, with its jaunty piano-line and frantic pace, instilling a dramatic sense of urgency.

News From Planet Kniffen shows tons of promise with its first foray into the world of jazz-fusion, with a debut album that blends mesmerizing soundscapes with genre-bending arrangements and musical prowess. These guys are not to be missed.





Are you ready?

Disc Jam has moved from venue to venue as its popularity has grown. Initially having its start in Central Massachusetts, it has tapped into the streamline of the robust jam scene residing here in the Northeast. Only in its eighth year, the four-day music and arts festival has developed a strong reputation for quality entertainment. It has since moved across the border to Stephentown, and despite opening its gates on the same weekend as Mountain Jam, it still flourishes. With the number of funk and jambands promised for the show — for many — it's just as big as the one in Hunter.

"I'm gaining some traction in the area," said Disc Jam organizer Tony Scavone. "I don't think we're as big as Mountain Jam is, but I appreciate that compliment."

Cavone said that's not his crowd.

"I carry an event that caters to the right people," he said. "I don't pitch myself to a drug culture. I don't cater my event to a fad or trend. I'm catering my event to arts and music and community. The people who come to it, they are the representation of me. I lead with my best foot forward, and my people who come take that exact step. I have people who that come who are lawyers, they are teachers, some are in the medical field, nurses... The music, itself, caters to the type of people who we want.

People don't come [to Disc Jam] to cause trouble. There's no trouble to be found: There's body paint, bubbles and hula hoops," he said.

while portraying the character in lab workshops prior to the musical's opening on Broadway. She was part of the original Broadway cast as part of its ensemble. She now returns to the national tour to play out her dream in her first principle role.

Montalvo said she was immediately struck by the details in "On Your Feet!"

"Being a little kid growing up in theatre, I never saw my people being represented as a whole on the stage," said Montalvo, who is of Puerto Rican heritage. "We saw

West Side Story, and little things here and there. But, to see an entire culture represented on a Broadway stage, a Latin culture - not just Cuban — I'm so filled with pride every single night."

Gloria and Estefan

First bursting onto Top-40 radio formats with the Miami Sound Machine in 1985, Gloria Estefan sold more than 100 million records and sold out stadiums around the world, while on her way to earning seven Grammy Awards. Her husband, Emilio, a lauded producer and musician himself, has 19 Grammy Awards. The story covers, not just the Estefan's storied rise within the music scene, but their lives and the struggles that impacted both of their careers.

Montalvo recalls how her sister Mildred introduced her to Gloria Estefan's music while the two were growing up. Miami Sound Machine had been playing well back into the '70s, and Gloria Estefan could be seen singing at weddings before a swell of Latin-themed music was pushed by the popularity of "Scarface" and "Miami Vice" in the mid '80s. Each touched upon the life within Cuban communities in Southern Florida, and mainstream America wanted more.

When Mildred learned that her sister was going to be in the musical, Doreen

said she grabbed her CD and asked, "Can you have Gloria sign this for me?!"

She did.

The musical's storyline is set to chart-topping hits that include "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You," "Conga,' "1-2-3," "Get On Your Feet," "Mi Tierra," Don't Want To Lose You Now," and "Reach," in addition to an original song written by Gloria and her daughter, Emily Estefan.

The cast stars Christie Prades, who understudied the role of Gloria in the Broadway production, and now plays the starting role. Mauricio Martinez, who plays Emilio, is an award-winning actor and recording artist. It also stars Debra Cardona, as Gloria's grandmother; Jason Martinez, as Gloria's father, José Fajardo; Ana-Sofia Rodriguez and Carmen Sanchez, as Little Gloria; and Carlos Carreras and Jordan Vergara, as Nayib and Young Emilio.


